



ON THE COVER

The cover is a contrast to the 1930's radios featured in this months issue. The drawing is from the front cover of the 1912 edition of the Manual of Wireless Telegraphy, published by Manhattan Electrical Supply Co. (MESCO).

I have many "how to" books and catalogs from the early 1900s in my collection, but find the MESCO Manuals to have some of the clearest explainations for the beginner. The early experimenter could get on-the-air with only a few components, which of course, MESCO could supply. These early MESCO catalogs/manuals occasionally turn up and are a valuable addition to a collection of early wireless equipment.

The manual begins: "The field of Wireless Telegraphy is beyond doubt one of the most fastinating for the experimenter and the student of electricity. The possibilities in this direction are unlimited and it remains for the experimenter to bring to light new laws and new systems which are certain to be discovered in the future. The apparatus for experimental purposes has been reduced to simple forms which can be readily understood and operated. The purpose of this book is to describe the operation and uses of the various instruments which are standard at the present time."

WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Story of an E.H. Scott 48-tube Custom Receiver



Although much literature is available on the E.H. Scott 48-Tube Custom Receiver and the E.H. Scott Quaranta, until recently, none of these sets were known to exist. During the mid 1930s, these sets were the apex of the Scott line of radios. Much attention was given to these sets in newsletters published by the Scott company. Articles bragged of the technical achievments, performance, and perfection of these radios. Several of the comments used to describe these radios are currently used to describe the advantages of compact disc players over conventional recordings! Several years ago, the author located one of the Scott 48-Tube Custom Receivers and has been restoring it ever since. Descriptions of the set components, history, and restoration methods and status are presented here to broaden the knowledge of radio historians and collectors.

ta are available from Puett Electronics, descriptions of the set will emphasize the differences and technical aspects of the set.


Unlike the Quaranta pictured in Scott's promotional literature, the set which has been found is housed in three large handcarved consoles. The radio console contains the tuner, crossover, recording amplifier, microphone preamplifier, and relay and filiment power chassis along with a Presto transcription disc lathe. This cabinet has two pheasants carved at the top and flowers and leaves carved at the bottom. The top lifts to expose the chromeplated tuner and crossover chassis. Below the tuner, a section of the cabinet may be pulled out for use as a drawer and logging desk. The sides are veneered in Indian Rosewood, and escutcheons are gold plated. Provision is made for controlling an "outside" speaker from this console. A dual ribbon studio microphone (Amperite SR-80) was included with the recording equipment.

Since reprints of promotional articles for the Scott 48-Tube Custom Receiver and Quaran-

The record changer console has the same visual appearance as the radio console; however, it contains a Garrard automatic record changer and a Capehart automatic record changer (the type which plays both sides of a record). No provision is made for record storage.

The speaker console is the same as shown in the Scott promotional literature. This console contains the power amplifier chassis and five speakers: one 18" dye-cast Jensen woofer, two 12" Scott Auditorium "midrange" speakers, and two Jensen horn tweeters.


The complete set weighs over 1000 pounds. When new in 1936, the forty-tube Quaranta in two consoles cost \$2500.00 plus tax, shipping, installation and accessories. No information is available on the cost of the Scott 48-Tube Custom Receiver although a price of \$5000.00 to \$7000.00 would not be unrealistic for this set.

The original owner of this set was an inventor and machinist by the name of Elmer Beardsley. He was part owner of the Beardsley & Piper foundry of Chicago. Mr. Beardsley allegedly owned patents on foundry equipment and sold foundry machinery around the world. Mrs. Beardsley, from whom I have received this information, was a concert pianist for the Chicago Symphony Orchestra. The Beardsleys lived in a luxurious house in the Chicago area when they purchased the Scott receiver. Their 5800 squarefoot house was finished in fine wood paneling (ceiling included), and their kitchen floor was heated marble.


In the late 1930s, Mr Beardsley purchased a piece of land with a waterfall in a summer recreation area in western Washington. Over the next few years he built an exact replica of

his Chicago house at the base of the waterfall. Picture windows faced the falls. At times his wife had to operate logging equipment to assist in paying for the new house. In 1945 the Beardsleys moved, flying their belongings, including the Scott receiver, to the new house. Both Mr. and Mrs. Beardsley had pilot licenses. Once in western Washington, Mr. Beardsley continued to work diligently using his airplane for transportation. According to rumor, the Beardsleys often entertained Douglas Fairbanks Sr. and Earl Stanley Gardner at their Washington estate. Elmer Beardsley passed away in 1959 from a massive heart attack. Mrs. Beardsley and her sister continued to live at the estate until 1961 when a buyer could be found. During this time the Scott set was placed in the attic.

