

Who Was This Frank Conrad, Anyhow?

Most of us know about the achievements of such radio giants as Guglielmo Marconi, Ernst Alexanderson, Lee DeForest, David Sarnoff, and Edwin Armstrong. And on another level most of us have heard about people like A. Atwater Kent, John F. Rider, and Howard W. Sams. But Frank Conrad? Who was he, and why does he deserve to be included with the other early radio pioneers?

The basic biographical facts are straightforward. Born in Pittsburgh on May 4, 1874, by age 16 he had quit school to work as a bench hand with the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Company, his life-long employer. (He also served in the U.S. Army during the First World War.) He married Flora Selheimer in 1902, and the couple had three children. By 1921, he became Assistant Chief Engineer at Westinghouse, a title he held for the rest of his life.

Yes, but what else did he do? Well, there were the patents — 177 of them in all, granted to Conrad between 1898, at age 23, and the year after his death in 1942. Conrad held patents on hand grenades, refrigerators, carburetors, radio transmitters and receivers, televisions, clocks, gear shifts, air conditioners, insulators, vacuum

tubes, and electric meters, among other things. Neither the Great War nor the Great Depression seemed to have an adverse effect on Conrad's ability to obtain patents. In 1915 alone he was granted 15 of them, and between 1904 and 1942, only in 1937 did he not acquire any.

Frank Conrad "invented" radio broadcasting!

All well and good, you may say, but what part, specifically, did he play in radio broadcasting? The simple answer is that he "invented" it. In 1919, Conrad was transmitting to friends from the workshop he had built in the second floor of his garage. Whether he ran out of conversation, or wished otherwise to avoid "dead air" in his transmissions, he thought to transmit the sounds coming from his phonograph. Soon people were buying receivers and tuning in just to hear what Conrad himself was calling "broadcasts." Thus.

Conrad invented broadcasting in the sense of making regularly scheduled transmissions intended for entertainment and intended to be received by any and all, rather than by a specific person in a specific location. From his broadcasts in Wilkinsburg, Penn., at Station 8XK grew radio Station KDKA.

The garage in which Conrad did much of his broadcasting still stands today. The Pittsburgh Antique Radio Society (PARS), assisted by the Wilkinsburg Commission, Inc. and the present owners of the garage, has taken on the project of preserving this historic building, and would also like to locate and preserve the equipment Conrad used when he made his first broadcasts. His original equipment is known to have existed as recently

as five years ago. If any Antique Radio Classified readers have information about this equipment, PARS would like to know about it. The equipment is on the cover of the September 1920 issue of QST and described in detail therein. This same photograph is reproduced on page 108 of Sydney W. Head's Broadcasting in America and on page 42 of Sterling and Kittross' Stay Tuned. PARS would also like to replicate any equipment that cannot be located. 


TELEGRAPH KEY REVIEW




RIGHT-ANGLE VERTICAL BUG - From Australia, this bug was used by the Postmaster General's Office for communications until it changed over to teletype. All the old instruments were ordered destroyed by the Postmaster General, so there were not many survivors of these rare bugs. Courtesy Alan Shawsmith, VK4SS.



MARCONI WIRELESS TELEGRAPH CO. Spark key on a wooden base. Notice the original extra pair of contacts that short out the coherer when the key is transmitting. It dates from 1910, and was an early attempt to upsize ordinary wood base landline keys for spark transmitters. It was found that the heavy currents would heat up the contacts and eventually char the wood leaving the keys mechanically unstable. Later versions used slate or marble for the base. GO-DEVIL BUG - This was designed to be used as a regular bug but would also double as a keyer paddle or sideswiper when the damper arm is latched into a fixed position by the catch on the damper mechanism. Notice the three terminals instead of the usual two. It is made entirely of aluminum except for plastic paddles. Courtesy Phil Shafer, W7BM.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

THE ATWATER KENT MODEL 20 DE LUXE also known as THE ATWATER KENT MODEL 24


Over a year ago, we received this letter from Richard Arnold:

"Dear Editor.

