

#### **EDITOR'S COMMENTS**

It's that time of year — another holiday season and another search for an appropriate December cover for A.R.C. We often begin with a pass through our files containing candidates submitted by subscribers, such as the photo on this cover. Or we look for holiday ads in vintage magazines, which present endless possibilities for tracing the more personal side of radio history.

Old ads and colorful brochures often depict families gathered around a set they may covet as a household gift. Better still, Santa may be on his way with a particular model to fill someone's heart's desire. In the case of the advertising sign on our cover, no set is in evidence, but clearly on his base, Santa is touting Sparton's "wonderful tone" as "Radio's Richest Voice."

This same 1926 advertising piece could well have been used for the subject of Alton DuBois' article — a 1928 Sparton Model 69 Equasonne, which he purchased for a mere \$70. But Alton must have thought Santa was working overtime for him in the back room when the dealer threw in a Sparton 29 cabinet speaker. The rare luck of finding both pieces at once would make any day seem like a holiday.

It could be argued that the radio holiday season never ends. But certainly the large 3-day events diminish in number along with the good weather. As fall gets fully underway, we begin gathering our report on the annual AWA Conference at Rochester, New York, which becomes a nice late summer holiday memory. This is still the largest, most diverse meet in the U. S., drawing participants from all over the country. Canada, Europe and Asia. Such an event is certainly a major feat and deserving of high praise for the organizers.

However, our editorial comments over the last several years, as well as the Internet comments included in *Radio Miscellanea* this month, convey concern throughout the radio community about the future of the AWA Conference. The consensus is that AWA can't be an exclusive club anymore, and that, in order to survive and maintain its membership, it must focus on a weekend schedule and open up to the general public.

I still adhere to the maxim appearing in the AWA announcement on our *Coming Radio Events* pages, "If you can go to only one meet, make it to this one." Still, other radio events like Extravaganza are now strong competitors for the top spot among events. We can only hope that AWA makes the changes necessary to retaining the appeal that it had for so many years.

Other meet and auction reports this month have a wide international flavor. Estes Auctions' sale of the Anderson Collection grossed \$125,000, the fourth highest for the firm. Among the many highly collectible items were several Art Deco Catalins and a Sparton blue mirror radio. In fact, whatever the category, the item was highly desirable; for example, the Atwater Kent 5, the Regency TR-1 transistor radio; and the Hudson-Ross 3 Little Pigs cathedral. As many as 22 items brought over \$1,000 each.

An interesting coincidence is that on the same day as the Estes auction in West Virginia, a major meet and auction took place across the world Richard Begbie reports on the Historic Radio Society of Australia's 20th anniversary meet and auction in Melbourne. You'll note another coincidence in the designation "AWA" in this listing, but here AWA means Amalgamated Wireless of Australia, maker of quality Bakelite sets, obviously not connected to the familiar U.S. club. It's always a pleasure to hear about a successful meet and the enthusiasm of our fellow collectors Downunder.

As we all know, Ray Chase gets around to more auctions than most of us could imagine attending. Even a very small one like that of the Westchester County collection in this issue contains a number of interesting items. Among them were a Philco 70 grandfather clock/radio selling at \$300 and an RCA Radiola 18 on an ornate speaker stand at \$350.

One Photo Review item reminds us of the post-World War II days when new gadgets to make life easier began to appear in the marketplace. The Westinghouse clock/radio could wake you up not only to music, but also to the smell of coffee. Other items offer something of interest to collectors of almost all radio categories.

Ted Rogers addresses a repair problem familiar to restorers of AC/DC radios — burnt-out resistance cords and ballast tubes. Ted describes using a diode as a replacement for a resistance line cord on a Radiokeg radio. Ted's article illustrates what we hope happens through A.R.C. — communication with other collectors and through articles that leads to solutions.

A.R.C. Benefits. By now, the pressure to choose holiday gifts is mounting, so be sure to consider A.R.C. benefits as a gift for a family member or friend. Note: a toll-free number, (866) 371-0512; Discover, Visa, American Express, and MasterCard accepted; books shipped free in the U. S. by book rate; and for current subscribers, a ten percent discount on all book orders.

