This porch scene is from the cover of Radio Supplies - Catalogue R-5 of Julius Andrae & Sons, Co. (March 1923) featuring "Receiving and Transmitting Equipment for Radio Telephone and Telegraph.

In this catalog, a complete Radiola IV, with tubes, batteries and headphones, costs \$275; an RC regenerative tuner-detector-amplifier could be purchased for \$142.50. For only \$65.00 plus \$3.40 for batteries, a complete Aeriola Sr. set could be purchased. Also advertised were the Kennedy Models 110, 220, 281; the Federal DX 58; and the Paragons RD5-A2 and RA10-DA2.

As we know, these early sets were difficult to adjust; the Andrae catalog comments: "The fascination is in the uncertainty of the thing... If you just had to push the button, ...you would discard the set in a month."

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Western Electric's Best-Known Radio-Related Products – 1920 to 1927 Part 2

This is the final part of a two-part article by Charles Fisher which surveys the radio-related products produced by the Western Electric Company over the period from 1920 to 1927. Part 1 covered the 3A, 3B, 4B and 4D receivers, the 1A loop antenna, and the 2A and 2B tuning units. In this part, the 7A (and its 2A power supply), the 14A and the 25A amplifiers are covered.

A.R.C. is pleased to have Charles contribute this article and the fine set of photos which include inside shots as well as the more common front-panel views. All of the sets are in either Charles' or the editor's collection. (Editor)

THE 7A AMPLIFIER

Although the receivers produced by Western Electric were covered in Part 1 of this article, the earliest reasonably common radio-related product is the No. 7A audio amp — No. 516-W spkr. combination, first offered in 1922 as the No. 10A Loud Speaking Telephone Outfit, shown in Figure 1. The No. 7A used the new type 216A tubes descended from WWI tube types. (The instruction sheet for the type 216A tube is shown in




Figure 5. Driver assembly for the 518-W horn.




Figure 3. 7A amplifier, inside view.

The No. 7A, shown in Figures 2 and 3, is a two-stage amplifier with push-pull output, as covered in a 1915 W.E. patent. There is a switched-tap transformer for gain control at the input, and a push-pull input transformer for the output tubes; a third transformer blocks DC from the speaker drive.

THE 516W HORN SPEAKER

The No. 516W horn speaker has the Edgerton

patent balanced-armature driver coupled to a phenolic-impregnated diaphragm – an efficient combination, but one seriously lacking in bass. The balanced armature driver for the No. 516W horn is illustrated in Figure 5. The outwardly identical No. 10D speaker for use with other amplifiers and/or receivers without output transformers has its own single-ended transformer in the base.

THE 2A POWER SUPPLY

The No. 2A Power Supply, shown in Figure 4, is for AC outlet operation of the No. 7A, providing 3 amps AC for filaments and 120 vdc for plates. The combination is thus by far the earliest radio equipment operating entirely "from a light socket." The No. 7A uses two type 217A half wave rectifiers resembling type 216A's except for missing grids and closer spacing of the plates. The No. 7A operates with AC on the filaments almost without

hum. This is because in the first stage, the grid sees the same AC as appears on the filament; in the push-pull stage, the AC on the two tubes cancel because they are in opposite phase.

The No. 2A can be modified to operate normally with one type 280 full-wave rectifier by an obvious and simple wiring change and jumper. It




Figure 6. 14A amplifier-speaker.




Figure 8. 25A amplifier.

is wise to mark unit "modified" to avoid damage if a type 217A is plugged into the modified socket.

No. 14A AMPLIFIER-SPEAKER

As early as 1924, the No. 14A amplifierspeaker combination, shown in Figures 6 and 7. was advertised for sale to the general public. The box-shaped cabinet contains an amplifier electrically identical to the No. 7A along with a driver identical to the No. 516W's, coupled to a built-in folded wooden horn. Its bass response is slightly better than that of the No. 516W. The No. 14A is mentioned in the 4B user manual for use when loudspeaker volume is wanted.

THE 540W SPEAKER

In the first edition of Sterling's Radio Manual is a picture of a broadcast station control room in which are identified a No. 4D, a No. 2B and the No. 540AW paper cone speaker, shown in Fig-

ures 11 and 12, which dates from 1925. These speakers were dramatically better than anything else available at the time, as far as agreeable sound is concerned. They have at least some bass response, and high efficiency. They will handle quite a lot of power, as for instance that provided by the curious but excellent No. 25A amplifier.

