

ON THE COVER

April is the start of the baseball season and is celebrated by the Music Master advertisement on A.R.C.'s cover. Baseball fans looked forward to hearing radio broadcast their favorite teams games in 1924 as do fans today. This Music Master advertisement appeared in the August 1924 issue of *Radio*.

The ad claims: "Summer opens a new world to good radio sets equipped with Music Master. Picnics, camping trips, boating parties, open-air dances – these are only a few of the occasions which Music Master can enliven for you."

As described in Floyd Paul's Horn Speaker Encyclopedia, The Music Master bells were of mahogany or spruce. The company went into receivership about August, 1926.

In 1924, the Washington Senators and the New York Giants went seven games in the World Series, two of the games lasting 12 innings. The Senators won the series.



COLLECTING BRITISH CRYSTAL SETS



Collecting British Crystal Sets is a multi-part series of articles designed to acquaint the reader with this specialized aspect of the radio hobby, one that many collectors find interesting due to the many unusual types of sets produced in England. PART IV. FINDING A BRITISH CRYSTAL SET

If the three previous articles on British Crystal Sets have whetted your appetite and you would like to acquire one or two of them, and if you are soon to be in England for a business trip or a vacation, perhaps I can suggest a few ways to go about it.

Richard Petty, the legendary NasCar driver, was asked about the role of luck in his many victories. He replied that if he had to choose between being good or lucky, he would choose lucky. Petty's choice may also apply to collecting crystal sets from the United Kingdom. You do need to be good at collecting, know what you are looking for and where to look for it, and develop good contacts; but you also need to be lucky. A good supply of money helps as well, because British crystal sets are expensive. They also are rare.

The university where I work granted me leave to do research. Four months of my leave were spent in Cambridge, England. While there. I took the opportunity to search for a few crystal sets. Local members of the British Vintage Wireless Society are obviously more skilled in collecting radios in their own country than someone like I could ever be. But they also do not encounter the problems that a foreigner is likely to face. You won't be able to hide being a "foreigner", for your American accent will betray you. (Even if you can avoid opening your mouth, your nationality may show. One day I had an appointment to meet an English collector for the first time. Just before I arrived he had run out for a quick errand, and he saw me emerge from the tube station, "That chap looks American", he thought to himself, and pulled his car over to the curb. Imagine my surprise when, in a crowded subway station, he walked up to me and asked, "Are you Howard Stone?")

The most important requirement for collecting crystal sets in the U.K. is to be armed with knowledge. Like anywhere else, not all the radios you will find will be what they are represented to be.

One Saturday morning I wandered through the Portobello Road Market in London and found five crystal sets. Now this was the largest number I ever saw at one time; I had not come across that many in a couple months of searching. But three of the flve were "fakes", one was a decrepit home-brew, and one was a very nice commercial set which I bought. (By "fake" I do not necessarily mean a reproduction, which would be relatively easy

to spot; I mean that the radio is not what the seller says it is. Perhaps it is a homemade set onto which a reproduction BBC stamp has been affixed, or it is a set in which some old parts have been installed to make it look like a commercial set.) Knowing the crystal set in detail before you buy will save some grief and money.

How do you get this knowledge? I hope these articles have interested you enough to read more. I can recommend four books that will help: (1) The Cat's Whisker by Jonathan Hill is an very good text with a chapter on crystal sets. The pictures in the book are excellent. (2) Vintage Crystal sets, 1922-27 by Gordon Bussey, is given over totally to British crystal sets. Unfortunately it is out of print, and you may have difficulty putting your hands on a copy. (3) Early Wireless by Tony Constable is another helpful book with a chapter on crystal sets, complete with pictures. (4) The best book of all is Radio! Radio!, newly published by Jonathan Hill. It is the most complete book on British radios of all periods, with nearly 1,000 illustrations including over 70 photographs of crystal sets alone.

It is important to learn what these radios look like, so that you can notice immediately if something is missing or not original on a set you are looking at. These books can help. What is more, until you're sure you have the pictures memorized, I suggest you carry the book(s) with you on your radio hunts, no matter how inconvenient it may seem.

When you find a crystal set, look carefully at the outside. Does everything look like the picture of the set? Check the condition of the case. Does it have a BBC stamp? If the stamp looks rather new, run your finger over the top of it. If the surface is fairly smooth and contiguous with the background, it is an old seal. If the seal is noticeably raised from the surface, and is of the self-adhesive type, it probably is a reproduction.

A small screwdriver is helpful to have to enable you to look under the control panel and check that all the parts and wires are genuine and untouched. Carry one in your pocket on your radio hunts. And a VOM would be useful, but probably will not fit into your suitcase. (I would rather save the space for bringing back a tiny crystal set.)

