

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

With the advent of the New Year here in New England, and, in fact, in the entire northern sector of the U. S., winter in its full snowy garb has settled in. On the one hand, January means fun on the slopes, grog by the fire, and attention to radio projects long dormant on the workbench; on the other hand, it can mean frigid temperatures, icy travel conditions, and cabin fever!

In general, we can assume that such winter hazards weren't on Powel Crosley's inventive mind when he came up with the subject of our lead article — the lcyball refrigerator. Instead, Crosley was bent on marketing a product that would solve such summer hazards as spoiled food and the scarcity of cold fluids. Needless to

say, the solution was not a radio.

This unlikely Crosley product caught Ray Bintiiff's eye in an unlikely place for a New Englander — an Idaho Historical Society Center. What was Powel Crosley doing marketing a refrigerator? Naturally, Ray couldn't resist consulting Crosley expert Dave Crocker, who had written an article about another unlikely Crosley product — the Moonbeam aircraft. The result is an article about a Crosley nonradio product that kept its cool even in the extreme heat of a store fire.

If this doesn't strike you as improbable, read how the lcyball system works. Who knows how many more unique Crosley products might be

hidden away in a forgotten archive.

Happily for our usual purposes, collectors like Richard Arnold stick to radios that can be repair projects in a warm workshop. Just the ticket for a winter's day. Richard's GE Model 410 is another of his success stories — a second look, a little TLC, and a very satisfactory radio, good for daily listening.

Ed Ripley's Emerson "Sunbeam" radio project was even more ambitious. It takes a special vision to see that a Sunbeam electric heater fan wouldn't be complete unless it had radio innards. It also takes persistence to find a chassis that fits. Ed's painstaking efforts to create an Emerson "Sunbeam" black box radio are described in detail, with photos included. Here's proof that there's more than one way to salvage a chassis.

As we look forward to the new year of radio events, we're still catching up on reports on past ones. Michigan's Extravaganza is a long-standing 2-day event that has grown steadily and became more successful over the years. It appears now to have topped all others in attendance — over 1,200 this year.

The reasons for this success are multiple,

but the primary one is that the flea market with its set starting time (Le Mans) is open to all. This is key to attracting new collectors and making up for the inevitable attrition any hobby suffers.

Another ingredient for success is the informal free reception with live entertainment to which all registered attendees are invited, rather than a banquet at an additional cost. Include all the usual offerings of a successful meet—an auction, presentations, a contest, drawings, a Ladies' Luncheon—and you have success, big time.

It's also a plus for the growth of the hobby to report on the success of a first-time event — the Tri-State Spring Radio Fest, the combined efforts of the Pittsburgh and Buckeye clubs. These clubs once had separate events, but combining them makes sense in these hurried times.

Despite poor weather conditions, there were 55 vendors in the flea market and over 200 attendees. Richard Estes presided over the auction of more than 225 lots, and plans for a second year event are already underway. The enthusiasm engendered by such events spells good news for all of us who want to keep interest in radio collecting strong.

RADIO MANUFACTURERS

The Crosley Icyball

Powel Crosley's interests were not limited to radios. In the August 2004 issue of A.R.C. Dave Crocker described Crosley's Moonbeam aircraft. In this article, Ray tells us about another very different product manufactured and marketed by the Crosley Radio Corporation (Editor)

During a visit to the Bonner County Historical Society Heritage Center in Sandpoint, Idaho, a Crosley exhibit caught my eye — and it certainly didn't look like a radio. Upon closer inspection, I found that it was an early refrigerator that Crosley called the "Icvball."

My first thought was to call Dave Crocker, our resident Crosley expert, and find out if he knew of this early refrigerator. Of course he did. Dave offered to send me "more than I ever wanted to know about the Icyball."

When I returned home, I found copies of the *The Crosley Broadcaster* in the mail. The March 15, 1929, cover page, featuring the Crosley Icyball, is reproduced as Figure 1. The June 1, 1929, issue contained a testimonial about Icyball's abil-

ity to survive a fire. That article is reproduced in a box on the opposite page.

