



## **EDITOR'S COMMENTS**

If you like to pour over auction results, you should enjoy this issue. Over 250 items from the auctions at the A.W.A. meet at Canandaigua, N.Y., and from three auctions in Philadelphia are listed.

This issue also includes over 170 classified ads which is a new A.R.C. record. The large number of ads and the auction article unfor tunately squeezed the space for Club News to a minimum, but this month there were very few events to report. If the ads continue at this level, A.R.C. may have to add a few pages.

Regular features include the Collector's Corner's coverage of the Montgomery Ward Airline Model 20 and the Photo Review. A special article by David Kraeuter gives us an in-depth look at the Rider Manuals.

The auction report is extensive and is part of A.R.C.'s continuing effort to make available value information on old radios. As the article warns, a list of auction prices is not a list of radio values. Auction prices are only part of the data used to determine values such as those published in A.R.C.'s Value Guides.

More value guides are in A.R.C.'s future. A guide to values of early radio magazines is complete and will appear soon. A tube value survey is planned for the coming months (see adjacent column). For the longer term, individuals are needed who are knowledge able of the values of TV, Bakelite, Art-Deco, and other items which have not been covered by A.R.C. Please let me know if you could contribute.

As has been mentioned before, A.R.C. is staggering its mailing dates. When you send in your ad, if you let me know when you received your issue, I will try to use the information to even-out the receipt dates.

Many have asked, "Where is Carlisle?" Carlisle is a small Massachusetts town of about 3800 people, about 35 miles NW of Boston and next to Concord. In fact, A.R.C. is the only magazine mailed from the small Carlisle Post Office, located in the basement of a quaint New England Church building.

That's all for now ... keep those ads coming.

#### **ON THE COVER**

The De Forest Radiophone D-12 Reflex with four-tubes, a crystal detector, a built-in loud speaker and loop antenna, was introduced in late-1924 for the Christmas season. The advertising claims are interesting to read after sixty years: "You sit in your own library – you reach out into space with a simple turn of the dials and soon you have contact with – Boston or Schenectady or Pittsburg, or perhaps some more distant point.... Almost any radio set can be made to work,... but remember that for general excellence, surety and smoothness of results the De Forest D-12 stands preeminent".

The set's four tubes and crystal detector did the "work of seven tubes with four-tube economy". The advertising went on to say: "It is as simple as eating to use the De Forest D-12" ... you learn that radio "is as interesting as a beautiful girl; as temperamental as an artist, and you learn to be a master of its whims and temperaments".

The directions for using the De Forest D-12 were: "put the loop into its place, turn the dials till you get your station (your dealer will show you how) and then your fun begins".

The selling price for the De Forest D-12 was \$161.20 in a Fabrikoid cabinet and \$176.20 in a Mahogany cabinet.



The 25th annual, Antique Wireless Association's 1986 Annual Conference was held in Canandaigua, New York on September 24th through 28th, 1986. Over 800 individuals were registered and over 200 flea market tags were issued. The auctions reported here were a small part of the total conference which included a talk by one of the inventors of the transistor, Dr. John Bardeen. The A.W.A. Old Timer's Bulletin usually includes a full report on the conference and so the non-auction story is covered here by only a few photos.

Auction reports are always popular with A.R.C. readers. The three auctions at the Antique Wireless Association's meet in Canandaigua, New York in September are reported by your editor, with assistance from Don Daykin and Ray Chase, both of whom took pages of detailed notes. Following the A.W.A. auction results, Frank Krantz reports on three auctions held in Philadelphia earlier this year.

The auction price lists reported here should not be construed as an absolute price guide. A listing such as this cannot adequately report on the condition of cabinets, chassis, transformers, the operating status of the set, the inclusion of incorrect, restored or replica components, whether or not tubes are included and/or are good, etc. Even a buyer at an auction itself finds it difficult to determine these facts while previewing the sets. Auction prices are a result of the excitement of the auction process, the skill of the auctioneer and the interest of the participants. Nevertheless, auction prices are useful for reference and are thus published below.

