



### EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Maybe you're a little surprised at our cover this month. It's not a photo of a set so rare or so expensive that many of us couldn't afford it, even if another showed up. Instead, it is a schematic of the Wheatstone Bridge circuit, which suggests simplicity and the test equipment that is the subject of Ray Bintliff's lead article

Ray, Alan Douglas, and others use vintage test equipment to diagnose problems in old radios. In Ray's case, he suggests vintage capacitor testers to diagnose capacitor problems in old radios. Such problems are more difficult to analyze than loose connections, burnt-out tubes or transformers that can be detected with a common volt-ohmmeter. Furthermore, vintage capacitor testers are readily available at flea markets, so why not use them to find bad capacitors in vintage sets?

In this, his fifth article on the subject. Ray concentrates on instruments that are practical for use today. He names several manufacturers of testers and the advantages or disadvantages of their products. His advice is to add, according to your needs, a tester, or analyzer, or both to your workbench. The bottom line is that vintage testers do a job that many modern testers cannot do.

In the restoration of an Airline Model 62-402, Richard Arnold didn't have to worry about a capacitor problem. However, he did have to fill the empty cabinet with all the right parts and then refinish the cabinet. It's interesting that in tackling the restoration of the "old," he used the "new" the Internet — to track parts and information.

And Ben Beekman also made the connection with our earlier Cortlandt Street articles on our website via the Internet. He shares a memory of himself as a young man, employed briefly by a radio company located on a street that still conjures up the past for collectors. Given the terrible fate of the site of Radio Row on 9/11, Cortlandt St. will always have even greater significance in our collective memories.

It's good to know that our website keeps browsers informed about selected contents of A.R.C.

### **PRINTED WITHOUT COMMENT**

We continue to receive reports from advertisers of e-mail responses to their classified ads proposing to pay them with a check, sometimes via a third party, in excess of the purchase price. At this year's auction, at least one impressive item showed up, a rare Pittsburgh wireless detector/ amplifier selling for \$2,300. In addition, the figures for this meet show that in all areas it's growing more radios in the auction, more sellers and bidders than in 2004. The hobby lives on in Minnesota, which is good news for the hobby everywhere.

# Capacitors in Old Radios — Part 5 More Capacitor Testers

Parts 1 through 4 appeared in the December 1997, December 1998, February 2000 and August 2004 issues of A.R.C. While the early capacitor testers described in Part 4 are of historical interest, they are not practical for present day use. In Part 5, Ray covers later models that have greater testing capabilities, are more accurate, and are useful instruments. (Editor)

As you would expect, the manufacturers of electrolytic and paper capacitors were also producers of capacitor testers. What better way to sell replacements than to provide a means for finding bad capacitors in a radio? The major manufacturers of capacitors for old tube-type radios were Aerovox, Cornell-Dubilier, Solar and Sprague.

Among the manufacturers of test equipment, only Jackson seemed to have an ongoing interest in capacitor testers. For a brief period during his McMurdo Silver Company operation in Hartford, Connecticut, Silver offered a capacitanceresistance bridge as part of his line of test equipment.

The makers of test equipment in kit form, such as EICO, Heathkit and PACO, cranked out an amazing number of capacitor testers.

#### CAPACITOR TESTER BASICS

Most vintage capacitor testers use a bridge

circuit to measure capacitance. Some bridge testers are also capable of measuring resistance, and they are usually referred to as "Resistance-Capacitance Bridges," "RC Bridges" or "Capacitor-Resistor Bridges." When other testing capabilities are added to the basic bridge circuit, such as power factor and leakage testing, the tester is usually called a "Capacitor Analyzer." (Power factor is a measure of a capacitor's efficiency, or, stated in another way, a measure of the power dissipated in a capacitor because of its internal series resistance). When you are using one of these testers, the capacitor under test, or at least one of its leads, must be removed from the radio's circuitry; otherwise, an erroneous reading may result.

Advances in capacitor analyzer design produced the In-Circuit Capacitor Tester. As its name implies, this tester eliminates the need to clip one of the capacitor's leads or remove the capacitor prior to test. This type of tester uses an RF oscillator circuit to evaluate capacitors. Several manufacturers included this capability in its testers.

