



EDITOR'S COMMENTS

The anticipation of the past year reached its zenith at last. The Ralph Muchow estate auction has become history, and to say that it was a success would certainly be an understatement. More than 300 collectors came to lay over a million dollars on the table for the enrichment of their own collections. The numbers speak for themselves — 177 items exceeded \$1.000, 15 of which brought \$10,000 or more. This auction will be the talk of the radio community for a long time to come.

These collectors also came just to view Dr. Muchow's legacy — a meticulously maintained collection that was his contribution to the preservation of radio history. He would have been pleased to know that his efforts were much admired and valued. We could do no less than give you a preview in this issue of the proceedings of the 3-day event, with a promise of a definitive report next month.

Some have criticized the frequency of auctions appearing on our pages; however, there is no question that auctions are where the action is. The interest in the Muchow auction and in auctions by Estes, Harris, eBay, and at meets makes it obvious that auctions w II continue to play a significant role in antique radio collecting.

But, without intrepid reporters like Ray Chase, and his wife Edith, who recorded 68 pages of listings, we would be unable to report fully on these events. Edith, incidentally, is the perfect "radio-wife." Not only does she spell Ray in note-taking, but she also supplies him with sustenance as he pursues their joint task. Our sincere thanks to them for the excerpts presented in this issue and the complete report to come.

An unexpected connection to the Muchow auction became evident when Dave Crocker contributed an article about a recent find — a Western Electric CW-936. A similar set sold in the Muchow auction for \$7,000. Finding two such sets in almost complete condition is certainly unusual and worth noting.

Articles sometimes just evolve over a long period — a bit like Art Kingsley's elongated radio. A year ago at the annual AWA Conference in Rochester, New York, I happened to meet Art, and he showed me a photo of his 20-foot long radio. The photo corroborated what might otherwise have sounded like what we used to call a "fish story." There it was — all 20 feet — with its creator at the helm. It was obvious that a significant story was in the offing, and Art agreed to tell it in an A.R.C. article.

Photo Review this month triggered a bit of personal nostalgia. The "foxhole" crystal set repro made with razor blades and pencil lead reminded me of a similar project I had undertaken at about age eleven. How many others out there also spent their childhood leisure

hours jamming razor blades into wood and whittling pencils down to the lead in order to listen to local radio stations in the wee hours of the morning?

Although the Houston Virtage Radio Association did not provide us with a report on its nearly \$20,000 auction, we were able to put together an account from its club publication and Web-site. An interesting aside is that this convention was an excellent example of club collaboration. George Potter, active in the Dallas VRPS and faithful reporter of their auctions for A.R.C., presented a seminar on his extensive display of De Forest

Even short reports are valuable. Anthony Patti sent an account of the Mapes Gallery auction of the Al Battison estate. This auction house in Vestal, New York, is worth watching for announcements about the inclusion of radios in future auct ons.

The excitement about John Slusser's publication of the fifth edition of the Collector's Guide to Antique Radios prompted last month's cover. We then asked Dick Desjarlais to review the book, which has 40 more pages and describes and prices 9.000 models. All new photos added to Dick's enthusiasm for the book.

Obtaining a quality replacement for grille cloth is problem enough, but when 'he surface to be covered is curved, most of us are in trouble. Ted Rogers attacked the problem and won the battle. He shares with us a step-by-step process with cear illustrations — the kind of regain article we all appreciate.

Radio Miscellanea provides corrections by careful readers — welcome input that improves the accuracy of our reports. We're also glac to report that antique radio has become a theme even for B & B's.

The Internet. There's always more to see on our Web site. We like to think it is a reliable source of information about the activities of the world of antique radio collectors.

Coming Radio Events. The fall radio season is upon us, with over 50 meets scheduled for this month. Not-to-be-missed is the annual AWA Conference in Rochester, New York. Other events include the Military Radio Collector's Association annual meet in Tobyhanna, Pa.: the Southeastern Antique Radio Society's Swap Meet in Alpharetta, Ga.; the A.E.A. event in France; the National Vintage Communication Fair in England; and the Australian Radio/Phono Fest. There's a world of collecting out there — join in!

