

Vacuum Tube Repair Wafers

These tube repair wafers are solid-state devices for quick and easy repair of early vacuum tubes. The wafer is installed by simply sliding it over the tube pins and reinserting the tube into its socket. If the filament is intact, but there is little or no emission, the filament may be lit for best visual effect. However, the tube can be open filament.

No change in radio operating voltages is required. Any number of tubes may be repaired in a radio. If wafers are installed on all tubes, the B+voltage may usually be reduced without sacrificing volume or sensitivity. Performance will vary between radio models.

Antique Radio Power Supply

The H15/H16 power supplies operates most tube type battery radios from low cost batteries. The H15/H16 steps up the voltage from a 6V battery to provide 22.5V, 45V, and 90VDC for the "B" voltage requirements.

A very desirable feature of the H15/H16 is the method of switching power on and off. This function is provided by the switch on the radio. No radio modification required.

The "A" voltage required by the radio can be from "C" or "D" flashlight batteries or from a 6V gelled electrolyte battery when operating 5V tubes. When operating 1.5, 2, or 3V tubes the H15/H16 can be powered by 4 "C" or "D" flashlight batteries or from a 6V gelled electrolyte battery. The gelled electrolyte battery can operate both the H15/H16 and the 6V "A" supply for 5V tubes from one battery.

Order the H15 of parallel filaments or the H16 for series filaments.

The compact size, 4"X4"X3/4", allows the unit to be installed with batteries in the battery compartment of most radios.

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Did you notice? The times they are a changin' — and so is A.R.C. We have a new look, both on our cover with its "cover lines," as they call them in the trade, and with some inside rearrangements.

This editor's page is no longer the first thing you see as you flip open your copy of A.R.C. Instead, pages at the front and back of the magazine will now be available to advertisers, who generally covet this space. Our ad policies and rates, as well as publishing guidelines, once on the inside front and back covers, now are found near the beginning of the classified ads. And we have added a table of contents, something many readers have requested.

These changes are a first step toward initiating a plan long on the A.R.C. drawing board — to put the magazine on the newsstands sometime in the coming months. Over the years, we have had many inquiries about whether the magazine is sold at newsstands, so we are convinced that there is a market out there. But, to move in that direction, A.R.C. must have a more traditional format. Look for more changes in the coming months.

We foresee that many will again ask, "Why not go wholly to the Internet?" Of course, the Net has pushed the issue of attracting new readers, thus leading to the advancement of the newsstands plan. However, we remain committed to providing options to all potential readers—those who want only an Internet subscription (a policy under consideration), those who still want to put the hard copy in a back pocket, and now, those who want to pick up a newsstand copy and might become new members of the radio-collecting community.

In the spirit of change, we've moved the Radiofest report into the October issue, rather than combining it with the AWA report in the November issue as in the past. We really wanted to single out the success of Radiofest with its public-friendly schedule and policies. Congratulations are in order.

Moving to West Coast activities, we present Hank Brown's report on the fifth annual meet of the Military Radio Collectors Group (MRCG) in California. With all the additional information Hank provides about individual sets, his articles have become an ongoing tutorial on collecting military equipment.

Whenever we read about this group's annual gathering, we think of a perfect slogan for them — "Old military guys never die; they just have fun!" Read about the hiding place for the transmitter in the annual hunt, and you'll see what I mean. Also their seminar speakers are apt to be unique, as in the case of Bjom Forsberg, alias the Red Baron, whose photo you won't want to miss.

PRINTED WITHOUT COMMENT

A.R.C. has received reports from four individuals who have sent funds to Paul Etheridge of Mississippi. They did not receive the items for which they paid. Two problems were rectified after considerable effort. A.R.C. serves as a clearinghouse for complaints if readers have not been able to resolve the problem themselves.

Thomas Wiegand's article on Nordmende radios broadens our view of foreign sets, especially when they have operatic names! Tom makes a convincing case for these sets to be worth a second look in flea markets.

Many of you are familiar with the Crosley book capacitor, a type of compression capacitor. This subject intrigued Dale Davenport enough to wonder about others out there. When our writers keep thinking, there's no telling what new information might surface.

Two sets are guaranteed to jump out at you in *Photo Review* this month. At first glance, the Telefunken Navy receiver and the 1918 spark gap don't look as if they belong on the page. But, these unusual items are undeniably a part of radio history.