#### **BRIDGE TESTERS**




Figure 1. This schematic diagram shows the basic circuit of a Wheatstone Bridge.

Bridge-type testers use circuits based on the Wheatstone Bridge. (See the sidebar for information about its origin). Figure 1 shows a schematic diagram for a bridge circuit that can be used to measure a capacitor's value. R1 is a potentiome-




Figure 2. A typical bridge circuit used in a capacitance bridge.

ter with a calibrated dial, R2 is a fixed resistor, C1 is a reference capacitor, and Cx is the capacitor under test.

An audio frequency signal (AF) is connected to points A and B. (A 60 Hz signal source is often used.) An indicator (I) is connected to points C and D. The indicator may be an AC meter, earphones, or a tuning eve tube.

If the ratio of the voltages across R1 and R2 are the same as the ratio of the voltages across Cx and C1, the bridge will be balanced. In its balanced state, the voltage across points C and D will be zero. For example, if earphones are used for the indicator, as the potentiometer is turned and the zero voltage, or null point, is reached, no sound will be heard in the earphones. The capacitor's value can then be read from the potentiometer's calibrated dial.

For resistance measurements, the signal source can be a DC voltage. The bridge circuit can be used to measure resistance, capacitance, inductance and impedance, if the source is an AF signal.

Figure 2 shows a slightly simplified schematic diagram of a bridge circuit that is likely to be found in an RC Bridge tester. The resistors, R1 and R2 have been combined into a single potentiometer, R1, but the bridge functions the same as does the original Wheatstone circuit.

### SOLAR ANALYZERS

The Solar Manufacturing Corporation produced a variety of capacitor analyzers. One of its early units, a Model CB, is shown out of its oak case in

Samuel H. Christie conceived the bridge circuit in the early 1800s. Why then is it not called the "Christie Bridge?" Good question. It appears that the circuit became known as the Wheatstone Bridge because Charles Wheatstone was the first to put the bridge circuit to a number of practical uses. Figure 3. It uses two tubes, a Type 6E5 eye tube and a Type 1V rectifier. A neon lamp serves as a leakage indicator. The Model CB measures capacitance in the range of 100 pF to 70 mF and resistance over the range of 50 ohms to 2 megohms. It sold for \$26 in 1942.

A similar analyzer, the Model CC, has an upper capacitance range of 800 mF. It uses Types 6E5 and 80 tubes and is mounted in a slopingfront, oak cabinet. The cost of the upgraded Model CC was \$32.50.

### SOLAR IN-CIRCUIT ANALYZERS




Figure 5. This rear view of the QCA shows a jam packed chassis.

Like the CB and CC models, the Model QCA, "Condenser Quick Check Analyzer," shown in Figures 4 and 5, uses a bridge circuit to measure capacitance in the range of 200 pF to 70 mF using a calibrated scale and a multiplier switch. Unlike the CB and CC, it does not include a leakage test function, but it does have an incircuit "Quick-Check" feature to test capacitors for high RF impedance.

"Quick Check" can also test for shorted, open and intermittent capacitors. For these tests, the capacitor under test is connected to the analyzer's balanced-oscillator circuit. If the capacitor is (Continued on following page)

open, the oscillator stays in balance and the shadow angle of the analyzer's tuning eye remains unchanged. The eye tube will close if the capacitor is not open.

A separate test is made for a short. If the capacitor is shorted, the eye tube will open fully. A good capacitor will produce no change in the eye tube's shadow angle or cause it to open or close slightly. An intermittent capacitor will cause the eye tube to flicker. A capacitor that passes the "Quick-Check" can then be tested for capacitance using the analyzer's bridge circuit. It should be noted that most in-circuit analyzers will give erroneous "shorted" readings if the capacitor to be tested is wired in parallel with a very low resistance.

This tester's tube complement consists of the following tube types: a 6G5 eye tube, a 25Z6GT rectifier and a 6J5GT RF oscillator. This model

uses a line cord for filament power. The cabinet size is  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{3}{4}$ ". The dealer price for a QCA was \$24.90 in 1942.

