In this issue, you will find...

The Marconi-RCA Model 106D on the cover introduces you to Wally Worth's article describing the development history of the set and the restoration of his 106D.

The Patterson Model PR-10 communications receiver is the topic of Henry Rogers' article. He finds that the PR-10's performance is less than that of comparable receivers of that period.

Also covered is the BIGGEST antique radio event of the year – the 1989 Antique Wireless Association (AWA) Historical Conference at Canandaigua, New York. The report includes photos of the contest and the flea market, and a listing of several hundred auction prices.

Although commercial television development was delayed by World War II, television was a part of our war effort. Al Weiner sent in photos and comments on the BC-1211 patrol plane television camera system.

Horn Speaker Survey. The Horn Speaker Survey Questionnaires have been tabulated, and a preliminary report was given at the AWA conference. (If you would like a copy of the presentation, send a long double-stamped SASE marked "Horn Survey Report.") The survey reported on 659 horns of 191 different types. 14.4% of the horns were Atwater Kent, followed in order by Magnavox, RCA, Western Electric, Amplion, Music Master, with 3% for Winkler/Reichmann, Dictograph and Tower.

We are waiting another month or two for more data before we finalize our results. If you would like to complete the survey form, or add more data to one you may have sent in earlier, write us for a "Horn Speaker Questionnaire."

Display Advertising Rate Increase. One never likes to increase prices, but the increase in circulation forces us to raise display advertising rates (see the inside front cover). However, the old rates will be honored for up to a six-month prepaid run if received before December 1.

ON THE COVER

Since we haven't featured an early wireless set on the cover for a while, here is the Marconi-RCA Type 106D wireless receiver.

The cover set, restored by Richard Foster, is from the editor's collection. The lead article on this receiver was contributed by Wally Worth and includes photos of the set he is restoring.

A number of original versions of the 106 were made; in addition, factory modifications converted the early versions to the 106D.

OOPS

Ron Ramirez wrote about an error in Figure 2 of his article "Rebuilding Philco Condensers" (A.R.C. October 1989, p. 9). On Part No. 3793-E, the condenser shown connected between the middle and the right terminal is actually connected between the left and right terminal.

Relating to this, but not an "oops," L. A. Mann tells us that collectors in his area call these items "boat type" condensers because of their shape.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Marconi 106 Receivers

The British Marconi Co. began manufacturing the Model 106 series receivers in 1915. The receiver consisted of a rugged cabinet that held a highly sophisticated crystal set with tuned primary and secondary coils. Two separate crystal detectors were used. One was a galena crystal with a catwhisker. The other was a carborundum detector with a zero-center potentiometer with a battery used to produce a potential across the detector, either positive or negative.

A panel-mounted buzzer connected to a battery through a push button, also on the front panel, was used to generate a signal so that the crystal could be set to a sensitive spot without the need of receiving a station signal.

An extensive array of switch points allowed a selection of

turns on the primary coil; another smaller set of points for the secondary coil gave a tuning range of 200 to 3500 meters. The two tuning condensers across the primary and secondary coils were fitted with shorting switches at the end of the rotation to cut them in or out of the circuit to avoid dead-end losses.

In 1922, the Model 106 was converted by the manufacturer to a one-tube receiver with the crystal as a back-up and with a switch added to the panel for selecting either the crystal or tube method of detection. These became the 106B and 106C Models.

U.S. MANUFACTURE

The Model 106 receivers were manufactured throughout World War I by the Britishowned Marconi Co. In an effort to insure the United States a supply of radio receivers in case of further hostilities, and also to protect the domestic radio industry, the U.S. Government decided in favor of an American corporation to manufacture receivers.

ers and communication equipment. To accomplish this, the Marconi Company's patents and manufacturing rights were purchased by the General Electric Company.

Agreements between RCA and the General Electric Co. resulted in a partnership wherein GE would become the equipment manufacturer and




Figure 3. The restored Model 106D chassis showing the location of the detector tube installed by RCA.

RCA would be the sole sales force behind these products. [Details regarding this period in the history of RCA can be found in the *History of Communications-Electronics in the U.S. Navy*, by Captain L. S. Howeth. 1963.]

RCA's Model 106 was sold under the Marconi patents, but when the 201 vacuum tube became available, the company recalled the 106, 106B, and 106C models already sold, and changed the circuitry into the regenerative one-tube sets that collectors find today. This altered receiver was called the Model 106D as shown in Figure 1.

Circuitry changes involved removing the potentiometer (no longer needed) and substituting a rheostat to control the tube filament, adding a new dial plate to go over the engraved dial markings on the panel, and adding a mechanical linkage to vary the tickler coil regeneration. The new

linkage required another knob on the front panel, but there was no room for it. The answer was to replace the solid coupler shaft with a hollow one and insert the added tickler control shaft inside. This new shaft moved the tickler coil for regeneration control.

