EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Whenever we feature a postcard or greeting card from the early days of radio on our cover, we're struck by its reflection on the popular culture of the times. Radio seemed to have permeated all aspects of daily living, and the depiction of headphones and radios, often shown with adorable young children, was widespread. To emphasize the communicative power of the airways, images of radio were everywhere.

The concept persists well into today. Consider the number of radio novelties that show up in auctions — radios designed into models of cars, MacDonald's hamburgers, Mickey Mouse, globes, ships — the list goes on. A highlight in Ron Ramirez's welcome report of Eric's annual radio auction is an "Official League Ball" radio that sold for \$700. It seems that the image of radio in one form or other is here to stay.

As is very evident, we report almost monthly on Estes radio auctions in these pages. However, it's good to know that other auction houses and clubs also include radios in auctions on a regular basis. Another highlight of Eric's annual auction was the RCA black Catalin radio that sold for \$960.

The Colorado Radio Collectors annual auction was also a great success. Thanks to Larry Weide we can report on the impressive total proceeds of \$4.600. as well as the memorable BBQ potluck lunch. The top item was a Scott Allwave selling at \$850. but. I repeat, the real highlight seemed to be the BBQ.

The Delaware Valley Historic Radio Club meet at Kutztown, Pennsylvania, is one of the most popular events in the country. Ask John Hagman who writes in almost idyllic terms about his annual trek from Vermont to Pennsylvania. This meet continues to grow, and John shares with us his very personal experience there.

Personal tastes in collecting are reflected in some contributions to *Photo Review* this month. A wall receptacle for an antenna shows how folks were adapting their houses to radio, just as today's new houses feature built-in everything. And commemorative dinner plates with radio themes certainly don't turn up very often. Both of these items reinforce the impression that radio had invaded American culture.

Richard Arnold's article on the GE HJ-624 reminds us that we've come a long way in push-button tuning. Though "feather-touch" may have been the operative word in selling this radio, the tuning was mechanical, and a screwdriver was required to adjust each button. Of course, a true collector like Richard would find that inconvenience a pleasure.

The pleasure Robert Shindhelm felt in acquiring the signal generator of his dreams is contagious. His Hewlett Packard 606A, acquired at a bargain price, was totally unaffordable to the average amateur repairman in its day. The set required little restoration and its lab quality condition will give Robert joy forever. We congratulate him on his luck and thank him for sharing his story with us.

The continuity of an old radio shop over two decades is the subject of Dave Gonshor's article on two old photos. Dave invites us to think about jumping back in time to the prices of the 1920s and 1930s. Truly a dream world by today's standards.

Ray Bintliff gives Robert Murray's book on the early development of radio in Canada a definite heads-up. The similarity to some American sets is covered, and as Ray points out, extending our radio knowledge beyond our borders is a plus for the hobby.

Radio Miscellanea includes information from helpful readers, as well as news about the offer of a Philco radio, the Model 80 Colonial Clock, at GBARC's Radio XXXVII this month. How this unusua set will be offered to attendees will be announced at the meet. Hope to see you there.

AUCTION REPORT

Eric's 16th Annual Antique Radio Auction Olney, Illinois — October 30, 2005

Once again, Eric's Auction Service, 1000 S. West Street In Olney, Illinois, hosted its annual radio auction. Each year the sale draws participants from several states and offers a wide variety of items.

This year's sale featured mostly table radios of the 1940s and later. Unfortunately, it had very little in the way of cathedral and tombstone radios. Only one early radio of the battery era was represented in the sale — a Radiola III with no tubes, which sold for \$35. However, there were quite a few horn speakers selling for an average of \$50 each.

The highlight of the sale was a small RCA Victor RC-350 black onyx Catalin, which brought \$960. A Trophy "Official League Ball" radio, made to look like an

oversized baseball, brought \$700, and a Zenith 6V27 6-volt tombstone sold for \$380. A Jackson-Bell tombstone with a Peter Pan cutout in its grille brought \$300.

Nearly all of the console radios offered were Philcos and sold for an average of \$25 each. One Zenith console, a Model 850, brought \$150.

