EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Would you believe that the Kennedy receiver on the cover of this issue was once a basket case? When I received Henry Roger's "before" and "after" photos of his restoration of a Kennedy Model 220, the restoration work and the quality of his photographs impressed me so much that I put the "after" picture on this month's cover. The full story is in the article subtitled "The Chicken Coop Rescue".

A six-page report follows on the September American Wireless Association (A.W.A.) Historical Radio Conference and its auction. Nearly \$40,000 of old radio equipment crossed the auction block to over 300 bidders. Since this important auction seems to establish equipment values' guidelines annually, over 350 items are listed in this issue. This get-together also attracts many rare and unusual items for its Old Equipment Contest; photos of many of the entries are included.

Paul Bourbin wrote his second *Vintage Test Equipment* article, this time on the Supreme 502 tube tester. Paul feels that it is nostalgic and enlightening to use vintage test equipment to test vintage radio sets.

A book review by Alan Douglas covers Achievement in Radio - 70 Years of Radio Science, Technology, Standards, and Measurement at the National Bureau of Standards. Club Spotlight features the Antique Radio Club of Illinois this month. (Send in information on your club if we have not yet featured it.) Photo Review will return next month; I hope that the A.W.A. Old Equipment Contest coverage will serve in its place this month.

Last month, I emphasized A.R.C.'s advertising policy by placing it in a box within the classifieds (it is on page 15 of this issue). Although some of you may have seen it for the first time, this statement has been included with the advertising policies for over a year. At least one advertiser has written and suggested that a buyer's policy would be appropriate, and I agree that buyers must be

reasonable! However, the seller has to take the lead in resolving problems with the customer. A.R.C. serves both buyers and sellers, and both should adhere to ethical behavior.

As well as the advertising policy statement, a lot more information on the wordy inside front and back covers may be useful. For example, some of you are paying for, instead of taking advantage of, your free 20 words; you should mention them when you send in an ad. Likewise, a few of you send in several ads during the month, taking a free 20 words on each, not realizing that you can take the 20 only once per month. Also, please remember to send in the extra 10c per word for words over 20, even if it is only a few dimes (stamps & cash are OK for small amounts; no non-U.S. stamps, please); this saves us the time taken to write for the extra payment.

Also, mail seems to take longer to arrive than it did a year ago (An ad from N.J. took six days to get here); mail your ads by the first of the month to help insure arrival by the deadline. The tenth of the month is the deadline for classified ads, and the first of the month is the deadline for display and business card ads. Occasionally, we can include a display ad or business card ad arriving after the first if there is room, but classified ads received after the tenth rarely get in (the printer usually gets the finished pages by the 11th or 12th). All ads that arrive late are held for the next issue.

We appreciate club event announcements by the fifth, as we try to put together the *Coming Radio Events* pages soon after that.

Thanks to many of you who stopped by the A.R.C. table at the A.W.A. conference in Canandaigua and at the ARRL Hamfest in Boxborough, Mass.; I enjoyed meeting some of the people we know through the many letters and ads received throughout the year. Although the fewer listings on the Coming Radio Events page reflects the coming of winter, even snow does not keep collectors away from a meet in New England!

ON THE COVER

This is the "after" result of an unbelievable restoration of a Kennedy Model 220 by Henry Rogers. Look at the photo on page four for the "before" picture.

The Kennedy Type 220 was first produced in 1921 in San Francisco, and later in St. Louis, like the set on the cover. The Type 220 is a one-tube regenerative receiver covering the range from 200 o 3200 meters. The cabinet is made of solid walnut with a Formica panel. The beveled-brass dials are satin silvered and lacquered; the dials

are usually very worn today.

The Type 220 sold for \$150, without tubes, batteries, etc.

OOPS! OOPS!

Not only did the September issue of A.R.C. incorrectly identify the cabinet style of the Scott Allwave 15, but last month's *OOPSI* named it incorrectly again. Hopefully, this will be the last correction... the Scott Allwave 15 on page eight of the September issue was in a "Tasman" cabinet.

KENNEDY WITH THE COLLECTORS

Colin B. Kennedy Model 220 The Chicken Coop Rescue

Lifting up the telephone receiver, I recognized the voice on the other end as my old friend and fellow radio enthusiast, Fred Winkler.

"I know this guy with a Kennedy 220. What's it worth?" asked Fred.

"About three or four hundred," I replied.

"This one's not too good. It's missing the variometer," Fred was hinting.

"Well, then a hundred," I was becoming suspicious.

