

By renewing early, you get an extra free issue and save us the expense of mailing reminders to you. Many thanks!

On to this month's issue... The old headphones on our cover remind us that the sounds coming from our radios were not always hi-fi. Richard Arnold contributed an article about the unsung headphone.

Jim Fred's popular series on AC radio repair continues this month with coverage of the superhet. As well as a step-by-step approach to getting those old radios to play again, Jim also includes a bit of theory (not too much) on the various radio circuits in each of his installments.

Two articles on classic E.H. Scott radios appear this month. Henry Rogers sent in a story with photos on his acquisition of a Scott Allwave Model 15. Norman Braithwaite describes a number of tips on restoring the performance of these fine receivers.

Auction Report features Frank Krantz' report on a New Jersey auction; while radios went from \$25 to \$205, a large paper maché "Nipper" (the R.C.A. dog) sold for \$525. The Photo Review and four pages from the Times Square Auto Supply Radio Catalog are included this month.

The first round of the A.R.C. auction has concluded; see the report on page seven. The interest in the auction was high, but as with many auctions, there were a lot of lookers, but not many bidders. I am open to suggestions for improvements to this potentially useful service. The growing size of A.R.C. coupled with the postal increases a few months ago resulted in a reexamination of subscription rates for foreign subscribers. As I wrote to them last month, all of the increment in the rates is due to postage. Perhaps the dollar devaluation will ease the \$55.00 per year air mail foreign subscribers, including Canada and Mexico, has been established at \$25.00. Delivery takes an extra two weeks or so to Canada, but two or more months elsewhere. About 3% of subscribers are outside the U.S.

I again mention radio meets here for many reasons. Meets are a lot of fun as well as a place to meet other collectors, many whom you already know, have talked with on the phone, and/or have corresponded with. There is opportunity to learn more through these contacts, the meet's seminars and museums. Often you can visit collections close to the meet. Also you will be amazed at your first meet by the array of cld radios coming out of trunks and vans. After spending years traveling from antique dealer to antique dealer and following up on local acs, seeing thirty (to 150 or so at Canandaigua) radioonly sellers in one place is overwhelming! Try to make one.

Although the big meet coming up is the 27th Annual A.W.A. Historical Radio Conference in Canandaigua, N.Y. (750+ collectors), also look over the *Coming Radio Events* page for everts near you. The recent meet I attended at the New England Museum of Wireless and Steam in Rhode Island was a success: 150+ radio collectors attended. My next trip will be to Canandaigua; see you there.

Repairing the Superhet Radio

This is the fourth part of a series on basic AC radio repair. Jim Fred has been involved in radio for over fifty years, and in this series presents useful hints for both the new collector and the veteran. Antique Radio Classified is please to have Jim contribute this series.

Refer to parts 1 and 2 of this series (Feb. & April 1988) for details on tools, test equipment, safety, etc. IMPORTANT: do not plug the radio in until you have read the safety tips and warnings in these previous installments! (Editor)

In our last column we told you how to troubleshoot and find defective components in your typical four-tube TRF receiver. This time we will lead you through a typical five-tube Superheterodyne receiver.

THE SUPERHETERODYNE

The name Superheterodyne has been applied to an improved type of radio that has better selectivity and sensitivity than a TRF radio. In a TRF radio the signal frequency, received on the antenna, is amplified by two or more tubes before the audio frequency is recovered in the detector. The audio frequency is amplified by the audio output tube and is applied to the speaker which allows us to hear the radio program. In a Superhet receiver the incoming signal frequency is converted (by the heterodyne process) to a different frequency, usually, but not always, to a lower intermediate frequency, called the IF frequency. A more efficient amplifier can be designed for a fixed frequency signal than can be made for a wide band of frequencies, i.e., the broadcast band. The audio frequencies stay with the IF frequency and is removed in the detector. It is amplified by the audio output tube and applied to the speaker as in the TRF receiver.

THE FILAMENT & POWER CIRCUITRY

If you will look at the Superhet circuit shown here, you will see that the filament circuit is so similar to the TRF set that we will not repeat the troubleshooting procedure outlined last time. There is the addition of a pilot light bulb, shunted by resistor R1. R1 provides the proper voltage drop for the pilot light filament. If the light bulb is burned out, replace it before proceeding.