The new dial plate added the words "Coupling" and "Tickler" and displayed the new model number 106D. The original engraving containing the old model numbers 106, 106B, or 106C was left on the panel, however.

As a result of the aftermarket changeover to a tube type detector, there is no peephole to see the tube to judge the filament temperature. Also, to replace the tube, the front panel has to be unscrewed (11

screws) and the chassis pulled out of the cabinet. These receivers were used mostly on ships of the Navy as the standard receiver in conjunction with the primitive transmitters of the day. These models were replaced when new and more powerful sets came along, but, because of the size and weight, many were just junked, accounting for their scarcity today.

RESTORING THE MODEL 106




Figure 4. Schematic diagram of the earlier Type 106 Receiver using only a crystal type detector for reception.




Figure 2. Chassis for the Patterson PR-10 receiver and Patterson pre-selector.




Figure 3. Underside of the Paterson PR-10 receiver showing the tuning mechanism and uncoated wire-wound coils.

My own set shown in Figure 2, was in deplorable condition when I found it in a chicken house; it required many hours of washing and polishing the nickel and other metal hardware. I also had to replace many pieces of deteriorating wiring as the circuit had seen many changes and repairs over the years. This reflected the low regard for these sets in the 20's and 30's. The result is

shown in Figure 3. Figure 4 illustrates the original wiring diagram of the Type 106 with a crystal unit for a detector.

As you can see from Figure 2, my set was converted to a Model 106D from the earlier 106B version; the two crystal detector mounts were removed. The small knob on the lower middle shaft is a replacement; the original was like the knobs on the two condenser controls on either side. Also, due to their scarcity, a nonoriginal buzzer cap has been substituted on the panel.

The brass reproduction nameplate I acquired for the top surface of the cabinet shows the Marconi Co. as the manufacturer and gives the serial number, range in meters, and Navy nomenclature.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Patterson PR-10

The Almost Great Receiver

The Patterson Radio Company of Los Angeles, California, manufactured its PR-10 communications receiver in 1934. The PR-10 has many of the features of the classics of that period. For example, it has a chrome-plated chassis, a fairly large complement of tubes, and colorful, illuminated dials.

When seeing a Patterson PR-10, I am reminded of my first encounter with this make of radio, which was my first communications re-

better than any Army-Navy surplus store.

One Saturday morning with nothing special planned, I decided to ride my bicycle over to Walt's and see what items he had scrounged up in the last few weeks. Walking through that single door, I immediately spotted the black, wrinkled, louvered cabinet of a radio sitting on the floor. There was even a single earphone laying on top of the lid. I didn't know what make it was, but it certainly looked impressive with its

ceiver. I was about fifteen years old at the time and living in the North Bay Area of California. Located in the town of San Pablo was "The Hole in the Wall," a junk shop with a flat facade and one door which inspired the name. The Hole in the Wall was owned by an unusual character named Walt Lane. Walt was a motorcycle hell-raiser in his youth; however, a motorcycle accident had left him with a permanently disabled hip.




Figure 1. Side view of the BC-1211 camera unit.

Running an establishment like The Hole in the Wall must have been a lot of work for Walt, but he always managed to have the two tiny rooms literally crammed to the ceiling with interesting and sometimes choice items – hundreds of books, old military uniforms and medals – just about anything a kid would dream of owning. Walt would usually sit behind the glass lined counter, his black rimmed glasses perched half-way down his nose; his bushy hair looked as if he had just climbed off a Harley. Patiently, he would show us kids his most interesting curios, usually extracted from one of the glassed cases kept behind the counter. The Hole in the Wall was

chrome- plated chassis and weird green and yellow celluloid dials. The set was a Patterson PR-10 which is shown in Figure 1.

"How much?" I asked Walt.

"Oh...how about fifteen dollars?" Walt replied in his somewhat nasal voice, peering over those black-rimmed glasses.

"I've got three. Will you hold it 'til I get back?" I asked, hoping I could raise the twelve dollars from somewhere.

"Yeah, sure." Walt was always agreeable to almost any deal.

Racing home, I told my Dad about my fantastic find, and he agreed to finance another one of my "old radio" indulgences. That afternoon Walt was paid, and I brought the Patterson PR-10 home. I already had a few old sets around the house, so there was a wire antenna strung-up on the roof. Hooking up the antenna, the PR-10 was plugged into the wall socket and switched on. It worked! That was quite a night, tuning in different sta-

tions, looking through those illuminated green and yellow dials at the red indicators behind, and listening on the single earphone while watching the "R" meter flick about its scale.