"This one's a basket-case. It was in a chicken coop."

"Fifty to sixty, I guess. Who has it anyway?" I asked.

"It's in pieces. You have a Kennedy variometer, don't you?"

"Yeah, but who has IT?" I knew what the answer was going to be.

"Come over and you can look at it!" Fred has a way of luring me into these deals.

At Fred's place, we went out to his workshop; there, on the floor, in several pieces and covered with multiple layers of dif-

ferent kinds of filth, was a Kennedy 220. It was missing more than just the variometer though.

"Well, what do you want for it?" I asked.

"How about finding me a good, low frequency Grid Dip Oscillator (GDO)."

"One that'll go down to 50Kc?" I asked.

"That'll do," Fred replied.

"Okay. That shouldn't be too hard to find. I'll bring this Kennedy back over here in a couple weeks from now, restored!" I must have wanted to set up a challenge for myself.

The deal was completed, and I stowed the Kennedy 220 "parts" in the trunk of the car and went home.

Complete examination revealed, besides a missing variometer and its secondary coils, filament pot, grid leak resistor mount, grid leak condenser and resistor and three knobs; also a lot of the nickel-plated hardware was gone. The cabinet was in three pieces. However, it looked like everything present was original and in good condition under the dirt.

Thorough disassembly was necessary first. The parts were then sorted into "bakelite" for one




Figure 1. The Kennedy Model 220 before restoration. Below the front panel is the rotor from the original vanometer, replaced in restoration.

type of cleaning and "plated" for a different method of cleaning.

The missing parts needed to be made or scrounged. The variometer was no problem; I had an original in mint condition. Also, found in the "junk box" was a Kennedy "silvered" dial and a General Radio potentiometer similar to the original. A potentiometer knob was found at the CHRS [California Historical Radio Society] swap meet the next weekend. I also found, in another junk box, a coil form that was the perfect size for the variometer secondary coils. However, when it came to the rest of the parts, I must confess, I had it easy! I have a Kennedy 110 in my collection for comparison, and almost all of the parts are interchangeable with a 220. For the secondary coils, it was just a matter of counting the turns on the 110's coils for the appropriate band, and then winding a "bank-wound" set of coils. For the missing screws, thumb screws, grid leak mounts, etc., it was a matter of removal from the 110, measuring the part, then turning it out on the lathe from brass stock. In the case of the knob for the series/parallel switch, it was casting with ep-

oxy in a mold made from the Model 110 original.

Now, with all the parts in hand, we had to clean the metal ones for nickel plating. I use a Sparex solution in an ultrasonic cleaner for about fifteen minutes. Then comes a water rinse followed by a water soluble degreaser for fifteen minutes with another water rinse. All metal parts are plated, even if the original plating is in good condition; otherwise, when fully assembled, the color of the nickel won't match on all the parts.

Cleaning bakelite can sometimes require rigorous brushing in the flutes of the knobs where grime has built up. I use a very weak solution of water soluble degreaser applied with a hand brush. The panel receives the same solution applied with a large, soft bristle brush. After cleaning, all lettering is filled with Lacquer-Stik. Then, using a silicon polish, the panel is polished to a high luster.

With assembly complete, I had a working Kennedy 220 receiver, but the cabinet was still in three pieces. Close investigation showed that the

finish was still somewhat there, so I decided to go ahead and reglue the cabinet together. It clamped together fairly square and looked straight when the glue dried.

Now it was ready to clean and oil. I usually don't re inish cabinets, preferring the set to look its age while appearing clean and complete. Nothing seems to duplicate an orginal finish: no matter how bad it is. I think the original is petter than a shiny new perfect finish. Anyway, this is what I do. First, I apply regular furniture oil with a rag to remove the loose dirt. Then, using 0000 steel wool, I lightly work more oil over the surface in order to clean the finish deeply. With another application of oil with a rag and a wipe down, it's done. Generally, this procedure ends up with an original finish that looks its age while still appearing


clean with a soft luster.


Dropping the panel into the cabinet completed the restoration. Total time: about twenty hours. Operation is almost identical to either that for the Kennedy 110 or 281, both of which were covered in articles in past A.R.C. issues [August 1986, p. 3, and September 1987, p. 7].

When showing Fred the set two weeks later, he said, "You know, the guy I got that from was cleaning out a chicken coop and was taking everything to the dump that day. I just happened to notice the Kennedy under the pile of junk ne was hauling off. He just gave it to me!" That was really a case of being at the right place at the right time!

