

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

The advent of winter and the holiday season has its own special sense of nostalgia and excitement. After a summer of intense radio activity, we batten down the hatches of outdoor events and look inward to family activities and our neglected workbench projects. This is a time when we may also become more reflective and think about the future of our collections and of our hobby in general.

This thought brings me to our lead article by Geoff Shearer about his daughter Becky's interest in collecting antique radios. How wonderful it is to know that there may be a serious young collector in our future. Becky is pictured at ages three, five, and eight with old radios she likes, and we learn that she has been collecting almost since age one. Tube testing is obviously her thing, and we think a message to the Santa on our cover should include an order for a special tester for Becky.

Hats off to Geoff and all his colleagues along the radio circuit who encourage Becky's interest. In our August 2003 Issue, Walter Heskes' article about his five-year old "Radio Twins" evoked a similar sentiment. As we all know, the next generation of collectors is vital

to the preservation of radio history.

And on that subject, thanks to Paul Joseph Bourbin for his article on the 1999 centennial commemoration of the first wireless transmission to the West Coast. We have to put this article in the "better late than never" category, since it was misplaced in our files. However, the subject remains of historical interest in that the California wireless link to announce the arrival of a Spanish American War troopship into San Francisco in 1899 can compete with the more commonly known Marconi East Coast transmissions.

For those interested in a later period in radio history. we offer two articles on AC sets. Richard Arnold reports that, much to his surprise, there is more than one Philco "Flying Wedge," His earlier article on the Model 49-503 led to information about the 49-203. And so, one thing leads to another in this pursuit of radio history.

Another AC set is certainly a mystery. Jerry Wieland would like to find out more about the Kroehler that he so painstakingly has restored. No doubt, fellow collectors will share information with him as they did with Richard Arnold, and we will offer a follow-up.

Photo Review offers a wide range of items, from microphones to TVs, from communications receivers to a Ham transmitter. Certainly the least commonly seen set is the 1946 Transvision TV sold by Gimbel's.

Reports on two major meets actually extend Photo Review this month — Radiofest and Extravaganza. Daniel Schoo has not only described the happenings at ARCI's Radiofest but also supplied many photos, including some illustrating the theme of the meet -Chicago manufacturers. The result is an overview of unusual items that often show up at such meets.

Radiofest offered the same kind of frenzied activity

as Extravaganza. The auction brought \$8,000 and was highlighted by an E.H. Scott Allwave 23 selling at \$3,000. Seminars included a hands-on, build-it-yourself crystal set session, as well as one on basic repairs.

Both Radiofest and Michigan's Extravaganza can be relied upon to be enjoyable, comprehensive, successful meets. Extravaganza, reported here thanks to John Reinicke, has a packed 350-space flea market, an outdoor tent for rental tables, a Ladies Luncheon, seminars, entertainment, a contest, even a "Radio Rescue" table. The top items in the \$15,000 auction were two Atwater Kent breadboards selling at \$650 and \$700, and a Philco Radio Bar at \$700.

Both of these events are open to the public and do much to encourage newcomers to the hobby. We

commend their organizers for their efforts.

A holiday gift suggestion lies in a book review by Jeffrey Crocker, son of longtime A.R.C. staff member Dave Crocker. Here's another example of interest in antique radios being passed from one generation to another. Jeff describes how he came upon Daniel Stashower's The Boy Genius and the Mogul, the story of TV pioneer Philo T. Farnsworth. Jeff's enthusiasm for the subject led to this review, which is a strong endorsement of the book.

Follow-up articles may take several years to appear, but they are worth waiting for, as Ragnar Otterstad's reminder about a Paris radio shop attests. We like the idea that an American traveler's visit to a Paris radio shop leads to a Norwegian traveler's visit to the same shop years later, It's clear that interaction across continents matters in our pursuit of radio preservation.

