EDITOR'S COMMENTS

One thing is indisputable — we're in sight of the turn of the century. But, antique radio collectors are reluctant to let the 20th century, so steeped in radio history, slip away. That's why our lead story by Ray Thompson and Dave Gonshor and our cover struck me as symbolic of multiple aspects of that history.

To begin with, Atwater Kent was at one time the largest radio manufacturing company in the country. One of its products and the focus of our lead article was the Radiodyne, which, at first glance, might not seem particularly noteworthy. But, on closer examination, the set suggests a story that is multifold.

First, it takes us back to the times when a radio's innards were completely exposed, unlike the covered chassis and slick exteriors of today. Even the vacuum tube sits in full view on the Radiodyne breadboard.

Second, the Radiodyne is a transition set in that it represents Atwater Kent's attempt to meet the new demands of the marketplace. This was a time when the government had opened up more radio frequencies so that the number of stations available to listeners greatly increased. In turn, manufacturers like Atwater Kent were challenged to meet the need to provide more se ective tuning, and the TRF became a popular solution.

The Radiodyne dial on our cover represents Atwater Kent's entry into that competitive field. In short, the Radiodyne story could be said to be representative of the technological and broadcasting history of radio in the mid-1920s.

Zenith, another great company in radio history, caught Richard Arnold's attention with a plastic table model that is a bit out of his usual line of cathedrals and tombstones. But, like most of us, Richard couldn't pass up a bargain. The style and functionality of the Model 6D015 intriqued him, and best of all — it worked!

Rich Urmano's brush with radio history in the form of a very old crystal set has much of the same flavor of intrigue with the unusual. The story has a different twist in that his crystal set in an old butter box proved beyond repair. But, a book, an unexpected gift, gave him the information and the inspiration he needed to recreate the set — a project that increased his admiration for the creators of these early sets.

How to enjoy these products of bygone days beyond their restoration and preservation is the subject of Herb Parsons' article on old radio shows. Herb, an A.R.C. advertiser, reminds us that radios were mean: to be listened to, and there's no better way than to tune in to the great shows of yesteryear.

The subject of Dave Crocker's short piece is the old photo of Powel Crosley at work. The fact is that we at A.R.C. are inspired by old photos and often use them as a starting point for a larger article. Keep us in mind when you find treasures like those in recent issues — photos of Cortlandt St., the Leese Co. Atwater Kent window display. Traeger, the Pedal Radio Man, etc.

Perhaps the real attention-grabber in *Photo Review* this month is the unusual Confucius horn speaker with the sound coming from the bottom. But perhaps the

plastic toy gun with a built-in crystal set is a close rival. Relating shocting a pistol to listening to radio seems a stretch, but Wonarch must have found a ready market.

Included in this issue are two auctions, contributed by our most faithful reporters — Ray Chase and Larry Babcock. Though you may have assumed that Ray's report last month on the first Krantz auction contained all the significant items, check again. Tube lots attracted a lot of interest, both from those looking for usable tubes and from collectors looking for the unusual. Treasures were also found among the books, magazines, and ephemera. Since many items were sold in large lots, keep your eyes open at flea markets for Krantz items to show up. Frank will be with us for a long time.

In reporting on the Estes Auction. Larry Babcock points out that Richard knows radios and presents good items well. Larry's reports themselves are special because they give a real feeling for the event. By sheer coincidence, the highlight of this auction was an Atwater Kent Model 10 breadboard. Although not the rare Radiodyne, it still sold for \$1,600.

Another coincidence is that our two book reviews treat important periods in radio histo y. Paul Bourbin reports favorably on Susan Douglas' Inventing American Broadcasting 1899-1922, which covers the pre-broadcasting years. Jerry Berg's On the Short Waves 1923-1945 covers early shortwave broadcasting, which took listening from a local to a worldwide perspective. Reviewer Bart Lee is so enthusiastic about this book that he will speak on it at the AWA Conference this fall.

Before we received the Bourbin review, Bob Breese had brought Susan Douglas' book to our attention. His comments reveal his enthusiasm for the book and its exploration of the "wireless fever" of the times.

The Internet. We are closer to our goal of implementing additions to our Web site. Our supplier continues to work cut the "bugs," but we don't want to release the material until the site is fully functional. Our latest hope is that we may have the work complete during Labor Day week right after AWA.

Coming Radio Events. Fall is big radio event time — 46 club events in September alone. Of course, the first is the big AWA Conference in Rochester, New York, September 1-4. HVRA's Mega Auction in Houston, Texas, follows closely on AWA's heels September 10-11. Note also the Stanton Auction in Michigan and the SARS fall swap meet in Georgia. Try to get to at least one event in your area, if not to the major ones.

ON THE COVER

The Atwater Kent breadboard tuning condenser shown on our cover may seem common enough, except for a few details that distinguish it as a Radiodyne. Not only are the three exposed brass binding posts at the bottom of the dial significant, but also the dial itself, which is numbered in reverse. The rafity of this set may not be clear until you read this month's lead article.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Atwater Kent Radiodyne




Figure 1. The Atwater Kent Radiodyne receiver, Part No. 4340.