The estate underwent two changes in ownership with the Scott radio in the attic before it was offered to me. At the time I was working in Seattle for a firm specializing in engineering services for small hydroelectric powerplants. One of our clients, the most recent owner of the Beardsley estate, asked several questions about a cathedral radio which I was trying to pawn off on an associate. He followed the questions with an offer of a three console radio with carved pheasants and flowers on them. I was familier with the Scott Quaranta from reading Scott promotional literature. I could hardly believe the description, especially considering that there were three consoles. I did, however, calmly commit to looking at them to see if they were anything in which I would be interested.




Views of cabinet top and bottom showing fine wood detail.



Several weeks later I inspected the set and confirmed that they were E.H. Scott. I did not purchase the set for several reasons. First, the set was not complete (more on this later), and I did not have the knowledge or resources to complete the set at that time. Second, I had no place to put the set in the small house in which I lived. And finally, my meager counteroffer was refused (I am ashamed to confess how meager this counter-offer was)! The owner of the estate did, however, leave me with the thought of converting the set into a bar.

After several months of worrying about radios being converted into bars, I decided to call John Eckland and let him have a go at the set. This was better than the certain demise of the set. John bought the set for \$600.00, and I was given first right of refusal, should he decide to part with it. After several months, John traded the set along with others to Alan Eaton for Alan's '57 Corvette. I did not have a '57 Corvette to ante up! Alan did, however, keep me in mind. Several months later he sold the set back to me at a price considerably greater than Johns \$600.00 purchase price (by this time the set was substantially complete).

When the set was first purchased by John Eckland, it was far from complete and original. In fact, what John actually bought were the cabinets. At some time in the early 1950's



Front view of elaborate speaker cabinet.


Mr. Beardsley was talked into purchasing some new Newcomb hi-fi (garbage) components and Electro-Voice triaxial speakers. These were hastily installed into the radio and speaker consoles, replacing the original tuner, crossover, power amp, and speakers. These original components have not yet been found and are probably rusting away in the humid storage room or garage of some old western Washington radio shop.

In the late 1970's, the set was further dismantled when the individual who owned the Beardsley estate traded the set for some contemporary top-of-the-line stereo equipment. Apparently the salesman knew of Mr. Beardsley's set and was under the impression that the set was complete. The disgruntled salesman took the Presto record lathe, Capehart record changer, recording amp, microphone preamp, relay supply, and one Scott Auditorium speaker in trade. Thus, only cabinets were left! By the time John arrived to pick up the cabinets they, had been moved from the attic to a detached garage open to the weather. The wood swelled, rendering the doors marginally operable, and the set was decorated with pigeon excrement and carpenter ants.

Once rescued, restoration began. John moved the set to California where the wood dried, and doors again worked. The set was cleaned, and the original finish was found to be in very good condition. An intense effort was launched to locate chassis and parts. John had me seek and find the original record cutter, changer, and chassis traded for stereo gear. The still-disgruntled salesman held us up for \$300.00 for these items (which were of absolutely no use to him and were miraculously still in the back corner of his shop's basement). John acquired a 1937 Imperial tuner chassis complete with faceplate (which fit perfectly) and escutcheons. He also picked up two complete sets of 1935 Imperial chassis and speakers for needed parts. After buying the set back, I purchased Earl Englund's Quaranta chassis. These chassis consisted of a tuner, crossover, power amp, and and Imperial power supply. All chassis were extensively modified, however the tuner and crossover modifications were by the Scott factory to update the set.

All six chassis required rebuilding and replating when acquired. At the time of this writing, four of the chassis are unique (no others have been found) and without schematics. The tuner chassis was used in the 1937 Imperial sets; however, no schematic is available. The microphone preamp was used in some Philharmonics, and the schematic is published in Scott literature.

