EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Though March in New England came in like a lion, there's hope in the air for spring as we go to press. Perhaps spring fever accounts for the growth in the number of events and ads advertised in this issue. The happy result is a larger issue — eight more pages than usual — allowing sixteen contributed articles, as well as Radio Miscellanea letters and Photo Review.

Our lead article features the RCA Radiola IV receiver. William Boyd's detailed account of this mid-1920s, 3-tube set includes actual on-the-air listening test results. A.R.C. has supplemented Boyd's article with a couple of nuggets from your editor's collection — a Radiola IV brochure and the publicity photo on the cover.

The Ediswan crystal set, ca. 1923-24, is the subject of another of Ian Sanders' excellent articles on British crystal sets. Ian tells much about the history of Edison Swan, the manufacturer of the world's first valves in 1904 and their subsequent use by Marconi.

Harold Isenring, with his many years of Sears electronic service background, lets us in on the genesis of the name "Commentator" for the Sears Silvertone. Harold also describes several idiosyncrasies which plagued the performance of this set.

At the Houston Vintage Radio Association's Mega Auction, over 500 lots crossed the block, nearly one-half of them vacuum tubes. Proceeds of over \$12,000 included a top bid of \$475 for a Sentinel Catalin.

For Radio Ramblings..., Fred Geer writes in a nostalgic vein about a post-World War II console — the Philco Model 46-1209. Fred and his sister were introduced to DX-ing on its broadcast and shortwave bands.

We present six follow-ups this month, as extra space allowed us to catch up on your welcome feedback to articles, questions, and comments in previous issues.

Permeability tuning filled many of our 1994 pages, and new info on this subject continues to surface. Alan Douglas' article reveals that the choice of permeability tuning was primarily economic.

Home brew loop antennas are a Dwane Stevens special interest. He reminds us that, although a loop antenna may appear to be just several turns of wire on wooden sticks, a well designed loop, correctly matched to a receiver, results in improved set performance.

Dwayne's loop antenna concepts inspired Michael Godar to replace the rabbit ears on a modern television set with a loop antenna. Michael now manufactures and distributes the "Super Antenna."

Buford Chidester's information about a Symphonic Globe speaker with the correct and original driver provides several construction details of interest. Dick Desjarlais reports the comments of five readers on his miniature Pastime radio, shown on our May 1995 cover. The most significant point is that the circuit is a reflex circuit, not simply a TRF circuit.

Follow-ups on call letters tell how radio station formats have changed — WIBG (I Believe in God) and WBCN (Broadcast Concert Network) are now rock stations. Perhaps most amusing is lowa station WSUI, which took its call letters from the familiar hog call.

Get your thinking caps on again. The second installment of Dave Crocker's "Radio Quiz" has an additional 42 questions, enough to drive you a little crazy.

The new Indiana Historical Addio Museum, housed in an historic, 1930s filling station, has over 400 radios on display. Our report indicates that the museum has hosted more than 7,000 visitors in less than a year.

As with so many items, an interesting story developed when Larry Babcock saw a Century code practice set at a radio meet. Although Century became a part of Federal in 1908, buzzers with the Century name are found on many early wireless receivers.

Photo Review this month shows sets from the 1920s to the 1960s and includes two farm radios designed for both 110-volt and 6-volt operation. Reader feedback continues with our regular Radio Miscellanea page.

Two book reviews are included this month — a 1919 Gilbert Radio Apparatus catalog reprint, reviewed by Jerry Finamore, and another of Eric Wrobbel's pamphlets on transistor radios, reviewed by Wally Worth.

New Books. Transistor radio collectors will be pleased to hear that the Bunises have released the second edition of their transistor radio price guide. As with the new editions of their other price guides, this one contains all new photos and additional models.

For years, Moore's book on communications receivers was the major reference for collectors of communication and amateur radio receivers. In March, Chuck Dachis released his superb, 225-page book on Hallicrafters equipment featuring over 1000 photographs. Only a few months ago, Chuck Penson's excellent book on Heathkit amateur radio products was released. A.R.C. carries the new Hallicrafters and Heathkit books.

The Eliminator. Although its history goes back to 1985, the radio collector parody *The Eliminator* has been included regularly in the April issue of A.R.C. since 1988. This year, *The Eliminator* editor decided to "eliminate" it from A.R.C. We are sorry to see it go, but if you would like to be kept up-to-date on the activities of the AC Radio Renegades, write to the A.C.R.R. at 3426 Coldstream Ct., Lexington, KY 40517.

Coming Radio Events. Spring is the setting for nearly four dozen events throughout the U. S. Look for A.R.C. in New Hampshire in April, at the Dayton Hamvention in May, and perhaps at the May National Vintage Communications Fair in Birmingham, England, and the July Extravaganza in Michigan. We hope to see you at one of these events, so stop by and say "Hi."



WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Classic RCA Radiola IV

The January 1994 A.R.C. carried a cover photo and article on William Boyd's RCA Radiola I crystal set. With this article, he continues his series on RCA Radiola receivers, providing information on restoration of the Radiola IV audio transformers and a list of stations received on his set. (Editor)

"The Radiola IV is a complete dry cell-operated vacuum tube regenerative receiver and amplifier, including a self-contained loudspeaker," states the introductory paragraph of the 1923 Radiola IV manual. The Radiola IV was manufactured by the General Electric Company for the Radio Corporation of America, as noted in the logo shown in Figure 1. The radio sold for \$275 according to an advertisement in Radio News, March 1923.




Figure 2. A front view of the radio shows the detailed cabinetry.

The radio's mahogany-finished cabinet, shown in Figures 2 and 3, is a classic ornate design of superb workmanship. Figure 4 reveals a front view of the control panel with the left door open. In Figure 5, the control panel is removed. Note the driver and neck of the horn assembly in the left compartment, with the horn itself taking up the right compartment.

The self-contained battery requirements are the following: three A dry cells, 1½ volts each for filaments; four B batteries, 22½ volts each for the plate voltages; and one C battery, 4½ volts for grid bias. Also in Figure 5, note the left rear of the cabinet interior which houses the A batteries, and the right rear which houses the plate batteries. The rear center area holds the C battery in such a position that protruding brass strips make contact with the battery terminals.

Figure 6 shows the control panel and chassis, while Figure 7 provides an under-chassis view of the radio.

The circuit consists of a sensitive 3-tube regenerative design with a detector and two transformer-coupled audio stages. Three Type UV-199 short-pln tubes make up the tube complement. The amplification factor for the UV-199 is 6.6 with a maximum undistorted output of 0.007 watts.

