EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Few would dispute the long established idea that a picture speaks louder than words. Perusing the reports on two major auctions in this issue. I realize that the numerous photos are telling the story of our radio collecting hobby. Photos of individual sets from the 1920s through most of the 20th century, reflect what has captured the imaginations of today's collectors. Photos of the collectors themselves actively engaged in meets and auctions show that the hobby is alive and well.

Nowhere was that engagement more evident than at the Vintage Radio and Phonograph Society (VRPS) 2004 Convention in Mesquite, Texas. This event is one I enjoy attending, and despite the tardiness of the report. I wanted to publish it and give you the full flavor of its success.

As many of you know, the reporter, George Pot-

ter, works for FEMA. Given the national emergencies of the last few years, he had every reason to put this report on a back burner. But, we would welcome it at any time, not only because of the outstanding auction, but also because of the variety of well-planned events centering around VRPS's 30th anniversary.

To commemorate those 30 years, a CD containing photos and events over three decades was available for purchase during the convention. This project was the result of a yearlong effort by Blake Dietze and George Potter, who certainly deserve kudos for compiling this record of club history

Other memorabilia were also available. Each registered attendee received a free polo shirt with the VRPS logo and "Celebrating 30 years, 1974-2004" embroidered on the sleeve. Similarly adorned duck bill caps, with the addition of the Texas flag, were on sale. Few left on Sunday without some token apparel confirming their allegiance to VRPS.

Another unusual highlight was the recording on wax cylinders of songs by the Dallas Blend, a barbershop quartet that entertained at the banquet. An original recording reproducer and a 12-foot galvanized horn were used and became a focus of interest. This recording on 100-year-old equipment was also played back so that we could really appreciate how recordings were made in the early days.

Detailed photos of this equipment are shown in the report, as well as many other rarely seen items. Three examples are an early version of the Grebe RORK detector and 2-stage amplifier, an RPM Atwater Kent breadboard-looking set, and a 1923 Ozarka portable. Also shown in several shots is what looks like a toy record player. However, it is, in fact, a bright blue and yellow GE magnetic recording and playback toy. It must have been a joy to a child of the times.

Looking at the VRPS photos, I'm also reminded of what an opportunity such an event is for meeting

friends, old and new. One photo shows VRPS President Jim Sargent in his home with part of his collection in the background. Jim was more than willing to comply with my request to see his collection, and I'm sure most collectors would do the same. Lurge you to do as I did and ask to see a collection if you happen to be in the home area of the collector.

VRPS definitely put emphasis on the five auctions spread over two days. The flea market runs only on Sunday morning, a departure from the schedule of most meets. The auction proceeds of \$57,000 were a respectable high for a club auction.

Big numbers were in evidence in the Estes auction featuring the collections of Ed Sage and Floyd Stahl and totaling \$261,095. The highlight is easy to spot - a 1936, 46-inch, blue-mirrored Nocturne selling at \$62,500. Many other mirrored sets sold for over \$1,000, even though a number of them had replaced glass or damage of some sort.

Blue-mirrored sets by Sparton are well known, but photos in this report are notable because they show the products of many lesser known manufacturers: Cord, Pomonette, Troy, Mir-Ray, Remler, and Liberty Phone. Of course, more traditional sets also brought solid prices. Examples are a McMurdo Masterpiece 6 selling at \$8,000, a Zenith 15U269 console at \$1,700, and a Radio Bar selling at \$1,000.

As always, Photo Review means more interesting photos. Every collector should find something to catch the eye, from the unusual and rare Marconi unit set to the DuMont TV set. Crosley, Kennedy. Echophone, and Zenith are also represented in varying models. Variety is a continual theme in this issue

AUCTION & MEET REPORT

Vintage Radio & Phonograph Society Convention Mesquite, Texas — November 11-14, 2004 Celebrating 30 years — 1974-2004

However, as many of you may know, George Potter works for FEMA, and, understandably, the events of this past year have kept him rather busy; thus, the delay in his compiling this report.

I was able to attend the event and have augmented George's report with additional photos and

The Vintage Radio & Phonograph Society, Inc., (VRPS), held its 29th annual convention at the Hampton Inn Suites in Mesquite, Texas, November 11-14, 2004. This is an outstanding facility easy to get to, close to restaurants, plenty of parking - leaving little to be desired in the way of comfort.

were registered. The proceeds for both Friday and Saturday auctions totaled \$57,065.


