

#### **EDITOR'S COMMENTS**

April features the reappearance of *The Eliminator*, the newsletter of the A.C. Radio Renegades. Their first two and only issues appeared in 1985. Your editor tracked down this little-known group and convinced them that A.R.C. was an approprate vehicle for their message: "Gloria Alternatus Currentus."

The rest of this issue is for real, starting with Harry Poster's article on the Du Mont Clifton television set. The chassis from this late 1940's set appeared in several cabinet versions including a large-screen (15") for the neighborhood bar and a sliding-door version distributed by Scott.

Jim Fred's second article on repairing A.C. radios also appears this month. I received several letters asking why Part 2 was not in the March issue; as with most series or multi-part articles, they are not run consecutively so as to provide space for other topics and variety.

A review of Philip Collins' book, Radios – The Golden Ace was contributed by Steve Baron. The Photo Review and the third installment of White's Index to A.R.C. complete the articles in this issue. Remember that White's Index to A.R.C. is available separately bound for \$4.00, postpaid, from A.R.C.

Speaking of books, the first paperback copies of Alan Douglas's book, *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's* were shipped by Vestal Press on March 11th. This fine and highly recommended book was reviewed in A.R.C. last month.

Has your copy of A.R.C. been arriving later than usua? We have received more than the usual one or two monthly requests for replacement copies. The recent post office service cubacks seem to have affected mail delivery, especially Second Class. Please wait until the 5th of the month if you receive A.R.C. by First Class or the 10th if Second Class, before calling or writing

for a replacement issue. We always get A.R.C. in the mail by the 25th, and often sooner; after that, the copies are at the mercy of the postal service.

Why do you get calls about your ad days before you get your copy? About one-third of the subscriptions are sent by First Class mail, which usually arrive sooner than those sent Second Class. A First Class subscription costs an extra 50¢ per month which goes toward the extra expense of mailing First Class. Please look over the paragraph on the opposite page "Mailing of Antique Radio Classified" for more information.

Which brings us to the bad news. Just when the postal service cuts back, it increases its rates. As a result of these and other expenses, subscriptions will likely go up about \$1.50 per year for Second Class and \$3.00 per year for First Class. I hope that by the next issue, the new A.R.C. rates can be announced. In the meantime, feel free to renew at the current rates and save!

The season of radio meets is beginning. As listed on the *Coming Radio Events* page, you could attend any of twelve events in April and May, from the Mid-Atlantic states, to Upstate New York, the Midwest, Texas, and California. Note: June 8-11 for the ARCA meet in West Virginia; August 11-13 for the Radiofest in Illinois; and September 21-25 for the AWA convention in Canandaigua; I plan to attend these three. The next meet I will attend is the Dayton Hamvention; there is always a big turnout of radio collectors at this huge hamfest. I will be sharing Booth #235 with Jim and Felicia Kreuzer of the New Wireless Pioneers. Stop by and see us.

That's it for this 52-page issue. This spring, plan to go to a meet; try to send in a classified ad to keep A.R.C. growing, and don't forget to save a few dollars by renewing early.


#### ON THE COVER

The graphics on the cover this month first appeared on the March 1909 cover of *Modern Electrics*, Vol. 1, No. 12. *Modern Electrics*, published by Hugo Gernsback, covered the phenomenon of electricity of that era.

The issue contained several articles on wireless by Eastham, Morgan and Maver, as well as articles about a small electric water heater, a Tesla coil and pioneer work with Edison.

Advertisements by Electro Importing Co. (a Gernsback company) were prevelant of course; Clapp-Eastham, Murdock, J.J. Duck and Omnigraph also adventised. The Radio Telephone Corp. (DeForest) adventised its R-J tuner.

Modern Electrics gave away premiums for new subscriptions such as the spark gap and the

# VINTAGE TELEVISION

# The Du Mont Clifton Model RA-102

Clifton...just another New Jersey town? Actually, the "Clifton" is an electronic rarity from the early television days and is shown in Figure 1. It seems Allen B. Du Mont had an affinity for naming his post-war TVs after local cities. So, it is not surprising to find one of his first postwar sets named after the town in which Du Mont Laboratories was located.