Presently, four chassis have been rebuilt and replated. These include the tuner, record amp, microphone preamp, and relay power chassis. To accomplish the restoration, wiring diagrams were drawn, and every component was removed. A schematic was drawn if reguired. The chassis and other plated parts were taken to a chrome shop for replating. When back, the components were replaced. Where rivets were originally used, they were replaced with new nickel-plated hollow brass rivets (the same kind). Paper capacitors were replaced with new mylar types. Resistors were checked and replaced if bad or off value. Transformers and coils were checked and replaced with original Scott types where required. Ground returns were soldered, and the tuner chassis was aligned per instructions for the 1936 Imperial tuner.

A number of interesting practices were found when rebuilding the chassis. Some of these include:

— The recording amplifier was made by modifying a finished Imperial power supply and amplifier chassis.

— A dummy speaker (12" Scott Auditorium speaker with its voice coil disconnected) was used for the output transformer to drive the cutting head and for a filter choke. This speaker was mounted in the bottom portion of the radio console, facing the side of the cabinet.

E.H. SCOTT-RADIO LABORATORIES

 No AC wires (other than signal) passed between the radio console and the speaker console containing the power amplifier.
Power for the amplifier was switched using a DC relay.

- The power amplifier is constructed similar to two Imperial power supplies side by side.

Upcoming tasks include restoration of the power amplifier chassis, crossover chassis, and wiring of the set. Schematics have been drawn for the crossover, recording amp, microphone preamp, and relay supply. Other schematics have yet to be drawn. Tube diagrams and functions will be released when the schematics are finished.




PHOTO REVIEW



FEDERAL 110 - (Barry Janov - Des Plaines, IL)



ADAMS-MORGAN CO. - Silicon-Antimony Detector, Type CR1235. Made for the Navy Dept. (BU S.E.), 1919. (*Jim Kreuzer - Elma, NY*)




UNKNOWN TELEGRAPH PRINTER - Early wooden cased tape printer. Spring wound with key and with regular clock works drive. (Walter Worth - Wollaston, MA)




RCA VICTOR - All transistor "Strato-World", model 1-MBT-6, of 1956/57. Loop built into flipup front cover. Seven bands, TRF front end - very "hot", good audio quality. Uses nine D cells. About the size of a Transoceanic. (*Robert Lozier, Monroe, NC*)




UNKNOWN SPEAKER - A small celluloid horn speaker and base, each 3 inches wide. It stands about 5 inches high. Manufacturer unknown to me. (R.A. Hostler - Findlay, OH)



SIGNAL CORPS - U.S. Army airplane receiving set, type SCR59, made by Western Electric Co. The last patent date shown is March 2, 1915. With it is shown the SCR65. This is a Signal Corps U.S. Army Radio Transmitter made by Connecticut Telephone and Electric Co. and used by U.S. Army Signal Corps, usually in airplanes. (David McKenzie - Eustis, FL)



WORKRITE - Believed to be a model 48, this set is a TRF using nine tubes. Designed to run on 25 Hz, it was probably built in Canada. The cabinet was made by the Thomas Furniture Co. in Ontario. The tube line-up is six 26's, one 27, one 71A and 80 rectifier. The tuned stages are individually enclosed in copper boxes with removable tops. The set plays as well as most in the 1928 TRF's group. (John Dewit - Beachville, Ontario)



GREBE - Model "RORN", it is an one-stage tuned radio frequency amplifier. These RF amplifiers were inductively coupled via an output coil to any make of regenerative receiver. The RORN was originally supplied with four different ranges of output coils. The RORN was introduced by Grebe in mid to late 1922. (*Craig Huseboe - Marshalltown, IA*)




JACKSON BELL MODEL 59

The Jackson Bell Company of Los Angeles, California, was one of the pioneers of the move towards "midget" radios that became the rage during the early 1930's. The early midget radios were looked upon with scorn by the major radio manufacturers of the day. But radios like the Jackson Bell model 59 were eagerly bought by the less wealthy and as a second set by the well-to-do. They were also very popular among apartment dwellers. The major manufacturers could not ignore the growing sales of the midgets, and by mid-1931 most had introduced models of their own.