Whenever you find a crystal set that interests you, ask if you can look at the inside. If the answer is no, don't buy the set. If the answer

is yes, look to see if everything appears original. Has there been recent soldering or any sign of tampering?

Where can you find a good collection of quality sets for sale? In three trips to Great Britain I have vet to figure it out. (A friend told me I was being impatient, that I was doing as well as anyone could expect.) A number of London's weekly flea markets are geared primarily for tourists and consequently are not the best spots for radio collecting, but you might get lucky. Remember Richard Petty. Specially-organized collectors' fairs with a large number of stalls, or booths, are better. There are also several dealers in Britain, especially London, who specialize in radios and mechanical music. They may have something for you, but expect to pay more. In any case, be sure to buy only from reputable dealers. Ask the advice of an impartial friend, if possible. Continued on following page.

Collecting British Crystal Sets continued.

The British Vintage Wireless Society is very concerned about fair practices in the collecting of old wireless equipment, and tries to insure that its members are honest in their dealings. While I was in England, one member was dropped from the society for his allegedly unfair dealing practices. How often can we say that our American societies are as concerned with ethics?

By all means join the BVWS. You will not only learn about radios in the U.K., but you will support its activities in the regulation of dealing and collecting practices. What is more, you will meet some great people who might invite you to see their collections and may even have a "spare" to sell or trade.

A final suggestion is to buy only known sets. I hate to make this suggestion because I know I won't follow it myself. It is the obscure and the unusual, not the Gecophone No. 1 that usually catches my eye. But if you buy only known and popular sets, you will be able to judge more accurately if they are what you

I hope you have enjoyed this series of articles on my passion, the British crystal set. I look forward to going back again to enjoy this lovely country, experience its history and traditions, and maybe even find another crystal set or two! (Howard W. Stone)



ELECTRO-SET LOOSE COUPLERS





Figure 1. Gauge to check shape of coil form and coil form itself.

Pictured are two loose couplers which I recently acquired. They both have special interest to me since they were made in my home town of Cleveland, Ohio. The loose coupler in Figure 1 has a tag reading "The Electro-set Co., Experimental Supplies, Cleveland, Ohio". It is 12" wide, 5" deep and 5 3/4" high. It has a 3" diameter sliding coil with a 9 position tap switch. Two other tap switches are mounted on the front

panel. I would like to restore this item, but need some documentation from the readers of A.R.C. on this company or the loose coupler itself. Perhaps someone may have an old Electro-set


Company catalog?



The loose coupler in Figure 2 does not have a name plate tag, but the phone condenser is marked Electro-set Co., so I assume it is a factory made set. It is 16" wide, 5" deep and 4 3/4" high. The sliding coil has a 6 position tap

switch. A crystal detector is mounted on the right side of the board.



LLOYD C. GREEN CONCERT SELECTOR

One day I acquired from a friend a long-coveted Greene Concert Selector in pristine condition. That it was made by Culver-Stearns of Worcester, Mass., rather than being the usual homemade version from a Sunday newspaper article, is unusual. (See ad for this set in Citizen's Radio Call Book, Spring, 1925.) The set has those pretty Langbein & Kaufman variometers with the green wires and the coppertinted ones together, a red subpanel and audios in removable drawn housings. Unfortunately, one of the variometers was in spaghetti condition, and not the rotor, which would have been easy, but the stator. Have you ever tried to rewind the inside of a stator? Once I tried with disastrous results.



Step one was a gauge to check the shape. Having drawn a circle four inches in diameter on a bit of wood, I cut it out on a bandsaw

leaving two legs just like the shape of a slingshot whose fork was a four-inch circle (Fig 1). This would slip over the work, and, once daylight was eliminated, indicate the correct profile. From the bottom of the fork, I needed a measurement for the points where the coil would begin and end, in effect a band on the sphere as wide as all those turns of wire.

Step two was to mount a round of wood in the lathe as thick as the band of turns of wire with about 1/16-inch extra. The smaller end was to be exact; the larger end would fall where it wanted. Turning the curve was simple, and the sandpaper finished the profile to the point where it was just like the gauge (Fig 1).

Step three was to cut two disks for the ends and to drill through all three parts for a through bolt to hold it all together; also needed were slots, one in the edge of each of the capping disks to hold the end of the wire and leave a bit protruding so that there would be enough to go through the shell of the variometer (Fig. 2).

All of that was ready to be assembled, but we needed a way to keep the coil from sticking to the form when it was doped. The simple solution was to cover the spherical center disk with aluminum foil pressed on tightly, and then assemble all three.

