EDITOR'S COMMENTS

This is Antique Radio Classified's 54th issue. This also is the 27th issue that I have published – one half of the total – from here in Carlisle, Mass. Over four years ago, Gary Schneider, the originator of A.R.C., stated the publication's philosophy, hoping that A.R.C. would "become the standard publication by which the collector can buy, sell or trade radio-related items on a large national basis." Today, with three times the readership of any other monthly publication in the hobby and with twice the number of ads, A.R.C. truly is the standard.

The lead article in this issue covers the Automatic Radio Mfg. Co. Although not a familiar name to many collectors, the company actually dates back to the early 20's. Wally Worth's fine article is on the popular Tom Thumb sets, which were made by Automatic Radio from the late 20's to the late 40's.

A new column – Radio Ramblings... – begins this month. Mike Adams, the current president of the Southern California Antique Radio Society (SCARS) and the producer of a PBS television series on collecting, introduces it. Although some may feel a negative tone in his article, it does give us food for thought about the rapid growth in the prices of more recent vintage sets. Additional reflective/whimsical-type articles are in line for future issues. Feel free to join the dialogue.

Two auctions are reported this month, one in New York and one in Massachusetts. Please remember that auction prices should not be considered current retail prices; they should be combined with other prices and information to determine the value of a set.

Jim Fred contributes the fifth article in his series All You Need To Know About Repairing AC Radios. This time he covers "Vacuum Tube Basics." OOPS

At times I feel like I am publishing a "What's wrong with this picture?" book when the mail arrives. With over 4000 readers, nothing gets by. A few things were "wrong" or at least misleading in the "Battery Set Power Supply" article by John Eng published in the last issue.

Please read the corrections/clarifications to the article on page six of this issue. Although the supply works as printed, one should note that the "C" output provides a positive voltage, not a negative one. In fact, the supply might be better called an "A, B and another B" power supply. AC/DC set series-wired tubes, like the 50L6.

Several of you noticed some problems with the "Battery Set Power Supply" article by John Eng last month. Page six of this issue includes corrections and comments.

One of those calling us to task on the power supply article was Orval Parker, who also sent in the suggestion for an inexpensive isolation transformer solution which we have included this month. Actually, Orval had sent in the idea some months ago, and we had misplaced it. Orval does have a little experience in the field since he built his first crystal set 66 years ago at the age of 15. Does this make Orval our oldest contributor?

I continue to receive reports of tragic experiences in buying and selling plastic radios. My conclusion is: PLASTIC RADIOS DO NOT SHIP WELL and often do not survive. With these radios, a relatively heavy chassis is attached to a brittle plastic cabinet by only a few screws; even if the radio is packed well, when the package is dropped (which it almost always is), the stress on the plastic cabinet where the radio chassis is attached often breaks the plastic at the screw holes. The same problem potentially exists with radios which have heavy components such as a chassis or speaker or where all components are mounted on the front panel. When shipping these radios, I urge: REMOVE THE CHASSIS AND OTHER HEAVY COMPONENTS FROM THE CABINET, AND SHIP EACH PART SEPA-RATELY, DOUBLE BOXED. Sellers, please use this shipping method; buyers, please insist on it!

Clubs, please note the *Radio Club Listings* published this month. If your club is missing or if there are any errors in your listing, drop us note ASAP, and we will add/correct your listing.

That's all for this first issue of the new year. A.R.C. thanks all of you for our success and pledges to continue service as the premier monthly publication for collectors of old radios.

This is the cover of the 1927 catalog of the Radio Specialty Co. of New York City. The company advertised itself as "Radio's oldest, established exclusive radio mail order house. Our motto is 'Quick Shipment.' All orders are shipped within 24 hours. Quick, prompt, courteous service. We carry a larger variety of radio parts and findings than any other radio house in the country." The 100-page Catalog No. 17 boasted of 500 illustrations and 75 hookups.

Another Rasco catalog, No. 19 for 1929, appeared on the October 1986 cover of A.R.C.

THE AUTOMATIC RADIO MFG. CO. AND THE TOM THUMB RADIOS

David Housman, A. J. Housman and John Grady formed the Automatic Radio Mfg. Co. in 1920. At first the company bought parts from newly-created RCA and others. First-year sales were \$10,000.