Radio Miscellanea contains much additional information on past articles — everything from the Musette to early TV repair experiences and Pepsi radio decals to a new address for a cable-making company. Frustrations about the shortcomings of e-mail are also given vent. But, on a happier note — satisfaction with A.R.C. comes from across the sea.

The Internet. For several months, our goal to get the classified ads up on the Web on a timely basis has been met. It's rewarding to see how many people are logging on to our Web site — 10,000 hits monthly on the home page and 1,800 on the classifieds. A total of 60,000 Web pages are accessed monthly. Where are these people coming from? The answer — from over 60 countries.

Techies out there might enjoy knowing that most folks are using PCs, 6 percent are on Macs, and 2 percent follow Dick Desjarlais' example on WebTV. The most popular choices on the site are, of course, the classifieds, followed by links to other radio sites.

Look for additional enhancements to our Web site in the months to come. And be sure to check the site about 10 days before the end of the month to find out the date the new ads will be posted.

Coming Radio Events. The month of October offers 55 meets, including the Buckeye Antique Radio and Phonograph Club's show in Akron, Ohio; the Indiana Historical Radio Society's meet in Greenfield, Indiana; the Museum of Radio and Technology's show in Huntington, West Virginia; and the Carolinas Chapter of the AWA's meet in Jamestown, North Carolina. In addition there are auctions in Vermontville, Michigan; Seville, Ohio; and Olney, Illinois. And, as always, A.R.C. will be attending the New England Antique Radio Club's Swap Meet in Nashua, New Hampshire, on October 21. Stop by our table to say, "Hi!"

MEET & AUCTION REPORT

Antique Radio Club of Illinois Radiofest XIX

Elgin, Illinois — August 4-6, 2000

REPORTED BY JOHN V. TERREY AND THE ARCI

The Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI) held its Radiofest XIX from August 4 to 6, 2000, at the Ramada Inn, Elgin, Illinois. The weather cooperated in that it was pleasant for the peak flea market times, and thunderstorms hit only during the indoor auction hours. Attendees represented the entire country — from New England and Florida to Arizona and the West Coast. In addition to representatives of Canada and Greece, it was a pleasure to see A.R.C. contributor lan Sangster and his wife who came all the way from New Zealand.

The change from the Wednesday to Saturday schedule of the past to a Friday to Sunday schedule had to be viewed with a degree of apprehension. But, if the flea market was any measure, the change meant success — 214 spaces were sold, and the peak count was 177 sellers set up on Friday moming. In 1998, I recorded a peak of 170, while in 1999, it dropped to 156.

The club was also relatively successful at minimizing the number of vendors who defied the rule and opened a day ahead. The majority respected the rule and literally seemed to wait for the gun to go off. And it did — apparently, at around 4:30 A.M. on Friday when the flashlights appeared and the game was on! Stayin-beds were caught by surprise.

Though Friday was definitely the peak day for the flea market, on Saturday, the action didn't slow down until showers hit around auction time in the afternoon. Really rare items were not much in evidence, but there were enough desirable items to keep buyers happy.

A very interesting innovation on the part of ARCI was opening the event to the public and offering more than just viewing privileges. In fact, an appraisal table staffed by club members was advertised, and the public was encouraged to bring in grandma's old Philco or whatever for evaluation. To avoid a conflict of interest, appraisers were not allowed to buy the items. Forty people took advantage of this service, and some then



walked through the flea market and sold the items. Others elected to put their items into the auction.

The idea of opening club events to the public for purposes of widening interest in radio collecting and preservation has long been a topic of discussion among collectors. Our hats are off to ARCI for apparently finding solutions to the objections often raised to nonmember participation in club events. This event certainly spread good will among the general public good news for collectors and for those old radios still stashed away in attics everywhere.

An important component of Radiofest is education. Wide-ranging and informative presentation topics included Matt May's "How To Read a Schematic," Bill Reid's "32-volt Farm Power Systems, Radios. & More." and Bob Paquette's slide show of microphone history.

Since Motorola was the theme of the event, a fine display of Motorola items contributed by collectors was available throughout the weekend. In addition, the Motorola Museum. a short bus ride away, was open to participants. Here the history of Motorola products is told as a "Journey through Time and Technology." In all, folks had a chance to see a wide range of Motorola products.