Coming Radio Events. Though the holidays will be in full swing, there are still more than 30 events listed this month. Among them is the New Jersey Antique Radio Club's 10th anniversary celebration on December 13 with contests, games, prizes, and dinner. Congratulations NJARC! Try to make at least one event, despite your busy schedule.

# **MEET & AUCTION REPORT**

# Antique Wireless Association Conference and Auction Report

Rochester, New York — August 28-31, 2002

The Antique Wireless Association (AWA) held its 41st annual historical radio conference at the Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT) Inn and Conference Center, formerly the Thruway Marriott, in Rochester, New York, August 28-31, 2002. Registered attendees numbered 825, continuing a downward trend from 854 in 2001 and from 981 in 2000.

In general, AWA and RiT continue to try to make do with what is really a remnant of a hotel. Some of the old staff are still there and worked hard at being responsive. However, the accommodations reflect what they now are — dormitory rooms. Two beds, student desks, bare walls awaiting student posters, all smack of college days. The dining room is now a cafeteria, and though the food was edible, it was reminiscent of a military chow line and far from average hotel quality. One improvement was that the front section of the bar was open on a limited basis for the social gatherings so essential to the success of a major meet.

Another was the new, professional looking sign, compared to last year's makeshift cardboard job. Unfortunately, it contained the same cold message restricting the flea market to AWA members only — another opportunity lost to attract new members and buyers.

An unusual personal experience led me to conclude that the need for improvement in basic room security has become critical. One afternoon, I found a woman, who had been reported

missing for an hour, asleep in my room. This, of course, was a serious breach of security, as the housekeeping staff admitted they they had let her into the room.


Since AWA uses off-duty police for patrolling the flea market, the same must be done for the hotel. Considering the valubles necessarily left by collectors in their rooms, the club has to deal with security issues in a facility that is no longer a full-scale hotel.

Unfortunately, there was no sign of change from previous years in the way the meet was scheduled. In fact, "meet creep" in the opposite direction was even more evident. Instead of moving events toward the weekend, registration for the flea market opened on Tuesday. Since there was no patrol of premeet sales, about a dozen vendors were already in business on Tuesday.

In additon, the Tube Collectors Association met on Tuesday, and anyone was welcome to attend. Though AWA has no control over the Tube Association's plan, which is, no doubt, convenient for its members, the Tuesday meeting drains from AWA.

Many who come for Tuesday are apt to cut off a day at the end and leave early.

Flea market sellers numbered 288, but, of course, not everyone opened up at the same time. In my annual walk-around the flea market, I counted 196 sellers on Wednesday, up a little from last year's 189. On Thursday, the drop to 112 from 196, and even from last year's 148, was precipitous. Ironically, when I mentioned this to an AWA official, his reponse was, "That's good, We didn't have

a parking problem."

Surely, lower attendance isn't the solution for a club with a parking problem. Ironically, although parking spaces were available, attendees staying at other hotels were unable to use them and had to rely on the shuttle busses. Is AWA in the business of encouraging or discouraging attendance?

Though Friday was a beautiful day, most of the flea market vendors had left. By Saturday, the day when the general public might have been there in large numbers, the area was empty. In general, the number of vendors pleased with the results of their sales seemed to balance out with those who were displeased and said they were considering not coming next year.


The seminars were well attended, beginning with the Members' Forum, which included dis-

cussion of any number of issues. Later topics ranged from early wireless and cone speakers to Amateur radio and the Enigma Cipher Machine. The Ladies Tea in the Hotel Gazebo was a pleasant interlude for the radio wives and friends. However, the sightseeing trip was cancelled because of limited interest.

Fifty years of AWA as a theme for the old equipment contest inspired interesting entries, although there appeared to be a reduction in quantity from past years. An item had to have won a blue ribbon in the past to qualify as an entry. Most colorful was Norm Hertz's red, white and blue American crystal set.

Among the other outstanding entries pictured throughout this report were an early 1939 TV camera, a Swedish crystal set, a 1914 Bowman time receiver used by watch makers to receive time by wireless, an early Zenith Trans-Oceanic, and a DeForest RJ4 with spherical Audion, Well known as a collector of Italian radios, Bob Lozier presented an exceptional 1934 exhibit.