One of their first products was the battery-powered "Bluebird," a one-tube set with two dials. Later came table or mantel sets of five and six tubes named "Arc," "Hudson" and "Liberty Bell" – all TRF's; the last two sold as chassis models only.




Figure 1. 1929 Tom Thumb four-tube portable

The first "Tom Thumb," shown in Figures 1 and 2, came in 1929 as a portable set in a black leatherette-covered wooden case about 12"x13"x8"

deep with four tubes, built-in loop antenna and wooden horn speaker. The panel was a thin brass "antiqued" sheet the full size of the case. A, B & C batteries were placed in the bottom half of the case with Deco swirls and Tom Thumb engraved thereon. Tuning was by a single dial in the center, with rheostat on the right and antenna trim capacitor on the left. On-off switch and phone jack were also on the front panel.

Three 199 tubes and one 222 S.G. RF tube were used in a simple TRF circuit powered by dry cells. The loop was in the hinged-front cover to afford a directional ability and complete with binding posts to connect an outside antenna if necessary.

There were also Tom Thumb Srs. and Tom Thumb Jrs., as well as table radios with built-in clocks.

The first automobile radio, powered by the car's battery and B batteries, for the 1927 Hupmobile was installed by David Housman. Thus began a long line of automotive radios pioneered by Automatic Radio.

In the 1940's, the Automatic Radio Mfg. Co. also made radios for bicycles (Figure 3), camera-radios (Figures 4 and 5), and three-way plastic-cased portables (Figure 6) that looked like the camera-radios, all named Tom Thumb. They also entered the television field (Figure 7).

Starting in the 50's, the company manufactured tractor radios for the working farmer, radio-phonograph combinations and many modern automobile radios and stereo cartridge players, until 1978.

They also made auto air

conditioners and home fans in their Vornado division. I bought one of their air conditioners in 1960, and installed it myself. I had to bring the car to the Melrose factory for inspection and warranty.

David Housman's sons – Edward L. and Herbert E. (who are twins), Frank M., and Charles J. – carried on the business from the 50's and 60's to the present.

The original company was located on the seventh floor of a building on "A" St., South Boston, in 1920, then moved to Canal St., Boston, again on upper floors. Then it moved to 122 Brookline St., Boston, on the fourth, fifth and sixth floors where it stayed in the 40's and 50's, employing nearly 1,000 workers. The last move was to 2 Main St.,

Melrose, Mass., where the company is to this day.

Before its 50th anniversary in 1969, the company had grossed over 40 million dollars in that year alone. Today Automatic Radio manufacstereo players, but has no museum as such.

I have found collecting Tom Thumb radios to be exciting as Automatic Radio is the only radio manufacturer I know which started as early as (Continued on following page)

tures only solid-state devices and test equipment, and imports from overseas most of the radios and stereos it sells.

I called on the company as a salesman of Gears etc. from the late 50's to the late 70's. I recently visited the Melrose factory and spoke with "Bert" Housman about the old days of radio and told him of my interest in collecting their older radios. He furnished me with a copy of their 1970 50th-year commemorative folder showing photos of many of their products and giving the history of the company. Included in the photos is the only known picture of the "Bluebird," their first product. The company has a small collection of some of its earlier radios and a few of the auto radios and

Battery Set Power Supply Corrections

A.R.C. seems to have more problems with its power supply articles than with any other topic. We received several letters and calls, pointing out discrepancies in the Battery Set Power Supply article by John Eng in last month's issue. Here is a sampling and a summary. (Editor)

Dear Editor.

I want to call your attention to errors in the battery set power supply by John Eng:

(1) In the battery radios I know, the "C" supply is negative with respect to ground. How can I get a minus voltage from this supply?

(2) In the metering circuit, the negative side is shown connected to the positive polarity. With positive on both sides of the meter, it will not read anything.

Dear Editor.

The supply published in the December issue cannot be used in the version shown to supply "C" voltage which must be of negative polartiy. The supply produces a positive voltage instead.

Perhaps an isolation transformer may be applicable to this problem.

1920 and continues in business today at a local site.

