Since artwork is reduced to 63% in the printing process, originals must be the artwork size listed below. Do not send in artwork on art board or send negatives. ON THE COVER

This month's cover is from the Golden-Leutz, Inc. catalog of new models for 1927. The 76-page catalog is the basis for Ray Bintliff's addendum to our lead article on Kitchel's Universal Trans-Oceanic set.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Leutz Universal Trans-Oceanic Type L-6 One-of-a-Kind Console Version

Radio treasures show up almost anywhere. Certainly Robert Kitchel has found a rare one, and so large that it would be difficult to hide even in a "shanty" in rural New Hampshire. Robert concluded that to examine the insides of his formidable set would be too difficult at this time, so Ray Bintliff has added information based on the Golden-Leutz catalog pictured on our cover. (Editor)




Figure 1. The multiunit Leutz Model L-6 in its massive cabinet shown here with the front cover lid closed.

While recently traveling in New Hampshire, I discovered a unique piece of radio history in an old shanty between Whitfield and Lancaster. It is a 65" long, 8-legged console radio manufactured by C.R. Leutz, Inc. of Altoona, Pennsylvania. It is shown with the front cover lid closed in Figure 1 and open in

Figure 2. The Bakelite nameplate identifies it as the "Universal Trans-Oceanic Type L-6, Serial Number X-87." Weighing about 250 pounds, the set has a solid mahogany cabinet, which is 43" high and 24" deep.

The center section of the lower cabinet contains the speaker. The upper section consists of five metal radio panels, each connected by metal binding post straps. The first panel at the far left is shown in Figure 3. Unlike some of the other

panels, it lacks identification.

This panel includes a rotary on/off switch above the two vernier tuning dials. These two tuning dials are marked "Selector 1" and "Selector 2." They are calibrated from 0 to 100. A toggle switch marked "On/Off" is mounted below the tuning knobs. The two controls located near the bottom of the panel are marked "Antenna" and "RF Bias."

The second panel from the left, shown in Figure 4, is identified as containing the "First RF




Figure 2. The Leutz Model L-6 shown here with the front cover lid pulled down in the open position,

Stage" and the "Second RF Stage." The thumb-wheel dial at the left marked "Increase" drives the drum-style tuning dial located on the right side of the panel. The dial is calibrated from 0 to 100 but strangely enough it is labeled "Kilocycle." The control just below the thumb-wheel carries the legend "RF Bias." The knob below the tuning dial is labeled "Resonator."

Figure 5 shows the third panel. This panel's function is not identified, but it may be the third and fourth RF stages. The thumb-wheel and drumdial combination are like those used in the second panel. However, this third panel has a tuning eye tube at the top, an unusual feature for an early radio. This panel also contains a "Resonator" control and an "RF Bias" control, but their positions are reversed from those used in the second panel.

The fourth panel, shown in Figure 6, is identified as the "Detector Stage." The layout of this




Figure 3. This assembly lacks a nameplate and its function is not clear, but its basic layout and dial plates are similar to other units in the radio.




Figure 4. Identified as the First and Second RF stages, this unit has a thumb-wheel tuning control and dial. The controls at the bottom of the panel are marked "RF Bias" and "Resonator."

panel is the same as the third panel, except for the tuning eye.

The function of the fifth panel, shown in Figure 7, is not identified. But, the presence of the 250 mA meter suggests that it might contain a power supply. The phone jack at the lower left is marked "Output" so there may be an audio amplifier behind this panel. The toggle switch at the right is a conventional or/off switch.

Most significantly, a nameplate that identifies the radio as a Leutz Universal Trans-Oceanic, is attached to this panel. A close-up view of the nameplate is shown in Figure 8. To the extreme right is an open area for what seems to be a sixth panel, which is missing.

The previous owner of this unusual console told me that only three Universal Trans-Oceanic (Continued on following page)




Figure 5. This panel also lacks a nameplate, and the positions of its RF bias and resonator controls are transposed as compared to the panel shown in Figure 3. In addition, a tuning eye is used.

models were built, and that he thought two of them were destroyed sometime during World War II. This particular set has a number "1" stamped on the back of its case.

He also told me that this Leutz supposedly had been ordered by the King of Belgium, but was never delivered. Maybe so, because whoever took ownership of this monster receiver would have had to have a large residence in order to




Figure 7. The nameplate on this panel identifies the radio as "Universal Trans-Oceanic" but provides no clue regarding the function of the electronics behind the panel.

(Robert Kitchel, Box 87, Danville, VT 05828)

Robert Kitchel, a longtime Vermonter, became fascinated with radio when listening to his grandfather's old black-dial Zenith, which he inherited and still has. A Fairbanks tombstone at a flea market caught his eye because his grandfather had worked for the company. An old radio man helped him to get it going and then began to teach him everything he knew about radios. That was the beginning of a lifetime of challenging projects and contacts with great radio people.

Robert Kitchel's Leutz L-6 Console

ANALYSIS BY RAY BINTLIFF

Robert Kitchel's radio and the Universal Trans-Oceanic described in the 1927 Leutz catalog, as well as in the following article, have many features in common. But Kitchel's radio also has some significant differences that raise a few questions.

First, the panel shown in Figure 3 appears to be a modification of a standard Leutz panel. The vernier dials are squeezed in between the two binding post strips, and the rotary switch between the two vernier dials looks like an afterthought. The close placement of the dials and switch is not characteristic of Leutz products. Did some previous owner modify the panel or was this done by Leutz?

Perhaps the radio was an engineering model on which new ideas were tried. The vernier dials may have been installed by Leutz because they are nicely engraved with the names "Selector 1" and "Selector 2." Also a Leutz switch plate is used for the rotary switch.

More significantly, what did this unit do? It has an RF bias control, so there must be an RF amplifier inside. Is it a preselector? If the nameplates can be believed, the 1st RF is in the adjoining unit.

Even more questions spring to mind. Why did Leutz combine the 1st and 2nd RF stages in a single unit? They are separate units in the catalog set. The mystery deepens when we consider the panel shown in Figure 5. The tuning-eye tube did not appear until the mid-1930s. So how did a tuning eye get into a radio from the late 1920s? And when did Leutz, Inc., go belly up?

Some things were apparently untouched. The detector stage shown in Figure 6 looks like the detector stage in the Leutz catalog.

The panel shown in Figure 7 shows evidence of major modifications, and it bears little resemblance to the audio amplifier in the catalog set. And the empty space to the right of the fifth panel can not be explained.