After several weeks of tuning around the bands, I was beginning to notice what I believed to be performance problems. All the amateurs tuned in were locals and even the shortwave broadcast DX was not impressive. I was formulating an idea that was to be the undoing of the Patterson PR-10. Thinking "newer is better," I decided to change all the Type 57 and 58 tubes to octal equivalents!




Figure 2. The RCA Type BC-1211 camera unit.

Changing all the tube sockets, the power transformer, (different filament voltages), and finding all the tubes was a major accomplishment (see Figure 2). The rewiring seemed tedious but was completed in a few days. The moment had arrived! I was expecting to be deluged with DXI Instead, the PR-10 only functioned on the broadcast band and then only received one station. Aligning proved fruitless, and finally in frustration, the Patterson was placed in the junk box.

About fifteen years after my first PR-10 experience, I acquired my present Patterson PR-10. It was missing a few parts which the former PR-10 supplied via the junk box. The cabinet required a new wrinkle finish but otherwise it was an excellent set.

A common problem with the PR-10 is the velvet drive mechanism. The rubber friction wheel deforms over the years leaving it with a flat spot. When tuning, it drives the dial one-half turn and then slips. Fortunately the friction wheel can easily be removed. As the rubber is somewhat hard, it is possible to reshape the surface by trimming it on a lathe. This results in a smooth drive when reinstalled.

Sensitivity is adequate, though not impressive. The coils are wound with cotton covered wire that was never coated, as shown in Figure 3. Moisture ingression could have been the cause for poor performance.

A couple of vears ago I was fortunate enough to obtain a matching Patterson preselector. This unit uses two Type 58 tubes resulting in three RF stages when used with the PR-10. The same coil construction is utilized resulting in the same questionable performance Oddly enough, the chassis is not chrome plated: however, the same translucent dials and a wrinkle black

cabinet are used, matching the PR-10's appearance. With the pre-selector in operation, overall sensitivity is improved, as is selectivity. Stability, however, is not good, with oscillation occurring when the gain is advanced too far. Perhaps the greatest disadvantage of the PR-10 and pre-selector is the lack of calibration. All dials are 0-100, with the broadcast band an exception.

The Patterson PR-10 and pre-selector are a particularly interesting combination. I always enjoy tuning around once and a while, even though several contemporary sets (the National HRO, for example) are much better receivers.

Incidentally, last time I was in San Pablo, Walt had closed up The Hole in the Wall. It looked as if urban renewal and civic progress were successful in swallowing up another old-time business, thereby ending a great source of memories.

ANTIQUE WIRELESS ASSOCIATION 1989 CONFERENCE & AUCTION REPORT

Over 930 collectors, 200-plus flea market spaces, four auctions, an outstanding array of contest entries, seminars, visits to the A.W.A. Museum, and simply rapping about collecting – this was the 28th annual Historical Conference of the Antique Wireless Association held October 4th through 7th in Canandaigua, New York.

This report is for those of you who could not attend this largest meet of the year, as well as a record for those who did go. Included is a listing of most of the auction items and photos of entries in the Old Equipment Contest and of the flea market. More information on the conference itself is usually published by the A.W.A. in its membership bulletin, *The Old Timer's Bulletin*. (Write the A.W.A. at P.O. Box "E", Breesport, NY 14816, for membership information.)

Auction sales totaled about \$29,500. New this year was a Television Auction; although only four items in this auction went for over \$100, interest was great. A DeForest Interpanel set brought the highest bid in the General Auction at \$1800; the set was in fine condition. A DeForest Type HR tube generated the highest single item bid of \$360 in the Tube Auction. The Communications Receiver Auction had several quality items going for over \$100, with a Hammarlund SP-600 receiver auctioned at the highest bid of \$235.

This report represents a selection of the auction items. Deleted are some items in poor condition, items with inadequate description and items with low selling prices. The auction listing has been sorted by manufacturer with the prices of similar items combined. The information reported is our best attempt to combine all information available to A.R.C.; however, no guarantee can be made for accuracy. Many thanks to Ray Chase who provided this auction report. (John V. Terrey)

General Auction. The General Auction contained 251 lots which were auctioned for a total of \$18,853. In addition to the DeForest Interpanel which was auctioned for \$1800, a 15-panel DeForest went for \$950. A unique crystal set made of pottery in the shape of a bug went for \$1200. Note: e = excellent, g = good, f = fair, p = poor, HB = home brew.




1905 Branley Coherer detector. The coherer is on the left with the tapper above. Contest entry by Andre Chompret.



VINTAGE TELEVISION

WWII Airborne Television

BY AL WEINER

During the war RCA designed and built an airborne television system. A patrol plane had a camera mounted in the nose and relayed live TV pictures to other planes and to ground receivers on 230 Mc.