Of course, the Motorola Museum

offerings reminded everyone of the sad passing of Dr. Ralph Muchow and of how much we looked forward in the past to the annual visit to his multifaceted museum. It was good to see Dr. Muchow's family at the banquet and to know that the Muchow Award will continue to be presented by his son Steve.

Speculation continues about what will happen to the Muchow collection. The scuttlebutt of the weekend was that an auction will be held next year in conjunction with Radiofest, If this should prove true, you will want to keep early August open for a possible dual event.

As usual, the Old Time Radio Contest featured some excellent entries. They included everything from small transistor radios to TV sets.



The Friday night awards banquet was held in a smaller space than in the past, as the banquet attendance of 89 seemed down from recent years. But the crowd was enthusiastic and enjoyed the entertainment provided by the Merry Mugs.

Auctioneer Harry Blesy and his wife Toni, assisted by ARCI members, moved the auction along at a good pace for the 108 registered bidders. The event was over by dinner time, so that collectors could dine at leisure. Of course, fewer items were offered — 93 as compared to 119 in 1999 and 161 in 1998. Obviously, the trend is downward, perhaps due to eBay. However, the increased flea market activity was a plus, and opening it to the public showed that clubs can adapt to the times and affect the outcome of their events.

The highlights of the auction were rather unexpected. Two top items turned out to be unusual cone speakers — a Western Electric and an Algonquin — selling for over \$400 each. A Shure microphone also went for \$400, while a Supreme AN/USM-


3 Navy test kit and a Motorola Lazyboy with remote brought \$350 each. All four of these items are rarely seen, but other things were also in the unusual range. The auction proceeds totalled \$8,942.

Overall, Radiofest this year met the demands of the public for a shorter, higher intensity event. Though the numbers fluctuated somewhat — up for the flea market, down for the auction — it had much to offer, and no doubt, will offer even more next year. Make your plans for August 2001.









GROSLEY WITH THE COLLECTORS

More on Compression Condensers

BY DALE DAVENPORT

The article by Jack Lowe and Dave Crocker on the Crosley book condenser in the January 2000 A.R.C. piqued Dale Davenport's interest. In submitting the the following article, he called it his "two cents worth." We're sure the information is worth far more to someone out there who may want to do even more research. (Editor)

I have a compression-type condenser manufactued by the Dubilier Condenser & Radio Corporation, New York, U.S.A. It's a Bakelite disk, 3 ½" in diameter with a central control knob/pointer and 180° travel. The scaling is from 0 to 180, left to right, clockwise. The unit's total thickness is approximately ½" plus the height of the knob, which is about 5%". The back of the unit has a black fibreboard cover held on with rivets. Marked by hand on the back is the value 0.0006.

A check with a digital capacity meter revealed that the capacity ranges from 0.025 pF to 597 pF in keeping with the indicated value. This value is equivalent to that of a standard 21 to 23 plate variable condenser of the early to mid-1920s. In all, the design and construction are similar to that of the compression condensers made to the Gernsback design.

The obvious advantage to this design is its surface mounting, which saves space. Since the piece is riveted together, I have not tried to confirm my supposition that it is a compression device, but everything, including the size and the feel of the control knob, indicates that it is.

What seems to me significant about this Dubilier unit is the patent date molded into the front: "Pat.7.6'20, other pats. pending." This date indicates that Dubilier filed for a patent on a compression-type tuning condenser more than three years before the application submitted by Hugo Gemsback and nearly a year before Powell Crosley filed for the book-type condenser patent.

WHO FILED FIRST?

The trail of who filed first for a compression condenser took another turn when I looked carefully at the printing on the dial of my Type A compression condenser made by the Connecticut Telephone and Electric Co. The Connecticut T & E unit was applied for well before the Gemsback patent — September 25, 1917.

I seem to remember seeing the Connecticut units advertised in catalogs dated at least as early as 1922. The compression condenser in the Sodion DR-6 sets appears to be the panel-mount version of the standard Connecticut T & E device or a modification at least.

DIFFERENCES

The design of the Gemsback compression condenser application of 1923 differs from the Connecticut T & E design in one primary way — one edge of the Gemsback movable plate is fastened solidly, and the compression screw moves the balance of the variable plate very much in the same way a later trimmer condenser operates.

The Connecticut design works differently, according to the William B. Duck Catalog of about 1922: "The variation of capacity is obtained by merely screwing the nut upwards and downwards upon the shaft, which moves the movable plate to and from the fixed plate." Guide rods allow the movable plate to ride up and down without rotation by way of slots cut into the plate's edge.