Without a doubt, the radio is a Leutz. But how did it become so much different from the radio described in the Leutz catalog? Maybe some A.R.C. readers can help to solve this puzzle. Or perhaps Robert will someday get to examine the innards of his set.

Golden-Leutz and the Universal Trans-Oceanic

Robert Kitchel's article about the Leutz L-6 piqued John Terrey's curiosity and sent him scurrying to his and the A.R.C. library to look for more on Golden-Leutz, Inc., and, as so often happens, one piece of information led to another. His findings—the Leutz catalog and other references—are the basis for this article.

Charles Leutz developed an early interest in radio and obtained his Amateur license at the tender age of 14. His early experiences have been well documented elsewhere and will not be repeated here. The references listed at the end of this article are excellent sources of information about Leutz and his companies. However, it should be noted that in 1921 he formed the Experimenters Information Service to sell blueprints and construction data to radio Amateurs and other set builders.

Golden-Leutz, Inc. was created in May 1921 and the Experimenters Information Service became part of the new corporation. Leutz was its president and his partner was Claude Golden. The company was located in the Long Island City section of Queens, a borough of New York City. The name of the company was changed to C. R. Leutz, Inc., in February 1927, and in October 1929, the company relocated to Altoona, Pa.

The company's catalog for the 1927 model year is dated June 1926 and still carries the Golden-Leutz name. The catalog proclaims Golden-Leutz to be "Manufacturers of the Highest Class Radio Apparatus in the World." Several new models were offered in its 1927 line, but the Navy Model Universal Trans-Oceanic receiver, also called the Silver Ghost, is of particular interest here because of its similarity to the radio discovered by Robert Kitchel.

UNIVERSAL TRANS-OCEANIC

The Universal Trans-Oceanic, with a price tag of \$950, was clearly the company's top-of-the-line set. In its 1927 catalog, Golden-Leutz hailed the radio as "The Most Powerful Broadcast Receiver in the World." Evidently, modesty was not one of the company's strong traits. But such advertising hype was not uncommon during that period.

The radio, shown in Figure 1, is impressive

because of its size (6 feet in length) and orderly panel layouts. It is no lightweight, as it weighs in at 140 pounds. In defending the radio's size, the Golden-Leutz catalog states, "The Universal Trans-Oceanic has been designed for universities, broadcasting stations for relay purposes, and true amateur experimenters who want to secure maximum results regardless of the number of tubes and batteries required or the space occupied."

The radio's specifications are equally impressive. By means of plug-in coils, the radio tunes from 3,600 meters to 35 meters, or about 80 kHz to 8 MHz. It is a 4-stage TRF set with a detector and 4 stages of "Distortionless Audio Frequency Amplification."

As Figure 1 shows, the receiver consists of 6 separate units, each housed in individually shielded cabinets. From left to right these units are the 1st RF stage, 2nd RF stage, 3rd RF stage, 4th RF stage, detector stage, and a 4-tube audio amplifier. Binding posts and metal straps are used to make the electrical connections between the units. Each unit contains its own B batteries. The radio's hook-up diagram calls for a 6-volt storage battery as the filament voltage for all units and a cone-type speaker 3 feet in diameter.

Although there are 5 main tuning controls for the 1st RF through the detector stage, these individual controls may be ganged mechanically by means of universal joints to achieve 1-knob tuning. When ganged, the Resonator controls are used to fine tune each stage. When not ganged, each resonator control is set to its mid-position and each stage may be individually tuned for best reception of the desired station.

THE 1ST RF STAGE

Figure 2 provides an external view of the 1st RF Stage. The binding posts at the top left serve as the antenna and ground connections. The thumb-wheel turns the variable capacitor and the tuning dial at the right. The controls at the bottom of the panel are the antenna coupling switch at the left, and the filament rheostat on the right.

An internal view, Figure 3, shows the components of the 1st RF stage. Note the tube and tube socket on a raised mounting and the transverse-

mounted tuning capacitor. The RF coil is in the background and the filament rheostat appears in the lower left corner. The filament rheostat controls RF gain. Two Eveready B batteries are positioned at the rear of the unit. Each of the four RF stages use a single Type UX201-A tube. Plate voltage for the RF stages is 45 to 120 volts.

THE 2ND RF STAGE




Figure 4. This internal view of the 2nd RF stage with batteries removed shows the raised tube and coil sockets. Note the transverse mounted variable capacitor with its shaft extension used to link it to the adjoining units.

The 2nd RF stage is similar to the 1st unit. Figure 4 provides another view of the transverse-mounted tuning capacitor as well as a plug-in coil removed from its socket. A vernier tuning capacitor or resonator is visible on the lower right side




Figure 3. This internal view of the 1st RF stage shows its sloping front panel and components. The tube is mounted on standoffs to minimize capacitance effects. This unit, like all of the others, contains its own B batteries.

of the front panel. The B batteries have been removed in this photograph.

THE 3RD AND 4TH RF STAGES




Figure 5. Golden-Leutz placed great importance on the use of extensive shielding. This view of the 3rd RF stage shows the metal thumb-wheel that also serves as a shield for the variable capacitor.

These units appear to be identical to the 2nd RF stage. A view of the 3rd RF stage is shown in Figure 5. The large disk on the right side is the thumb-wheel. This metal disk also serves to shield the tuning capacitor. In its catalog, Leutz emphasizes the use of extensive shielding to prevent feedback and oscillation.

THE DETECTOR STAGE




Figure 7. This internal view of the detector stage shows it to be similar to the 2nd and 3rd RF stages except that it uses a smaller battery.

The detector stage differs from the RF stages in that it uses a Type UX200 tube and a plate voltage in the range of 16 to 22 volts. External and internal views of the unit appear in Figures 6 and 7.

THE AUDIO AMPLIFIER




Figure 9. This internal view of the audio amplifier shows its components and the 8 batteries that are required to operate it.

This 4-tube amplifier, shown in Figures 8 and 9, uses one Type UX112 tube in the 1st audio stage and a Type UX201-A in the 2nd and 3rd audio stages. Either a Type UX171 or UX210 is

recommended for the audio output stage. The appropriate plate and bias voltages will depend on the type of output tube used. The controls at the bottom of the panel are filament rheostats that control the gain of the AF stages.

SCHEMATICS FOR THE CURIOUS

Page 447 of the 1931 edition of John Rider's Trouble Shooter's Manual contains a schematic diagram for the battery-operated Universal Trans-Oceanic. A schematic for the AC-operated version can be found in Rider's Volume I on the Leutz page 1-1.