The equipment went under the nomenclature of ATK and consisted of a TV camera "conversion" unit, a 7" monitor, a video transmitter, and a receiver. The equipment was designed to work from the aircraft's 28volt system. Picture quality was quite good despite the green display of the old 7CP1 CRT in the monitor. The construction quality was grade A, First Class.

Figure 1 shows a side view of the camera unit BC-1211. Clearly shown is the iconoscope pickup tube in the center. The iconoscope was not too sensitive, but performed well in daylight.

Figure 2 shows the front of the camera unit including the 3" Bausch & Lomb Iens. The Iens assembly could be moved back and forth to

focus the camera. There was no iris as the camera was used wide open.




Figure 3. The RCA Type ATK monitor.

Figure 3 shows the ATK monitor. Note the 7" 7CP1 CRT which gave a green image.

Most of this equipment was plentiful on the government surplus market about fifteen years ago. Now it is quite hard to come by, but occasionally shows up at flea markets. \$50 to \$100 is tops for this old stuff.



VINTAGE TEST EQUIPMENT

Calibrating A Tube Tester Without A Chart

More test equipment appears to be available than supporting literature. Often one will find a perfectly nice tube tester, lacking some or all of the information necessary for its use, for example—the test chart.

There is a way to get almost any tester to test any tube that can be fit into it. A tube manual and some proven good tubes of the type you will want to test are necessary. If you have some tubes that are known to be bad, that will help too. You will also need another tube tester of the same general type (emission, mutual conductance, grid shift, etc.) as the tester you want to calibrate and a voltmeter. Once you have all that together, it is just a matter of taking the time to calibrate the instrument.

TUBE PIN VOLTAGES

First, determine which switches regulate the pins upon which is placed the filament voltage. Use your tube manual to find out which pins are the filament pins for a tube that you would like to test. You should start out with a triode or other simple tube until you get the hang of it. With a voltmeter's leads inserted into the socket holes corresponding to the filament pins, adjust the tester until the rated voltage is read on the meter. Once that is done, you can put a tube into the tester without fear of damage.

The plate voltage is usually less in the tester than it would be in a radio. Next, determine if any switches on the tester control the plate pin location. You want to get the plate voltage on the right pin. Some testers have it preset, while others require that it be set. With your meter set, make sure the plate voltage is going to the right pin.

Some testers have just a circuit selector. In that case, look up a tube of similar characteristics that you have on your chart (if you have an abbreviated one), and set the controls accordingly; otherwise, you will have to experiment with the different settings. For example, almost all 4-pin tubes have the filament, grid and plate on the same pins. Therefore, whatever setup is necessary for one will work for all as far as circuit selection. Remember, rectifiers and diodes usually have their own test circuit and should only be matched up with tubes of the same type for calibration.

CALIBRATION

First test a tube of known quality in the other tester. Note its position on the meter. Then put the tube in the tester you want to calibrate, and

adjust the meter setting controls until the meter reads the same as the other tester. It is best to start with low settings (often with the controls set fully counterclockwise), and work your way up. Generally, the switches with fixed positions (ones that click on to a number of fixed positions) are the course adjustments, and the potentiometers (infinitely variable switches) are for fine adjustments. Eventually you should be able to duplicate the specifications for any tube that you want to test.

Remember, if you have an abbreviated chart, try to find a tube that is similar on your chart and go from there. Tube manuals are fairly common at swap meets, and perhaps you can borrow a similar tube tester which does not have to be the same brand. All testers used about four or five different types of circuits. The differences were in the switching systems.

TESTING TUBES FOR SHORTS

As for short tests: again, tubes with components on the same pins will show shorts regardless of the tube type. For example, any tube with the plate, grid, etc. in the same place will show shorts the same way. Make sure that the voltages are on the right pins, especially filament voltages. Many tube testers used AC for the filament voltage of all tubes as hum was not a factor in tube checking. If you have any tubes that are known to be bad (testing weak but with filament intact), you can double check your calibration by seeing if it tests bad in your tester. Be sure to write down your calibrations once you figure them out.

I have followed the above plan to be able to test tubes for which I do not have listings. You may run into trouble with miniature tubes, but the earlier tubes should be no problem. Beware of multi-purpose tubes; you will have to make a calibration for each section. Another hint: often tubes have exact or similar substitutes or the same specifications with a different base. For instance, the 5Y3 is the same tube as the 80 but with an octal base. You can use the characteristics of the 80 with the pin setup for the 5Y3 in your manual to determine control settings. The 27 and 56 are close enough so that the setting for one is good for the other.

This may seem like a lot of work, but seeing that old tester work again is worth it.
