WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Scott 48-Tube Custom Receiver Chassis & Operation

How does one put together a radio which consists of six chassis, six speakers, 48 tubes, two automatic record changers, a record cutter, and a microphone? The E.H. Scott Radio Laboratories assembled one in 1936, but they left relatively few clues for the rest of us. Old ScottCompany literature indicates that two of the 48-tube receivers were built for customers in California. Neither of these have been found complete. A couple years ago a third Scott 48-Tube Custom Receiver was found in the state of Washington (ARC February 1987). The author has been restoring this set and is currently near completion. This article describes the assembly of the set, chassis functions, set operation, and tube functions.

So, how do I put together a radio which consists of six chassis, six speakers, 48 tubes, etc? Let me start with what we have given:

- The original phonographs and record cutter,
- Three original chassis; the recording amp, the microphone preamp, and the relay and filament supply,
- One original speaker.
- A tuner and a crossover chassis from a Scott Quaranta (Italian for forty; this was a 40-tube Scott receiver using some of the same chassis as the Scott 48) or Scott 48 which was updated by the Scott Company later in the 30's.
- A power amp chassis from a Quaranta or Scott 48 with 58 extra holes (the amp was converted to a Williamson circuit in the early 1950's by a Hi-Fi hacker).
- Scott literature describing technical aspects of the circuit and operation to the lay person.

- A few promotional pictures of the chassis and cabinets included in the literature.
- Two more complete Scott Imperial (23 tube) chassis with power supplies and speakers for parts!

The first step is easy. The original chassis and equipment needed only to be rebuilt and replaced in the set.

The tuner chassis was also reasonably easy. Scott literature from late 1935 indicates that the Quaranta and the Scott 48 Tuner chassis were standard Scott Imperial tuners with only minor modifications. The modifications consisted of the addition of a volume range expander to the tuner chassis and replacing the tuning meter with a tuning indicator tube. This tuner chassis was again produced on a limited scale in late 1936 and is known as the 1937 Imperial. Since I had two of the 1937 tuner chassis plus the modified Scott 48 tuner chassis, restoring the tuner chassis was relatively simple. I used a badly rusted and partially melted 1937 tuner chassis as a wiring diagram (no schematic is available for this tuner chassis) while I disassembled. replated, and rebuilt the other 1937 tuner chassis. After completion, I parted out and sold the remaining tuner chassis.

The power amplifier chassis was a little more difficult. Scott literature indicates that the power amp was set up to amplify the highs and lows separately. Pictures indicate that the power amp is very similar to two Imperial amplifiers side by side on a single chassis. Reason, along with holes in the heavily modified chassis, indicated that the 10 kc attenuator was only used on the high frequency half of the amp. The problem was that there were 58 extra holes (as best as I can figure) which appeared on the chassis in

the early 1950s. Again, there is no schematic available; however, it is not difficult to figure out from information available. I drew some wiring diagrams for this chassis and removed all the components. I then carefully analyzed all the holes to determine which were original and which were added. I made numerous drawings showing the holes as found, holes believed to be original, and holes to fill. After this, it was off to the fabrication shop, one which had an individual who must be patient, like small jobs, and would not let the chassis warp when welding. When I get this chassis back with new chrome,I will replace the components to complete its restoration.


I have not started the restoration of the crossover chassis as of this writing. I believe it will be less difficult than the power amp. The Scott factory modifications to this chassis are relatively simple and straight forward. Additionally, I have an "as found" schematic of this chassis drawn by Roy Burnett, a California radio collector.

An interesting point concerning the Scott 48 is that a substantially complete set of chassis can be built from three complete, working Scott Imperial chassis (one being a 1937 version), a few extra speakers, and lots of labor.

With the chassis being complete, the next step is connecting them together (electrically). One might think this would be relatively easy. Just plug the tuner cord into the crossover chassis, plug the crossover cord into the power amp chassis, etc. Unfortunately, through all of the modifications, few of the original plugs and sockets have survived. Further, of those which did exist, wires were removed and changed. The fact that there was a relay power supply indicated that some remote switching was necessary. Where does the recording amp receive its signal from? Where do the tuner and crossover chassis receive their power from? These and numerous other questions came to mind. Through some intense detective work I have determined how the chassis were wired and how the set operates. As a result, every wire in the cables has a specific and reasonable purpose. Although there is some possibility the set could have been wired differently, it is not very likely.