SOME ADDITIONAL THOUGHTS

Looking at the schematic for the battery-operated set makes one wonder about the cost of equipping and replenishing the batteries for this radio.

The use of plug-in coils give the radio a wide tuning range, but changing coils in all five tuned circuits must be time consuming.

On the positive side, there is no question that the radio is well shielded, and good selectivity results from the 5 stages of tuned RF (4 RF and 1 detector stage). Tracking the 5 stages must have been a challenge for its designer and the resonator controls were his way around the problem.

Considering the state of radio design and per-

formance in the mid-1920s, the Universal Trans-Oceanic must have been a powerful radio. Perhaps the Golden-Leutz claim that it was "The Most Powerful Radio in the World" was not an overstatement.

The use of the name Trans-Oceanic is interesting. Who was the first to use it? Leutz or Zenith?

VINTAGE TELEVISION

More Adventures in TV Land

As the title indicates, this article provides more tales from the early days of television when the public was still adapting and reacting to this new medium — sometimes in strange ways. In this article, Ray recalls some of his experiences as manager of an RCA TV service facility in the late 1940s.

First, let me express my appreciation to the many A.R.C. readers who commented so favorably on my first article "Adventures in RCA TV Land" that appeared in the June 1999 issue.

SOME CHUCKLES ALONG THE WAY

While there were technical challenges and the usual working day hassles in the TV service busi-

ness, there were humorous events that livened up the day. Dealing with the public on a daily basis was never dull or easy. For example, there was the frantic call from the owner of a new TV set. He claimed that since his set had been installed, his neighbors were able to observe his daily activities on their TV sets. Scary, huh?

The telephone clerk that took the call recognized that this one needed some special attention. She told the caller that a technician would look at his set the next day. The service tech was briefed and dispatched.

When the technician arrived, he found that the customer had

covered the picture tube with newspaper to prevent the neighbors from watching. To his credit, the tech handled the situation skillfully. He told the customer that this was a common problem in new TV sets and assured him that it could be corrected. The technician removed the set's back cover and pretended to make some adjustments to the set. He then assured the customer that all was well. It worked. The customer never called again.

Was this performance above and beyond the call of duty? Sure, but it was not unusual in the early days of TV.

A REAL WAKE-UP CALL

Then there was the telephone call from a laughing customer with a problem. She explained that their telephone had been ringing each morning, but by the time she or her husband reached the first floor telephone there was no one on the line. Logically, they had a telephone installed in their

second-floor bedroom, only to discover that the sound they heard was not really the ringing of the telephone. It turned out that a bird was pecking at the TV antenna and producing a sound much like a ringing telephone. Although she thought the situation was funny, the early morning wake-up calls were beginning to wear her out.

Of course there was nothing in the TV service contract that required RCA to correct such a problem, but she was a good customer and really needed help. So, I sent out an antenna crew. They dropped the mast and tied pieces of cloth (furnished by the customer) to the antenna to keep that flicker bird away from the antenna. Again, a happy customer.

THE PERFECTIONIST Large-screen projection TV

sets abound today, but in the late 1940s and early 1950s, they were something of a rarity and definitely "high end." Consequently, owners of early projection sets seemed more critical and demanding. But one owner stood out from the rest of the fussy folks.

Keep in mind that TV stations of the period had limited programming time and they frequently filled TV screens with test patterns. Test patterns facilitated picture setup, particularly in customer's homes. They made it possible for technicians to

adjust picture width, height and linearity without the need for test equipment such as a crosshatch generator.

On the other hand, they also enabled those critical customers to detect deviations from the ideal test pattern. If a set's vertical or horizontal linearity was adjusted improperty the circles in a test pattern appeared egg-shaped or elongated, and other variations in the test pattern became evident. Grossly misadjusted screens produced distorted pictures that were obvious to most TV viewers regardless of whether the TV station was transmitting test patterns or regular programming.

It was extremely difficult, if not impossible, to reproduce a perfect test pattern. And the projection sets were more difficult to set up than the smaller, direct-view screens. Most screen setups produced a satisfactory picture even though some minor deviations in linearity could be detected when viewing a test pattern. In general, the screen

setup had to be pretty bad before a customer complained.

But this was not the case with "The Perfectionist." This fellow had two basic problems – too much time on his hands and a yardstick. He used the yardstick to check the test pattern for linearity and the results were never acceptable to him. As a result, he was on a first-name basis with every service technician in the shop as they tried to produce a picture that satisfied him. We tried to convince him that the slight non-linearity apparent in the test pattern did not affect the "viewability" of regular programs, but without success.

Besides losing patience with this guy, we were losing money. Since he had a service contract, he paid nothing for these service calls. This unproductive involvement had to be brought to a close. So, I advised him that we could do nothing

more to improve his picture.

The Perfectionist struck the next blow by writing a letter to RCA in Camden, New Jersey. RCA did not take customer complaints lightly. The number of complaints received was one of the factors used in judging the performance of each service branch. So, the game started again — we must do something to satisfy this customer.

I protested that this guy was a loony, but my words fell on deaf ears. In its infinite wisdom, the customer relations group decided that the customer should be given a new projection TV in exchange for his present set. A great idea? Not really.

Projection TVs had been out of production for about three years. Well, customer relations was not beyond a bit of skullduggery. They found a projection TV at RCA Exhibition in New York City. They shipped the set to me, and my task was to

check it over, deliver it to the customer, pass it off as a new set, and remove the offending TV. In all fairness to those customer relations reps, the replacement TV was in very good condition.

Another happy ending? No way. The trucking company had mishandled the TV and its cabinet was damaged beyond repair. But, miraculously the electronics and projection drum survived. We still had a problem. The chance of finding another clean replacement TV was slim.

I couldn't possibly tell the customer that the shipping company destroyed the cabinet. It was time for one more white lie. I told him that we had received his replacement TV, but that I was disappointed because the finish on the cabinet was not as good as his present set. Therefore, (being a nice guy) I offered to put the "new" innards in his nice cabinet. Fortunately, he bit. We pulled it off. The Perfectionist became another happy customer!

IN RETROSPECT

The memories that I have shared with you stand out in my mind because they were humorous and had happy endings. Obviously, not all of the situations ended happily or even had a hint of humor. But the early days of black and white TV were never dull.

American Forces Network History Project and Reunion

In collaboration with the Allied Museum on ClayAllee in Berlin, Germany, we are preparing a display about the American Forces Network (AFN), a radio and television network which provides entertainment to servicemen stationed overseas. The display will run from September 14, 2001, to the end of February 2002. Though nothing is confirmed, we hope to bring the display to the U. S. some time in 2003 as part of the 60th anniversary of AFN.