Canandaigua 1988 had several Tom Thumbs selling for up to \$400, indicating a healthy market. I still avidly collect Tom Thumbs and would welcome any additional information about the company or its products.

In summary:

(1) The supply will work as shown; however, all output voltages are positive.

(2) Traditionally, a "C" supply is one that supplies negative tube grid bias. The voltage vielded by the "C" part of the Eng supply is positive and would be better labeled as a second, lower, "B" voltage, perhaps for a detector tube.

(3) The meter switch diagram is misleading. The "C+" written on the schematic is the switch position label, not where the negative side of the meter should be connected; the negative side of the meter is switched to the "C" supply "ground" as shown by the ground symbol.

(4) The statement in the fourth paragraph -"All the supplies are independent from each other. Any grounding or DC return is to be done externally for greater flexibility for various power supply hookups." - is not entirely correct. The "B" and "C" outputs share a common negative connection; however, the "A" supply is independent.

(5) Note: There are two, independent ground symbols, and they are not connected together.

(6) The supply acts like an adjustable A-battery plus an adjustable B-battery with an adjustable tap.

(7) Missing is a negative "C" voltage which could be produced by a duplicate of the "A" voltage circuit, connected to a separate, third secondary low voltage winding. Neither negative or positive for this new "C" output should be connected to the grounds of the existing circuitry so that it would truly be independent.

This supply is close to what is needed; write in with your solution. (Editor)

This circuit puts out "C+", not "C-". Alan Douglas, Pocasset, Ma.

RADIO RAMBLINGS...

Whither Radio Collecting?

It's time we all talk about this dream I've been having lately. Actually, it's more like a recurring nightmare. It begins innocently enough: I attend our quarterly swap meets, and as president of SCARS (Southern California Antique Radio Society), I count all the people there. Noticing that the meets get larger each time, I should be satisfied. Then I interact with fellow SCARS officers, and I am told the news that our club grows larger every year. I should be overloyed. And I can't help but notice that the number of books, periodicals and organizations devoted to our hobby has exploded almost exponentially in just a couple of years. This should be a time of great euphoria in the radio collecting scene. But wait - something is wrong - I can't remember what comes next.

The next morning, I awake and spend much of the day wondering why a dream about all the recent successes in our hobby would leave me with such an empty feeling. How does this dream end, and what can I do about it? Will this be like Orwell's *Time Machine*? Will I see the future and be able to tell you about it, and if so, will you believe me?

It's nighttime again, and I am both looking forward to and dreading the inevitable. I'm looking forward to sleep; perhaps tonight is the night for the long-awaited conclusion to my strange dream, but I'm worried about what lies on the other side. Again, the same dream with thousands of people lining up to get into radio collecting. Our nationally televised swap meets are creating huge traffic jams. Special bookstores have opened that only sell books about collection, restoration and preservation of radio and television devices. Everybody wants to join in.

Now this is the time that I normally wake up. before the dream ends. Tonight will be different though. Tonight I will see into the future of radio collecting. Things are clear again. It is the year 1998. Yes, I am at the world's largest SCARS meet, in an equally large parking lot; some are old faces with many new ones. But wait - "Where are the radios?" I asked a long time fellow collector. "Well, you see," he started slowly, "some strange things happened back in 1988. Everybody wanted to collect so eventually all the radios were gone. So many people wanted just a few sets that the supply just ran out." I didn't want to hear more, but suddenly we were joined by more old friends who began to describe collecting in 1998 as just a social phenomenon where people trade photos of their sets and talk about the old days.

I learned so much more in my dream that night. I guess I was prepared to ask all the right questions. What about early wireless? Simple. After about 1988, not much traded hands because of two reasons. First, those who had early wireless sets knew about their great value and scarcity; thus, they kept them and passed them on to their children or to one of the major museums. And second, after acquiring such valuable early gear, these collectors lost interest in the clubs and periodicals because, clearly, there were no more wireless to be found.