In conjunction with this annual event, VRPS celebrated 30 years as a club, which started back in November of 1974. In those days, radio collecting activities were on a much smaller scale than today. Consider the fact that only two books had been published on radio - Vintage Radio and Flick of the Switch! Times have changed, and, of course, since we are in Texas, everything is big and bigger, so peruse the events described here!

A warning: Auction prices are not current values. Our selection of auction items is not necessarily complete. A listing such as this cannot adequately include the condition of cabinets, chassis, transformers, tubes, the operating status of the set, and the inclusion of incorrect, restored or replica components, etc. Auction prices are the result of the excitement of the auction process, the skill of the auctioneer and the specific interests of the participants. Nevertheless, auction prices serve as useful references and as another element in the value determining process. The possibility of error always exists, and if we are notified, corrections will be reported.

SPECIAL CD

VRPS had several special events that were scheduled during the convention. The first was on Friday when a CD was presented — a vearlong project produced by Blake Dietze of Vancouver, Washington, with George Potter assembling all the archived photos. Pictured were longtime members through the years from 1974 to 2004, as well as some of our annual events. Several of the charter members had passed away in recent years, but this was a celebratory occasion, so we were viewing them during the great times we

The CD is approximately 35 to 40 minutes in duration and is available in both black and white and color. Copies of this CD entitled "30 Great Years with VRPS" were available for purchase at the front desk for a nominal fee.

To commemorate the celebration, each person registering at the convention, was presented with a free, black, polo shirt with collar/sleeve stripes. The shirt also has a color embroidered VRPS logo and an embroidered "Celebrating 30 Years, 1974-2004" on the sleeve. Additional shirts could be purchased at the (Continued on following page)

the side.


The Old Equipment Contest is always an outstanding part of this convention. Dozens of entries in 20 categories were on display, and photos of several unusual, rare, and rarely seen items, are shown on pages 9, 10 and 11. Examples are Mike Grimes's Marconi coherer and Tom Burgess's RPM breadboard, a set very few may have seen before.

Tom also gave a technical session demonstrating his Western Television Corp. mechanical TV equipment in operation. He had assembled an operating television camera that would generate the required signals for an early mechanical TV receiver. Needless to say, a crowd gathered to see it work, as shown in the photo above.

FOCUS ON AUCTIONS

Unlike most meets that focus on a flea market, the VRPS Convention concentrates on the auctions, of which there are five spread over two days. The flea market is almost an afterthought relegated to Sunday morning only.

Friday's auction events included a Silent Auction, a Tube and Paper Auction #1, and a Friday

Auction #2, which generally featured lower cost radio items.

Saturday's events included check-in for the Saturday auction, a silent auction, and the big Saturday auction. At this latter event, two large sheet cakes with the VRPS logo celebrating our 30 years were served to convention participants.

Jim Sargent, VRPS President, was auctioneer, with Bill Werzner from Houston, HVRA President, assisting from time to time. Drawings were also held for preregistration members and for door prizes.

One has to be amazed at the kind of organization and the number of volunteers needed to run such an event. In this case the auctioneers were assisted by closed-circuit television so that all items, like heavy consoles, could be shown.

Though few high prices showed up in this auction, the total of over \$57,000 is a very respectable outcome. The highest price was secured by a Zenith Walton selling at \$1,550. Other sales of note were a DeForest Bulletin, selling at \$225; a Crosley Pup, at \$350; an RCA Radiola 26, at \$370; and a Grebe CR-9, at \$375.

SPECIAL SATURDAY EVENT

The culmination of events on Saturday was the annual banquet, which was sold out quickly, with 125 attending. The famous Dallas Vocal Majority presented its barbershop quartet, the Dallas Blend. This award-winning group of men presented a medley of songs; however, the program got more interesting, because for the first time, they recorded a tune onto a 1893 Bell Tainter Graphophone Type I cylinder phonograph well over 100 years old.


James "Rick" Wilkins of Duncanville, Texas, brought and assembled his 12-foot galvanized horn, which had been used to record a quartet at our convention back in 1982. This monster of a horn has to be broken down into several sections, and then attached to the cylinder machine with a special crane. An original recording reproducer was used, and, of course, Rick was there to add any adjustments.

The Dallas Blend quartet had never done any-

thing like this before, so it required some real hot air (of the human kind). Members of the quartet had to lean into the horn literally and sing loudly — shout, that is. The brown wax cylinder which contained the recording was presented to the quartet and another was made for the club. I can't say I've ever seen a group of men "sweat" so much for one song in my lifetime!