Missing, of course, from the contest actviites was the late Ralph Williams, for so long the driving force behind this event. Ralph knew how to plan wisely for the future, and for several years he had been grooming Jeff Byrne for the job. Jeff

gradually took over, and Ralph moved to the background, knowing the contest was in good hands. We would all profit from Raph's example.

The auction events showed a continuing decline from previous years. The bottom line this year was \$31,568, down 17 percent from last year, and probably closer to 22 percent if you consider that communications equipment did not have a secarate auction. From the heydays of 1997 and 1998, the auction take is down greater than 50 percent. If one were to factor in inflation, the slide would indeed be precipitous.

Certainly the Internet is a factor but this is too easy an answer, and any CEO viewing trends like these would be alarmed and thus trying new approaches. Otherwise, he would soon be looking for another job. The individual categories work out as follows: tubes, down over 25 percent from last year, 65 percent from peak; paper, down 25 percent from last year; equipment, down 15 percent from last year, down 44 percent from peak. The number of lots involved is, of course, well down, indicating a drop off in quantity as well, but not as much as the dollar total

The registration and viewing of 398 auction lots went very smoothly due to plenty of volunteers to handle input and a reduced level of traf-

fic. The Thursday morning communications/Ham auction had been eliminated, so some of these types of items appeared in the general equipment auction on Friday. The Thursday evening tube auction was conducted by Bruce Roloson as usual and took only one and a half hours to complete. There were no spherical Audions, and the highest bid of \$400 was for a lot of four KT-88 audio tubes.



Walt Buffinton started the paper portion of the auction at 9 A.M. on Friday and dispensed with all paper lots in one hour. The highlight, though not really a paper item, was a wooden jointed doll advertising GE, which most people had never seen before. This item, similar to the RCA Radiotron jointed doll, was decorated as a drum major. It was in excellent condition and drew a final bid of \$1,000.

No really rare or outstanding items were included in the equipment auction. Several big dollar items were passed due to high reserves, but the ratio of passed lots was not greater than in past auctions. The highest bid of \$2,200 was for a Grebe CR-18 with tubes and coils. Other high flyers were a spectacular Ozarka 299 suitcase portable for \$800 and an RCA AA-485 2-tube audio amp for \$1,400. Our Canadian friends contributed some nice items, including a Rogers hi-fi amp and preamp for \$800 and a Mercury Super 10 for \$700. The auction ended just before 2:30 P.M. All prices are rounded down to the nearest dollar. Some low cost items deleted.













# WITH THE COLLECTORS

## A Sparton Model 69 Equasonne

Just when you think that there are no more old radios to be found, a golden opportunity pops up. (Editor)

Several months ago, I visited the local antique shop in town, just to look around. I had gotten several radios from him that badly needed work, so most people did not pay attention to them. On the second floor level, I found a radio that was mixed in with a bunch of furniture. The dealer wanted \$70 for it. On closer examination, I found it was a 7-tube Sparton Model 69 Equisonne of 1928. I was familiar with that model but had never owned one, so I bought it.

He put the radio in my car and said, "Wait, there's more." And he brought out the console speaker, which turned out to be a Sparton Model 29 cabinet speaker — all for \$70! Both the radio and compan-

ion speaker cabinet were in good shape.

When I tried the radio at home, it worked for about 30 seconds and quit. I checked the speaker, an 18" cone type, and found it was OK. But, the magnetic armature assembly needed cleaning, so I took it apart and cleaned and adjusted it. When I tackled the radio, it was a job to unbolt and remove the three separate chassis. This thing is built like a tank.

Since the non-powered tuning unit was covered with dust and grime, I started to remove the capacitors to clean them. What a job! Thirty-nine screws and nuts had to be removed to get the unit out. I separated the capacitors from the coil unit and cleaned them in my ultrasonic cleaner. I reassembled the unit with the 39 nuts and screws.

This unit feeds a broadband RF unit that has six tubes and assorted coupling coils. What killed the operation was some shorted bypass capacitors. I replaced them all with 0.1 mF 400 v. capacitors and tried it again, only to discover that the audio transformer was also open. It had been replaced previously. I replaced that with a transformer I got from Antique Electronic Supply.

