

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

What's that — a ship on the cover? Did I receive the wrong magazine? Did A.R.C.'s printer switch photos with another magazine? The ship is too early to have laid the Atlantic Cable — no smoke stacks. What's the connection?

We wondered, too, until we realized that Buford Chidester's ship has a sail that is actually a cone speaker. And why not? A ship in full sail conjures up adventure and exploration. That image certainly relates to radio, which opened up the world to listeners everywhere. These colorful ship speakers make a perfect blend of the two worlds, and thanks to Dave Crocker, our graphic artist and an avid collector, we present them in the lead article.

Dave is always on the lookout for photos that can evolve into articles. In fact, the cover photo was originally destined for *Photo Review*, but Dave saw its potential as an article. As the owner of one of the speakers featured in the article, he has had frequent exchanges with the other two contributors, Buford Chidester and John DeLoria on the subject. And so, once again, a photo, plus related material from earlier A.R.C. articles, has led to another interesting article.

Joseph Wood describes the classic Western Electric 7A 3-tube amplifier. This amplifier was very popular in the early 1920s with amateurs, and today is a popular item with collectors. In fact, if you are purchasing a WE 7A, it is important to know whether or not tubes are included, since the tubes alone now bring over \$100 each, making them worth more than the amplifier itself!

Factory set junkers invite restoration, but home-brew junkers need to beg for it. William Corkutt heard the cry from two Pilot Wasp home-brew sets and furnishes us with the story in this issue. The reward was a performance living up to the Pilot's claims — DX from all the world and thrilling shortwave reception.

Wally Worth and Dave Crocker show us a recent home brew — the Bruno No. 3, a set originally designed to promote RCA's WD-11 tube. Another short item by Mark Oppat introduces us to a rare space heater disguised as a radio. And in still another short piece, Phil Whitney explains the markings on early Raytheon vacuum tubes.

Blake Dietz writes of one champion of the radio collecting community — Chevie Crandell, the outgoing, long-term president of the Dallas, Texas, area Vintage Radio and Phonograph Society (VRPS). You may want to attend the upcoming VRPS meet October 29-31 and wish Chevie well.

Photo Review this month seems to emphasize oddities—a knight on a horse, a dwarf cathedral radio, and an unusual translucent horn speaker having tiger stripes. But, to keep our ties to radio's earliest days, George Durfey provides a photo of an Eliot spark converter.

Construction articles often challenge us all, but Robert Enemark's power supply for battery and portable radios may test the skills of the best of the builders out there. Although various assembled power supply units are available from a number of venders, some collectors enjoy doing it themselves. Bob actually described this as a "simple power supply," but I thought it best to drop the word "simple" — after all, 24 components are used! Still, the cost is only about \$30.

The summer meet and auction season continues with reports on the Michigan Antique Radio Club's Extravaganza, the Mid-Atlantic Antique Radio Club's Radioactivity, Part 3 of our report on the Frank Krantz estate auction, a small auction held by Keystone Associates, and the Cincinnati Antique Radio Society's RadioRama, Again, our stalwarf reporters are Larry Babcock and Ray Chase, with Jim Clark also helping out.

Unfortunately, radio collecting, as do most such activities, has its occasional bad egg, and this month we report on one who has resurfaced — Mike Kirby. It has been about 8 years since this name appeared in our pages, but some of you will remember it well. This individual, who responded to wanted ads and accepted money, but did not deliver the goods, is in jail again. Fortunately, his recent fraudulent activities were curtailed quickly, unlike in 1989, when he defrauded dozens before he was stopped.

Also, fortunately, the frequency with which we have a story of this kind is rare, a fact that speaks well of the general honesty in the ranks of collectors. In fact, A.R.C.'s own experience in 1998 of uncollected checks was less than 3/100 of 1 percent!

ON THE COVER

The colorful wooden ship model of the *Venetian Lepanto* is actually a radio speaker which has a main sail as a paper cone. This unusual speaker of the 1920s is owned by Buford Chidester of Mt. Wolf, Pennsylvania. Fully rigged, it has miniature sailors in the rigging, three treasure chests, and tiny, colored light bulbs that filuminate the hull interior by AC current. Those attending AWA this year will remember seeing this speaker on display there.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Three Ship Speaker Designs

Cone speakers continue to crop up as a subject of interest to collectors. This article is a follow-up to articles in the July 1997 and the January 1999 issues of A.R.C. It describes three altogether different approaches to ship speaker design in the 1920s. (Editor)


Figure 1. The very colorful cone speaker ship model "Venetian Lepanto" made by Miniature Ship Models, Inc., of Philadelphia. The sail with the lion design painted on it is the cone speaker. Look carefully and you will see the sailor figurines in the rigging.

The ship model shown in Figure 1 is owned by Buford Chidester of Mount Wolf, Pennsylvania. Manufactured by Miniature Ship Models, Inc., of Philadelphia, this was the company's largest kit model. It measures 27" tall x 21" long and has a hull of painted wood construction. The 14" x 17" center parchment sail is actually the free-edge paper cone driven by a Vitalitone-type driver attached to the mast.

Found in remarkably good condition, the unit is fully rigged and has eight tiny cast-iron sailors in the rigging, (see Figure 2), all of which are hand painted. House current powers the lighting in the hull interior and the three tiny green treasure chests on deck. The ship is named the Venetian

Lepanto, and is one of many the company offered for sale either in kit form or fully assembled. One ship model even offered a 2-dial battery operated receiver inside its hull, exposed by pulling down one hinged side of the model.




Figure 3. The driver for the speaker is attached to the main mast just behind the paper cone sail.

Figure 3 shows the Vitalitone-type driver attached to the main mast, which operated the

paper cone speaker.

An ad for the Miniature Ship Models speakers, shown in Figure 4, illustrates the Santa Maria, La Pinta, and the Mayflower, just three of the many designs offered by the company. This ad appeared in the July 1927 issue of Science and Invention.





Figure 5. Another ship speaker by iMiniature Ship Models, Inc., this one with the cone speaker hidden in the deck.

Figure 5 shows a second type of shlp model design, which was also a wooden kit sold by Miniature Ship Models, Inc. Owned by John De-Loria of Chicopee, Massachusetts, this unit has undergone some restoration with modifications.

Named the *Mayflower*, it is 25" long x 26" tall x 10" wide. It differs from other ship model cone speakers in that, instead of being mounted in the sails, the speaker is flush with the center deck, and the driver is deep in the hull. A wooden




Figure 6. The cone speaker can be seen on the deck of the ship, covered with a grille cloth and a decorative wooden cover.

decorative grille covers the speaker cloth, as can be seen in Figure 6. The sails were recently restored with a light canvas-type material. The kit, composed of 62 separate pieces, originally sold for \$4.98.

