EDITOR'S COMMENTS

I continue to sound like a broken record mentioning the larger issues of A.R.C. each month, but after pulling together all the articles, classifieds, display ads, notices for coming meets, etc., the result is a 60-page issue, the largest yet! With its 3000+ circulation, A.R.C. has become THE required avenue for announcing and advertising antique radio events, auctions, products, etc.

Featured this month is a dual *Crosley Review*. Richard Arnold describes the Model 50 and its companion amplifier the Model 50A while David Crocker covers a version of the pair which was marketed in a single cabinet.

With this larger issue, we can publish more articles than usual. In *Vintage Television*, Peter Yanczer writes about the picture quality available from his modern implementation of early mechanically scanning television. "The Philco Model 444 'People's Set" by Frank Heathcote and Ray Chase's reports on two auctions are found in these pages. Also included is John Nagle's "Fire It Up, But Don't Blow It Up!" – a description of a technique to warm-up early AC radio transformers slowly so they can be fired up but not blown up.

Part III of Andrew Mooradian's *Olde Tyme Radio Services Directory* is included as well as a few letters continuing the SASE controversy. ON THE COVER

The small set on the cover this month appears at first glance to be home brew. The set is a Crosley Model 50 but sold under the Sears Roebuck name. The "Sears" Model 50, called the Model SR-2, is squeezed into a slightly smaller box, with no mention of Crosley on the panel but with a Sears paper tag on the bottom.

Collectors often pass up seemingly home brew sets. However, with the popularity of the early Crosley sets, collectors frequently notice these sets because in many cases they are Crosley sets without panel markings. David Crocker, the chief contributor to A.R.C.'s *Crosley Review*, receives a third of his Crosley-related mail from people who As mentioned last month, because of the postal rate hike, subscription rates will be going up. However, renewals will continue to be accepted at the old rates until June 10, so renew or extend your subscription now. Details are stated on the coupon opposite page 30 in this issue.

We have been able to keep the subscription rate increases down to the minimum. The basic Second Class rates are up only \$1.00, which is less than the \$1.50 predicted last month. With First Class issues now costing 65¢ to 85¢ to mail, First Class rates must go up \$4.00, making them \$9.00 (75¢/issue) over the Second Class rates. A free 20-word classified ad is still available to all subscribers, and the cost for additional words remains at 10¢ each.

With circulation going up, display advertising rates will also go up to reflect the additional cost of reaching more than double the collectors since the rates were set about two years ago. The new rates will be announced in the next issue. You may notice that the business card page has been improved so that a full card can now be included; previously the top and bottom had to be trimmed to a height of 1 5/8".

The summer schedule of meets approaches with multi-day meets planned in Charlestown, W. Va., Elgin, II., Lansing, Mich., Bloomington, Mn., and Atlanta, Ga. A.R.C. will repeat its "Meet the A.R.C. Authors" session at the June ARCA 1988 Convention in Charlestown, W. Va., so circle that one to meet the writers you know well from these pages.


Crosley Models 50 & 50A

The Crosley Radio Corporation introduced the Model 50 in 1924, one year before the Crosley Pup, which was featured in A.R.C.'s Sept. 1987 issue. The Model 50 and the Pup used the same Armstrong regenerative circuit, patented on October 6, 1914. The only difference between the two seems to be the slight redesign of the Pup's book Radio News Laboratories for testing and evaluation. It passed, and the company received a certificate of merit, number 951. The Model 50 marked a kind of return of a popular earlier receiver called the Harko Senior Model V.

During this time Mr. Powell Crosley, Jr. took a different view on the manufacture of receivers

condenser to accommodate for its confined quarters. The Model 50 sold for \$14.50, the 50A amplifier for \$18.

Regenerative receivers use a portion of the signal that passes through the detector tube to feed back into the input of the same



from most other companies. He was interested in low-priced receivers and volume sales. In fact, one of his advertising lines was: **"A** Crosley, better costs-less radio."

Most of the Crosley receivers used less than five

tube. In early receivers like this Crosley 50, this was done by means of a tickler coil to amplify the signal.

Four flat metal bars coupled the two units - the 50 and the 50A - together. The receiver by itself had excellent selectivity and very good headset volume. The two-stage amplifier, transformer coupled, allowed for horn-speaker volume and was designed to work with both regenerative and nonregenerative receivers.

