# COLLECTING BRITISH CRYSTAL SETS




Collecting British Crystal Sets is a multi-part series of articles designed to acquaint the reader with this specialized aspect of the radio hobby, one that many collectors find interesting due to the many unusual types of sets produced in England. ### PART I. THE BRITISH CRYSTAL SET

It has always baffled me why one radio collector hoards Bakelite midgets and another values Scotts. Why does any collector prize a particular class of receiver? Personally I am fascinated by many types of radios, both young and old. I have specialized in American one-tube receivers of the early twenties. But I have another passion, one my wife can approve (or at least tolerate!): I adore British crystal sets. Those sometimes primitive, sometimes complex sets of the United Kingdom have captured my fancy. Over the next few months I would like to share a little about these sets that have so captivated me. Maybe you will catch some of my enthusiasm.

Although Marconi's company broadcasted experimentally from their Chelmsford works in 1920, it was not until 1922 that broadcasts were permitted in England. One-half hour per week, Tuesday evenings from 8:00 to 8:30, station "Two Emma Toc" beamed out on 200 watts. It was manned by Captain Peter Pendleton Eckersley from a wooden hut at Writtle in Essex. Several months later, November 14, 2L0 - the first station of the newly-formed BBC - began broadcasting from the Marconi house in London. Wireless in England was off and running; the ether abounded with radio waves.

In Britain the Postmaster General governed radio, or "wireless" telegraph and telephony, in those early years. Concerned about the proliferation of new stations in 1922, the Post Office put all of its power over public radio waves into the hands of one authority: the British Broadcasting Company (after 1927 the British Broadcasting Corporation). Thereafter all radio stations were built and operated by the BBC. Furthermore, all radio sets, tubes, and major accessories such as loudspeakers were subject to the Post Office's approval. The sale

Earliest examples, devoid of both BBC/PMG stamp and GPO Reg. No., were released between August and October 1922. A crystal set designed for headphone use features a carborundum/steel detector (polarized by a 1.5v cell) plus open cat's whisker/galena detector, slot-in range blocks for various wave ranges, spade tuning controls, nickelplated fittings, black ebonite control panel, ivorine badge with the initials "MWT" (Marconi's Wireless Telegraph Co. Ltd.) set into a recess in the top of the rexine covered wood case. Size is 51/2 x 11 1/5 x 61/2 inches (closed), cost 9.10s.0d Pounds including headphones, aerial and earth wires. Spare crystals, a range block and instructions are housed in the lid. A smaller version, the "Crystal Junior", appeared at the same time.

In November 1925, a parcel of 15,300 "Crystal A" and "Crystal Junior" crystal sets were acquired by J.M. Millet & Sons of Southhampton who simply pasted on their own labels and instructions and sold them to retailers as the "Millet A" and the "Millet Junior", price 17s.6d and 12s.6d respectively, less 33½ percent for lots of 100. of unapproved equipment was not permitted. One major requirement for approval was that the set had to be of British manufacture made by a member firm of the BBC.

Although this may have been a problem for some American manufacturers who would gladly have exported their sets, it is a boon for present-day radio collectors. All factory-built radio sets between 1922 and the middle of 1924 had a BBC seal and a Post Office registration number affixed to them. The seal carried the inscription "BBC Type Approved by Postmaster General" (see Fig. 1). This is a great help in dating sets and in differentiating "home brew" from commercial radios.





After the middle of 1924, Post Office approval was no longer required, but until January 1925, when the stamp was abolished, all manufacturers still had to exhibit a BBC stamp on their sets to show their British origin. The new official stamp read, "BBC Entirely British Manufacture" (see Fig. 2). This stamp was used until sometime in 1927. From late 1924 a third but little-used stamp showed up on a few receivers without any peripheral wording—simply the BBC trademark (see Fig. 3).



Not only did the Post Office license stations and approve equipment, it also charged you to use your set. Listeners had to purchase a ten-shilling license each year. Half of the license fee went to the BBC for operating expenses.

Most Britishers began exploring the mysteries of wireless with crystal sets. Although they were used in America as well, they never reached the widespread acceptance enjoyed in Great Britain, where crystal set users outnumbered those with tube sets by four to one during the first half of the 1920's. For early wireless in England, it was the set.