Dropping the wire into the slot on the small end, I wound out toward the large end with the Continued on following page.

greatest ease, and the wire straightened as it crossed my thumb. In two minutes, I was looking at a perfect coil! The loose end goes in the other slot to keep it in place, and on goes the dope. I use contact cement. The only tricky thing is to remember to align the slots so that the protruding ends will line up with the holes in the shell of the variometer.

Once the cement is dry to the touch, you

have to take the form apart and lift the coil off. Unless you use gobs of cement, it will be easy to peel the foil away from the inside (it only sticks at the edges), and you have your coil ready to install. Coat the inside of the shell of the variometer with contact cement, and let dry to the touch. Lay strips of paper across the glue that you can pull out once the coil is in place. Start the inner wire in its hole and slip the coil into place carefully - no second chances here. Slide the paper out when the variometer is reassembled. Mine fit like a glove and, best of all, didn't get rubbed by the rotor.

Now this hot and selective set works again. The job took the better part of a Saturday, and was worth all the trouble both for looks and performance. Maybe this will encourage you to fix your own variometer. If it does, may I suggest that you make a trial coil with some surplus wire so that you get the feel of how to do it. Then if you make a mistake you can throw it away and try again.


COLLECTING ANTIQUE RADIOS A TELEVISION SERIES

A five-part series on the history, collection and restoration of antique radio will be available to all Public Broadcasting Stations during April and May of 1987. Check with your local P.B.S. station to see if they will be carrying it.

The Television series, "Radio Collector," was produced by Mike Adams, Professor of Television at California State University, Fullerton and features dozens of collectors and hundreds of radios from the first half of this century. Mike is a Vice President of the Southern California Antique Radio Society (SCARS) and also a subscriber to A.R.C.

"Radio Collector" is a five-part series about antique radio collection and restoration. From the early days of wireless communication in the late 1800's to the early 1950's, dozens of collectors and historians show hundreds of radios and tell of their significance. Each program features the ongoing restoration of a 1929 Silvertone radio. Most programs contain an

Ritchie & Sons, Boston." Best as I can make out, Ritchie made what we now call "quack medical apparatus" and this unit probably was a current controller for a spark medical machine.

THE "UNKNOWN SPEAKER" AND ABOUT RADIO CABINETS

C. Orval Parker, Pocono Summit, PA, writes: I suppose that I am the 111th to write on the Feb. 1987 Photo Review "Unknown Speaker." It is a Tower Minature model made down the street a piece by Tower Mfg. Co. about 1925. The acoustic/mechanical configuration is very like the Reflectone made by Rice & Hochster of NYC beginning in 1924.

The Workrite was always made in Cleveland. Not many radio companies really made their console cabinets after the "five board" or "bathtub" era, excepting the phonograph heritage concerns such as Majestic, Crosley and some relatively smaller operations.

MAJESTIC RADIO MODEL 15A

CONTRIBUTED BY: RICHARD ARNOLD, BOX 786, ARDMORE, OKLAHOMA 73402

Majestic's "Havenwood," Model 15A, was introduced in *Radio Retailing Magazine* in September of 1931 for \$44.50. The Georgian design, with its recessed Gothic grille in a matched walnut front panel with imported boxwood inlays, was an important selling point.

The five-tube superheterodyne chassis had a modulated circuit, tone control, twin power detection and spray shielding – a German practice being adopted that was


to do away with the metal cans and provide higher efficiency in the tubes. Tube lineup was: two 24's as detection tubes using the first detector as an oscillator, a 51, a 47 and an 80.

Majestic (Grisby-Grunow Co.) went out of business in 1934 but the Majestic name was carried on by a separate company, the Majestic Radio and Television Corporation.

MAJESTIC MODEL 15A




SENSITIVITY CURVE





The first issue was June 1930 and continued until December 1936. In January 1937 the name was changed to "Short Wave & Television. The last issue under this name was September 1938 and then in October 1938 changed to "Radio & Television." (GBS)






HI-GRADE WIRELESS INST. CO. - Made in Asheville, North Carolina, this set is believed to be the only surviving example of a 1920's vintage brand-name radio made in North Carolina. Built by John Rombau Co. of Asheville. Cabinets made in West Asheville by Dolph Blankenship. At this time Hi-Grade/Rombau operated WFAJ on 360 meters, call letters changed to WWNC and are still on the air. Circuit is a 3 tube regen. Estimate only 200 to 300 were made. Advertised at \$125.00 with tubes. (Robert Lozier, Monroe, NC)

KEICO - Heavy brass and beveled glass telegraph tape printer. Has KEICO #2271 stamped on brass case and 6-1924 on other side. Key wound large spring in barrel moves the tape punch rolls as long as signals are received. Stops at varying times after signals stop according to set-up. (Walter Worth - Wollaston, MA)