Some (not all) of the model numbers were announced, along with the make of each set during the sale. The following is a sampling of the items sold. Prices have been rounded to the nearest dollar. Most of the Items sold were considered to be in good condition unless otherwise noted below. Some low-cost items and items in poor condition or nonspecific descriptions are omitted.

A warning: Auction prices are not current values. Our selection of auction items is not necessarily complete. A listing such as this cannot adequately include the condition of cabinets, chassis, transformers, tubes, the operating status of the set, and the inclusion of incorrect, restored or replica components, etc. Auction prices are the result of the excitement of the auction process, the skill of the auctioneer and the specific interests of the participants. Nevertheless, auction prices serve as useful references and as another element in the value determining process. The possibility of error always exists, and if we are notified, corrections will be reported.



MEET REPORT

Kutztown Antique Radio Meet Kutztown, Pennsylvania — September 16-17, 2005

As is my habit, I attended the renowned Kutztown, Pennsylvania, radio flea market put on by the Delaware Valley Historic Radio Club (DVHRC) in September. I camped out at Promised Land State Park in the Poconos Thursday night, as it is a bit too long a drive to make it in one stretch from Vermont. I arrived a bit before noon Friday, and although a few dealers had set up already, it was a relaxed arrival. I delayed setting up myself while I perused what was out for sale. Nothing too promising turned up, so I began unpacking and setting up my own table.

At these events one is immediately set upon by swap jackals who are arriving with a new load of carrion — errr, radio stuff. As a warning to newbies, any quick interest shown by another dealer while you're unpacking always means you underpriced the item. Don't lower your price unless you really want a quick sale and don't mind seeing it on his table that afternoon. Your price tag will have been torn off and not replaced though, as sharks never put prices on

things.

I sold the Wurlitzer console I brought quite soon. It had a nice lacquer Job I had applied and a military grade chassis restoration by good friend Dennis. These sets are pretty rare so I knew it wouldn't last long. By late afternoon I still hadn't bought anything, but I'd sold about a third of my stuff.

Between sales, I had a great time talking with Keith Park and a few of our hosts from the DVHRC, as well as Bruce and Charlotte Mager from "Waves"

in Manhattan.

The weather was warm for mid-September; in fact, it was warm enough for a fan, but I had forgotten to bring one. I went out for dinner and also shopped for a fan, but couldn't find one for sale so late in the year, at least in Kutztown. After I returned, I sat out in the field where I had set up camp in the van a ways out from the market shelter. The dogs ran about in the full moonlight as I sipped a brew. It was breezy and 75°. What a life!

But that night we did get some heavy rains. These

fortunately cleared by 6 A.M. or so when I emerged to uncover my table. About 8 A.M. I bought a nice clean Silvertone 4587 console (compact, eye tube, 10 tubes, gold foil dial) from a new arrival for all of \$80. A little later, I found something I've wanted for years but couldn't previously afford — an outside horn phonograph. It's got a broken spring and needs a few other little things, but for \$175, it was a steal.

There wasn't a whole lot though of what I usually come to a swap looking for — high-end wooden sets needing a bit of work. But as my collection has grown, I have become far, far pickier, so this isn't really surprising. There was a bunch of fixer-upper, lower end consoles cheap, and plenty of "eye candy," such as nice Catalin and other fancy sets to admire. And there certainly were plenty of bargains in nice table sets too. I bought a Plant A, gold foil, seriesstring table model later in the day for \$25 as a gift set.

The auction proceeds this year went entirely to Katrina victims via the Red Cross. So when a bit less than half my stuff hadn't sold by late morning Saturday, it was an easy decision to donate most of what remained. I had dinner plans with a good friend well north of New York City, and couldn't stay for the auction this year. But it was a great relief as always to have the auction as an outlet for those things you just

don't want to haul back.

All In all, it was as always a great time. Thanks a million to the DVHRC and the folks at Rennlngers. Be sure to get your table for next spring reserved by mid-to late winter — the good spaces go fast and early. Go to http://www.renningers.com, and look under "Kutztown Special Events."



