EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Three big stories this month: (1) This is another record-breaking issue at 300+ classifieds and 52 pages, (2) Frank Heathcote's *Collector's Corner* is back, and (3) Alan Douglas' book *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's* should be available in a few weeks.

I feel like a broken record in repeating that A.R.C. has reached another peak in ads and pages, but this simply reflects the tremendous growth in the interest in antique radios. A.R.C. circulation has now gone over the 3000 point and continues to grow at over 100 new subscribers monthly.

Although interest continues in the sets of the early days of broadcasting, much of the new growth seems to be in later AC and Art Deco sets. Occasionally someone will phone or write to say that they are not sure they like this trend, but I believe that the more collectors of radios of any type who are out there, the more sets of all vintages will be saved.

In this issue, Frank Heathcote's *Collector's Corner* – A.R.C.'s most popular series – returns with an article on the Zenith Model 288. This is the first article Frank has sent A.R.C. since last summer (his excuse is that he has been restoring a Triumph TR-3). Drop Frank a line to let him know that you are glad he is writing again.

The fruit of Alan Douglas' years of research

into the early days of radio manufacturing is here. From a pre-publication copy, I consider Alan's *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's* a must for collectors of early broadcast sets. Within the next several weeks, Volume 1 will be out; Volumes 2 and 3 are planned to follow at about one-year intervals. I encourage you to buy this book soon so a strong signal goes to the publisher and to Alan that there are many collectors already waiting for Volumes 2 and 3. This March issue has more. Richard Arnold wrote an article on the colorful, plastic Emerson Aristocrat. Harry Poster and Ray Chase sent in reports on two Art Deco auctions. The *Club Spotlight* features the Michigan Antique Radio Club. Also included are the second installment of *White's Index to A.R.C.*, the *Photo Review*, and letters on the first use of the word "radio."

Thanks for all of the nice comments about A.R.C. sent in with your ads and renewals. With your contributions of ads and articles (and help in finding new subscribers), A.R.C. continues as antique radio's leading monthly magazine.

ON THE COVER

The cover is from a Colin B. Kennedy Company sales brochure, circa 1922, showing the Type 281 Short Wave Regenerative Receiver along with the Type 521 Amplifier. The drawing on this page, from the same brochure, shows the Type 110 Universal Regenerative Receiver and its companion Type 525 Amplifier. The Type 110 sold for \$285, and covered the entire range of 200 to 25,000 meters for "those who wish to cover the entire field of radio." A complete outfit including tubes, amplifier, phones and batteries cost \$447.30. The Type 281 sold for \$90 (complete outfit was \$216.30), and covered 175 to 900 meters. These sets were featured in Antique Radio Specifications in the September 1987 and August 1986 issues of A.R.C.

The Kennedy brochure stated: "Nowadays, entire families and even large audiences, many

miles distant, listen to concerts, sermons, speeches and news sent out by radio transmitters in much the same manner as they would listen to speakers or music rendered in the same room."





EMERSON ARISTOCRAT, MODEL 400, AC-DC RECEIVER

Although we hear and read a lot about certain radio companies like Atwater Kent, Philco, RCA and other early radio companies, we do not hear very much about the Emerson Radio Company. Emerson was also an early radio company, founded sometime in 1923.

Two brothers -Max and Ben Abrams - started the company. From its early years up until about 1932, Emerson was rather insig-



seven-tube AC-DC. the Aristocrat. Its tuning range is 540-1630 kc. (standard American broadcast and police). Some of the early Emerson midget sets had wooden cabinets; others were made of paper-covered cardboard which looked like leather in grain and texture. These receivers have a built-in loop antenna and work best with the rear of the set pointed in the general direction of the transmitting station.

The Aristocrat Model 400, of the Emerson Radio Co.

nificant. During the great depression the brothers recognized a need for a small radio with a small price. Although people were hungry for entertainment, they simply could not afford most receivers. Going to the movies was a popular pastime. Since no one was purchasing the sets of the higher priced radio manufacturers, many of these companies were going out of business. Although I was not around then, in the mid-forties as a child in Chicago I remember going to a movie show for a nickel; I spent the whole afternoon watching cartoons, Flash Gordon, and Hopalong Cassidy.

The first Emerson AC-DC receiver - 10" wide, 4" deep and 6 1/2" high - looked like a clock. The components were from other companies, such as Philco, Zenith and others, including Emerson. The companies simply assembled the parts into radios. Emerson's first midget receiver sold for \$25 complete, tubes and all. This midget receiver was so popular that Emerson spent over a year filling orders.

These small or midget radios reduced the cost of buying a radio by almost \$100. The average price for a radio receiver in 1929 was around \$135. Because of these midget receivers, the average price in 1933 was only \$35. In the early 1940s, midget AC-DC receivers accounted for almost 80% of all radios sold. By this time the cost of an Emerson midget set was down to \$6.95. Almost every family could afford at least one; many families had more than one. From an estimated 12 million radio listeners in 1932, the number grew to 55 million by 1941.