RECEIVER OPERATION

Regarding filament control, the manual for the Radiola IV suggests the following: "When a station is heard, slowly decrease the filament brilliancy until the signal strength begins to diminlsh, then increase the brilliancy just sufficient to restore full signal strength. Burning the filaments brighter than necessary decreases the life of the vacuum tubes."

The manual also notes, "There are two antenna jacks, one for wavelengths between 200 and 400 meters, and one for wavelengths between 350 and 600 meters. Since most of the broadcasting stations send on wavelengths between 360 and 400 meters, they may be received with the antenna plugged into either of the jacks."

The front panel controls of the Model IV are identified as: Filament, Wavelength, Intensity, and Vernier.

The filament control is adjusted for the required filament voltage — 3.3v. Next, station tuning requires adjustment of the wavelength control for a maximum signal from broadcast stations, while adjusting the intensity control for increased signal strength. As with all regenerative receivers, the intensity control is adjusted to

the verge of oscillation. This is where the receiver is the most sensitive and selective. Fine frequency adjustment is accomplished with the vemier control.

To get the Radiola IV in operation, I used an outdoor 50-foot long wire antenna and the house wiring ground. DC power was provided by a kit-assembled solid-state power supply.

Performance of this 3-tube 1923 receiver is outstanding! Sensitivity is excellent, and selectivity is more than adequate. Tables I and II detail the performance by listing the stations received.

The power supply voltages applied to the Radiola IV are as follows:

Filament = 3.0v Detector Plate = +45v Audio Plate = +90v Audio Grid Bias = -4.5v

The volume is affected by switching in 40 K, 25 K, and 15 K Ω resistors across the secondary (Continued on following page)




Figure 8. Schematic wiring diagram of the Radiola IV.

of the first audio transformer with a 3-position switch located on the right side of the chassis, as shown in the schematic in Figure 8. Volume can, in fact, be very loud, and one has to switch to the "soft" position of the volume switch. Speaker distortion is only present on the "loud" position for some local stations.

As the manual points out, headphones may be plugged into Stage 1 or Stage 2 jacks when you are trying to receive very distant stations. In this case, the loudspeaker is automatically disconnected. I found the use of the headphone jacks unnecessary.

Microphonics are not a problem due to the tube performance and the fact that the 3-tube assembly is shock-mounted.

RESTORATION/AUDIO TRANSFORMERS

This hard-to-find set was complete as received, having had some prior restoration. As is often the case, both audio transformers had open windings — in this case, primary windings. I purchased and measured the DC resistance of replacement UV-712 transformers from various Radiola sets and found there are two types of UV-712 transformers having different turns ratios and DC resistance.

Both versions have been used in various Radiola sets (Radiola II, IV, V). The higher turns ratio unit provides increased sensitivity while the smaller turns ratio tends not to overdrive an audio output stage. Both versions work well in the radio. The published transformer specifications indicate a response of 30-3,000 Hz. My measurements indicate a useful bandwidth for about 30 Hz to 10 kHz. Finally, the loudspeaker DC resistance measures about 1.100 ohms.

In summary, the Radiola IV receiver works well, and the operation of the set is straightforward. This conclusion very much agrees with a Radio News. March 1923, advertisement which states:

RADIO RAMBLINGS...

"Me and My Philco" — Model 46-1209

World War II was over and Americans were cash rich. Nothing new had been available since April 16, 1942. People stood in long lines with cash in hand to get their names on an order list for that long-awaited new anything. It was a wild time. Dad had his name on several lists for all the new things we wanted. People bought things, sight unseen, if they were lucky enough to get them.

One day, the dealer down Broadway called and offered us a Philco console with a tilt-out phonograph for \$215. My sister and I flipped out! We could not wait to see our radio. We trusted the Philco name, since our Philco PT-69 with its puttering clock had served us well for seven years.

That night we went to see the radio, which turned out to be a Model 46-1209. Other Philco 46-1209s I have seen come with a tiltout phonograph compartment door that is square at the bottom, with a plain vertical center bar. My version, as shown in the illustration, has a compartment door that is curved at the bottom corners with a design in the vertical center bar. Its sound was a treat - the lifelike, full, rich bass shook the floor.

My sister and I pooled all our money, and with an extra hundred from Dad, we bought the Philco. Anticipating its delivery, we had a hard time sleeping.

We lived across the street

from our school, and I watched from the school window all day hoping to see the radio arrive. I even considered sneaking out if it came during school. Three o'clock seemed as if it would never come.

The radio arrived just after I got home. The delivery people showed me how to work everything and set the push buttons to five St. Louis stations. They explained how to move the loop antenna for best station pickup and how to work the phonograph, which had a moving coil phono pickup.

Sister had bought two records that were played to destruction in the ensuing hours. We danced to them so many times that night that I can still recite the words to "Apple Blossom Time" and "Choo Choo Boogie."

It was 10:00 p.m. Central Time, my bedtime, and the CBS news boomed over KMOX. Even bad news sounded good on this radio. Moving the selector switch from pushbutton to manual tuning, I inadvertently changed stations. Instead

of the familiar "KMOX, the voice of St. Louis," I suddenly heard, "WBT, Charlotte." What a shocking moment! I quickly tuned up and down the dial finding it alive with hundreds of stations. That afternoon, when the radio arrived, it had picked up only the local St. Louis stations.

Then I heard those awful words — "Go to bed! School tomorrow!" How dreadful! What a thought, when the Philco was calling me out to play! I begged, "Just a little longer?" My parents gave in, sensing my fascination with the new radio. I was lost in the excitement of listening tc far-off stations from New York to Salt Lake City.

The station I most clearly remember was WLW,

Cincinnati. Its intro was "plunk-plunk-plink," like a string being plucked, with "WLW, the Crosley Broadcasting System, Cincinnati, the nation's station" sounding over the plucking. Stations in 1946 gave ID's often.

Getting an atlas, I found all the station locations. "Me and my Philco" formed a relationship that night, because that was when I decided to log all the stations in the world. That night a new hobby was bom — DXing.

I was warred that DXing "puts a strain on the radio" by pulling in stations so far away. But you know how radios are. A California station would slip in,

and I had to listen even though the radio was supposedly under great stress. Finally, my parents forced me to bed at 11:30.

The next day, I discovered that shortwave held a special treat. At 3 P.M. CST, "Armed Forces Radio Service" (AFRS) broadcast many of the nighttime radio shows that came on after my normal bedtime. I was in heaven. No more sneak listening! The Philco had made an honest kid out of me.