An entirely different approach to ship speaker design by an unknown manufacturer is shown in

This model is 25" tall x 17" long x 6" wide. I own this speaker and will attempt a total restoration later this year. Any hints on plaster restoration would be appreciated.

And there you have three novel approaches to speakers in ship models — one with a cone speaker sail, one with a cone speaker deck, and one with a horn speaker in the deck hull.

If any of our readers have any other variations, or can identify the manufacturer of the ship speaker shown in Figures 7 and 8, we would be glad to hear from you.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Western Electric 7A Amplifier

We are always glad to hear about an A.R.C.-inspired project. Sometimes an article does it; other times, as in Joseph Wood's case, an ad triggers a memory and away we go. No matter where the idea comes from, we're pleased to share it with our readers. (Editor)

In my collection, I have a Western Electric Type 7A amplifier. I didn't even take time to study it until I saw an ad in *Antique Radio Classified* that read, "Wanted: a Western Electric amplifier."

I took my amplifier out to look it over and found that it is true to the Western Electric reputation for high quality work. For its time, it was one of the best amplifiers available.

I decided to examine the amplifier, shown in Figure 1, more closely. First, I removed the eight wood screws that held the panel to the sturdy, almost square birchwood case. The wooden case measures 12½" x 10" at the base and 3½" deep inside. I pulled the panel up and turned it over to stare at what is a real old-time collector's gem. The wire used in its assembly resembles the old-time No. 8 rigid house wire soldered with great care to each component.

The top panel is a ½" thick piece of black Bakelite insulating material and contains all of the components on its top and bottom sides. On the underside, we see a tap switch, an on/off switch, a C battery case, a small molded condenser, three well shielded Western Electric transformers, three tube sockets, four input/output terminals, three battery connect terminals and a ground terminal.

Inside the bottom of the wood cabinet is a schematic of the circuit. As I studied the circuit and its related parts, I found that three Type 216A tubes do the amplification. Two of the Type 216A tubes are used in a push-pull output stage for maximum amplification. Three iron-core Western Electric transformers are needed to match the tubes to the input and output of the amplifier. The 381A transformer is connected to the gain taps, and the small molded condenser has a number — D44386.

Note that the Western Electric speech amplifier Type 216A tube is unusual in that it is spherical in shape and has a sturdy brass base. It is a 4-prong triode tube utilizing two prongs for the filament voltage, one for the grid and one for the plate.

This amplifier is battery-powered, and the tubes require 120 volts DC for the plate voltage, 6 volts DC for the filament voltage, and 71/2 volts for the

grid bias voltage. The two C batteries are Eveready No. 751 9-volt batteries.

The top panel has a Western Electric tag that has a long list of patents dating from 1907 to 1921. The 5-contact tap switch gives away the item's virtage as belonging to the crystal set era.




Figure 2. Internal view of the Western Electric 7A amplifier.



RESTORATION TOPICS

The Pilot Wasp DX From All The World

Home-brew radios are sometimes overlooked by radio collectors. In this article, William Corkutt shares with us the joy of restoring old home brews — in this case, two versions of the Pilot Wasp. (Editor)

No cabinet or tubes, untested and rough, but modest in price — a typical home-brew purchase. After cleaning decades of accumulated grime from the parts, I stood back to inspect my find. The brass variable capacitors, the red-topped audio transformers, the bright green coil, the big Bakelite-enclosed choke, the shock-mounted sockets — all indicated something special.




Figure 1. A front view of the restored shortwave Pilot Wasp.




Figure 2. A rear view shows the neat layout of the Wasp.

Surprisingly, the 3-tube radio proved to be a version of the shortwave Pilot Wasp so aptly illustrated and described in Volume 2 of Alan Douglas' Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's. My radio differed only slightly from the original 1928 Pilot version. The dual regeneration capacitors are side-by-side on my set rather than one above the other as in the original. Figures 1 and 2 show the Pilot Wasp after restoration.

In addition, the tuning dial on my set is a standard National

type rather than the Pilot celluloid scale and rectangular metal bezel. The parts layout on my baseboard is identical to that illustrated in the Douglas book. There are no panel markings on my radio and whether it was a kit or a home brew from Pilot parts is unknown. The Pilot WASP insignia on the rear of the front panel is my own addition from a Pilot advertisement. Oddly, the 3-tube Wasp is not listed in McMahon's Radio Collector's Guide.

RESTORATION

The radio had probably been stored in a hot place, since the hard rubber base had warped and sagged over the years. I removed the mounting screws from the transformers, tube and coil sockets, and battery connectors, keeping the stiff wiring intact to hold the components together

temporarily. Using the old baseboard as a pattern, I cut and drilled a new baseboard from plywood and applied two coats of glossy black paint. When it was dry, I remounted the baseboard using the original screws. One of the audio transformers was faulty. Fortunately I had purchased a substitute years earlier at a hamfest. (You find remarkable antique odds and ends at modest prices at hamfests.) I added the missing gridleak and tubes.

ON THE AIR

A broadcast coil came with the radio and it played very well. Using a set of Pilot shortwave coils from another radio, I was able, over a series of evening listening sessions, to receive foreign broadcasts and amateurs on all shortwave bands from 15 to 200 meters. Regeneration was smooth

and stable. The knob-controlled antenna coupling capacitor mounted on the baseboard is a must feature since loose coupling is essential when receiving code on the amateur bands. After over a half-century, the Pilot Wasp still lived up to its advertisement offerings: "DX from all the world!"

ANOTHER PILOT RADIO




Figure 3. The home-brew version of the Super-Wasp in its "as found" state.

By phone, I learned of a junker, which may have been a Pilot. I offered to buy it sight-unseen. The owner, apparently not wanting to take advantage of me, insisted on sending a photo before I made a choice. After I received the photo, shown in Figure 3, I called to ask if the shield-covers came with the radio. "What you see is what you get," I was informed — not an encouraging message since the radio appeared to be a true junker, one too dilapidated to restore to operation.

The radio was obviously a home brew. It used Pilot tuning components and the circuit of the 1929, 4-tube Pilot Super-Wasp, a Type 222 screen-grid RF amplifier, and the Type 01-A tube as regenerative detector and audio amplifiers. The audio transformers were husky GE units, and though somewhat rusted, both tested good. The tuning knobs were planetary-drive, National Velvet verniers.

A full set of eight shortwave coils wrapped in old newspaper came with the radio. I knew, of course, that in the late 1920s, set builders bought Pilot coil sets and matching variable capacitors, since the tuning circuits were the heart of regen-




Figure 4. A front view of the restored Super-Wasp

erative receivers. Additional parts were bought or scrounged. The panel and chassis of my radio are of heavy brass and the coil shields of galvanized steel. All-in-all, the radio appeared to have been fabricated by a skilled craftsman.