I tried to operate the three chassis on the bench with foot-long jumper cables connecting the chassis together. The set acted very unstable and would not tune right. On investigating, I discovered that the grounding connection in the cabinet was a polished brass plate that evidently had less inductance than the jumper cables. When the three chassis were in the cabinet and grounded properly, the radio settled down and operated well.

I had been corresponding with Dale Davenport about the set, and he sent me a circuit diagram and some suggestions on the audio output. After

I got the radio working, all the tubes were found to be good, and all the RF tubes were the original Type 484s. The only change was a Type 50 in the output that should have been a Type 585.

Bingo! I remembered that I had a box of old tubes stored away. In it, I found a Type 585 tube that was good. I will store the Type 50 for future use. I looked up the 484 and the 50 in Antique Electronic Supply. catalog. The prices are unreal.

My restored Equasonne, shown in Figure 1, is now residing in my family room and plays like the Philharmonic Orchestra.





# RESTORATION TOPICS

### A Cool Solution for a Hot Power Cord

BY TED ROGERS

Replacement ballast tubes and resistance line cords are becoming harder to find. Ted Rogers describes his approach to solving this problem when restoring a Radiokeg AC/DC radio. (Editor)

I read with interest the article by Stan Lopes titled "A Ballast Tube Solution," in the May 2001 issue of ARC. I have used this idea of substituting tubes that use higher filament voltages several times, and it works quite well. The AX chassis, which Emerson used in several models with Ingraham cabinets, is a good candidate for this idea.

However, there are many earlier AC-DC radios with older type tubes for which there are no higher-voltage tubes that are direct substitutes. Some of these used resistance-type power cords, others used ballast tubes. In either case, replacements are hard to find.

I was discussing this problem with David Snow of Jackson, Michigan, and he suggested using a diode to replace the line-cord resistor or ballast tube. This would provide half-wave power to the filaments, effectively cutting the power in half. I tried it, it works, and I want to give David full credit for the idea.

In thinking about this problem, you must remember how indirectly heated tubes operate. The filament, more properly called a heater, is simply a bundle of tungsten wire inserted in a thin metal sleeve (the cathode), which is coated on the outside with an electron-emitting material such as alkaline earth oxides. The sole purpose of the heater is to heat the cathode enough to cause it to emit electrons. Fortunately, the temperature required is not critical, so there is some leeway in heater temperature.

It makes no difference whether the heater is operated on DC, AC, half-wave AC, or any other wave form as long as the power delivered to the heater is correct.

#### **RESTORING A RADIOKEG RK-S-5**




Figure 2A. The original filament circuit.

I recently restored the Radiokeg Model RK-S-5, shown in Figure 1, using this method. The tube lineup consisted of a 77 first detector, 78 IF amplier, 85 second detector, 43 output and 25Z5 rectifier. The 77, 78 and 85 have 6.3-volt filaments, and the 43 and 25Z5 have 25-volt filaments, all drawing 300 milliamperes. With a 6.3-volt pilot light, the string voltage is approximately 75 volts. Figure 2A shows the original filament circuit diagram. Note that the pilot lamp, rated at 6.3V/250 ma, is shunted with a 25-ohm resistor.

The original circuit used a 150-ohm line cord resistor. This line cord dissipated 13.5 watts!

Replacing the line-cord resistor with a diode resulted in the filaments operating at almost the exact design voltages. Figure 2B shows the schematic diagram of the modified filament circuit. One would think that the half-wave voltages would be about half of the 120-volt line voltage, but this is not the case. This is due in part to the self-regulating characteristics of the filaments. Tungsten has low resistance when cold, and higher resistance when hot. If the filaments are running too cool, their resistance lowers, thereby drawing more current.

If you are going to try substituting a diode, it is important that you use a "True RMS" AC voltmeter for voltage measurements. These meters use a special bridge rectifier on the AC ranges, giving true RMS readings regardless of wave form. An ordinary multimeter simply places a diode in series with the meter movement on the AC ranges. On half-wave AC, they will read twice the true RMS voltage with the probes in one position, but zero volts with the probes reversed.