FRANZ POJER SUPER REJOP CRYSTAL DETECTOR – This plug-in crystal detector, which uses three springs and three crystals, was made by the Austrian company Franz Pojer in 1928. The company was famous for its outstanding design and workmanship. (Erwin Macho – Vienna, Austria)



RADIO AERIAL, GROUND, AND AC POWER RECEPTACLE — This receptacle was recently removed from the sun porch of a friend's home in Hagerstown, Maryland, during a remodeling project. The home, built in 1928, was wired for radio during construction. The antenna lead and ground wire were still running through the basement to the outside where the insulator for the antenna was also still present. We found that the ground was still attached to the ground rod as though waiting for the radio to be attached. This must have been state-of-the-art at that time. (Kim L. Bowers — Williamsport. MD)



PHILCO MODEL 40-140 – This time-worn 1940 table set was owned by a local barber shop for many years. Imagine the tales it has heard! It has six tubes and tunes three bands. (Carl D. Sutton – Ironton, OH)



DONALD DUNCAN CRYSTAL SET – This crystal set was manufactured by the Donald F. Duncan Co. of Chicago. It has a simple catwhisker type detector and measures 6" long x 3" wide x 2½" high. The case is leatherette over cardboard. (Dave Crocker – Mashpee, MA)

MARCONI WIRELESS STATION PLATE – This plate features the Marconi Wireless Station on Cape Cod. Under the picture of the station, it says, "Marconi Wireless Station, Wellfleet, Mass. The first wireless message from President Roosevelt to King George VII was sent from this station Jan. 19th, 1903." The plate measures 10½" across and is printed in green. It was imported expressly for Everett I. Nye of Wellfleet, Mass., and was manufactured by the W. Adams Co., England. (Dave Crocker – Mashpee, MA)



SIEMENS BROS. Type C.V. TUBE/CRYSTAL RECEIVER – Siemens Bros. Co., Ltd., (London) manufactured this one-tube, crystal receiver in 1922. It uses an early V24 tube. The right side of the box can be pulled out in order to give access to the vacuum tube. (Jim Taylor – Bournemouth, UK)



HOWARD, MODEL UNKNOWN – As near as I can tell, this set, with its ivy green, leather-covered, embossed gold stripe, wood cabinet, was made in 1936. It has the same chassis, tube lineup and layout as a 1935 Silver-Marshall Model 57-A, but with the addition of an SW band. The clock is a wind-up, 8-day Waltham. The model number on the label is blank, but in Rider's, it appears to be a Howard Model 58. It looks like an executive desk radio with the pen, pencil holders missing, but I wonder if it is a presentation radio or a production model. Any information would be appreciated. (Stephen Kuhn – Lockhart, TX)

WITH THE COLLECTORS

General Electric Model HJ-624 Feather-Touch Tuning Radio

A 6-tube, AC/DC set was bound to interest Richard Arnold. Once again, he shares his find with our readers — a General Electric "Feather-Touch" set. (Editor)

The radio in Figure 1 caught my attention with its good looks (at least, in my opinion). It is a 1939/40 model. Rider says that the set was made pre-June 1940. On the bottom of the radio, a paper says that It is an H-624, the "H" meaning that it was made in 1939. The company blacked this marking out a bit and replaced it with a stamping that says HJ-624, indicating that it was made in 1940. I suppose that this is an early 1940 set that spanned parts of both 1939 and 1940.

For those of you that have other General Electric radios, a letter E in front of the model number means that the set was made in 1936. The letter F means 1937 and the letter G means it was made in 1938.

THE MODEL HJ-624

This set is another push-button radio in my collection. It has six plastic tuning keys. The push-button tuning mechanism is mechanical, not electrical. Each button has an adjusting screw behind it that you can set to the station you desire. When depressed, the buttons move the dial scale pointer to the desired number on the face of the dial scale. General Electric has given the radio the designation: "Built-in Beam-a-Scope Six – Feather-Touch Tuning Key."