On Sunday morning our final event was the flea market, which saw a crowded room and lots of equipment being traded, swapped or sold. By noontime, everyone had hit the road to home, taking with them fond memories of a celebration of 30 great years.





Seen at the meet was this interesting children's toy, a Model 4SJA1 magnetic recording/playback device from General Electric, called a "Play-Talk." The complete toy, upper right, consists of the tear-shaped recorder/player unit and the separate microphone/speaker. The inner portion of the tuntable platter contains a spiral-grooved disk (A); a magnetic media disk (missing) is placed on the platter at (B) outside the spiral disk. Shown upper left is a bottom view of the tone arm which shows the magnetic record/playback head (C) and the tracking pin (D). In operation, the pin engages the spiral groove and moves the tone arm and record/playback head across the magnetic media disk. A close-up, lower right, shows the grooves in the spiral disk (E) and the location of the guide pin (F) on the tone arm. The photo on the lower left shows the manufacturer's identification and the edge of the flocked turntable.







THOMPSON MODEL S-70 – This 6-tube Neutrodyne receiver was manufactured by the R.E. Thompson Mfg. Co. of Jersey City, New Jersey. It was called "The Thompson Concert Grand" and sold for \$180 in 1924. (Wally Worth – Wollaston, MA)



DuMONT TELESET MODEL RA103-C-2 – This AM/FM TV/Phono combination was manufactured by the Allen B. DuMont Laboratories in Passaic, New Jersey. It has 28 tubes with a 12JP4 picture tube. (Ross Mason – Mason City, IA)



KENNEDY MODEL 366B - This handsome highboy was manufactured by the Colin B. Kennedy Corporation of South Bend, Indiana, in 1932. It has 12 tubes, dual speakers, one long wave and three shortwave bands. (Ross Mason – Mason City, IA)





MARCONI UNIT SET – This 6-piece receiver was manufactured by the Marconi Scientific Instrument Co., Ltd. Considered quite rare, its vintage is ca 1920. Each unit is numbered from 1 to 5; however, the last two units are both No. 5s, as they are 1-tube amplifiers. The top three units at the left make up the RF end and detector. (Jim Taylor – Bournemouth, England)



AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions Edward Sage and Floyd Stahl Collections Burbank, Ohio — November 19, 2005

REPORTED BY RICHARD ESTES

Edward Sage of Albuquerque, New Mexico, was well known among radio collectors for his wonderful Deco collection. His home was filled with Deco furniture, and mirrored radios highlighted every room. Mr. Sage had logged over 300,000 miles in pursuit of these beautiful radios.

In September 2005, due to Mr. Sage's declining health, the decision was made to sell the collection at auction. We were asked to view the collection and to make plans to move it to our Ohio facility. Wow! What an

undertaking!

We were able to enlist the help of Frank Rasada, a longtime friend and fellow radio collector, to help with wrapping the radios and packing them in boxes. Bob Avery, another collector and a friend of Mr. Sage's, also offered his services. My wife Kathy and Frank did all the wrapping and boxing, while Bob and I loaded the radios and secured the boxes in the truck. Frank came up with the best way to transport the Nocturnes, and they made it to Ohio in good shape.

Held on November 19 at the Expo Auction Center in Burbank, Ohio, the auction attract-

ed 177 bidders from 17 states and Canada. A large contingent came from the West Coast, and California was especially well represented.

The highlights, of course, were the two Sparton Nocturnes. All sorts of figures were tossed around among the crowd as to what the Nocturnes would bring. At the start of bidding on the Blue Nocturne, the number rose quickly to \$50,000. Two bidders went to the finish line, and the set sold for \$62,500.

The peach Nocturne also quickly shot up to \$50,000, but then inched slowly to the winning bid of \$57,000. Both radios had had new glass installed, but we gave the new owners the

original glass pieces to restore to their original condition.

We included the Floyd Stahl collection in this auction, offering a wide variety of battery sets, consoles, horn speakers, tombstones, cathedrals, tubes, books and magazines. Included were beautiful Atwater Kent 9 and 10 breadboards, Kennedy Types 281 and 525, Westinghouse Aeriola Senior and Junior, plus many other outstanding sets.

The auction was paced so that every third item would be a glass radio, a plan that insured a fast pace and completed the mirrored sets by 12:30 P.M. The rest of the auction continued

until 4:00 P.M. The proceeds totaled \$261,095. We were thrilled to be able to conduct this auction and hope that all attendees enjoyed it as much as we did. Just looking at all those beautiful radios from a bygone era was a pleasure.