The model 59 was introduced in late 1929, selling for \$59.50. In comparison to later midget sets, it was quite primitive. It uses seven tubes; a 26 in each of the two RF stages, a 27 as detector, another 26 in the first AF stage, two 71A's in the push-pull output stage, and an 80 as rectifier. Both audio stages are transformer coupled, and the output stage feeds a magnetic speaker. Little filtering is needed by the magnetic speaker so only a 2 Mfd. and a 4 Mfd. paper condenser are used along with a filter choke. Volume is controlled by simultaneously varying the bias on the RF tubes and shorting out the input signal at the antenna.

I was rather surprised at the performance of the model 59. It was better than I had expected. Although sensitivity was adequate on the high end of the dial, below 850 KHz it was very poor. An alignment job might have cured this. Stations in South Bend, Chicago, and Indianapolis were received in the daytime with sufficient volume for comfortable listening. Increasing the volume too much caused regeneration on distant stations or overloaded the speaker on the nearby ones. For a magnetic balanced armature speaker, tone quality seemed better than most.

The next Jackson Bell model, the 60, was very similar to the 59. In fact some 59's were remarked as 60's and most of the model 59's shortcomings were rectified. A regeneration control was added, the magnetic speaker replaced by an electrodynamic, and the 27 detector tube replaced by a type 24.



The early Jackson Bell midget cabinets were a simple, easy to manufacture, art deco style. The finish seems to be more paint than a stain, and the wood underneath is very light in color and weight. I had a model 60 in my collection at one time that was done in black with silver lame (a cloth interwoven with metallic threads) grille cloth and white pin striping. It was original and very striking, but the finish was in poor condition.

The Jackson Bell model 59 seems to be quite a bit rarer than the model 60 and the much more common model 62. All are hard to find in good shape on account of cheap construction methods. The 59 and 60 seem to still be reasonably priced as most collectors don't care for the styling. They are probably the easiest-to-find examples of a really early midget radio.



WITH THE COLLECTORS

The AZTEC 7-Tube "AC" Radio

"The 1930 Aztec 7-tube "AC" radio was made by Fred W. Stein, the genius who designed the Steinite radio and offered the world the first electric receiver. Mr. Stein believes this radio to be his greatest radio moment." At least this is what a Burstein-Applebee advertisement proclaims. The receiver was priced at \$38.70 wholesale to dealers and came complete with seven tubes. The list price was stated as \$64.50.

The advertisement boasted twelve reasons for its superiority, they were:

- 1. Genuine Walnut Gothic Design Cabinet
- 2. Magnavox Lifetime Dynamic Speaker
- 3. Push-Pull Amplification with 245 Power Tubes
- 4. Three Stages of Tuned Radio Frequency
- 5. Screen Grid Tubes as Power Detector
- 6. Uses Balanced Radio Frequency Coils
- 7. Sturdily Constructed Shielded Steel Chassis
- 8. Operates with Single Dial Control
- 9. Kilocycle Dial for Accurate Tuning
- 10. Has Efficient Sensitivity Control
- 11. Illuminated Dial for Easy Tuning
- 12. And also has New Tone Control

Who is Fred W. Stein? He was a self-taught electronics engineer with an eighth-grade education. He made a fortune in radios in the 1920's and lost it in the Depression. He came back with a device to measure moisture content in grain.

As a boy he played with telegraphy and then wireless transmission. After receiving his eighth grade diploma he served a three year apprenticeship with the Kansas Railway, Power & Light Co. in Atchison, Kansas.

In 1908 he and a friend started an electrical business, and soon afterward he broke away and set up his own electrical contracting business. He sold Galena crystals for 50 cents or 3 for a dollar. A large ad in the Kansas City Star brought him a surprisingly large response, and he sold his "Long Range Crystals", 1,000 mile range, by the thousands. Luckily, not many people complained.

When WW-I came he joined the Navy. By 1921 he was back home making crystal sets. In 1926 he marketed the first electrical radio in the United States which operated on batteries. Then next year he marketed the first radio that worked on household current, called the "Steinlite."

His payroll reached 1,185 employees, and he was making 20,000 radios a month before the radio market went down in the depression. He lost his factory which moved to Ft. Wayne, Indiana, after being sold to a Chicago company.


Mr. Stein started making a few sets under his name, Fred W. Stein, in 1930/31, but he went bankrupt. Mr. Frederick W. Stein Sr. died in Atchison, Kansas, November 27, 1972, at the age of 84.