Radio Collector for Life? Our New Collectors

Learning about the next generation of antique radio collectors is always a pleasure, especially when the participant is a young "woman" like Becky. We like to think that many more women will become dedicated collectors in the future. (Editor)

Sometimes, life can play funny tricks on you. I have been a radio collector since 1989, and my wife Wendy joined the hobby a couple years later. She said something like "if you can't lick 'em, join 'em." Anyway, she likes the small wood cathedrals and Emerson "cute" wood sets. Me, I'm into tube novelty and big tube count Zenith and E.H. Scott consoles. Sounds atypical, doesn't it?

Well, after 22 years of marriage and our older daughter in college, along comes Becky in 1994 while we were living in Albuquerque, New Mexico. People asked (and continue to ask) if Becky was "planned," and we say, "Sure, but it wasn't our plan."

Even when she was an infant, I carried Becky to all the flea market ventures and Hamfests in the area, and, of course, to all the radio club

The most memorable trip that comes to mind was the time I was towing a trailer of goodies to Elgin, and we broke down several times along the way. I learned a couple of lessons en route: 1) Never tow with a front wheel drive vehicle; 2) Buy the "lifetime" warranty from AAMCO. I remember our little "trucker" sitting on the curb at midnight in some gas station between Oklahoma and Illinois. We broke down again south of Springfield, Illinois, with a fuel filter gone bad; then, the trans-

Then, as we returned year after year, other collectors would give her sets to add to her collection. Willy Sessoms was particularly keen on making sure Becky walked away with a radio at every meeting.

So, how does she spend that one Sunday a

month when dad goes to the radio club meeting? She wants to go too, and she helps me sell tubes, run food, and hold items up in the auction. She has even gone to the microphone and given presentations on her "show-n-tell" items. Once it was on pink and blue tubes she has, and the other was on the "Radio DJ" gizmo we found at the T.J. Maxx store. The point is that Becky doesn't sit on the side and color in her coloring book or draw pictures - she's in the thick of things. If she draws a greeting card for me, it always has a radio on it.

Becky is eight years old now and has her own Hickok 600 tube tester. She tests, marks, boxes, and sells all the tubes I bring in. For her effort, she gets to keep the money from those sales. In the early morning hours of Saturday and Sunday, she's

down in the basement helping me with my repair work and always asks the question, "Dad, do you have any tubes to check?"

Of her radios, the Empress "Chalet" is her favorite. She also likes to play with my little amps and microphone and puts on her own shows. From the "Radio DJ" she's learned the principle of transmission and reception and understands the concept of discrete frequency. I won't let her use the soldering irons yet (you moms will be pleased to hear that), but it won't be long before I'm handing her the capacitors to put into the set.

Becky relishes the trips to antique stores and flea markets and finds more radios than I do. It's great having an extra pair of young eyes looking out for stuff that you may miss. Plus, she's got the advantage of being closer to the ground where people put things. Her e-mail "handle" is RadioBecky@aol.com. (Not to worry, I've blocked all mail to her mailbox).

I missed all this with our older daughter because she was well into her teens when I began this hobby, and she viewed it as something "Dad did down in the basement." Now that she's grown, married and matured a great deal, she'll call me on the cellphone and describe radios she's looking at in an antique store and ask if she should buy one. She lives in Denver so now those folks have more competition. But Jenny is not "engaged" in the hobby like Becky. And I think it's cool that a girl would really like this electronic stuff. I've put away some "you build it" kits for a later time, and this Christmas she's going to get the basic Radio Shack crystal kit. Next year she'll get the Short Wave Kit I bought from the Adam's estate.

I have found that if you subject your little ones to the hobby early and make it interesting and fun (profitable too – she loaned Mom some money last week), the minds and hearts will follow. Now, if only I could get Wendy back into it, the way she used to be....

THE WIRELESS YEARS

A Commemoration of the First Wireless Transmission on the West Coast

This is the second of two articles by Paul Bourbin that were mistakenly put on hold in our filling system some time ago. However, a historic radio event is always worth recording, no matter how many years after the fact. (Editor)

On Saturday morning, August 28, 1999, a group of about fifty radio historians, supported by the United States Coast Guard, a historian and a naturalist from the National Park Service, the press and a few bemused tourists, commemorated the 100th anniversary of the first working wireless signals in America. The California Historical Radio Society, the Perham Foundation, the San Francisco Amateur Radio Club, the Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA), owners of the Cliff House, and the United States Coast Guard sponsored the ceremony.

