Two diligent readers, Alan Douglas and Richard Foster, sent corrections to last month's RCA Radiola 26 article. The correct year of introduction was 1925, not 1924. The battery box was included with *all* sets, not an accessory as stated. Also, the use of the meter as shown in the photograph is incorrect. On this model the pin jacks on the panel are for headphones; Models 25 and 28 have pin jacks for a filament voltage meter.

I was surprised that none of you proofreaders out there wrote about my placing Hertz' experiment in the eighteenth century. Of course, 1888 is in the nineteenth century. The A.R.C. auction is rolling along. Bidding by postcard slows down the auction process, but its purpose to allow everyone, not just the first caller, a chance to purchase a desirable sel appears to be working. The auction page is now opposite the inside back cover.

Every radio had its story when it was originally bought. Occasionally one of these stories can be pieced together from surviving fragments, even though you don't know the first owner. This Grebe console, for instance, has a storage tray under the lid, a fine place to keep sales literature, log sheets, and Little Orphan Annie photos from Ovaltine. What can you learn by pawing through this litter?

Well, the original owner, who lived in Au-

For now let me set aside Crosley radios, my usual topic, and bring up a subject whose time has come – namely, the condition descriptions of radios for those who buy, sell and swap. Terms such as "junker," "mint," and "nice" have different meanings to many collectors, and more than one buyer has been upset by the seller's description upon opening a UPS delivery.

I believe that the antique radio collecting hobby is credible enough now to accept a rating

standard for its equipment, just as coin, stamp, firearm and auto collectors do for theirs. As Jim Kreuzer's "Value Guide" column (in 1984, '85 & '86 A.R.C.) helped stabilize antique radio prices, I am attempting to separate "the good, the bad, and the ugly" by advising the following gradations. I heartily welcome your recommendations and comments.

Let me suggest a simple letter-grade system written as (A) or (B) or (C), down to (G) – the (A) for the best and the (G) for the poorest. Radio tubes do not apply.

- A. A "mint" condition set, hardly used, showing no wear, totally original with all working parts, no cabinet refinishing needed, all plated parts bright, clean, as purchased condition.
- B. An "excellent" condition set, totally original with all working parts (including audios), unaltered, unrefinished, showing some wear, some cleaning or touch-up necessary, any repairs done so expertly.
- C. A "very good" set, intact piece with all parts (although some non-original), if not working it can easily be made operable, cabinet in need of some attention, any necessary grille cloth undamaged, chassis has dust (needs cleaning), all knobs there, panel uncracked.
- D. A good example of an "unchecked" set, possibly with a few parts missing or non-original parts of different manufacture installed, some chassis rust, in need of cleaning and repair, usually not working but with an effort can be made operable, audios usually open, some original knobs or dials replaced with "something else" or missing altogether, cabinet in need of refinishing or veneer repair.
- E. A non-working, incomplete set with many parts missing, broken or replaced with another manufacturer's brand; dusty, dirty chassis with rust; cabinet too rough to restore without a major undertaking, everything in need of attention, no guarantees.
- F. A "basket case," incomplete with most parts missing, chassis altered beyond original design, cabinet if any a disaster, usually not worth saving, truly a "junker" desirable only for a few needed parts.
- G. Rusty clock parts mistakenly thought to belong to an old radio.

Every month when he got his assessment sheet in the mail from headquarters, he would use the blank back side for scratch paper. The nice thing about this (now) is that each sheet is dated. So we know that his wife listened to cooking shows and popular music and could hear stations as far away as WIOD Miami. Since the first sheet is dated May 1, 1925, (and arrived a month earlier), it is very likely the set was bought in April. Since some of the log sheets are on the backs of stock and bond prospectuses, the family evidently had some money to spend.

In fact, from reading between the lines of scribbled notes, we can even follow the family through the radio store. "Sonora built-in horn" might indicate a dislike for a separate ungainly speaker. Lists of accessories and prices hint at: "Look, dear, by the time you've added a \$40 horn, \$28 table, batteries and tubes and other odds and ends, you're spending almost \$300. Why not pay a little more and get it all bu l, into one nice-looking piece of furniture?" Apparently they did.

