ON THE COVER

If Heinrich Hertz had not proved the existence of electromagnetic waves in the late 1880s, today we might be collecting telephone and telegraph gear instead of radios, 100 years ago, in 1887, Hertz published the first of several papers about his experiments with the phenomenon today known as radio waves. The article on Hertz in this issue of A.R.C. describes these first experiments and his apparatus. An article will follow in a future issue on his landmark proof of radio

The cover illustration is from The Work of Hertz and Some of his Successors by Oliver Lodge, published in October of 1894. The book was a reprint of a lecture delivered on June 1. 1894; Hertz had died on January 1 of that year.

ANTIQUE WIRELESS ASSOCIATION 1987 CONFERENCE & AUCTION REPORT

Over \$20,000 was bid in the three auctions at the Antique Wireless Association's 1987 annual conference. This annual event ran from September 23rd through 27th in Canandaigua, New York. 725 individuals registered and 202 flea market tags were issued.

This report details the auctions and includes photos from the auction and the old equipment contest. More information on the conference and contest is usually reported in the A.W.A. *Old Timer's Bulletin*.

Although the flea market and auctions are the high point for many, the meet also included a demonstration by Floyd Engels of the rare RCA Theremin, a 1929 electronic musical instrument. Rudiger Walz from Germany, one of the many foreign collectors in attendance, presented a talk on the making of radio tubes. His contest exhibit on the Loewe receiver and the Loewe multi-valve tube was a highlight of the old equipment contest. The best-in-show contest award went to Jim and Felicia Kreuzer's Marconi exhibit which included the multi-tuner shown on the June 1987 A.R.C. cover. Photos of both of these displays appear in this report.

Thanks to Ray Chase, Wally Worth, Dave Crocker and the Antique Wireless Association for their inputs to this listing. Ray's detailed notes formed the basis for the report. Dave included a comments which are shown in italics. Wally Worth commented, "Most items were sold for prices about where you'd expect. Exceptions were, of course, the very rare and/or mint pieces."

Again this year, prices on some items, particularly tubes, were driven up by foreign buyers who find early U.S. radio items rare in their country. Tubes were in demand by these buyers this year.

A warning: Auction prices are not current values. A listing such as this cannot adequately include the condition of cabinets, chassis, transformers, tubes, the operating status of the set, and the inclusion of incorrect, restored or replica components, etc. Auction prices are the result of the excitement of the auction process, the skill of the auctioneer and the specific interests of the participants. Nevertheless, auction prices serve as useful references and as another element in the value determining process.

This report is a selection of the items auctioned. Deleted were items in poor condition, with inadequate descriptions and low selling prices. The auction listing has been sorted by manufacturer with the prices of similar items combined. The information reported is a best attempt to combine all information available to A.R.C.; however, no guarantee can be made for accuracy. (John V. Terrey)






A spherical audion, displayed in a DeForest RJ-4, a contest entry by Larry Babcock.





As well as the multi-tuner (upper right) which appeared on the June 1987 Antique Radio Classified cover, the display included the double magnetic detector (lower right). This unit includes two detector circuits, one in the front and one in the rear; one can be used as a back-up. The bust of Marconi was an exciting find in another collector's basement. The most recent, significant addition to their collection, and included in the display, is an original, signed, letter from Marconi to Wm. Preece reporting on Marconi's experiments on 3-Mile Hill in 1898.








RCA Radiola 20 desk console, a contest entry by Robert Trauterman. The "lamp" on the right is an antenna; the speaker is not RCA.

The Ansley Television Story By Harry Poster

Recently I had an opportunity to sell my Ansley projection TV (circa 1947), and was I happy to see it go. In the process of selling it, I learned a few things about the Ansley television line.




Figure 1. Ansley Projection Television. The set projects an image onto a separate screen through the lens seen behind the door on the left. This is one of only 100 made circa 1947 or 1948.