You will see that the rectifier tube is different. The TRF set had a half-wave rectifier with an anode and a cathode. The 25Z5 tube, used here, has two anodes and two cathodes. The 25Z5 tube can be connected several different ways, but in this set the anodes are connected in parallel, as are the cathodes, effectively making it a two-element tube. This tube is connected as a half-wave rectifier.

THE ELECTRODYNAMIC SPEAKER

Another difference in the Superhet radio is the speaker. The TRF radio has a magnetic speaker and the Superhet radio has an electrodynamic speaker. The word "Electro" means that the magnetic field for the speaker is supplied electrically. Later radios have a PM (permanent magnet) speaker whose magnetic field is supplied by an Alnico metal magnet. More about this later. The electromagnetic speaker used here has a 2500-ohm field coil. All dynamic speakers have another low resistance winding called a "voice coil." The voice coil on pre-WWII speakers had an impedance of three to four ohms measured at a frequency of 1000 cycles per second, and a DC resistance of 1.5 to 2 ohms. Since the voice coil has a very low impedance and the audio output tube has a plate impedance of 2500 ohms, it is necessary to use an impedance matching transformer between the plate and the voice coil. This is T1.

The speaker field is connected from B+ to ground. Current flowing through the winding produces a strong magnetic field. The filter choke and filter capacitors, C2 and C3, smooth out the pulsating DC produced by the rectifier tube. Troubleshoot this portion of the circuit just as you did the TRF set.

CHECK THE OUTPUT STAGE

The 43 tube is a pentode audio output tube. The voltage on pin "P" should be about 110 VDC. Capacitor C4, connected from plate to ground bypasses high audio frequencies to ground which improves the sound from the speaker. To test C4, unsolder the ground connection, turn the set on, and measure for voltage between ground and the unsoldered end of the capacitor. If you measure any voltage at all, replace the capacitor. C5 can be checked the same way. Capacitor C15 can be checked for leakage by unsoldering the capacitor lead to pin "G," and with the set turned on measure for voltage between ground and the unsoldered end of the capacitor. Resistor R 3 is the arid return resistor, and R 4 is the cathode bias resistor. Capacitor C 6 is the cathode bypass which improves the tone and volume of the radio. Check it for shorts and leakage too. The voltage on "K" should be -12 to -18. The voltage on "S" should be between 100 and 120 VDC. If everything checks OK up to this point, touch a metal screwdriver blade to "G" of the 43 tube. It should produce a hum in the speaker. If it does proceed to the 75 type tube. If it doesn't, you will need to troubleshoot until you find the problem.

CHECK THE DETECTOR STAGE

The 75 tube is a duo-diode triode used as the second detector. R5 is the plate load resistor. The voltage on pin "P" should read 40 to 60 VDC. Remember what I said in the last column about resistance values. On pre-WWII schematics "M" indicates thousands of ohms, while after WWII "M" indicates millions of ohms. Therefore, R3 will be 500,000 ohms, and R4 will be 650 ohms, etc. Resistor R6 is the cathode bias resistor, and capacitor C7 is the cathode bypass capacitor. Check these as you did on the type 43 tube.

CHECK THE AUTOMATIC VOLUME CONTROL (AVC) CIRCUIT

Now we have another new concept. Automatic Volume Control or AVC. If you have listened to pre-1930 radio sets, you have observed a great deal of fading or a drop-in speaker volume. You may have rushed to the radio to turn up the volume, but then moments later the volume was too loud. This was very annoying until an engineer designed a circuit that eliminated the problem. By designing a vacuum tube called a variable "MU" or variable gain control tube, he was able to increase the gain of a tube when the signal faded and decrease the gain of a tube when the signal strength increased. The circuit doesn't work perfectly unless you control the gain of three or four tubes, but the simplest AVC circuit made a big improvement in an inexpensive radio. In a simple way, we can say that the IF signal is rectified by the diodes "PD" and the cathode "K", this voltage is smoothed by resistors R8 and R9 and capacitors C8, C9, and C10. The resulting minus DC voltage is applied to the 6D6 grid and controls the tubes gain.