The Museum is also organizing a reunion in 2001 of AFNers, including BDN (Blue Danube Network), AFN France, and the SEB/SEN (Southern European Network). If any former AFNers are among your readership, please have them contact us at the address below.

Over the last 60 years, it is estimated that AFN had an audience of some 16 million soldiers, family members, and civilian employees. But, it was the wider, "silent," listening audience which made AFN popular in Europe. In the 1950s-1960s, AFN had an estimated 200 million listeners in Europe, and was heard as far away as South Africa on shortwave. Probably no other station influenced its audience more than this American station, which provided a taste of jazz, country and western, and rock and roll music.

Unlike Voice of America or Radio Free Europe, AFN

was never a propaganda tool, as American soldiers would have reacted to that negatively. Therefore, AFN was a station many said, "you could trust."

Since the mittary never keeps outdated equipment, it is very difficult to put a display together, especially of American equipment in Europe. We have lots of recordings, shows, photos and film, but little equipment. We hope that members of radio clubs in the U. S. will assist either through loans or sale of items that our budget will allow. Among the things we are looking for (from memories of 50 to 60 years ago) are the following microphones: RCA BK1A, 44BX, and 77DX; Altec 633; and Labor MD21. We would also like to add a 1937 Crosley Arrow radio, old "On the Air" lamps, an SSD-2 receiver, a World War II Army wire recorder, an Army/Navy Hit Kit, and a master control unit. Naturally, we're interested in anything else from AFN.

We look forward to hearing from your readers and greatly appreciate any assistance they can provide.

An Unusual Zenith 6D015

The following success story started as a letter of inquiry. Carlos Gimemez, Sr., hoped that someone would have information about the original owner of his unusual Zenith. However, before we could print the letter, Carlos had an answer to his mystery. Read on. (Editor)




Figure 1. The 1946 Zenith Model 6D015 radio shown with its carrying handle in the up position. (Photo courtesy of Richard Arnold)

The Zenith 6D015, shown in Figure 1, was featured in the September 1999 A.R.C. in an article by Richard Arnold. It is a set I have had in my collection for five years. I found it in a flea market in Vermont. My radio is in like-new shape — it has no cracks or chips whatever, and plays nicely. But, what is really unusual is that it has an inscription on the front brass plate, as shown in Figure 2. Though the words may not show clearly here, they read as follows:

At the top:

Ted Davis, Pittsfield, Vermont Boston, Mass.

Germany Munich Schwienfort Frankfort WVRBUB - Erdine Stuttgart - Ausburg Nurnburg - Furstenfeldbruck 9th Air Force 43RD Air Depot GP

At the bottom:

Aug. 6th 1945 Dec. 22, 1948 5th Air Sea Rescue Sqdn. Western Air Base U.S.A.F Theodore E. Davis

I wanted to know the history of this radio, who Theodore E. Davis is, or was, and if any of his family is still around. I'm 74 years old and was in the service also in World War II. I thought that perhaps A.R.C. readers could help me find some of the Davis family who would know about this set. Perhaps they would be pleased to know that it is being carefully tended here in Florida.

Well, here is the rest of the story, written by my son:
On a recent trip to Fort Meyers, Florida, while visiting my father, he told me he had something to show me. My father is a radio/TV collector and has a

house full of antiques. He buys and fixes radios and sometimes sells them. The man is incredibly smart — to see him at age 74 bring a radio back to life is amazing to me.

To get back to the story — he came out with this radio and asked me if I knew what it was.

"But this radio has something written on it. Look at this!"

I told him I was so happy to have found him, as my father wanted him to know that he has his old radio.

He started to laugh and told me how proud he had been of his radio and how he took it wherever he went. The last time he saw the radio was in a trade with his brother for something else. He couldn't remember what.

That for the moment is the end of the story. My father still has the radio and is happy that he knows more about its history.

Rehabilitating Old Tapes

Many of you may still have tapes of treasured recordings made in the heyday of the reel-to-reel tape recorder. The following article addresses the problem of deteriorating tapes. Although A.R.C. hasn't tested the procedure and can't guarantee it, it may help you to preserve a piece of history in your collections. (Editor)

It looks as if reel-to-reel tape recorders have joined antique radios as collectible items. Although radio stations have dumped them for digital gadgets and DAT decks, there are still many reel machines in use daily. Many tapes are available from the past ranging from old master tapes of famous artists to sentimental home tapes made with less than ideal equipment.

Not all tapes from the past will play today due to tape deterioration. The worst defects are found in back-coated tapes that squeal when played. Another problem is the shedding oxide which coats the heads and idlers with a sticky mess.

The first tapes made had a paper backing that easily tore or broke but can still be played on better machines (the Smithsonian claims that the Ampex ATR-100 does them best). Next came the plastic "acetate" tapes which seemed much better and smoother. They also play well usually, but have a tendency to break more easily as they age and get brittle. I'm told that high humidity helps some of these tapes recover somewhat.

Later still, mylar and polyester became available. Vastly superior in strength and not affected much by age, they nevertheless would not break cleanly. Instead they stretched, ruining some sections of tape beyond redemption. Nearly all tapes manufactured since the 1960s are mylar or polyester.

Then in the late 1960s, a new tape oxide formula was adopted on the deluxe grades of tape and a back-coating was added. This tape had much lower noise levels and lower distortion and seemed to run more smoothly through many professional Studers and Ampexes and expensive home decks.

Everyone was happy for a while, and then sometime in the 1970s, users began to find that their tapes squealed and left deposits on the guides and heads. The condition only became worse with time, and finally the tapes would not play at all and would stall the motors of the most powerful machines. Many tapes were thrown away as useless or destroyed in the process of trying to play them. It happened to all brands but somehow Ampex, being one of the largest suppliers, seemed to get more of the blame.

There is a simple solution to the problem of tape deterioration that Ampex claims to have patented. It works to bring the tapes back to life, sounding almost like new. Even expensive calibration tapes give likenew responses. The solution is to cook your tapes in a convection hot-air oven at 120 degrees or higher, but no more than 140 degrees. Start with a cold oven. The temperature should be fairly steady within a few degrees Fahrenheit. Too hot can damage plastic reels.

After cooking for at least 24 to 48 hours, the tapes should be cooled to room temperature for another 24 hours in the oven before playing. One cycle may not be enough for some tapes; if so, the whole process needs to be repeated. The back-coating takes the longest to cure.

