

Here at A.R.C., we receive letters asking about do-ityourself radio repairing and also about repairing services. Whether parts and tubes are still available for old radios, etc. is a concern. We respond with a copy of A.R.C., suggesting perusal of ads, especially the display, business card and boxed classified ads. Some letters report on finding that last-needed part for a repair job through an A.R.C. wanted ad.

Yes, many services are available to collectors... You can buy a broadcaster to transmit old radio programs to your old radios, you can eliminate batteries; you can buy books of schematics or single ones; you can buy books on repairing, on history, on collecting; you can find someone to repair your radio or cabinet, or you can obtain the parts to do the job yourself. Tubes, line cords, old wire, knobs, grille cloth, dial glasses, vibrators, and lots more items are available for your own repair projects. Speakers can be reconed; transformers can be rewound. There are museums to visit; meets, flea markets and conventions to attend; and publications to receive.

Of course, the pages of A.R.C. include a lot of this information also. Over the next several months, we will list Andrew's directory, along with

some last-minute additions by A.R.C.

The radio meet action for AprI spreads from coast to coast with meets from Oregon and Washington State, to Kansas, Texas and Arkansas, to Ohio, Kentucky, North Carolina, and into the Northeastern states of Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, New York and New Hampshire. Western Electric's Best-Known Radio-Related Products – 1920 to 1927 Part 1

In this two-part article. Charles Fisher surveys the radiorelated products produced by Western Electric Company over the period from 1920 to 1927. Covered in this part are the 3A, 3B, 4B and 4D receivers; the 1A loop antenna and the 2A and 2B tuning units. The 7A, 14A and 25A amplifiers and the 2A power supply will be covered in Part 2.

A.R.C. is pleased to have Charles Fisher contribute this article and the fine set of photos which include inside

shots as well as the more common front-panel views. All of the sets are in either Charles' or the editor's collection. (Editor)

Western Electric began as Gray & Barton in Chicago in 1869, making telegraph and other electrical equipment. The Gray of Gray & Barton

- Elisha Gray - was an important inventor, having conceived a workable telephone before Bell did. He later invented the Telautograph which sent handwriting over land lines.

Gray & Barton became Western Electric (W.E.) in 1872; in 1878 they were engaged to manufacture all the new Bell Telephone Co. equipment. They operated briefly at 109 Court St., Boston, by taking over the Charles Williams, Jr. shop where Bell and Tho-




Figure 2. 3B receiver, panel view.

mas Augustus Watson developed the workable telephone. (The author has an American Tool & Machine lathe which was in that shop at the time.)

In the early years of the twentieth century W.E. expanded into household appliances such as vacuum cleaners, percolators, irons and toasters, mostly made by others but widely advertised under the W.E. name. During WWI they developed equipment and tubes for the Signal Corps and the Navy, including the 215A "peanut" tube, which was still in production for WWI!!

In the early 20's, W.E. began making radio re-

ceivers, not for home or amateur use but for commercial interests, with sales limited accordingly.

3A AND 3B RECEIVERS




Figure 3. 3A receiver, inside view.




Figure 4. 3B receiver, inside view.

The Western Electric 3A and 3B receivers, shown in Figures 1, 2, 3 and 4, are the earliest that are not excessively rare, dating from 1921-23. They are four-tube TRF's. using 215A tubes. The antenna input is arranged for either long wire or loop. according to con-The RF nections. transformers in the 3A are wound on square wooden forms similar to the IF filter in the more common 4B. Tubes are located in a metal box whose cover opens on the top of the set; hence they do not appear in the photos. There is one stage of audio, fed by a 218E transformer, suitable for phones or for driving the separate 7A amplifier outfit, illustrated on this month's cover and to be described in Part 2. Perhaps the most unusual feature is the design of the Western Electric-made type 91A tuning condensers, in which the entire rotor appears to be a one-piece lostwax casting, likewise the stator assembly. The plates are thicker at the hubs, tapering toward the edges. The latest patent on the 3A shown is May 10, 1921.

