Such historic times lend themselves to a nistory article, and fortunately, we had one on hand. Ed Ripley has written a history of the AM broadcasting band, tracing its evolution over the years. He tells the story of well-known stations and the changes in technology and regulation that affected them. For anyone who remembers White's Radio Log, this is a must-read.

It may also be a first to have a "couple contribution" in the pages of A.R.C. We were delighted to discover in our files a Christmas photo contributed by Irene Ripley that seemed to fit neatly into husband Ed's article. Perhaps this is another sign of what's to come in our field — more participation by "radio wives."

Added to Ed's look at the past is Ray Bintliff's ook at the future. The article was prompted by Mark Hewitt's letter expressing concern that the world of radio that he knows and loves will be obliterated by digital radio. Ray talks about current digital radio development and offers comfort about the survival of analog technology

With a name like "Dilco," a follow-up is inevitable. A R.C. loves feedback that generates follow-ups. When an article results in feedback — even a seemingly farout idea — we try to pull the information together in a coherent way. In this case, Dick Desjarlais, who wrote

the original article in the October 1999 issue, did the job. The result is that we often learn something quite unexpected, such as the fact that Dilco was in the tube manufacturing business.

Photo Review this month suggests that the print version of A.R.C., like the Internet, can also suggest a wider radio-collecting universe. Represented are the U. S., Canada, Austria, and England. Variety too is evident — a "cube" and a "moon" radio, an exposed-tube radio and an enclosed horn speaker.

Jerry Wieland's restoration article tells how to preserve an original cone speaker, even if the field coil is beyond repair. He describes how to convert it to a permanent magnet speaker.

Two auction reports keep us abreast of auction prices. Rod Mills reports on the auction of a portion of his own collection — 500 items totalling \$15,000. The obvious highlight was the Atwater Kent breadboard Model 10 selling at \$1,045. But, a first must have been the \$577 paid for a near-new Hickok tube tester, proving again that condition counts.

The Houston Vintage Radio Association (HVRA) continues to host outstanding events. In this auction, the Zenith 5S373 console, selling at \$1,300, would normally have been the highlight. However, it was overshadowed by the Philco Predicta No. 4730 "Continental" TV, selling at \$1,700.

Chuck Schwark reviews Ray Bintlift's Philco Condensers and More, an updated version of Ray's familiar Philco Bakelite Block Condensers. Chuck says that the book is excellent and should be a constant companion for restorers of vintage Philco radios.

Radio Miscellanea features feedback to articles, plus Web-related suggestions. Though Shenandoah sounds as if it should be in Virginia, after placing it in Nebraska in the October issue, we have finally placed it correctly in lowa. And we have received welcome empathy for our recent Web-related implementation woes, as well as high praise for our expanded site.

Coming Radio Events. Over 30 events will take place in the month of December. In addition, our "Mark Your Calendar" section lists 30 events for the year 2000. Old radio collecting will apparently be alive and well in the new century. Try to attend a meet in your area — perhaps you'll find the right radio for your winter project.

VINTAGE BROADCASTING

Evolution of the American AM Band A Brief History

The following article seems appropriate for the last issue of the century, since it traces the history of AM-band radio, which has been so much a part of our radio listening pleasure for decades. As we look toward the inevitable development of digital radio, the subject of Ray Bintliff's supplementary article, we're happy to reflect on an aspect of radio's glorious 20th century. (Editor)

Ever wonder how the AM band got to be the way it is, and what it was like back in the early days? Today, in the United States, we have well over 4000 AM stations, operating on 116 frequencies, spaced 10 kHz apart. A good radio can separate, say 1260 from 1270, without any trouble. However, it wasn't always that way, and the early broadcast band went through much upheaval and change before arriving at what we're familiar with today.

One has to remember that radio broadcasting for entertainment evolved from a medium that was generally being used in a service capacity.

The early "wireless" was largely being used for sending messages, mostly in code. Ship communication and wireless telegraphy were the order of the day on the spectrum we now know as the AM band.

EARLY REGULATIONS

When the first pioneer broadcasting stations went on the air in the early 1920s, the Department of Commerce regulated the radio frequencies. So-called "entertainment" stations were allowed to operate on a frequency of 360 meters (roughly 833 kHz). A second frequency of 485 meters (approx. 690 kHz) was set aside for broadcasting crop reports and weather services. Neither the transmitting equipment nor the receivers were capable of operating in a narrow 10 kHz bandwidth, and the early entertainment stations all had to share the same space.

There was some variation within the band, as

stations would sometimes shift their positions a bit when interference became excessive. This meant that listeners would sometimes have to search for their favorite station, and with primitive receiving equipment it could be a challenge. Local stations would take turns or share time on the same frequency. Interference from distant stations was less of a problem in the earliest days because the crystal sets and other primitive receivers weren't all that sensitive. As more sophisticated receiving sets came into wide use, however, the problem of nighttime "skywave" became readily apparent.

EXPANDING THE BROADCAST BAND

What had started out in 1920-1921 as a handful of stations — notably KDKA, Pittsburgh; WJZ, Newark; WWJ, Detroit; and a few others — very quickly became a crowd. A second frequency was added by Commerce Secretary Herbert Hoover in 1922, allowing stations to use 400 meters (approximately 750 kHz). 360 meters was dubbed "Class A" and the new band was known as "Class B," the latter having been envisioned as a band for "better quality" stations. Certain technical requirements had to be met for Class B transmission, and a maximum power of 1000 watts was authorized. Class A stations, in those days, varied in power from as little as 5 watts to as many as 500.

According to Thomas H. White, in his Internet article "Building the Broadcast Band," the number of stations authorized to operate on 360 meters

reached 524 by March, 1923. Once again, the Commerce Department acted to expand the broadcast band, this time assigning all of the space from 550 to 1350 kHz for AM broadcasting. Frequencies were spaced 10 kHz apart, and stations would still be divided into Class A, with a maximum of 500 watts, and Class B with a top operating power of 1000 watts.