The Atwater Kent feature story in the May 1999 issue of A.R.C. has sparked more Atwater Kent interest. We're glad to have the Radiodyne brought to our attention, as it marked an interesting milestone in Atwater Kent history. (Editor)

The Radiodyne shown in Figures 1 and 2, also known as "Part No. 4340," was the first Atwater Kent radio to use a tuned radio frequency (TRF)— a design consisting of three individually tuned stages. It was called the "Wonder Set" by distributors because its three tuned stages made the set very selective compared to earlier designs.

This greater selectivity was a much needed improvement In radio receivers. Prior to September 1923, all radio stations time-shared one of two assigned frequencies. Thus, broad tuning was acceptable in receivers of that period. With the assignment of additional frequencies, im-

proved selectivity was needed to prevent interference from radio stations operating on adjacent frequencies. Consequently, selectivity had become an important feature of radio performance.




Figure 3. The wiring underneath the Atwater Kent Radiodyne breadboard receiver. Note that the wires do not cross over each other.

In addition, the Radiodyne was known for its remarkable wiring arrangement. There are no crossed wires under the board. Figure 3 shows the underboard wiring used on the Radiodyne sets.

Soon after A. Atwater Kent had marketed the Radiodyne, he discovered that another company, Western Coil Co. of Racine Wisconsin, had already laid claim to the Radiodyne name. He was forced to change the name quickly to the Model 10, and only a small number of Radiodynes were actually made. Consequently, it is the most desirable of the Model 10s to collect, and the selling price reflects this rarity. Unfortunately, many sets claimed to be Radiodynes have either been modified in some way, or they were not Radiodynes in the first place.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES

The Radiodyne has many distinguishing features. The primary one is that the metal tags on the Type AD RF coil are labelled "Radiodyne" (not Model 10). One of these brass tags on a Radiodyne RF coil can be seen in Figure 4.

In addition, two paper tags are glued, not tacked, to the bottom of the board. A warranty tag has the board serial number stamped on it; the other tag has instructions about using the new ¼-ampere filament tubes. Figure 5 shows both paper tags under the Radiodyne board. There also may be a larger tag glued, not tacked, to the center of the board identifying the Radiodyne as a No. 4340 set.




Figure 7. A view showing the multiple use of binding posts on the components on the left side of the Radiodyne receiver.

In a Radiodyne, the 3-tube TA unit and the tuning condenser cans are painted green. Binding posts are used throughout — on the tuning condensers, TA unit, RF coils, potentiometer and 1-tube "islands" — as Atwater Kent had been selling these separately for experimenters to build its own sets prior to the introduction of the Radiodyne. Binding posts are also used to connect to the batteries and the antenna. Figures 6 and 7 show the multiple use of brass binding posts on the Radiodyne board components.

The green, 3-tube TA unit has a unique keying pattern for the tubes. Two of the key slots point to the rear of the board, the other slot points to the right. Later breadboard models have one slot pointing left, one right, and one to the rear. This

was done to simplify filament wiring. Finally, on very early Radiodynes, aluminum plate switches, left over from the last of the Models 4052 and 4066, were used instead of the familiar Bakelite switches. So, the Radiodyne can have either an aluminum or Bakelite switch.

Any deviation from these features indicates that either the set is not a Radiodyne, or that parts have been changed. With the exception of the switch, there was no evolution of the parts making up the Radiodyne because of the short production time before the set was changed.

MODIFICATIONS

Any part of an original Radiodyne may have been changed for a variety of reasons. Parts may have broken or been scavenged and been replaced with nonoriginal Radiodyne parts. A common modification to an original board is replacement of the TA unit because of an open winding on one or both of the potted audio transformers. An open winding on an audio transformer was a common failure in the radios of the 1920s. A black or brown, wrinkle-finish TA unit indicates a replacement unit.

The Radiodyne originally came with condenser cans vulnerable to a hand capacitance effect. where the tuning would change as the hand was removed from the dial. To eliminate the hand capacitance effect, all one had to do was to add a jumper wire between the ground terminal and the rotor terminal.

Retail outlets for radios at the time were piano and music stores, department stores, auto dealers and other outfits not versed in radio engineering. It is likely the simple fix to the hand capacitance effect was not understood. Or, perhaps new condenser units were installed simply to

charge more money for the repair.

There is no evidence that Atwater Kent authorized any such modification, as Radiodynes were manufactured for only a short time, followed by the identical Model 10 (so identified by the tags on the RF coils) and then quickly by the Model 10 without binding posts on the components. In any event, tuning condensers without binding posts indicate that they have been changed for whatever reason.

Another clue is that the binding post type condensers had to have three holes drilled in the board on the front face of the condenser units. The condensers without binding posts would have two holes in the board towards the rear of the cans, so the existence of holes (plugged or open) on the board in front of the cans is an Indication

that it is a Radiodyne board. Figure 8 shows a front view of a Radiodyne tuning condenser with three binding posts having their wires leading into the board holes.