The set is wired as shown in figure 1. The relay supply (which also includes a filament supply) is used to keep all AC current out of the long cord between the crossover chassis in the radio cabinet and the power amp chassis in the speaker cabinet. A DC signal activates a relay in the power amp to turn the amp

on when the radio is turned on. Additionally, the filament voltage for the tuner and crossover is supplied from the relay supply chassis rather than the power amp chassis. The direct current power (B+, Screen+, C-) for the tuner and crossover is supplied by the power amplifier. The recording amp generates its own DC power from the AC line. The microphone preamp also receives its DC power from the recording amp.

Operation is as follows:

<u>Radio</u>: The signal goes from the tuner chassis, through the crossover chassis, to the power amplifier chassis and the speakers.

<u>Phonos</u>: The signal goes from the phonograph, through a master control switch on the record cutter mounting board, to the phonoposts on the tuner chassis. From there, the signal passes as the radio signal does.

Microphone: The signal goes from the microphone, through the microphone preamp and master control switch, to the tuner, and then as the radio signal does.



Recording: The recording amplifier receives its signal from an equal combination of the high and low outputs of the crossover chassis. This combination of signals is accomplished within the crossover chassis. The signal exits the recording amp, passes through the output transformer on a dummy speaker (voice coil disconnected) and drives the cutter head.

What would one use the record cutter for? In a 1936 letter from Mr. Scott, he suggests:

- "(a) Making a record of a particularly fine radio program; a symphony for instance, or an important political talk.
 - (b) Recording foreign station programs.
 - (c) Recording baby's first words.
 - (d) Recording Junior's piano or violin playing.
 - (e) Recording friends, parents, or your own voices."

So, if you wanted to record your childs first words, the signal would come from the child and go to the microphone, to the microphone preamp, to the master control switch, to the tuner, to the crossover, to the recording amp, to the dummy speaker, and finally, to the record cutter! Quite a maze. When you play back the childs first words, the signal is derived in the phonograph and passes to the master control switch, to the tuner, to the crossover, to the power amp, to the speakers, and finally to the childs ears! How about that!




The external speaker was controlled by a T-pad located on the record cutter mounting board.

Tube functions and placement are shown in figures 2 through 6. The microphone preamp contains the only octal tubes used in the set. This preamp is identical to those used in some special Philharmonic combinations. The 40-tube Quaranta was similar to the Scott 48 but had no microphone or record cutting facilities. This leads to an unanswered question; how did the Quaranta have 40 tubes when only 39 are left when removing the microphone preamp and recording amp from the Scott 48? Scott counted the voltage regulators and rectifiers, so we must also.

TURBOCHARGE THAT OLD CONSOLE BY ROBERT LOZIER

Relax...Don't think that this is an article on how to hack up a classic radio simply to make listening more enjoyable. However, if you attach an automobile-type FM-to-AM converter to the back of your set, you can receive better programming. For example, our local nonprofit FM stations have big band record shows, rebroadcasts of radio comedy, drama and big band remotes from the 30's to the 50's. They sound just great coming from my 1938 Zenith console.

These FM converters are usually available new for less than \$15. I frequently find used ones at flea markets for less than \$4.

These converters are designed to be powered by an automobile's 12-volt system, but they will work just fine on 9 volts if a simple mod is made. Then you can use a Radio Shack "black ice cube" type plug-in battery eliminator.

Disconnect the pilot light in the converter. The light pulls much more current than the circuit and greatly increases the power supply ripple. These converters are very sensitive to the ripple.

The only thing that must be done to the circuit is to change the FM output-signal coupling capacitor from the typical 10-to-15 pf. to about 180 pf. You will find this capacitor connected directly to one of the poles of the power switch on the converter. This matches the input characteristics of the typical long wire antenna input on your vintage set.