In 1925, Crosley submitted the Model 50 to the




Figure 2. The Crosley Model 50 circuit diagram (Richard Arnold.)

tubes. These circuits would rely on feedback to develop the same output volume as the six- or seven-tube Neutrodynes.

From 1922 to 1930, Crosley produced about 129 different models. He favored giving his receivers names such as Ace, Pup, Chum, Playmate, Buddy, Bandbox, Gemchest and Showchest.

Crosley's first AC receiver was a metal box called the Gembox which was made about the same time that Atwater Kent made its metal-cased AC receivers.




Figure 3. The Crosley Model 50-A Amplifier circuit diagram (Richard Amold.)




Crosley Mystery Set: The Model 50 & 50A Combination

Let's mention a Crosley mystery set that appeared in mid-to-late 1925. It's the seldom seen Model 50/50A. This set consisted of the famous one-tube regenerative Model 50 connected by bus-bars to the Model 50A two-tube amplifier...a combination usually found in two small wood cabinets...except this unit appeared together in I would appreciate hearing from collectors who might have one of the Model 50/50A sets in their possession.

Another factor contributing to the Model 50's decline had to be the need for a better tuning device than the already strained, limited "book-type" condenser. The air-waves were becoming

Crosley has a good performing radio in the Model 50 (a good beginning); Crosley's Model VI sales have slowed, allowing a surplus of VI parts and cabinets in the warehouse; Crosley is about to come out with a newer line of radios that would obsolete the 50 and its two-tube amplifier. What would <u>you</u> do?

Powel did what many other radio manufacturers like Atwater Kent, RCA, etc. did at the time...market those parts! Get nd of surplus stuff! And either by design or coincidence, it was discovered that both panels of the Model 50 and companion 50A amp fit rather nicely into the old Model VI cabinet, with two slight modifications: a wooden center post was fitted in the box to accommodate the mounting screws of both panels, and slightly shorter tube socket mounting shafts had to be manufactured (and they were). Crosley offered it to the public to buy (and they didn't). Its life span was brief, for at that time radios with exposed bus-bars and tap switches were "old hat."

I have not found yet any advertising regarding the ill-fated 50/50A Crosley, which indicates just how short its life must have been. I have known of only three to appear in collections, one with a smaller old-style warrantee card in the cover lid describing the Model 50 only. The other two had both cards – one for the 50, and one for the amp. was sold through the Sears Roebuck stores as a Model SR-2 and aimed at the youth market. The compact wooden Model 50 cabinet was shrunk even smaller to a square format, and its panel redesigned to fit the cramped components inside. This would be Crosley's smallest tube-type radio sold in a wooden cabinet.

Franklin Institute Sale, March 24, 1988

On March 24, the Franklin Institute, Philadelphia, auctioned off a large part of its collection of scientific and technological periodicals and serials. These were mostly weekly and monthly technical magazines, many in complete sets with dates ranging from the late 1700's to 1980. Many were in bound volumes. An extensive amount of material was disposed of; some lots covered 20 to 30 three-foot library shelves. Condition of the goods varied from poor to good.

359 lots were auctioned off in a little over three-and-one-half hours for a total realized price of just over \$200,000. Some lots of particular interest to radio historians are listed below. A 10% buyer's premium was charged so all prices should be increased by 10% to reflect actual price paid. The lot number is included for information.

THE PHILCO MODEL 444 "PEOPLE'S SET"

In the 1930s, the radio situation in the U.S.A. was quite different than in most other countries. Most of the European countries were suffering from the Depression and the results of World War I. To the common person a radio, except for a crystal set, was a real luxury item. Most European factory-built radios were more or less hand-built rather than assembly-line manufactured as in the U.S. Consequently, prices were very high and output very low. Also, the European standard of living and wages were quite a bit lower. In some countries, England for example, radios were heavily taxed, and a license was necessary to own one.

The European governments, especially the dictatorships, realized the value of radio in getting propaganda to the people. In Germany and Italy, the governments sponsored manufacture of ultra-cheap radios for the masses. In England, this did not go unnoticed, and the Philco Radio & Television Corporation of Great Britain Ltd. released the Model 269 "The People's Set" in August of 1936. This was strictly a corporate venture with no government sponsorship.