There seems to be some dispute about the time and temperature for tape baking, and about how many times the process is repeatable. One large manufacturer now recommends 130 degrees F for 8 hours and a 24-hour "cure" period, and claims that too much time and heat can damage tape lubricants.

I had a tape in my attic since 1974 subject to cycles of up to 140 degrees, and I was able to bring it back to life. However, it needed three treatments before it would play without shedding.

I suspect that the experts don't really know or aren't telling, so each tape is an experiment of some sort.



HEATH MODEL BC-1A - This 1959, 5-tube, transformer-powered, broadcast tuner is capable of a flat response to 9 kHz. When it receives AM stations using wide range programming, the effect is similar to FM. A bridged-T filter is employed to reduce the annoying 10 kHz beat note prevalent on the AM band. Two outputs are available from phone jacks, one medium impedance, fixed, and one low impedance, variable. (Roland Jenkins - Leavenworth, KS)

TELEDIAL RADIO, MANUFACTURER UNKNOWN — This wooden, shortwave and broadcast band receiver measures 12" wide, 63/4" high and 6" deep. The rotating wooden center dial with finger holes indicates a late 1930s manufacture. Can anyone identify the maker? (Edwin G. Cook — Vancouver, WA)





ZENITH MODEL 6S238 - This 1938 chairside tunes the broadcast band, as well as the shortwave, police and foreign bands. It has 6 tubes and 4 wooden control knobs, each with the Zenith "Z" on them. (Claude Chafin - Saint Louis, MO)

MEET REPORT

Meet Schedule Changes in the Wind Radiofest on Weekend Schedule

For several years, A.R.C. has encouraged clubs to take a serious look at a weekend meet schedule so as to maximize attendance and capture the interest of new-comers. The change in Radiofest's schedule for this year is a sign that the idea is really taking hold, though clubs in Michigan and Dallas proved the success of a weekend schedule some time ago. (Editor)

The news that the Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI) will hold Radiofest XIX on Friday through Sunday, August 4-6, 2000, strikes us as a clear message that even the big event organizers realize that they must include weekend days in the schedule. Otherwise, they will cater only to the fully committed and not increase interest in radio collecting beyond this select group. As we have said before, we have no chance of enticing the casual drop-in into becoming one of us unless they can do so on a day off.

Art Bilski of ARCI has told us that changing Radiofest's schedule was long in the making. But, as with most volunteer organizations, it was difficult to get a consensus and so things remained the same for a long time. Finally, many factors combined to effect a change.

First among them was feedback from attendees. Times have changed. People are overly committed to work and family affairs and cannot give a portion of a work week to a radio event. To accommodate their schedules and to give them a greater opportunity to enjoy the flea market, a weekend schedule has been adopted. The old Wednesday to Saturday schedule meant that even by Friday the flea market had been picked over, and by Saturday, many vendors had folded their tents.

In addition, we're pleased to know that Art believes articles and comments in A.R.C. certainly influenced the decision to change. We like to know that we can be a voice for making antique radio collecting better and for helping it to grow.

ARCI expects that the change will result in more public participation and that those participants will decide to stay through the full three days. The club is working to make those days action-packed with less downtime.

One new feature at this year's Radiofest will be an exciting new concept — a "Public Appraisal Fair." The public will be encouraged to bring in their radio-related treasures. "Experts" will examine the item, and, using various price guides and other references, will provide the owner with an estimated value. The owner will then have the option of placing the item in the Saturday radio auction, subject to the nominal fee to the club. This could result in many more interesting items showing up on the block.

As we've said before, Radiofest is one of the premier events for antique radio collectors. Now that it will take place on weekend days, the turnout should be larger than ever. Better make your reservations early.

As many of you know, ARCI and the radio-collecting community suffered a great loss this year. Dr. Ralph Muchow whose private radio museum was a star attraction every year at Radiofest passed away on March 4 at the age of 83. (See accompanying "Profile.") The museum will not be open this year, and its future is as yet undecided. Dr. Muchow's spirit will surely remain alive at Radiofest and among the many collectors who were fortunate enough to know him.

COLLECTOR PROFILE

Dr. Ralph W. Muchow 1917-2000

To honor the memory of Dr. Ralph Muchow, one of the great champions of antique radio collecting, A.R.C. is pleased to present this "Collector Profile." Fortunately, our information comes from the best of all possible sources — Dr. Muchow's son Steven — who joined in his father's interest in preserving radio history. We are extremely grateful to Steve for sharing his memories with our readers. (Editor)

On March 4, 2000, the radio collecting community lost a great historian and champion for our hobby. Dr. Ralph Muchow, shown in Figure 1, of Elgin, Illinois, passed away at age 83. "Doc," as he was known to many collectors, began collecting antique radios in 1967 and assem-

bled what many consider to be the finest private collection in the world.

Perhaps you are among the hundreds of collectors who visited "Muchow's Historical Radio Museum" during the past 30 years. If so, you probably agree that it required several visits to see it all! Few people realize how this museum began and the story behind the amazing individual who was to become its curator.

Ralph's interest in radio began in 1924 — what a great time to be starting in the hobby! He built his first radio, a crystal set, when he was eight years old, and truly, never stopped building radios — especially crystal sets! Even more recently, surounded by hundreds of museum radios, for him, there was still that certain thrill of "building your

own." Figure 2 shows a variety of his crystal sets. Many of the crystal sets he built during the past 50 years were based on designs published by the original MRL (Modern Radio Laboratories) in California. Ralph would often correspond with MRL's founder, Elmer Osterhoudt, to discuss the performance of his latest set after a night of DXing.

Circuits that performed well moved from his experimenter's "breadboard" into a wooden cabinet. One of Ralph's favorites circuits, the 'flextal,' was able to drive a 12-inch PM (permanent magnet) speaker and required a volume control! Even

more amazing was his detector — an LED which did double duty as a pilot light! He estimated that he had constructed between 200 and 300 radios over his lifetime.

THE 1930s-1940s

In the 1930s and 1940s, even as the country was reeling from the Depression and a world war, Ralph was busy and moving forward. In addition to his radio hobby, he earned a dental degree from Northwestem University in Evanston, Illinois, retired with the rank of Major from the U.S. Army, married his wife, Carole, and started a dental practice and a family. He also became a nationally ranked table tennis player.

With all of this, he still found time to build radios! For example, the 1940s brought a fascination with portable sets, and he built several battery-operated radios using 1-volt and 3-volt tubes.