You can also picture the fast-talking salesman, spouting technical phrases while the bewildered couple try to take notes. "Straight-line F" and "2 stage" came through all right, but "griding"??? Well, what novice radio listener ever heard of a grid leak?

VINTAGE TELEVISION

EARLY TRANSISTOR TVS

Although most TV collectors consider early tube-type televisions as the most interesting, there is a small but growing demand for the early transistorized TVs. While Philco was producing its printed circuit board, tube-type Predicta line of large vacuum-tube televisions, it was also scooping the industry with the first batteryoperated portable TV.

In July 1959, Philco notified its service people and sales outlets of a revolutionary product, "the new lightweight, fully transistorized television receiver" which "caught the industry not just by surprise, but in open-mouthed astonishment." The Philco Safari Model H-2010, shown in Figure 1, was born, TV could




Figure 2. Motorola Astronaut Model 19P1-1, rear chassis was revealed with the Astronaut name and view. Special rechargeable battery strapped-in, at bottom. logo set at the bottom left of the plastic

then ride the autos, trains, boats and airplanes, with a promised picture-perfect reception. The Safari had a two-inch picture tube, Type 2EP4, and used an optical system to enlarge and project the image to the viewer. The 10AT10 (1960 release) chassis was powered by either 117VAC, or a 7.5 volt P-560 battery. This rechargeable alkaline battery (unfortunately discontinued about ten years ago) powered the set for four hours, and then was to be recharged for about twenty hours.

The Safari's picture image was designed to be viewed from a distance of about five feet; this image was supposed to appear to be the same size as that seen on a 14-inch direct-view set. This is

made possible by a parabolic mirror which projects the image toward the viewer. However, in use, the top and sides of the image were clipped if the set is viewed from more than a couple of feet away. The Philco Safari used 21 transistors plus two rectifier tubes, both Type 5642, the only vacuum tubes used besides the picture tube. It was produced with both brown and black cabinets; at the modest price of about \$250, the 10AT10 was a good buy for the family on the go!

Although RCA, Emerson and GE had demonstrated prototypes of transistor televisions, the next set released was a Motorola. This second entry into the new field of transistor TVs was the Astronaut, marketed and sold in early 1961. The set was large and heavy; it looked like a black suitcase, but when the front cover was removed, the 19" CRT (Type 19AEP4) was revealed with the Astronaut name and logo set at the bottom left of the plastic.




Figure 3. The first Sony, Model B-301W, has 8 1/2" CRT.

The TV had 25 transistors and only one vacuum tube – a 1S2A HV rectifier. Portability was made possible by designing a special recharge-




Figure 2. Crosley Model 11 100U. This 1951 model was one of a variety of Crosleys with an airplane dial-like face and available in several colors. Note the short fin-like designs on the side of the case.

The first battery-operated portable television was the *Safari*, introduced by Philco in July 1959. Motorola followed with their *Astronaut* in 1961, as did Sony with their *Model B-301W*.

able silver-cadium 18v battery, shown in Figure 2. It was interesting that many of the transistors in this set were pushed into transistor sockets; this made removal for testing and replacement much easier.

Apparently, the Astronaut was a problem to fix and stay fixed. Although many Safaris are still playing well (on AC), the Motorolas were quickly destined for dear. Many Mark

destined for doom. Many TV shops remember the sets playing for a few hours at most! And, Motorola was willing to recall and give a refund for as many Astronauts as possible; this in a time when "Caveat Emptor" was the law of the land.

Not to be outdone by American manufacturers, the Japanese company Sony produced a Model 8-301W transistorized television in late 1961. This set, shown in Figures 3 and 4, was compact and well-made. The CRT was a special 8 1/2" Type 210HB4, which was driven by two 1DK1 rectifiers, used in a doubler to produce 6000 volts. Besides these two tubes, 23 transistors and 18 diodes were used. An AC line cord could be used or a special wet battery-pack attached to the back of the set, giving about three hours of use. Unfortunately, when found, these lead-acid batteries are usually in poor condition and corroded. Using ar auxiliary kit, the viewer could plug his TV into 12VDC from an automobile or boat battery.