Proceed to check resistors R7, R8, R9, and

replace any that are more than plus or minus 20% from their indicated value. Check C8, C9, and C10 for leakage. Because the AVC voltage is quite low, typically 0 to -5 VDC, these capacitors must have no leakage.

CHECK THE IF AMPLIFIER STAGE


If everything checks OK in the AVC circuit, move on to the 6D6 tube. This tube is the IF amplifier tube, a pentode remote cutoff vacuum tube. IF-1 and IF-2 are the IF transformers. Check for DC voltage on pins "P° and "S." It should measure 90 to 100 volts. Voltage cn "SU" and "K" will vary with rotation of the volume control R12. If these voltages are OK, touch the grid cap of the 6D6 and you should hear a hum indicating that all is well from the 6D6 grid to the speaker.

CHECK THE CONVERTER CIRCUIT

The 6A7 is a very special tube. Its technical name is "Pentagrid Converter." Pertagrid means that the tube has five grids. Converter means that the tubes function is to convert the RF signal frequency received at the antenna to an Intermediate Frequency (IF) as referred to at the beginning of this story.

The volume control R12 changes the cathode bias which changes the amplification of the 6A7 and 6D6 tubes. It also shunts part of the incoming signal to ground to prevent overloading the 6A7. Grid G2, cathode K, and the plate P plus capacitor C11, resistor R11, coil T2, and runing capacitor C17 form the local oscillator circuit.

The RF signal frequency is tuned by coils T3 and variable capacitor C16 to the frequency of the station you want to receive. The local oscillator produces a frequency which is 456 Kc higher than the signal frquency. For instance, you are (Continued)

tuning in a station on 1000 Kc, your local oscillator frequency is 1456 Kc. The difference frequency is 456 Kc which is accepted by the IF transformer and amplified through the 6D6 tube.

Now check the DC voltages on the 6A7 tube. Pin "P" should have 90 to 100 volts, pin "S" should have 60 to 90 votls. Pin "G1" will have minus 3 to minus 6 volts; this is the oscillator grid bias voltage. Pin "G2" will have 90 to 100 volts. Check R10, R11, R12, also C11, C12, C13, and C14 as you did the other components in the set.

If everything checks OK, you should be able to tune in a station. If not, RF alignment and IF alignment may be necessary; you will need more test equipment to do the required alignment work. We shall try to provide you with the proper information and procedure next time.




Figure 3. Complete "A" Voltage Schematic, Corrected.

too low. Of course, the first caller gets a bargain, but after a dozen or so calls, the selier realizes that he made a mistake. The auction helps the seller determine the value of his item.

 Good for A.R.C.: A 10% commission was being taken by A.R.C. to cover the costs of the extra telephone line for the auction, running the auction and something (hopefully) left over to go toward A.R.C.'s ongoing expenses.

Although there was a great deal of activity on the auction telephone line, the number of bids which came in was way less than expected. Of course, limiting the bidding to postcards (which simplifies the running of the auction and results in a hard copy of all bids) slowed it down considerably. It was because of the mail delay (up to a week) that it was difficult to put a deadline on the bidding, which is when most of the bidding takes place.

A.R.C. is considering changes to the auction, including leaving bids on the answering machine. Let us know your thoughts. (The Editor)

CLASSIC RADIOS

Restoration of Performance in E.H. Scott Receivers of the Early and Mid-1930's BY NORMAN S. BRAITHWAITE

Although I wrote this article primarily for the benefit of those collecting and restoring early and mid-1930's Scott receivers, the problems and solutions here apply to many other sets made by other manufacturers.

Some of the most common problems I find in

the early and mid-1930's E.H. Scott sets, especially the Allwave 15 and Imperial (Allwave 23), include oscillator failure (oscillator will drop out at the low end of the higher bands), lack of sensitivity, and poor selectivity. In one extreme case, an Imperial had an oscillator which cut out at the low end of all bands and would not oscillate at all on the high band. Changes in the circuits and construction practices substantially eliminated these problems in the Philharmonics and later sets.