THE 1950s

Ralph's passion for building smaller and smaller radios extended into the 1950s with that "new technology" — the transistor! Transistor radios were expensive at that time, but he found a solution in an inexpensive kit offered by the Philmore Manufacturing Co., Inc. The kit, Model TR-22,

was a 2-transistor "reflex" design with built-in speaker. He built one and was inundated with requests from his dental patients and friends to build one for them.

While he didn't have time to build their radios, he offered to fix them if they didn't work. Many radios came back to him with components soldered in the wrong locations and untrimmed leads. In retrospect, he felt it would have been easier to build the radios correctly himself in the first place rather than have to rebuild them later.

This example reveals how much he enjoyed radio and enjoyed sharing his passion with others, whether it was to help build and fix radios or, in later years, to conduct a museum tour. Clearly, it was his enthusiasm that sparked an interest in radio in me, his oldest son. Because of the many hours we shared together tinkering with radios, I became an Amateur radio operator and an electronics engineer.

THE 1960s

Ralph was a craftsman, and he effectively used these skills in the early 1960s to satisfy his quest to build smaller and smaller radios. He decided to "shrink" the Philmore TR-22 transistor radio kit, substituting smaller components as tech-

nological advances made them available. Figure 3 shows the Philmore radio size reduction.

SLOT CAR RACING

When his family was involved, Ralph doubly enjoyed hobbies. This was evident in the 1960s when he became interested in racing slot cars along with his younger son Dave. A peg protruding from the bottom of these 1/22 and 1/22 scale electric cars held the car in place on a slotted track, while a hand-held rheostat controlled car speed.

Ralph enjoyed competitive sports, and this hobby brought back the competitive spirit now missing from his earlier days

playing table tennis. He and Dave built and raced cars, winning many trophies at Chicagoland racetracks. Dave went on to capture the world championship title in slot car racing.

If this were not enough, Ralph was also a railroad enthusiast. He collected antique toy trains and steam engines and constructed a fully operational 24-foot long HO gauge train layout in the basement of his home.

THE MUSEUM - THE 1970s-1990s

Most radio collectors associate Ralph with his extraordinary radio museum. So, how and when did the museum begin? In 1967, Ralph walked by a local antique store and noticed an antique radio in the window. It turned out to be an Atwater Kent 10 breadboard. Recognizing this set from his youth, he soon had it under his arm and headed home with his prize. A successful restoration of the radio sparked an interest in Atwater Kent, and, after finding several more radios, he realized that the bug had bitten! Figure 4 shows one of his splendid treasures, a Brunswick Panatrope, in pristine condition.

Soon the basement in his home was filled with radios and no room for expansion. Out of necessity, the museum was relocated to his downtown Elgin dental building. As tenants moved out of the building, the collection grew to 3,400 sets and now occupies 24 rooms. Just one of the many rooms in Ralph's museum is shown in Figure 5. From the very beginning, Ralph insisted that no item would be displayed unless it was "museum quality." While it required a greater restoration effort, this philosophy set the museum apart from simply an aggregation of radios.

In addition to providing radio history for visitors, the museum has been a resource for other interests. For example, both the motion picture and television industries have borrowed museum pieces for use in their productions. In addition, Ralph often provided students with hard-to-find information on "wireless" needed for their school projects.

Throughout the 1970s, 1980s and 1990s, he was very active in several radio clubs. He was a founding member and past president of the Antique Radio Club of America (ARCA) and the

Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI). ARCA eventually was absorbed into the AWA, but ARCI continues to be a very active club, hosting the premier annual "Radiofest" meet in Elgin, Illinois, every August.

Seasoned collectors will remember Ralph and his wife Carole's regular attendance at all ARCA

and AWA conferences in the 1970s, 1980s and early 1990s. He especially looked forward to entering radios in the contests and brought home many "best of show" and "first place" awards over the years.

In 1985 Ralph was elected a "Fellow" in the Radio Club of America and received the club's "Batcher" award in 1988 for his efforts in preserving radio history. He received ARCA's "Harry Houck" award in 1989 and earned the club's "President's Museum Award" in 1992 and 1993 for his outstanding presentation of a recognized private museum. The Antique Radio Club of Illinois honored him by naming its contest "Best Of Show" award the "Dr. Ralph Muchow Award."

Each year, participants at Radiofest looked forward to viewing the Muchow collection, as Ralph gladly opened the museum for tours. This event became a family affair with immediate family, including grandchildren, participating. During the tours, Ralph brought radio history alive. There was an interesting story to tell about each radio, and his vast knowledge rarely left questions unanswered.

Were you fortunate enough to have been among the hundreds of people who visited the museum within the past thirty years? If not, the museum was featured in the February 1997 issue of Smithsonian Magazine. Understandably, many collectors are wondering about the future of the museum. It has been decided that the museum will remain intact for at least a year as options are considered.

RESTORATION TOPICS

The Riga B417 An Internet-Assisted Restoration Project

In the following article, Jerry Wieland reveals yet another way in which the Internet can bring collectors together, not just locally, but internationally. Using the A.R.C. Internet Web site link to foreign references and e-mail, Jerry connected with a Russian and a Swedish collector about his Riga B417 — a success story follows. (Editor)

When I first saw the large table radio shown in Figure 1 in a Wisconsin antique shop, it struck me as having a foreign appearance. When I picked it up and saw a cable with crocodile clips plus a line cord with a European plug, I was curious. Was it battery or AC? It rattled ominously, a knob was missing, but the wooden cabinet was in good shape. The price was right, so I bought it.

Days later, a fellow collector saw the name Riga on the rear cover and commented that Riga was a Russian port city. Using the A.R.C. Internet site foreign references, I found a link to a Russian collector's site displaying a radio with a very similar cabinet along with a schematic.

Comparing the tube location chart on the back of my radio to the schematic on his showed the two to be different. His is a 6-tube AC set with 6-volt filaments, whereas mine has a 2-volt battery cable, which I assumed to be the filament supply. The 4 octal tubes used in mine, all of which were missing, had numbers I could not cross reference: DCH21, DF22, DBC21, DLL21.

THE E-MAIL SEARCH

An e-mail to the owner of the Russian site evoked a response that said my set was made in Latvia by the Riga Radio Works before the Soviet takeover in 1940. From 1941 to 1945, the Germans occupied Latvia. After the war, the Soviets gained control. I assume my radio was made in the early 1940s. The Russian collector could not give me any information on the tubes since he collects only Soviet era radios which do not use tubes with low voltage filaments. I downloaded all his Riga schematics hoping that some of the circuitry might be similar to mine.