Certainly these modifications lessen the value of a particular Radiodyne set, but they may not indicate that the set was not originally a Radiodyne. Whatever early Model 10 version you have, it is desirable because of the use of binding post

parts and because the history of the Radiodyne is Intriguing, as foretold by its early title -"Wonder Set."

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Zenith Model 6D015

Once again Richard Amold tells us about a set he found too interesting to pass up — not an uncommon experience among collectors. (Editor)

The Zenith Model 6D015, an unusual but neat looking radio, was part of the Zenith 1946 model line. Because of its appearance, it is a desirable set for any collection.

This Zenith is made of brown plastic and has a quarter-moon dial and a half-moon louver design over the speaker area. One of the more interesting features of this radio is the handle, which, no doubt, is to facilitate moving

the set around; however, this radio is not a portable
— it is an AC/DC set.




Figure 1. The 1946 Zenith Model 6D015 with the handle down.




Figure 2. The Zenith Model 6D015 with the handle in the upright position.

The handle is a black plastic appendage that fits down into the top of the cabinet and becomes almost flush with it, as shown in Figure 1. However, it easily lifts to the upright position, as shown in Figure 2. The handle is a little fragile, especially at its pivot points, so sets with intact handles are harder to find.

This handle is attached and becomes a part of the gold-tone decorative strip that starts at the middle of the top and runs down to a somewhat tapered end at the bottom center front of the radio. At the end of this strip there are two concentric knobs. One controls the on/off switch, and volume; the other is for station tuning.

At the top front of the radio is the word "Zenith," and directly below that is a one millimeter hole that glows red when the radio is on. This is a rather striking feature at night or in a darkened room.

The dial scale station pointer looks like a toothpick and is angled to allow for the curvature of the scale. The grille cloth is a heavy gauge fabric similar to burlap.

The 6 tubes used in this set are the following: 12SJ7 RF, 12SA7 converter, 12BA6 IF, 12SQ7 detector and amplifier, 35L6 power and 35Z5 rectifier.

I ran across this radio in an antique store in southern Oklahoma about a year ago. Its unusual appearance caught my eye, and further examination revealed that it was pretty clean with no cracks. The fact that it is a Zenith didn't hurt either. About sold, I looked at the price tag— "\$36 firm and it works," it said. I bought it.

After taking it home, cleaning it up a bit, and playing it, I found that it sounds great (it has Consoltone). Although I don't usually keep plastic sets, I decided to put this Zenith 6D015 into my collection. There it sits in all its glory midst the 1930s wooden cathedral and tombstone types.

RESTORATION TOPICS

The Butter Box Crystal Set Saga

The following adventure with an old crystal set is another example of how a seeming "basketcase" can develop into an absorbing project. Rich's acquisition of the Bishop book was the lucky chance that we all wish for when we have a radio challenge on our hands. (Editor)

I was first bitten by the radio bug when I was a boy on Long Island back in the 1950s and 1960s. In those days, there were always plenty of old radios being tossed out — after all, they were consumer products meant to be consumed. If we were on our way to school and saw an old radio being trashed, my

brother Steve and I would stash it under some bushes along the avenue and then retrieve it on the way home. On weekends we often would take the train into New York City for a day of hot dogs and radio browsing on Canal St. a few subway stops from "Radio Row." The sidewalks were six feet deep with radio parts at salvage prices on both sides of the street.

We did a lot of experimenting in our little radio shack behind the garage back then. I built quite a few crystal sets from scratch with just a handful of parts. Those days in Floral Park are long past, but once bitten by the radio bug, you find it stays with you. I've been collecting and restoring radios for years now, and I'm still fascinated by those crystal sets.

A few months ago, I had the opportunity to purchase a very old crystal set that was made from an old butter box probably back in the 1920s. It had been lying in a shed for years and was suffering severely from weather damage. I negotiated a price and took it home, if for nothing more than to reuse the vintage hardware. Somewhere in the back of my mind I was planning to build a crystal set.

THE STATE OF THE SET




Figure 2. The interior of the butter box crystal set repro showing the wiring of the tapped coil to the two tap switches.

I took the set apart when I got home, and after close inspection, decided that it was too far gone to restore. Still, it had a very unusual circuit and I studied it. The resulting butter box crystal set insplred by this old set can be seen in Figures 1 and 2.

The double cotton-covered wire (DCC) of the coil was laden with fungus. The box had a unique plunger on the side that was attached to a sec-

ondary coil that slid inside the primary coil. Molsture damage had taken its toll and had swollen the cardboard core on the primary coil so that the secondary coil was stuck inside of it. The only way to uncover the mystery of what the secondary coil looked like was to pull the primary apart.

The set had 2 contact tap switches with 9 taps on each switch attached to many taps of the primary coil. One contact switch was connected to 100 turns of #24 DCC wire with a tap every 10 turns. The other contact switch was connected to ten more tums of the same coil with a tap on every turn. The coil was 4 Inches in diameter and 5 inches long. Satisfied with that, I pulled the coil apart to reveal the secondary. It had been wound and coated with varnish or shellac and wasn't in such bad shape. It appeared to be 200 turns of #28 DCC wire mounted on a core that was meant to slide snugly inside the primary.