The radio is classified as a compact radio with the cabinet size belng 8 ¾" x 16" x 7 ¾". It is a 6-tube superheterodyne radio that can use either glass or metal tubes. The normal tube lineup Is the following: a 6SA7GT converter-oscillator; a 6SK7GT IF amplifier; a 6Q7GT detector, audio and AVC; a 6J5GT 2nd audio amplifier, a 25L6GT power output; and finally, a 25Z6GT rectifier. The dial lamp used is a No. 44.

The instructions say that the tubes can all be replaced with equivalent metal tubes. However, when changing the detector or IF tubes to metal tubes, the receiver should be realigned.

The radio will operate on 115v AC or DC and 25-60 cycles. The IF is 455 Kc.

Another feature of the General Electric Model HJ-624 is its 6½-inch Dynapower speaker with 2 watts of undistorted power with 2.5 watts of maximum.

mum power. The tuning range is 550 to 1600 Kc on a broadcast band only. You will notice that the radio not only has the six tuning keys but also features two thumb wheels protruding through on either side of the dial escutcheon. The one on the left is the off/on and volume control, while the one on the right side is for manual tuning. The cabinet has been restored, but the grille cloth you see pictured is the original cloth.

Well, there has been a vast improvement to the looks of the radio. When I found it, the finish was really bad. I had to take it down to the wood and completely refinish it. I think it turned out pretty well. Now if only I could get it to work. Working or not, I think that it is a very handsome radio that looks great up there on the shelf.

Hewlett Packard 606A

How I Found the Signal Generator of My Dreams

If you own an HP 606A, you can relate to Robert Shindhelm's experience. The Model 606A is an overly engineered, rock-solid signal generator. For all other readers, here is your chance to learn more about this unit, as well as have a few chuckles, (Editor)

There it was, right in front of me on eBay, and located less than 25 miles from where I sat — a Hewlett Packard Model 606A signal generator, shown at right. I couldn't believe it — the picture was a little fuzzy, as many eBay pictures are — but it was unmistakable. One of a kind! I had bid on several of these in the past, but right at the last second or two, some jerk with more money, or may-

be more smarts than I, had pulled the rug out from under me, and I ended up with nothing. I resolved to do this very carefully so that nothing would go wrong this time.

I carefully noted the auction number and the date and time for the end of the auction. It had about two days left to run, and I sweated away every minute. At last, the time was here. It was about 11:10 P.M. and the auction would end at 11:21:07. I sat down at the computer, turned it on, got online, found my auction, reread the listing for the 47th time. synchronized my watch with eBay time, and went to the bidding area. I still had about seven minutes to go.

As I said before, I had been watching for one of these items for some time, so at least I had a fair idea of what they had been going for. I thought about it a little bit, so I bid the most I had ever seen one sell for; then, since I figured I would be able to pick it up and not have to pay any express, I added about 25 percent more. I really wanted this signal generator.

I put the pointer over the bid button, looked at my watch, and still had over five minutes before the end of the auction. I sat there fuming and sweating with my finger poised for the

longest five minutes I have ever known, hoping that the computer wouldn't time out or drop offline or something. At last, with 15 seconds to go I pressed the bid button, closed my eyes and slowly counted to 20. My heart thudded and my palms sweated.

When I opened my eyes, the screen said I was the high bidder! I cou dn't believe it. I pressed the back button and then the reload button. Sure enough the auction had ended, and I was high bidder! And it cost me only about half the amount that I had bid. I was absolutely ecstatic. I was so excited that I let out a whoop that woke up my wife, and that quieted things down quite a bit. I did go ahead and send the seller a message that I was the high bidder, gave him my telephone number, and asked if I could pick it up, as I was anxious to conclude the transaction.

The next morning, I immediately put the computer online so I could regularly check my e-mail and took the phone to the garage so I wouldn't miss a call. I fretted and fumed all day with no calls and no e-mail that I cared about. Finally, about 7:30 p.m. I got an e-mail from the seller that said he had been trying to reach me by phone all day but kept getting a

busy signal. I had been so excited that I hadn't thought about the computer tying up the line.