A similar tester, the Model BQC "Condenser Quick Check with Bridge," is shown In Figures 6 and 7. This compact tester is 6" wide x 5" high x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " deep — slightly smaller than its predecessor the QCA. This model is also capable of performing in-circuit testing for high RF Impedance, as well as shorted, open, and intermittent capacitors. The tube complement is identical to the Model QCA. The slide switches used for the Short Test in the QCA were replaced with more convenient push buttons on the BQC.

For the service shop that already had a bridge type tester, Solar sold a stripped down Model QC that performed only Quick-Check testing. It sold for \$14.90.

### SOLAR'S EXAM-ETER SERIES

Solar also produced the Model CE Capacitor "Exam-eter." This model, shown in Figure 8, has all of the features of the QCA with added functions, such as a resistance bridge, megohmeter, variable DC power supply, milliammeter and an AC/DC vacuum tube voltmeter. The Model CE uses a meter as an Indicator rather than an eye tube. The tube complement consists of two Type 6J5 tubes and one Type 6L6.

The tester has a capacitance measuring range of 10 pF to 2,000 mF and a resistance range of 50 ohms to 10,000 megohms. The CE measures 11¼" x 8½" x 6". The 1942 price of a CE was \$44.90, "complete with tubes."

The Model CF, shown in Figure 9, superseded the Model CE. The variable DC supply was omitted in the CF, and an electrolytic capacitor leakage current test was added; nevertheless, the tube complement remained the same.

The capacitance measuring range for the Model CF remained the same as for the CE, but the resistance range was from 100 ohms to 7 megohms. However, an "Insulation Resistance" mode was added to the CE that extended the upper range to 10,000 megohms. The CF grew in size to 12<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" high x 10" wide x 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" deep. The CF

is a versatile analyzer that could be put to practical use today. It is a bit more complicated to use than some of the Sprague models described below.

### AEROVOX

The Aerovox Corporation, of Brooklyn, N.Y., and later of New Bedford, Mass., a major producer of capacitors, seems to have had less interest in the manufacture of capacitor testers. Aerovox

did make some capacity-resistance bridges, as well as a Model 95 L-C checker. The Model 95 is an interesting device. It can perform in-circuit testing of capacitors, inductances and tuned circuits.

### JACKSON CONDENSER TESTERS

The Jackson Electrical Instrument Company of Dayton, Ohio, produced a line of radio test equipment that included capacitor testers. A Model 112, shown in Figure 10, is a bridge type capacitor tester that measures capacitance over the wide range of 10 pF to 1,000 mFd. An eve tube is used as the indicator and the easy-to-read calibrated dial scale uses a second pointer to expand the scale's effective length. The tester has a 6-position switch for selecting the appropriate voltage for leakage test. The unit can also measure power factor. Its cabinet dimensions are 13" x 10" x 5".

Another Jackson tester, the Model 650-A, is similar in appearance and offers the same features as the 112. The 650-A was priced at \$36.95 in 1942.

#### PYRAMID CAPACITOR-RESISTOR ANALYZER

The Pyramid Electric Compa-

ny of North Bergen, N.J., was a manufacturer of capacitors and capacitor analyzers. An example of Pyramid's analyzer line is the Model CRA-2, shown in Figure 11. A full-featured instrument, it measures capacitance and resistance and has a (Continued on following page)

"Quick Check" mode. A variable DC power supply and a 4-position milliammeter switch are used for leakage testing. A megohmeter function is included for insulation testing.

A  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " calibrated dial is used for capacitance and resistance measurement. Its  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " meter has three separate scales for reading current and megohms and setting DC leakage voltage. A fourth scale provides a "Good-Bad" reading for the "Quick Check" test. The tube complement consists of Types 6SN7GT, 6CB6 and 6L6G. The CRA-2's dimensions are 14" x 9" x 6". This analyzer is well made and easy to use. It may be more difficult to find than the more common Solar testers.

#### PACO IN-CIRCUIT CAPACITOR TESTER

PACO Electronics of Glendale, N.Y., supplied the PACO Model C-25 in kit form. This in-circuit tester, shown in Figure 12, has the advantage of being able to test for a shorted capacitor when the capacitor is shunted by a resistance as low as 7 ohms. A Type EM84 indicator tube is used rather than the older Type 6E5. It is only capable of measuring the capacitance of electrolytic capacitors. This PACO is small and lightweight. It measures 7½" high x 5¼" wide x 4½" deep.