EPILOGUE

When television came in, our Philco Model 46-1209 ended up as a vocational school shop radio mascot. It was working well in 1972 — the last time I saw it. The Model PT-69 resides on a shelf in my bedroom and still works, but the clock passed on years ago.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Sears Silvertone Commentator Radio

BY HAROLD ISENRING

This article on the Sears "Commentator" radio has been a long time coming. There is a lot of misinformation about this popular midget radio, most of which concerns production dates. There were, in fact, two models, one prewar version in 1939 and a slightly modified postwar version in 1946. Outwardly, they perform and look the same. (Editor)

In early 1939, Noblitt-Sparks (Arvin) of Columbus, Indiana, a supplier of Silvertone radios for Sears, came up with an excellently designed midget radio to replace the successful "Election Model." (See my article in A.R.C., October 1992, pages 8-9.) The replacement was the "Commentator model," a 5-tube superheterodyne with a built-in loop antenna in a surround plastic cabinet. The postwar version, a Model 7004, is shown in Figure 1. It has four mechanical push buttons that push down, thus assuring cabinet position stability.

There are three cabinet colors — walnut, Model 3351; ivory, Model 3451; and a solid onyx, Model 3551 (not Catalin). The ivory cabinet is solid black plastic sprayed with ivory-colored lacquer. It has red knobs and push buttons. The walnut and onyx models have gold knobs and push buttons. The tubes used are Types 12A8GT, 12K7GT, 12SQ7GT, 35L6GT and 35Z4GT. The radio uses a 120-volt C7 lamp, so a rectifier like 35Z5GT with a tapped heater for a 6-volt pilot lamp is not needed. The price range for these models was \$9.95 to \$12.95.

SOURCE OF THE NAME

Like the "Election Model" before it, this radio needed a name. In early 1939, war clouds were gathering in Europe. At that time, most Americans could trace their ancestry to Western Europe, and they were very concerned about what was happening in the "old country."

The only sources of news were daily newspapers and theater newsreels. A radio newscast was a rarity, until a successful 5-minute radio news report by Elmer Davis began to be aired every evening at 7:55 CST. The warring nations broadcast their propaganda to the U.S. via shortwave radio, and so shortwave radios became very popular.

The radio networks began to send reporters to Europe to get the truth about the war. These reporters, all famous names by now, began 15-minute evening reports daily. After the news, they usually brought in military and political experts for interviews. Soon these reporters began to comment on the news of the day themselves, and so they were called "commentators." Thus, Sears picked up on this great name for the new radio that could receive newscasts anywhere in the house with its built-in loop antenna. [This radio, and those of similar design were also often called "Candy Cane" radios due to the curved shape of the plastic dial.]

PROBLEMS

Early on, after the set was in the field, a problem of oscillator drift was noted. The set drifted low about 12.6 kHz during the first hour of operation. This made push-button setup a problem. It was recommended that the push-button cams be set while the set was cold and the drift annoyance compensated for by the manual tuning knob as it occurred. Radios of the competition of the era also had drift problems but with a few as low as 2

kHz. By using negative temperature-compensated capacitors, I have reduced the drift in my Model 7004 to 4.5 kHz.

There were some early failures of the C7 pilot lamp. C7 pilot lamp filaments vibrated badly if the set was played loud.

There was also a problem with the models using gold knobs and push-button caps. They were made of solid yellow plastic sprayed with a gold paint. The paint soon wore off exposing the yellow plastic. In later production, the knobs and caps were solid gold-colored plastic which looks as good as new today.

As our country feverishly prepared for war, certain parts

shortages occurred. Due to the shortage of Alnico for magnets, the PM speaker was replaced with an electromagnetic speaker with a 3000ohm field. The field was connected in shunt with

the B voltage.

Plastic for cabinets became unavailable due to war production. Early in 1942, before the government stopped civilian production of radios, a Model 7020 with a metal cabinet patterned after walnut Model 3351 but without push buttons was produced. [See A.R.C., January 1993, page 7.] An ivory Model 7022 was also made. The metal cabinet prevented the use of the loop antenna in its old position. The depth of the base was increased by 1½ inches, and a Faraday shielded loop was mounted in the metal base. The antenna worked suprisingly well.

In early 1942, as production was nearing an end, Sears ordered that a quantity of parts be squirreled away so that it could be first on the market with a radio after the war was over. The set reappeared in the stores for the 1945 fall and

Christmas seasons.

In early 1946, Arvin slightly modified the set to use single-ended tubes [i.e., tubes without the grid cap associated with the Type 12A8GT and 12K7GT]. The new model used 12SA7GT, 12SK7GT, 12SQ7GT, 35L6GT, and 35Z5GT tubes. The postwar production had new model numbers — Model 7004, walnut; Model 7006, ivory; and Model 7008, onyx. The new design worked as well as the old models but with the same drift problem.

After the set was in the field a while, it began

appearing in the shop with a weird problem. The sharp IF amplifier was becoming broad. Some, as viewed on a scope with a swept oscillator, were double-humped.

It turned out that the IF transformers were impregnated with a very low temperature wax. As the inside of the set heated up, the wax melted and gravity pulled the top winding closer to the bottom winding and thus modified the response curve of the IF transformer. In some cases, the top coil actually reached the lower coil producing an over-coupled, double-humped characteristic.

This overcoupling caused each station to appear on two spots on the dial. Arvin responded to this problem by increasing cabinet ventilation. The top of the rear grille cloth was folded back on itself to produce a %-inch slot at the top. Arvin, of course, had the IF transformer vendor change to a wax more resistant to higher temperatures.

In spite of its few problems, the Commentator was a very popular radio. I am proud to have a walnut Model 7004 radio in my collection.

The Indiana Historic Radio Museum

On May 20, 1995, the new Indiana Historic Radio Museum opened its doors to the public. After being guests at several other museums, members of the Indiana Historical Radio Society (IHRS) decided that it was time to have their own museum.

The building is conveniently located in Ligonier, halfway between Fort Wayne and South Bend, Indiana. On the National Historic Registry as a 1930s filling station, it has been completely refurbished and now houses over 400 radios and radio-related items. The front office houses the Ligonier Visitors Center, which helps in the day-to-day operation of the building.

With "Preservation for Posterity" as the IHRS logo, the museum leans heavily toward education. Schools have shown a great interest, and many groups have already made use of the facility. In the first four weeks, the museum had over 400 visitors, and as of February 1, that number

had grown to 7,000.

Some of the displays featured are the following: farm sets of the 1930s, crystal sets, World War I and II sets, early speakers, tubes, Catalins and telegraphy. Hands-on displays include an opportunity to try to tune a 1920s 3-dial set and to listen to a set that plays old-time radio tapes at the push of a button.

