WITH THE COLLECTORS

Philco – Vivid Beauties to Predictas A Photo and Word Essay

A.R.C. presents this article by Fred Geer about Philco from its entry into the radio field in the late 1920's to its Predicta television days. Although some may disagree with some of Fred's personal observations, he prepares us for them in his introduction below. In addition, "Philco Phollies" was his working title for the article. (Editor)

This is an essay on the aesthetics used by Philco in becoming a grandiose builder of radios. I will examine the company through personal observation, some undocumented facts, a few credible sources, and the grand old Philco radios themselves.

Radio's "sea of tranquility" in the 20's was awash with black, brown, and a few drops of dirty color. Radios looked as if Dr. Frankenstein had delivered them from his mad scientist lab. Exposed tubes and parts glistened in the eyes of the buying public who wanted a radio no matter what it looked like. Experimenters enjoyed them in the shed out back, but they were not welcome in the living room.

Manufacturers soon realized that radio was for everyone and should be presented in a package that the lady of the house would enjoy and welcome. Breadboards soon sprouted sides and a top, though they still wore brown, black, or darkly finished wood, with a little brass trim.

Since Philco's (Philadelphia Storage Battery Co.) history goes back to 1892, it was already an old company in 1927. Up to that time it made batteries and radio power supplies.

PHILCO IN THE TWENTIES

Using its large distribution network for batteries, Philco made a tidal wave splash in the 1928 radio market with its "Vivid Beauty," 500-series table models. The colored, well dressed radios were in brown, grey, red, and green; each except the brown one had artistic hand-painted flowers complementing the metal sardine can style cabinets. These cabinets cost Philco one-third less than wood models.

The console cabinets used only the finest woods and veneers. Better than average workmanship and finishing dazzled buyers. A wide range of chassis/cabinet combos were available. Up to 60% of the price was cabinet cost. Some speaker openings had full color needlepoint tapestry depicting the 20's dream home with a whisper of smoke curling from the chimney.

On the technical side Philco played the cards close to the chest, when it came to keeping radio a mystery. But didn't they all? Even the schemat-

ics Philco supplied *Riders* lacked identification of some parts values. Fortunately someone at Riders penciled in the missing information, much to the chagrin of Philco.

THE PHILCO BAKELITE CONDENSER

Possibly to insure that servicemen would buy only Philco parts, the engineering staff may have concocted the black bakelite condenser, shown in Figure 1. Inside they could pack one or two condensers and, just for fun, a resistor now and then too! On the top side, up to eight terminals provided connections for the internal parts and tie points for other wiring. Confusing... but black

bakelite condensers may be the reason why so many 50+ year-old Philcos still work.

These condensers were an in-house product. Special precautions were taken to insure that only the best waxes and foils were used in their construction. Philco actually used a vacuum pump to rid the wax of all traces of moisture, thus allowing the condenser to be thoroughly Impreg-




Figure 4. Close-up of Bel Geddes, stylized letter "P" grille cloth on the Model 112 console.

nated with high temperature wax. They were given a 1,200 volt zap in a test jig, weeding out faulty units.

Rider's Volume 2 has a table that explains all internal connections and parts values for these units. Philco Service Bulletin No. 289, published in 1937, is a chart listing all black bakelites' internal wiring and values. By 1931, Philco claimed to be the "World's largest radio manufacturer."

THE BABY GRAND DESIGN

As the 20's came to a close, Philco saw that large elaborate radios were not the whole market. What people needed were smaller lower priced sets. New advancements in tubes, like the UY224, and more compact chassis and speakers cut costs. Cabinets were a high cost product. Time had come for radio to take a shape all its own. Form Follows Function brought forth a cabinet style shown in Figure 2 that even today says, "RADIO!" The arched cabinet was light and simple to build. It was made of thin wood stressed by the arch for strength, somewhat like a hen's egg. The Model 20 or Baby Grand legitimized the cathedral radio design that had been previously introduced by a few small West Coast manufacturers... a design that many would copy.