I did make contact with the seller the next day, and he told me, "Sure, come and get it." So I did. After I had paid the bill, he led me into a long building, and as we were walking, I could see the signal generator sitting by the back wall. The closer we got, the bigger it got!

Now I had seen many pictures of the HP 606A, and I guess I was vaguely familiar with Its dimensions, which are about 15" deep x 21" wide x 13" high, but no one had prepared me for this sight. The thing was huge with a footprint of about 300 square Inches. It was kind of like meeting the girl of your dreams and finding out that she was two feet taller than you. It was not only big, it was heavy. Lucklly there was a sturdy fellow there, about 50 years my junior, who picked it up and put

it in my truck with no trouble at all.

THE RESTORATION

Since the trip home blew a lot of the cobwebs and surface dust off, most of what I had to do was clean off the residue of 40 years of smoke-filled rooms. I plugged it in, and it did work, as they said it would, but only on one band, which they hadn't mentioned. The band selector was frozen solid and wouldn't budge.

After removing the housing, I could begin to understand why it was so heavy. This thing is built upon a large aluminum casting which is bolted securely to a ¼" aluminum plate panel. There is a large 4-section variable condenser, as well as circuitry for 19 tubes mounted in various positions within this casting. The band selector knob drives a steel shaft into a geared rotary toggle arrangement with cams and detents which rotate to position the coils. The coils are mounted on two contrarotating fiber

The Old Radio Shop

These two radio shop pictures are unique because they depict the evolution of radio over several years. Both pictures are of the same shop, located possibly in the Denver area.

In the earlier photo, left, a Radiola 17 or 18 with a RCA 100A speaker is clearly seen. Behind the RCA is an Atwater Kent, identified by the well known speaker style. These sets date from the 1927 time frame. However, a later tombstone can be seen in the right side of the shop, so possibly

the Radiola and Atwater Kent are used sets for sale.

Also shown are a pair of spring microphones, a large Jewell tester, and many parts lining the back and left wall. The signage on the right wall advertises RCA tubes, stating that 61 different tube types have been reduced in price, and that \$2.50 is saved on some types. This picture probably dates from the early Great Depression period.

In the second photo, notice that the two men in

plastic gears, thereby changing bands.

Most of this stuff appears to be of a size more appropriate for pumping oil wells than for band switching. All of these shafts and gears are supported by bushing and ball bearings, and all of the moving parts were filled with dirt and the caked remnants of some sort of lubricant that had been placed there 30 or

40 years ago.
I clamped a pair of vise grips on the shaft behind the panel so I could wiggle it and went to work with WD40, a toothbrush, and a small wooden scraper. Two days, and half a can of WD40 later, I could rotate the selector shaft; in three days the toggle arrangement started working. Today, it operates like new on all bands with almost unbelievable accuracy. It tunes continuously from 50 kHz to 65 MHz in 6 overlapping bands, and it has a built-in crystal-controlled oscillator with a 100 kHz crystal and a 1 MHz crystal for "zero beat

calibration "

As you can probably tell, even with the size problem, I'm reasonably well satisfied with my purchase. I've built a special "heavy duty" shelf for it over my workbench. I sure don't want to move it again.

At age five in the early 1930s, Robert Shindhelm was given a Radiola III, which was soon reduced to junk, but still sparked a lifelong interest in vacuum tube radios. Though he worked in a radio shop before World War II, he did not start active collecting until retirement in the early 1990s. His primary interest is in collecting and restoring pre-World War II radios, especially early electrics and test equipment. A favorite radio is a Howard Junlor from 1930.

the first photo are also in the second photo, along with another man and woman. It appears that the shop has adopted the Stromberg-Carlson line of radios, with two console models on the right side and a few Stromberg-Carlson table models on the left side. The front console is a Model 140L, dating from about 1937. Apparently, the shop continued business throughout the Depression. Also, Motorola radios are featured on a large sign on the back wall. The large Jewell tester has been moved to the back wall, and many parts still line the back and side walls. A workbench sport-

ing a chassls under repair is seen on the bench behind the front counter. Don't you wish you could jump in the picture and purchase a few radios and tubes at 1937 prices?