### **CORNELL-DUBLIER CAPACITOR BRIDGE**

The Cornell-Dubilier Electrical Corporation In South Plainfield, N.J., manufactured both capacitors and capacitor testers. The Model BN, shown in Figure 13, is a bridge type tester capable of measuring capacitance values from 10 pF to 50

mF. The unit is quite compact, measuring 3%" x 5" x 3" and weighs in at only 2 pounds. Its dealer's net price was \$11.88 in 1942. By 1954, the price had increased to \$24.95.

Cornell-Dubilier (C-D) also made a Model BF-50 capacitor analyzer that sold for \$29.88 in 1942. In addition to measuring capacitance, the BF-50 can test for shorted and open capacitors, power factor, leakage, and insulation resistance.

The Model BF-60 Capacitor Bridge, ca. 1954, measures capacitance, resistance and power factor. It uses two tubes: a Type 6E5 as the indicator and a Type 6W4GT as a rectifier.

C-D also produced five models of capacitor decade boxes. At least one of these boxes seems to appear at every radio flea market.

### SPRAGUE CAPACITOR ANALYZERS

The Sprague Products Company of North Adams, Mass., a manufacturer of resistors, capacitors and capacitor testers, made a series of analyzers named the TEL-OHMIKE. The TO-1, or Standard Model condenser-resistor analyzer, uses a bridge circuit to measure capacitance in the range of 10 pF to 5,000 mF and resistance in the 0.5 ohm to 70megohms range. Insulation resistance can be read up to 10,000 megohms. Leakage and power factor tests can also be performed. An eye tube is used as an indicator.

The TO-2 DeLuxe model has all of the features of the TO-1, except that a DC volt-milliammeter was substituted for the eye tube. Provision was made for external connections to the meter. In 1942, the TO-1 and TO-2 sold for \$34.50 and \$44.90 respectively.

The TEL-OHMIKE series continued through to

the TO-6A. The TO-6, shown in Figure 14, measures capacitance over the range of 2 pF to 2,000 mF, power factor, leakage current and insulation resistance. The use of push buttons simplifies the selection of capacitance and test voltage ranges. It uses one each of the following tube types: a 6AB4, a 6BL7GTA, a 6C4, and a 6E5. The TO-5 and TO-6 models can still be found but seem to be pricier than similar analyzers from other manufacturers. Of all of the analyzers in my possession, the TO-6 is my favorite because of its ease of use and versatility.

### **OTHER KIT TESTERS**

The Heath Company of Benton Harbor, Michigan, produced its famous Heathkits for a staggering number of electronic devices, including test equipment of all kinds. A separate article would

be required to describe all of the Heathkit capacitor testers. Consequently, Heathkit coverage will be limited to a description of the Model IB-5281 RLC Bridge.

The Heathkit Model IB-5281 RLC Bridge, circa 1977, is the only solid-state tester included in this article. Although it will not test for leakage or power factor, it has a number of advantages: It is battery-operated, lightweight, portable and can measure capacitance, resistance and inductance. A photograph of an IB-5281 appears in Figure 15.

Please note that the unit has been modified with the addition of an LED power-on indicator and a knob on the shaft of the level control. (Both mods are highly recommended). The bridge's ranges are resistance 10 ohms to 10 megohms; Inductance 10 mH to 10H; and capacitance 10 pF to 10 mF. Even if you have a capacitor tester on the bench, this Heathkit tester would be a nice addition.

The Electronic Instrument Co. (EICO) had great success with its Model 9508 Resistance-Capacitance-Comparator Bridge kits. The 950B shows up frequently in radio flea markets. This bridge-type tester covers a capacitance range of 10 pF to 5,000 mF. The resistance range runs from 0.5 ohms to 500 megohms. Power factor testing is included. The indicator tube is a Type 1629, and the rectifier, a Type 6X5.

### **CLOSING THOUGHTS**

A capacitor analyzer is a handy Item to have on a service bench. Since tube-type test equipment is inexpensive but

well suited to servicing tube-type radios you may want to put one on your bench. Pick a simple R-C bridge if you just want to measure capacitance, but consider a full-featured analyzer if you want to do leakage testing and power factor measurements. These old capacitor testers can do what present-day, solid-state testers cannot do — perform leakage tests using the high DC voltages found in tube-type radios.