THE CLASSIC CONSOLE

Philco invited Norman Bel Geddes, a top industrial designer of the day, to create a number of cabinets for 1931. Bel Geddes said, "There is a still strange point of view in the industry at the moment - to disguise the fact that a radio is a radio." A radio can be put in any kind of cabinet. "It might be assumed that radio need reflect none of these periods, but have a form that would be appropriate anywhere, due to its simplicity and dignity." Bel Geddes' words are reflected in the Lowboy Model 112, Philco touted it stating, "The eleven tube Philco Superheterodyne-Plus deliberately designed to give more performance than the average owner needs." True it was a lot of radio. "Then to give it supreme desirability, Norman Bel Geddes, foremost American designer, has created furniture of exquisite taste and distinction." Bel Geddes' design for Model 112 is a masterpiece and is shown in Figure 3. His design made all other consoles of the day look like an-(Continued on following page)




Figure 5. Drawing of Philco's Beam-O-Lite turntable, 1941.

tiques! His clever use of angle-cut woods change color and tone when the cabinet is viewed under differing lighting conditions, as if it were alive. Speaker grille cloth was a brocade, built on a stylized letter "P", as shown in Figure 4.

Although the woods used by Bel Geddes were real, this was not so for all Philco cabinets. A way of printing photographs of real wood on plain white wood fooled the buyer into thinking the fancy inlay woodwork was real. Many restorers have been surprised to find that they had stripped all the beautiful wood off a prized cabinet. Watch out for those *decals!* This technique was used in 1934 and extended to some consoles after 1937.

Not everyone had the space or cash for a good sounding radio/phonograph console. Inexpensive phonos had a thin sound. Philco to the rescue! With its Modei RP-1 music could be broadcast to any radio in the house including that fine sounding console in the living room. In fact with a longer antenna wire it could cover more than a quarter mile. What a deal! Everybody in the neighborhood could tune in 540 kHz and enjoy your good taste in music.

PHILCO'S BEAM-O-LITE

Philco's greatest "pholly" took place deep inside the 1941 Model 1015 Beam-O-Light, a 12tube console that had the breakthrough everyone wanted, a way of playing records on a beam of light. It was a two-speed 33/78 rpm record changer with a rather large tone arm shown in Figure 5. The head was shrouded in marbleized plastic with a dime-sized red spot conveying the idea of a ruby, all illuminated by a glowing light inside. In technical terms - "A Photo Electric reproducer with a floating jewel which reproduced sound on a beam of light." Under the adornment was a light bulb, optics, a mirror, and a photo cell. A special oscillator in the radio generated a very pure RF voltage which lighted the bulb. The light beam was focused via the

mirror on the edge of the photo cell. The mirror resting on the floating jewel was part of the stylus. As the stylus followed the grooves in the record, the mirror vibrated, thus modulating the light beam striking the photo cell. Like the sound track on a film, the cell changed the light to a voltage which was then amplified. Philco's Beam-O-Lite removed the surface noise and left the music clean and clear. Time and age caused the floating jewel to sink, degrading the music to inaudibility. It was a prehistoric CD.

When WWII halted manufacture of all consumer goods, Philco found itself with a large stock of auto radios for new non-existent 1942 cars. Philco converted the auto radios to operate on 110 volts AC and installed them in leftover console cabinets. War rules allowed no one to buy a new anything!

PHILCO'S RADICAL TV DESIGN

Consumer television began in the late 1930's, and some strange looking sets were designed during the transition from radio to TV. By 1950 larger screens relegated TVs into a box shape; they all looked alike. Philco in a daring move built the Predicta series (see Figure 6) a "Forward Looking Futural TV" and a TV still ahead of its time. The most exciting model was the Predicta Pedestal, a thin elegant floor model whose top climaxed in a 21" picture tube, appearing to float in free space.

With another model, "Philco creates the world's first separate screen TV set! Keep the set beside your chair... Put the picture anywhere!" so the ad said. Little mention of the thick 25' long flat cable needed to connect the powerful chassis with the picture tube. This Predicta was the tandem Model 4710L. Predicta used a Monopole antenna system with the ventilating metal panels acting as half of the rabbit ear. The whip part added a little zip to the design. Luckily for us, Philco made plenty of Predictas over the next few years. [See the December 1988 A.R.C. for a 5-page article on the Philco Predicta.]

The Predicta was to be Philco's last big splash. The Ford Motor Co. bought the company and recently sold the Philco name to North American Phillips. Philco built a super-engineered chassis and complemented it with eyeappealing cabinetry often years ahead of its time. Philco is the poor man's classic – too bad it did not have a chrome-plated chassis1

WITH THE MANUFACTURERS

The Philco Aerial Systems FROM THE PHILCO SERVICEMAN - FEBRUARY, 1935

Philco said to its dealers, "Install a Philco aerial whenever possible, – insure a satisified customer, and a good profit for yourself."