Under this plan, none of the stations operating on 360 meters would be forced to change, and could stay on the frequency as "Class C" stations, if they wished. It was hoped that most would voluntarily switch to one of the less congested frequencies.

The band expansion helped relieve the congestion, of course, but with more than 600 stations on the air by the mid-192Cs and with the vastly improved receiving equipment, the situation was hardly any better, especially at night. In 1927 the Federal Radio Commission (FRC) was formed to be a "traffic cop" for the burgeoning radio broadcasting industry. The standard broadcast band was expanded again, this time from 550 to 1500 kHz.

SHARING FREQUENCIES AND PAIRING STATIONS

The FRC had the monumental task of sorting through the "tower of babble," reassigning frequencies and pairing stations to share band space. Many of the early stations were not happy with their new assignments, and in some of the largest cities as many as five stations would share a frequency. In fact, the last of the shared time operations were recently eliminated when three Chicago stations on 1240 kHz were finally combined into one. Those stations — WCRW, WEDC and WSBC — had shared space on the same channel since the 1920s.

Another method of controlling the interference on the AM band was the assigning of "daytime only" radio stations. These stations were allowed to operate only during the sunrise to sunset hours, which of course varied throughout the year. The obvious reason for this type of restriction was the band itself. The so-called "skywave" activity, produced by the ionispheric layer present in the upper atmosphere, causes signals to be deflected back to Earth at night, increasing the amount of potential coverage (not to mention interference) by hundreds or even thousands of miles.

A few of the daytime stations are quite old, and have been operating on that basis since the 1920s. WEW in St. Louis on 770 kHz is just such an example. In recent years, the rules have been relaxed somewhat, and some former daytimers have been able to expand to pre-sunrise hours, meaning that they can get some kind of signal on the air by at least 6:00 A.M. Similarly, post-sunset operation offers daytime stations extended evening operation, and for many of them it means they can operate round-the-clock with reduced power.

BAND DIVISION

In the 1930s, further refinements were made to AM broadcasting. The Federal Radio Commission became the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), with more authority and greater international cooperation, primarily with Canada and Mexico. By then, the band had become divided into three major frequency categories, Clear Channel, Regional and Local. The "clears" were further subdivided into 1A and 1B groups.

A 1A clear could operate at full power, day and night up to 50,000 watts, and was usually the only station on a given frequency, except, perhaps, for a few low-power daytlme stations which may have been licensed to operate in a distant part of the country. Familiar examples of 1A clears are WFAN (formerly WNBC), New York; WLS, Chicago; KFI, Los Angeles; WHO Des Moines; and WCCO Minneapolis-St. Paul.

An article such as this would be remiss if it didn't mention WLW, the 1A clear channel station in Cincinnati, operated by pioneer receiver manufacturer Powel Crosley. Much has been written about WLW (See A.R.C. November 1992), so we will not elaborate too much about it here, except to say it was America's one great experiment with super power on AM.

WLW was given special temporary authority to operate on its clear channel of 700 kHz with a

power of 500,000 watts, an incredible feat for its time. In the mid-1930s this powerhouse was easily heard throughout North America and much of the world by night. Even by day, it was calculated that its ground wave signal reached eastward to Virginia, south to Georgia, west to Iowa, and north well into Canada. Crosley billed it as "The Nation's Station," and kept it running on super power until 1939, when the FCC finally decided that the experiment was over and WLW returned to 50,000 watts.

The station simply caused too much interference to stations on adjacent frequencies, especially 690 kHz, a Canadian clear channel then occupied by CFRB, Toronto. A friend of mine who grew up in Hannibal, Missouri, in the 1930s claimed that one rainy night, he heard WLW coming through the gutters and downspouts of his home, without benefit of a radio, such was the intensity of its signal. In the 1960s, there was a revival of interest in super-power broadcasting, but in the end the FCC rejected the idea. By then, the need for such high-powered stations was virtually nonexistant.

1B clear channel stations could also have up to 50,000 watts, but shared the frequency with a similar station in another part of the U. S. Two present-day examples of 1B sharing are WTOP in Washington, DC, and KSTP in St. Paul, Minnesota, both operating on the same frequency with maximum power, but directionalized at night so their signals do not adversely interfere with one another. Another example is WSAI (once WCKY)

in Cincinnati and station KFBK in Sacramento which co-operate as 50,000 watters on 1530 kHz.

Regional or Class III stations were licensed to coexist on given frequencies, but with maximum power of 1000 watts, and later raised to 5000 watts. An example of a regional channel is 570 kHz where such stalwarts as WMCA, New York; WSYR, Syracuse; WNAX, Yankton, SD; KLAC, Los Angeles; and KVI, Seattle, operate, along with about two dozen other stations. Another example is 1250 kHz where WTAE, Pittsburgh; WDAE, Tampa-St. Petersburg; WEMP, Milwaukee; KTMS, Santa Barbara, California; and WDVA in Danville, Virginia, broadcast along with 60 other stations.

DIRECTIONAL ANTENNA STATIONS

What made the coexistence of so many stations possible was the directional antenna system, which, in turn, was made possible by the development of the "vertical radiator" tower in the early 1930s. AM radio waves travel both by ground and by air. These new antenna systems were more effective for transmitting ground wave signals, which was an advantage in the daytime, but cut down on the "skywave" interference at night. They also made possible the directional antenna

array, allowing signals to be "phased" and sent in certain directions, rather than a circular pattern.

If you have ever seen an AM station that had a multiple number of towers in a row or in a box pattern, you were witnessing a directional antenna. Prior to the 1930s, stations used a horizontal or "flat top" antenna similar to the one pictured on the cover of the 1925 Radio Station Directory (photo, p. 4).