THE 25A AMPLIFIER

The No. 25A, a strange item, shown in





Figure 12. 540AW paper cone speaker, rear view.

Figures 8, 9 and 10, weighs many pounds but contains only two tubes, type 205D's, one of which is used as a half-wave rectifier, the other as an amplifier. The weight is largely devoted to the components needed to provide smooth DC for the considerable output power. (I have no data on a No. 25B except that its schematic is identical to that of the No. 25A.)

A final note on the speakers: the balancedarmature driver in the No. 540AW (and the larger 24" version) is the same as that used in the horn speakers. It is also almost identical to those used in the RCA 100, 100A and 103.

A larger, 24-inch model, No. 560W, was also made with identical drive mechanism and similar in appearance except for more decoration around the rim, accented with a pale red design. Experience with two of them suggests that they are no better sounding than the small ones.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Emerson Radio & Phonograph Corporation Compact Model 25

From 1924 to 1932, Emerson distributed radio receivers bearing its name through many diverse channels, including department and sporting goods stores. In 1932, Emerson began to specialize in small receiver sets for home use. This is a short story of one of these "compact" sets, the Model 25.

The year is 1932, and the fortunes of small radio were at a lowly state. For some reason the midget sets had failed to hold their own on the market and had lost public favor; small radio manufacturers were folding up about as fast as they had started. Some of the major companies that produced consoles reluctantly continued their midget models as price and gift items, or just simply to round out their product lines. For all practical purposes, research, engineering and promotion of small radios were dead.

At this time Emerson attempted to make a radio smaller than the midget – a radio only ten inches wide, six-and-a-half inches high and four inches deep. The idea of squeezing a radio chassis along with tubes, speaker and everything else into a case of this size was preposterous to say the least.

No standard speakers, condensers, dials, coils or other components were available, nor were any of the suppliers of radio equipment very enthusiastic about making any. It was a pioneering job, and Emerson engineers went ahead on their own and overcame many discouragements and seemingly insurmountable difficulties. By doing so they developed the first practical, and popularly accepted "compact" radio receiver. They

made radio and merchandising history.

The Model 25 was a four-tube receiver with a six-inch speaker. It weighed only six pounds as compared to the twenty-five pound midgets. The price was fixed at \$25.

More than two hundred thousand sets were sold in 1932-1933 by astounded dealers who could not believe their eyes. This was remarkable as the country was in the depths of the great depression. Orders poured in from all across the country, and for more than a year, orders were greater than production could sustain. Not until the middle of 1933 diproduction and sales come into balance on this one model alone.

Many manufacturers and dealers of the time considered Emerson's small radio as a "depression product," and that with the return of prosperity sales would drop. Instead, sales of small radios climbed to even higher levels in the following years.

One interesting fact, following the introduction of the compact radio, the midget sets experienced a revival; for a short time, a few years, Emerson enjoyed an increase in sales. But after this short spurt of new interest, the trend gradually faded away.

The Saks Fifth Avenue advertisement on the left claims, "UNIQUE – EMERSON COMPACT RADIO"; for an additional \$10, you could purchase an exclusive pigskin carrying case with handle.

By 1935, total production of all types of receivers was 5,500,000, of which 2,600,000 were small

Whither Radio Collecting - Part 3

Having read with interest the first two installments of this forum, I felt the need to add the voice of a common, ordinary collector. I describe myself as such because I do not have thousands of dollars to spend on sets nor the time to travel hundreds of miles each week to

look for early radio goodies.

I have been collecting off and on since 1974, when I purchased the chassis of a Magnavox CR-181 from an uncle. I was 14 years old and was introduced to the antique radio hobby through Mr. Jim Fred's articles in the old Elementary Electronics magazine. I remember Mr. Fred's articles often had pictures of Atwater Kent receivers. I remember the thrill at finding my first Atwater Kent, a Model 55C in a Kiel table. I remember my first cathedral set – a Belmont 51C that I bought for \$5. I also remember my first battery set – a Mohawk Cherokee. However, fifteen years later, the sets in my collection number something less than fifty.

Why don't I have several hundred sets? Well, I have already mentioned two reasons – lack of a large bank account, and many times my work schedule in the past has kept me from attending auctions where old radios were for sale. Also, I have one room upstairs reserved for my radio equipment and have room for more than what I already have; but if I bought too many, space

would become a problem.