This article is excerpted from the "Philco Serviceman," the Philco newsletter for its service organization which had over 12,000 certified members in 1935. The Philco All-Wave aerial system is also featured on this month's cover. (Editor)

The Philco All-Wave Aerial is a noise-reducing, high efficiency system for reception of both broadcast and shortwave. The system comprises a group of resonant circuits which are responsive to various frequency bands within the shortwave ranges, as well as complete frequency response in the broadcast band. For example, the 17-foot section is resonant to a guarter wave length of the 15-megacycle band. The entire length of 60 feet is resonant to a half wave length in the 6-megacycle band. The 43foot section is resonant to a guarter wave length somewhat below 6 megacycles. The combination of condensers, transformers and transmission line affords various other resonant points throughout the shortwave range. The result is that the antenna system is completely or partially resonant at almost any frequency within the shortwave broadcast transmission band. It likewise affords the high efficiency that a carefully installed antenna of the untuned type would for the other frequencies. When the switch is placed in the broadcast position instead of the short-




Figure 2. The Philco 3-Purpose Aerial was used for standard broadcast reception and was advertised with the following testimonial: "Have installed your three-purpose antenna system. It certainly does what directions say it will. Reception fine -storm in air; but no static. Have tried it on fortyeight stations and all come in clear and distinct."




Figure 1. The Philco All-Wave aerial system. The set transformer has a switch with two positions: broadcast and shortwave.

wave position, the system is then resonant to all frequencies within the broadcast band.

On some occasions better shortwave reception will be obtained for a given frequency with the switch in the broadcast position instead of the shortwave position. In a case of this kind, there is a resonant circuit which is made up of a particular combination of the set transformer and the length of transmission line to produce the better reception. This does not mean that the system is lacking in efficiency in the shortwave band at that particular frequency, but it does mean that under some peculiar circumstances a slightly better resonant condition will be contained with the switch in the broadcast position.

There are several points in the Installation which should be carefully observed at all times in order to get the most efficient reception.

1. The antenna should be as high as possible. If it is feasible to run the antenna from the end of the building out to a pole or tree beyond, such an arrangement would be more desirable than having the antenna run over the roof of the building, because of the greater effective height. The full length of the antenna should be employed whenever possible.

2. Best reception is obtained when the lead-in does not exceed 150 feet.

 A ground connection to the radio chassis will be desirable in most cases. In some installations, however, better reception with less noise may be obtained with the ground wire removed.

RESTORATION TOPICS

Rebuilding Philco Condensers

If you have ever attempted to restore a Philco radio made before World War II, you have encountered their "bakelite block" condensers. Up through 1937 Philco used numerous bakelite blocks in its sets; Philco's sets made between 1937 and 1942 usually had only one bakelite block - the AC line bypass.

What did you do when you came across a bad bakelite block condenser? Did you:

1. Bridge a new capacitor in the set as best as you could, disconnecting the wires from the bakelite block?

Take those nasty old bakelite blocks out and throw them away, install terminal strips and put new capacitors in the set?

3. Rebuild your bakelite blocks?

If you answered "yes" to 1 or 2 above, you took the easy way out, and your restoration is not authentic. (Yes, I am guilty of having once replaced all the bakelite blocks in a set with terminal strips and new components.)

You may say, "Those bakelite blocks are sealed! They look like they would be impossible to rebuild!" You're wrong! Bakelite blocks are actually very easy to rebuild.

Also, you may have come across at least one old Philco set that had been worked on by someone else, sometime over the past forty to fifty years, and it had some, or maybe all, of the bakelite blocks disconnected and paper capacitors "bridged" in. This was because, until recently, it was nearly *impossible* to rebuild the blocks since most of the older paper capacitors were too big to fit inside the bakelite block shell. I have a Philco 90 console, and all of its bakelite blocks had been "bridged" with replacement capacitors. A few of the blocks were even broken where some repairman apparently had the same idea, but his capacitors would not fit!

How is it possible for us to rebuild our bakelite blocks when the radio repairman of the past couldn't? The answer: we can purchase relatively tiny metalized film capacitors which will easily fit inside the bakelite block shell. You can purchase them from Antique Electronic Supply, P.O. Box 1810, Tempe, AZ 85281.

REBUILDING THE BAKELITE BLOCK

To get started, as with anything else, you need to know what you are doing. We will give you some examples, but before you attempt to rebuild a bakelite block, study the schematic of your radio so you will know how the part(s) inside the block are connected.