You should rig up a switch that will disconnect the radio's antenna, and connect it to the converter output. If you keep the regular antenna connected, you will pick up too much background signal which interferes with the FM program.

To use the converter, tune your set to an unused frequency in your area within the frequency tuning range of the converter, usually around 1400 Khz...Adjust the converter tuning slug until you hear the carrier, and tune in an FM station.

The only task left is to find a place to attach the converter mounting bracket along the inside-top-back edge of the cabinet.

Adding such a feature to a set for a noncollector who wants only "one old set in the house" greatly increases the utility of the set, thus increasing the set's value far above cost of materials. And most importantly, you do not alter the set and reduce its value as a collectible item.




PHOTO REVIEW








DEWALD - By Pierce-Aero, Inc., N.Y., Circa 1930, chassis #524. Typical of sets from this era, this TRF consist of three 24's, one 45 and one 80 along with a dynamic speaker. The cabinet measures 17 1/2" high, 13 1/2" wide and 9 1/2" deep, available in a light or dark walnut and a similar but somewhat fancier cabinet with overlays and a scalloped top. Radios under the name of Latayette and Robinhood also used this same chassis. (John Miller - Lexington, KY)







RADIOLA - Shown is a standard Radiola III with Balanced Amplifier in a factory case labeled "ARCO," complete with built-in wooden horn and room for batteries. RCA - Model AVR-5, 5-band receiver made 1933 to 1934. This 9-fube set was built for the Navy and is painted battleship gray over pine plywood. - 28. "Radio Strop Dressing," something that was used for shaving (?).
- 29. "Radio Ring Game Tune In;" toss rings onto antenna towers, 1920's.
- 30. Group of drinking glass coaster holders shaped like cathedral radios.
- 31. "Radio Automatic Rug Needle," some type of sewing device.
- 32. Group of eight pin-back buttons, various radio themes.
- 33. RCA cardboard advertising fan from the late 1920's.
- 34. "Radio A Better Jacket," original box that contained a jacket.
- 35. Wooden bank shaped like a console radio, about 5 1/2" high.


Electrical Research Laboratories Inc. Model 22P

By Frank Heathcote

One of the favorite sets in my collection is the ERLA Model 22P mantel clock radio. I bought it at an old radio auction a number of years ago in Georgia. Compared to the high prices most sets were going for, this little jewel was quite reasonable. It was made all the sweeter when I learned that an absentee bidder had placed an incredibly high bid on the set, but the surrogate bidder was called away. In the meantime, the auctioneer, who had been selling sets separately, grouped a bunch together and by the time the fellow came back the ERLA was mine. It had made my day as I had driven from Indiana to Georgia in hopes of getting the set and an unusual advertising piece for a collector friend.

The ERLA Model 22P was manufactured by the Electrical Research Laboratories Inc. of Chicago, Illinois. The company was founded by George Pearson, an auto distributor, in the early 20's. ERLA was doing pretty well by the mid-20's, and is best known for its Monodic battery TRF sets. The company was sold to Greene-Brown, makers of B-Eliminators, in 1928. ERLA went belly-up in 1930 and was reorganized as a private company in 1931, operating under the "Sentinal" trade name (used previously by United Air Cleaner Corp.) after 1934. The corporate name remained ERLA until 1945, making many private-brand sets. The company had moved from Chicago to Evanston in the late 30's and was sold to Magnavox in 1956.

ERLA was one of the first, if not the first, radio manufacturer to introduce a mantel radio with a built-in clock. It was a 7-tube TRF using push/pull 71A's in the output stage. It was introduced in the summer of 1930 at the latest. The model 22P was introduced in the October 1931 issue of *Radio News*. It sold for \$39.50 with clock, or \$29.75 without, and was also available in 110 volt D.C. versions. The A.C.



model 22P uses four tubes in a TRF circuit; a type-35 in the RF stage, a 24 detector, a 47 output, and an 80 rectifier. It is very similar to the model 335 in Rider's Volume I,with the exception of a 47 in place of a 45 output tube. The model 22P is not in any Rider manual. The D.C. version uses two 36's and two 38 tubes.