# **Montgomery Ward Airline Model 62-402**

### **BY RICHARD ARNOLD**

It takes dedication and determination to turn an empty cabinet into a good-looking, working radio. Richard Arnold explains how he did it. (Editor)

I have been writing articles for Antique Radio Classified since 1985, and maybe only three have been about console radios. I have a few consoles in my collection, but as a rule I tend to shun them for what I think are more interesting radios. I do, however, have this pretty neat looking Montgomery Ward Airline, shown in Figure 1, in my collection. There is a story here that perhaps some would find interesting, so here goes.

This now rather nice looking radio was an ugly duckling when I first saw it. Really, all that there was to the radio was an empty cabinet in bad condition and the original grille cloth. My son Andy had found the cabinet in a closet in the garage of an old house he was living in. Knowing that I am always on the lookout for old radios, he decided to rescue it. He brought it to me and said, "Here, look what I found!"

Well, I really wasn't all that thrilled, as I don't like to collect just any old console, especially when all there was to it was this messed up cabinet with a grille cloth. What was I going to do with it?

Nevertheless, I accepted it and even put it up against a wall in my radio room with its very limited space where it sat for about a year or so. You know, one good thing about these large console sets is that you can always use them to display another radio, so that is how I was using this Airline.

### THE RESTORATION PROCESS

Then one day, I was sitting there looking at the empty cabinet of the Airline console and decided to see if I could find a chassis and all of the other stuff that I would need to make it whole. Using my newly acquired computer, I looked at a number of links. I came across this one site that had many console radios pictured. It was the site of John and Jean Goller of Antique Radio Restorations. They had a complete Airline 62-402 pictured. Good grief! What do you suppose the odds of that were? I contacted them and made a deal for everything I needed. They were very nice people, very cooperative and helpful.

When the items arrived, I was very happy to see the great condition that they were in. The chassis was beautiful, all original and no rust.

Heck, it even worked and sounded great. I didn't have to do a thing to it. One nice surprise was that the set has one of those green-tuning eyes.

Well, now that I had the whole radio, all that I needed to do was to refinish the cabinet. The wood was all OK; just the finish was shot. I took it down to the wood and was really pleased with the condition and quality of the wood that the manufacturer had put into this radio. There were three or four different kinds of wood, not including the inlays. I looked at the set and decided not to stain it, as the wood had a natural beauty that I wanted to maintain. I purchased some expensive Tung oil and used it with what I think are great results.

### THE SPECIFICATIONS

According to Rider, the Airline Model 62-402 is a 1938 radio. It is a 10-tube superhet, not including the tuning indicator tube. The ten tube types used in this model are the following: a 6D6 RF, a 6C6 1st detector, a 6D6 IF, two 41 push-pull output tubes, an 80 rectifier, and four Type 76 tubes used as follows: a 2nd Detector and AVC, a 1st audio, an oscillator, and finally, a "Balancing Exciter." Now that one was a whole new term to me, so I found out what it means. It is a phase inverter for the two pushpull Type 41 tubes. The tuning eye or indicator tube is a Type 6U5. The IF for the radio is 456 Kc.

There are also three bands on this radio:

- Range B is the broadcast band from 550 to 1600 Kc;
- Range C is the Amateur band from 1,585 Kc to 5,400 Kc;
- Range D is the shortwave band from 15,000 Kc to 18,300 Kc.

There are also four knobs on the radio. They are used as bass and treble tone control, tuning, band selection, and on/off and volume control.

After I had finished the radio and had it all together and working great, I invited my son to sit down in the radio room. When I turned it on for him, he was amazed at what he was looking at. He couldn't believe it was the same radio. That green tuning eye impressed the heck out of him too.

Now, that is the story of my Montgomery Ward Airline Model 62-402 radio that was brought back to life and has turned out to be a beautiful looking and great playing radio. It was a diamond in the rough.