The Icyball's lift-top cabinet is made of metal and is insulated with cork. One of the two pressurized tanks or balls that make up the refrigeration system can be seen at the right side of the cabinet

THE ICYBALL SYSTEM

The lcyball system converts heat into cold. Its closed system contains a refrigerant (a mixture of water and ammonia). In use, the "hot ball" is heated by an external heat source, typically a kerosene burner. Then the hot ball is submersed in a tub of water. The condensation and evaporation process causes the temperature of the second "cold ball" to drop to below freezing.


Figure 2 shows an overall view of the icyball on display in the Idaho museum, while Figure 3 shows a close-up of the unit's external hot ball. Figure 4 shows the cold ball positioned in the lcyball's insulated cabinet.

The heating and cooling of the hot ball, referred to as "charging" is performed with the unit removed from the insulated cabinet. After the charging operation is complete and the cold ball begins to cool, the unit is moved to the insulated cabinet. A handle was provided for this purpose.

Icyball Refrigerator Laughs at Fire



At Parkin, Arkansas we have just authorized an Icyball dealer, the Parkin Furniture Mr. O'Quinn is the owner and manager of the establishment. He sold the first Icyball that he had in stock within 24 hours after he had received it. **Immediately** after receiving his 2nd unit and had put it in operation the town of Parkin had a big fire which burned the entire block in which Mr. O'Quinn had his business with the exception of Mr. O'Quinn's store. The heat of the fire was terrific and did considerable damage to the Parkin Furniture Co., but after the fire was subdued and little but ruins were left Mr. O'Quinn still had ice in his Icyball which he had in operation at the back of his store where the heat of the fire was the worst, which goes to prove that Icyballs will maintain their cold when it gets as hot as hell-o.

Figure 5 shows a close-up of the nameplate mounted on the handle.

Figure 6, reproduced from *The Crosley Broad-caster*, shows the complete leyball unit, including an Ice cube tray that could be inserted in the "freezing tube" at the base of the cold ball.

MARKETING THE ICYBALL

As Dave Crocker has pointed out In previous articles, Crosley was a great promoter and did not limit his products to radios. He did not hesitate to manufacture niche products if he thought they would sell. And the lcyball did sell. It sold especially well in rural areas that lacked electricity. Certainly, most rural homes had an adequate supply of kerosene lamps and heaters. Production of the lcyball is estimated to have been in the thousands.

Production began in 1928 and continued until 1938. The cost of an Icyball was about \$80.

Because radio sales declined in the summer months, Crosley believed that the demand for the refrigeration units could provide extra income for Crosley dealers during that otherwise slow sales period. To make sure that the refrigeration unit was a success, he produced about 1,500 units for field trials prior to going into production. He then followed up by establishing an "lcyball School" for Crosley salesmen and later for Crosley distributors and salesmen. An article in *The Crosley Broadcaster* states, "A man who knows his product finds it easy to self." Naturally, the lcyball was touted regularly on programs aired by Crosley's radio station WLW.

It seems that examples of Powel Crosley's wide-ranging interests just keep popping up.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

General Electric Model 410

In this article, Richard Arnold tells us how he scored again during one of his frequent visits to local antique shops. (Editor)

About six years ago I was making my weekly rounds through one of my favorite antique stores here in Ardmore, Oklahoma. I happened to come across the GE Model 410, shown in Figure 1, in one of the booths. It was not much to look at, and I started to walk past it. But, pickin's were really slim that day, so I decided to give it a second look.

I found that the finish was pretty rough, the grille cloth was shot, and there was a knob missing. Well, it looked like a challenge, and, at that point, I started to look at it as a possible project radio. I remembered that I just happened to have a set of knobs

that matched the one that was still on the radio, so that was not a problem. The price was apparently right — I think it was \$13 — and I went ahead and purchased it.

When I got the set home, I looked up the model number and found that it had been made in 1950. I cleaned it up some, tested the tubes, replaced the caps, added the new knob, and there it was — a little mundane General Electric radio that had come back to life.

THE GE MODEL 410

The GE Model 410 has a wooden cabinet that measures 9" x 7" x 13". It uses a slide rule dial scale that tunes the broadcast band from 540 to 1600 Kc. The two knobs are for on/off volume control and for tuning. It is an AC/DC set that operates on 105 to 120 volts. The IF is 455 Kc.