Philco's involvement in England dates from 1931. Six employees worked in a 4,000-sq.-ft. facility modifying U.S.-made sets like the Model 50 to operate from English mains supply and to receive the European long wave broadcast band along with the medium wave. By 1933, Philco was doing some of its own manufacturing at its factory at Perivale, Greenford, in Middlesex, with 210 employees. In '34, Philco opened a second factory and employed 510 people. In 1936, Philco's two factories in Perivale covered 175,000 sq. ft. and employed 4,000 people. Philco continued production after the war and at least through the early 1960's. Other American companies penetrated the English market; Jackson-Bell, Belmont, Pilot, and Atwater Kent were among them. Majestic and Zenith, known as Zetavox in England, even had small factories, but none of these did as well as Philco.

Philco introduced the Model 444 in September of 1936, using the same chassis as the wood cabinet Model 269. The Model 444's cabinet is made of black bakelite and is 16" high, 12 1/2" wide, and 9 1/2" deep. The set weighs 20 lbs. and sold for 6 Pounds, 6 shillings, about \$35 U.S. at that time. Four valves (tubes) are used in a superheterodyne circuit, and the chassis consturction and parts are very similar to Americanmade Philcos. A 6A7 functions as first detector and oscillator, and a 78E as IF amplifier. An unusual English tube, a PEN DD 61 double diode pentode serves as second detector, AVC, and



AF output. The tube was rarely used when new and is now very hard to find. The rectifier is an 80.

The People's Set covers the English medium and long wave broadcast bands of 500-1500 kHz. (600-200 meters) and 150-300 kHz. (2000-1000 meters), operating on 200-260 volts AC, 40-100 cycles. Other versions are battery, AC/ DC, and a three-band model. Reception of the Model 444 is quite good for a four-tube set. Both selectivity and sensitivity are quite good. I can pick up my favorite rock and roll oldies' station, WNDE (1260 kHz) in Indianapolis, without hearing our local station, WSAL (1230 kHz), at the same time. There is not a great deal of volume, but the PEN DD 61 might be weak.

The bakelite People's Sets are among the most collectible radios of that period in England. The general public and art deco collectors have as much interest in these sets as radio collectors. The streamlined design of the cabinet is quite unlike any other radios of that time. I believe it was designed by the famous industrial designer Raymond Loewy, best know for the award-winning 1953 Studebaker and the 1962 Avanti autos. Loewy did design the 1938 Philco (English) D521 "Empire Automatic" (see A.R.C., Oct. '87). The Philco 444 People's Set makes an interesting comparison with the German Volksempfanger (People's Radio), which was reviewed in the May '85 Collector's Corner of A.R.C. The next Collector's Corner will feature the Howard Model O superheterodyne mantel radio of 1931.



WHAT WAS MECHANICAL TELEVISION?

Very often I'm asked about mechanical television because few people know about the pioneering work done during television's early years. If a group of people were asked when television originated, the majority would say either 1939 or 1947, depending on their ages. Some of the older persons in the group might say 1930 or so; of course, they would be fairly accurate.

"Mechanical television" refers to a particular class of equipment used for producing television images of fixed or moving objects. Specifically, the term refers to television cameras or receivers which did not use some form of cathode ray tube. Many of the mechanical receivers were extremely simple, consisting of little more than a motor with rheostat, a scanning disk and a neon lamp acting as the light source. This plus a radio were the makings of a 1930's television set. Each major manufacturing company here and abroad had its own ideas on how the mechanisms should work. They (or the companies) developed many interesting and ingenious designs, using combinations of spinning disks, lenses, mirrors and light sources. Some companies were producing more elaborate forms of receivers containing lens disks, mirror drums, phonic motors, Kerr cells and even dual radio receivers which provided simultaneous sound reception with the picture. Mechanical equipment could produce a better quality image at far less cost. The pictures were brighter, sharper and more stable than those that could be achieved with the cathode ray tubes of the day.

A number of broadcast stations were carrying




Figure 1. Nipkow's scanning disk system of 1884, from "The Mechanics of Television" by the author.

a regular schedule of television programs in the years 1928 through 1930. Stations were usually equipped with one or more studio cameras of the flying spot variety and some form of movie projector. All of the stations' television equipment was mechanical in nature and provided images with 48 or 60 lines. The available resolution limited most transmissions to close-ups of actors or objects in the scene. Figures 2 and 3 show two examples of the image quality which might have been available from these systems. (These images were obtained from equipment developed

by the author which, using modern technology, attempts to duplicate and enhance the early scanning disk systems).