Stations began to utilize directional arrays in the late 1930s. WFLA in Tampa, Florida, was one of the first, if not the very first commercial AM station in the United States to utilize a vertical directional antenna. It was a 3-tower system on the shore of Tampa Bay. In more recent years the station moved the array to a new site several miles away with additional towers and tower height.

LOCAL BROADCAST FREQUENCIES

Still another class of broadcast frequency is the "local." Six frequencies on the AM band were assigned by the FCC for this service. They were originally 1200, 1210, 1310, 1370, 1420 and 1500. Maximum operating power was 100 watts, day and night. Primarily, stations on these channels were designed to service their local city of license, and many of them were in smaller towns.

However, more than a few big city stations were "locals" which posed a big restriction, even back then. Today, two examples of local channel stations in large cities are KYPA (formerly KGFJ), Los Angeles and WALR, Atlanta. The latter has operated under a variety of call letters over the years including WATL, WAKE, and WIGO.

Maximum power for the "locals" was later raised to 250 watts. In the late 1950s, another raise gave these stations 1000 watts by day. Finally, in the 1980s, the FCC allowed the Class IV locals to operate at a maximum 1000 watts day and night. In most instances these stations were, and still are, nondirectional.

Today, there are approximately 165 stations operating on each of the six local channels, making the interference level very intense. Even with 1000 watts, these stations, for the most part, are only effective to about 25 or 30 miles by day and as little as 10 to 15 miles at night. The six local channels today are 1230, 1240,1340, 1400, 1450 and 1490.

FREQUENCY SHIFTS — 1940–1980s

Many of the stations listed in old radio logs were operating on different frequencies from where they broadcast today. In part, this is because of the big frequency shift of 1941. As a result

of treaty agreements with the U.S., Canada, Mexico, and parts of the Caribbean, further realignment took place just before World War II. Lower band stations (540-750 kHz) largely stayed put, but mid- and upper-band stations shifted frequencies. For instance, clear-channel WCCO in Minneapolis-St. Paul went from 810 to its present 830 kHz. Similarly, WLS in Chicago went from 870 to 890, and so on.

Many of the upper band AM stations made a 30 kHz shift. A typical example is WDCW, (the former WFBL) in Syracuse, New York, a station I remember from my own childhood. It shifted from 1360 to 1390 kHz, where it remains today. Also, during this same period, the AM band was expanded to 1600 kHz, allowing for 10 new clear channel and regional frequencies.

During the 1960s, broadcasters began to argue for expanded use of the 1A clear channels. They reasoned that there was no longer a necessity for a station to serve most of the United States. With the proliferation of both AM and FM stations, virtually every part of the country could listen to stations broadcasting from their own

local areas. Over the next two decades the rules would be relaxed, and by the early 1980s the clear channel frequencies were being shared both day and night by other broadcasters.

The original 1A clear channel stations would remain as 50,000 watt nondirectional operations, but stations in distant parts of the country could now operate directionally on the 1A clear frequencies. WCTS in Maplewood, Minnesota, is a typical example. It operates on 1030 kHz, with 50,000 watts by day and 1000 watts at night, protecting the original occupant of the channel, WBZ in Boston, after dark.

In the 1970s and 1980s the AM band went through some tough times. FM had languished for more than a generation, due in part to the public's fascination with television. Also, the personal and legal struggles between RCA head. General David Sarnoff, and FM inventer, Edwin Armstrong, have to be listed as part of the reason

for FM remaining on the sidelines.

Sarnoff pushed ahead with RCA's development of television in the late 1930s and 1940s at the very same time that Armstrong was trying to bring FM into commercial viability. In the 1960s FM finally began to come into its own with its inherent lack of static and interference and the easy ability to broadcast in stereo. The once dominant AM band eventually found itself with only about 25 percent of the audience.

AM IN THE PRESENT

However, there is renewed interest today in AM radio. The FCC has recently expanded the band to 1700 kHz. If you have a late model car, you may already have discovered this extra bit of spectrum space on your car radio. A number of disadvantaged stations — daytimers, stations with extremely limited signals or very high interference levels — have been given the option of applying for one of the new upper-band channels. Each will operate with a daytime power of 10,000 watts, reducing to 1000 watts at night, nondirectional.

A station in Elizabeth, New Jersey, was the first to go on the new space and can be heard nights on 1660 kHz over much of eastern North America. I have personally heard the station in Florida and Minnesota. Other stations have recently begun operating on the new AM space,

and more are forthcoming. Many antique radios can pick up this expanded band. Back in the 1930s the so-called "police band" included the 1600-1700 kHz space, and a lot of the old AM dials were able to tune up to 1700 or even 1800 kHz

Another improvement for some AM stations is the FCC rule which no longer limits regional stations to 5000 watts. Some of the oldtimers, such as WTMJ, 620 kHz, in Milwaukee, have been able to increase to 50,000 watts by day. Others such as KFWB in Los Angeles and WFLA, Tampa-St. Petersburg, also have applied for higher wattage and may already be operating with it by the time you read this. The old power parameters no longer apply. In the past, a regional station in the U. S. had to be 500, 1000, 2500 or 5000 watts. Now, power increases will be governed by how much will fit and still keep the station within legal interference tolerances. A station might have 6600 watts by day and 4350 by night, or whatever.

Then, there is AM stereo. It hasn't caught on with the public to any appreciable extent, and rela-

tively few receivers are equipped to receive it. However, a number of AM stations broadcast in stereo, and it may become a factor in

the future.

So, with the expanded frequencies and the general revitalization going on, AM is alive and well. While the days of AM dominance are long gone, the prognosis for the future looks good. There should be plenty to listen to on the AM band for a long time to come.