I think several reasons can be given for the popularity of crystal sets in the United Kingdom. First of all, they were inexpensive in comparison to tube sets. They required a smaller initial investment and little or no operating costs. This was significant because the British, though by no means impoverished, were less affluent than their American cousins in the Roaring Twenties.

A second reason for the greater use of crystal sets in Britain was the general adequacy of these sets for receiving a local wireless station. A crystal set was able to receive stations as far away as 10-25 miles, depending upon the quality of the antenna and ground as well as the efficiency of the set itself. Since Britain is about the size of Oregon in area, a small number of stations strategically placed in large population centers could easily serve the bulk of the people. By the mid 1920's, most large metropolitan areas had a BBC station, so the majority of the British people could hear the BBC even on a crystal set.

A final reason for the crystal set's popularity in Great Britain was that its lack of selectivity mattered little, for in almost all areas of the U.K. there was only one station. When, at the end of 1926, the BBC began experiments with 2LO and another station in London on wavelengths only 100 meters apart, it was the death knell for the faithful and beloved crystal set, whose users heard both stations at once. Only tube sets could separate stations; soon crystal sets were obsolete and brought hardly a "ha'penny" in trade. (Howard W. Stone)

## SELDOM SEEN RECEIVERS

WINCHESTER - The Winchester radio pictured is a nine-tube TRF chassis with the following listed tubes: four stages of bal anced R.F. (326's), one stage of detection (327), one stage of A.F. (327), two stages of A.F. in push-pull (371's), and a 380 rectifier. In the General Motors Radio Corp service manual it lists Model 5069, then jumps to 5076. The metal name tag on the chassis was marked Model No. 5069, the 69 part of the number showing very weakly, over the 69 is stamped 70 very heavily making it a 1928 model of special listing. This Win chester radio was made for Winchester Repeating Arms Co., New Haven, Conn. If anyone has additional information on this radio, contact: John Martin, 817 Cook Ave., Billings, MT 59101. 
# A-K BREADBOARD REVIEW

The Atwater Kent "breadboard" review is an attempt to present in pictorial form each month some of the many variations of models produced. This will enable the collector to help identify the breadboards he may possess. The photos appearing each month are all reproduced on the same scale, so that variations in size can be visualized. ATWATER KENT MODEL 3 - PART NO. 3960: In 1923 when the Atwater Kent factory produced their first fully assembled receivers, the market was uncertain. Some fans wanted to build their own; some wanted finished sets and still others wanted to progress from a simple one-tuber to a more complex set as he could afford to upgrade. Set No. 3960 made upgrading practical. It was sold as a simple detector with a Coupled Circuit Tuner to match the antenna and was designated No. 3955. The purchaser could add a Variocoupler to make the set regenerative (although AK did not sell the instrument for that expressed purpose). Later the Two-tube Amplifier could be added to produce loud-speaker volume. Without the Variometer, but with the Two-tube Amplifier, the set was designated No. 3960. Because it was the third set in the initial series it is sometimes called the Model 3, but no factory documentation for the model number has come to light. Both Part Numbers, 3955 and 3960, were built on the same size board, 8½ x 26½ inches.



ATWATER KENT MODEL 4 - PART NO. 3975: Getting a little more output from an early radio was continuing struggle in the times that marked the beginning of broadcasting. Coaxing the antenna signal into the detector was an important part of the art. Set No. 3975 used a Variocoupler instead of the Coupled Circuit Tuner of its predecessors, in part because it permitted a better match between the antenna and the rest of the input circuit. Number 3975 was sold without the Variometer so the input matcher was important. It had to provide good transfer over a moderate frequency band with all sorts of antennas. A particular radio fan would have been better off to spend his efforts on a long-wire antenna high above the ground. But, the average fan chose instead to use the input variable inductor to raise his efficiency. This gave Atwater Kent the opportunity to offer No. 3975 and thereby increase his penetration of the market. The set was very similar in appearance to No. 3960, having the same size board and the same instrument arrangement. No indication of there having been a single-tube version has turned up. Only the full-up three-tube version is described in the number system.