The first wireless message hit the ether on August 23, 1899. Within the United States, three separate wireless transmission events occurred about the same time in 1899. The evidence suggests that the transmission of August 23, 1899, was, indeed, the first wireless transmission in the United States, or, perhaps, even the Western Hemisphere.

In August 1899, it was known that the troopship *Sherman* was returning to San Francisco from the Philippine Islands with California's regiment of soldiers who fought in the Spanish American War. The city had planned a big

celebration for the soldiers upon their return. Therein lay the rub. No one could be exactly sure when the troopship would arrive.

It was known that, before reaching San Francisco, the *Sherman* would have to pass by the lightship *San Francisco*, located nine miles out-

side the Golden Gate. This would give ample time to inform San Franciscans of the arrival of the troopship, but how could the message be sent to the city? More often than not, in August, the area around the Golden Gate is enshrouded in fog, so traditional methods would not work.

GEORGE MITCHELL'S IDEA

George Otis Mitchell, a physics teacher at Girl's High School, had experimented with wireless telegraphy. He had the idea that if a wireless transmitter were put onboard the *San Francisco*, a lookout could report sighting of the *Sherman*. A receiver located in the city would then pick up the message and relay it via telephone lines. A group of men got together to accomplish this task. The newspaper *San Francisco Call*, seeking a scoop, sponsored the venture.

At first, tests of the apparatus, initially a Tesla Coil, were made from the Spreckles Building, in downtown San Francisco to Telegraph Hill, with mixed results due to interference from trolley cars. Later, the receiver was moved to the Cliff House overlooking the Pacific Ocean. This location was away from trolley cars and closer to the lightship. It also had a telephone connection.

A Ruhmkorff coil spark transmitter was installed on the *San Francisco*, and the wait began. About 5:00 p.m., the *Sherman* was sighted through the fog, and Charles Fisher tapped out, "Sherman is sighted." He had only the spark transmitter and no way of knowing if the message had been received. Fortunately, it was.

The coherer, connected to a 75-foot vertical

wire with a "capacity hat," detected the signals, and the Morse inker noted them. A telephone call was made from the Cliff House to the San Francisco Call with the happy news. A cannon was fired from atop the Spreckles Building, followed by other signals. The city welcomed the Sherman and her heroes and celebrated for three days—they really knew how to throw a partyl

100 YEARS LATER

The commemoration on August 28, 1999, was not quite as spectacular, but the magic was still there. While the commemoration did not start until 10:00 а.м., members of the various groups were busy setting up all the myriad things necessary for the event. Among them were the exhibits of early equipment, a VCR and TV to play the commemorative documentary produced by CHRS President Steve Kushman and aired on KGO-TV. the modern radio transmitter and receiver to be used for the reenactment, public address equipment, etc.


At the appointed hour, CHRS President Steve Kushman welcomed one and all and outlined the significance of the day and the events to occur. Don Koijane, President of the Perham Foundation, explained the need for

historical preservation and the Foundation's plans for an electronics museum. Richard Everett, Curator of the San Francisco National Maritime Museum, spoke about its new radio wing.

Other speakers included Steve Haller of the (Continued on following page)



Don Koijane, President of the Perham Foundation, left, and CHRS President, Steve Kushman at the right...




This fully-operational 15-watt spark transmitter and receiver was assembled using vintage parts by Paul Bourbin.

(First Wireless Transmission on the West Coast, continued) GGNRA who gave a talk about the Presidio and its wars. Bob Holloway, also of the GGNRA, talked about the Cliff House site, its fog and environs. Col. Earnest James gave listeners background information about the First California Volunteers Regiment's involvement in the Spanish American War. Historian Bart Lee, also impresario of the event, told listeners about the technology of the day and the event that occurred on that day 100 years ago.

Captain Charles Williams spoke on behalf of the Coast Guard whose predecessors operated the lightship. Paul Bourbin explained how spark transmitters work while the President of the San Francisco Amateur Radio Club, Alan Schuman demonstrated Paul's transmitter. Spark signals were received on at least one portable transistor radio. Then it was time for the reenactment.