No admission is charged, but the museum has set up a fund at the Noble County Community



Foundation which oversees all donations made to the museum. This fund ensures that the museum will exist for future generations.

Due to new construction, the museum is closed until May, when it will be open Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays from 10 A.M. to 3 P.M. An additional day is likely. In March, it was open on Saturdays from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M. or by special appointment. The Indiana Historic Radio Museum is located just two blocks north of the junction of US 6, US 33, and State Road 5 in Ligonier. The Ediswan Crystal Sets (1923-24)

We are always glad when Ian Sanders adds to his excellent series on British crystal sets. Articles like this one enable us to foster the interests of that segment of our readership who are collectors of foreign sets. (Editor)

"The Ediswan reputation, solidly established upon 40 years' experience and service, is your guarantee of perfect satisfaction. Ediswan means 'the best possible." (Wireless World. October 10, 1923)

The Edison Swan Electric Company Limited was the result of a merger, in 1883, of the Edison Electric Light Company and the Swan Electric Lighting Company, both suppliers of electric lamps to the British market. Originally called the Edison and Swan United Electric Light Company, the new company adopted its abbreviated name Ediswan in 1916.

Best known as a producer of 1920s British radio valves under the Ediswan brand name, Edison Swan had the distinction of manufacturing the world's first valves, following an order in 1904 by Ambrose Fleming for samples of his experimental diodes. These were subsequently used as detectors by the Marconi Company, and until 1919, Edison Swan produced all valves used by Marconi.

Valves continued to be produced under the Ediswan brand name until 1929, when a merger with British Thomson-Houston and Metropolitan-Vickers took place. The new company, renamed Associated Electrical Industries Limited, replaced the Ediswan name with the name Mazda for all but some specialized and nondomestic valves.

In the early 1920s, Edison Swan also produced a range of receivers and wireless accessories, including headphones. Among these products were two crystal sets named for their year of manufacture — the Model 1923B and various versions of the Model 1924.

THE EDISWAN MODEL 1923B

The Model 1923B crystal set, shown in Figure 1, was introduced in the spring of 1923. The receiver is constructed in a dark wood cabinet with a lid and measures 8 x 5 x 7½ inches. All fittings are lacquered brass, and the ebonite panel carries the Post-Office registration number 433. Advertised in *Amateur Wireless* of April 7, 1923, as "... bang up-to-date and bristling with good features," the Model 1923B was purportedly being turned out of the Edison Swan factory at the rate of one every six minutes.

The wavelength coverage is 200-500 meters, and tuning is of the tapped inductance type; a switch at the left of the panel enables a condenser to be connected in series with the aerial. Early advertisements claimed a guaranteed range of 25 miles, but later ones added the caveat "under favourable conditions."

The detector is of the catwhisker/galena type, but has the unusual feature of a removable ebonite cap which could be screwed over the crystal for protection; see Figure 2. When the set was in use, the cap could be screwed over a threaded




Figure 3. The shortwave Ediswan 1924B crystal set.

brass dome located on the panel in front of the condenser switch.

In 1923, the Model 1923B sold for four pounds, seven shillings, six pence (£4.375), a price which included headphones and accessories.

THE EDISWAN MODEL 1924

A second crystal set, the Ediswan Model 1924B, shown in Figure 3, was offered in the summer of 1924. The Model 1924 is a more compact set than the earlier 1923B, and is of particularly neat external appearance. Smaller than its predecessor, measuring just 2½ x 5 x 3½ inches, the 1924 consists of a black ebonite panel mounted on an open-tray style base. Either walnut or mahogany finish was available. The panel carries the BBC approval stamp and the Post-Office registration number 4385. The aerial, earth and headphone terminals are nickel-plated.

Tuning over a range of 200-700 meters is by means of a pull-out slider located on the right

hand side of the base. The tuning coil is located inside the tray and is unusual in that it is wound with a rectangular cross section to facilitate the linear slide arrangement — itself an uncommon feature in British crystal sets of this period. The detector is of the open catwhisker/galena type.

Different versions of the Model 1924 were available, and Gordon Bussey lists six types — three models, each available in either mahogany or walnut. The set shown in Figure 3 is the shortwave Model 1924B, although the designation 3 only seems to have appeared on the instruction card; see Figure 4. In addition, a 1924L and 1924P were available, both of which incorporated a socket at the back of the set for an external loading coil. The 1924L was a long-wave model, and the 1924P included the loading coil from the BBC's experimental station 5XX operating from Chelmsford.

The Model 1924B was supplied in a distinctive crimson carton, shown in Figure 5, and in 1924 sold for one pound, seventeen shillings, nine pence (£1.89) which included one pair of headphones and aerial and earth equipment. The models 1924L and 1924P models were both priced over two pounds.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Permeability Tuning = Lower Cost

BY ALAN C. DOUGLAS

Permeability tuning has been a provocative subject since John Stanley asked for information in the March 1994 issue of A.R.C. Ray Bintliff compiled reader responses in the August and September 1994 issues and here is still more information from Alan Douglas' archives.(Editor)

Here's some additional information on permeability tuning, copied from a letter I received in May 1980 from H. L. Chadbourne of La Jolla, California. Chad, now deceased, was researching the development of communications receivers for a book he intended to write, and he had corresponded with engineers and company founders before changing his focus to pre-1900 wireless. He felt he would never know enough to do a really authoritative book on communications receivers, but he was wrong — I wish he had done it.

The following information from the letter is based on an interview with Dr. Carl Dan Pierson, an engineer with Belmont Radio Corp. from 1940 to 1944 and a short postwar period. He then left to get his

doctorate and go into teaching.

"Belmont was started in 1935 as a garage operation by Harold Mattis and another man. After the company was really operating, William L. Dunn was its chief engineer. Belmont was successful, and after a while was able to acquire the Dickens Ave. (main) plant of the bankrupt Grigsby-Grunow (Majestic) Co., across the street from the much larger Zenith Radio. The plant was Belmont's home for the life of the company. By World War II, employment was about 1,000, mainly women on the assembly line. There were six or seven engineers, and eight to ten drafting and technical staff. Employment increased slightly during the war.

"The most costly item on a typical AC/DC chassis was the tuning capacitor, which ran around 95c. Belmont was able to substitute a permeability tuner which worked as well or better but cost 45c.

"From the outset Belmont was a private brand name or house supplier. The company did not attempt to market its own line of receivers. Instead it sold its output to Montgomery Ward, Westem Auto Supply and other merchandising outlets, who used

various brand names on the sets.