# **COLLECTORS VALUE GUIDE**

MAGAZINE VALUE GUIDE: This month's Value Guide is a departure from our normal listing of radios and other "hardware" items. Collecting magazines ("software") and other paper items is very popular among collectors and also deserves attention. The collector of radio, TV, electronics, and electricity magazines has a choice of over 65 different titles from 1900 to 1954. This

Value Guide will cover some of the earlier magazine you may encounter.

And now a few words about the prices listed: (1) The condition of the magazines are to be considered in good or average condition - normal wear, both covers intact, no cover tears, no water stains, no missing pages, no dirty covers, slight spine cracking acceptable.. (2) The values listed are an average of all those collectors who participated in this value guide. Individual collector values that were not in the normal range (exceptionally high or low) of the others were discarded in the averages... (3) To condense this listing, magazines were grouped into "year groupings". Thus one must consider that a earlier copy of a magazine in a year grouping would be worth more than a later copy... (4) No special attention was given to first issues (Vol. 1, #1), special issues, or those which may have more content - ie, Christmas season issues normally have more pages. These special issues would in most cases be worth more... (5) When using this guide remember these prices are for an average, good condition magazine. If you have a fair or excellent copy, prices will have to be adjusted accordingly. Usually magazines that are in less than good condition (except rare issues) will show a large decrease in value and are not considered worth collecting. They are normally kept as "fillers" until something better can be found... (6) And above all - remember these prices are only a guide. It is normal for many collectors to pay much more for a magazine if it is their intent to complete their collection. Likewise those collectors who may have a casual interest in magazines may consider these prices extremely high. As no other magazine survey has ever been done in the hobby before, A.R.C. hopes you find this difficult undertaking in the way of time and effort of practical value to you - Gary Schneider.

### The Vocarola for Radiophone Reception

Another step in the advancement in radio reception has been made with the advent of the Vocarola, which has been brought out by the Westinghouse Electric & Manufacturing Company, East Pittsburgh, Pa.

The Vocarola is a reproducing apparatus which serves the purpose of a sound chamber, Through the use of the new apparatus, receptions of programs broadcasted by radio

telephone will be made comparatively easy and is especially serviceable where several persons are listening at one time.

The Vocarola consists of a specially designed metal horn attached to the mechanism of a single Baldwin telephone receiver. The standard Baldwin mica diaphragm has been replaced by a special metal diaphragm which will stand practically any amount of abuse without damage. A large amount of experimental work was carried on by Westinghouse engineers before final decision was made on the horn and it is

believed that the design furnishes as fine a quality of reproduction as can be obtained except through the use of a very elaborate sound chamber such as is found in high-priced talking machines.

The Vocarola will work satisfactorily from a twostage audio-frequency amplifier and, using good amplifying tubes, 150 to 200 volts may be used without danger of damaging the instrument.


### CO-OP "DEFIANT" MODEL M-900

A few summers ago I had the pleasure of attending a British Vintage Wireless Society meet at Harpendon, about 40 miles from London, I was hoping to find a few sets that I had only seen in photos and some totally new to me. I succeeded beyond my wildest dreams, picking up beautiful Marconiphone and Ultra mantels sets, two round Ekcos, a Lemouzy from France, and this month's featured set - a Defiant.

I saw the top of the Defiant poking out of a box and was quite intrigued. The owner pulled it out and the price was very reasonable. Many collectors milled around and I was told that it was an uncommon set and that I was quite lucky that it was complete. Most were missing the back and they were uncertain as to who made the set as all identification was there.

It turns out that the Defiant has an unusual history. It was sold by the Co-Operative Wholesale Society Ltd. which operates stores which return a dividend to the buyer who is a member. They began selling wireless in 1923 in agreement with various manufacturers. Business proceeded smoothly until October, 1933 when the retail dealers association forced the CWS to abandon the agreement with the Wireless Manufacturers Assoc. and to sell less dividend. This violated the basic principle of the Co-Op and they acted swiftly and secured production of sets made to their specifications by the Plessey Electrics firm. The name "Defiant" was chosen and the first line was introduced in December of 1933.