THE REENACTMENT

From a Coast Guard cutter located just beyond Seal Rocks, under the command of Lt. Mike Fazio, came the Morse Code transmission, "Sherman is sighted", which was relayed through the P.A. system via a Coast Guard receiving station set up by Chief Warrant Officer John Kedge for the purpose. People were then invited to watch the doc-

umentary video and ask questions. Upon conclusion of the event, those who participated retired to a fine repast in the elegant dining room of the Cliff

On exhibit for the event was a coherer supplied by Will Jensby, an officer of the Perham Foundation and of CHRS, a Morse inker supplied by Curator Ed Gable of the Antique Wireless Association, and the commemorative illustration, drawn by CHRS member Kent Leech. Also, there was an operating, reconstructed 15-watt spark transmitting and receiving station made of vintage parts, owned by Paul Bourbin.

The San Francisco Maritime Museum amateur radio station, K6KPH, manned by Tom Horsfall and Dick Dillman, copied the commemorative message and responded with a QST QSL message on the 80-meter Ham band. The AWA station in upstate New York also copied the message transmitted by the Coast Guard cutter and responded. The event was reported on several news programs, including San Francisco TV station KRON, and in the newspaper. San



The Philco Model 48-230 A Model 49-503 Look-Alike

Richard Arnold's article on his Philco Model 49-503 that appeared in the March 2003 issue of A.R.C. resulted in the identification of another Philco set that looks like the Philco Model 45-503, (Editor).




Figure 2. An underside view of the chassis shows the component layout, including the replacement filter capacitor.

I have found out from other collectors that there is a Philco 48-230 that is identical to the 49-503 in every aspect except for cabinet color. This came as quite a surprise to me as I had thought that the 49-503 was unique as the only "Flying Wedge." The 48-230 comes in the brown cabinet that I was looking for. It also came in ivory. So it looks like the radio we had at home was not a 49-503 after all. Front and rear views of the Philco Model 48-230 are shown in Figures 1 & 2.







RESTORATION TOPICS

A Kroehler with a Twist

BY JEROME WIELAND

Every collector knows the joy of a flea market where the unexpected turns up. Then, of course, comes the challenge of finding out more about the mystery set you can't resist buying and restoring it. Jerry Weiland takes us through the familiar process. (Editor)

My favorite radio hunting location these days is the flea market at the county fair grounds. Every month, including winter, vendors display all sorts of interesting stuff, including the occasional radio. This July, as I rounded a corner, I spotted a wide, rounded tombstone on a table. Even at a distance, it looked old and interesting. The metal escutcheon bore the name "Kroehler." The vendor said Kroehler was a furniture manufacturer. The cabinet was in decent condition and all the tubes were there. The price was high at \$90, and he wasn't in the mood to deal, but I couldn't leave without it. The radio is shown in Figure 1.

At home, a check of the Internet revealed very little information about Kroehler. I did find a furniture company in Wisconsin, but no reference to radios. A check of sites with photos uncovered one Kroehler tombstone but not mine. The free schematic sites had no Kroehler reference.

INTERNAL INVESTIGATION

I removed the chassis from the cabinet and examined the cabinet closely for further clues. There was nothing to be found. The chassis name-plate contains a serial number and the Kroehler Manufacturing Corporation name. The chassis contains six tubes and is a TRF design. The tubes types are three 24s as RF amps, a 27 detector, a 45 audio amp, and an 80 rectifier. The speaker is an 8-inch Rola electrodynamic with a chassis plug, which I appreciate since it makes chassis removal much less complicated.

Once the chassis was removed and vacuumed, it could be closely inspected. The 3-gang tuning capacitor was in good condition, but oddly had the remains of wires on each stator terminal at the top of the assembly. The two electrolytic filter capacitors in the power supply are housed in copper cans that screw into copper holders attached to the chassis. This is rather unusual. The hot lead exits the top of each capacitor. Interstage RF coupling coils are housed in shield cans as are the three RF amplifier tubes. A large power transformer and a power supply choke are also mounted on top of the chassis. An audio coupling transformer is also shielded.

