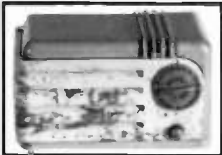

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Once upon a time, antique radio collectors thought that the only collectibles were early wireless and battery sets. How our horizons have broadened! First came AC sets and then on to transistor radios and hi-fi equipment. The pages of A.R.C. over the years attest to the fact that collecting now encompasses the changes in the radio technology of each decade. The industry has catered to the tastes and needs of the times, and so, among the traditional sets of a period, an unusual one may surface.

Richard Arnold's article about the 1957 Sylvania "Prospector" is an excellent example. Here is a portable radio apparently designed for Cold War times, complete with sundial, compass, and Geiger counter. Richard doesn't even own the radio, but took writing about it on as a challenge from friends who supplied the information. This kind of collaboration offers all of us the opportunity to learn about what's "new" on that ever-expanding radio-collecting horizon.

Of course, what's new *and* old attracting the eyes of collectors becomes most evident at meets and auctions. High on the list of annual successful meets is our own GBARC Radio XXXVII, reported again by Managing Editor Dorothy Schecter. Probably the largest meet on the East Coast, it hosted over 600 buyers and sellers in a facility filled with 98 tables. The "old guard" were there as usual, but what was really striking was the number of young people — and even younger family members — present. From that vantage point, the future of radio collecting looks bright.

The VRPS spring auction, though a smaller event than its fall convention and auction reported last month, was also well attended. High-end items were not prevalent in this auction, but the large quantity — over 400 items — made for a very respectable total of over \$20,000. VRPS always does a commendable organizational job in planning such events.

In that regard, A.R.C. is being forced to plan for an internal cataclysmic event, as you will see from our "Staff Profile." Pat Wedge, our office manager, and her husband, have decid-

ed to pull up New England stakes and head for North Carolina. Dorothy Schecter's article will tell you all the reasons, but, of course, we're having difficulty accepting the inevitable. Our only consolation is that we'll give her a royal send-off at the historic Concord Colonial Inn as a reminder of her Concord roots. Maybe that will change her mind.

Phil Bliss certainly changed his mind when he gave up looking for a Crosley Pup. Instead, he built one, albeit with a wood, rather than a metal cabinet. A successful outcome like this one has to give a great deal of satisfaction to the creator.

A book, of course, is another kind of creation requiring painstaking work. Reviewers Jim Monaghan and Dave Crocker found Kyle Husfloen's new price guide for radio and TV to be a solid effort. They are particularly impressed with the excellence of the TV section and recommend the book highly to TV collectors.

Getting back to the theme of the unusual showing up among a manufacturer's products, note the 1930s Dictograph set in *Photo Review* this month. Given the company name, the expectation would be that the set would have some capacity for dictation. After all, if a set can have a Geiger counter, why not a capability for dictation? Not so. It's a 6-tube set, pure and simple. Five other early sets are shown; one is the rarely seen Kennedy III.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Sylvania 3401 "Prospector" A Radio with Geiger Counter and More

BY RICHARD ARNOLD

Ever on the lookout for an unusual radio to buy and make the subject of an A.R.C. article, Richard Arnold's approach this time is slightly different. He doesn't own the radio, but he's met the owner's challenge to turn the information offered into an article. Another stroke of good luck for A.R.C. (Editor)

Here is a story of a very unusual radio that I'll bet not many of you have ever heard about — a 1957 Sylvania 3401 portable AM radio that has a Geiger counter built into it.

One day, I was at the home of a collector/friend who knew that I liked to do research on radios and write about them for *Antique Radio Classified*. A friend of his had sent him some information on this set, and he offered it to me, saying, "Here, see what you can do with this."

Well, I guessed that was a

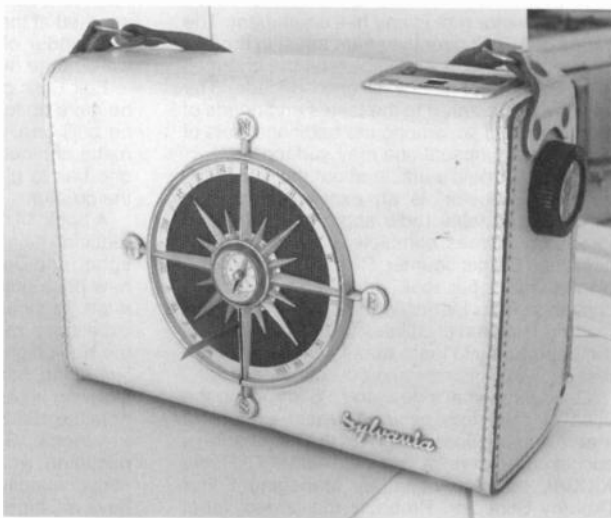


Figure 1. The Sylvania "Prospector" Model 3401 is housed in a leather case. What appears to be a radio dial is actually a compass and sundial. This radio is unusual in that it includes a Geiger counter.