Emerson named its midget radio of 1942, a

Static could be reduced somewhat by reversing the plug in the wall. The tube filaments were connected in series and were heated by the power cord. Having no power transformer contributed greatly to the radio's low cost. The Aristocrat can operate on 110-115 volts, both AC-DC.

Of course, the midget radios did not compare with the much larger and more expensive consoles. One problem was its tone quality. However, the \$10-or-under cost and its better selectivity gave the larger set manufacturers a blow that did not ease up until television appeared.

The Model 400 Aristocrat came in seven colors, in a sparkling hand-rubbed and polished cast plastic with the richness of onyx, with snap-in grille bars in harmonious colors. The color choices were: natural onyx, Brazilian onyx, Circassian onyx, ebony onyx, basic blue with white and red, basic white with red and blue, and basic red with white and blue. The Model 400 was 7 3/ 8" high, 11 1/2" wide and 5 3/8" deep. The preferred tube line up was 1-12SA7, 1-12SK7, 1-12SQ7, 1-35ZGT, and 1-50L6GT. The final line of the Aristocrat's advertisement states: "Better in Style - Tone - Performance - Quality - Value."

An Aristocrat in excellent condition can go for several hundred dollars, but it is not that easy to find. In the three plus years I have been collecting, this is the first one I have seen. Good luck collecting....

THE ZENITH MODEL 288


The Zenith Model 288, introduced in mid-1933 for the 1934 radio season, used the new Model 2051 all-wave chassis designed to capitalize on the public's new interest in long distance reception on shortwave radios. With the Model 288, Zenith provided a quality set with real all-wave reception at the reasonable price of \$69.95.

The well-made Model 2051 chassis uses an eight-tube superheterodyne circuit. Type 58 tubes are used in the RF, first detector, and in the first and second IF stages. In the original version a Type 55 tube served as the second detector and AVC tube. Later a Type 2A6 tube was used for these functions. A Type 56 tube serves as the oscillator and an 80 as rectifier. Five bands cover 530 to 25,000 kilocycles (565 to 12 meters). The schematics are in Rider's Volumes IV and VIII.

Features of the Model 2051 chassis include tone control, sensitivity control, automatic volume control, and a universal power transformer operable on 110 to 250 volts AC, 25 to 60 cycles. The Model 288 utilizes an eight-inch electrodynamic speaker.

The modernistic design of the cabinet is very simple in character. The center-front panel consists of two light walnut veneer panels butted at a 90 degree angle to each other, with the grain pointing upward. The side front panels and cabinet sides are made of a darker wood with the grain running vertically. Black lacquer highlights the base, top, and two decorative stripes on each side.

I have owned two of the Model 288's main competitors - the RCA 140 and the Atwater Kent 708, priced at \$92.50 and \$59.90 respectively; both are eight-tube sets of the 1934 radio season. In my opinion, the less complex Zenith outperforms both these sets. After overhauling all three. I can say that the AK and RCA are absolute bears on which to work. Since the AK has a double-decked chassis, the top must be separated from the bottom to access components. The RCA's chassis is very deep with most components buried underneath the very large coil assembly. The Zenith 288 compares very favorably with the 11-tube Philco 16B selling for \$85. The Philco has an edge in tone and possibly in reception. Philco's direct competitor with the 288

was the eight-tube Model 43B selling for \$59.95; I have never owned one and have no comparisons.

I used my Zenith 288 as my general shortwave receiving set with just a wire stretched along the baseboard as the aerial. With it I received my first and only QSL card from KQRP, a bootleg station on 7415 kHz. I recommend the Zenith 288 as an interesting addition to any collection. The later round dial Zeniths overshadowed its popularity a bit, but it is still a very good set worthy of consideration.

Collector's Corner will next feature the Philco of England "Peoples Set" Model 444, one of the most sought after sets in England and quite unlike any American-made Philco.

ART DECO - 1950's AUCTIONS

On January 15 there was a Deco/1950's auction in Port Chester, New York. Over 50 radios were featured; many collectors and dealers from the New York/New Jersey/Connecticut area attended.

Prices seemed high because of the poor condition of many of the radios. Defects were not mentioned before the bidding started, so we were not sure if the prices reflected bids from uninformed customers, or from dealers/collectors who were not concerned with condition. There was a 2-1/2 hour preview, so any one could carefully study the condition of the radio sets (we did!).