Digital Radio The Winds of Change are Blowing

The phase-out of analog technology in favor of digital applications is widespread. In this article, we share information provided by A.R.C. reader Mark Hewitt that describes the potential impact of digital technology on AM and FM broadcasting. (Editor)

The longevity and success of AM radio is truly impressive. Similarly, FM radio, although a newer mode of broadcasting, has been around since the 1940s. Of course FM did get an upgrade to stereo, but the technology remains pretty much the same.

Why has analog radio survived for so long while other electronic media have had shorter life spans? Probably because it works well and because of the great number of radios in use around the world. The sheer number of black and white TV sets in use was a strong incentive for developing a color TV system that was compatible with the black and white transmissions. Likewise, any new AM and FM technology will have to be compatible with existing radios.

Just as black and white TV was replaced by color TV, digital TV and High Definition TV may soon make analog TV outmoded. Perhaps the most dramatic changes have occurred in the field of sound reproduction. The 78 rpm record was made obsolete by the long playing 33½ rpm record. The LP was, in turn, replaced by audio tape cassettes. Now, digital CDs are the predominant audio medium. With technical advances driving the consumer entertainment market how much longer can analog radio survive?

A LOOK AT THE FUTURE

An article in USA Today predicts that a smooth transition from analog radio to an all-digital system may take 15 to 25 years. However, the use of a technology called "In-Band On-Channel" (IBOC) will enable broadcasters to transmit digital signals along with standard AM and FM signals and thus ease the transition from analog to all-digital radio.

So, IBOC will offer the best of both worlds. It will allow owners of existing radios to continue to listen to their analog sets and enable the "techies" to savor the new digital transmissions. The use of digital technology promises static-free AM radio with "near-FM quality" while FM transmissions could achieve "CD-quality."

Keep in mind that IBOC is not yet a reality. The FCC has yet to establish standards for IBOC, and a number of manufacturers are still testing systems and radios. It is estimated that a digital radio may cost \$75 to \$100 more than a current analog model. Prototype digital radios could be out by late 2000 —

perhaps an optimistic estimate.

An article in the September 5, 1999, edition of the Rockford, Illinois, *Rockford Register-Stara*lso covers the matter of digital radio. The article reports that a compatible system is 12 to 18 months away. Again, this estimate may be optimistic.

In addition to improved sound quality and greater immunity from static, digital radio could provide real-time data such as traffic, weather, and stock market reports, as well as emergency announcements to both hand-held computing devices and radios.

In his letter, Mark Hewitt said, "I hope that modern technology doesn't ruin my little world of radio collecting." To Mark and other collectors, I say do not despair. The demise of analog radio is not likely to occur for quite some time. If and when it does, an AM broadcast unit can always transmit programs from recordings to old radios.

Consider the technical and financial aspects of the switch to digital radio. The FCC and the radio industry must establish standards for digital radio. Prototype and production radios must be produced. Not only will digital radios cost more, but broadcasters must invest in new equipment with cost estimates reaching as high as \$200,000 per station.

No doubt these obstacles will be overcome eventually and all-digital radio will become a reality. But in the meantime, enjoy those great old analog radios.

If we consider how past technological changes have affected our hobby, things don't look so bad. Sure, color TV is almost universal, but black and white sets are still collectible. In the Amateur Radio world, single sideband (SSB) has become the most popular method of voice transmission, but AM communication receivers are still hot collector items.

On the bright side, the phase-out of analog radio may underline the importance of preserving examples of this venerable technology.

"Dilco Who?" Follow-up

This follow-up to Dick Desjarlais' article on Dilco in the August 1999 A.R.C. demonstrates once again what A.R.C. is all about — the exchange of information. The more of that we do, the more we learn about radio history. (Editor)

In my Dilco article in the August 1999 issue of A.R.C., I requested reader assistance in learning more about this unique early 1930s cathedral radio. True to A.R.C. form, I have received four responses to date. Some of the comments are quite similar, but varying observations, speculations, and facts have made this compilation an enlightening and fun experience.

The first reader to respond was Scott McCleskey, an engineer for General Motors in Detroit, Michigan, and an active member of several antique radio clubs. Scott, and incidentally all four responders, identified the set as a Tom Thumb Automatic, manufactured by Automatic Radio Mfg. Co. Inc., Boston, Massachusetts.




Figure 1. Front view of Scott McClesky's Automatic Tom Thumb.




Figure 6 (left) and Figure 7 (right). These photos of Dick Desjarlais' Dilco appeared as Figures 2 and 3 in his article "Dilco Who?" in the August 1999 A.R.C. Compare the escutcheons and Rola speaker sections of Dick's set with Scott McCleskey's set in Figures 1 and 2 of this article.

Figures 1 and 2 show the front and rear of Scott's Automatic Tom Thumb. Note the differences in the shape of the escutcheon and the style of the knobs when comparing his set in Figure 1, with my set in Figure 6 at the end of this article. My

escutcheon is rectangular with rounded top and bottom and is held with two round-head screws, while Scott's Dilco has a slightly triangular escutcheon held with three wood screws. The knobs on my Dilco have three "spokes" emanating from the centers, while Scott's set has plain center knobs with ridges at the outer edges.

While on the phone with Scott one day, I removed the escutcheon on my set. I wanted to see if the Automatic Tom Thumb escutcheon that he and the others had described had been removed and replaced with the Dilco escutcheon. Not so. There was no evidence of other nail or screw holes, or outline of a previous escutcheon plate.

When the rear view of Scott's set in Figure 2 is compared with the rear cabinet view of my set in Figure 7 at the end of this article, the upside-down Rola speaker, the speaker baffle and the extra long speaker wires look to be the same. This might blow the theory that the shield pan was deformed to accommodate a nonoriginal speaker baffle. So why was the speaker so obviously bent out of shape?

Perhaps Scott has the right answer when he says, "Probably this was done some time ago when the grille cloth was replaced, and the speaker assembly was not properly reinstalled... causing the speaker to be down too far to push the chassis in. So some lame brain technician crushed the

chassis shield down so he wouldn't have to repair the radio the correct way!" Another possibility is that the loosely placed board on the floor of the cabinet caused the chassis to be too high for the speaker.