The 3B has a number of minor changes. Different binding post locations relate to details in the tuning unit/loop wiring. The RF transformers are of different round design. The box is fully shielded inside, unlike the 3A, and it has a circuit diagram pasted to the inside back. The latest patent on the copy shown is August 22, 1922.

These sets are beautifully made (like the 4A through the 4D), but as two-stage TRF's they (Continued on following page)




Figure 6. 4D receiver, panel view.

were soon unable to cope with expanding broadcasting. It is to be noted that they do not carry "licensed for commercial use only" labels, although it is an assumed fact. Figure 7 shows the license label from a 4B.

4A, 4B AND 4D RECEIVERS

It became clear that the Superheterodyne principle was superior, and W.E.'s Lewis Clement developed such sets for them. The first of the famous WE superhets was the 4A for restricted sale under patent agreements controlled by RCA. Sales were legally limited to hotels, institutions and broadcasters, etc. — as distinct from "amateurs." They were accordingly made to ulti-

mate industrial quality standards – very visible today.

The 4A is so rare that it will not be detailed here (see article in ARCA *Gazette*, March 1977). Suffice it to say that it used three stages

of IF and the same dial scales as the 3A and 3B.




Figure 8. 4B receiver, inside view.

The 4B receiver, shown in Figures 5 and 8, appeared in 1924, according to the user manual copyright. The book actually covers the "6004B Outfit" which includes receiver 4B, 1A loop, 1002C headphones and 10A battery box.

The 4B receiver uses six 215A peanut tubes: 1st det: osc; two IF stages (45 kHz), 2nd det and audio, and the set must be operated so that the tubes are vertical. Loop is centertapped for a small amount of regeneration giving added sensitivity and selectivity. There is a switch for choosing one or two - IF stages, and option of phone connection to 2nd det or audio amp. In addition there is a five-step attenuator acting on the first IF. Almost all components are W.E. make, a notable exception

being the General Radio tuning condense's like s.l.c. 247's except they have more plates and W.E. part numbers 115A and 115B cast into the counterweights. (Savings in cost of the three series 91A's would have been considerable.) 100 on the dials is high wavelength. The set is entirely shielded like the 3B, and the oscillator is separately shielded; the loop will thus always find two sharp nulls, without interference from stray pick up.

There are two extra jacks in the front panel, which the book says do not enter into operation – they are for factory test only! They in fact measure plate currents of oscillator and 1st detector if a small capacitor is connected to the terminals of the jack plug. The overall audio frequency re-

sponse is quite limited in the bass, not a factor considering the available speakers. This is a result of selectivity in the IF amp and design of the audio transformer. On a loud signal, the effect of the latter is audible by comparing detector and amp output (correcting for level).

The 10A battery box (not shown), included in the 6004B outfit contains space for both A and B batteries. The box is of wood and is 9 1/2" x 10 1/2" x 8 1/2". One compartment with a hinged door holds six No. 6 dry cells to furnish the "A" filament voltage. Another similar compartment holds two Eveready No. 766, 22 1/2-volt batteries for the "B" voltage. A note recommends that only five A batteries be connected when new to insure against burning out the tubes.

The 6004B outfit includes headphones 1002C: I am unable to sav whether these are identical with the common W.E. phones marked 509W; I found a N.O.S. pair in a box marked 1002F

The 4C receiver is evidently identical to the 4B except that it is part of the 6004C outfit which includes the 20A two-section (series and parallel) an-

tenna filter for suppressing a local station's (or another strong carrier) and the 2A tuner.




Figure 9. 4D receiver, inside view.

The 4D, however, is different in most details. It is shown in Figures 6 and 9. The oddest is the variety of nameplates found on different sets, each kind with a different list of patents. Late sets have a small simplified label.

Changes include: replace 1-or-2 stage amp switch and five-step attenuator with a nine-step attenuator; tuning condensers now s.l.w.. (which also tune higher, high numbers for high frequen-

cies); counterweights marked 115 D & E (115C with 17 rotor plates was used in the 2A tuning unit); new type IF transformers are shunted by resistors, probably for preventing oscillation in view of increased gain; there is also a new IF output filter, larger than that in 4B. Finally, the 2nd detector is now fed 22 volts instead of 45 as in 4A, and has no phone jack. The new 226D audio transformer has substantially improved bass and

treble response, a fidelity improvement obviously accompanying those in available speakers and amps, especially the cone type W.E. 540AW and the 25A amplifier to be described in Part 2.