The tuner had 14 positions; channels 2-13 plus two spares which could be filled in, if and when, UHF programming was available in the viewer's area. Unlike its predecessors, the 8-301W used many standard transistors; Sony had made an effort to send any unusual or special parts to all of their national distributors before the set was marketed. The TV was mcdular in design; once the outside sheet metal was removed, the internal i²C boards could be easily removed and repaired or replaced.

Many collectors have obtained the Philco Safari, which seems to be rela-

tively common, but most have never seen a Motorola Astronaut. Initially produced in limited numbers, coupled with the destruction of many sets, the Astronaut is probably the most difficult early transistor TV to be found. The Sony has a 1950's look, and recently it has found a place on the antiques and collectible circuit. The 8-391W appears to be the most common of the three sets mentioned; however, this could be deceiving. The Sony has only recently been displayed and sold, so many of the existing sets may still be in circulation, not locked into collections.

If you come across any early transistor televisions, they may be just what you need to spice up your TV collection. And, if you really don't like the non-vacuum tube sets, maybe they would make good trading material at the next radio meet!

COLLECTING 1950'S RADIOS BY DESIGN BY WILLIAM P. SURECK

The rise in popularity of the 1950's Deco style radio has paralleled the ever-increasing interest in the artistic designs characteristic of that decade.

Companies including Crosley, Arvin and Admiral created interesting sets that incorporated aerodynamic and freeform (nonsymmetrical) designs mimicking other consumer goods of the era.

These radios were often marketed in a carnival-like variety of colors that served to transcend the more traditional brown or white radios of earlier years, excluding Catalins. Bakelite and metal cases were factory painted colors such as red, green, peach, pink, blue and turquoise, while plastic sets were molded in these colors. Such ra-



painted colors such as Figure 1. Dahlberg Pillow Speaker Radio Model 430-D1, ca. 1955. A dime red, green, peach, pink, was required for operation as the customer rested; speakers were placed blue and turquoise, while under one's pillow and the inverted dial could be read in bed. Shape even plastic sets were molded seemed to simulate a pillow.

dios tended to offset typical blond wood and wire furnishings or complement the brightly colored appliances, upholstery and wallpaper used in the 1950's.

While the initial impact of these radios may be their bold colors, closer inspection reveals design details that mirror the emergence of the Atomic Age jet propulsion and finally the Space Age.

Echoing auto design of the period, radios can be found that have fins, a radar-like face, and imitation starburst dials. Still others have rocketshiplike dial pointers and chrome accents that suggest a 50's-style dashboard.

Examples of radios with these characteristics and also in excellent condition are not very common, at least in the Chicago area. Perhaps these radios were considered more disposable (being plastic), less expensive, and less like furniture than radios of earlier vintage.

Colored 1950's radios with above-average design are in such demand,

SHOPPING FOR RADIOS AND PARTS "STICKER SHOCK!" (ESPECIALLY FOR THE BEGINNING COLLECTOR) BY RON RAMIREZ

In these days of inflation and high prices, "sticker shock" is something we all face when purchasing that new car, appliance or even a house. But have you ever been hit with it when buying parts for that old set you just have to fix this week so you can hear what it sounds like?

For my recently acquired classic Philco Model 70 and a couple other sets needing a good restoration, I went to my local distributor to pick up some parts with which to fix them. The parts filled the bottom fourth of a small sack about the size of a lunch bag. I estimated the cost at around thirtyfive dollars. The man at the counter totaled up my order and announced the cost – nearly seventy dollars!

"Sticker shock!" I felt my jaw drop, like Wile E. Coyote's does in those Road Runner cartoons. I felt a little sick for a few days afterward. My wife was not shy in letting me know how she felt more than a little unhappy about it!

The sad fact is that the local distributors are selling parts like 10 uF, 450v electrolytics for around three dollars and 0.47 uF, 600v capacitors for over six dollars. And, as most of you know, many of the old sets use lots of 0.47 uF capacitors!

But there's good news! You don't have to pay outrageous prices for your parts. All you need is a little patience and a willingness to do business with some of the mail order firms offering electronics parts. Antique Electronics Supply, 688 West First St., Tempe, Arizona 85281, specializes in parts for the collector, as does Puett Electronics, P.O. Box 28572, Dallas, Texas 75228. Some other parts' suppliers which carry a general line of electronics parts, including some things we collectors can use, include MCM Electronics, 858 E. Congress Park Dr., Centerville, Ohio 45459, and Hanifin Electronics, P.O. Box 188, Bridgeport, Pa. 19405. These are just a few examples; many more can be found in this issue of A.R.C. Send for their catalogs, and compare their prices with your local distributor's; you may get a pleasant surprise!