This coil was also 5 Inches long, and I noted that both coils were wound in the same direction. I measured the coil on my ohmmeter, and it was open. This was probably the reason for the set's retirement to the shed. There was a wooden plug in the top with holes drilled in it for the wires to come out, and the brass plunger rod was screwed to the center of one of the ends. I thought the whole thing was very interesting but mysterious. I put the set aside and filled the experience in my mind.

A SECOND LOOK AT THE SET

Summer passed, and the warped and twisted butter box sat on a lower shelf in the cluttered shop and was pretty much forgotten. I was still thinking of building a crystal set but had some

other projects going, and I was still looking for a good schematic.

Later that year I received an unexpected gift from my sister Joanna — a 1911 book called *The Wireless Operators' Pocketbook of Information and Diagrams*, by Leon W. Bishop. What a treasure it is! The wheels of my mind were turning as I looked at all of the old circuits. This was the information I had been looking for!

The crystal set circuits I had seen up until then hadn't covered those forgotten days of vintage wireless circuits. When I saw a circuit of a loose coupler set in the book, it hit me — that old butter box and its circuit all came together for me. The package was different, but the principle was the same.

The book told about the advantages of a loose coupler in a wireless crystal set and of DCC wire over enameled wire. Enameled wire creates a coid with the windings too close to each other, causing high capacitance in the coil. That lowers the coils efficiency (Q factor) and makes for much more broad tuning of the set. If enameled wire were to be used, a thread would either have to be cut into the coil surface to keep the windings separate, or a spacer placed between the windings when the coil is wound. This was news to me!

THE RESTORATION

I began to realize what the butter box was all about. I now had a mission and a plan, to resurrect the vintage butter box. I returned to my shop, pulled the old butter box off the shelf and eyed it with a critical eye - yuck! I had forgotten how sorry it looked and decided that I needed a new box. I went to the garage and found a nice long plank of wood 5½" wide x ½" thick, left by the previous owner. I measured the old box — 5½" deep x 7½" high x 11" long and ½" thick. Son of a gun, I knew they had left that wood there for a reason and this was it!

A few hours and hand tools later, I had myself a new box. The inside lid of the old butter box had the label "Brookfield Creamery Butter" on it. The old timer who had built the set turned the lid upside down to hide the writing. I decided that I wanted the label to be visible on the top of my box. I scanned

the lid on my flatbed scanner and printed it out on paper. I then centered and taped the paper to the top of my box and carefully branded the letters into the top of the box using a hot soldering iron.

To get the "right" finish on my new box I got creative. I rubbed some nice orange and amber colored "Indian Head" gasket shellac thinned with alcohol into the wood, leaving it with a good base. Then I rubbed some walnut Tung Oil into the wood to give it some depth. The set was really beginning to look good! I then decided to put hinges and a latch on the box to facilitate service and inspection.

Covering the face of the box with a sheet of paper, I carefully traced the positions of the bind-

ing posts, the contact switches and the taps, and then drilled out all the holes. After some rooting around, I found some cardboard coil forms of the correct diameter. I soaked them in polyurethane, and after they dried, they were ready to be used.

What detector I would use on the set was an issue, as the original one was missing. An ad on the Net yielded a reply from a gentleman, and I soon struck a deal with him for some vintage crystal parts. One week later the package arrived and a generous package it was! In the midst of the sliders, rods and binding posts was a beautiful fixed detector. It was a vintage Marvel A1 "Little Devil" detector and inscribed on it was "Hot as Hades." I had just found the final piece to the butter box crystal set!

OPERATING THE SET

The set was finally complete. I anxiously connected my old pair of 2000-ohm Brandes Superior headphones that I cherish and placed them on my head. I was approaching the moment of truth — to unlock the mystery of the old butter box. I connected the ground wire first and heard a crackle in the phones. I then hooked up the antenna and a voice rang out in my headphones "77 - WABC" with excellent volume.

When first tuning the set, I used the 10-turn rotary switch and then fine tuned it with the 1-turn rotary switch. As for the plunger on the side for the secondary coil, pulling it out (loose coupling) causes the set to tune much more sharply, and this makes for good selectivity on separating the weaker stations. It was interesting to note that even when the secondary coil was almost entirely pulled out from the primary, the volume was still quite good and actually improved the signal on some of the weaker stations. Pushing the plunger in (close coupling) makes for broader tuning and is good for local station listening.

After testing out the set for a while, I determined that the set could use a condenser in series with the antenna. The set tuned predominately towards the lower portion of the AM band, almost into long wave, and there are few stations

down there below 700 Kc these days. A condenser in the antenna circuit would allow the set to tune higher on the AM band and would allow me to adjust the overall frequency range.