In the radio that he since has sold, Scott observed that original appearing, reamed holes were drilled through the cabinet baseboard to accom-

modate chassis shock mounts. There are no such shock mounts or reamed holes in the Dlico.

However, Dale Davenport of Fort Smith, Arkansas, surmises that the honoriginal board slipped underneath the chassis could be a replacement for some type of missing shock mountings.

Dale thought that the chassls is likely to be original to this cabinet, as it fits side-to-side and front-to-back very nicely, and the shaft holes and escutcheon line up quite well. Dale and Scott agree that it is quite common to find the crude chamfering on the back of the shaft holes. This allows for correct shaft length extending through the face of the cabinet.

In answer to a question by Dale, there is evidence of a mounted "can" type filter capacitor having been located (and removed) just in back of the power transformer. Regarding the dual 20 mFd tubular filter capacitor so shoddily installed, and observing that the original capacitor

Fathauer. was probably dual 8 mFd, Dale comments that "most old service guys don't seem to have gotten too excited about capacitor values being somewhat excessive." As an added note, the power transformer may not be original, as it appears overly large and not well suited to the available space.

Dale reported other sightings, such as seeing an Aztec or Atchison set with nearly the same cabinet front. As was the custom in the early days of the radio industry, it is probable that the "Dilco" radio was manufactured by Automatic for Dilco and other distributors.

As mentioned earlier, Scott sold his Automatic Tom Thumb after restoring it. He regrets selling it because it is the only one he has ever seen. But, this radio-collecting hobby can sometimes take some fortuitous turns. Scott sold his set to none other than George A. Fathauer, who with his father, George H. Fathauer, formerly owned Antique Electronic Supply in Tempe, Arizona.

George has shared some very helpful information about the trade name "Dilco," as evidenced in the Dilco Radio Corporation vacuum tube ad shown in Figure 3. At least we know that Dilco actually manufactured radio tubes! Further proof of that is George's photo of a Type 227 Dilco radio vacuum tube carton shown in Figure 4. This photo also appears on page 35 of his recently published book, Radio Tubes and Boxes of the 1920's.

George also provided the November 1930 Radio News magazine ad in Figure 5, showing the new Tom Thumb Midget radio by Automatic. It is clear from this ad that the knobs on my set are not original. The knobs for Scott's set, however, as shown in the front view of Figure 1, are a perfect match to those in the Radio News ad.

Jeff Gardner of Gloversville, New York, also read the Dilco article with interest, and observed that a cathedral radio with an identical cabinet is pictured on page 73 of Mark Stern's *Machine Age U. He* says, "If you switch the escutcheon and the knobs, this set is a dead ringer."

Incidentally, while at the famed antique flea market in Brimfield, Mass., in early September, I actually came upon another Automatic set! Unfortunately, the cabinet was a basketcase, and the chassis had serious modifications. I decided not to buy it, but, of course, I've had second thoughts since. Just think, I could have had a live (well, almost live) Automatic Tom Thumb to compare face-to-face with my Dilco.



INTERNET

To Web or Not to WebTV — Part 5 (If I can do it, you can do it)

The first four parts of this series on my introduction to WebTV concentrated on purchasing and setting up the necessary equipment and getting acquainted with the wireless keyboard. After that was done, the major goal was to learn how to use e-mail. Now it's time for me to venture into more uncharted territory — the Internet. WebTV gives access to the Internet through the use of an Internet terminal and a wireless keyboard. Your TV screen takes the place of a monitor.

When I opened the carton containing the Sony WebTV Plus Internet terminal, I discovered an unexpected bonus. Sony had provided a 394-page softcover WebTV Special Edition titled What's on the Web. This book is glowingly billed as "Your Indispensable Guide to Thousands of Useful and Exciting Business, Professional, Personal, Technical and Social Places Along the Internet's World Wide Web."

Well, that seemed to cover a massive territory! My first thought was, why would I want to access such a broad spectrum of information? My second thought was, even if I desired such access, how would I retrieve it all?

WHAT'S ON THE WEB

Most of the pages in What's on the Web are devoted to a brief description of hundreds of Web sites, plus a 35-page Web subject finder. This is fine for someone who knows which buttons to press and what techniques to use to reach these Web sites. Needing a starting point, I began with the introductory section, studiously highlighting salient points.

A handy glossary provided definitions for Web jargon, including Web site (Web page or home page); links (words or groups of words which are highlighted on Web pages); search engines (ways to find the sites you are looking for); and URL (universal resource locator), which indicates a Web site's exact address or location on the Web.

If I had my own Web site, (which I don't, yet!) my URL or Web site address could look like this: http://www.desjavu.net. In order to go to a Web site, you must type the URL exactly as it appears, upper and lower case letters included.

Although the glossary was informative, what really caught my eye was this statement: "You can reach all the Web sites covered in this guide on your Sony TV Internet terminal through our own Web site — JumpCity — simply by entering the 4- or 5-digit Jump Codes we've assigned to each Web site we've reviewed here."

JUMPCITY

More study revealed that I could short-circuit the use of URLs for each Web site I wanted by using What's on the Web and the companion Web site, JumpCity. This supposedly makes it more convenient

to "jump" right to the Web site you are looking for without each time having to type the sometimes confusing URL.

After a little practice, and as a novice on the Internet, I found this feature to be only marginally useful. It requires moving the wireless keyboard cursor arrow buttons to "Favorites" and pressing the return button. There is a built-in JumpCity icon in the Sony "Favorites" folder. Once you select this icon you are linked to JumpCity.

After highlighting and pressing JumpCity, you must enter the 4- or 5-digit code for the Jump site you want to visit. For example, the code number for Sony's site on the Web is "Jump 4027." Pressing this code number automatically links to the Sony Web site. To jump to another site, you go back to JumpCity by pressing "Back" or "Recent."