Again from Duck: "A spring placed upon the screw operates to open the plates when the nut is unscrewed on the shaft." The nut is fastened to the control knob, very much in the way the Gemsback application drawing indicates. The plates are separated by a thin mica sheet.

CONCLUSION

All of this goes to prove, I suppose, that good ideas occur frequently to more than one person and in more than one place. There may be other patents and styles of compression condensers that predate the Connecticut, Dubilier, Gemsback, and Crosley versions. Differences in these designs are in the details.

What they share in common is the principle of the moving plates separated by a dielectric, closer or further apart, to change the capacity of the device. Later condensers or variable capacitors designed around the idea of varying the intermeshing of plates soon relegated the compression style devices to "trimmer" status. I suspect that this change was prompted by the need for "repeatability," with the rotating designs having the ability to return to an exact capacity at a given degree of rotation — something the compression designs had trouble doing — and to do it at less expense.

The Nordmende Carmen and Othello Radios

BY THOMAS WIEGAND

While the names "Carmen" and "Othello" are readily associated with opera, their connection with radio may seem remote. But in Europe, the arts are more connected to everyday life than in the U. S., and so the names of the German radios described in the following article were not so unusual to the ears of European buyers. (Editor)

Manufacturers of German radios used various methods to designate their models. Grundig and Saba used numbers — the higher the number, the larger, more deluxe and expensive the radio. Blaupunkt used names of places — Paris, Vienna, Palermo — and continues to do so with its car radios. Nordmende, a condensation of Norddeutsche

Mende Rundfunk (North German Mende Radio) used names of operas and opera singers — Parsifal, Tannhauser, Caruso, etc.

Nordmende also went one step further with the Othello 58 and Carmen 59, two large table radios, by adding the year of manufacture. Though only one year apart, these radios have quite a few differences while also sharing some similarites.

SIMILARITIES

First, the Othello and the Carmen are European models, not normally intended for export to the U. S. The FM band extends only from 88 to 100 MHz, instead of from 88 to 108 MHz, as on U. S.




The Nordmende Othello 58.

models. All dial and controls markings on the radio are in German, and a change in the line voltage and plug (from 220V to 110-115V AC) is required.

Both sets feature a rotating ferrite (AM) antenna, activated by first pressing the "Peilantenne" button and turning the large knob behind the tuning knob. A red pointer then moves behind a window in the dial glass to show the antenna position. Nordmende would later call this feature "Direction Finding."

Rather large side speaker grilles on both radios conceal 4-inch diameter tweeters. Variable bass and treble controls, plus the "Tonblendor"

(tone blender), give an almost infinite range of sound impressions.

The "Tonblendor" is a row of buttons which allow the listener to adjust the radio's sound to taste. The Carmen 59's Tonblendor buttons are labeled as folows: "BASS, SPRACHE, ORCHESTER, SOLO, JAZZ." Pressing the "BASS" button adds bass, like the "super bass" switch on modem stereos. It is turned off by pressing it again. "SPRACHE" (Speech) is a position used for spoken programs; "ORCHESTER" (Orchestra) for musical programs, "SOLO" for vocal performances, and "JAZZ" for jazz broadcasts.

On the Othello 58, the "HORSPIEL" button is added. This filters out all bass tones, like the "telefilter" used in radio studios. On shortwave broadcasts, this feature would be beneficial.

Of interest are the many place names on the dial glass with a transparent strip next to each. Moving the dial pointer within the strip brought in that particular station under the right conditions, German manufacturers would include this feature on their radios in one way or another until the mid-1960s.

On the rear panels of both sets, there are connecting jacks for a phonograph, tape recorder, FM antenna, ground, and external speaker.

These features were also common on the sets of other German manufacturers.

Differences between the Othello 58 and the Carmen 59 are shown in Table I.

Here is a quick translation of the German abbreviations on the push buttons: Aus = Off, TA (Tonabnehmer) = Phonograph, Tonband (Tape) = Tape Recorder, L (Langwelle) = Long Wave, Peilantenne = Directional AM Antenna, M (Mittelwelle) = AM, K (Kurzwelle) = Shortwave, UKW (Ultrakurzwelle) = FM.