I tested with a condenser to determine just what capacitance range I needed. I then studied what early "book type" tuning condensers looked like and decided to sneak a homemade brass book condenser into the back of the box with 2 brass leaves. It took me the better part of the day to figure out how to make a nice one in the correct capacitance range. From 2" x 5" brass hobby stock, I fashioned a nice condenser that's nothing more then a large trimmer pot — 25-150 pF. A nice early vintage knob is located on the back side of the set in order to keep symmetry on the front.

I then retested my crystal set and was able to pick up a "clear channel" from Washington D.C.

— WTOP 1500, which is a six-hour drive from here. My crystal set was finally flying high and

"Hot as Hades" it is!

In retrospect, although the set isn't an original vintage set, it is a tribute to a time when life was a

little simpler. It is also a tribute to the original builder — the old timer who remains unknown and whose unique qualities still stand tall after all these years.

Today's TV sit-coms can't hold a candle to the likes of *Fibber McGee & Molly, The Great Gildersleeve, Our Miss Brooks* or *The Life of Riley*. Westerns are all but extinct today, but shows like *The Lone Ranger, Hopalong Cassidy, The Cisco Kid* and *GunSmoke* can still be enjoyed on tape. If adventure appeals to you, then

shows like Challenge Of The Yukon, The Mysterious Traveler, Escape or The Lives of Harry Lime can be heard.

Oldtime radio shows can be divided into various categories. Among them are comedies, crime fighters, dramas, historical events, horror-fantasy, music shows, mysteries, sclence fiction, soap operas, westems, private investigators, wartime shows, and adventure. The variety is almost limitless.

So, the next time you turn on one of your treasured old radios, just remember that the old shows that once played through these old sets can be heard and enjoyed once again and are available from various mail order suppliers. These shows can help to take you back to the days when radio was king. It was truly "The Golden Age of Radio."

Powel Crosley at Work

The interesting photo below shows Powel Crosley, sometime in 1926, testing one of his latest radios in a lab room of his factory. The photo was sent to me by Powel's grandson, Lewis Crosley, who resides in Sarasota, Florida, fairly close to the Crosley mansion, which is now undergoing a massive restoration process.

In studying the photo, I came to the conclusion that this was probably some kind of promotional piece for two reasons: 1) There is such a variety of equipment shown, and 2) Powel's face definitely has been touched up.

The radio on the radiator to his right is a 3-tube Crosley Super Trirdyn Regular, which appeared in the fall of 1925. The set under his right elbow is a Model RFL-60, which was a 5-tube set offered in early 1926. Powel's left hand is operating the "Crescendon" knob of a brand new 1926 Crosley Model 4-29, a 4-tube receiver.

Above the large power supply (manufacturer unknown) in front of Powel are two Crosley cone speakers — a Musicone and a Super Musicone, which is turned around. The metal box to the left of the Model 4-29 looks like a prototype of the Crosley AB and C power unit, which was announced in April 1927.

The spectacular Crosley mansion and grounds on the Gulf Coast at the Bradenton/Sarasota line will be open to visitors sometime in the year 2000. Exhibits





INGELEN MODEL TRV-111 - This 1959 portable, made in Austria, was a very popular radio. It operates on battery power and tunes only the AM band. The case is green leatherette. (Erwin Macho - Vienna, Austria)



CROSLEY MODEL 628-B - This 1937 Bakellte radio has a broadcast and shortwave band which tunes up to 7.0 MHz. It has a 6-tube, AC powered chassis utilizing a 2W3 half-wave rectifier. It is a fine example of the Decostyling of the late 1930s. (William Dalton, Jr. - Bridgeport, CT)

AUCTION REPORT

Krantz Auction — Part 2 Somerdale, New Jersey — April 24-25, 1999

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

As indicated in the August A.R.C., the first Krantz auction was so extensive that it was necessary to present Ray Chase's report in two stages. Below is the promised Part 2 — tubes, paper, and ephemera. A report on the second 2-day auction, held June 26-27, will follow in a future issue. (Editor)

"A once-in-a-lifetime experience" was how Ray Chase described the Krantz auction, held on April 24 and 25, 1999, in Somerdale, New Jersey. Childers & Smith Auction Co. had its work cut out for it taking on the disposition of the late Frank Krantz's 70 years of collecting. The logistics of sorting, cataloguing, moving the equipment that filled every nook and cranny of a small house into a large tent, and making it accessible to viewers and bidders are almost beyond comprehension.

What is even more amazing is that Ray Chase was able to follow the crowded "walk-around" bidding procedure in the cold, rainy weather and to compile the information in a comprehensive form for A.R.C. readers. We're looking for an

appropriate medal to pin on him.

Collectors picked up some very good buys in the tube, book, and ephemera categories. Among the highlights were a DeForest spherical Audion selling at \$450; three flats of 6L6s at \$350; six WD11s in boxes at \$360; a DeForest catalog and other early items at \$260; an authorized agent RCA electron tube sign, mint in box, at \$375; about eight 1950s hi-fi magazines in a binder at \$290; two large, 1934 Majestic ad posters at \$250; eight *Voice of Victor* magazines from the teens, at \$200; 50-70 service items, including three *RCA Red Books*, at \$320; and many lots of *Radio News* and *Radio Craft* selling from \$12 to \$225.