The construction of a typical bakelite block is simple. It is a black bakelite case with solder lugs




Figure 1. The Philco bakelite block, Part No. 4989-D.

on top. Turn the block over, and you will see that it is sealed with a black waxy-like sealing compound. Inside, depending on the block, is one or two paper-wound capacitors or a capacitor and a wirewound resistor. Looking at the top of the block again, you will see a rivet in each solder lug with a tiny wire coming through the rivet. Those tiny wires connect the part inside the block to the solder lugs.

We will first remove the sealing compound and all of the components inside, and then insert new components in the empty shell.

You can use a soldering iron to melt the compound out, but this is messy (and stinks, too) so I find it easier to scrape the stuff out. The compound may or may not come out easily, depending on the individual bakelite block. It is still waxy in some blocks and is easily scraped out with your pocket knife. On others, it has hardened, making it more difficult to dig out. Be careful when scraping this out, however; if you are too rough, you could break your bakelite block.

After scraping for a few seconds, you will expose the old component(s). Take these out, too. Scrape out all remaining wax until the shell is empty and clean. Then unsolder the tiny wires from the solder lugs and remove these. Make sure the rivet holes are open and not obstructed by solder.

Referring to Figure 1, we will put in our replacement capacitor. All you have to do is stick the wires of your replacement through the proper rivet holes, push the new capacitor into the block, and solder the leads to the solder lugs at the same points where the tiny wires from the old part were soldered. You now have a rebuilt bakelite block.

If you want to, you can reseal the block, but I prefer not to in order to make it simple for the




Figure 2. Additional Philco bakelite blocks.

block to be repaired again, should the need arise. Besides, the open part is on the side that mounts against the chassis and cannot be seen.

Figure 2 gives the details for rebuilding four typical bakelite blocks. You will notice that each block has a different Philco part number, stamped into its side. To rebuild other bakelite blocks, refer to the schematic diagram and also study how the block hooks up in the set.

Many early Philco sets also used large metal cans which housed one or more capacitors. However, we are out of room this time and so we will be back again in the future with details on how to rebuild these.

Philco Mystery Control Alignment BY RICHARD C. FOSTER

Here is a helpful way to align the Philco 39-116 and other wireless remote "Mystery Control" models with great precision and with ease. I worked out this active method after being dissatisfied with the performance of a friend's radio which had been aligned according to Rider. This method also protects the precious 2A4's from burning out due to overloads from the signal generator. The method is based on the fact that the remote receiver section responds to varying voltage and amplifies it like an IF strip.

For power to the "Mystery Control" transmitting unit, I use two D-cells in series for the filament of the 30 tube and five 9-volt transistor batteries in series for the plate. These cells are more than adequate because only pulses are transmitted. Buy good quality, however, for the longest shelf-life. The battery wire color codes in the remote unit are: Red = B+; Black = B-; Yellow = A+; Green = A-.

Be sure that your Mystery Control dial works freely, checking for dried goo in the bearing or a warped dial rubbing on the case. The dial may be removed by unscrewing the decorative cap in its center. For good measure, replace the .05 MFD capacitor and check the 5000 ohm resistor inside the Mystery Control.

ALIGNMENT OF SET CHASSIS SECTION:

 Begin by replacing the tubular capacitors in the remote section of the set chassis. Leaky capacitors are of no help here.

2. Check the pickup loop in the set for continuity. It is recommended to resolder the joints at all connections of the loop.

3. Pull the 2A4 from the set, and connect the AC-volts scale of a VTVM to Pin No. 5 (as seen from the bottom). Use a meter with high ohms/ volt.

4. Make a loop, 12" in diameter, five or six turns to be placed near the set pickup loop.

5. Connect the signal generator to the 12" loop and set the signal generator to the frequency given by the code on the back of the set (See Rider's Manual Vol. IX for a table of frequencies). Turn the sensivitity control knob on the chassis to "Near" (away from "Extreme".) Now, and not before, turn the signal generator on.

6. Set the transformers to resonance in the order given in Rider's IX, using the peak voltage at Pin 5 of the 2A4 as a resonance indicator.

7. Follow the normal procedure to set the "Mystery Control" box (turn the screw in the nut seen in the bottom of the box, using tiny increments) by walking away from the set until the greatest distance possible has been reached. You can tell when you have reached this point because the distance begins to diminish after a certain point is reached on the screw setting.