Only a selection of the items auctioned are reported. Items in poor condition and items where an adequate description is not available are omitted. Where several of the same items were auctioned, the results are summarized in a single listing. Prices are for the full lot described unless the word "each" is included in the description. The prices reported are the best attempt to combine all information available on selling price, description and condition, however, no guarantee can be made for accuracy. (John V. Terrey)






**MIRACO** - Manufactured by the Midwest Radio Co. of Cincinnati, Ohio, this set is the model "MW". It sold for \$54.50 in 1923/24. It is a four tube TRF built into a Mahogany cabinet, front panel size of 6" x 19 1/2". The frequency coverage is from 175 to 600 meters. Also similar to the Model "MW" was the Model "K", which is a two tube set in a smaller cabinet. (Greg Farmer - Fridley, MN)

**WARE** - The "Bantam" by the Ware Manufacturing Corp., N.Y., a six tube TRF using three 24's, a 27, a 45 and an 80. With a size of 16" high, 13 1/4" wide, 7 11/16" deep and a weight of 22 pounds, Ware claimed that this set was the smallest full power electro-dynamic radio receiver on the market as presented in a *Radio News* ad, December 1930. (John Miller - Lexington, KY)



**BULOVA** - This clock radio, model M-701, was made in 1931. Uses 3-51's, 1-24, 1-27, 1-47, and 1-80 tubes. *(Karl Rommel - Lansing, MI)* 




**DEFOREST** - Model R.J.5 Audion Detector, introduced in 1914. Equipped with a "S" grade tantalum filament bulb (unlike example in photo). Advertisement states "Bureau of Standards test show this unit to be the most sensitive and reliable detector ever invented." (David McKenzie - Eustis, FL)

JUBILLE MFG. CO. - Crystal set manufactured in Omaha, Nebraska. I have the original box and bill-of-sale which states it was purchased on 1-7-26. Instructions say "Brass, steel, and aluminum throughout - no wood to shrink - crystal is 75 to 80 percent efficient!" (Walter Worth - Wollaston, MA)



**RCA** - This RCA Model 75X17 was made in 1948. It is unique due to its hand-painted oriental motif on the top, sides, and behind the dial scale. It is basically black with gold trim with gold, orange, and green motifs. (*Greg Farmer - Minneapolis, MN*)





## A Sunday Afternoon Tour of the John F. Rider Manuals Contributed by David Kraeuter

Everyone wants to see what radio is on page one of volume one; in fact, on that page in my set begins a 28-page long model-bymodel list of "Peculiarities in Commercial Radio Receivers." Following that and the Table of Contents is a 100-page section titled "Modern Trouble Shooting", which begins with a discussion of the "attempt to secure information from the set owner" and ends with a chart listing tube characteristics.

The first radio schematic in the main section of volume one is for the A-C Dayton Company's Model XL-5. Morgan McMahon's Radio Collector's Guidelists1925 as the date for this set. But this is not the oldest set represented in the volume.

American Bosch Magneto Corporation's Model 54 D.C. is represented both with a schematic and a pictorial drawing. The juxtaposition of the two pages dramatically illustrates how much easier it is to interpret the schematic than to interpret the pictorial.

We continue alphabetically to the beautiful Atwater Kents with their distinctive power cable cards drawn right into the schematics. The horn speakers are also drawn in. I assume that symbols for these parts had not yet been standardized when the original schematics were drawn. I guess I really don't need the schematic for AK-42 anymore. That was my first antique radio, so I about have it memorized.

There are other "hybrid" schematics, such as for the A-C Dayton Model XL-10. It follows the convention of drawing all conductors in straight, parallel or perpendicular lines, but then has the coils drawn in free hand, and uses drawings of the semi-circular tuning capacitor plates rather than the symbol for a variable capacitor. Drawings, rather than symbols, also often appear for line cords, plugs and switches. For this Dayton I notice that the draftsman did not bother to draw in the circles for the tube envelopes.