In 1944, the Du Mont Laboratories' "Times, Tubes and Television" release gave a guick history of Allen B. Du Mont's career. Du Mont, the former Chief Engineer and VP of De-Forest Radio Co., became direct supervisor of the television work after DeForest's buy-out of the Jenkins TV interests. The W2XCD TV station at Passaic, N.J., (see

note below) produced "the very first American genuine television entertainment of record," and it is not surprising that Du Mont stayed in the area and pioneeered TV on his own. From a research lab in Upper Montclair to factories in both Clifton and Passaic, N.J., Allen Du Mont was a local ce-

### More on Du Mont Television

I asked Robert Kessler who was the chief engineer at Du Mont's W2XVT Television station to comment on Harry's article and he sent in the following:

Harry did a fine job on this article ... I would like to add that the W2XCD TV station transmitted a mechanical scanning image of 60 lines, an improvement over the earlier Jenkins 48-line image. The first all-electronic television image transmitted by Du Mont was in 1938 from experimental TV station W2XVT, also in Passiac, N.J. [Editor]

lebrity of sorts, employing thousands of area residents in his tube and TV business




Figure 2. Front view of the main chassis showing fourteen front controls plus two tuning controls.




Figure 3. Rear view of the main chassis showing the Du Mont 12" CRT, a 12JP4. The variable TV tuner is just to the left of the CRT.

But, the Clifton is a surprising set with a unique look, like a robot robbed of its arms. It has a unique double chassis, unlike its even larger predecessors, the RA-101 line with four chassis, and the more common tabletop Chatham, RA-103, with a single chassis. It also is unusual, if not unique, in offering a 12" picture tube (or a 15" tube in the Club model) while most competitors were satisfied with 10" CRTs. The RA-102 main chassis is shown in Figures 2 and 3.




Figure 4. The Du Mont Club.

The Clifton was produced in 1946 and 1947. The earliest variation was the RA-102-B1 model, which lacked a focus control

on the front panel. There were five small knobs, two above three, in the center of the front panel. The focus was added in the -B2 revision and the -B3 (Club) model, with three small knobs above and three small knobs below. The Club (see Figure 4) was a 15" tabletop version, designed to be mounted in clubs and bars, with hidden controls behind a large trap door. Except for the larger CRT and the different cabinetry, the Clifton and the Club are identical.

The power supply chassis of the RA-102 models slides in below the main chassis and produces the 300-volt, 400-volt and the 10,000-volt (HV) supplies. A time delay relay is incorporated; a diode reaches working temperature and then activates the 6AL5 delay tube on the main chassis. The 400-volt supply, and, subsequently, the HV supply, is powered. The delay allows all tubes to warm up and within a few seconds a full raster appears with no spot on the CRT. If the

TV-AM-FM switch is in any position other than TV, only the 300-volt supply works.

Controls are everywhere on the Clifton! Two huge continuous tuning knobs are on the front; the control on the left side is for standard AM, the right side control for television channels 1-13 and FM radio. Behind this right control the standard, and well-known Du Mont "Inputuner" is used. Television channels 1-6, then FM stations, and then TV channels 7-13 are continuously tuned with this rotary inductor.

The lighted tuning meter above the AM dial is the FM tuning indicator. The TV/FM dial is lighted when the small bottom-center control knob is turned to FM or TV positions. A second TV position or this switch allows the television to function, but the light is extinguished.

The other five small knobs control volume, focus, contrast, tone and brightness. Also, screwdriver adjustments allow the technician to vary CRT bias, vertical size, hold, position, linearity, and peaking, horizontal peaking, linearity, size, frequency and phase; plus voltage and regulator function can be adjusted.

The Scott Radio Labs. (known as the E.H. Scott Radio Labs. prior to 1946) designed a sliding-door television, Model 13-A, around the RA-102 chassis. It featured a TV/video switch where the CI fton had the AM dial. Instructions are included to hook up easily the set to your Scott 800-B radio phonograph; the Chippendale styling was incorporated in the Model 13-A design, "harmonizing" with the Scott 800-B cabinetry, Although it seems unusual to see Scott buying from Du Mont, actually both RCA and Du Mont produced the chassis for many models of Crosley, FADA. Andrea, and other manufacturers.