"When World War II came, Belmont was given the prime contract for Army ground IFF (identification friend or foe) equipment. Hazeltine had the prime Navy contract, and at first Hazeltine's design was used for the Army gear. Then other designs were introduced, some quite advanced. It was a bit of an honor for a company as small and as new as Belmont to be given a prime contract.

"Belmont redesigned the BC-348 aircraft receiver to incorporate its old favorite, permeability tuning. This was quite a feat. There were 6 bands and 2 tuned circuits before the first RF, followed by a tuned mixer and oscillator, or 6 x 4 = 24 coils that

required suitable cores and a mechanism for moving them, plus provision for interstage shielding and a bandswitch. The result was 9 pounds lighter and a little smaller than the standard BC-348, yet worked very well. A few units were shipped to Wright-Patterson AFB, but this version was never put into production.

"Postwar Belmont was divided internally into two parts — government products and consumer goods. Raytheon bought the company because it wanted to cash in on the boom it saw coming (correctly) for TV. However, Belmont, being a house supplier, had no marketing or distribution setup, and Raytheon itself was oriented to defense work. Belmont TVs were all right, but the mechanism to sell them was

(From the files of Fred B. Cassens, Supt. of Zenith Radio Corp.'s Final Assembly Division, ca. 1937.) absent. So Raytheon sold the consumer goods part of the company to Admiral and moved the government part to Santa Barbara, where it exists today as a western division of Raytheon."

I have paraphrased a few portions of this letter. As you can see, the primary motivation for permeability tuning was economic. A manufacturing cost of fifty cents was a great deal of money in 1940. As an example, see the manufacturing costs for the Zenith console production line in 1937 in Table I. courtesy of the late Fred Cassens. The final assembly and shipping cost was nineteen cents per set. broken down into 30 separate operations, whose costs were figured down to two-tenths of a cent.

Regarding RCA's use of permeability tuning:

the ARB military aircraft receiver, designed and built by RCA, used it. Serge Krauss is quoted in the May 1991 AWA Old Timer's Bulletin (p. 19) as saying that RCA's core material was better than that of other suppliers and that RCA eventually had to tell its future competitor how to make it.

More on Call Letters

Scott Kilgore's article "Call Letter Meanings" in the February 1995 issue of A.R.C. triggered many memories of early radio stations. A little contest seems to be underway to determine the winner of the best call-letter story "sweepstakes." Perhaps there are more entries out there. (Editor)

From Alan Douglas:

While it's true that many old station call letters have now-forgotten meanings or slogans, for the earliest ones the calls came first and the slogans later, WOC, WBT, WLW, and KOA, for instance. were all assigned alphabetically (not at random), and their slogans were invented later to fit the occasion.

If you look in the 1922 government callbook, you can see that letters were assigned in sequence, skipping those still held by ships or by shore stations. As ships changed registry (or sank), new calls became available. Of course, some of the broadcast licenses changed hands too: KOA was originally owned by the Denver YMCA, and I doubt that it was heard "Klear Over Denver," let alone "America." a slogan adopted years afterward.

At some point around 1923, applicants could request particular calls, but the only obvious one in the June 1922 callbook is KOP, the Detroit Police

Department.

WEEI in Boston, by the way, stands for the Edison Electric Illuminating Co., not the Edison Electric Institute.

Here's my entry in the "best call-letter story" sweepstakes. Any Philadelphians about my age (I went to college there in the early 1960s) will remember the loud rock station WIBG. What was never said was that when the station was first owned by St. Paul's Church in Elkins Park, the call letters stood for "I Believe in God"! [Another of today's rock stations - WBCN in Boston - was originally a classical music station, part of the "Broadcast Concert Network."]

From Phil Whitney:

I always liked the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company's WEAR Cleveland, which apparently referred to their tires, and WIOD in Miami, which was identified as "Wonderful Isle of Dreams." When telephone companies owned radio stations, WCAP in Washington stood for "Chesapeake and Potomac"

(a telephone company). WOWL stood for the Owl Battery Company in New Orleans, WNYC's meaning was obvious, since it was owned by New York City. WRC, still operating in Washington, D.C., stood for "Radio Corporation (of America)."

"Sui" was a hog caller's way of rounding up his pigs so the State University of Iowa's radio station call letters were WSUI. WLIT was owned by the Lit Brothers Department Store in Philadelphia. When WABC in New York City began broadcasting in the 1930s, it was owned by the Atlantic Broadcasting Company, but it became the flagship NBC station there later before changing to the American Broadcasting Company. Owned by Atlantic City and located on the steel pier, WPG stood for "World's Play Ground."

Good references for call letter information are the NAB Yearbook, Stevenson's Radio Bulletin of 1933, most magazines of the 1920s to the 1930s. and my book, Virginia Broadcasting, 120 Years on the Air, published by the Virginia Association of Broadcasters.

A Yankee magazine article of September 1972 tells of New England's first radio station — WGI-AMRAD, standing for American Radio and Research Corp., manufacturers of crystal sets. Two rooms of the factory on the edge of the Tufts University campus in Medford, Mass., housed the station, which featured mostly classical music for only a few hours a day.

In the 1921 Christmas season, Bob Emery, wellknown to New Englanders for decades as a radio and TV personality, read stories to children, as well as their letters to Santa. Emery was probably the first performer ever to use a telephone regularly on the radio; he was perhaps the first talk show host.

This article claims several other "firsts" for WGI-AMRAD: the first to broadcast college lectures, weather and stock market reports, religious and children's programs, dramas, and a political speech by Boston mayor James Michael Curley. However, the station disappeared from the airways in the late 1930s, and the studio-factory became Tufts' North Hall, which burned down in 1972.

More on the Symphonic Globe Speaker

BY BUFORD CHIDESTER

Since I am a cone speaker collector, I very much appreciated the good article on the Symphonic Globe speaker in the February issue of A.R.C.

It is important to note that the picture of the internal driver, shown in Figure 3 of the article, is that of an Atwater Kent unit and not of the original driver supplied with this speaker. As shown in Figure 1, the original driver contained a horse-

shoe magnet very similar to the RCA 100s, Westem Electric, etc. It has a mechanical, tensiontype volume control that extends through the bottom of the globe. The driver assembly is attached by means of a triangle pot metal transition piece.

The slots on the bottom portion of the globe were originally covered in a blue/green silk, similar in color to the globe itself. Over the years, in most cases, the globe color has changed to a darker green, with the silk fading to a very light blue/green. Edges of the slots at the bottom of the globe were actually painted with blue paint before the silk was installed.