What about wooden broadcast receivers, both table models and consoles? I learned about another interesting but predictable turn of events. If you remember way back in the late 1970's, everybody was combing America's attics for these newly discovered treasures. Everybody in the fledgling hobby of radio collecting thought that a Philco cathedral or a nice Scott console would look nice in his home. Folklore had it that millions of these sets existed in barns, attics and basements, but sociologists have suggested that due to the great migration from the eastern states to the Sunbelt during the 1970's, much old furniture and radio equipment was pitched as grandma moved into her mobile home. There was some hope as late as 1987 that some of these sets might be restored, but most tackled were poorly restored. In fact, several restoration experts left the business in 1989, because the only sets available at swap meets had been "restored" at least three times and were beyond economical restoration. And the good sets were in the hands of people who were going to keep them.

There was a ray of hope for the collecting community in the mid-1980's; these sets were beyond the price of all but the wealthiest collector. I heard stories of how in 1989, one very wealthy person bought up every popular plastic set by paying prices you would not believe. He did this because these sets became *de rigueur* art objects for wealthy young professionals and commanded astronomical prices in upscale antique boutiques. The same thing happened to transistor sets by the early 1990's.

Although this dream was a bit hazy, radio collecting seems to be suffocating under the weight of its own success. Radios were a finite commodity, and the demand simply outstripped the supply.

Back to reality. I am starting an open forum on the state of radio collecting because I am convinced that in the rush to get that rare radio at any price, we do face the very real possibility of future extinction because of our success. I would like to hear from A.R.C. readers and to have A.R.C. print these letters and articles in future issues. I believe that because of A.R.C.'s tremendous readership, it should address these questions.

AUCTION REPORT

BOVINA CENTER, NEW YORK - NOV. 12, 1988 CONTRIBUTED BY PHILLIP W. PETRI AND RAYMOND CHASE

An antique radio collection of about 100 radios, test equipment and tubes was auctioned on November 12, 1988, at the Bovina Creamery, Bovina Center, New York. Auctioneers Chuck McIntosh and Bob Burgin of the McIntosh Auction Service conducted the sale. The few attending this poorly advertised auction came from quite a distance to the remote auction site on a very cold day. Of the under 25 bidders, only about 10 were active; generally, prices were low with a few surprises. Disposing of the 121 lots took nearly three hours.







Vacuum Tube Basics

This is the fifth part of a series on basic AC radio repair. Jim Fred has been involved in radio for over fifty years, and in this series presents useful hints for both the new collector and the veteran. Antique Radio Classified is pleased to have Jim contribute this series.

Refer to Parts 1 and 2 of this series (Feb. and Apr. 1988) for details on tools, test equipment, safety, etc. IMPORTANT: do not plug the radio in until you have read the safety tips and warnings in these two installments!

Part 3 (July 1988) covered the TRF radio and Part 4 (Sept. 1988) covered the Superheterodyne radio. (Editor)

Before proceeding to troubleshoot large radios with many tubes and complicated circuits, I think we should talk about vacuum tubes. I'll discuss filament voltages, tube bases, tube substitution, and simple series and parallel wiring, rather than getting into technical engineering stuff.




Figure 1. Batteries connected in parallel.

Let's go back to 1922, and review the tubes, DC, available then. We will start with the WD-11 and WX-12. (Even though Western Electric tubes were used by the military before 1922, they were not popular in home sets.) The WD-11 and WX-12 tubes had identical elements, i.e. plate, orid and filaments, but had different bases and pins. The filament voltage was 1.1 volts DC at .25 amperes, intended for use with a number 6 dry cell. Three cells in parallel as in Figure 1 provided the correct voltage and current for these tubes. A number 6 dry cell was about 2 1/2 inches in diameter by about six-inches tall and can still be purchased today. These cells were readily available then because three cells in series (often called "Hot Shot" batteries) were used in early ignition systems of automobiles and gas engines and in early telephones. They could be easily purchased and soon became popular as filament batteries for radios.




Figure 2. Batteries connected in series.