# **More Cortlandt Street Memories**

The archived articles on our Web site continue to provide excitement and information for browsers of the Web. Ben Beekman found our 1998 article on Cortlandt Street and contributed these additional memories of those early days. (Editor)

Mr. Yonker's photos of Cortlandt Street, Manhattan, [See A.R.C., September 1998, and www.antiqueradio.com] awakened some old memories for me.

Around August of 1950, I was hired by Arrow Radio as a replacement for a Hank Goldberg, who was about to be drafted into the Army. I was to work with (or for, I forget which) a Morty Selzer. My first job there was to keep up the inventory in their old ledgers, updating the stock figures according to the invoices. My little office was a closet-sized room on the second floor with a window looking out the back of the building. I'd be in there all day entering the figures on line after line.

The main area was filled with desks for the salesmen, who were always on the phones, or were constantly being paged over the PA to "pick up, please" by a woman who took the incoming calls. The one page I remember most was "Hy Mendel, pick up, please."

Once or twice I had to go along with the delivery truck on a trip which took me into the factory of the Techmaster Television Company. There I watched as dozens of people handwired the RCA 630TS chassis that were being built under license. Another time, we went out

to the UTC transformer factory, driving past City Hall on the way.

Another part of my job was to put a dot of colored paint on the underside of each miniature vacuum tube in a box containing dozens so as to color-code them for warranty purposes. We had a dumbwaiter on which we could place parts from the second or third floor stock rooms and speedily lower them to the ground floor sales counter area.

I remember that if I looked out the front second story window to my right, I could see the West Side Highway. Looking to the left, I could spot a Nedick's on the next block.

Having to stay in that tiny room, working on the books, I soon became unhappy. After all, a 19-year-old graduate of the Delehanty School of Radio and Television would want to do something more in line with his training, wouldn't he?

And so, one day I phoned in and told them I wouldn't be coming ir anymore. Not a nice thing to do, without any notice. but I was only a kid and didn't understand that. I never returned to Cortlandt St., finding future employment in nearby Long Island City television factories. But that Arrow job, being my first ever, has always stayed with me. Makes you wonder what Cortlandt St. would have been like today had the World Trade Center not been built.

Ah, those were the days!

# Estes Auction Burbank, Ohio — April 16, 2005

All elements were there for a spectacular auction - a beautiful day in spring, along with a stellar collection of radio treasures - and the record crowd was not disappointed. The Estes auction on April 16 at Expo Auction center in Burbank. Ohio, featured the collection of Arthur Aseltine from Ann Arbor. Michigan, in addition to other consignments. The Friday evening viewing was well attended, but there were few consoles, box lots, and other "under the table" offerings. That changed on Saturday morning when loads of box lots and consoles were brought in, and the undersides of the tables filled up rapidly

This auction featured an impressive list of wireless sets, Kennedys, DeForests, Grebes, crystal sets, advertising pieces, books and ephemera. The 10 Atwater Kent breadboards included three Model 10s and several Model 8s and 9s. There were few or no novelties, transistor radios, military radios and only a couple of ham items. The "good

stuff" really brought the buyers out, and by auction time, the parking lot was overflowing.

This was a large sale. I recorded well over 700 lots and missed quite a few, so the final total was probably over 800 lots. The 104 tube lots were more than the usual number and offered some rare tubes, including five or six Audions.

The method of sale of the books and ephemera was by "choice" from one of several display racks where the

books and ephemera were laid out. In this method of auctioneering, the buyers are bidding on the opportunity to buy one or more items at the final knock down price per item; that is, the winning bidder may take one or more items at the bid price for each item chosen. This continues until all items on that rack are sold. As the number of items on the rack dwindles, the auctioneer may offer all remaining items for one price.

This type of sale makes it very difficult to keep track of what items are sold and what price is realized, so the detailed listing does not record many of the book and ephemera items. Also, in the afternoon, several simultaneous side auctions were held to deal with the bulk tube lots, miscellaneous box lots, and test equipment under the tables. I was not able to record these auctions.

A special note regarding console radios: Often we hear a general comment about how console radios do not sell and are not appreciated. Certainly there is the size and transportation problem, but let me offer the following accounting.