Other "old-fashioned" practices abound. Tube grids frequently are represented by the symbol we use today for fixed resistors. Or sometimes the grid is shown as a sine wave. Resistor values may be given with the suffix "M". This represents a kilohm, not a megohm. Alignment instructions refer to kilocycles per second, rather than kilohertz. And today's picofarad was yesterday's micromicrofarad.

I wonder how many readers own, or have even heard of, a Brunswick-Balke-Collender radio. Volume one contains 48 pages of schematics for this company's products, not all of which were radios. This and other volumes contain schematics for power amplifiers, eliminators and power units, set analyzers and other service instruments. There are also separate sections for Canadian receivers, short wave and kit receivers, record players, and midget receivers. Some automobile radios are included. Television schematics appear at least as early as volume 16, published in 1947. By 1948 a separate loose-leaf service was established for television.

Literally hundreds of pages in volume one are devoted to the schematics of such wellknown manufacturers as Crosley, General Motors, Grigsby-Grunow (Majestic), Philadelphia Storage Battery (Philco), R.C.A. Victor (Radiola Division and Victor Division), and Zenith, but some lesser-known companies are here also. Bush and Lane Piano Company is represented only by their Model 10 and Model 12 S.G. (for Screen Grid). Not to be outdone, the Jesse French & Sons Piano Company has two sets included. The Reese-Mace Company has all its schematics appearing on just one page - one for the Model Five Tube and one for the Model Five Tube Improved. A service note is appended: "These English made receivers available through John Wanamaker, N.Y."

Many manufacturers produced only one or a few models before dropping out of the

market in the 1920's. There is an obvious parallel here with the current market in the home computer industry. How long will it be, I wonder, before someone will be fondly leafing through the equivalent of Rider volumes for the computers of the 1970's and 80's, and get an idea to write "A Sunday Afternoon Tour of the Computer Manuals"? For my part, I'd like to see an article in A.R.C. written about Rider's manuals by someone who actually worked with them daily as new, "stateof-the-art" service literature.

To say that Rider was a prolific author is certainly an understatement. Between 1929 and 1960 he published about 40 books. This does not include new editions, the trouble shooter's series, the specialized auto radio series, the public address equipment series, or any of the various indexes to these series.

John Francis Rider was born in 1900, and the first issues of his Perpetual Trouble Shooter's Manuals appeared in loose-leaf form in 1931. The cumulated volume one was published by the Radio Treatise Company in New York. From volume three onward, the publisher is listed as John F. Rider. Although Rider originally intended to cumulate volumes semi-annually, the series continued on an approximately annual basis until the final volume (number 23) was completed in 1954. An introductory note in volume two charmingly indicates the chronological scope of the work: "Let it be known that Volume 2, does not supersede the first volume. It contains entirely new material. Volume 1 covered the period from 1919 to about October 1931, Volume 2 covers the period from October 1931 to the end of May 1932." Actually several different editions of the manuals were published, including the single-volume abridged edition of volumes one through five seen frequently at garage sales and flea markets.

Rider obviously had a passion and a gift for organization. The first 15 volumes (published between 1931 and 1947) contain well over 20,000 pages of schematics and data for the radios and radio-related products of more than 1000 manufacturers. A 200-page cumulative index covers all items in these volumes, including more than 1500 individual models from R.C.A. alone. The set is indexed in

various other early service literature, but it is also a pleasure to open volumes at random and browse.

I think Rider was justifiably proud of these manuals, and wanted the service technicians who owned them to be proud of them, too. Witness the following notice which appears at the beginning of volume nine under the heading "100%ERS, NOTICE":

In the event you have all the Rider Manuals, but do not have the title page for each, send in those title pages that you do have together with a letter stating that you are the owner of volume or volumes for which you have no title pages. This letter must be affirmed or sworn to before a duly authorized official, such as a notary public.