8. Reset the knob on the set to "Extreme" for hottest performance across the livingroom.

If you peak the transformers carefully, you will be amazed at how very sensitive and responsive the remote unit is, and your visitors will be wideeved. The action really is wireless!



Le Guide Du Collectionneur T.S.F.-Radio-TV, Vol. 2 The Radio and TV Collector's Guide Book, Vol. 2 By Guy Biraud and Richard Foster

BOOK REVIEW BY JOHN P. WOLKONOWICZ

In the August 1988 issue of A.R.C. I reviewed Volume One of *The Radio* and *TV Collectors Guide Book*. Now just about a year later, Volume Two has arrived, completing this interesting two-volume set.

As you may remember, these books comprise something of a Vintage Radio and Flick of theSwitch series for European wireless, radio and TV receivers. Like Volume One, Volume Two is a thick horizontal format paperback with glossy covers measuring 9"x10-3/4" and having 256 pages. It is primarily a picture book, but all text and captions are in English as well as French (Guy Biraud's original French text was translated by Richard Foster).

Biraud used only original advertising illustrations throughout the book to prevent misinformation via pictures or incorrectly restored equipment.

The two volumes are divided into three parts. Part 1 covers early history, makers and their products before 1918; all of Part 1 is in Volume One. Part 2 covers the years 1918 to date with manufacturers' products arranged in alphabetical order; Volume One includes manufacturers through P with the remainder (129 pages) In Volume Two. Part 3 covers television, tubes, accessories, parts, and ephemera; all of Part 3 is in Volume Two.

Part 3 begins with "The History of Television," covered in eighteen very interesting pages. A seven-page "History of European Vacuum Tubes" also contains a separate wall chart on "The Genealogy of European Electron Tubes From 1915-1930." The tube genealogy was written by M. Champeix.

Part 3 has sections on accessories, parts, and ephemera. Accessories covered include loudspeakers, loop antennas, battery eliminators, microphones and pickups, and meters and measuring devices. There is a 34-page section on loudspeakers that is particularly well done. The parts section covers coils, condensers, detectors, potentiometers, resistors, rheostats, and transformers.

The book continues with a very interesting section on radio related ephemera; postcards, stamps, advertising, art and toys. A complete index to Volumes One and Two is included.



As with Volume One, this volume concentrates on equipment from Continental Europe, particularly France; coverage of British makers is much less complete. However, several excellent books are already available on British wireless equipment. The reader may be surprised to note that one of the principal European manufacturers, Philips, is missing from these volumes. Philips, however, was covered in detail in Guy Biraud's previous book *Radio Collectibles Manufactured By Philips* which is still available.

While these books are not for everyone, anybody interested in European equipment will find them invaluable. Unless you have a large collection of European radio magazines, the information contained here is generally unobtainable in this country. Furthermore, the different philosophies of design taken by European manufacturers (versus their American counterparts) is always of great interest.

Volume Two is priced (like Volume One) at \$49.95; both are available from Richard C. Foster (12 Shawmut Ave., Cochituate, MA 01778), Antique Electronic Supply, Vestal Press and A.R.C. While \$100.00 may sound like a lot for two books, I'd guess that quite a few collectors will make the purchase. These books offer a good value for the unusual and important information they contain.

I got distracted.



The General Radio 650-A Impedance Bridge

Some of you may be wondering why I would be including a "laboratory" instrument in a column concerned with radio test equipment as used by the radio repairman. While the impedance bridge was of little use to the radio repairman of yesteryear, it is an invaluable tool for the restorer of today.

Quite often the sets we acquire now have open or shorted coils, chokes and transformers. A few years ago, these sets

would be considered "parts" sets to be salvaged for other useful parts. Now, with the supply of old sets drying up, these parts sets also are the objects of restoration. A faulty transformer is much harder to replace than a capacitor or tube. The damaged unit must be rewound or a replacement made.

Often radios have more than one identical transformer, or coil. In this case, the good transformer can be used to arrive at the specifications for the one needing repair. Otherwise another good transformer can be found in another working set and borrowed to get the specifications. Often the original's specifications are poor or nonexistent.



ible precision and is shown in Figure 1. The bridge will measure: direct current resistance and alternating current resistance (at 1000 cycles) from one miliohm to one meg-ohm with a maximum error of 2%; capacitance (at 1000 cycles) from one pico-farad to 100 micro-farads with a maximum error of 2%; the dissipation factor (RC) of a capacitance from .002 to 1 with a maximum error of 20%; inductance from one micro-henry to 100

And, the use of an ohmmeter alone will not allow you to make a proper transformer.