Initially, the source of these problems was difficult to locate; however, after extensive investigation, the causes became apparent. The primary cause was resistance in the oscillator and IF circuits. The resistance develops in electrical connections made through rivets and machine screws.

The most critical of these connections are located on the tuning capacitor. Electrical connections to each stator in the tuning capacitor are made by a machine screw which passes through a phenolic insulator. After fifty years, the phenolic insulator shrinks enough to allow a small gap to develop between the screw and a solder lug. Light corrosion sets in, and resistance develops (Continued at bottom of following page)

fect. I knew the dealer would want a fortune for this set, but thought I would ask anyway.

"How much for this radio?" I asked, trying to seem casual and not too interested.

had to buy it as part of an estate sale to get the stuff I really wanted." He paused. "Fifty dollars!"

"Oh," I said, carrying the casual, not interested act too far as we walked out of the shop and drove back to our parents' home.

Of course, that was a sleepless night full of doubt about my ability to recognize a good deal even if it were carrying a placard around its neck. Thinking of all the other collectors with that ability who were at that moment buying the Allwave 15 fueled my insomnia.

At 9 AM the next day, we again went to Maritime Antiques, and the shopkeeper, of course, recognized us. "Are you going to buy that radio today?" he asked.

"Yes," I said.

"Good! I'm glad to get rid of it. Fifty dollars!"

I paid him quickly and loaded my choice treasure into the truck. Returning home to Nevada, I thought along the way what a strange person that shopkeeper was.

Upon complete examination, I was even more delighted with the Scott. It didn't work for the antique dealer because he had the antenna wire connected to the GND post. The set performed as well as it looked. Also, when testing all the tubes, I discovered that each tube had its original sales sticker dated 1935 still attached. All original tubes? Maybe. An envelope found inside the cabinet is addressed to a woman in Michigan and postmarked 1947. The set was obviously well cared for since new and probably in her estate.

Well, twelve years later, I still have the Scott Allwave 15 with Serial No. M-416. It still works perfectly, testimony to the quality of set which Scott built back in the early 30's and later. The cabinet is still mint, showing the quality of the

in the connection. The tuner must be removed to fix this problem. All connections to the stators should be cleaned and tightened. I will even solder the heads of the screws to the solder lugs.

Small resistances also develop in riveted connections used for ground returns. Scott riveted solder lugs to the chassis using a lockwasher between them to improve the electrical connection. However, after the years of service, some resistance may develop. The resistance in these connections may be only a fraction of an ohm, but this is enough to noticeably reduce sensitivity and selectivity in the RF and IF circuits.

These riveted ground returns may be improved by soldering a bridge from the solder lug to the chassis. Since the chassis is steel, it must be cleaned very well (such as with steel wool or sandpaper) for rosin core solder to adhere. Acid core solder should not be used. A heavy duty soldering gun is necessary to heat the chassis adequately. If steel wool is used to clean the chassis, all steel wool fragments must be removed before applying power to the set.

After ground returns have been fixed, the IF alignment should be checked and adjusted as

woodwork that Scott supplied with his sets Scott radios are examples of what kind of radio receiver could be built when the manufacturer was himself interested in radio; while catering to the higher priced clients, he was interested in building the best quality radio possible.

required. A simple and accurate method of checking the IF alignment on the Imperials and Philharmonics without using test equipment is as follows:

1) Tune the receiver to a strong local station.

2) Set the selectivity/fidelity control 1/3 of the rotation from selective.

3) Rotate the sensitivity control through its range.

The tuning indicator will not vary if the IF adjustments are correct. Additionally, with the antenna removed, volume and sensitivity full on, and the selectivity/fidelity control as above, a rushing sound should be audible over the whole of each band. If the set fails either of these tests, IF alignment should be conducted as described in Rider's volumes 14 and 15.

Once these procedures have been accomplished, the performance of a rebuilt Scott receiver should be impressive and should rival the best receivers made throughout the years.

My next article will be on the Scott Telematic and Automatic Program Selector Clock.