A warning: Auction prices are not current values. Our selection of auction items is not necessarily complete. A listing such as this cannot adequately include the condition of cabinets, chassis, transformers, tubes, the operating status of the set, and the inclusion of incorrect, restored or replica components, etc. Auction prices are the result of the excitement of the auction process, the skill of the auctioneer and the specific interests of the participants. 

Estes Vintage Radio Auction Seville, Ohio — May 22, 1999

Estes Auctions are held in an old bam in Seville, about 30 miles south of Cleveland, Ohio. I have attended these auctions several times over the past few years and found them to be equal to many of the auctions at radio meets, and better than some. This one was no exception, with a wide variety of old radio artifacts sold.

The auction facility is relatively primitive, but comfortable, and Richard Estes is an excellent auctioneer who really knows old radios. Collectors may recall that he was the auctioneer at the memorable Henry Ford Museum auction, and he officiates at Extravaganza in Michigan every year. At this auction, 368 lots passed the block in 5½ hours. Total sales were \$22,870. Registered bidders numbered 121.

It used to be that cathedrals outpriced tombstones by a wide margin, but this seems no longer true. Tombstones sold from \$55 to \$305, averaging a bit over \$90. Cathedrals averaged about \$137, with the top price being \$375 for a Philco 90 — a decline from about \$700, a price I have seen in the past for this top-of-the-line set. On the other hand, a Majestic tombstone went for \$75, despite its very poor condition.

Console prices were low, ranging from \$5 to \$25. Since collectors don't have room for these high performance sets, only the outstanding ones bring high prices. For example, a beautiful 1929 Radiola Electrola radio/phono with legs brought \$500. A Majestic 17 sold at \$100 and a Victor R32 at \$85. I myself have always wanted a Du-Mont TV and could have purchased one for \$5, but — where to put it when I got home?

Tops among the hom speakers was a tortoise shell Burns horn selling at \$180, though a large segment of the bell had been poorly reattached. An unusual Atwater Kent horn with deep base sold at \$150. Cone mantel speakers sold in the

\$20-\$30 range, but a nice wooden cathedral, similar to the Peerless design, brought \$50.

Of the dozen or so 3-knob TRF sets sold, a Grebe Synchrophase with the battery-box base brought the top price of \$425. An A.C. Dayton in a white cabinet (possibly painted) went for \$150, while other sets went for \$50 to \$125.

The star of the show was an Atwater Kent Model 10 breadboard, complete with tags and good tubes, selling at \$1,600 — the highest price I have seen for a Model 10. An Atwater Kent 20C brought \$85, while other Atwater Kent sets sold in the \$25-\$85 range.

Many AC small plastic radios sold for \$5-\$30. An earlier white and gold Crosley went higher at \$85, and a white Coronado brought \$105. Early nice TVs excited little interest and many brought no bid at all or sold under \$10. A tiny Sony Watchman brought \$22, while a collectible RCA 8-TS30 sold at \$35, though it may have had no top.

At about 2:30 P.M., the auction had been running 4½ hours and was getting down to the lesser items. There were only about 25 bidders left, and the auction finally ended at 3:30 P.M.

There were only a few "no bids" here. That was mainly because the auctioneer was willing to start the bidding at a very low price — even \$2. Most items unsold were big items such as consoles or TVs. The auction could have been sped up a bit if cheap lots had been combined and no bids had started below \$10 or \$20, as Estes does at the Michigan meet.

This auction report is from my personal notes. The conditions described are a combination of what the auctioneer said and what I saw from my front row seat. There are a few omissions and perhaps a mistake or two. I did leave an hour before the end, but only inexpensive items were left then

Rich Estes plans to conduct four auctions during the 1999-2000 season. The first will be in late October, after the AWA meet in Rochester. It will contain many early items and even some Marconi equipment. That's one I'm not going to miss! Other auctions will follow in January, February, and April of 2000. Watch for the ads here in A.R.C.

The Comfort Inn, located in Seville, is the closest motel to the auction barn. The telephone number is (330) 769-4949. I prefer the Cross Country Inn in Medina, Ohio, about 14 miles away, but near many restaurants and a nice antique store. This is a AAA, 2-diamond motel, and with a senior discount, my room cost was only \$30.94!

On the Short Waves 1923–1945 By Jerome S. Berg

Radio on short wavelengths opened up the world. Commercial interests exploited the discoveries by the amateurs in the early 1920s that wavelengths under 200 meters could girdle the globe. The broadcasting craze of the 1920s featured a desire to hear distant stations— DX. The shortwaves on which stations began to broadcast

in the late 1920s and early 1930s made worldwide DX a nightly event. Like local broadcasting before it, the shortwave broadcasting of the 1930s generated an enormous enthusiasm.