The fragile and microphonic WD-11 was soon replaced by the 200A and 201A triode with a 5volt, .25 amp. filament. The automobile storage battery (6 volt) rapidly became the favorite filament supply. These tubes were soon joined by the 112A, and the 71A also with 5-volt DC filaments. In a home without electricity, the automobile storage battery of six volts DC became the source of power. I've heard many old timers tell stories of how once or twice a month they had to take the battery to town to get it charged; charging would take several days as well as another trip to town to retrieve the battery. Since this was quite expensive as well as time consuming, the 99 and 120 tubes were developed. These tube filaments needed from 3 to 3.3 volts at .060 amperes and .125 amperes. Here again we could use the number 6 dry cell for filament power, three in series as shown in Figure 2. Other DC filament tubes were also developed. but these were the most popular.

Of course, with all these battery radios, "B" batteries of 45 to 135 volts were necessary. These batteries were not rechargeable and were thrown away when they were exhausted.

In 1927, radios operating from the AC power line were introduced. Most city homes had AC lines entering their homes, but only electric light bulbs used the power. After radios were introduced, other electrically operated appliances soon began to appear. Sixty cycle AC power could not be applied to a battery radio because a loud hum would come from the speaker, preventing reception of the program. One reason was that the plate of the tube required pure DC; building a "B" battery eliminator to replace the "B" batteries used by a battery set easily took care of this. In two or three years the "B" battery eliminator became obsolete because a "B" power supply was built on the chassis with the rest of the radio.

The second source of hum was the tube fila-




Figure 3. Tube filaments connected in parallel with each other and with a battery.

ment. As the 60 cycle current alternated from plus to minus, the filament would alternately get hot and cold sixty times a second. Engineers soon found two ways to minimize this action. One way was to use a heavy filament wire whose thermal inertia slowed down the heating and cooling effect. One such tube was the Type 26 tube used in the RF amplifier circuits. The second way was to enclose the filament in a ceramic sleeve. The ceramic sleeve, called cathode, was coated with a rare earth compound. When the filament heated up, it made the cathode hot which released electrons from the cathode coating. One of the first cathode type tubes was the Type 27 tube: it was called a triode because the filament and cathode were considered as one element. Other early cathode type tubes were the 24 and 35. The filament voltage of the 26 was 1.5 volts AC. The filament voltage of the 27 was 2.5 volts. Other 2.5 volt tubes were the 45, 2A3, and 47.

Most of the very early AC-operated radios used 26's, 27's, and 71A's, with an 80 rectifier tube. Other early tubes used were the 50, 81, and 10. In the early 1930's, vacuum tube design advanced rapidly. The next generation of radios used the 56, 57, 58, 55, 2A5, 2A6, 2A7, etc. These tubes had 2.5 volt filaments and drew currents from .8 to 2.5 amperes. This meant that the power transformer had to supply a large amount of filament power. To make more efficient and cheaper-to-operate radios, engineers decided that 6.3 volts would be a more desirable filament voltage. A whole new line of 6.3-volt cathode type tubes were introduced which could operate on either AC or DC filament voltage. This also made the automobile radio possible.

Some of the new 6.3 volt tubes were the 77, 78, 76, 75, 85, 36, 37, 38, 39/44, 41, etc. Then it was decided to do away with two-digit tube num-




Figure 4. Tube filaments connected in series with each other, and with three batteries in series.

bers and replace them with numbers like 6C6, 6D6, 6F6, 6A7, etc. Many of the 6.3-volt tubes had characteristics similar to the 2.5-volt tubes, making it possible in some cases to replace the power transformer and use a set of tubes with different filament voltages. Since the current drawn by the 6.3-volt tubes was .3 to .7 amperes, some power was saved, and smaller wire could be used in the power transformers; this made some savings in component cost possible.

In 1934, design work was being finalized for a new concept in vacuum tubes. The base would have eight pins with a large center keyed guide pin. This allowed the tube to be inserted into the socket only one way; this tube became known as the octal tube. In 1935, the octal tube was introduced with a metal shell instead of glass envelope. Small signal amplifier tubes, i.e. the 6K7, had the grid cap on top. Soon, however, several changes were made. The power amplifier tubes and rectifier tubes were made with glass envelopes, and the grid cap was abolished. The grid connection was made to one of the base pins. The tubes made for portable battery sets continued to have glass envelopes.