In the days of tube radios, amateurs never met a radio they thought they could not improve. Even in the 1950s, I recall always adding a component or two to a commercial radio to "tweak" performance and impose a personal touch. Our 1929 builder had added two extra variable capacitors. These capacitors allowed coarse tuning to the center of a band while the verniers enabled fine tuning.

ANOTHER RESTORATION

As received, the chassis was coated with a layer of the type of grime that forms on horizontal metal surfaces subjected to damp and dust. Avoiding harsh chemicals on principle, I removed the box shields and spent several hours using steel wool to clean the surfaces between components, being careful not to disturb the original wiring. I sanded the rust from the audio transformers and touched up the metal with black paint. After removing all knobs and encasing the chassis in a plastic protective sheet, I spray-painted the panel since the original paint had cracked with time.

The original builder had mounted a couple of tube sockets at the rear to serve as power and phone/speaker connectors. I replaced these sockets with a terminal strip. Electrically, the set was in fair condition and only the voltage dropping

resistor for the screen-grid tube required placement.




Figure 5. Compare this photograph of the restored Super-Wasp with its "as found" photo in Figure 3.

While debugging the reassembled radio, I discovered that plugging in the coils resulted in many finger cuts from the sharp edges of the shield boxes. I decided to dispense with these shields, leaving intact only a panel shield between the two plug-in colls to prevent feedback and undesired oscillation. Later experiment showed that the full shields were unnecessary. Figures 4 and 5 show the restored radio and the rewards that result from well executed restoration efforts.

After I resoldered several loose connections, the radio operated. Stations, amateur and foreign broadcast, were received using all four coil pairs. The variable antenna coupling capacitor had been mounted on the front panel — a nice touch. Like its Wasp predecessor, the Super-Wasp lived up to its advertisement of: "Thrilling short-wave reception."

For cosmetics, I rubbed the cabinet with furniture wax and polished it smooth. Some of the white numerals of the main tuning dials had faded. I replaced the faded dials with better ones bought at a hamfest years earlier

(Pilot Wasp Home Brews, continued) and saved for such an occasion.

What made the Wasp so good during the dying days of the regenerative era? After all, the circuit was common and the patents had run out years ago. Probably it was attention to detail. The Pilot brass variable capacitors always used flexible pigtails to connect the rotor to the circuit, rather than relying on the rotor-shaft bearings as less scrupulous manufacturers often did. The Pilot coil forms were ribbed to produce high-Q coils which reduced losses and improved selectivity. The shockproof Pilot tube and coll sockets

gripped tight and required the coils to be equipped with handles for insertion and removal.

Shielding the detector and the RF amplifier stages inhibited interaction and unwanted oscillation. In addition, the liberal use of bypass capacitors allowed the amplifiers to be pushed to their maximum. Though such well-designed regenerative receivers would continue to be used by amateurs into the 1930s, the public demanded something less technical and simpler to use. The low cost superheterodyne was in the offing.

My heartfelt thanks to Alan Douglas whose excellent books, *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's*, enable me to identify interesting radios that come my way. (His Pilot section contains the circuit of the Wasp.)

The Bruno No. 3 1-Tube Receiver



The Bruno No. 3 receiver uses a flat compression-type tuning condenser because of the internal space limitations of the loose coupler construction.

PROBLEM LOG REPORT

Kirby Sits in Bay County Jail — Again

In February 1991, A.R.C. published an article with a similar title. As we said then, a case of illegal activity is rare among radio collectors, but Mike Kirby is the exception. We're sorry to report that he has continued these activities up to the present. The following is a warning about Kirby to newcomers to the hobby and will bring those who know about Kirby's past up-to-date. (Editor)

"Organized Scheme to Defraud" — that's the charge against one Mike Kirby, who at this writing sits in the Bay County jail in Panama City, Florida, awaiting arrargnment on September 30. That charge will ring a familiar bell to longtime A.R.C. readers who remember Mr. Kirby's victimization of radio collectors as far back as 1989. At that time, 57 readers reported to A.R.C. that they had been offered items for sale by Mike Kirby of Panama City. Of these, 36 paid Kirby money, but only one actually received the merchandise; most of the others eventually received a refund, if they were persistent.

As the February 1991 article reported, A.R.C. acted as a clearinghouse for information on Mr. Kirby and forwarded information to the U.S. Postal Inspector. The Postal Service followed up on the numerous complaints, and on October 18, 1989, Kirby was arrested. However, he was released the same day after consenting in writing to (1) cease representing that persons sending him money for merchandise would receive the merchandise in a reasonable time, (2) make refunds to all persons not receiving merchandise, and (3) return any new orders received. Over the next several months, Kirby returned most of the payments he had received.

However, once again in 1990, he began responding to ads, receiving payments and not shipping merchandise. Our 1991 article left off with Kirby's 1990 arrest and release pending trial. Since then, we have had no more complaints from our subscribers and assumed that his activities had been curtailed by the long arm of the law.

Wrong. In August of this year, we learned that Kirby was still at it from Steve Finelli, an alert subscriber, and then via the Internet, where a waming from David Stinson advised people to send any information on Kirby's activities to Detective Robert Luther of the Panama City, Florida, Police Department.

As a result, we decided to do a little investigative reporting on our own of Kirby's history of illegal activities. As best we could determine, the following summary of his activities is accurate.

UPDATE ON 1990-1991

According to the Bay County Clerk of Courts, Kirby's 1990 arrest put him in court in September 1991. He was sentenced to 30 days, 250 hours of community service, and 5 years probation on a felony charge of scheming to defraud a California ham radio operator of \$600. Though the victim got his money back, Kirby was charged because of the number of complaints about his using the mails to defraud. "Scheming to Defraud" is a third-degree felony and carries maximum penalties of 5 years in jail and up

to \$5,000 in fines.

As an interesting aside, Kirby had been a seemingly upstanding member of the community. He was a science teacher in the Jinks Middle School, and the Panama City News Herald headline of January 4, 1991, — "Teacher Arrested for Fraud" — must have been a jolt to the students returning from the holiday break, not to mention an embarrassment to the school administration.

THE RECORD - 1991-1999

The Bay County jail records show that Kirby had a total of three arrests in 1991 — all of which resulted in release on the same day; one arrest in 1992 for which he spent 14 days in jail; two arrests in 1994 resulting in less than two months in jail; one in 1996 resulting in probation, and now in 1999, a new charge. The grand total is nine arrests with brief sojurns in the Bay County jail.