AUCTION HIGHLIGHTS

Ralph Muchow Estate Auction Tops \$1,000,000! Auction Highlights

Time was too short before our press deadline for more than this cursory report of the recent Muchow auction. For the October issue, we will have done our usual comparison of prices from various sources and will present a definitive report. (Editor)

The heat was on in Elgin, Illinois, August 3-5 — both inside and out. While temperatures soared outside, the excitement mounted inside the Hemmens Convention Center, as Auctioneer Richard Estes mounted the podium. At the peak on Saturday, a standing-room-only crowd of over 300 registered bidders had gathered for what well may be the radio auction of the decade.

The numbers speak for themselves — 1,733 items passed the block for a total of \$985,158. Adding the 5% buyer's premium made a grand total of \$1,034,416. This is the first antique radio auction on record — at least, to my knowledge — to exceed a million dollars. Note: All prices reported here subsequently will not include the buyer's premium.

Unfortunately, our deadline for the September issue of A.R.C. would not allow for more than a snapshot of this remarkable event, including the \$1,000+ items we have extracted from Ray Chase's 68-page hand-tabulated report. However, the October issue will have a detailed report from Ray Chase, Estes Auctions, and others. Our hats are off to Ray and his wife Edith who

deserve special accolades for their recording of all items during the whole 25½ hours of heavy bidding.

Most interesting was the fact that, throughout the three days, the level of intensity was maintained. On Friday, the 437 lots of tubes, paper, and advertising sold for \$101,000 — an amount far exceeding that for all the items in the usual auction sales at meets. Highlights included the two Orson Welles "War of the Worlds" transcription disks, selling at \$14,000, and a very rare Wireless Specialty Apparatus Co. Audion tube, which drew the top price of \$3,200.

It's doubtful that many there had ever seen such a wonderful array of advertising items, wall hangings

and stand-up displays. Eleven of them sold for over \$1,000 each.

Saturday and Sunday saw the same level of intensity with 1,300 lots selling for a total of \$884,000. In all, I would categorize three groups of offerings: unique, one-of-a-kind items; rare items; and items usually seen at flea markets and auctions. Many of the latter were picked up at market prices, especially by those who stayed until the end. And remember, everything, whether rare or common, was in good to excellent condition.

Though complaints were heard about the "astronomical" prices paid for some items, it's worth reflecting on that phenomenon. Yes, some prices did seem out of line, but how can you begin to put a price on such

items as the receiver Admiral Byrd took to the North Pole? The \$33.500 paid by an organization planning to take it on a trip that recreates his voyage to the Pole becomes reasonable in that light.

Is \$26,000 too much for a Collins Wireless telephone from 1906, a rare and important piece in radio history? This one could be the only one in existence. How about the Marconi 106D selling at \$15,000? Here is an example of a typical going rate, as two others have sold in recent years for about the same price. There is really no way to name a "right" price, as value, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder. And after all, the prices were no crazier than those seen often in eBay auctions.


And there was certainly much to

behold. I can't remember ever seeing 12 Atwater Kent breadboards, 6 Leutz and 9 E.H. Scott receivers in one auction. A total of 177 items went for over \$1,000 each. The high prices seem justified when you realize that the rare, quality items were there, and people had come from all over the world with money in their pockets to spend on them.

Just to give you a taste of the whole, the following is a quick overview of the items sold for over \$1,000. Prices are not guaranteed to be accurate. Tune in next month for a complete report with many more photos.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

A West Point Teaching Tool A 20-Foot Long Radio?

As one of ten Civil Service employees who joined with 25 Army officers in the Department of Electrical Engineering at West Point, Art Kingsley helped to replace a major teaching tool of the vacuum tube era with a comparable state-of-the-art device. The story is an interesting one that led to his creation of a 20' long radio. (Editor)

In the mid-1960s, each classroom in the Department of Electrical Engineering at the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, New York, had a large steel console containing a dynamic demonstrator as one of the training aids. It was a vacuum tube superheterodyne radio consisting of eight individual modules each 20" wide and 15" high. Each panel or module contained a stage from a superhet radio.




Figure 1. An example of a "Philco console," the vacuum tube version of the dynamic demonstrator superhet radio. It is comprised of 8 panels or modules consisting of an RF amplifier, converter, IF amplifier, diode detector/AVC, audio amplifier, phase splitter, power amplifier, and power supply. Unfortunately, the portable in the lower left obscures the audio amplifier.

In addition to these eight radio modules, the console also contained enough extra panels to build a 1.5 MHz transmitter. In this way, one class could build a transmitter and another could assemble a receiver, and they could communicate with each other. Figure 1 shows this console.