To properly determine the specifications of a transformer or coil, one needs a good impedance bridge. The impedance bridge can supply all of the information necessary to make a duplicate of the original. The bridge can be used to ascertain the specifications of a working transformer or coil and can also be used to verify the specifications of the repair or replacement.




Figure 2. Basic circuits used in the Type 650-A Bridge.

The General Radio Type 650-A impedance bridge is a beautiful piece of equipment of incredWheatstone bridge, and the inductances are measured by a Maxwell bridge and a Hay bridge. Figure 2 shows some basic circuits used in the Type 650-A Bridge. Figure 3 shows the Type 650-A Bridge being used in a test lab of the 30s.

The 650-A impedance bridge is a most beautiful piece of apparatus. The layout and workmanship are superb. The inside of the cabinet is shielded with sheet copper, and each wire is layed out carefully with perfect bends. It is difficult to imagine how it could be built any better. Originally, the specifications required four No. 6

henries with a maximum error of 10% (at 1000 cycles); and the energy factor of an inductance (Q) from .02 to 1000 with a maximum error of 20%.

In addition, the bridge can perform the following special applications: AC resistance with reactance; the natural frequency of a tuned circuit or inductor; parallel inductance and resistance of an unknown inductor, parallel capacitance and reactance of unknown conan denser, supply of DC polarizing for condensers and DC magnetizing current for iron core coils: direct capacitance of a three terminal condenser; and the terminal capacitance between the terminals of an inductor and its shield.

The resistance and capacitance measurements are made by use of a

dry cells, but a standard sixvolt lantern battery will work just as well.

Little, if anything, goes wrong with the instruments, provided the voltage applied does not exceed the safe limits of the components. One can occasionally find a dirty contact in a switch or a loose connection. If one of the components is damaged, it must be replaced with an exact duplicate, preferably from another unit. Otherwise precision will be sacrificed.

A few hints: The instrument should be attached to a good ground for any capacitance or inductance measurement. Incidentally, when using the bridge for a transformer or choke operating at 60 cycles, DO NOT use house current as an external frequency input. When using the bridge with IF transformers, be sure to input an oscillation of 20 kHz. This is the highest frequency that will work reliably in the bridge. The results will be slightly off for the transformers, but the trimming capacitor should compensate.

Heathkit produced a bridge that is almost an exact duplicate, save for the quality of the cabinet and panel. Its layout and method of operation are almost identical. The operating manual for the Heathkit version is still avail-

able from Heathkit (as are manuals for all of its equipment); therefore it is much easier to obtain than the General Radio manual. Both are interchangeable, but the General Radio manual has a little more information.

As you can see, the impedance bridge will become a most useful piece of equipment as the

supply of inductors dries up, and we have to rely on good reproductions. That's it for now. If you have any questions concerning old test equipment, please let me know.

Component and Testing - High Voltage Circuits

This is the eighth part of a series on basic AC radio repair. This series presents useful hints for both the new collector and the veteran.

In Part 7 (A.R.C., June 1989), we reviewed power supplies. We recommended changing filter capacitors, testing rectifier tubes and renewing the power cord if the old one is not in good condition. If you have done these things carefully, you should have a power suppy that will work for you. You may wish at this time to test the rest of your tubes.

Refer to Parts 1 and 2 of this series (Feb. and Apr. 1988) for details on tools, test equipment, safety, etc. IMPORTANT: do not plug the radio in until you have read the safety tips and warnings in these two installments! (Editor)




Figure 1. Philco Model 70 wiring diagram. "Most Often Needed Radio Diagrams", 1926-1938, page 125.

In this part we will use the Philco 70 (See Figure 1) as an example, and most of what we say will be applicable to other AC sets. This set was chosen because it is common, and it has most of the features we will encounter. We will see how to "divide the set" for a gross performance test, and how to run a voltage check to see if the high-voltage distribution system is functioning correctly.

COMPONENT TESTING




Figure 2. Symbols used in the testing of the Philco Model 70.

Let's back up a moment. If you're a real beginner, refer to the symbols shown in Figure 2. Remember that any time you want to read the value of a resistor or capacitor with a tester, you should make sure the set is off. Then disconnect one end of the component, and keep your hands off the leads so as not to falsify the reading.