Along the way, he received the required sentences of 5 years, subsequently reduced to probation and fines with no time served in state prison, and with all conditions reimposed. But, he has violated those conditions, and once again fincs himself in what must be his home away from home — the Bay County jail.

A.R.C. ADVERTISING POLICY

In general, Kirby is an anomaly among radio collectors, as overall, we receive very few reports of problems. When we do, we spend considerable time helping individuals to resolve their differences. If several complaints accumulate about one person, however, we refuse his advertising until the conflicts are resolved. The number of complaints about other individuals in no way has matched the number accumulated by Mike Kirby. Many readers may not realize that this complaint service is part of our efforts to enforce A.R.C.'s advertising policy, if you contact us in writing about the problem.

As for investigative reporting, the A.R.C. staff may decide to give up radios for the police beat. Exchanges with the Panama City court, the Bay City jail, and the Postal Inspector in Mobile, Alabama, were full of interesting asides. When one of the officers was identified as "Bond" and an earlier investigator as "Sam Slay," we knew we had arrived and were destined for screen tests.

CLUB SPOTLIGHT

Chevie Crandell —VRPS President A "Bandleader" Passes the Baton

As the Vintage Radio & Phonograph Society (VRPS) approaches its 27th year, the 25th Anniversary Convention, and the millennium, reflection on the many changes that have taken place over the years is inevitable. Throughout most of the club's history. C.F. (Chevie) Crandell has been instrumental in those changes, first as a member looking for early battery sets at the third annual convention in 1976; then as chairman in 1979; and finally, since 1984, as president - an unprecedented 15-year term.

On July 17, 1999, Chevie stepped down from the presidency. On August 15, 1999, fellow directors George Potter and Gary Reeves (armed with cameras) joined me for an informal interview with Chevie and his wife E.G. What follows are excerpts from this exciting and enriching event. We pick up Chevie's biography with his early interest in radio.

THE EARLY YEARS

Chevie grew up with radio, as his father, Claude Crandell, was the bandleader of the Nebraska City Municipal Band, located in Shenandoah, Nebraska. Claude's band was regularly broadcast on KFNF, which was the Henry Fields Seed and Nursery Company Station, known for broadcasting crop information to local farmers. Interestingly, Henry Fields also produced a 3-dial TRF set called the "Shenandoah 5," circa 1925. [A.R.C. readers may remember reading about Henry Field and Station KFNF in several issues from 1987 to

Chevie shared an interesting story about KFNF that shows how the radio industry has changed. yet stayed the same. KFNF used to award prizes for contests during their broadcasts. In those days, telephones were not commonly in every household, and to acknowledge receiving a broadcast, listeners would send telegrams to the station. The first telegram received would determine the winner!

In his youth as a member of the Boy Scouts, Chevie constructed several crystal sets, and in

the late 1920s, built his first 1-tube receiving set. As a young high school student. Chevie recalls rescuing, at fifty cents each, many battery sets from the local radio stores, and using the parts to build sets of his own. (One has to wonder, "Are there any regrets?").

After graduation from high school, Chevie headed for Kansas State University where he completed both his Bachelors and Masters degrees in electrical engineering. While in graduate school, Chevie had the good fortune to meet E.G., who was finishing a degree in

music. They were married in 1940.

While attending the university, Chevie recalls participating In experimental television broadcasts using a 60-line flying spot arc transmitter. The broadcasts were made twice weekly, mostly still frames, except when E.G. would volunteer to pose, and she wouldn't sit still! Concurrent with these broadcasts, the student team was developing an electronic television receiver for the reception of the mechanical transmitter.

Chevie's collecting interests reflect his engineering background. He collects battery sets for the most part, and his focus is on the different circuits used in the mid-to-late-1920s radio receivers. Chevie is a real historian when it comes to radio circuit design improvements and advancement.

ENGINEERING CAREER AND VRPS

After graduating in 1940, Chevie went to work for Southwestern Bell in Dallas as an engineer. In 1942, he was invited to join the prestigious Bell Laboratories as a member of the technical staff in electronics research. During his 2-year stay, Chevie worked primarily on military radar. Later he worked on the development and deployment of the first U.S. transcontinental microwave system. In 1945 Chevie returned to Dallas, where he worked for 33 years with Southwestern Bell as the Manager of Facilities Engineering. It was during the latter part of his career that Chevie joined the then budding Vintage Radio and Phonograph Society.

Within a year, he was drafted to serve on the

Board of Directors, a team of eight, in those days. In time, Chevie would serve a year as chairman. He recalls a club then of about 40 or 50 members, less than adequate convention facilities, and manual, paper-processed auctions. In 1979, Chevie, George Potter, and Dave Medly made a move to incorporate the society, an endeavor that was completed in 1980. Four years later in 1984, the Board of Directors elected Chevie Crandell presi-

dent. For 15 years at the conclusion of each annual meeting, E.G. would ask, "Are you going to be president again this year?"

THE VRPS PRESIDENCY

In the 15 years since Chevie took over as president of VRPS, many changes have taken place. The club roster now tops 500 members, fall conventions now run 3 full days, and auctions are computerized. Added to its events calendar are annual cabinet and chassis restoration workshops, two all-day swap meets, a spring auction, and a Christmas Cheer party. Without the passion and devotion of Chevie Crandell, I doubt that this unprecedented growth could have taken place. Fortunately, Chevie will remain on the Board of Directors with responsibilities, and in order to put to rest any rumors — Chevie and E.G. are in great health, and they will remain active in the hobby.

Let's not forget that behind every great leader, there is someone special lurking in the shadows. In the case of Chevie, that support role is rone other than his wife E.G., a gracious woman who is no stranger to radio and its history. At age 15, E.G. played piano accompaniment for young contestants on radio programs. She remembers how excited she was to be allowed to play a piano in radio broadcast studio, and how unimpressive small town radio studios tumed out to be in the 1930s. Later at WLIB (New York), while Chevie was off working at Bell Labs, E.G. and a small group of ladies produced a 50-minute weekly music program. In recent years, E.G. has played

the part of the president's personal secretary, receiving calls from all over the country at all times of the day and night, and politely directing them to the appropriate board member. E.G. says you can not imagine how many folks don't know what their radios are worth (and want a phone appraisal!).

At the end of the interview with this wonderful couple, sitting in the living room of this charming home filled with curios of all ages, I asked Chevie and E.G. to reflect on the past 15 years and share with us some final comments:

Chevie: "I have appreciated working with a great bunch of fellows, not only from a radio-collecting perspective, but from a social aspect as well. It's a great hobby and preserves a part of history as well."

E.G.: "People who have a meaningful kind of hobby are very lucky. Chevie has a real love of radios. As time goes on we realize what is important. It keeps both of us young."