Last summer I went to an antique shop in Sulphur, Oklahoma, and found this AK 20, so I thought. A large cabinet with round legs. Some of my collector friends in Oklahoma City came by and saw it, and they thought it was an AK 24. 'Never heard of it,' I said..."

It appears that Richard decided to research this set, as he recently sent in this fine article. (Editor)

The Atwater Kent Model 20D or Model 20 De Luxe or Model 24.

Atwater Kent designated this version of the popular Model 20 the AK 20D or AK 20 De Luxe, and, when given part No. 4920, it was called the AK 24.

Around 1924 to 1926, when Mr. Atwater Kent was making his Model 20 receivers, someone had an idea to make the cabinet of the AK 20 more ornate. Since this idea deviated from the norm and was not like Mr. Kent's style or general approach to radio receivers, it is doubtful that the

As there were several production runs of the AK 24, the factory gave the new model the number 4920. This model was the first Atwater Kent receiver to have feet instead of the usual felt scratch pads. Based on the panel from the Model 20 - which by the way was sold as just a panel with no cabinet, it was assigned part No. 4670, and was designated as the Model 20 panel; the design incorporated a molded edge top cover that matched its base. The medallion and the millededge panel buttons were finished differently from the big box in that they were "gold plated," as was the on/off pull knob. The nameplate under the lid had the same look and description as the Model 20. Taking the medallion off my set, I found a small yellowing piece of paper slant cut to fit in the groves in the back of the medallion with the number 11294 stamped in black ink. Anyone who has the Model 20D, check to see if this paper is behind your medallion and note what numbers are on it.

Some think that demand from a more affluent radio public for a more beautiful cabinet to go with

more expensive furniture and taste caused this style change. Others seem to think the change was made to test the market. In either case, the production was only one-twentieth of the quantity of the regular Model 20. No other models were made with the molded edges.

Radio News Magazine of December 1925 has an advertisement showing a Models 20, 20C, and 24. The Model 24 sold for \$100.

A September 1924 Atwater Kent catalog describes the receiver as "Cabinet Receiver De Luxe." In this receiving set the beauty of the Model 20 receiver has been greatly enhanced by the addition of an overhanging lid, with a proportioned base with rounded wooden feet.

The color scheme has also been materially enriched by the use of gold plate for the finish of the nameplate and panel trimmings. The result is a strikingly handsome and dignified cabinet which can be placed on the finest piece of furniture.

Volume, range and all other details are the same as the Model 20 receiver: non-radiating and non-squealing.

The dimensions of the receiver are height - 9 3/4", length - 26 1/2", and depth - 9 1/4". It has five tubes. The price of part No. 4920, the De Luxe cabinet receiver, was \$120.







BOOK REVIEW

RESTORATION & PRESERVATION OF SCIENTIFIC APPARATUS FOR COLLECTIONS

by Guy Biraud Translated by Richard Foster

This handsome, although somewhat expensive, hard-bound book is presented in dual language format – with the left pages in English and the facing right pages in the original French. Restoration & Preservation of Scientific Apparatus for Collections by Guy Biraud includes numerous line drawing illustrations and photographs, several in color.

Surely the man who wrote this book could restore scientific apparatus for museums. The author treats in great depth the restoration steps and techniques appropriate for several types of complex antique scientific instruments, including a section on a piece of radio apparatus. About half the book encompasses detailed examples of restoration techniques used on several specific projects, employing methods directly appropriate to radio refurbishing. Biraud's book includes instructions for French Polishing, other cabinet repair and refinishing processes, and also numerous recipes to prepare metal cleaning and corrosion removing compounds which sound almost mystical in both their preparation and use. I have been anxious to find a source for these seemingly exotic raw materials so that I could try the magic potions myself. The formulations called for in Biraud's recipes may be hard to obtain in this country.