"Sticker shock" can also hit you when you go

according to one Chicago-based antique dealer, that brown or white radios from the 1930's and 1940's are being bought by "artistic types," spray-painted gaudy multicolors and passed as authentic 1950's (or earlier) colored models.

Hopefully, this is not a trend that will compromise the preservation of what is both a reflection of popular culture and a form of mass-produced into the area antique shops, flea markets, etc. A collector friend once told me about a Super-Zenith VIII that a certain man had in his house. I went to look at it; when I asked him what he wanted for it, he said, "Fifteen hundred dollars!" And he wasn't kidding!

Most antique shops, flea markets, and private owners will bargain with you on the price. As an example, on a recent trip I went into an antique shop and found a Philco Model 20 in a lowboy console, priced at \$18. My wife was with me, and I told her, "Watch this." I found the shop owner and told him I would give him \$10. He said, "\$15"; I held firm at \$10. Finally he told me, "Doggone it, give me the ten. You knew you were going io buy it anyway!"

Those relatively new to the hobby need to get an idea of the worth of the radios they want to collect. I suggest a good price guide such as Fathauer's Radio Collector's Directory and Price Guide [Unfortunately, this book is currently out of print, Editor]. After collecting for a while, you will get an idea of what most radios are worth. And if you get into a situation where you find a set you want to buy and the owner will not bargain with you on the price which you feel is too high, walk off; sometimes that will change the owner's mind. If this does not work, you may later find another radio at a better price. I wouldn't pay \$1,500 for a Super-Zenith VIII, and you shouldn't either, unless you are super rich!

Also, you have to consider the condition of a set when you purchase it. I only paid \$10 or the Philco Model 20 because of its poor condition. Obviously, sets in better condition bring more money.

And so, whether you are shopping for parts or looking for sets, learn to be a bargain hunter! Invest some money in postage; write to the fine folks advertising here in A.R.C., and take advantage of their services. Last but not least – don't let "sticker shock" shock you!

Repairing the TRF Radio

This is the third part of a series on basic AC radio repair. Jim Fred has been involved in radio for over fifty years, and in this series presents useful hints for both the new collector and the veteran. Antique Radio Classified is please to have Jim contribute this series.

Refer to parts 1 and 2 of this series (Feb. & April 1988) for details on tools, test equipment, safety, etc. IMPORTANT: do not plug the radio in until you have read the safety tips and warnings in these previous installments! (Editor)

Before starting to troubleshoot and repair a radio, you have to be able to identify the components and read a schematic drawing, sort of a road map of your radio. Certain symbols represent each coil, capacitor, resistor, etc. in your radio, making it possible to draw the component symbols on a sheet of paper and draw lines to represent connecting wires. To a beginner with his first radio, this may be confusing. For this reason, some pictures of radio parts with the schematic symbols are shown, allowing you to identify most of the radio components. Take a look at Figures 1 and 2 and become familiar with the appearance of the various components used in AC radios.

You also should know something about the different circuits used in radios before starting to repair a radio. Radios made before the 1930's included types such as crystal sets, regenerative receivers, neutrodynes, TRF's (Juned Badio Erequency receivers), and superheterodynes. Since this series will concentrate on radios built in the 30's, we will only consider TRF and superheterodyne circuits.


THE TRF


The TRF, the simpler of the two, was introduced in the early 1920's. In a TRF receiver, one or more stages of radio frequency amplification precede the detector stage, and all the tuned circuits are tuned to the same frequency. During the 1930's, many TRF radios were built because of the depressed economy; people had very little money to spend on a radio. The TRF could be sold for less money than a superheterodyre because it had less parts and took less labor. When I had my radio shop in 1937, I sold a small TRF set for only \$6.95. However, time proved the superhet to be superior in selectivity and sensitivity, and the TRF became obsolete.

The last TRF I remember was built after World War II by the Kingston Radio Corp , Kokomo, In., for the Montgomery Ward Company. I had a small part in designing this radio. The set was housed in a steel cabinet and came in six different colors.