P.S. I never did find Fred that GDO. I ended up trading him an old National Low Frequency receiver instead.

Thanks to Henry for thinking to document his project. If you are just beginning to start a restoration, take some pictures (black & white). Then, when you are finished, write the story of the project and send it in to A.R.C. (Editor)

ANTIQUE WIRELESS ASSOCIATION 1988 CONFERENCE & AUCTION REPORT

Over 800 collectors, an overflowing flea market, four auctions, an outstanding display of old equipment contest entries, seminars, a spectacular Tesla coil demonstration, visits to the A.W.A. museum, and simply kibitzing about radio collecting and radio history — this was the 1988 Historical Conference of the Antique Wireless Association held September 21st through 25th in Canandaigua, New York.

This report is for those of you who could not make it to THE radio meet of the year, and is a record for those of you who did attend. Included here is in-depth coverage of the auction and a "Photo Review" of a number of the contest entries. More information on the conference and contest is usually reported in AWA's membership bulletin, *The Old Timer's Bulletin*. (Write the A.W.A. at P.O. Box "E", Breesport, NY 14816, for membership information.)

The best-in-show winner in the Old Equipment Contest was a 1917, pack mule, SCR-49 set entered by Michael Payne, Alvin, Texas; see the July 1988 A.R.C. *Photo Review* for a photo of this set.

Auction sales totaled over \$39,000 with a record 333 bidders registered. An auction of items from a private estate was first and included several early wireless items going for over \$1000 each. The vacuum tube auction followed with spherical audions in the \$500 range again. The General Auction included a number of items going for over \$500; the highest bid, \$1700, was for an Amrad SE 1400. The Communications Equipment Auction, with several nice HRO's, was held Saturday a.m. An HRO-500, like new, went for \$500.

This report is a selection of the items auctioned. Deleted were some items in poor condition, items with inadequate descriptions and low selling prices. The auction listing has been sorted by manufacturer with the prices of similar items combined. The information reported is our best attempt to combine all information available to A.R.C.; however, no guarantee can be made for accuracy. Many thanks to our contributors this year (over 35 pages of handwritten notes on the auctions): Ray Chase, Vic Johnson, Tom Burgess, Wally Worth and the A.W.A. (John V. Terrey)

Estate Auction. Highlighting the four auctions was an estate sale on Friday morning at 9:00 am. The several unique and very rare items sold included a two-piece spark transmitter and coherer receiver. The highest bid was \$2400 for a Pre-Civil War Morse register. \$1600 was bid for a Johnson/Phillips T-06 receiver, and \$1500 for a British coherer receiver. About 95 items were auctioned for a total of about \$17.500.



VINTAGE TEST EQUIPMENT

Supreme 502 Tube Tester

The tube tester is one of the most necessary pieces of equipment for the repair of vintage radios. While modern test equipment can be used to perform most test and repair functions, testing the quality of tubes without a tube tester is very difficult. Unfortunately, tube testers for the types of tubes used in vintage radios are no longer made. Therefore, the one piece of vintage test equipment that modern day repairmen need is a tube tester. An ohmmeter can be used to check for filament continuity, but more elaborate equipment is necessary to evaluate the quality of a tube. As tubes become scarcer, the need to judge a tube's condition becomes more important as substitutes may not be conveniently available.

The two basic types of tube testers are the emission type and the mutual conductance type. The emission type measures the amount of electrons emitted by the filament or cathode. As the tube nears the end of its useful life, the number of electrons that the filament can emit decreases. Eventually the electrons emitted are insuffi-

cient for the tube to function properly. The circuitry of the tester is adjusted so that the meter reading will show the relationship of the tube's emission to that of the manufacturer's specifications. The tester's meter should leave the "Good" section at the point where the tube has reached the end of life point for proper emission. Mutual Conductance (also known as Transconductance) is the relationship between the signal voltage and the plate current for zero load resistance, and is measured in microhms (microamperes per volt) or millimhos (milliamperes per volt).

There are two types of tests for Mutual Conductance – the static (or "grid shift method") and the dynamic method. These two methods will be discussed at a later time. Other tests that can be performed to check the quality of a tube are: Gas current (negative grid current), microphony (acoustic feedback), noise (caused by speaker output) and heater-cathode leakage. One thing that a tube tester cannot indicate is whether a



tube will oscillate in a particular circuit. A tube can test well and still fail to oscillate. The only way that a tube can be tested for oscillation is by substitution. However, a tube that fails to oscillate and test well will work in a different section of the set.