The model 22P was one of the earliest radios to use a horizontal full-vision tuning dial, which was to become almost an industry standard 10 years later. The dial strip is angled at 45 degrees to make viewing easier and is also lighted. Another unusual feature for such a small set is the use of an eight inch speaker. The set is only 13" high, 13" wide, and 9" deep but weighs a surprising 21 lbs. The chassis is made of heavy gauge steel and the tuner is fully shielded. The cabinet is made of walnut veneer except for the arch and the base which are stained popular. The speaker grille, which also holds the clock, is of a (Continued on following page)

molded substance, similar to Crosley's "Repwood" and although it looks very fragile, it has held up very well. A self-starting Telechron clock is used.

Reception for a 4-tube TRF set is very good. It has no trouble picking up and separating WLW Cincinnati on 700 Khz and WGN Chicago on 720 Khz at a loud volume on an indoor long-wire antenna. Our local station on 1230 Khz blankets 40 Khz either side. Tuning is direct so the entire dial is covered by a ½ turn of the knob which makes pin point tuning a bit difficult.

As are most mantel clock radios, the ERLA 22P is a very desirable set. ERLA sets are very hard to find information on. Many models are not covered in Rider manuals and most, if not all, ERLA radios in my collection have no model identification on them. ERLA also made many private brand sets under various trade names such as Tone Master, Ramway, Sky Rover, Templeton, and more.



THE UX-200A TUBE BY RICHARD ARNOLD

In February of 1927, the Popular Science Institute of Standards was testing a new supersensitive detector tube, the UX-200A. The outstanding feature of this new tube was its ability to amplify distant hardly recognizable stations six to twelve times louder than the 201A or 301A tubes then in use.

The chart show how the new tube excelled on amplifying weak signals. As the strength of



Curve Shows How Tube Excels on Weak Signals Fig. 1. For reception of local broadcasting where the signal strength is great, the standard 2014 tube is usually adequate, but when you want to bring in distant weak signals with loud speaker strength, the new 200A detector tube is far better. On weak signals it is more than equivalent to an extra stage of radio-frequency amplification when used under proper conditions

the received signal became louder, the curving line that represents the new 200A approaches the line of the 201A, so that by the time the signal has reached the same loudness, such as would be received from any local station, there would be little difference between them.

You can increase even more the detection




of weak signals by connecting the detector grid return wire from the plus side of the filament to the negative side. Changing this connection in this manner almost doubles the volume obtained.

Still further improvements can be made by adjusting the detector plate voltage to 28-30 volts. However, 45 volts is the maximum recommended.

The 200A does have one peculiar characteristic. It hisses quite loudly for about a minute after being turned on. However, this fades and does not become a problem in the quality of the audio reception.

Using the tube in the detector stage will be like getting another, or extra, stage of radio frequency amplification. No changes are needed to your filament control circuit. Just take out the 01A you are using, put in the 200A, and enjoy the difference. I use mine in my AK 20 deluxe, and I can really hear the vast improvement.




VITUS RADIO RECEIVER - built and used in France for World War I Armed Forces. The circuit is a combination of several different types in which a tuned antenna stage is fed into a tuned R.F. stage variometer and tuned condenser, feeding a variometer and condenser tuned detector, a loading coil variometer and tapped switch facilitating both short- and long-wave reception. The batteryoperated set uses Western Electric VT-1 tubes. The receiver and all parts, except tubes, are original as used in service on the battlefront 68 years ago. CX-299 tubes are now used as they are as close in characteristics to the original as obtainable. The gain and volume are exceptionally good, necessitated by being used against the battle noise, as it was used with observation kite/ balloons directing cannon fire by the gunners.

The age of the receiver is judged to be somewhere between 1914 to 1917. The authenticity of the history of the receiver was verified by Dr. M.G. Houghton, who served as a medic in the front lines of the three great

American exploits that turned the German dream of victory into a humiliating defeat. Dr. Houghton brought the radio back along with his medical equipment on his return from France.

Accompanying is a schematic of the receiver. This receiver is part of the Ira. L. Witthaus radio collection. (Ira L. Witthaus, 310 E. Walton, Warrenton, MO 63383)