Last but not least, the cone material is a fabric commonly known as Burtex, which is constructed of two different fabric textures laminated together. Cone speakers such as the Splitdorf, Stevens, Algonquin, Magnet, etc. are good examples of Burtex cones manufactured by the Stevens Company. Usually, these cones were formed by stretching the material over a cone-shaped form, resulting in a seamless cone, unlike most of the paper type cones.

Pastime Follow-up

The May 1995 A.R.C. carried a cover article on Dick Desjarlais' Pastime miniature radio. Reader response was helpful and enlightening. (Editor)

Several sharp-eyed responders to my article on the Pastime miniature console (May 1995) were quick to note that the circuitry for this TRF set is not truly "straightforward." Instead, the circuitry is actually a reflex circuit.

My good friend and colleague Chet Gehman confirmed these opinions with the following definition: "A reflex receiver is one which uses an amplifying device to amplify simultaneously two widely separated frequencies or bands of frequency. More specifically, the recovered modulation (audio) is amplified by a stage (or stages) — RF or IF — preceding the demodulator stage. Applying this definition, the circuit of the Pastime radio is indeed a reflex."

Gehman recalls selling, as well as repairing, several Kadette very compact radios back in the late 1930s when he was a radio service man in the Bronx. He remembers one similar Kadette Jr., having essentially the same circuit with the addition of a

regeneration path and adjustment. It was in a metal case and sold for approximately \$9.95.

C. Orval Parker and others elaborated on the reflex circuit, emphasizing that the pentode unit of the 6F7 tube also amplifies the output of the detector and applies it to the 12A7 tube output section. Parker concluded that, in his experience, the Kadette Jr. set was totally unique, not just cheap.

Parker agrees that the Pastime was available in cases of more than one material, style, or color. His story is worth retelling about a young lady who came to his repair shop with a badly damaged Kadette Jr. in an off-white and red marbleized cabinet. This, her bedside radio, had tumbled to the floor several times. She had put the case back together with nail polish. Even more interesting was the fact that she was using the bedsprings as an antenna, and by changing her place on the bed, she could tune in different stations!

John Stanley observed that the schematic for the Kadette Jr. does not indicate any on/off switch and wondered whether this sets the Pastime apart from the Kadette Jr. However, a colleague who owns two

Kadette Jrs. assured me that physically the "'slide" on/off switch and volume control is the same as that of the Pastime.

Several readers commented on the extreme compactness of this set. In back and forth correspondence, Stanley asked if I plan to get the Pastime playing. I replied that I hadn't yet drummed up the courage to take apart this jampacked, intricate chassis. He easily understood why I am reluctant to disturb, in his words, "this rare piece of radio history."

Stanley also asked other questions: "Where are all of those RF coils and transformers placed? The antenna transformer should be nearly as large as one of the tubes! Was powdered iron used? The schematic shows air core coils and chokes."

The answer is that the schematic is correct — all of the coils, though well hidden, are air core, not powdered iron.

Nigel Featherston commented: "Good grief,

power and antenna on the same plug — a "hot" chassis too — definitely not a good set for the kitchen or bathroom!"

And Kenneth Nevins, owner of Nevins Museum of Radio, a small private museum, wrote that he is doing research on the history of radio in Ann Arbor, Michigan. He has considerable interest in the Pastime Kadette Jr. because the manufacturer, International Radio Corporation, was located in Ann Arbor.

After the Pastime article appeared in the May 1995 A.R.C., it attracted considerable attention at the Michigan Antique Radio Club Extravaganza, where it won first place in a contest. It was also of great interest at the Antique Wireless Association (AWA) Conference in Rochester, N. Y., where it commanded third place in the contest category "Radios from 1925 to 1935."

Century Code Practice Set




Figure. 1. Partial schematic diagram of a radio's front-end connected to a long-wire antenna.

I found this code practice set, shown in Figure 1, in the flea market at the Mid-Atlantic Antique Radio Club (MAARC) meet in Timonium, Maryland, in June 1995. As soon as I saw it, I knew that I had to own it, but I wasn't exactly sure whether this was a telegraph or radio-related item.

I did know that the Century Telephone Construction Co. and the Frontier Telephone Co. had united to form Federal Telephone and Telegraph in 1908, so I started my research in some old Federal radio catalogs. Federal Bulletin 117-W, November 1922, pictured an almost identical item. The only difference was that it used 6 screw terminals instead of the 4-pin jack terminal block found in the unit I had purchased.




Figure 2. Partial schematic diagram of a radio's front-end connected to a loop antenna.

Calling it a practice set, No. 575-W, the Federal ad said this set was intended for use in teaching wireless telegraphy, and, in fact, had been used by the U.S. Army Officers training camps. I was elated! My find was related to early wireless. The ad went on to state that the set included a 168-W buzzer and a 860-W key. These numbers, used by Century, are also on my set. The code practice set tag, shown in Figure 2, reads as follows:

C e n t u r y Telephone Construction Co. Buffalo, N. Y. USA

Century ceased to exist in 1908 when it merged with Federal. I had not thought that my practice set was that old. However, the *AWA Review* explains that the Century name continued to be used on Century-related products until at least 1918, and Federal calls its buzzer a "Century Buzzer" in Federal catalogs well into the 1920s.

HOMEBREWING

Loop Antennas Revisited

BY DWANE STEVENS

Dwane Stevens' February 1993 A.R.C. article described various designs for loop antennas. The tables in this sequel go one step further, as they give detailed information for the construction of box loop and spiral loop antennas. This data should be of value to the experienced experimenter, as well as to beginners in loop antenna construction. (Editor)

For many vintage radio enthusiasts loop antennas provide a unique attraction. Their physical attributes — wires neatly strung around a support form creating a diamond, square, or rectangle — seem to provide tangible evidence of a radio set's ability to "capture" those invisible radio waves which provide the music and news we enjoy.

My article "Antennas for Vintage Radios," which appeared in the February 1993 issue of A.R.C. on page 5, included a discussion about loop antennas and their construction. Since that time I have come across some additional information about loops which may be of interest to antenna enthusiasts.

A REVIEW OF LOOP ANTENNAS

First, let's review a few principles about loop antennas. For the scope of our discussion about 1920s broadcast receivers, keep in mind that loops were intended for use only on receiver circuits that were specifically designed for them. At the time there were two basic antenna designs for general broadcast receivers — long-wires and loops —

each consisting of a multitude of variations.

A typical radio front-end circuit, as shown in Figure 1, was designed for a long-wire antenna. It comprises an L-C tank circuit (inductor and variable condenser in parallel), which tunes in the desired frequency. The long-wire antenna captures radio signals of various frequencies and injects them into the tank circuit for the tuning process.