An excellent example of an emission type tube tester is the Supreme Model 502 tube tester. Produced during the mid-thirties, it was capable of testing four-, five-, six-, seven-pin and octal tubes by the emission method. In addition, external connections were available for four ranges of AC and DC volts, five ranges of resistance, electrolytic and electrostatic capacitor tests. A single meter gave all readings, and a NE-1W bulb was used to show leakage. The Supreme Model 501 had the same tube testing circuit, but lacked the external connections for multi-meter use. The panel was of brown painted metal with an Art Deco design around the meter. It was very well laid out. The tester was encased in Supreme's usual, well-made case of light oak.

The 502 was very easy to use. All the operator had to do was to set four dials and throw the toggle switches as per the chart. If the tube passed the leakage test, the operator threw the "LKG-TEST" toggle switch to TEST and read the results on the meter. A chart for most of the common tubes, with instructions, was located under the lid.

The most common problems encountered preventing proper operation of the tester are: failure of the 01-A tube under the panel, dirty contacts, and failure of the capacitors. The AC voltmeter, AC line test and the tube leakage test will not work properly if the capacitors are shorted, leaky. or open. Even if they still seem to work, they should be replaced to prevent problems later on. You will have to hunt for some of them as they are well hidden behind the wiring and other components. On some units, you will find that the filaments do not light when testing five-, six-, or seven-pin tubes. Try setting the "Filament Return Selector" switch to the pin number designated by the letter "H" OTHER THAN pin one. Often the tube will light, and the tester will work perfectly. If your particular tester has this problem, you can either rewire the unit, a very difficult task, or remember to put the switch in the other position. Tracing out the circuit is quite difficult as the wires are bundled into a cable and the color code is redundant.

The 502 was my first tube tester and one which I still use quite regularly. While I own a goodly amount of modern test equipment, I often find it very interesting and challenging to repair a set using old equipment. Something that we all should do is repair a radio using test and repair equipment contemporary with the set being repaired. This gives a better feeling for what the radio repairmen of the day had to endure to repair a set. This will also give a better feeling for the design of the set. Using old equipment will teach you how repairmen reasoned out a set's problems. Have you ever noted that the voltage readings of modern meters often are a little higher than the manufacturer's specifications? One reason is the type of meter used. The listings given in the service literature were based upon the meters that most servicemen had at that time. Since most of the meters had a sensitivity of 1000-2000 ohms per volt, radio manufacturers listed voltages using those types of meters. Now, even inexpensive meters have a sensitivity of 10,000 to 20,000 ohms per volt and often higher. Since a voltmeter is put in parallel with the circuit being tested, the resistance of the meter is in parallel with the resistance of the circuit. Therefore, the resistance of the meter is in shunt with the circuit, and the meter's load reduces the voltage of the circuit. With modern high resistance meters, the change is often negligible, but with older lower resistance meters the difference could be significant. This is especially true in the lower ranges. The voltages listed in manufacturer's literature were not the "true" voltages but what the serviceman was expected to get. With modern equipment, the readings are closer to the "true" voltage and generally are a bit higher.

BOOK REVIEW

Achievement in Radio -70 Years of Radio Science, Technology, Standards, and Measurement at the National Bureau of Standards.

By Wilbert F. Snyder and Charles L. Bragaw

Achievement in Radio is organized by chapters according to projects or fields of investigation: prewar radio, WWI developments, broadcasting, measurements, antennas and wave propagation, time standards, and so on to the present day. At least one-quarter of the book that's more than 200 pages - is devoted to pre-1930 work. The table of contents alone runs 20 pages, the index 34, the whole volume 876. 876 pages in large format means that a lot of information has been packed in. What didn't fit into the text has been saved for the voluminous footnotes, which occasionally take most of a page. The hundreds of photographs have been well reproduced on coated paper.

Is the book worth \$55? Certainly to me it is. For example, I wanted to look up P. D. Lowell, with the Bureau from 1913 to 1922, and again after 1941, and best known to radio collectors (or should be) as one of the designers of the Grebe Synchrophase. In the index are no fewer than 22

page references to Lowell, and all sorts of biographical tidbits are tucked away here and there.

More up-to-date readers will find descriptions of everything from WWII radar countermeasures to the Bureau of Standards' radio station WWV to studies of the ionosphere and beyond. All in all, it's just what its title says it is.

This book got an enthusiastic review in the August 1987 AWA Old Timers Bulletin, but, maddeningly (book reviewers please note), no price or ordering information was provided. 