Last year a friend in South Jersey offered me a projection television; with visions of a pop-up RCA set, I quickly bought it sight unseen. I was disappointed to discover I had bought a TV in a small end table with an opening on one side. The set is shown in Figure 1. Soon a local TV repairman promised to buy it, but, after seeing it, he reneged.

I had offered it to nearly everyone I knew, but its lack of character delegated it to the back of my garage. Last winter when a woman wanted to buy an Ansley TV – any Ansley TV, I knew my angel had arrived! As it turned out, her father is Bernard Fine or "Mr. Ansley TV" - the former president of the Ansley Television Co.

After the set was repaired, I delivered it directly to Bernard Fine. Although the Ansley Television Co. folded many years ago, Fine is still a treasure of early television information.

According to Fine, T. Stuart Harris - Clearvue's guiding force - began producing the Clearvue line of televisions after World War II. He had approached Fine who, at that time, manufactured cabinets at a large cabinet factory in Turner Falls, Mass. Fine decided against producing the Clearvue cabinets, but Harris managed to buy 1/3 of the Massachusetts plant. Fine still held out, but an-

other opportunity quickly presented itself.

The Ansley Radio Company produced quality FM units; this former Long Island City, N.Y., company had moved to Trenton, N.J., because of tax problems. But Ansley went out of business, and Fine paid \$15,000 to buy the Ansley name, production equipment and goodwill.

At about the same time, Allen B. Dumont had perfected the 15" CRT while everyone else was using 7" and 10" picture tubes. Dumont was apprehensive about demand for a bigger tube; however, Fine contracted to buy half of Dumont's production, and the 15" tubes rolled off the production line.

After Harris dropped the Clearvue line (Clearvue was out of business), he joined Fine in Trenton at the Ansley Co. in making Ansley TVs, including the Model 710 with 630 chassis and 10" tube, several other table tops, several consoles, and a \$1000 combination console. They produced 10", 12" and 15" models, and, of course, the Ansley projection set which Fine swears was the first projection TV. The set uses an RCA 630 chassis with a Phillip's Protellegram projecting assembly, requiring about 25,000 volts. Because of the high voltage and production techniques, the set was never Underwriters Laboratory approved.

Fine had made 100 sets which he found impossible to sell! Luckily, Newsweek ran an article on the sets, and movie stars who had film projection (Continued on following page)

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA ANTIQUE RADIO SOCIETY (SCARS)

The Southern California Antique Radio Society (SCARS) began in 1976 with the publication of a newsletter. As with most historical radio groups, SCARS' goals were to bring together people interested in the collection, restoration and history of old radios and to publish a journal. Early swap meets attracted up to 150 people. The largest club west of the Mississippi, SCARS has grown to a membership in late 1987 of 600, 100 of whom live in other states and countries.

Members receive the SCARS journal - The California Antique Radio Gazette - four times a year, mailed before the quarterly meetings. The Gazette features historical radio articles on subjects such as wireless, broadcast receivers, test equipment, restoration, literature, and television, as well as club news. SCARS' editor Floyd Paul, author of the Radio Horn Speaker Encyclopedia, has presented a series of articles for the past three years on the history of radio manufacturing in Los Angeles during the 1930s. Club member Alan Douglas has been the Gazette's most prolific outof-state writer, with several dozen other writers also contributing to the publication.

(Ansley TV Story, continued) studios in their basements decided they also needed TV projection.

At \$975 each, only about a dozen sets had been sold on 57th Street in Manhattan. Now Los Angeles was the real marketplace. The UL problems haunted Fine until he found a dealer on Sunset Strip. The Strip sat between Los Angeles and Beverly Hills; because of a quirk, neither city had jurisdiction, and the remaining 90 Ansley sets sold out.

In addition to editor/author Floyd Paul, several of SCARS' current officers and directors are well known to the antique radio community. These include antique radio author Morgan McMahon, George Fathauer of Antique Electronic Supply in Phoenix, and Mike Adams who has a nationwide public television series on radio collecting

SCARS' holds quarterly swap meets/business meetings in Southern California, usually on the third Saturdays of February, May, August, and November - the annual meeting. The meetings attract over 300 people from California and the West. The annual May meeting is co-sponsored with the Antique Wireless Association and features a large auction. The annual meeting includes a swap meet, luncheon, election of officers. program and contest.