Jerry Berg has now chronicled the history of that phenomenon. We owe him a debt of gratitude. He has written a very good book indeed — On the Short Waves, 1923-1945. Everyone who has ever tuned a dial above 1600 Kc ought to buy it. You'll like it.

On the Short Waves tells the story, not only of broadcasting, but of shortwave listening as well. Jerry quotes Hugo Gernsback in 1926, "I cannot imagine any greater thrill than that which comes when I listen. as I often do, to a

station thousands of miles away. It is the greatest triumph yet achieved by mind over matter."

Jerry tells who the broadcasters were, and in the increasingly tense 1930s, what they were trying to do. He provides great detail on the listeners as well, not only the hobbyists and casual listeners, but also the World War II volunteers who monitored tirelessly for news of prisoners of war in order to notify their families.

The book distills station histories, equipment, publications, ephemera (e.g., QSL cards and EKKO stamps), personalities, clubs, and events of the world into 272 pages of well written and superbly illustrated text with scholarly notes and a thorough index. Outstanding as it is as a source of historical material, the book is even better for

enjoyable reading by anyone with an interest in radio, its powers and its development. Not until the coming of the worldwide Web on the Internet has a technology had so much impact on the world of nations.

Shortwave radio, as Jerry tells the story, made us all internationalists because it brought the

voices of the world unedited, unmediated, and unspun — directly into our homes. They came, not only into our 'radio rooms," however modest, but also into our living rooms. We could hear the world and make up our own minds about what we heard. DX took on meaning, and the book lays it out. To this day, a shortwave radio provides an unmatched ear to the world, and we should be thankful to Jerry for telling its history so well.


But what of an encore? A compact disk with this story, and with accompnying audio and illustrations in color? A coffee-table book with color illustrations updated to the 1990s? A second volume—1945-1995, The Cold War in the Ether? If

Jerry does any of these, you may be assured that they will be of high quality — equal to that of this book.

BOOK REVIEW

Inventing American Broadcasting 1899-1922 By Susan J. Douglas


While there are many good histories of radio and broadcasting available today, most of them center around the equipment or the personalities within the industry. Yet, radio did not develop in a vacuum. Indeed, radio and broadcasting were strongly influenced by society as it was and events that occured during the early part of this century. Broadcasting was, as the late D. H. Moore would say, "a sociological phenomenon." This is the approach Susan Douglas takes in her book, Inventing American Broadcasting 1899-1922. which explores the evolution of broadcasting.

This book is quite different from Eric Barnouw's excellent book, A Tower In Babel, which looks at broadcasting from an industrial point of view, or Tom Lewis' book, Empire Of the Air,

which examines broadcasting in a study of three of the major personalities Involved with radio. Douglas feels that to really understand broadcasting, we must study it in the context of the social and economic times in which it evolved.

One would think that a study of broadcasting would start with the KQW broadcasts of the 1910s or broadcasts of the early 1920s pioneered by KDKA. Indeed, that is where Douglas planned to start. However, as she delved more deeply into the events leading up to regular, commercial broadcasts, she realized that we would have to go even earlier to the very beginning of wireless to understand how broadcasting came about. Therefore, this book ends with the birth of broadcasting.

In the introduction, Douglas discusses the three factors that she believes were necessary for broadcasting to evolve: 1) technology — control of a working system (not just individual components properly protected by patents) necessary



to making broadcasting work; 2) the capital and business strategy needed to exploit this technology; 3) control of the media to shape public opinion and promote society's desire for the technology.

This third area is often overlooked. While the media of the time did not Invent broadcasting, they had tremendous influence as to how it would be shaped. It is to these three areas that the book is devoted.

The first chapter covers the inventor-hero concept popular during the time of Marconi's wireless reports of the America's cup races of 1899. The individual inventor, like Edison in his early days, struggling to invent something for the betterment of humanity, was much admired by American society at that time

The second chapter details the struggle by different Inventors to make a complete technological system that would work better than competing systems and, at the same time, circumvent competitors' patents. Each inventor wanted to monopolize the industry for his own profit.

The third and fifth chapters discuss the financial aspects of broadcasting. It was not enough to have a great invention; one had to sell it. While some were struggling for capital, others were cashing in on the aura of wireless to sell worthless stock. After many people had lost their money in bad investments, they began to look at the inventor-heroes as single-minded villalns who were taking their money.

The fourth and sixth chapters cover the influence of the U.S. Navy and amateurs. The Navy, after inital reluctance, became a major buyer of wireless. Since wireless companies needed capital, they were strongly influenced by the Navy to make apparatus to Navy specifications. Since the

Navy was mainly interested in reliable, point-topoint communication, the Navy influenced the direction wireless was to take for a while.

Amateurs were able to make homemade apparatus fairly cheaply. Soon the amateur wireless hobby grew to the point where there was a conflict between the amateurs, who believed "the air" was free for all, and the Navy, who wanted strict control in the name of national security. Amateurs prevailed for a while, because no one was sure how to regulate that which was so nebulous.