Resistors: A resistor impedes the flow of current, adjusts voltage and generates heat. Its value corresponds to the colors of its stripes or the colors of its body/end/spot combination. The colors indicate the digits of the resistance value as follows:

First stripe or body: first figure. Second stripe or end: second figure. Third stripe or spot: multiplier (number of zeros). Where:

Black: zero Brown: one Red: two Orange: three Yellow: four

Green: five Blue: six Violet: seven Gray: eight White: nine

Thus a resistor colored brown/red/red is 1200 ohms; brown/black/green is 1,000,000 ohms or one megohm.

An extra color band if present indicates tolerance (accuracy of the resistance value) as follows:

> Gold: 5% Silver: 10%

No color band: 20%

The measured resistance reading should correspond with the color coded value to within 20%, closer if there is a gold or silver tolerance band. When in doubt and the resistance is above 0.1 meg (100,000 ohms), change the resistor.

Capacitors: A capacitor is generally two lay-

ers of foil separated by insulating material (dielectric) most often rolled into a cylinder with wires coming out the ends. They pass varying voltages (AC) but not direct current, and can allow radio or voice currents to pass through while blocking battery currents. Unfortunately you cannot measure *capacitance* values with a VOM. However, when measured with an ohmmeter, they show a swing to low resistance while they charge, decaying to a very high resistance.

This happens very quickly [and you can see the meter needle swing] unless the capacity is large.

Transformers: A transformer is the mounting of two or more coils of wire on a core or a form, so arranged that varying voltage in one coil will induce a similar varying voltage in the others. The voltage ratios between the coils is directly related to the ratio of the number of turns in the respective coils. Most transformers measure as a quite low resistance across the windings. Some interstage transformers measure at two or three thousand ohms on their secondaries.

Coils: A coil is a series of turns of wires wound on a form, having many interesting properties. "Coil" may be used to mean a radio-frequency transformer. The coils should measure very low ohms on your meter.

TESTING THE SET

Before you turn on your set, make a quick visual inspection beneath the chassis, looking for wires without insulation, dripping wax or tar – especially from your power transformer – or burned resistors. These conditions should be corrected before you try your set. Another check that is most useful at the start is checking large wirewound resistors for open sections. They are easy to spot because they often have blue or brown (as in the Philco 70) porcelain coatings, or steel shells with tabs protruding (called "Candohm" resistors).

Bear this principle in mind: if a resistor opened or a transformer became hot, something caused it to happen which needs to be corrected.

A quick test for a short-circuit in the B+ circuit can be run. Make sure the set is off. Set a voltohm meter to ohms and connect as follows: negative lead to chassis and positive lead to the rectifier filament. With meter on the 10K ohm setting: the needle should swing almost to zero, then return to something like 50,000 ohms as the filter capacitors charge up. A zero or very low reading indicates a short.

We are ready to test the set. There are two tests to be run now. A voltmeter is needed, and the location of the detector (or 2d detector) must be known. Detector tubes often have numbers like 24-A, 75, 85, 6B7, 6Q7 and so on. Many of the earlier ones have a grid-cap (with a wire connected to it) on top. The Philco 70 uses a 24-A as a second detector.

Turn the on/off switch off, and plug in the set. Be prepared to cut the power off quickly if anything goes wrong. If you have access to an AC ammeter that will read 10 amperes, you may want to put it in series with one side of the AC line cord; the current drawn in amperes should correspond roughly to the wattage drawn by the set divided by 100 (100 watts ought to show about 1 ampere after the initial surge).

When you turn on the power, watch the 80 rectifier tube. If you see blue flashes or if it glows orange after a moment, cut off the current, because there is a short circuit somewhere. If your ammeter reading is way too high, cut off the current. If all goes well, the filament will glow normally, and no strange noises will issue from the speaker. The other tubes will light, and the set will warm up.

A theoretical diversion: AC radios have a tune# and high-frequency amplifier section to bring in, select and amplify the wanted signal. They have a detector tube to separate what you want to hear (the audio signal) from the high frequency (radio frequency signal) you cannot use, and they have an amplifier to drive the speaker. The detector tube is a convenient place to "divide the set" into its main parts and to test the output half all in one quick check with the following test.

Classic Test Number One: Place your finger on the grid cap of the detector tube (the fourth tube from the left on the Philco diagram), and you should hear a loud humming in the speaker. If the detector tube has no cap, you can put your finger on the middle terminal of the three terminals normally found on the volume control (IMPOR-TANT: The volume control assembly often also includes the AC power switch, which is usually the rear part of the volume control with two terminals. 110v AC voltage is connected to these two terminals and is dangerous. Carefully touch only the center terminal of the three on the volume control portion and not the two on the AC switch *(Continued on following page)*

portion. Also, remember, keep your other hand off the chassis!). You should get the same humming. This sound will show at once that the power supply is delivering its voltage and that the audio amplifier is working. No humming means the contrary.