RESTORATION TOPICS

A Power Supply for Battery and Portable Radios

BY ROBERT B. ENEMARK

Many older portable radios require special batteries or battery packs that are no longer available. The battery-operated power supply described in this article can supply the needed voltages using easily obtained. alkaline D cells. Unlike AC lineoperated power supplies, this battery-operated power supply restores the true portability to your battery-operated radio. The heart of this power supply is a DC-to-DC converter that produces the required B voltages. For the power supply described in this article, a single D cell is used to light the 11/2 volt tube filaments. If a radio requires a

higher voltage for the filament supply, two or more D cells can be wired in series. The use of D cells for the filament supply is only appropriate in radios that use tubes with low current drain filaments and is not appropriate for radios that use Type 01-A tubes, which require a substantial A supply. (Editor)

Many older battery-operated or portable sets use plate and screen voltages much higher than what are available today in off-the-shelf batteries. What is needed is a simple low cost DC-to-DC converter that operates from easily obtained dry batteries, and which can produce a variety of higher, selectable B voltages for various low current-drain, receiver requirements.




Figure 1. The completed A and B power supply, including the D cells.

My goal was to design a supply that would be relatively uncomplicated in concept, easily built, and low in cost. The result is shown in Figure 1.

Also, the parts had to be available almost anywhere in the U.S.A. — for example, from a Radio Shack store. However, it turns out that these stores no longer carry high-voltage electrolytic capacitors; therefore, they must be obtained elsewhere.

THE DC-TO-DC CONVERTER

My design for a power supply includes a B supply that utilizes a 250 Hz square wave generator feeding a driver and an inverter/driver, all accomplished using five small parts and an inexpensive integrated circuit. The drivers control two power MOSFET switching transistors that alternately turn on and off at the 250 Hz rate like a vibrator in an old auto radio (but at a higher switching speed). This push-pull action alternates current in the primary of a step-up transformer, and its secondary voltage is rectified and filtered to supply the higher voltages for the receiver. The




Figure 2. Schematic diagram for DC-to-DC B supply.

B supply runs on 4 D cells or about 6 volts. A separate D cell supplies the A voltages.

BATTERIES TO RUN THE UNIT

For this application, a lot of current is not required, and it is preferable to have the batteries last a reasonable length of time. A typical alkaline D cell supplies heavy current with much less drop in voltage than a carbon-zinc one and lasts longer too. With a load resistance of 2 ohms and drain current averaging 650 mA or so, its internal resistance is about 1/10 ohm.

After about 6 hours of operation at this level, a D cell will lose about 20 percent of its terminal voltage. With intermittent operation, the cell tends to recover somewhat, and its life will be lengthened. The design is based on the assumption that the current drain from the D cells would not be more than 700 mA.

The 4 D cells, or about 6 volts that this supply uses, produce B voltages over a range of 50 volts, at 35mA or more to 220 volts at 5 mA. Higher output current can be obtained at the expense of lowered battery life. This basic design could be altered for much higher output currents by heat-sinking the transistors and by changing to a higher powered transformer.

TECHNICAL DESCRIPTION

Referring to the schematic diagram of the B supply shown in Figure 2, you can see that U-1 is a CMOS integrated, quad 2-input NOR Gate, generically a Type 4001. When a "one" (positive) appears on either input of a gate, its output goes low. When both inputs are tied together as shown, each gate acts like an inverting amplifier (usually saturated) or "NOT" gate.

Gate B is connected back to the input of gate A through a capacitor C1 which is shunted by resistor R1. This 360-degree phase shift (2 inversions) causes the outputs to toggle at a rate determined by the time constant of R1 x C1. Gates C and D are used to turn on and off the MOSFETs, Q1 and

Q2 every other half-cycle in push-pull fashion, since Gate C's output drives Gate D's input. These act as power switches controlling the square-wave current through the primary of transformer T1.

Transformer T1 was chosen because it is small, light-in-weight, and can operate efficiently at audio frequencies, A Radio Shack No. 32-1031 line-tospeaker transformer turns out to be ideal for this application, because it has a balanced primary winding (speaker impedance taps) and 5 secondary taps for selecting the needed voltage (taps labeled "watts"). Since this is an audio transformer, it is more efficient when operated at audio, rather than 60-Hz line frequencies.

Note that a balanced primary is required, or equal turns presented to each transistor. Since the number of turns goes as the square root of the impedance, the primary common lead is zero; 4 ohms is a turns ratio of 2, and 16 ohms is a turns ratio of 4. Thus, with the 4-ohm tap in the center, and the common and the 16-ohm taps at the ends, the primary becomes a balanced, center-

tapped winding.

T1 has secondary taps labeled in watts. (Note that although the transformer taps are labeled in Watts, the nomenclature is completely unrelated to the power available from this supply.) The lowest voltage output tap is labeled 10 watts, and the highest one 0.62 watts. A bridge rectifier and pi-section filter completes the supply, reducing the ripple to low levels. Output taps can be individually selected, or more conveniently, with a switch, if quick changes are desired. Note that if the LED indicator is omitted, the 150 K-ohm resistor should be left in as a bleeder for the supply and electrolytics.

SUPPLY PERFORMANCE




Figure 3. Efficiency curve for the DC-to-DC Converter.

The lower part of Figure 3 has curves showing the output voltage regulation vs. current drain for different transformer secondary taps, so one can easily select which to use for various applications. The curve in the upper section of Figure 3 shows

the ratio of output power to input power, or efficiency of the supply. For a given output power, the efficiency does not change much from tap to tap, so the measurements were averaged into one curve. Transformer losses tend to cause the efficiency to drop off at lower output currents. However, it remains above 60 percent for most applications. Also note that the best regulation is obtained at the lowest voltage taps, where secondary impedances are lower.

PARTS AND HINTS

For convenience in building this converter, Radio Shack catalog numbers are provided in the parts list. It's always preferable to use intergrated circuit (IC) sockets for home projects, but even more so when using MOS ICs, which can be blown out by electrostatic charges when handled. I prefer wire-wrap sockets for hand soldering because the leads are longer and more rugged (excess lengths are easy to snip off). The socket should be spaced from the (Continued on following page) (Simple Power Supply, continued) board using a piece of thick spaghetti insulation, for example, so that melting solder does not "wick" up into its pins

For the MOSFETs, I cut off most of the conducting Scott foam, leaving a small piece which keeps all leads shorted until they are soldered into the circuit; this technique also stands them off the board. Once soldered, the foam sponge can be pulled apart with small pliers.