Since the TRF radio was an important part of the AC-DC set production during the 1930's, we will troubleshoot a typical four-tube model this time and go to the superhet in the next column.

I will not go into electron flow nor attempt to analyze each stage as to signal flow. I will emphasize voltage measurements and resistancecontinuity measurements as a means of isolating (Continued or following page)

the defective parts. Repairing radios should be fun. You do not need the knowledge of a radio set designer to repair one.

CHECK THE COMPONENTS

Your eyes will become the most important tool you have when you look at the components in a radio chassis. Look for burned or charred resistors and capacitors with bulging ends or wax leaking from the cardboard tube. Until World War II, most small capacitors were either mica types molded in brown plastic, or they were paper dielectric types placed in cardboard tubes. The tubes were sealed by pouring hot wax into each end of the tube. If these capacitors became defective, they would overheat and melt the wax. If your set has cardboard tubular capacitors, it wouldn't be a bad idea to replace all of them with new ones before you start to repair the set. Modern capacitors will not look at all like the old ones; they are dipped into orange, blue, green, brown and other color plastic coatings. You might also find molded plastic tubular capacitors in green, black, yellow and other colors.

CHECK THE LINE CORD

After you have corrected the visual defects under the chassis, go to the line cord. Has the rubber insulation hardened? Is the cord frayed, cracked or damaged?

There were three basic kinds of power cords. One was the two-conductor rubber or vinyl insulated kind sometimes called "Zip Cord." The second type was like number one except that it had a silk or cotton fabric covering. The third type was the "Resistor Line Cord." This cord was larger in diameter than type two because it may have two conductors plus a wire-wound resistor inside a fabric cover. The resistor was wound on a flexible asbestos cord and insulated with an asbestos to 350 ohms, and was six feet long. While operating, the cord would become quite warm. New resistor line cords are no longer made; unless you can find good N.O.S. (new old stock) cords, you must use a regular cord and a fixed wire-wound resistor.

Some AC-DC sets will have fixed wire-wound resistors, but others will have a ballast tube in the filament circuit. A ballast tube is a resistance wire wound on a mica form, soldered into a tube base, and covered with a steel can. It looks like a metal tube and gets very hot when operating. These tubes are no longer made, but you can still find them if you try. These ballast tubes can also be replaced with wire-wound fixed resistors.

TESTING THE LINE CORD & HEATERS




Figure 3. The circuit schematic of a typical TRF radio.

Refer to the typical TRF receiver circuit shown in Figure 3 for the tests following. Although your receiver may not be exactly like the one shown, it will have the same general components.

If the line cord passes your physical inspection, it is best to check it out with your ohmmeter. Set your ohmmeter to its lowest range. Put the black lead to "Y" and the red lead to chassis or "B-". Operate the off-on switch S1: the ohmmeter pointer should swing from high ohms to zero ohms. If this happens, one conductor of the line cord and the switch are OK. If not, you can use the ohmmeter to find the bad component. If the indication is OK, move the black lead to "X" and check the tube filaments. (In AC-operated tubes the filaments are often called "heaters"; these terms may be used interchangeably.) If all the tube heaters and resistor R2 are good, the meter will read on the left-hand-side of the scale. If you get no meter indication, pull the tubes, one at a time, from the tube sockets. Check for continuity between the large pins on each tube. The older 4-, 6-, and 7-pin tubes always have two large pins for filaments or heaters. If you don't get a reading, replace each bad tube with a new one. If the tube heaters are all good, find the 290-

ohm resistor, R2, and measure it. This resistor could be part of the line cord or a ceramic wirewound resistor mounted on or under the chassis. If it is open – i.e., has no continuity, replace it with a new 300-ohm, 35- to 50-watt wire-wound resistor. If it is a part of the line cord, I recommend using a regular line cord and adding the wirewound resistor. Connect these items as shown in the circuit diagram. Since the resistor will get quite warm, place it in the best possible place to prevent damage to the cabinet or other parts.

CHECK THE AC BYPASS CAPACITOR

If C5 is shorted, fuses will blow when you plug in the line cord. If C5 is open, the set may have static sounds in the speaker when you get the set to play. If you have followed my previous advice, you may already have replaced this capacitor.