Browsing through other sites, for example, I found the Museum of Television under Jump Code 0220. This site turned out to be a Canadian-based TV History Museum, promoting a television education conference to be held in Toronto in the year 2000.

Looking further into the Web Index/Finder, I spotted a search engine listed as "Yahoo! — A Guide to WWW." Curiosity got the best of me, since I had heard this weird term before. So I entered the Jump code 0043. At this point I didn't know Yahoo!'s URL, or any others, for that matter. In this, my first effort at accessing a search engine, the JumpCity code system did prove helpful. Looking at the Yahoo! home page, I highlighted "Classifieds," thinking I could easily find references to antique radios, including, of course, A.R.C.

This led me to the antiques link and a new page showing antique collectors under "Community." Somehow, I had lost the trail for classifieds, but I forged ahead and pressed the antique collector's link. This led me to auctions, which I thought I would save for another day.

Since I felt I was getting nowhere — at least nowhere I wanted to go — I pressed "help." I was directed in this way to another search engine called "AltaVista at Jump 8025." Using the search bar, I typed in "antique radios" and then pressed "search," which was in small type under the bar.

Disappointed, I saw absolutely no reference to antique radios. But some instinct prompted me to press the scroll-down button. How obvious! But not to a novice! Lo and behold, I was immediately informed there were 2,285 Web pages for antique radios. I decided this would be a good place to practice surfing.


SURFING

What fun! There were twenty different antique radio Web sites listed in AltaVista, each with its own link to specific topics. This was indeed a new world for me. I

decided to try the first site listed, "Classic Antique Radios and Television." Pressing the bar, I found Don Hauff's home page and pressed the links for E.H. Scott, McMurdo Silver, Scanning Disc TVs and Electronic TVs. Given his note that "This home page is still under construction," I was not surprised to find only two or three classics under Scott and McMurdo Silver, and no entries for TVs.

Skipping to Rod's Classic and Antique radios, I used the link for selected radios in the 1920s, and noted 15 hard-to-find sets just in that era. The photos were fine, especially when enlarged. I began to realize that I could spend multihours just scanning this and other collections in the AltaVista search engine alone! But that could come later.

For now, I was just trying to get a "feel" for a few Web sites that are available in What's on the Web.

Unfortunately, what was not in JumpCity's Index/ Finder was A.R.C.'s Web site!

Even though I could easily have accessed the A.R.C. Web site with the A.R.C. URL (www.antiqueradio.com), I thought I'd do a search for antique radio publications and access the A.R.C. Web site that way. Wow! AltaVista found 4,598,335 pages! I began to realize how much I had to learn about using carefully selected key words to get the right results.

NARROWING THE FIELD

Following John Terrey's suggestion, I tried putting a (+) sign before "antique radios" to try to narrow the field, and I came up with 87,700 Web pages. Quite a reduction from over 4.5 million! This was getting interesting! Next, I tried a (+) sign before and after "antique radios." Same number — 87,700.

I tried putting "antique radios" in quotes, pressing the edit button to correct a typo in the bar. Amazing! The number of Web pages was now reduced to 4,015. Now I was noticing familiar territory in Web sites like Harry Poster's Vintage TV's and Radios, the New England Antique Radio Club, Antique Radio Classified: Book Review, and Antique Radio Classified: Collector Books.

What if I put a (+) sign before the quotes; would that reduce the number even further? Still 4,115. But when I put the (+) sign before and after the quotes, the number was surprisingly reduced to 2,289 pages! Well, why not one more experiment. How about putting the (+) signs inside the quotes? Still 2,289. But, now I know

that this little experiment will stand me in good stead as

The Sony publication What's on the Web was certainly not intended to be a complete listing of WebTV sites. For example, since it does not include the A.R.C. Web site, there is no convenient JumpCity code number with which to gain access. However, no problem, because I now know A.R.C.'s URL (www.antiqueradio.com) by heart. In this and similar instances where the URL is already known, I learned there is no need to use either "JumpCity" or "Search." Using my wireless keyboard, I simply press "Options," and then "Go To," type the known URL in the address bar, and press "Go To Page."

THE VALUE OF A.R.C. "LINKS"

There are many informative features of A.R.C.'s

Web site available to WebTVers, as well as to the experienced computer person. My favorite page is "Links." There, in addition to many Web sites of radio collectors, I found two Web sites for the AWA (Antique Wireless Association). The first is a history and introduction to AWA. The second is for the Old Timer's Bulletin, the official AWA journal.

Referencing that publication, I found that the November 1998 issue featured a new column edited by Chuck Schwark, titled "Getting Acquainted With the Internet." This first column included a brief description and history of the Internet, a helpful glossary of Internet terms, plus a list of "services" available on the Internet. In the February 1999 issue, Chuck's column, now aptly called "On the Internet," concentrates on basic hardware and software requirements for connecting to the Internet by computer.

This section does not apply to those of us who have chosen or may be choosing WebTV to get online. However, the continued glossary of Internet terms and the listing of antique radio Web sites is of interest. The May 1999 issue focuses on a definition of search engines. In addition to useful tips on narrowing the search for sites, a list of suggested URLs is included.

In Part 6, the conclusion of this series on WebTV, I will recap (pardon the pun), the various features of WebTV Plus, and expand upon my further adventures in utilizing what e-mail and the Web have to offer.

Surfing the Web with A.R.C.!

While at the Rochester AWA meet this past September, I was given the opportunity to preview an early version of the new A.R.C. Web site under development. It was evident that the A.R.C. staff had put a lot of thought and work into the new site. I recently got another opportunity to review their progress. The Web site has certainly taken shape and should be online by the time you get this!