VINTAGE MILITARY EQUIPMENT

Collecting Military Equipment — Part 4 Plus the Fifth International MRGC 2000 Meet

BY HANK BROWN

A.R.C. has been following the Military Radio Collectors Group (MRCG) annual meets for several years now, and each of Hank Brown's reports has attested to the growing interest in military equipment. Hank also includes much additional material on individual sets.

These articles help to open up a special category of radio history and its jargon and to introduce us to a highly participatory aspect of radio collecting. Past articles on this subject appeared in November '89, June '91, and November '94. Parts 1, 2 and 3 of this series appeared in March '99, August '99 and April '00. (Editor)

Weather conditions for the MRCG meet at Camp San Luis Obispo on May 4-6, Thursday to Saturday, were just about per-

fect for all three days. Although the meet was planned as a 2-day event, we really had an extra day by getting started Thursday afternoon.

Shortly after noon on Thursday, there already were five stations in the nearby camping area up and running on batteries, dynamotors, vibrator supplies, as well as 110V AC lines. Trucks, vans, campers, tents and other shelters were surrounded by masts with a variety of antennas and wires running up into the trees. Bands in use were 10-meter FM, 75-meter AM, 40-meter CW and handheld rigs on 6-meter FM and 75-meter AM.

Later in the afternoon, the Noncommissioned

Officers (NCO) Club began to take on the look of a military display area, as many transmitters, receivers, accessories and other items arrived for installation on tables. Some equipment was set up for display only, while other systems were fully operational with power supplies, mikes, keys, headphones or speakers. An operational display of two 1930s BC-148 Army trench radios was running on the high end of 75 meters using Morse code for local work. These early portable sets use a single tube in the transmitter and a 3-tube receiver. Many participants tried their hands at communicating with one another with the two

units several hundred yards apart.

An early U.S. Air Force AN/ARN-30 VHF navigation set was receiving bearings from the local VHF Omni Range (VOR) station on 112.4 MHz. The VOR navigation system for aircraft has been in operation for many years and is maintained by the Federal Aviation Administration. With VOR receiving equipment in an airplane a pilot is able to determine his bearing from a VOR station within a range of about 90 miles.

Mark Blair, KE6MYK, arrived in his big M998 HUMMWV military vehicle. The "Hummer" replaced the familiar little Jeep that was used for many years by all services. Mark had an AN/VRC-47 (Vehicle Radio Communications) radio

MILITARY NOMENCLATURE

The "BC" in the military model number stands for "Basic Component," and the BC-148 is part of the SCR-131 system. The SCR stands for Signal Corps Radio and indicates that the equipment is a complete system.

Signal Corps, Navy and Air Force equipment designations were standardized towards the end of World War II so the "AN" indicates the Army-Navy designation system is used. The "ARN" stands for Airborne Radio Navigation type equipment. Another example of equipment designation is AN/ARC-5 in which the ARC stands for Airborne Radio Communications type equipment.

Army BC-148 Transceiver

Bjorn Forsberg is operating one of two BC-148 Army trench transceivers on the 75-meter band. The loop, a rigid design, is part of the single-tube, transmitter tank circuit and is used for both transmitting and receiving, not for direction finding. Power output is about 5 watts. The transmitter uses a single Type 10 tube. The receiver uses three Type 864 (VT24) tubes in a regenerative detector and 2-stage audio design powered by internal batteries.

Although back in the 1930s the Army advertised this radio's range as being in excess of 5 miles, these little transmitters were heard about 400 miles away during tests a few months before the meet,

At the meet, two stations were working each other

on Morse code using BC-148s, but they were so close that a signal from the regenerative detector of the sending station was heard, as well as the transmitted signal.

Regenerative detectors are actually small transmitters since they can oscillate on the frequency they are tuned to receive. Therefore, if one BC-148 was tuned to receive on 3980 kHz, as well as tuned to transmit on 3980 kHz, the receiving station operator would hear the oscillating detector signal when the the key was up and the transmitter signal when the key was down. The key-up signal was loud and clear and almost as strong as the transmitter signal. Of course, this same problem existed when transmission was the other way around. Since operation was on one



common frequency, this caused some confusion.

In earlier days, long-wave transmitters with arc or alternator designs could not be keyed by the usual on/off method so the frequency was shifted up and down by the keying circuits. For example, a transmitter may be assigned to transmit on 18 kHz with the key down; with the key up the circuit would be shifted to 22 kHz. The dots and dashes of a message could be heard on 18 kHz but other keying could be heard on 22 kHz. The signal on 22 kHz was referred to as a "back-wave."