The seventh and eighth chapters show how things changed as a result of the *Titanic* disaster. When rescue efforts and later information on survivors were hampered by wireless chacs, interference, and lack of regulation, people demanded regulation. The government, prompted by the Navy, began regulating the wireless industry and amateur stations.

The advent of World War I reinforced government control. However, during World War I, government control of some industries, like the railroads, turned out to be a disaster. Public opinion then shifted to corporate control of radio. The public believed that corporations were benevolent in their use of inventions. By this time, the inventor-hero had mostly disappeared, and the large research laboratories had taken over much of the development of technology.

The final chapter brings together all the parts necessary for commercial broadcasting to begin. The formation of RCA combined patents so that good quality apparatus could be made. Amateurs were no longer thought of as pests, because, during the war, amateurs had helped to fill the great need for radio operators. Soon, some of them started broadcasting music and other interesting material to which all could listen.

It soon occurred to radio manufacturers that you could sell a lot more radios to "Everyman" than just to licensed commercial and amateur operators. Thus, broadcasting was born.

The epilogue discusses the fact that, while a lot about broadcasting has changed since the

beginning, an amazing amount has not. Broadcasting is still controlled by major corporations. Corporate-military connections are stronger than ever. Broadcasting has become one medium strongly influencing public opinion. The sale of advertising finances broadcasting, just as it does print media.

The book finishes with extensive notes allowing readers to delve more deeply into subjects that interest them. These notes show the depth and extent of the author's research. There is also a very good index.

Douglas has managed to avoid perpetuating many of the myths about early radio that trap other authors. The context of her book is that radio was just one of the many forces of change at the time. Things that appear strange to us now make sense when viewed in the perspective of the prevailing social climate of the era.

On the down side, Douglas does not have the technical expertise to explain clearly the circuitry and apparatus used in early radio. Whether the reader is an expert or a novice, he will find some of the explanations a bit obtuse. However, this is not a technical book, and the lack of technical explanation does not detract from what is meant to be a sociological study.

Overall, Inventing American Broadcasting 1899-1922 is a well researched book and merits a place in the library of anyone interested in broadcasting from a sociological-historical viewpoint.

Published by the Johns Hopkins University Press, the book has 363 pages in a 6° x 9" paperback format with about twenty illustrations. It is available from *Antique Radio Classified* and other booksellers for \$14.95. Be sure to check for shipping information.

"Wireless Fever"

BY BOB BREESE

In 1922, Herbert Hoover was Secretary of Commerce and described the "wireless fever" as "one of the most astounding things that has come under my observations of American life." In her book *Inventing American Broadcasting 1899-1922*, Susan J. Douglas does a wonderfully accurate job of telling the story of that "wireless fever" era.

This history of the events leading up to the advent of American broadcasting includes the story of the inventions of the wireless telegraph and the wireless telephone in the context of the cultural history of the period. World commerce was rapidly growing, a world war was fought, the *Titanic* sank, and the automobile was replacing the horse.

Douglas gives individual inventors a great deal of deserved attention and credit for their individual roles in the development of radio. The book is worth reading just to gain a better appreciation of these men.

But, the book is much more. It is the story of amateur radio operators, as well as of capital and the quest for profits, which turned wireless inventions into profitable commercial enterprises. The result was the formation of the Radio Corporation of America and the active participation of corporate giants — General Electric, Westinghouse, and AT&T. It is also the story of how the Navy tried to gain control over radio, told in a very informative way.

In all, Susan Douglas' study of the era of "wireless fever" is well researched and very good reading. It should be read by all who are interested in the history of early radio.

We traveled 600 miles round trip, as we have for the past several years, to attend the first day of the meet. Upon arrival, we discovered that the flea market lot was completely devoid of vendors. In checking with the hotel, we were informed that many other attendees were also alarmed to find that the flea market did not begin until Friday, July 9, the same as last year.

This gross misrepresentation [by the advertiser] is totally inexcusable and has caused undue hardship and expense for out-of-town and out-of-state attendees.

However, one could argue that the notation "Huge Open Air Flea Market" should have made clear that the flea market did not start on Thursday, but on Friday. No doubt, MARC will make that clear in next year's ad. On the other hand, A.R.C.'s club events box lists what occurs on each of the four days. And note also that our "Coming Radio Events" pages always contain a box warning participants to check dates, places, and times of events, since cancellations and errors do occur.

In regard to club scheduling, one more point is worth making: when a meet moves its opening day forward, attendance and activity dwindle on the last day — the day that new and potential collectors usually show up. (Editor)

Vacuum Tube Repair Wafers

These tube repair wafers are solid-state devices for quick and easy repair of early vacuum tubes. The wafer is installed by simply sliding it over the tube pins and reinserting the tube into its socket. If the filament is intact, but there is little or no emission, the filament may be lit for best visual effect. However, the tube can be open filament.

No change in radio operating voltages is required. Any number of tubes may be repaired in a radio. If wafers are installed on all tubes, the B+voltage may usually be reduced without sacrificing volume or sensitivity. Performance will vary between radio models.