I also found a Swedish Web site that lists a similar Riga model, but again the tubes didn't match. An e-mail brought the response that my

tubes could not be identified. To help find substitutes, the Swedish collector scanned many pages of a 1940s Swedish tube manual and e-mailed them to me. He also provided a page of tube terms he had translated from Swedish to English!

ASSESSMENT OF THE SET

After reviewing all the documentation, I returned to the radio. A closer examination of my B417 revealed a number of problems. The speaker had detached from the front panel ripping away the audio output transformer secondary wires. This explained the rattling. The output transformer has three primary terminals, but only one was connected. Three chassis wires were lying loose. A resistance check of the transformer showed the primary to be open. This transformer was history.




Figure 2. The B+ power supply, possibly a home brew, uses a voltage dropping resistor that allows operation on either 110- or 220-line voltage. The stacked device on the right is a solid-state rectifier. The filter capacitor is located at the left side of the chassis. Note the European-style line plug.

The AC line cord terminated in a separate chassis that is rather crudely built. As Figure 2 shows, it has a large, probably selenium rectifier and a ripple filter. The capacitors in the output filter were open. A toggle switch marked 110/220 volts varied resistors in series with the load. The output wires to the radio chassis were marked 90 volts and 0 volts with crimp-on metal tags. I believe this power supply was an after-market addition to eliminate the plate supply battery. However, a 2-volt battery was still required for the filament supply resulting in a rather odd power system. I removed the 90-volt supply and concentrated on the main chassis.

The large circular dial is impressive in appearance. However, the pointer did not turn. I found

that the pulley was loose on the tuning capacitor shaft and the cables had excessive slack. The pulley supports two cables. One wraps around the tuning shaft and the other around the dial pointer shaft. The tuning shaft can be pushed in to activate a leaf switch which supplies power to the dial lamps. This feature is usually found on battery sets to conserve current.

After making a dial stringing diagram, I removed the dial which exposed the pulley. Rather crudely cast from pot metal, the tuning pulley was in poor condition; it was both cracked and deformed. Small projections for tension spring anchoring had broken off leaving the springs loose. One slot was so deformed that I could not pull the cable through it. Probably another item for the garbage can. I put this aside to concentrate on the circuitry.

RESTORATION AND MODIFICATION

Tracing some of the circuits proved that the B417 is similar to an M557 schematic obtained




Figure 3. This bottom view of the chassis shows the component layout.

from the Russian Web site. Although the M557 has 6 tubes, one is a tuning eye and the other a rectifier. If I don't count those two, the remaining 4 tubes are similar in function to the tubes in my B417. Both radios have 3 bands — long, medium, and shortwave. Now I needed to find tubes. Should I convert the set to 6-volt tubes or look for 1-volt substitutes?

In my collection, I have a Motorola portable from the mid-1940s that uses octal tubes with low voltage filaments. I decided to check these tubes against the M557 schematic. The configuration was similar enough to make me decide to try them in the Riga.

I modified one stage at a time starting with the mixer/oscillator, followed by the IF amp, detector, and audio amp. The tube sockets required rewiring since the filament pin-outs of the substitute tubes were different from those of the original tubes. The plates, grids, and cathodes were OK as is.

I used an oscilloscope and signal generator to make sure each stage was operating before proceeding to the next. With this approach I was able to get the AM band operational. It was not as difficult as expected. For power, a multiple output DC supply provided the filament and a 90-volt plate voltage. A junk box audio output transformer and some speaker cone patching completed the operational restoration, at least on the AM band.

From the original transformer configuration, I believe the audio output tube should be a dual triode operating in push-pull. This is what the radio on the Swedish site uses. My current substitute is a single triode, so I did not use a push-pull output transformer. I will try that configuration when I find a suitable dual triode.

Next, I tried my hand at RF and IF alignment. Ferrite slugs protrude through the side of the IF shield cans and have a 5/32 hex head. The antenna coupling coils also have similar slugs but are recessed in the chassis. My socket wrench was too large for the chassis access hole. I had to use a nut driver to tune these which proved to be tricky because the metal shaft detuned the coils. After some tweaking, the AM band was more sensitive. A few stations could be heard on the shortwave band also. On the negative side, the local oscillator

dies at the lower shortwave frequencies, and sensitivity on the long-wave band is not very good.

Since the electrical restoration was progressing, I decided to make some progress on the dial and bandswitch. The stop was missing on the bandswitch allowing it to rotate 360 degrees, which bent some of the contacts. I was able to straighten the bent contacts with needle nose pliers. Since it would require extensive disassembly, I did not want to remove the bandswitch from the chassis to investigate the stop problem.

Instead, I fashioned a stop on the chassis from a piece of sheet metal bent to make contact with the collar of the bandswitch indi-

cator. This collar has two set screws which now act as bandswitch stops when they hit the bracket. A short cord attached to this collar operates a tricolored disk that indicates which band is selected through an opening in the tuning dial face. The disk colors match the frequency band colors on the dial face.

The dial mechanism was more difficult to repair. The cast pulley was not salvageable. For a replacement, I consulted my junk boxes. A plastic insert from a lawn table was just the right diameter. To attach it to the tuning capacitor shaft, I used a collar from an old tuning pulley.

After supergluing the collar to the plastic insert, I inserted three small screws for reinforcement.

More screws were then added as anchors for the dial cords. Stringing these cords was very difficult because the tuning dial assembly covers the pulley. Once the stringing was accomplished, the dial worked well. All that remained were two dial lamp replacements. An easy job, I thought. However, the two screw base bulbs were glued into their sockets — with great glue, to say the least. I finally mangled the bulbs with the needle-nose pliers and removed the pieces. The sockets survived to accept 2.5-volt replacement bulbs.

After I had touched up cabinet scratches and added a substitute knob, the radio looked presentable, as shown in the two chassis views in Figures 3 and 4. I will continue my search for more suitable tubes, a knob, and a schematic. The set's performance still needs improvement. This is one of those projects that could last for years. However, I would not have gotten this far without the Internet. It proved to be a useful high-

tech tool for restoring a rather low-tech radio.

Association des Amis du Musée L'ElectroAcoustique les Radiophiles Français 25th Anniversary — 1974-1999

The Association des Amis du Musée de l'ElectroAcoustique Les Radiophiles Français (A.E.A.) celebrated its 25th anniversary May 16, 1999, at its annual general meeting in Bordeaux, France. Founded in 1974 by Jean Engelking and four other wireless enthusiasts, the A.E.A. now has nearly 300 members and is growing steadily.