The set has six tubes: a 12SK7 RF amplifier, a 12SA7 oscillator, a 12BA6 IF amplifier, a 12SQ7 detector and audio amplifier, a 35Z3 rectifier, and finally, a 35L6GT power amplifier. The pilot lamp is a 6-8v bayonet style #47.

After getting the set working, I did a little cabinet refinishing, and put in a new grille cloth. Now I've got a 1950s radio that plays great.

I have looked on eBay for the radio a number of times and have yet to find one. I did, however, find a Model 405 that was up for auction and in

really good condition; it sold for only \$11.50. A 404 sold also, but I did not keep track of it. Who knows, maybe this 410 is pretty scarce.

The 410 is very selective, and the sound is great as it uses a 5-inch permanent magnet speaker. I tell you — looks were deceiving with this little radio. It's a good one, and I listen to it just about every day. Sure am glad that I salvaged it.

There are two other models that use the same chassis: They are the Model 404, which is a brown plastic, and the Model 405, which is an ivory colored plastic. The General Electronics Department, Electronics Park, Syracuse, New York, made these radios.

Emerson "Sunbeam" AM Cathedral Radio

As he did in an article in the August 2005 issue, Ed Ripley demonstrates that there is more than one way to salvage a radio chassis. A little imagination and a heater fan with the right shape will do the trick. (Editor)

Take a good look at the front and rear photos of the radio in Figure 1. Do you recognize it? Have you ever seen one before? You say your grandmother had one when you were a kid? You'd better look again.

Actually, I'm fooling you, big time. Grandma might have had one that looked like this, but if she did, it kept her warm on cold nights. You see, this was once a Sunbeam Heater Fan. I replaced the fan works with the chassis from an Emerson 707B, shown in Figure 2, sometimes known as the Emerson "Sunburst." It had fallen and "burst" all right, but the chassis was still good.

Originally, I bought this steel-cased heater fan because of the cathedral-mushroom shape and the chrome grille. Also, it was "radio-sized." Including the base, it measures 12" high x 5½" wide x 6" deep. I paid \$20 for it. It still worked, barely, but it looked like a radio, and, well, the rest is history.

THE HEATER FAN CASE

The restoration process went fairly smoothly. First, I removed the fan and heating elements, along with the on-off snap switch on the front of the unit, as shown in Figure 3. Left with a rectangular opening flanked by two screw holes, I decided to use the opening for a peep-window dial. So, I needed a radio chassis with a tuning capacitor low enough to line up with the hole. The adjacent screw holes could later be enlarged and used for the tuning and volume control shafts.

I disassembled the rest of the heater fan case and refinished it. The original black enamel was badly worn and scratched, and there were places where rust was beginning to show. I lightly sanded it, and masked off the nice old gold and red Sunbeam decal on the front. It wasn't perfect, but enough of it remained to keep it on and thus preserve some of the originality. I then painted the case gloss black. When it dried, I reinstalled the chrome grille assembly.

THE EMERSON 707B CHASSIS AND SPEAKER

One of the biggest problems one encounters in a project like this is finding a chassis that will fit. I

tried several, but the Emerson 707B, shown in Figure 4, seemed to be the best candidate. This model is a 5-tube, AM superheterodyne radio with the tuner located below the chassis platform, which was perfect for what I needed. It was also small enough to fit. There was lots of room to spare at the sides and above, but it would be a snug fit from front to back.

The little speaker that was mounted on the Emerson was damaged, and would need to be replaced. I removed it and found a bigger PM speaker that would fit into the chromed housing of the cabinet. The rear of this housing is recessed, and is approximately $6\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter. The speaker, which I believe was originally part of an old battery farm radio, nestled into the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " cavity and fit like a glove.

I then cut some grille cloth into a circle, just slightly larger in diameter than the grille cavity. Since it wasn't practical to try to glue the speaker cloth to the grille, I made the cloth piece just large enough so that it held in place when the speaker was pressed down over it. Figure 5 shows the grille cloth being installed.




Figure 6. The PM speaker is attached to the cabinet's chrome housing in two places.