In the case of men who are owners of the Rider Combination Manual, that was distributed through RCA or Cunningham, send in the title page of that for credit on Volumes I, II, and III. Those of you who obtained your Rider Manuals on tube deals, are entitled to the Rider 100% Group Certificate if you are the owner of Volumes I to IX.

Perhaps "100%ERS" also got a discount on their subscription rate?

I acquired my set of Rider's only a few months ago. Mine were expensive - \$350 for volumes one through sixteen. But they are in excellent condition and were available right around the corner. Since buying them I have seen other sets for sale for less. And I talked to an elderly gentleman, a retired radioman, who told me that only a few weeks before I met him last year he put his Rider's out on the curb for the garbageman. Oh, no...




## MONTGOMERY WARD "AIRLINE" MODEL 20

In the early 1930's probably the biggest competitor to the radio dealer were mail order outlets. The biggest, then as now, was Sears-Roebuck whose Silvertone sets were very popular. Not far behind was Montgomery Ward. The radio trade magazines of the day assailed the catalog outfits for unfair competition and mounted campaigns to inform the public that their dollars were best spent at the radio dealer who sold, installed, and serviced his sets. However, the catalogs could sell at a substantially lower price that attracted many consumers. A Gulbransen Model 130, a 7-tube superhet manufactured by Wells-Gardner listed for \$69, the same set sold by Montgomery Ward under the Airline name went for \$52, only the cabinet trim differed. Seventeen dollars was a big difference, especially in 1931.

Airline radios were manufactured by three companies in the early 1930's: Wells-Gardner & Co. of Chicago, Davison-Haynes Mfg. Co. of Los Angeles, and the U.S. Radio & Television Corp. of Marion, Indiana. This month's featured set was made by the latter and appeared in the fall/winter catalog of 1931 selling for \$21.95. Advertised as a personal radio, the Airline Model 20 was not recommended for distances greater than 100 miles. It was a predecessor of the cheap 4-tube sets that were soon to flood the market selling for \$9.95. It was sold under numerous brand names such as Gloritone "Gloriette"; U.S. Apex "New Yorker"; and Radiotrope "Metropolitan".

The Airline 20 is a 4-tube TRF set using a 24 or 35 in the RF stage, a 24 as detector, a resistance coupled 71A in the output stage, and an 80 as the rectifier. A single winding on the power transformer supplies filament voltage to the 2.5 volt 24's, and the 5 volt 71A tube. This is accomplished by grounding the center tap of the 5 volt winding and one of each of the filament pins of the 24's, a rather interesting way to save a few cents in the cost of the transformer. A 6 inch electrodynamic speaker is used that employs two field coils. One provides bias voltage for the 71A; the other is part of the filter network. Volume is controlled by varing the resistance between the aerial and ground, and between the cathodes of the RF tubes and ground.



The Airline 20 weighs 14 lbs. and is 11" tall, 10" wide, and 7" deep. For a cheaper set it is very well made. Reception is adequate with more than ample volume on nearby stations. About the most troublesome problem on the Model 20 is an open circuit in one of the field coil sections. Substituting the open section with a 5-10 watt resistor of the proper value will make little noticeable change. If low volume is a problem in an otherwise correctly operating set, it could be due to the speaker fields being out of phase. Reverse the connections of one of the fields.

I've always liked the unusual shape of the little Airline 20; it reminds me of a sunflower and it's one of my favorite small sets. It is much more desirable than the cheap 4-tube sets that followed.

In the next installment of "Collectors Corner" we will feature a very unusually styled 4-tube mantle radio from England, the Co-Op "Defiant" Model M-900. There is an interesting story behind their trade name. Happy collecting - *Frank & Diana Heathcote.* (GBS)