Since these consoles were manufactured by the Philco Radio Corporation, they were called "Philco consoles." We had 20 of them, and they served the Department well for many years. However, with the advent of solid-state technology, their days were numbered.

In early March of 1972, the Department let it be known that a solid-state replacement was being sought to replace the vacuum tube demonstrators. We started contacting manufacturers and vendors for their input to our requirements, and, of course, Philco was high on our list.

SPECIFICATIONS

Besides being a superhet radio, what other capabilities did these units require? Our specifications included flexibility and the ability of a unit to parallel closely the course material as it was being taught at the time. The solid-state components had to be discrete rather than integrated circuits. Connecting external test equipment to the radio could not adversely load it down. And, of course, cost was a big consideration.

As the responses from the vendors started to come in, we knew we were in big trouble. The individual cost of these units varied from about \$1,500 to \$5,000 each, and we needed 20 of them. Also, they in no way paralleled the course material as it was being taught at that time.

BUILDING A DYNAMIC DEMONSTRATOR PROTOTYPE

So, it was back to the drawing board to figure out how to acquire 20 dynamic demonstrators at a reasonable cost. Our final solution turned out to be the best of all worlds. We decided there was perhaps enough expertise present in the department to design and build our own.

We had 20 electrical engineers, our instructors, a highly qualified technical support crew, and a completely operational machine shop. Yes, we were already busy with the everyday needs of running an electrical engineering course for the cadets at the United States Military Academy; however, we thought that with careful job assignments, this course of action was guite feasible.

The original design and planning for this new training aid was turned over to Major Don Voss, one of our instructors, and me, a member of the technical support crew. Don was to come up with the original circuit design, and I, with support from our machine shop, was to build and test a prototype.




Figure 2. This partial view of the prototype of the solid-state dynamic demonstrator shows the RF amplifier, mixer/oscillator, audio amplifier, and driver/push-pull amplifier modules.




Figure 3. Major Don Voss tunes a production model of the solid-state demonstrator. Note the nice silk-screened panels courtesy of the Tobyhanna Army Depot.

The size of this device was to be the same as the old Philco console, with all components except transistors and IF cans to be of the plug-in type. We decided that the power supply had to be heavy enough so that, besides supplying the required voltages for the dynamic demonstrator, it could supply all voltage requirements for other experiments at 20 positions in each classroom.

We had very little time in our daily schedules for this large task. Don was still carrying a full instructor's load, and was helping to handle the daily chores inherent in teaching an electrical engineering course. Dynamic lectures were also a large part of this workload, with a new lecture

required every Saturday. New training aids were being built continuously, as we went from the vacuum tube era into the new world of solid-state.

Needless to say, things were really humming, and nobody sat around twiddling his thumbs. I was deeply involved in helping to design and build some really crazy devices too numerous to describe here. As busy as I was at the time, whenever I look back at it, I always feel that the experience was part of the best time of my life. I used to call my work world my "toy shop."

Monthly meetings were held with the Department Executive Officer so that everybody was on the same page. To retain the old steel console was an early decision at one of these meetings, thereby saving many thousands of dollars.

With the assistance of the machine shop, I built eight panels made of 1/4" Masonite. Covered with white paper, they were fabricated so that we could draw the circuit on the front of each panel, showing the locations of all parts and their values. It was on these panels that we built the original prototype. A partial view of the prototype is shown in Figure 2.

After much testing and tuning, we finally settled on what appeared to be a decent looking and playing radio. At this time, we turned this prototype over to the rest of the instructors for their feedback and suggestions. After about three weeks of this testing and probing, we settled on a final circuit. It was with this circuit that we planned to move forward.

REPRODUCING THE PROTOTYPE IN QUANTITY

As money was very tight during this time frame, Don and I used to travel to Tobyhanna Army Depot in Tobyhanna, Pennsylvania, on what we called our "scav-

hanna, Pennsylvania, on what we called our "scavenger hunts." This depot was a property disposal base. It also contained not only a full electronic service facility, but also a machine shop capable of design and construction of major parts and components of many of these systems. It was the latter that was to stand us in good stead in the plans for our new classroom receivers.

While we were there on one of these scrounging missions, we mentioned to them quite by accident our plans for the new solid-state, dynamic demonstrator radios. They then let it be known that they also had a printed circuit facility, capable of producing rather large circuit boards.

In addition, on one side of the board, they could print the circuit, while on the other side they could silk-screen a complete 4-color pictorial of what each board represented. We thought we had died and gone to heaven!