Turning the chassis over revealed some prob-

lems. Two multicapacitor cans were riveted to the chassis and were leaking wax. No value markings could be found on the cans. The audio coupling transformer was potted in black tar and had been overheated causing black slime to flow over the wires and components in the area.

REPAIR PROCEDURES

Before committing to any repairs, I like to assure myself that the power transformer is alive. I do this with all the tubes removed and a 120v light bulb connected in series with the primary. I slowly apply power to the primary through a variac increasing the voltage slowing while watching the bulb and monitoring the high voltage transformer output with an AC voltmeter. Ideally, there should be no smoke. flames, or noise. The output voltage should be between 300 to 700 volts, and the bulb should not light or at most glow very dimly. Significant glowing indicates leakage or a short. Mine passed the test.

With this many obvious problems, there were probably other less obvious issues to be found. A schematic is very helpful when you need to determine what function various components are performing. I had some unidentified parts that would need to be replaced, and I did not know the original values. Since I could not readily find a schematic on the Internet, I decided to draw my own.

Single-band receivers are not very complicated, and TRF designs are even less complicated compared to superheterodyne types. An hour of tracing wires resulted in a decent schematic. Most of the leaking multistage caps were RF bypasses in cathode circuits. A 0.1uF value is tvpical for this function. One was the detector cathode bypass which I chose to replace with an 0.1uF since audio may be present.

Next I checked the continuity of the RF coupling coils and the audio transformer. I was pleasantly surprised to find all were OK. I also noticed supply chokes were used in each RF amplifier plate circuit. One of the three was open. I replaced it with a modern

choke from my spare parts supply. Value is not

critical in this application.

A check of the two power supply filter capacitors showed one to be completely open, but the other still seemed functional. Since they were single-stage 8uF/450v types. I decided to replace both. Heft each original filter capacitor screwed in the chassis for appearance, disconnected the hot lead under the chassis, and then wired a new cap out of sight. In my more ambitious (younger) days I would have gutted the old cap cans and mounted a new cap inside. This now seems like too much work for something practically no one will ever notice. An under-the chassis view of the radio is shown in Figure 2.

All told. I replaced nine parts before considering a full functional test. All tubes checked OK and were inserted into their respective sockets. All sockets had the tube number marked on them making it easy to get them in the correct locations. I connected an antenna wire and slowly increased the line voltage with my Variac. The radio came to life with a satisfying sound of a weak station. Tuning around revealed more stations. Tweaking the trimmers on the 3-gang tuning capacitor peaked the stages and resulted in very good reception for this type of design.

I was very pleased with myself until I noticed that the stations were not tracking correctly on the dial. The dial was calibrated in large 0 to 100 numerals with smaller 575 to 1500 kHz marking in between. The low frequency stations were on the high end of the dial and visa versa. The drum dial has a semicircular plastic strip which appears in the small dial window of the escutcheon. Two dial cords are used

to pull the wheel in either direction.

No amount of repositioning or restringing would make the dial track correctly. I began to wonder about the 3-gang tuning capacitor. Those cut wires on the top might be a clue as to what caused the tracking problem. Examining the connections to the gangs revealed that the three wires to the TRF stages were not soldered, but wrapped around screws. This did not appear to be the original connection method. It was more likely that they were soldered to the lugs at the top

of the assembly. It appeared that if I turned the whole tuning capacitor assembly 180 degrees the dial would track correctly.

One slight issue still remained however. The tuning capacitor shaft was now too short to mount the drum dial on. In fact, the shaft on this side was flush with the capacitor housing and it needed to be about two inches long. Since I had gone this far, I was determined to make it work. To extend the shaft, I would need to graft an extension to the stub. To do this. I found a metal pin of the same diameter and cut it to length. I drilled pilot holes in the pin and capacitor shaft suitable for tapping 4/40 threads.