Still later the loctal tube was introduced. The loctal tube had no phenolic base; instead the elements – i.e., plate, grid, etc. – were welded to wire pins brought through the bottom of the glass envelope. A metal guide pin, with key, allowed the tube to be inserted properly. The socket had a spring in the center that gripped the guide pin tightly to hold the tube firmly in its socket. RF and IF amplifier tubes with glass envelopes had to have close-fitting metal shields, grounded to the chassis, to prevent interference between stages.

During World War II, the seven- and nine-pin miniature tubes were developed for military use. Many thousands of surplus octal and loctal tubes were in the government warehouses when the war ended. The first postwar radio receivers were built using these tubes. Later every home and auto radio built had the miniature tubes.

If you collect and repair AC-DC radios, you will hear about the All-American Five radios. These sets first used a 6A8, 6K7, 6Q7, 35Z5GT and either a 35L6GT or a 50L6GT. When singleended tubes came along, the All-American Five used a 6SA7, 6SK7, 6SQ7, 35Z5GT, and either the 35L6GT, or the 50L6GT. When seven-pin (Continued on following page)




Figure 5. A multi-filament-voltage transformer with tube filaments connected in parallel.

miniature tubes came along, the All-American five became a 6BE6, 6BA6, 6AV6, 35W4, and either a 50C5 or a 50B5. There were also equivalent loctal tubes.

I would be remiss if I didn't discuss the difference between series and parallel tube filament circuits. We will start with parallel circuits because radios sets made during the first ten years used parallel circuits. For instance, the WD-11 tube needed 1.1 votis DC for its filament so a number 6 dry cell of 1.5 votis supplied the filament power when the tubes were wired in parallel. When the tube filaments were wired in series, several batteries also would be wired in series as shown in Figure 4.

When AC-operated filament tubes came into use, the tubes had different filament voltages. For instance the 26 tube needed 1.5 volts AC; a 27 needed 2.5 volts AC, and a 71A needed 5 volts AC. A power transformer with separate secondary windings provided the necessary voltages. All the tubes, with the same voltage filaments, could be connected in parallel across the same transformer winding as shown in Figure 5. Remember: devices requiring the same voltage, but different current, must be connected in parallel. Devices needing the same current, but different voltages, can be connected in series.

In 1930, the country was in the midst of a depression. People could not pay \$150 to \$600 for a radio receiver. A less expensive radio that would still give satisfactory reception anywhere in the U.S. had to be designed. One solution was




Figure 6. Tube filaments in series with dropping resistor connected with the power line.

to do away with the expensive power transformer. Engineers found that by using tubes whose filaments all drew the same current, you could put tubes in series as shown in Figure 6, even though each tube required different voltage. The value of the series voltage dropping resistor was chosen to give the correct voltage across the series string of tubes. Thus, the inexpensive AC-DC radio was born.

If you only collect and repair radios made from 1935 to 1950, you will have no trouble finding tubes for your radios. Thousands of most tube types are still available. In the few cases where tubes are hard to find, you can use adapters or find substitute tubes.

A Low Cost Isolation Transformer BY ORVAL PARKER

There is a great shock or injury hazard when it is necessary to test or repair an AC/DC type radio. All collectors should be aware that such operation should be conducted with the set powered through an isolation transformer. Test equipment can also be damaged without isolation, but most isolation transformers available are quite expensive; so with limited use needed, we can look at alternative approaches. Two single secondary transformers connected back to back are often advised [as shown in Part 2 of Jim Fred's series on repairing AC radios], but a simpler solution exists. If the surplus electronics catalogs are checked, it will be found that many transformers intended for both 120- or 240-volt operation have two separate primaries as well as the output secondary. Typically such a transformer would have a schematic as illustrated; possibly the terminal arrangement will be indicated for the alternate connections. For isolation conversion one of the primaries can function as primary, and the other primary becomes the isolated output winding.

It also is possible to adjust the output voltage by connecting the secondary winding in series with the input winding as indicated by dotted connecting lines. A transformer with 12- or 24volt secondary, possibly center tapped, weighing two to five pounds, is about right for this project. The cost will be about five dollars. Mounted in a small case with input power cord, switches and output receptable, it can be convenient and safe. Best to be safe, rather than sorry or worse.




Figure 1. Schematic: Conversion of dual primary transformer to isolation type.