Things got even better: Not only could they do all this for us, but it would be at no cost to us. This involved 200 boards. Wow!

Now it was time to start looking for the individual components: resistors, capacitors, transistors, controls, etc., and all these in large quantities. All during this time. Don and I continued our

ties. All during this time, Don and I continued our scrounging missions and eventually came away with all the transistors required for this large project. We also found many of the resistors and capacitors. How could you beat that!

By the winter of 1974-75, the first set was completed. After some tweaking here and there, the design was frozen, and full production started shortly thereafter.

However, the problem of acquiring suitable tuning capacitors loomed. We called all over the country but had no luck. This problem threatened the whole project. But, sometimes things happen over which we have no control — a stroke of genius offered a solution.

Why not use field-effect transistors in the RF and local oscillator stages, thereby allowing us to use the tuning circuits from the old vacuum tube demonstrators? This idea not only solved a serious problem, but gave us another teaching tool the field-effect transistor. Now we knew we were going to have a wonderful teaching tool that we had designed ourselves one that would make us all very proud. In addition, the monetary savings to the Department were inestimable.




Figure 4. The mixer/oxcillator stage shown in this closeup is typical of the panels used in the production sets. The panel is used to mount the circuit's components and to display its schematic diagrams. Connections to the preceding and following stages are made by the jumper wires shown at the left and right sides of the panel.

Figure 3 shows Major Don Voss tuning a production version of the solid-state dynamic demonstrator. A closeup of a typical panel of the production sets is shown in Figure 4.




Figure 5. Art Kingsley views his creation — the 20-foot long radio.

Getting back to the 20' transistor radio: As a sort of joke, I set these panels up horizontal-

ly instead of vertically. Using the two regulator panels and a separate speaker panel, the total length of the radio is now 20' long, as Figure 5 shows. I wish I could have done this with the vacuum tube radio as well, and I would have the satisfaction of having a 20' vacuum tube radio, as well as a 20' solid-state radio.

Incidentally, we called these radios D.E.E.R. radios, or Department of Electrical Engineering Radios.

EARLY WIRELESS

The Western Electric CW-936 Radio Telephone System

BY DAVE CROCKER

The CW-936 system is featured on our cover. One of the highlights of the much anticipated Muchow Auction in August was a Western Electric CW-936 Radio Telephone system. A few months earlier, Dave Crocker found this radio for sale in Foxboro, Mass., with almost all its components Intact. Here Dave shares detailed information about this rarely seen system. (Editor)

When the U.S. entered World War I in 1917, the U.S. Navy was in need of a more modern method of communications for its warships other than the telegraph. Western Electric answered this need with the introduction of the CW-936 Radio Telephone System.

Existing radio patents did not apply here since the system had been ordered by the government in war emergency times. The CW-936 system was designed for use on U.S. Navy World War I subchasers, and whether or not it was used on other warships of the time is not clear. However, It is generally considered to be the first commercially produced radio telephone and telegraph transmitter.

THE CW-936 TRANSMITTER/ RECEIVER




Figure 1. The massive Western Electric CW-938 Radio Telephone receiver and transmitter. The set as found was missing two meters; however, for the photos in this issue, the existing meter was copied in the position of the missing two. Dave has since acquired the meters and the set is complete.

The entire CW-936 system consisted of eight major components, plus two pairs of Westem Electric headphones and a pushbutton handle device for the extension box. The largest piece is the CW-938 transmitter/receiver, shown in Figure 1. It is a massive component measuring 24½" x 18½" and weighing in at a hefty 60 pounds!

Outside its box-jointed, walnut cabinet (nothing too good for the U.S. Navy) is a plethora of brass. This includes all the

heavy hardware used throughout the construction. All the other brightwork, such as the name-plates, corner protectors, dials and switches, are gold-plated.

There is a total of 22 binding post terminals on the panel. The left-hand panel section can be removed to expose the transmitter for adjustment purposes. All the internal parts are attached to the back of the front panel, which, when unlatched, pulls down for service.

Figure 2 shows the CW-938 opened to reveal

its tube complement, consisting of two Type VT-2 (tennis bal) tubes and three Type VT-1 tubes. The transmitter is a self-excited oscillator type. The receiver, in all probability, has a regenerative circuit. The set tunes from 256 to 600 meters.

THE CW-926A AMPLIFIER




Figure 3. The matching 3-tube CW-926A amplifier.