After tapping, I cut the head off a 4/40 screw and threaded it into the cap shaft after coating the threads with super glue. I then threaded the shaft extension onto the protruding screw also coated with super glue. When tightened, the extension exhibited minimum wobble since I took care to drill the holes as close to dead center of the shafts as possible. After drilling a few mounting holes, remounting the tuning assembly, and restringing the dial cords, the dial tracked properly. I connected the TRF leads to their proper locations at the top of the gangs.

Apparently, the tuning capacitor assembly was not original. During disassembly, I noticed that additional mounting holes had been drilled in the frame. Some of the mounting brackets appeared to be handmade also. However, the assembly fit well and worked electrically. Someone took great pains to replace this assembly and did a rather

nice job except for the tracking problem ..

I refinished the cabinet keeping the original grille cloth. The photos show the final product. I would appreciate some information on the Kroehler Company and their radios, particularly this model.

MEET & AUCTION REPORT


Michigan Antique Radio Club Extravaganza '03 Lansing, Michigan — July 11-12, 2003



The result of the effort was a much more leisurely and pleasurable setup. A large computer printout showed the location of all of the vendors in the parking lot. A large number of club members volunteer to bake, and the very good results are enjoyed by all. The tent also serves as the "meet central" area.

The Ladies Luncheon at noon on Friday provides a pleasant opportunity for the women to get together and socialize over a meal at Hummingbird's

restaurant in the hotel.

By Friday afternoon a lot of the attendees are ready for a break, and the two programs offered provided a chance to sit down with a cool drink and enjoy the presentation. These sessions are always well attended, and this year the 100-person seating capacity of the room filled to "standing room only." The first presentation was about speaker repair. Mark Oppat showed how to save a number of speakers without the expense of reconing. The second presentation was done by Dennis Smith on "Detrola, Michigan's Largest Radio Manufacturer." Dennis' knowledge of Detrola is encyclopedic and the presentation was enjoyed by all.

Friday evening is highlighted by the Social Hour and Contest showing. The Social Hour is open to all registered attendees and features contest viewing, socializing, appetizers, a cash bar and entertainment. It is really a very pleasant way to end the day.

The entertainment this year was provided by "The Middle Spunk Creek Boys." For those of you not familiar with the group, they are a Bluegrass band with a bit of a 1960s flavor. The contest at Lansing is always outstanding and this year's theme of "Art Deco" brought in a truly mind boggling display of radios. It is really quite amazing to see not just a few, but dozens of rare sets. Most of us will not see these again in our lifetime. The contest devoted six of ten categories to the Art Deco

period and all of the categories were well represented. From the Majestic "Park Avenue" to a display of all of the Zenith "Zephyr" sets, the exhibit featured sets from the really nice to the downright sublime.

For the television collectors a prewar television camera was displayed, probably the largest item on exhibit. event and the foot traffic in the flea market easily doubled so that sales remained strong on Saturday. The "Radio Rescue" table was busy all day.

Saturday also saw the fourth presentation, Dan Gutowski's "Shellac in the 21st Century." Dan did an outstanding job of showing how to get the best sound from 78 pm records. Dan has transferred a number of rare 1920s vintage recordings to CDs, and the sound quality resulting from his processing is quite satisfactory.

Saturday afternoon brought the equipment auction. Well known auctioneer and Michigan Club member, Rich Estes conducted the auction in the "buy back" format. In this case the seller may bid on his own item in order to bring the price to a reserve. There are many advantages to a "buy back" auction. The bidding remains lively because if an item does not make reserve, it is not obvious. The seller can change his mind as the bidding proceeds and can, if he chooses, raise or lower what he would consider reserve. Because the club charges a modest fee for "buy back" items, the overall commission structure is quite modest for the seller.

This year's auction proved it is hard to beat a live auction for interest and the ability to personally inspect an item prior to bidding. A number of quite rare and possibly unique items were offered for sale. A total of 196 lots were put up for auction for total proceeds of \$15,175. Of this, \$2,770 were buy backs and a total of \$12,405 went to sales. The auction had a minimum bid of \$20 and a total of 25 items did not make minimum for a "no sale." The auction results probably are a reflection of the present market conditions, influenced by the large number of estate liquidation auctions this year.