LETTERS – THE WORD "RADIO"

Dear Editor,

According to Vasseur's *De La TSF A L'Electronique*, the word "radio" is first used by Branly to describe his tube "radioconducteur" or coherer that he perfected in 1890. This use is as a prefix, and undoubtedly meant "rays" in the sense of radium and radioactivity, but this appears to be the first time the word was applied to the art of radio as we know it. Technically, Branly was not using it <u>in place</u> of "wireless," but it would appear to be the first use of the word to apply <u>to</u> wireless.

A few months ago you printed a request asking where the word "radio" came from. I was looking through a Coyne Electrical School Radio Book and found: "The term Radio, coming from the word radiate, applies particularly to the general radiation or broadcasting of messages and radio entertainment and education,"

Prior to 1920, the word wireless was used almost entirely when referring to this equipment.

Dear Editor,

"Radio" may be derived from early (1875-85) experiments in light beam communication. According to the Oxford English Dictionary, "radiophone" is defined as "...an apparatus for the production of sound by any form of radiant energy." and "...the radiophonic sounds resulting from a direct action of radiations upon the receiving substances." (both quotes from 1881). The OEB also cites "radioconductor" as another term for Branly's coherer in wireless communication (1898), so obviously by that time, many physicists considered wireless wave energy to be radiant energy. The question now becomes when did the short form "radio" first appear in print?









MICHIGAN ANTIQUE RADIO CLUB MARC



Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's - Vol. 1 A-C Dayton to J.B. Ferguson, Inc. by Alan Douglas

We've all been waiting for this book! Alan Douglas' Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's was certainly worth the wait. I do not think I'm going too far out on a limb in saying that this will become the definitive book on American broadcast receivers of the 1920s within our lifetimes.


I have known Alan for 20 years now and know that this book has been in the back of his mind for at least that long. The author's excellent magazine articles, which began in the mid-1970s, have familiarized many of us with his factual and concise writing style. Alan greatly enjoyed writing those articles, and was constantly on the lookout for new source materials, magazines and books which he could use for more articles.

By the early 1980s, when this book was conceived in earnest, Alan had amassed what is one of the finest and most complete historical radio libraries in the country. This, coupled with his keen interest in the subject matter and his entertaining writing style, ensured the resulting book to be of lasting value.

The research that went into this book did not stop with the usual book and magazine literature search. In addition, Alan combed Patent Office Gazettes, Sunday Newspaper Radio Supplements from the 1920s, and original company records. He maintained correspondence with former radio company executives, factory workers, dealers and enthusiasts, and endeavored to interview them personally whenever possible. No stone was left unturned.

The result is a book which goes far beyond the normally dry historical text. This book will satisfy business historians seeking to learn about the beginnings of this important industry. It will satisfy new collectors looking to identify and learn more about their sets and the companies that made them. And it will be of particular interest to the serious collector looking for previously unpublished information.

Alan's initial goal was to cover every manufacturer and every radio set produced in the U.S. during the 1920s. That book would have taken a lifetime to write and would probably have filled 5,000 pages. To limit the project to a manage-



able size, Alan set some boundaries. To be included, a company generally had to have maintained national advertising of its products for a period of three years. This limited the scope of the book to about 70 of the largest manufacturers. So, if your favorite company is not included, this is the reason why.

The book is being issued in three volumes to spread out the workload for the author and publisher and to make the book manageable in size. Volumes 2 and 3 are well underway.

Volume 1 begins with a 20page illustrated introduction to radio in the 1920s. Here, Alan sets the stage for the company histories that follow, and he provides general information on radio engineering and design trends as the 1920s pro-

gressed. The remaining 200 pages of the book are devoted to chapters on individual radio manufacturers and the sets they produced during the 1920s.

Each chapter contains one or more pages of corporate history followed by original advertisements and photographs in chronological order of every set that company advertised up to December 1929. Wherever possible, Alan used a recent photograph of an unrestored, or correctly restored, set. The photographs in this book are truly of professional quality. For those of you wishing to identify unusual sets in your collection, or for those wanting to learn more about the sets made by a particular favorite manufacturer, this book will be unbeatable.

To give you an idea of the size of the chapters, a typical small manufacturer, Air Way, has three pages, one-quarter page of text and 23 illustrations. A large chapter, such as the one on Atwater Kent, covers 24 pages, has four pages of text and 68 illustrations.

I guess the best way to sum up my review of this book is to say that if you could buy just one book on the antique radio hobby, this should be it! As over five years of research went into this book, the price asked is small indeed.



The next two volumes due in the months ahead will carry all the way to Zenith.

PHOTO & DRAWING DETAILS

The deadline for ads with drawings or photos is the first of the month.

Although the column on the magazine page you are holding is 2 1/4" wide, the artwork given to the printer has columns 3 9/16" wide The printing process reduces everything to 63% of the original.

Drawings should fit within the 3 9/16" column. If a drawing is too large or too small, it must be resized photographically for an extra charge. Photos may be of any size since all must be converted to a half-tone for printing; in the process, the photo size can be changed