NPN power transistors can be substituted for the MOSFETs by coupling the inverter/driver outputs to their bases through 680-ohm resistors—to limit IC drain to a maximum of 10 mA. Then the 10K-ohm, pull-down resistors would not be needed. If output power exceeding about 1.5 watts is desired, the transistor DC betas would need to be 50 or more.

All the electronic parts except for T1 and the batterles were mounted and wlred on a Radio Shack predrilled PC board, Cat. #276-168, which was cut to a size 23/4 inches square. The total cost of parts for this supply is around \$30 or less, depending on what one can scrounge up from one's junk box.

APPLICATIONS

If a C supply Is needed for a radio, a zener diode rated at the required C voltage can be put in series with the supply mlnus output and the negative input to the radio. The minus C wire would then be connected to the negative supply output and the C+ wire to the set's B- connection. A good-sized electrolytic should shunt the zener diode of such an arrangement. Note that the C voltage will reduce the plate supply voltage by that amount.




Figure 4. A prototype of the supply mounted in the battery compartment of the RCA Model BT-40 portable radio.

Figure 4 shows a prototype of this supply used in an old RCA

Victor BT-40 portable set and a typical B battery. Figure 5 shows a front view of a Model BT-40, with Burgess batteries typically used in this set. Since the filament drain of this 4-tube set is 250 mA, and the plate supply of 90 volts draws 8 mA, a single D cell is a good match for supplying the filaments, roughly matching the life of the plate power supply batteries.

The supply electronics were placed in the battery compartment as far as possible from the internal loop antenna to reduce pickup of harmonics of the 250 Hz square-wave. Also, an aluminum shield was placed under the chassis shelf, since the chassis bottom had no cover plate. These precautions reduced the sound of

the 250 Hz pickup to what was barely noticeable between stations or on very weak ones.

In case the radio set used is very sensitive or has a large loop antenna, the supply probably should be placed at a distance or put into a metal box for shielding. This RCA portable at first developed an audio motorboating which was killed by shunting the bias resistor for its 1C5GT output tube with a 1000 mF/15-volt electrolytic.

RESULTS

Powered by the B supply and a D cell as the A supply, the set works very well and is a sensitive portable BC receiver that can be enjoyed and demonstrated. In Figure 5, the bulk of the old carbon-zinc A and B batteries contrast with the much smaller size of this power unit and its batter-

ies. By the way, the real impetus for designing this power supply was my need for a portable supply for the Ferris Model 32A Radio Noise and Field Strength Meter which I expect to tackle soon.

Labeling on Raytheon Radio Tubes

It was common practice for the manufacturers of vacuum tubes to produce tubes for other radio companies and to mark the tubes with the radio company's brand name. Some examples include DeForest, Airline, Philco, and Silvertone. Among the more than twenty names to be found on early radio tubes was that of the battery company Eveready or of the National Carbon Company which, along with Raytheon in Waltham, Mass., provided tubes for the early market from 1930.

Raytheon, known for many years as a leader in electronic equipment, occupied the plant used earlier by the makers of the famous Liberty airplane engines found on bombers in World War I. By 1931 radio tubes were appearing on the market bearing the name "Eveready Raytheon."

An unusual feature of these early tubes is their

markings. The ER201A, shown in Figure 1 and sold in 1931 has a base marked "Eveready Raytheon ER20*A." The base has been dusted with white chalk to make the marking more visible. The metal plates inside the envelope bear the name "Raytheon" stamped into the metal in raised letters, as shown in Figure 2, making the tube now a rare collector's item.

The Eveready Raytheon name also appears on the paper label, affixed to the tube's envelope. Although it is not readable here, the bottom portion of the label reads "Serco," along with the test results dated October 8, 1931.

MEET & AUCTION REPORT

Michigan Antique Radio Club Extravaganza '99 East Lansing, Michigan — July 8-11, 1999

The Michigan Antique Radio Club (MARC) held its 14th annual meet in East Lansing, Michigan, July 8-11, at the Holiday Inn South Convention Center. The event was highly successful, as MARC is able to make a lot of very forward-looking ideas for conducting a radio meet work well.

The event started on Thursday, a day earlier than in previous years. Family registrations numbered 335 from 31 states and 3 foreign countries. The theme of the convention was "On the Air," celebrating the history of radio and TV broadcasting. Free bus transportation was provided to the Michigan Historical Museum in downtown Lansing where an "On the Air" exhibit was displayed.

Again this year there was the 40' x 125' tent right in the middle of the flea market area. Unfortunately, at dawn on opening day of the flea market, it was pouring rain with much thunder and lightning. However, most of the sellers with sheltered tables went ahead and started selling. Almost nobody was outside until the storm ended a couple of hours later. Then 170 sellers occupied 250 outside selling spaces.

The tent where all registration is done has become the trademark of this meeting. The hospitality area had twelve 8-foot tables and chairs set up under the tent for snacking and socializing. This area could accommodate over 100 people, and ample refreshments were provided free for everyone throughout the entire event! (Donations were accepted.)

This is always a very complete meet with a large flea market, an exhibit, a contest, five programs, a women's luncheon, an outstanding social hour, and a large auction. The flea market

lasted three days but was most intense from dawn until lunch on Friday. Almost no sellers came later.

THE FLEA MARKET

Many interesting objects were offered in the flea market. One was a Federal 61 said to be in beautiful shape. The seller said it had been his Dad's. (Too bad he didn't want to keep it!) The asking price was \$1,500. There was also a nice looking Radiola II without the phones for \$450 and a Federal 58 DX for \$775. I saw an RCA Radiotron doll in good condition and in a display case for \$850. That may seem like a lot for a doll, but I sold mine for more a few years ago.

A white Colonial world radio with a big repair patch was \$750. A small, pressed composition

It was really useful this year when a heavy thunderstorm occurred during the first several hours after dawn on the first day of the event.

Emerson Model 411 Mickey Mouse radio was priced at \$1,200. It looked complete, but the finish was poor

I found a primitive, early, home-brew crystal set with one coil and a rat's nest of DCC insulated copper wire. I like it because the homemade coil was wound on a Quaker Oats box for the coil form.

I also found a very cute radio toy, "Radio Tinker." It is an 8" wide x 6" high tin box made to look like an early 1920s radio. There are two knobs that click when turned and the usual holes in the panel to see the tube filaments. There is also a built-in kazoo, a telegraph key, and a slot for coins to use it as a bank.

THE SOCIAL HOUR

MARC always has a social hour instead of a banquet. The "hour" actually lasts more than two hours. It is extremely popular for two reasons: it is "come as you are," and it is free! There was also excellent entertainment, and free hors d'oeuvres were available. In the same room were all of the contest entries. About 200 attended, and almost

half were wives or family members of collectors.