Figure 4. The interior of the CW-926A with its front panel and chassis unlatched and lowered. It operates using three Type VT-1 tubes.

The second major piece of the system is the matching CW-926A amplifier, shown in Figure 3. This audio amplifier measures 20" x 11" x 6½" and weighs 30 pounds. It, too, has a walnut cabinet

adorned with similar brass fixtures, but only 7 binding post terminals. Figure 4 shows the front panel and chassis pulled down to expose the three Type VT-1 amplifying tubes

THE ENTIRE SYSTEM




Figure 5. Diagram of the entire CW-936 Radio Telephone system with all components and wiring. (From "Robinson's Manual of Radio Telegraphy and Telephony for the use of Naval Electricians.")

The entire CW-936 system is shown in the diagram in Figure 5. Besides the CW-938 transmitter/receiver and the CW-926A amplifier, previously described, you can see in the lower left the CW-928 switchboard, connecting the twin dynamotors to the receiver/transmitter. It, too, is housed in a walnut cabinet having 16 terminals.

The dynamotor unit (CW-927), at the lower center of the diagram consists of two motor generators, each producing 350 volts, which are spring-mounted inside a triangular metal frame. These dynamotors were manufactured by the Westinghouse Company.

In the upper portion of the diagram is the CW-1052 extension box, a cast metal, waterproof housing with a pull-down front panel. Connected to this unit is a push-button switch on a handle (CW-1054), a 13" metal horn loud speaker (CW-929), a waterproof metallic microphone (CW-1053) and a pair of Western Electric headphones (CW-834). All of these items, including the extension box, were mounted in the pilot house of the vessel. Everything else was situated in the ship's radio room.

In the middle right of the Figure 5 diagram is shown the Western Electric antenna knife switch (CW-969) with its three insulators mounted on a wooden base. At the lower right of the diagram is a second pair of WE phones, and the unique handheld microphone and hanger (CW-930), both of which were made by Western Electric.




Figure 6. Some of the CW-936 system components. Clockwise from top left: the twin dynamotors, the emergency battery box, the antenna knife switch, the horn loud speaker, and the hand-held microphone and holder.

Figure 6 shows some of the aforementioned components. However, included, but not men(Continued)

tioned before, is the emergency battery box in the upper right, for which I do not have the CW number

I found the transmitter/receiver and its matching 3-tube amplifier in their original crates, (see Figure 7), which kept them in practically unused condition. A cleaner, some wax, and lots of elbow grease removed 80 odd years of dirt and grime and brought the set back to nearoriginal condition.

As I have said, these pieces were over-built to rigid U.S. Navy specifications to insure their survivability. "Built like a battleship" certainly applies here. Figure 8 shows the upper right corner of the receiver/transmitter. You can see the use of heavy brass construction. This system was truly built to last, and it did just that!

Whereas Dave's system was found with the shipping boxes, the Muchow system, instead, had the switchboard panel. Condition was similar since the Muchow system was in "contest" condition along with a Blue ribbon it had won to prove it. (Editor)



MEET & AUCTION REPORT

HVRA-AWA 22nd Annual Convention - 2001 Houston, Texas — February 2-4, 2001

COMPILED FROM REPORTS IN THE HVRA GRID LEAK AND ON THE HVRA WEB SITE

The 22nd annual Houston Vintage Radio Association (HVRA) and Antique Wireless Assoclation (AWA) Convention was held on February 2-4, 2001, at the Hobby Airport Hilton In Houston, Texas. The weekend included a full program of auctions, exhibits, contests, and technical seminars. And for family members not involved in radio, there are always many interesting things to do In Houston.

Collectors arrived on Friday from around the city, country-side and surrounding states, bringing the total to 110 registered bidders. Equipment for the auction began arriving before the doors were opened.

Club rules for the Friday auction called for a \$10 minimum opening bid. The first part of this

auction was designated for tubes and collectible paper Items. An estate from a local family brought in over 20 tube caddies full of tubes, plus many assorted parts and test gear. One particular tube caddy had a number of 01-As and sold for \$250. Rider's manuals were plentiful.

After the tube and paper items were sold, radio items, such as the small wood and Bakelite sets, were moved along. The Friday night auction lasted until about 10:30 PM., and by the time everyone got checked out and their purchases removed, it was approaching midnight.