Although a bit complicated, the Clifton is no harder to operate than most other early B&W televis.ons. We have gotten our Clifton working without much trouble; it is well made and quite straightforward in its electrical construction Only a handful of the RA-102s are currently known, but I'm sure more will turn up. In this area, where Du Mont was king, several of the past employees remember that many bars displayed Cliftons...will write more after visiting all the local pubs! (Harry Poster, PO Box 1883, S. # All You Need To Know About Repairing AC Radios - Part 2

This is the second part of a series on basic AC radio repair. Jim Fred has been involved in radio for over fifty years, and in this series presents useful hints for both the new collector and the veteran. Antique Radio Classified is pleased to have Jim contribute this series. (Editor)

In our last discussion on beginning radio collecting and repairing, we left you hanging in midair. This was due to a shortage of time to prepare the manuscript and send it to A.R.C. From now on, I hope to meet you in this column once every two months.

We would like to start you off in repairing your own radios this time, but we are going to wait until later because we believe you must have more background first. This information will help you when it becomes necessary to obtain schematic drawings, tubes, and parts for your repairs.

# RADIO MANUFACTURERS AND DISTRIBUTION

Radios were made by two distinct types of manufacturers. The first we shall call "major brands" and the second "private brands." Major brands included, but were not limited to: Atwater Kent, RCA, Philco, General Electric, Zenith, Crosley, Motorola, etc.

Private brands included Sears Roebuck Silvertone, Montgomery Ward Airline, Western Auto Supply Truetone, Spiegel Aircastle, Gamble Stores Coronado, etc.

Major brands normally made and sold radios with their own names on the cabinets, through franchised dealers, supplied by a distributor handling only one brand name. For instance: Philco made the radios in Philco-owned factories, sent the radios in boxcar or semi-trailer loads to large Philco distrributors, who then sent small quantities of radios to the franchised dealers. The distributor would stock large quantities of replacement parts and tubes. The number of distributors in a state would depend on its population. Sparsely settled states would have only one distributor, while states such as Indiana might have three - one in the capitol city, one in the northern part and one in the southern part. In Indiana, for example, this would put a distributor in South Bend or Fort Wayne, one in Indianapolis, and one in Richmond or Evansville. The distributor usually had several salesmen who visited the franchised dealers one or more times per month.

There were several hundred other radio manufacturers in the United States who would put any name you wanted on a radio cabinet or dial if you ordered a minimum quantity of radios. These were the private brand companies. The largest of these companies were in the Chicago, Illinois, area. These companies included Wells-

Gardener, Belmont Radio, Clinton Radio, Warwick Mfg. Co., Sentinel Radio, etc. Indiana had Kingston Radio Corp., U. S. Radio and Television, and Arvin Corp. These companies with few exceptions always put the name of a mail order house, chain store, automotive supply store, drug chain, or major department on the set.

A third group of companies made major brands and private brands at the same time. For instance, Arvin at Columbus, Indiana, supplied a group of automotive parts wholesalers with Arvin radios, while they made as many as 5,000 Silvertone radios per day for Sears Roebuck. Delco Radio Division, at Kokomo, Indiana, made as many as three million auto radios per year for General Motors, as well as Packard, Studebaker and Willis-Jeep. At the same time, GM bought radios from Crosley and others to distribute through the United Motors automotive supply chain. These included both Delco and United Motors 32-volt Farm radios. Later in this period. Admiral Corporation bought Continental Radio and Belmont and combined them under the Admiral name. They shipped Admiral radios to distributors who sold them to franchised dealers. At the same time, they made Airchief radios for Firestone stores, Mantola radios for Goodyear stores, and Wings radios for Goodrich stores. For a time. Zenith made auto radios for Ford, and Motorola made auto radios for Ford and Chrysler. In the early 1930's, both RCA and GE made auto radios for General Motors.

It would take a book to list all the manufacturers of radios, who they sold to, their brand names, and their locations. It is safe to say that, in the 1930's more radios were built around Chicago than anywhere else in the United States.

#### **SCHEMATICS**

The reason I've spent so much time on the above radio history is because it is necessary for you to understand the radio industry before you try to obtain schematic drawings and service information for the sets you are going to repair. There are old-time radio repairmen (most are 70 or 80 years old today) who could repair most radios with only a few hand tools and a volt-ohmmeter. I've met a few, but to do a good repair poyou need a schematic drawing and some basic information before you attempt to repair a radio.