THE AUCTION AND THE INTERNET

The auction was smaller and shorter than last year but made up for this in quality. Auctioneer Richard Estes kept things moving efficiently for a little over 3 hours. Sellers paid a 10 percent commission and a 5 percent buy-back fee. The maximum fee was \$75 for any lot, and the minimum bid was \$20.

Registered bidders numbered 166. Of the 192 items crossing the auction block, 166 sold for a total of \$22,020 — more than a third less than last year, not including the Marconi Model 106 that went for \$15,200 in 1998. So total sales dropped significantly, and I believe there is a reason for this — the Internet.

Many collectors and sellers told me of the effect of eBay and the Internet on the buying and selling of old radios. Almost every seller I asked said he was now selling on eBay. He was selling his better stuff this way and was gettling high prices for it. Some sald that what they brought to Michigan was those items that hadn't received a high enough bid on eBay.

Many thought that the future for radio meets looked gloomy, and some thought that the smaller club meets would be especially affected. So clubs had better consider this possibility in planning future meets.

Personally, I find the idea of dealing on the Internet cold and uninteresting. I like to show my stuff off in the contest and exhibits at radio meets. I love socializing with other collectors and feel that collecting radios in isolation via the Internet would take all of the fun out of it.

Then there is the problem of shipping. I can recall shipping a well packed cathedral and having it mishandled and demolished by UPS. As a result I no longer self any radios by mail. The fact that that some of these nice old objects will be ruined during shipment and the total number of antique radio artifacts reduced needs to be taken into consideration.

Of course, Internet sales affect both the flea (Continued on following page)

market and the auction. I compared the Michigan meet auctions for the last three years. In 1997 and 1998, over 300 lots were sold compared to about 200 lots this year. Total sales were about \$35,000 in 1997, \$37,000 in 1998 (plus \$15,200 for the Marconi 106), and about \$23,000 in 1999. In 1997 and 1998, the auction lasted 4½ hours. In 1999 it was 3 hours and 5 minutes. The number of bidders was also reduced about 10 percent this year. This is a very obvious drop in the size of the auction. Was it the result of Internet sales? Probably.

Comparisons of the flea markets are a bit more difficult. I thought there were about as many spaces sold this year, but perhaps there was not quite as much of the nicer pricey stuff available. I'm not sure what the best method is for radio clubs to combat this problem, but I suggest that they con-

sider it in their future meets.

There were two Atwater Kent Model 10 breadboards in good to excellent condition. With tubes, they sold for \$700 and \$850. This seemed a bit low. Rich Estes sold an Atwater Kent 10 at his auction barn last spring for \$1,600.

The two stars of the auction were a blue and white Detrola Model 219 Super Pee Wee and a very unusual trapezoid-shaped Ozarka in beautiful condition. Each sold for an even \$2,000. I always marvel that a small set like the Detrola that was quite low priced when new and had minimum performance can bring such big bucks now just because it looks nice and is unusually small.

Another interesting piece was the very rare Federal 9 2-tube audio amplifier. As a Federal collector, I looked this one over very closely. There was no cabinet, and the chassis seemed too deep. Also the base construction of two aluminum strips didn't seem right. There was both black and red hook-up wire, and the audios and tube sockets were not Federal.

I also noticed that the front panel had been refinished with black enamel paint. It went for \$550, which would be cheap for a good piece. This was an early Model 9 because it had the metal tag ID on the front panel rather than an

engraved name.

Other interesting pieces included a McIntosh Model 240 stereo power amplifier, excellent and working, which brought \$725. A Brook audio amplifier sold for \$275. A Crosley Pup without the tube was stated to be in only fair condition, but I saw no dents, and the base and label were there. (Some paint was missing.) It sold for \$325, which seems about right.

Finally, there was an unusual Dictograph cone speaker in a square wood cabinet. The cone is the shape of two horizontal half cylinders with a B-shaped cross section. Working and in very

good condition, it brought \$275.

The Michigan group really knows how to put on a good meet, and it is as much for the spouses as the collectors. This is the one meet my wife wouldn't miss. With the women's luncheon and the social hour, plus the very large hospitality area under the tent, she loves it. The good Lord willing, we will be there again next year and hope that we can chat with you. Extravaganza 2000, the 15th annual convention, is scheduled for July 7-9, 2000.

Krantz Auction — Part 3 Somerdale, New Jersey — June 26-27, 1999

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

Because auctioning the radio estate of the late Frank Krantz was such a huge operation, we had to divide the report of the first auction in April into Parts 1 and 2. Though the following report is offically of the second auction, we are calling it "Part 3." Once again, Ray Chase has done a yeoman's job of gathering detailed information, somewhat condensed here in that the list largely contains only items that can be identified at least minimally. (Editor)

One still wonders where it all came from. After a 2-day sale in April, radio buyers faced yet another packed 2-day auction, June 26-27, to try to complete the disposal of Frank Krantz's estate. The plan of auctioneers Childers & Smith was the same — a Saturday and Sunday start at 10:00 A.M., a large tent in the backyard, and the "walkaround" selling format due to the spread out nature of the items. There was no catalog this time as there were fewer individual items, with the bulk of the material in box lots or batches.

Auctioneers Harold Smith, Dennis Childers, and Annette Smith tried to group items as best they could, — tubes, parts, test equipment, paper, etc. — and to speed things up by making much of the bidding by "buyer's choice." For example, several tables of boxes of tubes would be designated, and bidding would start on buyer's choice of any box in the group. The buyer could take one or more boxes each at his winning bid price. When a minimum bid of \$5 a box could not be obtained, all remaining boxes were sold as a lot.

The weather in June could not have been more different from that of April. While April was cold and raw, June was hot and stifling with typical New Jersey high humidity. Strong stamina was again the order of the day to cope with the heat under the

tent. The buying crowd was notably much smaller probably due to the weather and to the realization that the cream of the crop had been sold in April. Also they knew that this sale would be almost totally parts, paper and miscellanea.

Again some camera items, as well as some miscellaneous household goods, which I did not record, were included. A separate tool auction, also not recorded, was conducted concurrently in front of the garage on Saturday morning. A few non-Krantz radios were also added to this sale by the auctioneers.

Saturday's sale ended at about 3:00 p.m. due to the heat and to the need to restock the tent for Sunday. Sunday was more of the same, mostly box lots. In the two days, I recorded only about 60 percent of the lots sold because of the difficulty of identifying accurately what was in the box or lot. Obviously there could be (and I'm sure there were) many hidden treasures in some of the lots. Conversely, you could be buying a "pig in a poke," but at the prices paid, that was hardly likely.