There were over fifteen consoles from the 1930s and 1940s in this sale. Nine of them sold for a total of \$210, or slightly less than \$25 each. Six of them sold for a total of \$12,400 or slightly over \$2,000 each and this did not include the Zenith Stratosphere. So the message here is that superior consoles bring superior prices, while average or below average consoles bring low prices. If it's good, it will sell.

But there is always the exception: a Capehart Model 111K3 with "flip over" record changer, in excellent condition — a very nice radio in my opinion, albeit a bit on the large and heavy side — sold for a mere \$10. A clear case of the right buyer not being present or not having the ability to transport it.

But what about the Zenith Stratosphere, the star of the show? This Stratosphere was clearly in the best shape of any I've seen, but then, one does not get the opportunity to see that many. A couple of knobs were not correct, and one small escutcheon was missing, but the major problem was that the two speakers were gone. Otherwise, it was in excellent condition.

Richard Estes announced that he had identified two sources of speakers: The first had one speaker available, while another was willing to sell two speakers. Unfortunately, Richard could not induce the potential seller to consign the speakers to this sale, but he offered to pass on the appropriate contact information to the buyer.

The bidding on this set opened at \$10,000, and within seconds was at \$40,000, which was the ultimate sale price. Unfortunately, the buyer is in Europe, so another American treasure ends up across the pond. Anyway, as I've said before, each Estes auction is like a trip to a new radio museum where you can touch and even purchase museum quality artifacts.

As usual, Richard conducted the auction nonstop from 10:00 A.M. until 6:30 P.M. I stopped recording at 5:55 P.M. and missed quite a few lots in the last hour while checking out myself. The dollar total that I recorded was \$250,000, and with the lots that I missed, the total surely was \$260,000, not including the 5 percent buyer's premium charged at this location. Surely, this was a "barn burner" of an auction.

One final thought — I keep trying to remember to take some pictures in the parking lot at the end of the sale. It's quite a sight to see some of the eager buyers trying to stuff their many purchases into obviously overloaded cars and trucks, especially those who had overindulged in the bulk and box lots. Oh well, I guess that's half the fun of it.






This interior view of the Victor RE-154 shows the phonograph and the radio's front panel.

# Radio Daze Auction — May 20, 2005

The Northland Antique Radio Club's (NARC) Radio Daze was held May 20-21, 2005, at the Comfort Inn in Plymouth, Minnesota. The events included a swap meet, a raffle, an old equipment contest, a luncheon with a guest speaker, and the auction reported below. Many thanks to Alan Jesperson of Great Northern Antiques for forwarding Greg Farmer's auction report. (Editor)

Wow! What a fun auction! This year's Radio Daze auction offered more than twice as many radios as were offered in 2004 and didn't end until about 10:30 Friday evening. Auctioneer Ed Ripley kept things moving, and his crew worked smoothly as they hauled items up for sale. A nice addition this year was the quick review of each item's qualities that Kip Wallace, former NARC president, gave as each one came up. Don Hauff and his crew again did an outstanding job of record keeping. I think they have a better system and do a better job than any auction I've attended. Thanks to all who helped!

The auction included 138 items with the most expensive being a rare prebroadcast era Pittsburgh Wireless detector/amplifier pair that was sold for \$2,300 by a man who had owned it since 1936. A couple of other highlights were a Zenith R520 selling for \$390 and a large Nipper dog for \$330. Total sales were \$8,045 with \$350 of that going to NARC.

Amazingly, the number of sellers increased from 18 last year to 33 this year. There were also 24 more bidders registered for the auction this year, so we hope this trend continues in the years to come. A sampling of items from the auction is listed below.

While auction prices should not be used to place a value on your own radios, it is still interesting to see the prices realized at the annual Radio Daze auction. Keep in mind that the condition of these items ranged from fair to excellent, and they were bid accordingly.

A warning: Auction prices are not current values. Our selection of auction items is not necessarily complete. A listing such as this cannot adequately include the condition of cabinets, chassis, transformers, tubes, the operating status of the set, and the inclusion of incorrect, restored or replica components, etc. Auction prices are the result of the excitement of the auction process, the skill of the auctioneer and the specific interests of the participants. Nevertheless, auction prices serve as useful references and as another element in the value determining process. The possibility of error always exists, and if we are notified, corrections will be reported.