In 1930, two companies started to publish books of schematic drawings. Of course, some major brands supplied books of drawings of their own products to their franchised dealers, but here we are talking about private brands and isolated repairmen who repaired every kind of radio made and had to buy parts by mail order. In the 20's every town had a radio tinkerer who built crystal sets and battery radios. In the 30's these

became the radio repairmen. In many small towns and the surrounding countryside, most of the radios came from Sears, Spiegel, Wards, an automobile garage, or battery shop. Repairing these radios fell to the town handyman or electrician.

One of these publishing companies was owned by John Rider. He published the *Rider Perpetual Trouble Shooters Manual*. Volume I was published in 1930 and one in each year thereafter until 1953. The 1930 volume contained many circuits of radios built before 1930. These circuits were usually just copies of drawings supplied by the set manufacturers. Most don't show values of capacitors or resistors. In fact, some schematics do not even identify the type of tubes used.

The second company was owned by Hugo Gernsback. He published books of schematics called *Official Radio Service Manual*. This set of manuals was only published from 1930 until 1936. There was also one auto radio schematic book.

Rider had the field to himself until 1947 when Howard W. Sams left the P.R. Mallory and Company and founded the company that bears his name. Sams had a room full of service engineers who dissected actual radios which were supplied on loan by the manufacturers. They drew out the circuits, made voltage and gain measurements, and produced a folder of service information for each set. They also did the same for television sets and audio amplifiers. About 10 to 12 sets of information were put into a *Photofact* folder and sold through radio parts stores.

If you are serious about repairing old radios, you must have a set of *Rider's Manuals* in your shop.

#### SAFETY

As promised in my last column, I am going to warn you about a serious safety problem. Most AC-operated radios produced prior to 1932 had a power transformer in each radio that effectively isolated the radio chassis from the 115-volt power line. Soon an engineer found that several dollars could be saved on each set if they eliminated the power transformer. These radios were soon referred to as AC/DC radios. Since there was no transformer, the set could also be operated on a 115-volt DC power line. DC power lines could be found in various places before World War II.

Looking harmless but potentially dangerous, the AC/DC radios command your respect. These sets were built without power transformers, and one s de of the AC line was usually connected to the chassis. The line cord plug was not polarized; i.e., the plug could be inserted two ways. If you




Figure 1. Typical AC wiring entering house.

look at Figure 1, you can see that the wiring coming into your home has three wires. The two outside wires have 220-240 volts across them. This voltage is used to energize the hot water heater, the clothes dryer, and the cooking range. The center wire is neutral and is usually grounded at the electric meter. The 110-120 volts needed to operate radios, lights, etc. is obtained from the neutral and either of the outside wires. Now we can plug the radio in so the chassis is connected either to the ground or to the hot side of the line. If it is connected to ground, well and good; but if the chassis is connected to the hot side, we are in big trouble. If we are standing on a concrete floor or touch a grounded water pipe or furnace duct at the same time we touch the chassis, we get a nasty shock. Depending on age and physical condition, a 110- to 120-volt shock can be fatal.

# Use an isolation transformer or two power transformers to prevent shock!




Figure 2. How to hook up an isolation transformer.

We can prevent this condition by using an isolation transformer at our workbench as shown in Figure 2. An isolation transformer has a primary and secondary with equal numbers of turns. This means that if you put 115 volts AC into the primary, you also will get 115 volts AC on the secondary, and in addition you will be insulated from the incoming power line. It makes no difference how you now plug in the radio when using an isolation transformer. The chassis cannot be connected to the hot side of your power line.




Figure 3. How to use two power transformers as an isolation transformer.

I've just attended an auction sale at the former Stancor transformer plant and have several new and used isolation transformers. If you are interested in one, drop me a line. If you cannot afford to buy an isolation transformer, you can make one from two similar transformers, such as you might find a 1950's TV set. Connect it as shown in Figure 3, and you will be safe from shocks.

This is all for now. Next time we will try to get into the troubleshooting and repair of a radio.




SIMPLEX MODEL H - Manufactured by the Simplex Radio Co. of Sandusky, Ohio. Introduced in 1930, it was Simplex's first mantel radio. 