After you make this conversion and start measuring the filament voltages, don't be surprised if you find that there is considerable deviation from the design voltages. The manufacturing tolerance on filament resistance is probably 10 per-




Figure 2B. The modified filament circuit.

cent at best, and when the filaments are connected in series, these differences will show up. As long as the voltages are within 10 percent of nominal, the tubes will probably operate OK. However, if they are all higher than nominal, you may want to add some resistance to the circuit to bring the voltages down to normal, thus extending tube life. The resistance required will be low, and the wattage dissipation tolerable.

#### THAT TOO-BRIGHT PILOT LIGHT

One more refinement is necessary. You are probably familiar with the initial over-brightness of the pilot lights in AC-DC radios. When the radio is first turned on, the tungsten filaments are cold and their resistance is low. This causes the pilot light to be very bright for a second or two until the filaments warm up and their resistance increases. When a resistance-type power cord or a balast tube is in the circuit, they reduce this initial surge, and the pilot light does not get excessively bright. When these resistances are replaced with a diode, however, this initial surge is much greater, and the pilot light probably has a life expectancy of only a few on-off cycles.

This problem can be overcome by connecting a zener diode across the pilot light. You might expect that a 6-volt zener would be the right choice, but it isn't. Zeners are designed to regulate DC voltages, and they act differently on halfwave AC. I tried a 6-volt zener, and the pilot light voltage was only about 4 volts. So I made a major investmen: (about \$3.50) for an assortment of zeners from 6 volts to 12 volts. I found that a 10-volt zener worked best. With the tubes warmed up, the pilot light voltage was about 5 volts. This voltage is established by the 25-ohm shunt resistor across the pilot light; leave this resistor in place.

When the radio is first turned on, the zener limits the voltage to about 6 volts, dropping to 5 volts as the tubes warm up. After the tubes warm up, the zener has no effect on pilot light voltage. The zener functions only during the brief warmup period. During this warmup period, however, the zener has to dissipate almost 2 watts. I used a 1N5347 zener rated at 5 watts to be on the safe side. It costs only 52 cents.

For the rectifying diode, I could have used a 1-amp diode such as a 1N4005 but again I chose to be on the safe side by using a 1N5408 diode rated at 3 amps, costing 48 cents.

The zener must be connected with the correct polarity. Don't worry about this, though. If it is connected backwards, the pilot light will not light up at all, but it won't damage anything. Just reverse the connections and it will work OK.

#### SAFETY MEASURES

I agree with Stan Lopes that these old AC-DC radios with one side of the power cord connected to the chassis presented lethal shock hazard. A nonpolarized AC plug can be inserted in

the wall outlet both ways, so there is a 50-50 chance that the chassis is hot. I wonder how many people were electrocuted by these radios.

Whenever I restore any radio, I am willing to sacrifice a little bit of authenticity in the interest of safety. I always replace the power cord with a 2-wire cord with a polarized power cord that can be inserted in the outlet only one way. The wide blade on the plug connects to the neutral side of the line, and I connect this wire to the chassis or floating ground circuit. The hot side of the line is connected to the on-off switch [Some AC/DC radios have the AC switch in the chassis-ground or B- side of the AC line. In such cases, the radio must be rewired to place the AC switch in the hot side of the line.]

One final point: If you are restoring a radio with a ballast tube, and want to leave the ballast in place for the sake of appearance, be sure to totally disable the ballast. If the burned-out elements inside the ballast touch the housing or each other, you won't like the result.

If the shell can be removed from the ballast, you can remove all the internal stuff, put the shell back on, and plug it in safely. If the ballast cannot be taken apart, you should remove all of the wiring from its socket. An added bonus is that you have removed 12 to 15 watts of heat from inside the cabinet, so it won't develop a charred spot on the finish directly above the ballast.

Ain't this a great hobby!

# Estes Auctions — Anderson Collection Wheeling, West Virginia — April 20-21, 2002

Estes Auctions conducted a living estate auction for Larry Anderson of Wheeling, West Virginia, on April 20-21, 2002. Mr. Anderson was Programming and Events Manager at radio station WWVA in Wheeling, and the auction was held in the station's Capitol Music Hall — certainly a fitting place and atmosphere for a radio auction.