The club hopes to establish a museum on the West Coast and to grow to over 1000 members. The Southern California Antique Radio Society invites interested collectors to join them in contributing to the antique radio hobby in the western states; addresses to join and phone numbers for information are to the left.


Because the 12" and the Dumont 15" tubes were rare, they were often stolen and resold in New York City, according to Fine. This constant theft as well as production and other difficulties caused the Ansley Television Co. to go out of business. Today Ansley TVs are rarely seen and remain a little respected line of scarce early televisions. So, if anyone comes across another Ansley projection set, I would love to buy it - just kidding! 







THE WIRELESS YEARS

Heinrich Hertz - Part I The First Experiments

Heinrich Hertz is one of the most important individuals in radio history. Why?

After all, before Hertz's experiments in 1887 and 1888, Edison, Trowbridge, Morse and many others had tried to communicate without wires. Some had even succeeded, though only over short distances.

Heinrich Hertz is remembered because he succeeded in proving the existence of the electromagnetic waves, upon which radio today is based.

INTRODUCTION

In 1887, Hertz first described his apparatus and initial experiments with electric waves. Then in 1888, he made his landmark discovery, proving that radio waves behaved just like light. They have the same velocity, can be made to exhibit standing waves and can be diffracted, exactly as Maxwell had theorized in 1865. But even with these discoveries, Hertz did not realize that he was working with a phenomenon that could be used for practical communications. It was not until 1895, after Hertz's death, that Marconi combined Hertz's transmitting apparatus, Branly's coherer detector and Morse's telegraph key and printing instrument to make wireless communication a practical reality.

Note: This article draws liberally from the books by Fleming, Fahie and Hertz listed at the end of this article.

EARLY ATTEMPTS

From the earliest days of electric telegraphy, inventors had directed their attention to the problem of dispensing in part or entirely with the necessary interconnecting wires.

As early as 1838, Steinheil, of Germany, demonstrated that the earth could perform as the return for a telegraphic circuit. He even hinted that telegraphy without wires might be possible by asking "... whether it is necessary or not to have any metallic communication at all for carrying on telegraphic intercourse."

Fleming states, "From the date of that suggestion the notion of telegraphy without wires may be said to have been ever present to the minds of telegraphic engineers."

Early experimenters' methods to dispense with wires fall into the following general categories:

(1) The conduction of electric currents through moist earth or the water of rivers, lakes or seas. This method engaged Morse,




Figure 1. Signals were transmitted from A to B using water at points C-E and D-F to complete the circuit. Distance Z had to be much greater than the width of the river. (Fahie, pg. 26)

Lindsay, Trowbridge, Preece, Rathenau, Strecker, Wilkins and Melhuish. Morse, in 1842, and Lindsay, in 1854, sent messages across a river without wires by placing the wires from each side of the telegraph circuit, in the water at a large distance apart relative to the width of the river. See Figure 1.

(2) Electromagnetic induction between parallel metallic conductors. This method was studied by Trowbridge, Preece, Stevenson and

Lodge. In 1882, Preece wrote about interference on telephone lines from close-by telegraph lines. The telegraph signals could be clearly read on the telephone lines.




Figure 2. Signals were transmitted between the wires strung above the trains and the conductors "a" in the roof of the trains. (Fahie, pg 105)

(3) Electrostatic induction between conductors separated by a greater or less distance. This was brought to a working success by Edison, Gilliland, Phelps and W. Smith, as a means of communication with moving railway trains. Figure 2 shows Edison's configuration of 1885.

In many cases, suggestions were put for-

ward which were based upon obviously erroneous ideas. Nevertheless, the best of the methods had only enabled comparatively short distances to be covered.