There was no way to bolt the speaker directly to the case without drilling more holes and ruining the look of the chrome front. However, there were four bolts on the inside front that held the chrome housing to the case, as shown in Figure 6. I was able to use two of them to attach mounting brackets that would hold the speaker in place.




Figure 7. The Emerson chassis after its modification to fit the Sunbeam cabinet.

Next, It was time to modify the Emerson chassis. After removing the speaker, I unbolted the on-off-volume control, leaving the wiring intact. I cut away part of the right front chassis frame, as shown in Figure 7, so I could mount the volume control directly to the heater cabinet. I later found that I needed to extend two of the wires by a couple of inches.

I also removed the old, damaged ferrite bar antenna and a cardboard back plate from the Emerson. The set was recapped, and one tube was replaced to put the Emerson back in working condition. A loop antenna from an old Admiral junker was used to replace the ferrite bar, and a black power cord was installed, replacing the too-short original. The Emerson 707B has a dial lamp, which I retained, using a #47 bulb. However, it doesn't really do much illuminating, and could be removed.

FITTING THE CHASSIS TO THE CABINET

Next came the all-Important business of preparing the modified Emerson chassis to fit the Sunbeam cabinet. The chassis had a direct tuning shaft with no strings, pulleys, etc., which was one of the reasons I chose it. However, in order for it to line up with the left screw hole in the heater case, I had to raise the chassis about ½".

The Emerson had two mounting holes in the bottom of its chassis. I built a small ¼" wood platform for the front one, and glued two ¼" thick pieces of rubber to it. The assembly was attached (Continued on following page)

to the front mounting hole with a small bolt. I used the rear hole to actually mount the chassis.

After lining up and measuring, I drilled a small hole in the bottom of the heater fan case, and used a longer mounting bolt. Figure 8 shows a bottom view of the cabinet with the mounting bolt and flat washer visible in the upper right. I selected a round, spool-like wood spacer, and to this, I glued a circular piece of rubber gasket material, again totaling about ½". The mounting bolt went through the case and the spacer and into the chassis. I purposely did not bolt the front so I would later be able to maneuver the chassis a bit when lining up the dial.

The dial itself was a disc, fashioned from some plastic dial material I found in the junk box. I needed a disc with a radlus of about $1\frac{1}{6}$ " so it would line up with the dial hole and not rub on the bottom of the case. It also needed to be thin enough so it wouldn't rub against the front of the case. The dial disc I used slipped right over the tuning shaft, and was tight enough to stay in place. Actually, one could make such a disc out of stiff cardboard and use a rubber grommet in the

center. This one had a pressed metal center hole and worked perfectly.

The dial face was copied from an actual dial of an early 1930s radio and was in the 0 to 100 scale, commonly used in those days. I pasted the copy to the disc. It had black numerals on plain white paper, which would look good on a black radio. I used a thin protective plastic overlay to preserve the paper dial and give It a little shine. The numbers read sideways in the peep window, and a future project may be to modify the dial with a different scale and numbers that read straight up and down.

As Figure 9 shows, the front of the Sunbeam cabinet has a protrusion that previously held the on-off switch, giving a handy indentation on the rear side. I measured this Indentation and found it to be 1½" wide and 5½" high. I cut a plece of clear plastic to fit the opening and serve as a dial lens.

Also, two small pieces of black cardboard measuring %" x %" were cut and glued to each end of the clear plastic on the rear side. See Figure 10. This was done to hide the extra white area on the left side of the dial and the vacant space between the edge of the disc and the right edge of the dial opening. A little white paper arrow was also glued

to the right side for a dial indicator. The completed lens assembly was glued with epoxy into the rectangular indentation.

REASSEMBLY

Now, it was time to reassemble the project. The chassis and dial numbers lined up quite well. The tuning shaft was a little short, but I knew that going into the project. I had nice black set-screw type knobs picked out that would work just fine.

However, with the dial disc in place, I was unable to push the chassis all the way to the front. I knew that the upper part of the disc would have to reach up under the grille assembly, but I didn't count on being unable to tilt the chassis enough to get it started. The solution was to remove all but one of the grille mounting bolts and leave it loosely in place. By lifting on the grille and tilting the chassis, I was able to slide the dial disc into place and complete the installation, as shown in Figure 11.