In contrast, Figure 2 shows a typical radio front-end circuit designed for a loop antenna. Here the loop serves double duty. First, it acts as an antenna by capturing radio signals as the long-wire did. Second, it also serves as the coil or inductor in the L-C tank circuit. Therefore, the loop is actually part of the frequency tuning circuit, with the resonant frequency being determined by the inductance of the loop and the capacitance of the variable condenser. Because of this relationship, loops were constructed to match variable condensers of differing capacities which were in use at the time. This relationship is described in Tables I. II and III.

Some radios were constructed to use either a long-wire or a loop antenna. The sets usually had a switch that connected the long-wire and an internal coil (inductor) to the variable condenser, or connected the loop only without the internal coil to the variable condenser. This arrangement was to utilize the advantages of each antenna—the long-wire's advantage of greatly increased signal strength from local as well as distant stations, and the loop's advantages of compactness and portability.

As shown in my article "Antennas for Vintage Radios," loops can, of course, be used on either type of radio, but with greatly varying degrees of success on sets intended for a long-wire antenna. For example, I use my loop on sets designed

for long-wire antennas such as my Freshman Masterpiece and my Atwater Kent 33, but only when I need portability and when I'm satisfied with receiving only local stations. In this case, the loop acts mostly as a very short wire antenna.

LOOP ANTENNA DESIGN

Recall the two basic types of loop antennas the spiral or flat square type (shown in Figure 1 on page 5 of my previous article) and the box or single-layer, square type sometimes called the solenoid type (shown in Figure 3 on page 6 of the same article). The spiral loop is the simplest to construct, but is less desirable since the inner tums rapidly become less useful as the enclosed area diminishes.

Table I shows the number of turns required on box loops of various dimensions when used with tuning condensers with values of 0.00025, 0.0003, 0.00035 and 0.0005 mF. The combined capacitor values and loop dimensions are designed to cover the AM broadcast band. The loops are considered square; that is, with four sides of equal length. However, an oblong rectangular loop can be constructed from this table as long as the area in square inches of such a rectangular loop is the same area in square inches of the given square loop. Also, the longer dimension of the loop should not be more than twice its shorter dimension.

Table I provides construction details for loops with dimensions of 18, 20 and 24 inches per side. The loops are wound with #20 insulated wire over widths of 3, 4, 5, or 6 inches. The windings are

equally spaced over a particular dimension.

Example: Suppose your radio set has a 0.00035 mF variable condenser, and you want to build a box type loop 18 nches square with the space for the winding to be 4 inches wide. Referring to the table under the heading "18-inch per side," you find in the left-hand column the size of the condenser ".00035," and following this to the right on the same line, to the third column under the heading "4-in. wide," you find the number "17." This means that 17 turns of wire are required, equally spaced over a width of 4 inches on an 18-inch.

square loop in order to cover the broadcast band.

Table I is taken from a home study course by the National Radio Institute, Washington, D.C. entitled Complete Course in Practical Radio, Lesson Text No. 15, Receiving Antennas and Their Installation, copyright 1929, 1930, page 25. The lesson text also presents much technical theory concerning how the loop actually works, but I have only presented a compilation of the construction aspects.

Tables II and III are taken from the article "Theory and Design of Loop Antennae" found in the June 1925 issue of Radio News, page 2305. This information is probably not as practical for our purpose as the information in Table I because it deals with spiral loops 4 feet per side, a much larger dimension than is usually desired; however. I have included it for all those experimenters and diehards who always want more information.

Table II can be used for designing loop antennae to cover various ranges of wave-length. (Note: In 1920s publications such as Ragio News, measurements in wavelength were nearly always used. The radio community had not yet made the transition to thinking in terms of frequency.) The table is based on a loop, with an outside dimension of 4 feet per side wound with No. 20 double cotton-covered wire with turns spaced one-half inch apart. [Wavelength can be converted to frequency in kHz by the following formula: Frequency = 300,000 + meters.

The Radio News article states: "Loop antennae, as described above, when used in conjunction with a 7- or 8-tube superheterodyne, have been used successfully to pick up stations with good audibility at distances of 2,000 to 3,000 miles."

As can be seen from the figures in Table II and from the above quoted material, these 4-foot loops could easily provide an interesting challenge to a loop builder.

Table III provides data for large spiral antennae ranging in size from 3 to 8 feet per side.

Remember that the efficiency of a loop is usually about 1 to 10 percent of that of the average long wire antenna. In the 1920s, however, that drawback was many times overlooked because a loop was considered "compact" and "portable" and could be rotated to minimize interference. Besides, if you could afford a 7- or 8-tube "super," you then had enough amplification to make up

The Super Antenna — A New Invention

BY MICHAEL GODAR

In this article, Michael Godar describes his new invention and credits Dwane Stevens' article on loop antennas (Feb. 1993) for the inspiration. A.R.C. is always pleased to be a partner in any project aiming to improve existing technology, particularly if it also helps with old radio projects. (Editor)

A great idea was set in motion. A new, flatstyle antenna was developed. A new company was born. All this was because of an article I read in Antique Radio Classified.

As a technician in the TV, VCR and radio repair business for more than 20 years, I'm only too familiar with a common customer complaint about rabbit ear indoor TV antennas: "Our technologies have advanced to such a level that we can send a man to the moon, but why haven't we done something about ugly rabbit ears?"

How true! While television has evolved from one generation to another, the basic design for indoor TV antennas has remained largely the same, with the two protruding metal rods nearly analogous to outdoor TV antennas. Rabbit ears no longer fit into the ever popular entertainment centers, nor do they satisfy the sophisticated taste of today's interior design-conscious consumers.

It never occurred to me to get involved in the antenna business until one day in the winter of 1993 I read an article about loop antennas by Mr. Dwane Stevens in the February 1993 issue of A.R.C. "Maybe I can eliminate the rabbit ears by modifying the old style loop antenna for modem TVs and radio receivers," I thought.

My original concept was an oblong coil antenna centered around a flat-lying 2 x 4 board. I tried different sizes, but all failed in certain frequencies; I also experimented with different loops, but encountered problems in television reception. By then, I had come to realize that even if a loop antenna did work, large-scale manufacturing would be difficult and expensive.

I decided to change design direction, turning my eyes to the multiple dipole array. But, a standard TV dipole antenna measures several feet in length, and to miniaturize and compact the design was no easy task. I concentrated on experimenting with different configurations and metals.