ELECTROMAGNETIC WAVES

Fleming states, "A new era dawned when the scientific investigations commenced which finally placed us in possession of the principal facts connected with the generation and detection of electromagnetic waves [radio waves]." Hertz performed these experiments to verify Maxell's theories.

In 1887, Hertz published a paper entitled (in the English translation of his collected papers) "On Very Rapid Electric Oscillations." The following is drawn from this paper.




Figure 3. Hertz's experimental apparatus. (Hertz, pg. 40)

Hertz's apparatus of 1887, illustrated in Figure 3, consisted of a transmitter and receiver. For his transmitter, Hertz used a Ruhmkorff coil (spark coil) "A", a spark gap "B", and two elongated spheres "C" and "C" connected as shown in the figure. The distance between "C" and "C" was about two meters; the apparatus acted as a tuned circuit.

Hertz's receiver was the rectangular loop (a-b-c-d), connected to the gap "M" at which

sparks were observed when the transmitting apparatus was energized.

The Ruhmkorff coil Hertz used was large, 52 cm. long and 20 cm. in diameter. He used a mercury interrupter and six large Bunsen cells (wet cell batteries using Sulfuric and Nitric acids and zinc and graphite). Two 3 cm. diameter brass spheres were used for the spark gap "B". It is interesting to note that Hertz's experiments were performed at a wavelength of about 2 meters.

Hertz was able to obtain sparks 2 mm. in length at "M" when his transmitter and receiver were 50 cm. apart. Sparks were still perceptible when the distance was increased to 1.5 meters. He verified that indeed current was flowing in the receiving loop by breaking the loop and noticing that the sparks at "M" ceased.

Then Hertz proceeded to prove the existence of oscillations, by proving resonance. He stated, "... it seemed to me that the existence of such oscillations might be proved by showing ... symphonic relations between the mutually reacting circuits. According to the principal of resonance, a regularly alternating current

must ... act with much stronger inductive effect upon a circuit having the same period of oscillation than upon one of only slightly different period." For these experiments, Hertz used apparatus similar to that shown in Figure 3, except that "C" and "C" were spheres 30 cm. in diameter and could be moved along the wire connecting them to the spark gap.




Figure 4. Spark gap length vs. sphere spacing. (Hertz, pg. 45)

Hertz measured the longest spark which could be obtained while positioning the spheres different distances apart. He obtained the peaked curve shown in Figure 4 which plots the length of spark obtained vertically, and the distance between the spheres horizontally. Hertz then varied the dimensions of the receiving loop; he got a similarly peaked curve when he plotted the spark gap length and the loop size. He had demonstrated that both the transmitter and receiver could be tuned, and when tuned to the same wavelength, the spark generated was a maximum.

COMMENTARY

In 1887, Hertz had demonstrated the transmission and reception of radio waves. He had demonstrated tuning. He had devised an antenna and a loop receiver. To complete a practical wireless system, he still lacked a practical detector. It was not until eight years later that Marconi borrowed the coherer idea from Branly and created a system of wireless telegraphy.

One more element was lacking for Hertz. Fleming stated it as follows: "When any new field of discovery is ... laid open, it invites the attention of two classes of minds. There are those who are chiefly drawn ... by a desire to increase purely scientific knowledge, ... regardless of any particular practical utility ... On the other hand, there are others to whom this pursuit of ... new theories does not appeal. They are impelled to look at once for applications of the new knowledge." Hertz was the former and Marconi became the latter.

Hertz died at the age of 36, not realizing the full potential of his discovery.

PHOTO & DRAWING DETAILS

The deadline for ads with drawings or photos is the first of the month.

Although the column on the magazine page you are holding is 2 1/4" wide, the artwork given to the printer has columns 3 9/16" wide. The printing process reduces everything to 63% of the original.

Drawings should fit within the 3 9/16" column. If a drawing is too large or too small, it must be resized photographically for an extra charge. Photos may be of any size since all must be converted to a half-tone for printing; in the process, the photo size can be changed.

PHOTO AND DRAWING COSTS