The Model M-900 was introduced in mid-1935. and is a 4-tube set covering the long and medium European broadcast bands. In England sets were taxed yearly on a rate based on the number of tubes. Unlike the U.S. where 4-tube sets were bottom line cheap products and mainly usable for local reception only, in England they were well made and often included features to get the most out of a set. In the M-900 an AC/VP1 vari-mu HF pentode is used in the RF stage, an AC/S2 HF pentode is the detector, resistance coupled to an AC/2 PEN output pentode and a UU3 full wave rectifier supplies DC voltage. Volume is controlled by varying the voltage to the RF cathode. A



trimmer condenser on both gangs of the tuning condenser acts as a bandspread control. A .0005 ufd. variable condenser functions as a regeneration control by coupling the plate of the detector to its input. A 6 inch Jensen speaker is used and features include a built-in mains antenna, external speaker jacks, phono input, and transformer adjustable from 200 to 250 volts.

The cabinet of the M-900 is bakelite and is uniquely styled. It measures 14" tall & wide, 8" deep, and weighs 19 lbs. Individually lit tuning dials indicate which band is selected. For a 4-tube set the performance of the M-900 is phenomenal. It is able to separate 50,000 watt WIBC in Indianapolis on 1070 Kc from 1,000 watt WNWI in Valparaiso and our 1,000 watt local WSAL on 1230 from 50,000 watt WOWO on 1190 in Fort Wayne. On almost all TRF sets WSAL blankets WOWO. Tuning is a bit difficult but I imagine this set would have fit the bill for a cost conscious Englishman looking for good performance. It makes a very interesting collectible.

### **GREBE SYNCHROPHASE**

The *Grebe Synchrophase* was manufactured from late 1924 until mid-1927. It was a very popular model generally selling for about \$150.

The circuit is TRF using Straight-Line-Frequency condensers for equal spacing of stations throughout the tuning range. Binocular coils and neutralizing condensers are used for high selectivity. Later models have two tuning ranges and a ballchain drive coupled to the center dial for single dial tuning.

The Synchrophase has always been considered a top performing receiver. For its vintage, it is almost unrivaled in sensitivity and selectivity, though microphonics, caused by certain types of tubes and the early UV-type sockets, can sometimes be a problem. Also, if a Synchrophase oscillates while tuning through a signal, the neutralizing condensers may need adjustment.

The set used for testing is an original example from late 1925 with all of the mid-production improvements. Best DX was from stations WBAP in Fort Worth, Texas, and CKWX, Vancouver, BC. (Henry Rogers)



day life was also depicted.



### **UNUSUAL RADIOS - THE "OZARKA 95"**

An apparent last gasp, the Ozarka 95 set appeared in 1932 with what RCA called the "sensational new tubes", the types 58 & 56, and a pentode output. This particular model uses 8 tubes and includes an RF amplifier, a separate type 56 oscillator and is provided with AVC, again separate. It is one of those irritating and tricky circuits with the volume control on the cathode of the AVC tube, between the center tap and the chassis, so it does get warm.

The delightfully decadent cabinet (what I call "boudoir" style) has a walnut veneer front with maple veneer decorations, all held together with walnut legs that form the corners. The elaborate grille is very striking, and houses a Rola speaker whose ten inches take up most of the opening.

Probably the most striking feature of these fine sets, with such catchy automotive names like V-8 & V-16, was their copper-plated chassis. The idea is similar to the brass and aluminum McMurdo-Silver sets of the same period. Even the V-16 has two rows of tubes marching across the back of the chassis. This set, like the McMurdo's, has shielded tubes in the back. They have a lot of eye appeal.

This set is a hot performer. Tests indicate that the I.F. is 175KHz. It tunes from 550 to 1500KHz and can be squeezed a tad higher. It has so much gain in fact that AVC is an ab-



solute necessity. Unfortunately, the volume control on this set, along with the AVC bias resistor beside it, have been changed. The problem is compounded by the lack of published service information and schematics. If anyone out there can help, I'd appreciate it. There's enough gain to demolish the set without AVC and this fine piece should be on working display in my living-room. (Richard Foster, 12 Shawmut Ave., Cochituate, Mass 01778)