Figure 3. Tube socket base diagrams of tubes used in the Philco Model 70.

Classic Test Number Two: The voltage test. Turn the chassis over (never turn over a live chassis lest one of your fingers contact something hot underneath - you'll drop the chassis every time). Use your voltmeter on the 300 volt DC scale with the negative lead to the chassis or clipped to the negative terminal of the filter capacitors. Referring to the basing diagram of the tubes, (See Figure 3), locate the **plate** terminal of each tube. (Base diagrams are always viewed from the bottom, or pin end, and are read clockwise). Your probe here, with the set in operation, should give you over 200 volts, the correct value can be determined by referring to service information for the set. Up to 20% variation from specified voltages is not surprising, as line voltages are higher today, and meter calibration may not be exact. The next pin going clockwise is usually a screen grid and should show high voltage as well, usually a bit higher than the plate voltage.

Conductive Path Tests: Now is a good time to test the various conductive paths. There is little voltage drop through transformers, chokes and coils. For example, check the voltage at each point along the path from the rectifier filament, through the choke coil (#39 on the diagram in Figure 1), and the speaker field coil (#36 on the diagram in Figure 1), and through coils to the plates of the tubes. Note also the branch leading from the large resistor to the screen grids of the tubes. When a problem exists, the methodical checking of these paths becomes very important in helping to locate the cause.

Several typical problem scenarios follow. For each, the symptoms observed/measured are described, and the probable cause and possible fixes are suggested.

Scenario A: The rectifier tube lights, but you can't get any humming (in Classic Test Number One). You run a voltage check and find no high voltage anywhere but at the rectifier filament. Following the circuit diagram leads you to the speaker, whose large field coil is part of the power supply circuit. A continuity check (with the set off) shows that it has infinite resistance. You need to repair or replace the speaker. We'll talk later about replacements.

Scenario B: No humming and the output tube begins to glow orange. Check for plate voltage on the output tube (here the 47). If there is no plate voltage, the transformer that couples the tube to the speaker (#34 on the diagram) is suspect and should be checked for an open. (The orange glow comes from the screen grid which acts as a plate when there is no plate voltage.)

Scenario C: No humming, plenty of voltage at the output tube, but the grid of the output tube shows an abnormal reading. Normal is negative. (The grid voltage is measured with a Vacuum Tube Volt Meter, VTVM; a VOM cannot be used

as it affects the voltage being measured. Normal grid voltage is negative, sometimes up to 45 volts negative.) One of the highest stress points in an AC set is the capacitor (#31 on the diagram) that couples the signal from the second detector plate to the output tube's grid. This part often shorts or gets leaky and needs replacement. In many early sets like Majestics and Kolsters from the late 20s, a transformer was used for coupling; it needs to be checked as it frequently opens up.

Scenario D: The rectifier lights, you get humming, you run voltage check checks and find a couple of RF tubes without plate voltage. Reference to the diagram shows that the RF tube plates are connected to the power supply through coils, and that the voltage path has a bypass capacitor (#21 on the diagram) running to chassis ground. On the Philco 70 diagram these coils have numbers 6, 18 and 20. Step one: disconnect the high end of the capacitor, and check it for resistance. Zero or low ohms indicate a short; the capacitor needs replacement. A healthy one tested on a voltmeter with a needle will show a jolt as the meter battery charges the capacitor followed by a return to a range between several hundred thousand ohms and infinity. Use at least 10K ohms for your scale setting. Step 2: check the coils for continuity, using a resistance check from the plate to coil terminals. You must find a reading of almost zero ohms on at least two pins, one in, one out. Philco sets often have bad coils, but they can be rewound.

Scenario E: When performing the conductive path tests, you find low or no screen grid voltage on the tubes. Notice that in this set, the volume control, which is connected to the resistor #37, is part of the voltage path to the screen grids. Either it or condenser #5 (next to #21 in the diagram) may be at fault.

Here in Part 8 we have covered the locating and correcting of the majority of set problems which occur in the parts subjected to high voltage. These are the components that are stressed the most and that break down first. Obviously, we have not covered everything, but these procedures provide a good and methodical way to begin repaining your set.