At 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, the remaining group of buyers was invited to pull items out of the garage (which was still crammed full) and whatever came out would be auctioned with a minimum opening bid of \$5. This brought out more hidden goodies, some of which were bid up to \$90. Then back to the tent, where requests were taken, and buyers made up their own lots to be auctioned off. Finally, everyone was worn out, and the sale was halted.

Amazingly, there was a good deal of unsold residual material still in the garage, in the basement, and under the tent. But do not wait for a third auction as the remainder was of lesser quality and was probably sold to a dealer as a "clean out" lot.


A final note regarding Frank. Although he had stripped many things for the parts and separated items of a set, he organized them well and tagged almost everything. My experience was that the tags were, by and large, correct, and this gave buyers confidence in the items purchased.

Remember that I did not record all the sales and that a 10 percent buyer's premium must be added to the listed sale price. Numerous box lots are not listed here. All prices have been rounded down to the dollar.

MEET REPORT

Cincinnati Antique Radio Society RadioRama '99 Cincinnati, Ohio — June 25-26, 1999

The Cincinnati Antique Radio Club held its RadioRama '99 at the Signature Inn in Florence, Kentucky, just 10 minutes south of Cincinnati, on June 25-26,1999. With great weather and a great location this was a very nice event. Thursday evening, a hospitality session included homemade cookies and other snacks and offered the opportunity to meet quite a few old friends along with the visitors.

The swap meet had been advertised to start at dawn Friday. I arrived at 6:30 a.m. to find almost everybody already set up and artifacts changing hands. Next year I'll arrive at least 30 minutes earlier. When this club says "dawn," they really mean it!

There were some interesting items offered. Floyd Engels had a fully restored and working RCA Theremin for sale for \$6,000. As far as I know it wasn't sold, but Floyd said one had been sold at a major auction house for about the same amount. The Theremin is a rare 1920s musical, electronic instrument played without touching the instrument. The movement of one hand controls the pitch and the other the volume. A sine wave type tone is produced.

I also saw one of those early Magnavox 2-tube amplifiers for \$500. While I considered whether I

wanted to pay that much, another collector bought it. Floyd found a very clean looking Crosley VI. That is the set in a taller cabinet with horizontal

strips of wood above and below the Bakelite front panel. He thought \$200 was a reasonable price. There was a larger demand here for the newer AC table radios than for the historical early sets like Floyd's Crosley VI.

Every buyer and seller here was wearing a stick-on badge showing that he had paid his registration fee. At other meets I have noticed that many buyers never register and are able to get by without supporting the event. Not here. Two people roamed the flea market and sold tags to all who didn't already have them. Every buyer and seller was tagged. The registration fee was a bargain at \$5 each and the additional \$10 to set up and sell was also very reasonable.

I "shopped" until about 8:00

A.M. when I decided to set up and sell. I am not a dealer and sell only a few times a year. Most of what I had was stuff left over from previous radio meets, but I sold more than I ever did before at any meet.

I think it had a lot to do with my timing. You all have seen how buyers swarm around a new dealer as he unpacks his car and sets up. Well, by 8:00 A.M. almost everybody else was set up so there was a very large crowd around my table as I unloaded the car. Buyers competed with each other to buy my Rider's manuals, AC table models, boxes of new tubes, early French telephones, 01-As, and early 1920s *Padio News* magazines. I didn't sell any novelty transistor sets. Have you noticed that novelty sets are much harder to sell and go for lower prices than they did a few years ago?

One collector was discussing Type 35Z5 power tubes with me and said he had read an article describing how to replace this tube with two diodes. One was used to rectify the B+, and the other to drop the filament voltage in the series filament string. Then I told him the way I had repaired sets with a dead Type 35Z5 during World War II when new replacement tubes were often unavailable. This tube has a tapped filament. One portion is in parallel with the dial light. This

segment is made of lighter material than the other portion which must carry the full current of the series string. When the pllot light burns out, it overloads the portion of the filament in parallel with the pllot light filament so that portion of the 35Z5 filament soon blows too.

My solution under wartime conditions was to place an oversize pilot light in the set. It carried the full filament current, and I found that the set would work fine with only one side of the filament lit. The tap was not in the center of the tube filament, and it was always the smaller segment that blew so most of the filament was still serviceable. You could still try this idea if you don't have a Type 35Z5. It doesn't overload anything.

This meet also included a nice exhibit of pre-war RCA radios. They filled the exhibit room and included all of the early Radiola models as well as many later pre-World War II sets.

A seminar entitled, "Genuine Plastic Radios of the Mid-Century" was also presented. This meeting did not include an auction.

Most interesting was a tour of the Gray History of Wireless Museum. It is said to house one of the most complete collections in the world. The founder, Jack Gray, was born in 1900. He obtained a Commercial Telegraph license in 1917

and then began working as a shipboard wireless operator for the Marconi Company. He started his collection in 1930.

Jack died in 1970 and his collection is now housed at the Crosley Telecommunications Center, 1223 Central Parkway, Cincinnati, Ohio. It is open for visitors weekdays from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. For Information call Charles Stinger (513) 867-0079.

I liked the hotel facilities very much. The rooms were top rate and a good free continental breakfast was provided. I hope to see you there next year!

Carefully write the following numbers and letters (especially in model numbers) since some can look alike; for example 1, I and I (the number one, the capital i and the small L.) Also: 0, 0, 0, Q and D; r and n; 6, b and G; V, U, u, v and Y; A and R; 5, S and s; 2, Z and z. We try to correct spelling errors, so when using an uncommon word or manufacturer which we might mistake as a more common word or manufacturer, note it so that we do not "correct" it. Editor's annotations are in [brackets].

Advertising is accepted only for early items related to radio, communication, etc. All items must be described fairly; reproductions, reprints and not-original items must be so identified. Deadline: NOON ET- 10th of the month!

Classified ads must have a standard heading such as WANTED, FOR SALE, FOR TRADE, FOR SALE/TRADE, SERVICES, MESSAGE, HELP, AUCTION, MEET, etc. This heading is the only bold or all-capitalized words allowed in the ad. Capitalize only manufacturer names, model names, etc. This standard ad format makes scanning the ads easier.

Before writing your ad, please look over the ads in a recent issue of A.R.C., and try to write your ad in the same style. Full name (or company name) and address is <u>required</u> in all classified ads; we will add it if you forget.

To encourage varied content of the ads, the same classified ad may be run only once per issue and for only two consecutive months. (To run an ad longer, use a boxed classified or display ad.)



Ham call letters and business name can be included in the 6 words and do not count extra. Full name (or company name) and address is required in all classified ads. Each additional word, abbreviation, model number or number group, extra telephone numbers, fax, e-mail, etc. count as one word each. Hyphenated words count as two words.