Mr. Anderson collected Catalin and novelty radios for several years, but due to health reasons, he decided to sell the collection. Over a hundred avid collectors from all over the United States and one buyer from Brazil, along with absentee bids from Australia and Europe, pushed the sale to \$125,000. The high bid of

\$7,500 came on an Atwater Kent Model 5 breadboard. This set was also the only early item collected by Mr. Anderson.

This was the 4th highest grossing radio sale for our firm. It put the total at just under one and a half million dollars in less than a year, not including the radio sales at the Seville Auction Barn.

In addition to those listed, many other novelty radios sold in the \$20 to \$100 range. We certainly enjoyed the privilege of getting to conduct the sale at the radio station. And our thanks to Mr. Anderson for putting together a great collection that can now be enjoyed by many other collectors. 

# Historic Radio Society of Australia 20th Anniversary Meet and Auction

Melbourne, Australia — April 20-21, 2002

Around mid-April 1982, Ray Kelly and a few others brought together maverick Aussie interests in old radio to form the Historic Radio Society of Australia (HSRA). Twenty years on, and still growing, the HRSA decided to celebrate this milestone in style. The resulting meet was an outstanding success for both attendees and the organization as a whole.

Major events on the Saturday included a flea market, auction, a display grandly called "Concours d'Elegance," and a twentieth anniversary dinner. The 100 plus who sat down to the evening dinner in a Melbourne Returned Servicemen's Club were royally wined and dined. The buzz of conversation never fell below fever pitch, reflecting better than anything the level of camaraderie and networking engendered by these events.

For many, the dinner is the highlight of such meets. Four or five speakers explored various aspects of our common passion, and prizes were presented to winners of the Concours display.

The display was an ongoing part of the weekend, being open to the public as well as members on both Saturday and Sunday. It not only celebrated pride in ownership and the careful preservation/restoration of artifacts, but also gave members a chance to have their prize pieces judged in a competitive environment.

Eleven categories saw keen competition, and, as so often happens at these events, the judges had a nearly impossible job. Eyecatchers like the 1927 Melo-Heald 14-tube kit-set (completed in 2002!) vied with more traditional pieces. In the end, top marks went to Les Janes for his immaculate

work on the rebuild of a Stromberg-Carlson 501A and matching #5A floor speaker

Les unearthed the pair via a newspaper ad, and was dismayed to find that both radio and speaker had nourished and housed extended families of the species rattus rattus for around 60 years. The rebuild involved every aspect of the restorer's art, and a superb result saw Les justly named winner of the 1920s section and outright winner to boot.

The commerce of the weekend began with a fairly low-key flea market Saturday morning. Although some useful spares could be bought cheaply there, most of the better items had been set aside for an auction of nearly 350 lots. More than 100 bidders registered on the day, and although many of the more desirable pieces failed to make reserve, around \$10,800 changed hands at the auction.

The glory days of radio production in Australia were between around 1930 and 1955, so most local auctions will boast a fair number of Bakelite mantel radios. This one was no exception. Some nicely restored examples sold cheaply on the day, although none of the higher end AWA radiolettes or coloured Bakelites emerged this time round. However, some 1930s Australian timber mantels came

up for sale, with some rare ones amongst them. Airzone, a premier Australian manufacturer of the 1930s, was unusually well represented, with one cathedral selling at \$400 and a nice tombstone being knocked down at \$388. A beautiful example of the rare 1932 classic #404 cathedral was passed at \$675, which would have been top price for the day. The radio was sold later by private treaty.

Of interest to U.S. readers: a nice Philco 66 dual wave set sold for \$163; an export (240V)

Zenith (one of the 700 series) in lovely restored condition went for \$325; and a clean original Amplion AR-19 horn made \$250.

Many more radios were imported than were locally made during the 1920s, and few early Australian battery sets come up at these auctions. This time round, a little-known Holst Super 5 failed to reach reserve with a high bid of \$165, and the Melboume manufacturer Seyon was represented by a 2-tube recenerative set, which sold for \$120.