The Early Development of Radio in Canada, 1901-1930 Edited by Robert P. Murray

The subject of this book is described quite well by its title. However, there is a final chapter that extends the book's time frame into the 1940s and tells about the Thorcraft Radio Company that was formed in Canada in 1947.

In the United States, we tend to focus on our own manufacturers. But as radio collectors, we should be aware of the activities in other countries as well. This book provides an opportunity to extend our radio knowledge beyond our borders.

While Marconi's early work in Canada has been well publicized, it seems that other aspects of Canadian radio have not been given equal treat-


ment. This book fills that gap nicely.

Some of the material contained in the book has appeared previously in other publications such as AWA's OTB, Review, and Journal and Antique Radio Classified, as well as a number of other radio club publications. Fortunately, Murray has updated and combined these multisource

articles into a single publication.

The book Is not "pure Canadian" because it covers the radios produced by Canadian West-Inghouse and the Canadian General Electric Company. Readers will recognize their similarity to the U.S.-made sets sold by RCA. Some other examples of U.S./Canadian relationships appear in the book. But for the most part, Canadian radios are the prime subject. Included are the activities and products of the Canadian Marconi Company, the Natlonal Electric Signaling Co. (NESCO), Rogers Radio, Ltd., and lesser known Canadian firms.

One chapter that I found to be of particular interest was the Mercury Super Ten radio, also produced in kit form by the H.M. Kipp Company, a motorcycle dealer. The book describes the various Mercury models and how Kipp worked



around patent restrictions. Like the rest of the book, this chapter is "profusely illustrated," as they say in the trade. It is worth mentioning at this point that all of the photographs in the book, including the very old, are of good quality.

Another interesting chapter covers a lesser known company, W.W. Grant Radio, Ltd. and its "Volce of the Prairie" series of radio broadcasts.

Canadian Marconi and Rogers Radio receive full treatment with some great illustrations. Rogers also produced vacuum tubes and acquired rights to the McCollough AC tube, another link to the U.S.

As mentioned previously, the RCA radios produced by GE and Westinghouse and their Canadlan counterparts

are covered in detail.

The book's final chapter tells the story of Hank Thorkelsson who started manufacturing radios in the 1940s. His Thorcraft line of radios included a 32-volt farm set, a battery set, and a number of AC/DC models

So if you want to learn more about the Canadian Radio Industry's early period and some of its colorful characters, *The Early Development of Radio in Canada 1901-1930* is just the book for you. It makes interesting and informative reading. The supporting illustrations are icing on the cake.

The Early Development of Radio In Canada 1901-1930 Is published by Sonoran Publishing, LLC, in 8½" x 11" paperback format and contains 154 pages. It sells for \$26.95. Philco 80 Colonial Clock to be offered at Radio XXXVII

He recalls that the Philco was a premium awarded by the Raleigh Tobacco Company in 1938. As he says, "If you smoked a zillion packs of their cigarettes and collected the coupon in each pack, this was one of the things you could earn." The radio was last used around 1955, and then relegated to the attic.

The Philco Model 80 Colonial Clock is pictured on page 40 of Ron Ramirez's book *Philco Radio 1928-1942*. Ron indicates that this is a 1932 model and is 'fairly hard to find.' Robert Grinder in *The Radio Collector's Directory and Price Guide* values the model at between \$300 to \$600. And in John Slusser's book, *The Collector's Guide to Antique Radios, 6th Edition*, a similar model, pictured on page 198, is valued at \$320 to \$345.

The good news is that we will be offering the radio, as is, at Radio XXXVII and will split the proceeds between Mr. King and GBARC in support of the meet. All interested collectors should see us at A.R.C.'s book sales table for details of how the radio will be offered.

The bad news is that the radio needs significant restoration. A few of the problems are veneer damage on top and sides, frayed line cords, torn grille cloth on top, a damaged speaker, a missing knob, and a clock that does not run.

A restorer's gem awaits you at Radio XXXVII. (Editor)