The first thing you will notice is a new look that is fairly simple to use. Down the left side of the page are section headings to common points in the Web site that you might want to visit. Most of these you will immediately recognize. This "navigation bar," as it is sometimes called, allows you to jump quickly to common places on the Web from anywhere on the site. You can then use the "Back" button in your browser to return to where you were.

NEW SECTIONS

Two new sections of the Web pages are "Classified Ads" and "Auction Prices." When you go to "Classified Ads," you will need the "log-on ID" (your sub number) and the "password" from your mailing label. If you get your copy by First Class mail, this is on the envelope. so don't throw it away! Simply key in the 1- to 5-digit log-on ID and the 4-digit password in square brackets on your label, and you are there!

The "Classified Ads" section is quite versatile, allowing you to view the ads as in the magazine, but also to search through all of the ads for certain items. This

search capability does take some time, so it is not the way you would normally browse the ads. Fortunately, A.R.C. thought of that and provided some categories such as "For Sale," "Wanted," "Message," etc., just as they are in the magazine.

To access a particular category, click on the heading, and you will be given the ads for that section of the classifieds in groups of 10 ads per page. If you see an ad that you may want to respond to, you can print the page from your browser by hitting the "Print" button. There are "Next," "Previous," "First" and

"Last" buttons to help you move around the section.

SEARCH CAPABILITY

There is also a "Search" capability. From the "Classified Ads" home page, click on the search link to get to the "Search" page. The next thing that you do is to select the section of the classifieds you want to search. You can select "All," but if you are looking for a particular "Wanted" ad - for example, for a Midwest radio it is faster to search only the "Wanted" section. Then, you will need to enter the "Search" keywords. This search is very much like those used in many other Web sites, and if you are a veteran Web surfer, everything will be obvious.

If you are not familiar with Web surfing, just specify a word or two that would find what you want. The general "Search" will try to find only ads that have the 18 words you use in the exact order you type them in. For example, if I were interested in finding 6L6G tubes. I might enter "6L6G tube" into the search box, and press the "Search" button, However, unless both words are adjacent in the ad and in that order, I will miss some ads.

The idea is to find as unique a keyword or phrase that will get you what you are looking for without missing something that is important. In this case, since 6L6G is most likely used as a tube number anyway. I would not add the word "tube" to the search.

Another thing to note is that the "Search" will look for all types of capitalization of the keyword(s) that you use. Therefore, "Midwest," "MidWest," and "MIDWEST" will all yield the same results!

It may seem that there are a lot of things to remember when using "Search," but once you use it, you will feel like an old pro in no time! For those who really want to get fancy, there is even an "Advanced Search" capability, but the description of that is beyond the scope of this article. There is help available on the Web site, and it includes examples to assist you.

AUCTION PRICES

Well, now that we have had a quick look at the "Classified Ads" section, we can use some of what we have learned to access the "Auction Prices" section. since that is driven by the "Search" also.

Clicking on the "Auction Prices" button on the A.R.C. home page on the left navigation bar brings us to the

"Search" page for auctions. The search here works just like the search in "Classified Ads." Try to use a single word that is unique enough to get you just what you want. I tried "Midwest" and found eleven items. Imagine what I would find with a word like "radio."

The results of a search are displayed 10 items per page and include the item, the venue (club/auctioneer), and the price. To get the information on a venue, such as in what issue of A.R.C. the full report can be found, search for the keyword "Venue."

There are currently no photos in either the "Classified Ads" or the "Auction Prices" sections, but I am told that they will be coming for the classified ads.

As always, there are a few small things that I would like to see in the future:

· A bit more help on the search pages to explain how to use multiple words in a search.

- Dates in the "Classified Ads" and the "Auction Prices" sections to include an issue date. [Currently, the date in the classified ads is the deadline date e.g., December ads are dated 11/10/99. For auctions, the "Venue" search will list the venues, and the issue in which the auction was reported.]
- E-mail addresses and Web site addresses as hyperlinks, so that you could just click on them to send a message, or view a Web site.

There is a lot to see and do at the new Antique Radio Classified Web site, so I would encourage you

to check it out!

Over a two week period alone (October 15 to November 1 this year), page requests averaged 1,340 per day — which works out to over 40,000 page requests a month!

Equally impressive is the worldwide interest reflected in the list of more than 60 countries represented — from Asia and the Middle East (Japan, Israel, the United Arab Emirates, etc.) to Europe (Russia, United Kingdom, Portugal, Bulgaria, etc.), South America (Argentina, Venezuela, Costa Rica, etc.), and, of course, North America (the U. S. and

Canada). This worldwide interest is good news for the radio-collecting community.

THE ATTRACTIONS

What is it that attracts these visitors to our site? The answer appears to be the storehouse of information there offered free to everyone. After the home page itself, the most frequent requests go to 1) Marketplace — subscription renewals, book purchases, and free sample requests are made easy; 2) Links — over 250 Web sites may be accessed; 3) Radio Photo Gallery — an area we hope to expand significantly in the future, and to which we want to provide a search capability; 4) Events — the "Events Calendar." All of these features are updated monthly. Also frequently accessed is the Radio Club List, always available on the Web site but printed only once or twice a year in the magazine.

These features have been offered since 1995, but on our newly designed home page, they are easier to access. Mills Auction Charlottesville, Virginia — Sept. 26, 1999

The aftermath of Hurricane Floyd posed no problems for the large antique radio auction held September 18, 1999, in Charlottesville, Virginia, at Dill's Auction House. This part of central Virginia had minimal effects from the storm. About 80 active bidders showed up to bid on the 350 radios and 150 related items from my 12-year collection. Among the bidders, about 10 states were represented, including Minnesota, Connecticut, New Jersey, Tennessee, and all states adjacent to Virginia. Total sales exceeded \$15,000.