CHECK THE "B" POWER SUPPLY

Next place the black lead from the ohmmeter to chassis or B-, and place the red lead to the junction of C1+ and R1. If your ohmmeter reads zero resistance or a very low value, replace C1. A good capacitor will cause the ohmmeter pointer to kick upscale as the internal battery in the ohmmeter puts a charge into C1. If you get this kick, proceed to place the red lead at the junction of C2+ and R1. If you get an upscale kick here, measure the resistance of R1 which should be 2000 ohms. If the value measures more than plus or minus 20% from this value, replace it with a 2000-ohm, three-watt resistor. If all the above indications were OK, you are now ready to plug in the radio.

Note: On the schematic drawing you will note the values of the resistors. For instance: With R1-2M, before World War II, M indicated 1000; after World War II, M was used to indicate 1,000,000 or 1 megohm, and K now indicates 1000 ohms. In the present time, resistors under 1000 ohms are usually indicated 200; 200K would indicate 200,000 ohms, and 200M would indicate 200 megohms or 200,000,000 ohms.

FINALLY, POWER IT UP

It is best for your own safety to use an isolation transformer between the wall outlet and the radio plug. (See the last column on page 6 in April's A.R.C. for our reasons.) Turn the switch on, and watch the tubes slowly light. You may now hear a loud 60-cycle hum; if turning the volume control has no effect on the loudness of the hum, this indicates that the filter capacitors C1 and C2 are open. An open capacitor is hard to detect with an ohmmeter so the listening test is best. If you get the loud hum, replace C1 and C2 with new capacitors of equal (or no more than two times) the capacitance value and at the same (or greater) voltage.

CHECK THE AUDIO OUTPUT STAGE

The 12A7 is a dual purpose tube. Pins KR and PR comprise a half-wave rectifier that supplies "B+" voltages for the plates and screen grids of the other tubes. The second section of the 12A7 is the pentode audio output to the speaker. Set the range selector switch of your VOM at least 200 VDC or more. With the black lead on chassis or B-, put the red lead on PA of the tube socket.

Find PA by placing the two large pins away from you. PA will be the first pin in a clockwise direction. Your VOM should indicate between 80 and 100 VDC. If it doesn't, switch the VOM to a resistance range, unplug the radio, and measure the speaker coil, T3, resistance. It should measure between 800 and 2000 ohms. If you get the proper voltage of PA, switch the red lead to G2, which should read 10 volts more than PA. Next check pin KA for bias voltage which should be 13.5 VDC. If you do not get this value, check resistor R3 for 1200 ohms and C3 for shorts. Replace either if defective. If all measurements are OK, touch a finger to the grid cap on top of the 12A7 tube. You will hear a hum if this tube is working properly. If you do not hear a hum, test the 12A7 in a tube tester. Since you have checked voltages, resistors, and capacitors, the audio output stage should work.

CHECK THE DETECTOR STAGE

With the audio stage working, move on to the 6C6. The 6C6 is a pentode tube operating as a detector. You can check for voltages on P, S, and SU-K. You should have 80 to 100 volts on P; on S you should have 40 to 80 volts and on SU-K about 3 volts. If the voltages aren't there, check the associated resistors R5, R6, and R8, also capacitors C5, C6, and C7. If all is OK, put your finger on the grid cap of the 6C6 and you should hear a hum or sound of some kind.

CHECK THE RF AMPLIFIER STAGE

Now, proceed to the 6D6 which is the RF amplifier and antenna coupling tube. Again, check the voltage on P; it should be 80 to 100 VDC; S should have 80 to 100 VDC; SU-K are in the volume control circuit, and the voltage will vary as the contact arm of R7 moves from one of the control to the other, i.e., from the antenna end to the SU-K end. If the voltages all check OK and a resistance test of the volume control is OK. attach a piece of insulated wire at least 15-feet long to the antenna connection. Turn the volume control clockwise, and try to tune in a station. Switch S2-S3 is a selector switch to a long-wave frequency of 140 Kc to 340 Kc, or the broadcast band from 600 Kc to 1500 Kc. At this time your radio should be playing.

Next time we will troubleshoot and repair a superheterodyne receiver.