Despite the sparsity of text in the book due to its dual language presentation (100 of its 400 pages are in English), the book provides very detailed step-by-step restoration techniques at a fairly advanced level.

The author puts forth the philosophy that there is nothing sacred in preserving the dirt, dust and corrosion which we may find on a piece of old equipment when it comes into our possession. In fact, we may have a responsibility to future generations to attempt to restore a piece to the form and finish (both in appearance and operation) which it had when it was first acquired by its original owner. The danger, of course, is "overrestoration" where the equipment is brought to a level of perfection greater than its original condition. Biraud cautions against this and stresses the importance of research to determine "when to stop."



Overall, I highly recommend this book as an encyclopedia of restoration techniques for anyone seriously interested in approaching museum quality in his collection.

THE TYPE THIRTY TRIODE

BY DAVID BROOKS

Thanks goes to Richard Foster who sent in this witty commentary on the new and the old.


Recently, while trying to establish peaceable speaking terms between two recalcitrant computer modems, exasperation won out, and I drifted away to simpler times. Back then, before the pestilence of faceless electronic locusts had spread throughout the land, components carried the look and feel of their functions, and circuit boards smelled of fresh lumber. Resistors were carbonaceous aneurysms in copper arteries. Capacitors were capable of condensing when necessary. Vacuum tubes were glassy greenhouses where electrons coursed among grids and plates worthy of their names.

My all-time favorite vacuum tube was the type thirty triode, with which I once had a close personal relationship. In a graceful glass envelope, the tube's elements stood proudly arrayed, exposed and visible for all to see: spidery filament, lacy grid, and a plate as big as a billboard. When lit, the bare filament sagged in graceful catenaries, and distant worlds flickered in the soft glow. In that tube and in those times, it seems that clarity prevailed over involution, and frankness

over pretention.

The type thirty was known among friends as a medium-mu amplifier, which means that it could produce at its plate a facsimile of the activity at its arid but enlarged 9.3 times. To gainfully employ this remarkable magic, certain external components and consumables had to be supplied, and arranging for the ingredients provided half the challenge and most of the mystery. For example, two sturdy volts were needed to heat the filament - an unfathomable requirement in days when cheap volts came in increments of one and a half, and rheostats were expensive luxuries. With pirated telephone dry cells at the ready, one could bask in a mellow single-cell glow and correspondingly relaxed performance, or risk all in the temporary glory of a three-volt blaze.

With filament fed, it was on to grid leaks and ticklers, condensers and coils, connected with wires and phosphor-bronze clips and powered by purloined *B* batteries. Antennas shot outward and ground rods were pounded, and finally the type thirty was called on to speak. It did so faintly, through a single earphone, with much squeaking and squealing. The trick was to advance the tickler coil, which controlled the feedback, to the brink of regeneration, at which critical point the triode became a sensitive detector of radio

waves. The slightest twitch beyond the transition, however, brought only howls and screeching, as the tube, in mortal oscillation, strained to leap from its socket.

Simplicity was the beauty of the regenerative detector, and its hallmark was the restful rushing sound produced at the precipice of instability. Controlled feedback in a triode brought to mind the roar of ocean waves on a fine sand beach, or the sounds of the sea cupped in a conch shell; with imagination, the earphone offered an auditory tunnel to distant places. The subtle effect the magic carpet - is altogether lost in the serpentine hiss of a modern FM receiver.

The type thirty and I did our share of listening to the world, but the tube eventually expired in impetuous hands, and the radio was dispatched to the attic with the stamp collection and other dusty passions. The varnished pine board with the wires stapled on it probably succumbed to an early purge. Yet there is no going back, for the type thirty triode is as dated as a dinosaur, replaced by an imported megachip with a zillion transistors. My modem is blessed with an abundance of them, sterile black bedfellows lined up like cots in a barrack. I would gladly trade a few for a regeneration control.