I don't really believe that availability of sets will be a problem — at least, not for a while. One important thing to consider is the fact that old sets may turn up in the least likely places. I live in a small town, and I once picked up an Atwater Kent 9A breadboard here in Providence. Also, a lady once brought an Aeriola Senior to me where I used to work; I purchased it for \$30. I purchased a Radiola III from another collector in nearby Madisonville, where I now work. In this same town I came across a Philco 90 – a console with a nice original finish and in playing condition. I bought it for \$55. This goes to show that you, too, just might come across a rare find in your own back yard!

I do not collect TVs, but a fellow I know once GAVE me a Philco Predicta. In turn, I gave it to a TV collector in Madisonville. (I didn't want the

thing either. . .)

I, too, have sometimes traveled long distances to obtain sets. I once made a trip to Kansas City, Missouri, just to trade a couple of sets for another Atwater Kent Kiel table. My mother-in-law took a liking to mine, and I didn't want to give mine up, so I found another one for her. I have bought sets in Kentucky, Missouri, Illinois, Indiana and

Tennessee.

The future availability of sets doesn't really worry me. What bothers me is the increasing number of "collector-dealers" who have discovered the increasing interest in radio and TV collecting as a potential gold mine! Flea market operators and antique store owners have also discovered that people like us collect radios and have begun to raise their prices. I have dealt with a "dealer" in the past, and I would much rather deal with a collector who, like me, is more interested in enjoying the antique radio hobby than making a huge profit.

Recently I have been looking for another car. I thought that I would be able to purchase a nice car that was two or three years old at a substantial savings over a new one. Not true! If you have to get a loan to buy a car and pay for it for X number of months (like me), you soon find that payments on a late model used car are nearly as high as payments on a similar new one!

What does that have to do with our hobby? I'm glad you asked that question. It's one thing to pay a hundred dollars or more for a mint condition Philco cathedral. It's another thing to pay a hundred dollars for a Philco cathedral in fair to junk condition! Yes, it is happening (at least in my area)! I paid \$70 for a Model 89 that needed a lot of work, and I believe I paid too much. I know, I didn't have to buy it, but you know how it is when you find a set you really like . . .

What worries me is that, just as used car dealers have inflated their prices to catch car buyers that are turned off by ten to twenty thousand dollar sticker prices on new cars, radio dealers could send prices increasingly higher until, turned off by rising prices for their goodies, radio collectors may start selling their collections

and take up fishing.

Don't get me wrong, friends; I realize that the rarer the set, the more it's worth. I know that sometimes, if you want a set bad enough, you have to shell out a little more than you might want to. My advice to you would be, keep your eyes and ears open; and if you think something you want costs too much, DON'T BUY IT! More than likely, you'll find another later – and it may even be at a more reasonable price. This has worked for me before, and it may work for you, too.





The survey has two goals:

- 1. To determine the range of current values for horn speakers.
- 2. To determine the distribution of various horn speaker models surviving today.

The questionnaires will be analyzed to find the range over which the value estimates cluster; the high and low of this range will be determined for each model. The reporting of a range of values for each model (instead of only a single average value) will minimize the problem of the high/low bias of buyer/seller estimates. When using the guide, condition and the price differences across the country can be handled by choosing your own value within the range printed. The guide will also include a measure of how many readers estimated the value of each model.

Ownership information also is being collected in this survey. In his book, Floyd Paul reported on a survey of 81 collectors owning 1235 horns. Hopefully this survey can add to his coverage.

Price guides have been popular with A.R.C. readers, and several have been published in the past by A.R.C. Many battery sets were covered in *The Collectors Value Guide* by Jim Kreuzer, printed in thirteen issues from late 1984 to early 1986; in the May 1986 issue, about 40 horn speakers were valued. In addition, two surveys have been conducted by A.R.C.; the magazine value survey results were reported in the December 1986 issue and the tube value survey results in the August 1987 issue.

Some believe that price guides cause bargains to disappear. Although a few "bargain prices" may go up, there also are some items thrown out because they are thought worthless. Some sellers get ripped off by being offered only a fraction of an item's real worth (I believe that knowingly to offer a small percentage of an item's value to someone who asks about an item's worth is unethical.) A value guide which gives you a range of values still allows you to make an offer at the low end, which is not unreasonable to someone not desiring to advertise and look for a "retail" buyer.

So, please participate in A.R.C.'s horn speaker survey! Pull out this center spread; fill in the values of the horns you feel confident to estimate, and check off those horns you own.