The club was founded with the aim of preserving antique equipment and documents related to wireless transmission and reception. The members' field of interest is broad and includes radio receivers and transmitters, electric telegraphs, telephones, TV sets, record players, tape recorders, sound movies, electronic tubes, transistors and more. The club president, J.C. Montagné, estimates that each member has from tens to hundreds of wireless sets, depending only on the space available.

With an eye toward the A.E.A.'s goal, the president, with the help of his fellow club members, is trying to establish a national preservation site — a complex combining preservation, a museum, and an academy to train restorers of scientific devices. At least five of the A.E.A. members have published books on the history and equipment of their hobby and on their collections.

First printed in 1974, the 24-page A.E.A. Bulletin is published quarterly to furnish members with news of the club, a calendar of events, technical and theoretical articles and classified ads. A look through the October/November/December 1999 Bulletin finds articles on the history of microphones, a home-brew triode power amplifier, World War I amplifiers, and low frequency power amplification using tube amps, plus a 25th anniversary message from J. Engelking, the founding president. All the articles have an introductory summary in English, even though the Bulletin is printed in French.

A.E.A. activities include meetings and flea markets. One such event is the Roger Furon meeting (named after its first organizer) held every summer since 1987 in Les Vans, in the south of France. Another is the A.E.A. annual meeting held in even years in Paris and in odd years in outlying towns. Large exhibitions are also organized every three years or so.

AUCTION REPORT

10th Annual Harris Antique Radio Auction Marshalltown, Iowa — April 1, 2000


Saturday, April 1, 2000, was warm and sunny for the eager buyers attending the tenth annual antique radio auction at the Gene Harris Antique Auction Center in Marshalltown, Iowa. No April Fool here! Over 525 excellent lots of antique and collectible radios were awaiting bidding action by 159 registered buyers from 13 states. The auction was called by Gene Harris, Julie Harris-Stem, and Dale Albee.

Noticeably absent from this year's auction were the very top level of both battery and AC sets. Making up for this was the large number of 1930s to 1970s table models in both wood and plastic. Demand was good for these sets, and they realized higher prices than in previous years. Battery radios were about equal to last year's numbers with good demand and strong prices. Tubes brought good prices. Books, manuals, and advertising were in short supply.

A new feature of this auction was to have the listing of merchandise on the Internet by lot number. Harris Auction is one of the pioneers using this listing technique. Anyone with a computer and Internet capability can now contact the Harris Web page ahead of the auction, pull down an auction listing, see every item listed by lot number, and print out his own copy right at home. Only last minute, morning-of-the-auction consignments were late in getting listed.

The impact of the new Internet sales technology was a hot topic of conversation at the auction. The fact that high dollar items were absent and that even old standbys like Zenith consoles were scarce fueled talk of changes in the wind. On the other hand, Harris' use of the Internet for previewing brought in quite a number of bidders who had never been to a Harris radio auction before.

A warning: Auction prices are not current values. Our selection of auction items is not necessarily complete. A listing such as this cannot adequately include the condition of cabinets, chassis, transformers, tubes, the operating status of the set, and the inclusion of incorrect, restored or replica components, etc. Auction prices are the result of the excitement of the auction process, the skill of the auctioneer and the specific interests of the participants. Nevertheless, auction prices serve as useful references and as another element in the value determining process. The possibility of error always exists, and if we are notified, corrections will be reported.

The auction moved rapidly and bidding was spirited. Little "junk" was offered. Strength was shown in the lower priced sets indicating that collectors were going in the direction of whatever was available.

Some highlights from the auction were the following: An Atwater-Kent dealer's heavy pressed paper wall plaque in excellent condition selling at \$600; a Trophy Baseball radio at \$675; and a beautiful Zenith 12S370 12-tube, shutter-dial console at \$475.

A Stromberg-Carlson 350-V designed to fit into either a room corner or along a wall, in mint condition, was an excellent buy at \$450. A black 1926 Neutrowound Super battery set sold for \$550. Many plastic table model sets benefited from the expanded listing on the Internet with good prices ranging from \$30 to \$100. A red plastic Silvertone 4509 in very good condition sold for \$500. Plastic sets are becoming more popular and in demand, especially by the newer collectors.

Harris Auctions will plan for another radio auc-

tion extravaganza set for April 7, 2001. Early consignment will give maximum advertising cov-

erage. See you there!







"Carpinchoe" Defined

Dear Editor:

Your correspondent Ted Rogers (May 2000 Miscellanea) asked about the word "Carpinchoe," a material he said that Stromberg-Carlson used to support the edge of loud speaker cones. The Oxford English Dictionary contains the following entries: "A local name in South America for the capybara. These great rodents are generally called 'carpinchos.' ... When alarmed, the carpincho utters a kind of grunting cry. ... It is 4 feet long and weighs about 98 pounds — the largest extant rodent quadruped, nearly allied to the guinea pig. ... Lives about the rivers of tropical South America. ... Some naturalists call it the 'water-hog.'... Food consists exclusively of grass and vegetables."

So the carpincho is a capybara, the world's largest rodent. Interestingly, the Catholic Church defined the capybara as a fish, so it could be eaten on Fridays.

I guess Stromberg-Carlson could charge more for carpinchoe leather than for rat leather!

Deadline: NOON ET- 10th of the month!

Classified ads must have a standard heading such as WANTED, FOR SALE, FOR TRADE, FOR SALE/TRADE, SERVICES, MESSAGE, HELP, AUCTION, MEET, etc. This heading is the only bold or all-capitalized words allowed in the ad. Capitalize only manufacturer names, model names, etc. This standard ad format makes scanning the ads easier.

Before writing your ad, please look over the ads in a recent issue of A.R.C., and try to write your ad in the same style. Full name (or company name) and address is <u>required</u> in all classified ads; we will add it if you forget.

To encourage varied content of the ads, the same classified ad may be run only once per issue and for only two consecutive months. (To run an ad longer, use a boxed classified or display ad.)

IMPORTANT — COUNTING WORDS — IMPORTANT

The standard headings: WANTED, FOR SALE, etc., count as one word each time used in an ad. Name, address and (one) telephone number, count as 6 words, regardless of length. Ham call letters and business name can be included in the 6 words and do not count extra. Full name (or company name) and address is required in all classified ads. Each additional word, abbreviation, model number or number group, extra telephone numbers, fax, e-mail, etc. count as one word each. Hyphenated words count as two words.