The meet closed on Saturday evening with a very large donation auction under the big top. A successful donation auction is very important in order to help pay for the meet and keep sellers' costs low. Extravaganza is no exception and the club was very happy with the donations. Not only are donation auctions fun, they remain a very good way for the collector to acquire restoration "fodder" and low cost sets, in addition to supporting the club.

The number of donated items was so large, they were stacked on tables and at each table a "choice" auction was held. The winning bidder could take any item on the table at the bid amount. After the winning bidder made his selection or selections, the table was offered to anyone else at the bid amount. If there were no takers the table was again opened for "choice" bidding.

The process was repeated until the whole table was sold. By the time the bid price was under 10 bucks, there would usually be several items that would "come off the table" at the bid price. When the bidding got to a buck or two, the table would usually be cleared. In a couple of instances the remaining items were "reverse auctioned" and the auctioneer asked if someone would take an item for a buck. The humor was well received and the table cleared. A total of 8 tables and three pallets were sold this way. The grand total for this auction was \$832.50, all of which will help the club fund and improve swap meets.

One other notable feature of MARC meets is the seller's drawing. Each seller is given a ticket for each space reserved in the flea market and for each table reserved under the tent. On each day of the event, a ticket is drawn and on Friday the winning ticket was for \$50 and Saturday's winner got \$75. The club views this as a way to reward the sellers. These drawings were in addition to 50/50

Antique Radio Club of Illinois — Radiofest XXII Elgin, Illinois — August 7-9, 2003

The Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI) held Radiofest XXII from Thursday, August 7 through Saturday, August 9, at the Elgin Best Western Hotel on River Road just east of Route 31 in Elgin, Illinois. Registration began at noon on Thursday. Contest entry check-in began at 1:00 P.M. The flea market opening time this year was 5:00 P.M.

The number of registered sellers this year was up by 4 at 152 sellers. The number of spaces was up by 18 at 203. The number of paid members increased







provided free of charge.





The Boy Genius and the Mogul The Untold Story of Television

By Daniel Stashower


The Boy Genius and the Mogul by Daniel Stashower is a short biography of the child genius Philo T. Farnsworth and his electronic "Image Dissector" invention. It is also the story of the other major early television pioneers, including John Logie Baird, Vladimir Zworykin, and Ernst Alexanderson. What the book Empire of the Air does for radio, this book does the same for television. In fact, you will see a number of the same players in both stories -David Sarnoff, Lee de Forest, and Edwin Armstrong.

If you were to ask the average American who invented television — arguably the most important social invention of the 20th century — most wouldn't have an answer. He could probably tell you

who invented the airplane, light bulb, telegraph, phonograph, and cotton gin, and perhaps could name-drop Marconi and de Forest as radio pioneers, but for TV, most would draw a blank. I too, admittedly, fell into this category, and sought to rectify my ignorance.

This book review, therefore, is the result of a quest. I was looking for a good general history on the origins of television — a book that was not too technical or exhaustive, yet very engaging and clearly explained the basic concepts to a layperson. To my surprise, I had a hard time finding such a book in print or on sale. My local library had a few books on the origins of TV but none fit my requirements. My local bookstores (Borders and Barnes & Noble) were even worse — they carried no books on the subject.

Given the social magnitude of this invention, I was surprised by this sorry fact. I had all but given up until, while traveling, I unexpectedly stumbled



upon *Daniel Stashower's* The Boy Genius and the Mogulat an airport.

Stashower is a journalist who has written for the New York Times and the Smithsonian magazine, and has published a number of mystery novels. That being the case, he approaches this subject from my perspective — as a generalist and an outsider. His book is a quick read — 260 pages.

Stashower covers Farnsworth's humble, yet auspicious childhood in the backwaters of Mon-There, to the tana. amazement of his schoolteacher. Farnsworth explained his ideas on electronic television - ideas that none of the great scientists of his day had yet grasped. While the great adult inventors were looking to build TV through a mechanical means, Farn-

sworth, at age 14, rejected such a platform as too limiting; instead, the embraced a truly electronic "non-moving parts" solution. The significance of his idea cannot be understated, especially given his age.