TEST INSTRUMENT - French wattmeter with current transformer in walnut case. Very heavy wing nut terminals to handle upto 100 amps. (Walter Worth - Wollaston, MA)



ULTRA "LYNX" III - A four-valve (tube), long and medium wave, AC radio manufactured by Ultra Electric Ltd. of London, England. It sold in 1933 for 10 guineas, which converted to around \$6C. Ultra made some very American looking sets and, although this is not one of them, the dial escutcheon and knobs are identical to some U.S. types. With a little imagination, the letters of the company name can be made out in the speaker grille. (Frank Heathcote, Logansport, IN)

# THE GOLDEN AGE BY PHILIP COLLINS

A gap in the radio collecting library has been filled with the publication of *Radios: The Golden Age*, by Philip Collins. It is the first book to recognize the explosive growth in the popularity of Catalin (cast phenolic) and other plastic and novelty radios of the 1930s through the early 1950s.

Radios: The Golden Age sets a new standard of photography in the radio hobby. About a hundred radios are illustrated, mostly in full-page photographs and all in glorious color. The quality of the photography is equalled only by the first-rate printing.

The star subjects are the much sought-after Catalin radios, but bakelite, mirror and novelty radios are also well represented. A few vintage advertisements are included, to good effect. The experienced collector is unlikely to see many unfamiliar sets, but the novice will be delighted to discover that there was a lot more to radio design than polished walnut and brown plastic.

But the book has a nagging flaw. A few of the radios have been "restored" in a manner that may not be entirely authentic. This reviewer has yet to see any evidence that certain small metal radios, such as the four-tube Arvin, were originally chrome plated. Yet freshly-chromed Arvins are starting to show up at radio swap meets and in the pages of this book. Along the same lines, a few of the plastic radios in the book sport paint schemes that are highly suspect. [Another example: The 1933 Emerson "Mickey Mouse" radio on page 13 sports the image of Jiminy Cricket which did not appear until 1940 in the movie *Pinocchio*. The Editor.]

The notes in the back pages refer to these radios as "refinished." This is insufficient, as one



generally assumes that a radio has been refinished authentically. If it has not, or if the author is uncertain, he should so indicate. Every book is part of the historical record, and we owe it to ourselves and future collectors to make that record as accurate as possible.

Other than production dates and short descriptions for the radios, the only text is a short introductory essay. Some additional proofreading may have helped: A.M. does not stand for "alternating modulation."

Still, in setting out to create a lavish and colorful picture book, the author has succeeded quite nicely. *Radios: The Golden Age* is the type of book better suited to the coffee table than the reference bookshelf. Or better yet, it would look fine sitting atop a Stromberg-Carlson blue mirror chairside.

The December 1987 issue of Americana Magazine (\$11.90/year, 205 W. Center St., Marion, OH 43306) contained an excellent article by Roger Rapoport of the Oakland, California, Tribune on Philip Collins and his new book. Following are a few brief excerpts from his article.

One of the most dedicated (collectors of antique radios) is Philip Collins, who has decorated his Westwood, California, apartment with more than 200 of the sets. He believes that they represent

our first important plastic art form, delineating, he says, both the lined and moderne concepts that are "usually asociated with automobile radiator grilles, railroad engines, and airplanes."

The best of the Collins collection is now highlighted in his new book ... The idea was originally rejected by twenty-five publishers ... however ... the resulting volume was worth the effort. It is a splendid showcase of lavish full-page color photographs... The book is scheduled for publication in England, France, Germany and Japan. It has spawned a 1988 radio calendar, and a 1989 version is planned.

Any similarities to other publications or individuals should be considered coincidental.


# BOOK REVIEW SAGA OF THE FLUSH-A-DYNE

Q: Dear Dr. Radio, I found one of those useless old battery radios in my basement with the words "Crosley Pup" on it. My kids don't think I should throw it away, but I can't think of anything useful to do with it. Do you have any suggestions?

Linus Pulp, Fergus Falls, MN

A: Dear Linus, I'm glad you wrote me before throwing away that Crosley Pup. No matter how useless those old battery radios appear, there is almost always a use for them. In your case, since your children are interested in the radio. I have a suggestion that will add years of usefulness to an otherwise worthless set. Why not try the following project along with your children? First, remove the vacuum tube (usually a Type 12), and carefully place a 3-volt flashlight bulb in the glass envelope. Run your wires down through the base of the tube socket after removing the obsolete inner workings in the case. Remember to leave the knobs in place on the radio; heaven only knows those battery sets are ugly enough without empty holes in the cabinet! Now externally hook up six 0.5 volt solar cells in series, run the wires in through the base of the radio, and connect them to the 3-volt bulb. Now you've not only saved that radio from the trash heap, but your kids have an energy saving solar powered night light they will enjoy for years to come.