TEST INSTRUMENT - French current transformer in oak case, additional information not known. (Walter Worth - Wollaston, MA)




SILVERTONE - 1932 Silvertone "All Wave", model 1589, sold by Sears, Roebuck Co. This early shortwave set had an attractive cabinet of burl walnut and featured a novel tuning arrangement. MODEL XX - Crosley's bid in the 1924 highprice field was this cabinet Model XX (20). It had doors to conceal the panel and battery storage area. It stood 40" high and had the top cover lid hinged for access to the receiver chassis. Below was an amplifying wood horn speaker. Without tubes or batteries it sold for \$100.



MODEL XXV - At the top of the 1924 price range was the Model XXV (25). The receiver was the 4-tube Model X (10) with a redesigned chassis to fit a square panel. Two doors, when closed, hid the radio panel and the speaker compartment. The split-top lid opened to give access to the radio (left) and speaker (right) plus battery storage behind both areas. The \$150 price did not include tubes, batteries, phones, or a speaker. However, for a price, the dealer could install a Magnavox R-3 or similar horn unit.



ACE MODEL 3C - The 1924 "Ace"-type 3C was actually the Model 3B redesigned in a square format to fit a large table cabinet like the Crosley Model XL. The two silk-interlined doors opened to expose the radio panel at the left, and included loudspeaker unit on the right. Its price was \$125 without batteries or tubes.



ACE MODEL 3C CONSOLE - The "Ace" 3C could be made into a console style version for just \$25. The small legs of the receiver cabinet were removed, and it simply fit into the mahogany console top. Doors below opened to reveal the battery storage area.

BOOK REVIEW

RADIO HORN SPEAKER ENCYCLOPEDIA

Floyd A. Paul 1545 Raymond Avenue Glendale, CA 91201 1986, 80 pages, paperback

For over 25 years, antique radio collectors have been fortunate to have at least one comprehensive reference book available dedicated to antique radio receivers. Beginning in 1961 with Harold Greenwood's *Pictorial Album of Wireless and Radio 1905-1928*, a steady stream of books has emerged covering the receiver-collecting segment of our hobby. True, most of these had minor sections on loud-speakers, but all too often the loudspeaker collector had to thumb through stacks of 1920's radio magazines to identify a new acquisition.

Floyd Paul's new book, Radio Horn Speaker Encyclopedia, superbly fulfills the long-standing need for a reference book devoted solely to horn speakers manufactured between 1920 and 1927. In just 80 pages, this comprehensive book covers all aspects of horn speakers. There's something here for every-

Chapter 1 covers the early development of horn loudspeakers and describes the various configurations and types of drivers which were employed. This sets the stage for the rest of the book. Chapter 2 gives detailed histories of the ten most important horn speaker manufacturers. Each history outlines the manufacturing strategy of the subject company and includes a detailed identification guide for that company's horns. The detail in this section is incredible. For example, with the help of the section on Atwater Kent horns, the collector can positively identify the four different types of AK "M" horns. In the Magnavox section, 19 horn types are described; frequency response curves are plotted for the R3-D, and schematic and cutaway diagrams are provided. Even the long-time collector with a comprehensive library of magazines will learn many interesting and useful new facts in Chapter 2.

Chapter 3 addresses the question of the relative rarity of specific horn speakers. Here the author conducted a survey of 81 collectors who together owned 1235 horn speakers. The results of the survey are listings of manufacturers:

- with the greatest number of horns in the survey
- with 5-25 horns in the survey
- · with fewer than 5 horns in the survey.



For Atwater Kent, Magnavox and RCA, the most popular horns in the survey, Paul breaks down these companies' output by model number.

Chapter 4 is likely to be the most often used section of the book. Here the author provides us with thirty-five pages of pictures of common and uncommon horn speakers from his collection and the collections of others. With three to four pictures per page, the photos are large enough for easy identification. The photography is excellent. The last page of the section is devoted to several interesting English horns.

Chapter 5 provides a useful trade-name-tomanufacturer cross reference listing. Chapter 6 consists of a manufacturer's encyclopedia which lists the products of more than 320 horn manufacturers. For each entry the shape of the horn also is given to aid in positive identification.

The book concludes with Chapter 7 – a listing of sources where readers can obtain even more information on horn speakers. A detailed index is also provided.

I've waited a long time for a book such as this, and it certainly doesn't disappoint. Once I got the book home, I couldn't put it down until I had finished it. This book is a must for anyone who collects horns or anyone who is interested in radio history. It is well written, comprehensive and delivers much more information than its modest 80 pages would suggest.