Finally in late June of that year, a working model showed promise. The model was tested in the greater Phoenix area. Later tests were conducted in Los Angeles, San Diego, Las Vegas, Milwaukee and Brooklyn, New York. By August, the design was finalized.

Thus, an entirely different looking indoor antenna was bom — one without rabbit ears. Named "Super Antenna," this multiple dipole antenna is housed in a flat, high-impact plastic case, 1 inch in height, which can be placed conveniently atop a TV/VCR set or on the shelf of an entertainment center. Compatible with all TVs, VCRs, AM/FM stereo shortwave and VHF police scanner receivers, an antenna works well with color television VHF and UHF bands. It also works well with 1920s battery radios and all old style radios needing a long wire antenna.

My ideas for an antenna with no rabbit ears originate from my more than 20 years of direct contact with customers. But I owe my inspiration for Super Antenna to A.R.C. and Mr. Dwane Stevens' article about loop antennas.

AUCTION REPORT

HVRA Mega Auction Houston, Texas — January 26-27, 1996

THe Houston Vintage Radio Association (HVRA) held its Mega Auction January 26-27, 1996, at the Tides II Hotel Lai Lai Restaurant in Houston, Texas. This 2-day event drew over 85 collectors — more than expected, since many attendees brought their families along. In all, 514 lots crossed the auction block for a total of \$12,057, setting a new record for HVRA's winter sale. Collectors came from all over Texas, as well as from California, Florida, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Ohio, Tennessee, and Virginia.

The Friday evening auction lasted 3½ hours with sales totaling \$3,653. Auctioneer Bill Werzner encouraged the 55 auction bidders to have a virtual field day bldding on several thousand tubes and many N.O.S. parts from at least two estates.

Saturday's auction, running from noon to 5 P.M., drew 64 bidders. A total of 277 lots auctioned included console radios, table sets, and nice test equipment, as well as leftovers from the Friday night auction. Gross sales totaled \$8,404.

Among the highlights were a set of Rider's Volumes 1-18 selling for \$390, a Stromberg-Carlson tombstone with loop antenna and power supply for \$180, and a marbleized wine colored Sentinel Catalin with ivory trim for \$475. Unfortunately, detailed information was not recorded at this auction, and the following is only a representative list.

The club is looking forward to its May 3-5 convention with a bigger, better auction.

A listing such as this cannot adequately include the condition of cabinets, chassis, transformers, tubes, the operating status of the set, and the inclusion of incorrect, restored or replica components, etc. Auction prices are the result of the excitement of the auction process, the skill of the auctioneer and the specific interests of the participants. Nevertheless, auction prices serve as useful references and as another element in the value determining process. The possibility of error always exists, and if we are notified, corrections will be reported.

Gilbert Radio Apparatus 1919 Catalog Reproduced By Antique Radio Press

Most collectors interested in pre-1925 radio equipment may know that the A.C. Gilbert Co. was a manufacturer, not only of trains and erector sets. but also of wireless radio equipment from 1919 to

1923. They also know that finding any information or reference material on A.C. Gilbert Co. radio equipment is an extremely difficult task. Thus, Jim Fred's Antique Radio Press reproduction of a rare Gilbert Radio Apparatus 1919 catalog is good news.

Subtitled "Gilbert Wireless Instructions" by Clarence D. Tuska, this is more than just a catalog. It includes two introductory chapters presenting an elementary course on wireless theory and apparatus. These chapters provide a basic explanation of standard radio components, radio wave principles, radio wave transmission, and radio wave receivers, diagrammed and presented in lavmen's terms.

The next chapter then shows how to assemble, install, and operate A.C. Gilbert wireless apparatus. There are five parts to this chapter, covering a house-to-house wireless set, a receiving set (crystal), an Audion detector, a sending set, and a "build your own"

radio parts set. The final chapter covers radio operating, Morse code, U.S. radio stations and regulations.

While the catalog has a nice offering of good early wireless information, it may be difficult to use as a reference since the quality of the reproduction is rather poor, providing little detail of the equipment pictured. The illustrations, which are line drawings, reproduced much better.

Doubtless many of you have read previous books by Eric Wroebbel on Toshiba, Sony and Regency radios. These books are about the so-called "first wave" radios and were a welcome addition to the information avail-

able at the time.

In this new book, Collectible Transistor Radios From Realtone and SounDesign - A Photo Guide, Wrobbel explores the early and prolific products of the "second wave," which covers 1959 through the 1960s and beyond to the 1970s under the new brand name "SounDesign."

The models are presented in nearly chrono-



logical order, starting with the TR-701, believed to be the company's first effort. Many of the models are stunning in design and, therefore, favorites of collectors. The Realtone TR-870 Satellite is given special prominence because of its styling, its 2-band operation, and the "greenhouse" effect of the dial housing.

A red Realtone TR-870 was my favorite set, but I relinquished it to an avid collector for her Christmas present.

The notations on the sizes of the sets are good: "SP" for shirt pocket and "CP" for coat pocket. However,

there should be a notation for the larger sets -

perhaps "HC" for hand carried??

The cover is self-explanatory and neat. Most of the pages are well laid out, although the photocopies of some sets are blurred. Nevertheless, with 60 photos on 16 pages, this book, along with the author's other three books, should be on every avid collector's shelf. The addition of handdrawn scenes and doodles breaks up the stiff format nicely.

The SounDesign section is comprised of only 5 sets, some handsome and some dogs. Still, we must remember that these sets were produced well into the '60s and '70s when all sets were losing definition anyway.

This is true with one exception—Crosley Station WLW operated atone time at 500 Kilowatts until the complaints about blanketing over wide areas forced the FCC to reduce the power to the usual 50 kilowatts.

Shellac and Lacquer Refinishing

Dear Editor:

I'd suggest to anyone interested in refinishing antique radio cabinets that they get into the easiest and best refinishing media there are, especially for amateurs—shellac and brushing lacquer. I'd also suggest that 000-and 0000-grade steel wool will do everything in the refinishing process that various grit sandpapers allegedly do, and at less cost and easier availability. A very good book on the proper use of shellac and lacquer is Fumiture Finishing & Refinishing, published by Sunset Books.

Two excellent books — Johnson's The Weekend Refinisher, avaliable from A.R.C., and Grotz's From Gunk to Glow or The Gentle Art of Refinishing Antiques and Other Furniture — reject the use of spar varnish for interior furniture, as suggested by James Newton in "Three Refinishing Secrets" (A.R.C., September 1995). Use of spar varnish can be so complicated and potentially ruinous that it quickly discourages a beginner to the point of giving up on what can be an almost simple, as well as highly enjoyable, pastime.