While development of mechanical systems continued, engineers in the United States and abroad were continuing their experiments in electronic television. Gradually the cathode ray tube problems associated with brightness, sensitivity, focusing and synchronizing were solved; by 1936, cathode ray tube equipment was outperforming the best mechanical equipment of the day. More important, mechanical design limitations were preventing further improve-

FIRE IT UP, BUT DON'T BLOW IT UP!

Suppose you had just brought home that brand-new old receiver you've been looking for since you started collecting. After wiping off the dust and cobwebs, it looked even better than it did in the dust and heat of the flea market. It looked so good, in fact, that you couldn't help thinking that it probably worked too. You couldn't resist the temptation to plug it in and find out. So you tried. And you found out all right!

Everything looked fine for a second or two. Then, there was a loud POOF; the lights went out; a big puff of smoke came out of the power supply, and that horrid, acrid smell of a burnedout power transformer filled the room. Oh-oh.

To add insult to injury, your wife called downstairs, "Are you all right, dear? The lights just went out in the kitchen... What's that <u>awful</u> smell?" You were embarrassed to tell her that what might have been a fine working receiver was no more, and you hoped she'd forgotten how much you paid for it.

Well, how else could you find out if it worked or not except by plugging it in and turning it on? Isn't it just another case of you win a few, you lose a few?

Perhaps, but with a little patience and preparation, your receiver might have survived to become the pride of your collection. No guarantees, but it's a good time to make haste slowly.

The first problem is that the receiver was designed when the average line voltage was in the 105-110 volt range. Line voltages have gradually crept up over the years. Today, the line voltage on my workbench is 125 volts, an increase of about 15 percent.

The second problem is that the insulation of 50 years ago was not as good as insulation today, even when new.

Finally, your dream receiver has probably been sitting in somebody's garage or basement for at least 25 of the last 50 years, and the insulation has dried out and/or absorbed moisture. Once the insulation material has broken down and carbonized, a conduction path is established, and the transformer is gone. (Save it, though, in the hope that it can be rewound.)

When you add these facts together, it's not surprising that the power supply did go POOF! Let's pause a minute to see what you could have done differently to save the power transformer in your next receiver.

The basic problem is how to drive out the moisture and rejuvenate the insulation without putting a voltage stress on the insulation. The first approach I thought of was removing the transformer from the chassis and baking it in the kitchen oven. Besides smelling up my wife's kitchen and probably getting lunch late, this would involve disturbing a lot of other components and causing a lot of undesirable hassle. Fortunately, the same thing can be accomplished more easily with the transformer left in place.

In normal operation the heat generated in a transformer comes from two sources: One is from core loss, which is proportional to the voltage across the windings; as we are trying to minimize the voltage stress, we can develop very little heat from this source. The other type of loss is I²R or copper loss. Since this is a current loss, it is independent of voltage. How do you generate full current in the transformer windings without developing full voltage across the windings? Easy: Put a short circuit on the transformer secondaries!

That's easy, too! Begin by removing the rectifier tube. In receivers of the age bracket of interest to us, it's probably a Type 80 with a four-pin base. Find a 4-pin plug in your junk box, and connect a heavy jumper across the two large (filament) pins and across the two small (plate) pins, and plug this into the rectifier socket. Next, locate the tube whose filament is electrically nearest to the power transformer, and replace it with a plug having the filament pins shorted out.

DO NOT plug the receiver into the wall at this time, or you really will blow the power trans-




Figure 1. Receiver Power Transformer Bake-out Circuit.

former sky-high and probably a lot of other things too!

Now, connect the secondary of a 2.5 to 5.0 filament transformer to the receiver power cord (power transformer primary). The filament transformer primary should be connected to the 120 AC outlet, if possible through an adjustable power transformer. Use of an adjustable transformer will make the bake-out process a lot easier. You should also place an AC ammeter in series with the connection between the filament transformer and the receiver power transformer to monitor the primary current. A schematic is shown in Figure 1.