The speaker and loop antenna leads were then soldered to the Emerson chassis, and the loop was glued to the right inside wall of the case. It was a big improvement over that ferrite bar that came with the Emerson, but it still wasn't as sensitive as I liked, so I added a long-wire antenna. This not only improved reception but made the result look more like an early 1930s radio.

I call this black box beauty my "Emerson Sunbeam — the Hottest Radio in Town!"

MEET & AUCTION REPORT

Michigan Antique Radio Club Extravaganza '05 Lansing, Michigan — July 8-9, 2005

The Michigan Antique Radio Club (MARC) celebrated its 20th anniversary at Extravaganza, on July 8 and 9 at the Holiday Inn South Convention Center in Lansing, Michigan. Extravaganza has the reputation of being one of the premier antique radio events of the country, and this year was no exception. As usual, the event was well attended, and all enjoyed themselves.

Extravaganza opened with registration on Thursday afternoon, July 7. As they were last year, the flea market spots were assigned, and once things were set up, people could move into their spots and get tables set up. This process went smoothly, and, by dinner time, the flea market was large-

ly filled. Over three hundred spots had been reserved. Estimated attendance was over 1,200.

A noted feature of Extravaganza is the "big top"
— a large tent in the center of the flea market which serves as home for registration and the hospitality area, and provides 60 tables for vendors to rent. The tent also provides a gathering spot out of the

sun and weather and adds to the ambience of the

On Thursday evening, Club President John Reinicke did a presentation on "Fun with Bakelite" in which he showed a number of techniques, from restoring the shire to otherwise fine sets to replacement of missing pieces. As a demonstration, he

used a shattered Zenith set that had been repaired with a variety of materials from fiberglass to Bondo. This kind of presentation is well received, as about a hundred gathered for it in the hospitality area under the big top.

After the presentation, an old-fashioned movie projector was set up to show a *Three Stooges* short. The short was followed by a feature length movie, all under the big top. A sizeable contingent hung around for the movie and groups could be seen socializing in the flea market area throughout the evening.

FRIDAY ACTIVITIES

The Michigan Antique Radio Club has a policy of no sales before 7 A.M. on Friday. On Friday morning, almost all of the vendors adhered to the policy. Unfortunate-

ly, a very few did not have the courtesy to follow the recommendation, and some complaints resulted. This is a minor flaw that can be corrected by a bit more checking in the future.

The event opened officially at 7 A.M., and the remaining spots in the flea market filled as more vendors arrived on Friday momling and things got into full swing. By midmorning on Friday, over 1,000 event badges had been handed out, and officials had to run to the store to buy another box. The badges were not required to roam the flea market, and an additional couple of hundred attendees were in evidence in the flea market. A very good turnout indeed!

To promote Extravaganza, the Michigan Club places ads in over 60 local papers and runs spots on local radio stations. The cost of the ads is covered by the admission fees.

On Friday, the ladies got to enjoy the "Woman's Luncheon" in the Hummingbirds restaurant. This is well attended and, in a lot of cases, provides a chance for the spouses of ardent collectors to commiserate. There were door prizes, and everyone enjoyed a good meal.

The weather cooperated for the most part and the day would have been perfect if it were not for two "out of the blue" rain showers. The showers came up quite quickly and caught several flea market vendors by surprise. Since the sun came out between showers, there were two scrambles to get things covered with tarps and dropcloths.

On Friday afternoon, there were two technical presentations: one by Mike Dale on vacuum tubes,

and another by Mark Oppat on soldering. Mark also did a question and answer session. Both presentations were very well received and played to a "standing room only" crowd. Mike and Mark were surprised at how much interest there was in the topics, and both ran well past the posted finish time as they answered many questions.

The contest at Extravaganza, always an amazing affair, is open for viewing at the close of judging on Friday afternoon. It is really surprising and gratifying that so many collectors will bring quite rare and valuable items for display.

This year the theme was Michigan radio manufacturers and broadcasters, and we were treated to a rare Wolverola, an almostas-rare peach Sparton, and a number of Detrola, Wilcox-Gay, Kadette, and other Michigan sets. Speakers, test equipment, radio station memorabilla, novelties and, of course, the "open" category rounded out the display.