It is almost certain that the 226D transformers often found in 4B's were fitted to improve audio quality, not to replace failed original 218E units.

The 4D was made as late as mid-1927, and perhaps later. As primitive as it seems. compared to the Radiola 28 then available. probably has better audio quality always Western Electric's main interest.

THE 1A LOOP ANTENNA

The 1A loop, in the 6004B outfit is a massive black structure, nicely made, with a rotatable joint




Figure 10. 1A loop antenna used with 4B and 4D receivers.

above the base. It is shown in Figure Narrow and tall, it achieves sensitivity in a minimum of table or bench space. It connects to the set via a strip of woven webbing in which are three leads (one for the center tap). This web prevents changing of the lead spacing, and consequently the tuning changing when the loop is rotated or moved.

THE 2A AND 2B TUNING UNITS





Figure 13. 2A tuning unit, inside view.

The 2A tuning unit, shown in Figures 11 and 13, has a 1920 patent plus "patent applied for." It consists of a varioccupler feeding a tuned circuit using a GR 247 s.l.c. condenser. marked 115C, its W.E. part number. That and the fact that the output coil is centertapped show that it was designed for use with the

Besides the tuning control, there is one for

coupling and a switch for operating either "Aperiodic" or tuned

An improved tuning unit, 2B, appeared some time later, no doubt for use with the 4D set. It is shown in Figures 12 and 14. It uses two fixed capacitors and a small high-efficiency variometer made by General Radio. There is as before a switch for Aperiodic or tuned operation. plus a switch for connecting one or both capacitors, giving two frequency

ranges, 375-600 kHz and 475-1600 kHz. This must have been for monitoring SOS frequencies. The only patent on my 2B (serial 322) refers to the General Radio variometer and is dated 1925.

VINTAGE TELEVISION

Mechanical Television A Stop on the Road to Modern TV – Part 1

In Part 1 (February 1989), Meghan Halstead described the origins of mechanical television and the replica mechanical television equipment constructed by Richard Brewster. In Part 2, she describes the experience of appearing on such a television system and the emergence of electronic television. (Editor)

APPEARING ON TELEVISION

Being televised by mechanical TV is certainly different from stepping in front of the family video camera. Come back with me to a 1930 television station as I describe my brief acting career in our basement, using only equipment common to that era of television.

First, I put white paste on my face and black lines around my eyes. This makeup was required of all actors in the early days of TV. The distinct bright and dark colors cause stronger electric signals than mild tones (such as normal flesh tones). The more contrast between light and dark, the stronger and more distinguishable the image on the receiver.

Now I sit on a stool only one foot away from the photocell box. A white sheet hangs directly behind me. The light inside the transmitter, which passes through the drum and lens before it reaches my face, is directly cooled by a low-humming fan. The lights in our basement are turned off; it must be completely dark so that the photocells react only to the light reflected by me.

Finally, the scanning drum is turned on. The light in my face, before steady, now seems to flicker on and off, as it passes through the holes spinning around it. The scanning motor makes a low vibrating sound, which rises in pitch as the drum rotates faster. If I look at the sheet behind me, I can see the spot of light move from right to left, faster and faster, until it becomes a line and then many lines, forming a square of light, in the center of which is my head. Figure 4 pictures a 1930's actress in a situation similar to mine. Finally, the scanning drum reaches rotating speed, locking in and steadying in pitch.

Ten feet away, my father peers into the twoinch square screen of a 1930 TV set. The scanning drum in it is also rotating, projecting light
(from electric impulses) onto the screen. At first,
all he can see are blurred lines of dark and bright
light. He tries to bring the transmitting picture of
me into coherence by turning a small knob on the
receiver which adjusts that drum's speed. He is
attempting to synchronize the two drums. This is
a difficult process; the picture flips horizontally

very rapidly. He must turn the knob one direction until the flipping slows down and begins to flip in the opposite direction. If he turns the knob just enough before the flipping changes direction, he will be able to keep the picture in a fairly steady position. (The picture flips vertically as well as horizontally. Correction of this problem requires further adjustment.) At this point he depresses an automatic synchronizing circuit which locks the receiver drum's speed, emitting a loud, highpitched whirring sound.