To begin the bake-out process, turn the adjustable transformer to zero, and plug it in the wall. Now turn on the receiver, and slowly increase the output of the adjustable transformer until the input current is equal to the rated value. For a fouror five-tube receiver, this will be about half an ampere. If you know the receiver power consumption and its rated line voltage, you can calculate the proper current by dividing the receiver power by the rated line voltage.

The situation that has been set up is that the short circuits on the secondaries prevent any appreciable voltage from building up across any of the windings. With only 2 1/2 volts on the primary, the maximum voltage across the 300-volt secondary is less than 10 volts, an amount which should not severely stress the insulation.

If you cannot obtain rated primary current with a 2 1/2 volt transformer, try a five-volt filament transformer instead.

Now, let the receiver bake for a while. Continue to monitor the current because it will drop off as the temperature of the transformer rises,




Figure 2. Operational Test Circuit

due to an increase in copper resistance with temperature. Increase the adjustable transformer setting to compensate for this drop.

After an hour or two, the temperature of the power transformer should be comfortably warm to touch. The line current can actually be increased to about 50 percent over the rated input current without overheating the transformer. This is because with the very low input voltage, the power transformer core losses are very close to zero and do not contribute to the temperature rise.

I suggest you let the transformer bake like this for two or three days.

The next step is to apply power to the receiver, but do it gently! Start by removing the shorting plugs; also remove the filament transformer in the primary line. Connect the power transformer primary directly to the output of the adjustable transformer. Continue to monitor the primary line current for signs of trouble. See Figure 2.

Be sure all the tubes are installed in the receiver. Check the Type 80 to see if it has an old style envelope. If it does, temporarily replace it with an 80 with a modern envelope. No sense in taking a chance on ruining an old style tube.

Now the fun begins. With the adjustable transformer at zero, turn on the power and slowly increase the line voltage in 10-volt steps. Leave the voltage setting on each step for at least 10 to 15 minutes or even longer to insure nothing breaks down. The advantage of this is that if a component does break down, the low voltage on the rectifier filament will limit its emission capabilities and prevent excessive current flowing through the rectifier which could damage other components. Leaving the voltage at each step for a while will give the electrolytic capacitors a chance to reform too.

I suggest you do not allow the line voltage to go above 110 if the receiver dates from the 1920's or early 30's, or above 115 if the receiver dates from the late 30's.

Although this bake-out technique is not guaranteed to make each and every radio play, my own experience has been that it helps to save receivers that would otherwise blow sky high – and end up in the spare parts basket.

Name, address and telephone number, count as 6 words, regardless of length. Ham call letters and business name can be included in the 6 words and do not count extra. (Note: "Jim, (111) 111" also counts as 6 words.) So, please include complete name and address in your ads.

After the above "seven" words, 13 words are left for the rest of the text of a free 20-word ad.

BOXED CLASSIFIED AD DETAILS

Boxed classified ads run unchanged for three months or more. No words are free. Ads may be shaded and may include bold and all-capitalized words freely. The ad need not begin with For Sale, etc. Boxed classified ads are placed with the display ads on the lower portion of the page.

BOXED CLASSIFIED AD COSTS

Minimum run is 3 months, prepaid. Nonshaded ads:

10¢ per word for all words,* none free, plus

10¢ per word for each bold word plus 10¢ per word for each all-caps word. Shaded Ads:

20¢ per word for all words* pius 10¢ per word for each all-caps word.

Note: All words in shaded ads are bold.

Add 10¢ per word to above costs.

*Three of the total words can be bold-all-caps at no extra charge.

PHOTO & DRAWING DETAILS

The deadline for ads with drawings or photos is the first of the month.

Although the column on the magazine page you are holding is 2 1/4" wide, the artwork given to the printer has columns 3 9/16" wide. The printing process reduces everything to 63% of the original.

Drawings should fit within the 3 9/16" column. If a drawing is too large or too small, it must be resized photographically for an extra charge. Photos may be of any size since all must be converted to a half-tone for printing; in the process, the photo size can be changed.


PHOTO AND DRAWING COSTS

One-time charge of \$5.00 (no charge for drawing if size is OK) **plus** \$1.00 per 1/2 inch (on artwork) per month.

Drawings also may be requested to be run free and will be printed at the option of A.R.C. and as space permits.