In our case we solved the problem by running the transmitters and receivers in the BC-148s on slightly different frequencies. (Vintage Military Equipment, continued)

installed in the vehicle. The radio is one of many types used by the Army for short-range work and operates on VHF bands with FM modulation.

Trish Gibbons, WA6UBE, joined the group with her 1954 Army M-37, %-ton communications truck. The M-37 is probably best known as the "Dodge Weapons Carrier." This 4-wheel drive vehicle has been used for many different purposes, including cargo, ambulance and communications work. The Type S-144 shelter installed on the back of the truck was well equipped with late model digital tactical communications equipment on all bands. These late model surplus radios are often referred to as "green radios" because of their paint.

Off to the side a 1942 Ford GPW jeep with an AN/GRC-9 (Ground Radio Communications) and an RT-70 (Receiver/Transmitter, part of another GRC system) was used to move equipment from the campground area to the NCO club. Willys and Ford built most World War II Jeeps — while the Ford unit is called the "GPW," the Willys is known



A Rhodes and Schwartz Model EK-07D German receiver owned by Dan Arney, KN7DI. Sometimes referred to as the "Rolls Royce R-390," this receiver was in the \$5,000 range in the early years of its production. The 27 tubes can be checked in circuit by a built-in test meter. The weight is 150 pounds and the frequency range is 500 kHz to 30.1 MHz.

VOR (VHF OmniRange) AN/ARN-30 Navigation Receiver

VHF Omnirange (VOR) bearings are being received from a nearby Omnirange station on 112.4 MHz with this AN/ARN-30 navigation receiver. A red flag at the bottom of the cross pointer instrument is pulled out of sight indicating the signals are suitable for navigation purposes. If either the transmitter or the receiver fails, the red flag appears to warn the pilot that the information is not valid.

A small Omnibearing Selector (OBS) knob on the bottom left of the in-

strument has been adjusted for a slight error to the right of center on the Type IN-10 cross pointer indicator. Normally, the OBS is adjusted to center the vertical meter pointer and the magnetic bearing to the station is read from the compass card around the edge of the meter. Circuits in the receiver also indicate whether the bearing selected will take you to or from the station.

The small receiver on the bottom left is a 75 MHz Marker Beacon set. As an aircraft passes over Marker Beacon transmitters, one of three colored lamps indicate which beacon it is over. Three types of beacon transmitters are in use. One is located along airway routes at designat-



ed points, while the other two are called "Outer" or "Middle" markers (OM/MM). The OM and MM transmitter sets are located on the flight path to the runway for landing purposes. The transmitters are modulated with three different audio tones to activate the lamps.

The similar size receiver on the right is a 20-channel Glide Slope (GS) receiver. GS circuits are used to guide a plane down a precision slope to the runway. The combination of equipment makes up an Instrument Landing System (ILS). The black receiver to the right is a complete RU-18 Navy communications receiver operating on 12V DC. Several plug-in coil sets provide tuning from 195 kHz to 13 MHz.

as the "MB."

Another impressive installation was Dennis DuVall's red van with a 40-foot pneumatic mast on the back. An air compressor could be heard running from time to time to keep the mast up in the air. Rian Robinson, W6SVU, assisted Dennis in operating a large, high-power Type T-368 transmitter and R-392 receiver. The transmitter puts out about 400 watts, while the receiver is the military mobile version of the ever-popular R-390 radio. The antenna was a half-wave wire to nearby trees.

Meet activities were coordinated by the use of an Army PA system with an original Type T-17 carbon mike. A modem CD player provided great 1940s and 1950s music while the meet was underway. The PA system was a great deal of help in getting the word out as to what was happening and what was next on the schedule.

FRIDAY ACTIVITIES

On Friday, the NCO Club was opened early in the moming, and the meet was officially underway. Informal set up, field operations, and socializing took place most of the day. Many of the collectors were able to meet each other face-to-face after


years of radio contacts, phone calls, e-mails and letter exchanges. More equipment arrived for dis-

play in the club.

Pizza, drinks and salad were served late Friday afternoon for about 50 people. The signin list indicates there were over 65 present for the day's activities.