UNF CONVERTER RCA MODEL U2 - The U2. introduced in 1952, offered a selection of only two UHF channels, which had to be preset inside the cabinet by a technician. There is no provision for fine tuning. Housed in a brown steel cabinet, the U2 features a power transformer and uses a 6BQ7 tube for an RF oscillator, and a 6CB6 tube as an IF amplifier. Made in 1952, it operates cn Channel 2. Fortunately for the growth of UHF broadcasting, several companies like Mallory and B'onder Tongue began marketing tiny customer-tunable UHF converters for channels 14-83 in 1953, and built-in converters were mandatory after 1963. This allowed UHF stations to grow steadily in the 1970's and 1980's. (Charles Harper - Lexington, KY)

HEADPHONES

Many interesting articles have been written about radio receivers, horns, loudspeakers and other radio equipment, but I have seen little concerning headphones. Possibly, we can learn a little more about these early receiver units.

Earphones were being used for telephone reception prior to radio, so they were already on hand when radio came on the scene. Radio sig-

nals were sometimes rather weak, weaker than the telephone signals. One of the big things in early radio was going for distant stations which had weak signals. Telephone headsets were not able to pick up these radio signals too well. The solution was to design headsets especially for radio reception. They were made with a thinner diaphragm, and

more turns of a finer wire wound on the coils.

The impedance of a telephone headset might be 100 ohms whereas a radio headset would be at a minimum of 1000 to 3000 ohms. This impedance means resistance to alternating current. The higher the impedance the better the phones as it more matched the electrical nature of the transmitted radio signal.

Headphones are generally go/no-go instruments; they either work or they don't. Most of the time the trouble is in the cord. Headphone cords are made of tinsel wire and can be easily damaged. Sometimes a problem can be in the wire winding around a coil. If the headset reads open




Figure 3. The internal construction of a headset (Reyner, Modern Radio Communication, 1923).

on an ohmmeter, you can unscrew the cap and look for a broken lead. If you don't see that, try to unwind the wire from the coil and look for a broken end.

Many companies made headphones. Westinghouse may have been the first as it held an early dominant position in the industry. Other early manufacturers were Murdock, Holtzer-

Cabot, Mesco, Brandes and Baldwin. Some of the better known names of the 1920's were Kellogg, Frost, Kennedy, Federal and Red Head. One company, Murdock, made a 2000-ohm headset as early as 1913, and sold it for only \$4.50. By 1925, the price of an ordinary headphone was down to \$2.95.

Baldwin (Baldies) as they were called, were probably the finest headphones made. They used a fiber diaphragm in what they called their Type C and sold it for \$16.50 in 1910. In 1922, they made another Type C which werecalled amplifying headsets. These were probably the most famous radio receiv-

ers. They were made entirely different than any other headset then on the market. They had a special mica diaphragm which was actuated by a very thin light armature which was supersensitive to the slightest variation of current passing through the electromagnets. This type of construction made possible the hearing of signals that were not audible in an ordinary headset.

These headsets were so good that they were



used by many departments of the U.S. government and even some foreign countries.

These headsets actually were not traditional headphones, but early magnetic speak-


ers, and were used in early horn-type loudspeakers where earphones were simply attached to the end of the horn.

The Times Square Auto Supply Co., Inc. was one of the many firms which found itself in the radio bus.ness when the sales of radios soared in the early 1920's. Not only did they have six stores in New York City, but welve out-of-town stores including ones in Rhode Island and Wisconsin. A few of the pages from their 1924 catalog are printed on these pages.



This is an exceptionally high class receiving set designed particularly for use where portability is desired. Light in weight yet ruggedly built into a convenient carrying case with special compartments to accommodate the headset, two tubular three-cell flash light "A" batteries and from two to four "B" batteries. The batteries are at all times connected allowing instant operation by only connecting an antenna and ground.

The cabinet is of heavy mahogany, the front cover and carrying handle are removable, giving the set a handsome appearance for home use. Two UV-199 Radiotron tubes are

used in its operation. These tubes are the latest development and each draws only .06 ampere from the battery. It is therefore possible to operate the set one or two hours daily for several weeks with two threecell flash light batteries.

Its remarkable selectivity permits it to receive both local and distant stations with clearness and volume of tone.