Auctioneer Bill Werzner, with the assistance of VRPS president and auctioneer Jim Sargent, kept

the auctions moving at a rapid pace. Many of the items that did not sell on Friday were auctioned at the end of the Saturday's auction.

The Saturday auction, offering cathedrals, tombstones, consoles and telephones, got started with the \$20 minimum-bid items. Highlights included an Atwater Kent 35 with power supply, an E4 speaker and an advertisement selling at \$200; a Grebe MU-1 syncrophase at \$200; a very heavy, World War II, German, vintage brass resistance box at \$270; a National HRO-50 at \$200; a Shure 5B microphone on a floorstand at \$300; and an Atlas battery radlo in Its original box at \$340.

The Friday night and Saturday afternoon auctions brought a total of \$19,665, with 683 lots passing through the auctioneer's hands.


The old equipment contest had 70 entries in 22 categories, and the quality of the equipment was excellent. Billy Richardson's Pressley Hypower receiver won "Best of Show." There was also a large display of De Forest receivers, entered by George Potter. This display was honored with both the President's Award and People's Choice Award.

Mapes Auction Gallery — The Battison Estate Auction Vestal, New York — February 16, 2001

On February 16, 2001, the Mapes Auction Gallery of Vestal, New York, held an auction of thousands of general items from the estate of Al Battison, W1HE. About 100 of the 450 items sold were radios or radio-related. Battison was an avid collector of early radios and anything closely related to the subject. In fact, he could be called the original pack rat of the radio world!

After many days of sorting and boxing the thousands of items collected from Mr. Battison's house, Mapes Auction Gallery sold the choice pieces of the collection on Friday, February 16. The audience consisted of over 200 potential buyers. The hottest items included large vacuum tubes, telegraph keys and a stack of Collins 32V-3 radios. Early QST and Radio News magazines also did very well.

Some of the more interesting items were a lot of military boxed tubes, selling at \$270; four Collins 32V-3s, at \$1,240; a small lot of General Radio catalogs, at \$300; an Aztec microphone, at \$200; an Easton telegraph key, at \$210; *Radio News* magazines, at \$250; and *QST* magazines, at \$275. Early

radios by Grebe, Browning Drake, Stromberg-Carlson, and Atwater Kent sold for between \$70 and \$200. A telegraph Key by Lionel in the original box sold for \$90.

The radio section of the auction totalled approximately \$7,000. Interestingly, many of our buyers contacted us via the Internet on our Web site, mapesauction.com, which allows us to meet the needs of far off clients who could not make the actual auction.

Mapes Auction Gallery has about two radio and electronic equipment auctions per year, but we often have radios and related equipment in our weekly auctions. We generally mention the fact that radios and the like will be offered at our auctions, and many times will post photos of the items on our Web site.

BOOK REVIEW

Collector's Guide to Antique Radios, 5th Ed. By John Slusser and the Staff of Radio Daze


In 1987, the founders of the New England Antique Radio Club, Marty and Sue Bunis, published the first of a series of reference and price guides, entitled *Collector's Guide to Antique Radios*. By popular demand, other editions followed, with the fourth and last edition published in 1997. Those of us who still appreciate hard copy, as well as or in place of the Internet and CDs, longed for a fifth edition of the Bunis series.

Fortunately, this longing has now been fulfilled with the publication of the fifth edition of the Collector's Guide to Antique Radios by John Slusser and his staff at Radio Daze. Although very similar in format to the earlier Bunis editions, the fifth edition adds more diversity with the inclusion of more photos and listings for battery radios and consoles. It also has a special section on E.H. Scott radios, featuring 28 listings and 20 photos.

The author's stated goal is "to provide the radio style (console, table, etc.), year of initial market introduction, case material (wood, plastic, etc.), an identifying description, the number of knobs, type of reception (AM broadcast band, FM, etc.), the number of tubes, and the type of power utilized (AC, battery, etc.) for each listing." Clearly, this book is intended to guide the reader in identifying old radios, as well as to provide current pricing information.

The author gives a candid and realistic explanation of pricing, and the price ranges represent an average of various pricing sources. Price ranges, as first utilized in the fourth edition, have been reviewed, and, where appropriate, updated to reflect current market values.