The highlight of the auction was the sale of an Atwater Kent Model 10 breadboard for \$1,045. Other notable sales were a near-new Hickok 539C transconductance tube tester for \$577, a MacIntosh monaural amplifier with WE tubes for \$522, an RCA Radiola RAE-59 radio/phono console for \$269, a Philco 90 cathedral for \$412, a Zenith A-600 Trans-Oceanic with leather case for \$209, a set of three large demonstration breadboards (receiver, transmitter, & power supply) for \$143, and a Saal hom speaker for \$110.

All cathedral and tombstone radios sold well. Very little interest was shown in transistor radios. Old monaural amplifiers did well, probably because of their tubes or transformers. The interest in test equipment, such as signal generators, scopes, and meters, was mixed but not very great. A single homemade crystal radio sold for only \$5.50. Microphones sold well.

All the following prices are rounded down to the nearest dollar.

As the owner of all the auctioned items, I was pleased that I finally would be able to get my cars back into their garages. An electronic engineer, I retired from NASA Headquarters in 1988 where I was a program manager for several planetary





Electro-Dynamic to Permanent Magnetic Speaker Conversion

While restoring a Stewart-Warner 953 console, I came across a problem that I had never encountered before. Although the speaker appeared to be in perfect condition, the field coil was open. I was able to disassemble the speaker until the coil was visible. Although I found one winding break quickly, repairing it did not solve the problem. I finally gave up trying to find another break in the thousand turns remaining.

I had a number of options at this point:

1. Advertise in A.R.C. for an exact replacement speaker.

2. Find a replacement field coil.

3. Replace this speaker with a permanent mag-

4. Replace this speaker with another electrodynamic type.

I tried a permanent magnetic speaker, and it worked, but mounting it would require some cabinet modifications. Since my original speaker was in good condition, I wanted a solution that allowed me to use my original. I decided to try a conversion to a permanent magnet type.

THE CONVERSION PROCESS

First, I removed the 1-inch diameter steel rod that directed the field coil flux into the voice coil area. In the now vacant hole in the voice coil windings. I experimented by inserting magnets that I had found around the house. Most were flat bar magnets that fit in the voice coil cylinder so I

could vary the position around the voice coil while tuned to a station on the now working 953 chassis. I found that the speaker volume would increase to a point as the magnet was inserted, but then would decrease when inserted further. Stronger magnets yielded more volume.

The strongest magnet I found would lift a 5-pound weight, though it was only 1.5" long x 1" wide x 0.38" high. Since it would not fit into the 1" diameter voice coil cylinder, I tried mounting a steel bolt to the center and inserting this bolt into the hole. This directed the magnetic flux into the hole and proved to work well.




Figure 1. The bolt and magnet attached to the speaker.

I superglued the bolt to the magnet and added some hot melt glue to the hole in the bolt to further anchor it to the magnet. I then positioned the bolt in the center of the voice coil cylinder and hot-melt glued the magnet to the speaker frame, as shown in Figure 1. The bolt protrudes about 0.5" into the voice coil.

When I reassembled the field coil cover, the speaker looked original from the rear. The audio quality is very good, and this modification didn't

cost me anything but time.

Usually the field coil is in series with the Bvoltage power supply. When the field coil is eliminated, it must be replaced with an equivalent choke or resistor. In the Model 953, however, this coil is in a shunt circuit to ground. It can be eliminated without replacement. As a safety precaution, I disconnected the high voltage lead in the radio to the field coil because this terminal was exposed on the speaker frame.

I hope this article encourages others to salvage old speakers with open field coils rather than replace them. Some experimentation with magnet strengths and orientation will be necessary, but the results are worth the effort.

Philco Condensers and More by Ray Bintliff, W1RY



This expanded update to Ray Bintliff's original 1994 publication, The Radio Collector's Guide to Philco Bakelite Block Condensers, will be a welcome addition to anyone's service and repair library. In this brand new 1999 edition, Ray has not only updated the Bakelite block section, but also added two new sections dealing with other Philco condensers most often found during restorations metal-cased condensers and Philco tone-control assemblies.


The original Bakelite block book, now Chapters 1 and 2, has updated information regarding the different Bakelite block types. It also has an expanded section on rebuilding these unique

radio components. Included in the rebuilding are safety tips for removing the old tar-impregnated contents and pictures, as well as descriptions of tools Ray uses to make the job much easier.

The original pictorial section and part number listings have been condensed (pun intended) into a more readable format for finding the correct terminal layouts and condenser values. The original edition required flipping back and forth between the diagrams and the parts listing tables.

Now the part values are printed right along with the Bakelite block pictorials. As a result, the number of pictorials has increased, making identification of any Bakelite block condenser a snap.

metal-cased condenser is the subect of Chapter 3 and covers the three most encountered often types. As with the Bakelite block section, there is a parts listing, as well as pictorial diagrams for these components. Some omissions in the listing are due to incomplete or unconfirmed information on a few types. Philco was notorious for not organizing this type of service information. Where known, color codes for

the wire leads are shown in the diagrams.

In Chapter 4, Ray goes into great detail on Philco tone controls, which are a combination of multiposition mechanical switches with embedded condensers, similar to Bakelite blocks. The information provided on the construction and electrical connections of these units is carefully detailed. Ray also provides simplified schematic diagrams for typical tone-control circuits taken from Philco service bulletins. There are 28 pictorial diagrams for the various tone controls.

Philco never put this type of service information into any kind of booklet or engineering bulletin, and this publication is a valuable resource to fill the gap. This is an excellent book that will be a constant companion for the collector and restorer working on vintage 1930s Philco radios.

Philco Condensers and More, first edition, 1999, is available in a softbound, 68-page, 81/2" x 11" format with 300 illustrations. Priced at \$14.95, it may be ordered from Antique Radio Classified. Please check with A.R.C. for ordering and shipping information.

Each additional word, abbreviation, model number or number group, extra telephone numbers, fax, e-mail, etc. count as one word each. Hyphenated words count as two words.