In addition to trophies, contest winners received a commemorative radio with the MARC logo and a 20th anniversary designation. The first place winners got a miniature cathedral set, and the ribbon winners received a small AM/FM set.

The contest is the centerpiece of the gathering and attendees can walk around to enjoy the entries. This year, in addition to the contest, there were several tables placed around the room for non-judged displays of Michigan radios. Also on these tables were many items from other Michigan manufacturers, such as Heathkit, V-M, Electro-Voice, atc.

general audience. This year it went to a really remarkable miniature replica of an old radio shop that was built into an old radio console. Sherl Jenicke went to considerable effort to create this replica.

The "Best of Show" was Chris Rockhey's peach Sparton. Jeff Conley captured the "Chairman's Trophy" with his restored ebony and chrome Detrola. The "Best Restoration" award went to Lowell Muhlhbrandt for his General Motors 110 with the remote control ashtray. (When did you last see the ashtray and the set together as a working pair?)


"Radio Reception" features a drawing for the Grand Prize, which was a replica of a Sparton blue "sled." This AM/FM/CD modern set is a quite good reproduction of the original. The prize drawing was done in a "Survivor" format. Five winners were drawn and invited on stage. Each winner was given the opportunity to auction off his ticket in a 50/50 format (half the sale of the ticket goes to the club). Then one of the five is drawn and that person is "off the island." Again, the survivors can auction their tickets. This continues until only one remains — the winner. This is a fun way to hold a prize drawing.

All through the reception people could enjoy the cash bar, the trays of goodies, and music by "Picks and Sticks." "Picks and Sticks" are well known in southeast Michigan and can often be seen at Greenfield Village at the Henry Ford Museum.

SATURDAY ACTIVITIES

On Saturday, there was an all-day flea market. In the morning, Donald Matteson did a presentation on "Sparton's History in Broadcast Radio." Like those on Friday, this excellent presentation was very well received.

Late on Saturday morning, under the big top, children of all ages participated in "Radio Craft." In

this session, each person made a curio box, decorated it with a radio-theme decal, and lacquered it — a fun activity for all.

The highlight of Saturday is the equipment auction in the afternoon. Presided over by the premiere old radio auctioneer, Richard Estes, the auction is in a "buy back" format. Rather than placing a reserve on an item, the seller may bid on his own item in order to protect the price. This makes for a lively auction and keeps things moving.

This auction provides an opportunity for sellers to offer pieces in an auction format for very low commission rates. This year, 160 lots were offered for sale for a total bid of \$14,150. Of this, \$3,305 was buy back, and a total of \$10,845 exchanged hands.

The dynamic of a live auction is always interesting. One seller, who had placed a number of quality items in the auction, complained that he had to buy back just about all of his items. In this case he did not find a motivated bidder for many of his items. On the other hand, two sellers noted that they had placed items in the action that had not made their reserve on eBay.

At this auction, all of the items sold, and one of them managed to top the eBay reserve by double! These sellers were quite happy with the results. The response at an auction is never predicable and auctions still provide good opportunities for bargains for both sellers and buyers alike.

At the end of the auction, the second 50/50 drawing and the second "sellers drawing" were held. MARC gives each seller a raffle ticket, and one ticket is drawn on Friday for \$50 and one is drawn on Saturday for \$75. This is MARC's way of thanking the sellers.

Extravaganza closes on Saturday with the "Good Buy Affair." This is the donation auction held under the big top at the close of the main auction. The items are stacked on tables and "choice" is auctioned. That is, the bidder has his choice of any item on the table for the winning bid. He can take one or more items for the winning bid for each item. After the winning bidder takes choice, anyone else make take an Item at the bid price. Then the table is put up for bid again, and the process is repeated until the table is empty.

By the end of the bidding on a table, the winning

bid price is on the order of a buck or two. When the price gets that low, the tables empty quickly The "Good Buy Affair" gives folks a chance at some real bargains and raises money for the club to help offset the cost of the meet.

The Michigan Club and its many volunteers put a considerable effort into Extravaganza and it shows. The event is "laid back" and a lot of fun. However, it really is a lot of work to "make it look easy."