Now I can do some acting. Unfortunately, because I must remain within a foot of the photocells, they only pick up a picture from my shoulders to just above my head, and I am limited to facial and hand gestures. On the TV screen, my father sees me open my mouth, shake my head, and wave my hands. He shouts out how many fingers I hold up, and yells when I make a face at him. It's exciting for us to participate in TV the

way people did 58 years ago.

Actually, it's hard to believe that people enjoyed watching such scenes on tiny, difficult-to-tune-in sets. However, we must remember that when TV first entered American homes, it was a novel and unusual thing. Owners were thrilled to see anything at all on their sets; they were not expecting to see a mini-series or an episode of *Dynasty*. Therefore, they didn't mind only thirty minutes of television a day or only one person watching at a time.

ELECTRONIC TELEVISION

Although mechanical TV was a huge success to inventors and observers alike, it lacked potential and was just a detour on the road to modern TV. Television no longer consists of rotating drums and "flying spots" of light. This method became too cumbersome and immense for every American home. A "new" method, being researched and developed at the same time as mechanical, became the driving technological force behind modern TV.

Electronic television hinges on the invention of a cathode ray tube in 1859, when William Crookes discovered that he could send a stream of electrons through a vacuum tube. Then, in 1897, Karl Braun refined the Crookes tube by placing a fluorescent screen at one end. This made the path of electrons visible. He used deflecting plates so that the stream of electrons could be controlled. Braun's cathode ray tube became a method of projecting a picture with no moving part.

In 1907, A. A. Campbell-Swinton theorized that by using the Braun tube he could develop an electric receiver and transmitter — a completely electronic television system. His theory used two synchronized cathode ray beams; the transmitter beam scanned the picture and sent electric impulses to the receiver, whose beam scanned a cathode ray tube, producing the picture. Unfortunately, Campbell-Swinton's theory preceded available technology. He was never able to put his theory into use.

During the 20's and 30's, with the help of the Radio Corporation of America, Russian scientist Vladimir K. Zworykin took Campbell-Swinton's theory and applied new technology to develop the electronic system of television which we have today. The only significant differences between Zworykin's TV and the present system are that now we have optional color, a much clearer and bigger picture, many channels, and 24-hour programming.

It is interesting to notice how viewer's attitudes have changed since the early years of television. When first available to the public, TV was the focus of marvel and admiration. Families crowded to see the face of a man on a three-inch

screen, scarcely believing that the man was actually hundreds of miles away.

And what about today? We have screens 10feet wide, full color, sound in stereo — and how often do we bother to wonder that it works at all? The pioneer researchers and first audiences realized TV's significance. For them, it truly was "vision at a distance."

We try to correct spelling errors, so when using an uncommon word or manufacturer which looks similar to a common word or manufacturer, note it so that we do not "correct" it. Editor's comments are in [brackets].

Capitalize only manufacturer names, model names, etc. Wanted and For Sale ads are mixed together to encourage the reading of all ads, including the Wanted ads. This standard ad format makes scanning the ads easier.

Before writing your ad, please look over the ads in a recent issue of A.R.C., and try to write your ad

in the same style.

To encourage varied content of the ads, multiple insertions of the same classified ad are limited to two successive months. (To run an ad continuously, use a boxed classified or display ad.)

IMPORTANT — COUNTING WORDS — IMPORTANT

The standard headings: WANTED, FOR SALE, etc., count as one word each time used in an ad. Name, address and (one) telephone number, count as 6 words, regardless of length. Ham call letters and business name can be included in the 6 words and do not count extra. (Note: "Jim, (111) 111-1111" also counts as 6 words.) So, please include complete name and address in your ads.

Each additional word, abbreviation, model number or number group, extra telephone numbers, etc. count as one word. Hyphenated words count as two words.