This old Army PA system with two homs outside helped keep the meeting schedules on time. The T-17 carbon mike worked very well.



Jay Coward, KE6PPF, assembled this navigational system. A Navy Type ARB communications receiver is combined with a ZB-3 UHF navigation receiver on top. The UHF receiver converted navigation signals transmitted by an aircraft carrier down to the tuning range of the ARB receiver. Coded signals told the pilot which way to fly to return to the carrier. A DU-2 loop is on the left above control boxes and range filter. The loop was used for direction-finding work on lower frequencies.

The first of several DF (Direction Finding) exercises was conducted just after lunch. Cam Ogan, WA6VVC, provided a very small battery-operated transmitter with programmable voice message and variable RF power output. The signal source is 51 MHz FM. A few trial runs were conducted so everyone could get a bit of experience with their antenna loops and portable rigs. Any type of equipment capable of receiving 51 MHz FM signals could be used to find the hidden transmitter. (See box on page 20 for (Text continued on page 21)

The Hidden Transmitter Hunts

Friday afternoon, we organized four direction-finding (DF) tests or hidden transmitter hunts. The first three allowed every one to practice with their vintage equipment. The initial hunt was rather easy with the signal source almost within sight of the starting point. The second hunt was a bit harder, while the third required some skill to locate the little hidden transmitter in a large field across the street from our meeting place.

About 4 P.M., the fourth and final DF test was announced and eight operators warmed up their rigs for the run. This time the transmitter was moved out of the staging area by a crew of four aboard the GPW Jeep. Contestants saw the vehicle travel around the camp roads and disappear behind some buildings about a mile away. Dennis DuVall, operating the PA system, was in 2-way radio communications with the Jeep crew. He made periodic announcements on the PA system of the placement progress. A few minutes later the DF signal came on the air, but everyone was told to wait until the Jeep crew returned from their jaunt. As the crew drove into the staging area a final PA announcement kicked off the hunt.

Eight hunters took off in all four directions looking for the signal. Some were heading in the direction the jeep was last seen while others were going in the opposite direction. There were hunters in the fields, around the RV area, near the NCO club, and just about any other area or direction you could think of.

What the participants did not know was that as the Jeep left the area, it stopped in front of the NCO club for a few seconds. By entering another door out of sight of the hunters, someone had placed the transmitter in a stall in the men's room. Meanwhile, the Jeep crew had driven around the camp roads making sure everyone could see the Jeep in the distance. When it disappeared behind some buildings about a mile away, Dennis DuVall, who was operating the PA system, ran back to the men's room and turned on the transmitter. A brief message to the Jeep reported that the deed was done, and it was time to drive back. This bit of electronic deception used by the armed forces past and present seemed appropriate at this time.

Mark Blair and Cam Ogan were the first to locate the rig with their PRC-6 and PRC-77 units. PRC-6 hand-held radios were used extensively during the Korean War, and the PRC-77 was the backbone of Army forward communications during the Vietnam conflict. The PRC-6 uses miniature tubes, while the PRC-77 is solid-state design all the way. The two hunters looked under the old wooden club building, in the boiler room, behind trash bins and all over the outside until they

finally went inside. A big smile announced to all they had found the signal source.

Tom Horsfall, WAGOPE, was next to iocate the rig. Tom spent some time in and around the lounge near the men's room looking for the signal. Eventually he entered the room but came back out after a few minutes. Tom made a few more sweeps of the lounge and bar area and then entered the restroom again. A loud exclamation indicated he had indeed located the hidden transmitter with his PRC-6 and loop.

When asked why he had not found the rig the first time, he said he saw a sign on the stall door. Of course that sign, shown below, was placed on the door when the transmitter was planted!



Participants and observers had a great time with this exercise. Everyone, DF'ers and plotters, had a lot to talk about for the next hour or so.

more information on the hidder
transmitter hunt.)

One DF'er did not have a loop, so he used his PRC-6 (Portable Radio Communications) with the antenna against his body for locating the little transmitter. His body acted like a shield for the antenna and provided directional indications. As he got closer, he folded the antenna up and took some more bearings by using his body as an RF shield. When really close, he removed the antenna and put a finger on the antenna post, which provided even more directional information. When just about on top of the transmitter, he used only the PRC-6 with no antenna as a probe to locate the culprit!