In the four year period from 1997 to 2001, most of the radios listed have experienced a modest increase in price, ranging usually from \$25 to \$50. Some examples include the Federal Model 110, increasing from \$700-\$750 to \$750-\$800; the Tuska 222, from \$700-\$800 to \$750-\$850; and the Guild Grafanola 785, from \$125-\$150 to \$140-\$170. The Sparton Model 557 Blue Mirror radio remained at \$2,000 plus. The Zenith Model 12S232 "Walton" tombstone also remained unchanged, at \$1,200-\$1,300; but the Zenith 9S232 increased from \$900-\$1,000 to \$1,000-\$1,100. The Zenith Trans-Oceanic Model B-600 (6A40 chassis) increased from \$75-\$85 to \$90-\$120. A very



few radios are listed at a lower value than in the fourth edition.

Typographical errors are hard to find, but one example worth noting is on page 161, where the Philco Model 18L is listed as Model "8L." A glossary of radio terms, especially suited to the novice collector, is presented at the beginning of the book.

All in all, this fifth edition is a worthy and welcome extension of the Bunis tradition.

RESTORATION TOPICS

Installing Grille Cloth on Curved Surfaces

BY TED ROGERS

Replacement of a radio grille cloth can be a challenging task even if its mounting surface is flat. A curved surface can make the job even more difficult. Ted Rogers offers an approach that can simplify this task and produce a wrinkle-free grille cloth. (Editor)

Several radios in my collection have curved or angular surfaces where the grille cloth is installed. How do you get the new grille cloth to fit without wrinkles and without getting glue on the visible areas? When these radios were built, the grille cloth was glued directly to the grille work, but the manufacturers probably used an elaborate gluing fixture. I have developed a method that is fairly easy to do, and the results are very good. The secret is to glue the new grille cloth to a piece of screen wire.




Figure 1. This simplified diagram shows the order in which a replacement grille cloth and its wire-screen backing are assembled.

THE PROCESS

First, get a piece of old-fashioned wire screen painted black. This is the best kind to use because it is the stiffest. In addition, the black paint tends to lock the joints of the screen wire together, making it less likely to unravel. Aluminum screen wire will work, but it is not as stiff. Plastic screen will not work at all because it is too flimsy.

Carefully measure the grille area, and then cut a piece of screen wire to that size. Test fit it in the cabinet to be sure of an exact, snug fit.

Next, cut a piece of 3/4" plywood 4 inches longer and 4 inches wider than the screen wire. The extra width and length is to provide a 2-inch margin.

Select your new grille cloth and cut a piece 8 inches longer and 8 inches wider than the screen wire. The extra width and length give you something to pull on when you install the grille cloth. Most grille cloth has some kind of a pattern, so take this into consideration before cutting the cloth. In this way, the pattern will look right on the finished product.

Wait until your wife goes shopping, and then use her steam iron to iron the grille cloth. Iron it

on the back side until all the wrinkles are gone.

Nearly all grille cloths have a front (face) side and a reverse side. Lay the grille cloth face down on the plywood base. Staple one side of the cloth to the plywood, stapling into the edge (not the face) of the plywood, as shown in Figure 1. Then, staple the other side of the cloth to the other edge of the plywood, stretching the cloth as you staple it. Repeat this procedure for the ends. You should now have a panel with the grille cloth stretched tightly over the plywood, face down, with no wrinkles.

Now, check the pattern. If you have distorted it by unevenly stretching the cloth, remove staples and restaple as necessary to correct the problem. Take your time doing this and get it right. What you see here is what you get on the finished job.

Next, lay the wire screen on an old newspaper and spray it on one side only with a spray adhesive, such as 3M Super 77. You can find this product in most hardware stores. Be sure all of the screen wire is covered with adhesive, but do not put on a heavy coat. You do not want it to




Figure 2. This Midwest Model 18-37 is an example of a radio cabinet in which the grille cloth must fit the angular shape of the cabinet's grille.

bleed through the screen wire or clog the openings. Let it dry for a few minutes until it is tacky.

Pick up the wire screen, turn it over so the sticky face is down, and hold it about an inch above the grille cloth. Move it around until you are satisfied that it is properly centered on the grille cloth pattern, and then lower it onto the grille cloth. Smooth it out with your hands.

THE FINAL STEP

The only remaining step is to weight the screen wire down to hold it flat against the grille cloth until the adhesive dries. Cut a piece of 3/4" plywood to the same size as the wire screen. Before placing this plywood on the wire screen, place a layer of ordinary kitchen wax paper on the screen wire. This will prevent any adhesive that has bled through to the top of the screen wire from sticking to the plywood.