The story continues and covers Farnsworth's early adulthood. In particular, it outlines the rather rocky relationship he had with his venture capital backers, the Crocker National Bank, in San Francisco. Stashower also, in parallel, covers the story of the corporate RCA giant, David Sarnoff, the man who would ultimately become Farnsworth's nemesis. While Sarnoff relentlessly sought control of TV, as he had previously done with radio, Farnsworth sought to protect his patents. This conflict becomes the focus of the last third of the book and makes for great reading.

The struggle between the two men was intense, ultimately leading to long, drawn out lawsuits. Sarnoff had the corporate resources to drag

this on for years, which was his strategy, knowing that Farnsworth's patents would eventually expire in time. Unfortunately, this struggle ultimately exhausted Farnsworth and brought on his eventual decline into obscurity

While Stashower treats Farnsworth in a very sympathetic light as "the little guy," he does not gloss over his shortcomings or key mistakes, such as his drinking and rocky marital relations. He also admits that Farnsworth's obsessive drive to beat Sarnoff, and his failure to have a presence at the 1939 Word's Fair — the major public forum for demonstrating the power of TV — undermined his efforts.

This book is well written and full of drama. It is an important book as it seeks to do justice to a now long forgetten TV pioneer. This national loss

of memory in our culture is unfortunate, for Mr. Farnsworth is as notable as our best-known inventors — Marconi, Bell, Morse, etc. My one critique of this book is minor: There are only a handful of pictures in the book — one per chapter. I wish there were more photographs and diagrams, especially of Farnsworth's television tube "image dissector" invention. The book did a good job at fueling my curiosity — I naturally wanted to see more of what I was reading.

Déjà Vu — A Unique Paris Radio Shop

Here Ragnar Otterstad of Norway tells how a February 1999 article by Daniel Schwartzman about a Paris radio shop surfaced among his papers and led to a visit to that shop four years later. We're happy to report on the continuing success of the Lubczanski family radio tube shop in Paris. (Editor)

Several years ago there was an article in A.R.C. by Daniel Schwartzman about his visit to Paris and a unique radio collecting shop called "Radio Tubes." I thought it would be interesting to visit that shop but forgot all about it. Then we moved from Copenhagen back to our native Norway three years ago. I never got around to organizing my stuff properly, but one day I was looking for some information and suddenly found the article among some other papers.

As it were, we had plans to drive around in parts of central France where we never had visited before. On our way, we were to visit with my brother-in-law who was in his last

year as a diplomat in Paris.

So, in due course, we arrived in Paris, and I got "permission" to pursue my radio interest. Taking the Metro in Paris is very easy, and I arrived at Republic Metro station in no time. Five minutes walk and I saw the sign "Radio Tubes" at 40 Boulevard du Temple. Coming into the shop was indeed like walking back in time some 40 odd years. There were several domestic receivers on display. Tubes were stocked wall to wall from the floor to the ceiling.

Welcoming me was a very friendly lady, Madame Rita Zelty. We started off in French but it soon was obvious that she spoke English too. It turned out that she had studied English and was speaking the language absolutely fluently. She told me that her father, the owner Michel Lubczanski, was now a very old man and could no longer work in the shop due to his fragile health. Madame Zelty told me she was the daughter and had taken on the responsibility of running the business in cooperation with her sister Nadine Lubczanski and her son Jerome

For some time the shop had been closed but reopened after the new generation had taken an interest. The motivating factor seemed to be the feeling for keeping such a rare shop in business and the positive interest from their many customers. The pleasure of seeing happy faces when people find some rare tube they had been looking for, sometimes for a very long time, made a difference.

Madame Zelty has the handicap of not being trained in radio or electronics. Fortunately, her father has managed to establish a database with the inventory and location of the products. She could, therefore, tell me on the spot if a certain tube was available.

I was impressed by the large inventory the shop has — not only European tubes but also a great many U.S.-made tubes, all in original packaging. If you are in need of a specific tube, Radio Tubes is now also on the Internet and is shipping anywhere in the world.