Andy Miller, KD6TKX, and Andy Becker, N0NVM, ran a DX (Distance) test with Navy MAB-to-MAB rigs on 3885 kHz. They worked about ¾ of a mile apart on AM. The MAB is from the early part of World War II and operates from 2300 to 4500 kHz using AM modulation. Batteries and vibrator circuits provide power. Packaging is such that the portable units can be carried on an operators backs with suitable racks and straps. The antenna is a short flexible whip. The two operators had complete sets with all accessories as issued many years ago.

In a comer of the display room, a TG-7 teletype machine from 1943 (a military model of the commercial Model 15) with cover removed was clanking away at 60 wpm on local loop. This display provided a dynamic comparison between 1940s mechanical equipment operation and new solid-state gear that has no moving parts. Needless to say the noise from the machine attracted guite a few onlookers.

SATURDAY ACTIVITIES

At 4:57 a.m. on Saturday, the scheduled swap meet activity started. The NCO club was

opened, and a coffee pot plugged in to greet the early arrivals. The first light of dawn was still half an hour away as several flashlights pierced the darkened backs of trucks and vans to reveal military treasures. Muffled voices in the dark could be heard making deals, trades and sales. More trucks, vans and trailers arrived to fill the parking area. A large crowd pored over the various military items, which included transmitters, receivers, power supplies, manuals, parts and other accessories. Some of the rather rare items that were on display in the club found their way to tables in the swap meet to the delight of many buyers.

This busy period continued until about 9 A.M. when the formal program began in the club meeting room. Ludwell Sibley started the scheduled programs with an interesting series of slides and a spirited discussion of German and Japanese World War II equipment. Questions and comments from the group added to the program. Ludwell is the author of *Tube Lore*, a reference for users and collectors of vacuum tubes.

Bart Lee presented his continuing series on "Radio Intercept." For many years, Bart has been fascinated with radio eavesdropping, spying, decoding messages and gathering intelligence over radio circuits. He has been a regular participant and his long and detailed research was appreciated by all present. Bart is an active member of the California Historical Radio Society (CHRS) and the Antique Wireless Association (AWA).

trated by Dave Ragsdale with the able assistance of Quentyn Brown. The fire got a bit too high for a short while but a couple of cans of water took care of the problem. Just short of 100 servings were delivered during this popular part of the meet. The meal was excellent, and, as usual, there were no leftovers.

Cam Ogan and Mike Frey took the podium after lunch and presented a program on the late model "green radios." (These late, digital tactical radios are so called because of the paint used on equipment manufactured in more recent years. Earlier military radios were painted black or with the familiar olive drab paint scheme.) This area of collecting is becoming more popular, and many questions were raised and answered. Several working sets were available for a close look and hands-on experience.

Late in the afternoon Dennis DuVall made an announcement that a World War I flying ace with 19 kills would like to address the group. Although 9 of the kills were friendly and 10 were enemy, we decided to let the speaker proceed. Then, out walked Bjom Forsberg in a World War I flying helmet with World War I French goggles, scarf and flying jacket. The spoof brought back memories of our first meet five years ago when Bjom appeared dressed in a complete Russian submarine commanders uniform with medals from Russia, USA, England and France!

Bjom discussed the RAF's (Royal Air Force) early 1930s regenerative receiver and accessories as used in the British Swordfish biplanes. The RAF R.1082 plug-in coil receiver works very

well on all frequencies from 100 kHz to 22 MHz One wonders how an operator changed bands while in the air since the set has 28 plug-in coils to cover all the bands. So far Bjorn has been a speaker at every MRCG meet, and we look forward to his sixth presentation next year.

A great daylong trip to the John Steinbeck



The Bay Area Maritime Museum is another attraction in the San Francisco area that interests many meet participants. Bart Lee, Tom Horsfall, and Dick Dillman have been involved in developing this museum. If you're in the area, be sure to visit the complete victory ship radio installation ashore, as well as the S.S. Jeremiah O'Brien, a restored and operational Liberty Ship, and the U.S.S. Pampanito, a fleet submarine from the 1940s. Many hours of volunteer work were necessary to restore all of the radio equipment in these vessels to operational status.


In the Los Angeles area, there is also a restored and operational victory ship, the S.S. Lane

Spare tubes are displayed in the box in the front of the unit.

Verschoor had just introduced his Kadette, not sold through Emerson, a move that put International on the map. The parting between Verschoor and Abrams seems to have been amicable, but I don't know.