After laying the plywood in place, put some kind of weight, like a can of paint, on top of it. Wait until the adhesive has dried before removing the weight. I usually just let it stand overnight. Figure 1 shows the stack-up described above.

After removing the weight, the top plywood and the wax paper, carefully remove the staples to release the grille cloth from the base. Do not try to remove the grille cloth by using a knife or a razor blade; grille cloth should be cut only with scissors.

After you have removed all of the staples, carefully trim the grille cloth to the edge of the screen wire. Again, use only a good pair of sharp scissors.

You now have in your hands a panel of wrinkle-free grille cloth glued to a stiff screenwire backing.

INSTALLING THE GRILLE CLOTH

Place the grille cloth in the cabinet, molding it to fit the contours of the cabinet's grille area. In some cases, the grille cloth and screen will snap into place and stay there without any fastening at all. In most cases, it will require fastening around the edges.

If the cabinet is strong enough and thick enough, you can run a row of staples around the edges of the panel. If the cabinet is too thin or fragile for stapling, the panel can be held in




Figure 3. This close-up of the Midwest 18-37 shows the angular construction of its cabinet.

place with a bead of glue or sealant around the edges. On some large grille areas, you may have to use some small tacks or brads to hold the panel tightly against the center areas of the grille.

Caution: Do not put any glue on the cabinet before installing the panel. It is not necessary, and you would surely get some glue on the grille cloth where it would show.

TWO SUCCESS STORIES

I have recently used this method to install new grille cloth in two consoles. The first one is a Midwest Model 18-37. As shown in Figure 2, the grille area is V-shaped from top to bottom. The replacement grille cloth measures 10 inches wide and 27 Inches high and is held in place by staples around the edges.

Three small brads in the center were needed to hold the grille panel firmly against the vertical center rail. The closeup in Figure 3 provides a view of the angled grille cloth. The speaker is mounted on a flat plywood baffle several inches behind the grille cloth.




Figure 5. This close-up of the Airline console shows the difficult task that awaits the installer of new grille cloth.

The other console, shown In Figure 4, is an Airline 62-403 "Movie-Dial" model. This radio has two grille cloths. The first one measures 5 inches wide and 19 inches high. It fits inside the hollow, half-round vertical post in the center of the radio. In this case, it simply snapped into place and required no fastening. The main grille cloth fits over the flat speaker baffle, and is installed by stretching and stapling it over the baffle. A detailed view of the grille cloths is provided in Figure 5.

After you have completed the job, ask your wife to come to the shop and tell you how nice the new grille cloth looks. She can also take this opportunity to tell you that you forgot to unplug her iron after you ironed the grille cloth.

The Tower House radio in the June 2001 ssue of A.R.C., p. 17, is apparently the same radio with a different clock, shown in the December 1998 *Photo Review*, and listed as an "Ingraham Clock Radio, Model Unknown." Its tube complement is the following: 224, (3): 47 output. (1): and an 80 rectifier.

The wording of the metal tag on the Tower House set seems to indicate that the set is a house brand sold by the H.M. Tower Corp. "Distributor American Bosch Radio" could indicate that the set was manufactured by Bosch for the Tower Co. The knobs/dial placement, the general shape of the cabinet and grille, and the overall look of the set are reminiscent of the Bosch table sets of the period, although without the clock. 1931 would seem to be a good guess as to manufacturing date. A cruise through the first three or four volumes of John F. Rider might produce a schematic to match the set.

Speaker ID Error

Dear Editor:

There appears to be an error in the identification of the loudspeakers on page 23 of the July 2001 issue. The speaker on the left, while it looks very much like an Atwater Kent E3, is probably a Crosley Type F Dynacone.

The dead giveaway is the pattern in the ornate grille. The speaker shown has the six small diamonds like my Crosley Dynacone, while my Atwater Kent speaker has six much larger, petal-shaped cutouts.

Both speakers are "magnetic" and use rigid "voice" coils to cause a magnetized bar to move and vibrate the cone. Most vintage magnetic speakers use a horse-shoe, permanent magnet as did the Atwater Kent speakers and the RCA 100 and 100A. However, the Crosley Dynacone used an electromagnet excited by the radio receiver, such as the Crosley Showbox.

An implication would be that the Crosley Dynacone speaker had to be used with a receiver that could supply 22 Vdc at 40 mA for the field, while the Atwater Kent speaker could be used with any radio wired for a magnetic speaker.