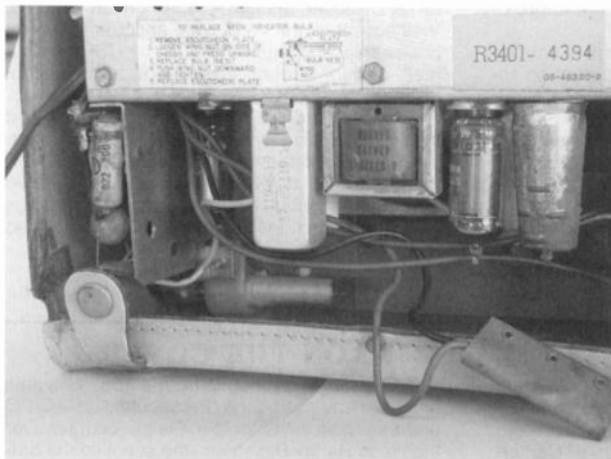
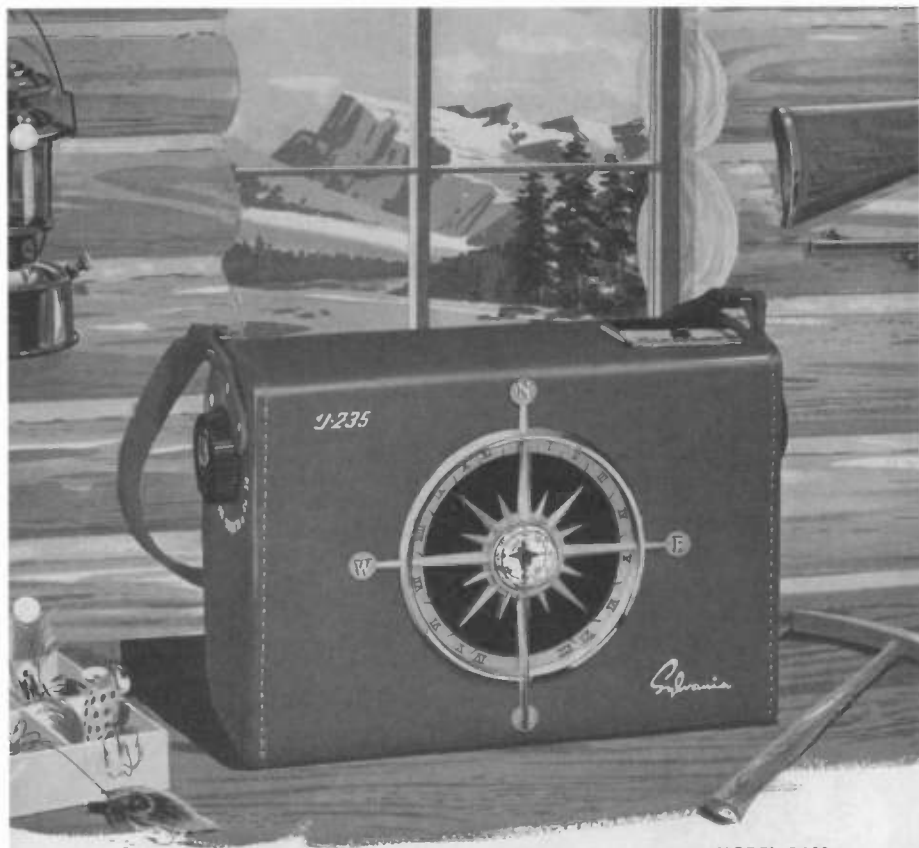


Figure 2. An interior view of the Prospector's inverted chassis and Geiger-Muller tube shown horizontally at the bottom.

challenge, and that is why I have decided to write this article. To begin, I contacted some collectors who own one of these rare radios on the Antique Radio Forum. They were willing to take the time to make their information available to me, and so I am able to put together this story.

THE SYLVANIA MODEL 3401

The Sylvania Model 3401, called the "Prospector," is a 1957, AC-battery, portable, shown in Figure 1. The radio is an AM receiver with a Geiger counter, and it comes in a leather case with a shoulder strap. There are two model numbers given: One is a 3401TA in a tan leather case, and the other, a 3401BG. They both use

the same chassis, given as number Ch. 1-612-1.

Along with using a selenium rectifier, the radio uses the following tubes: one each of a 1R5 as a converter, a 1U4 IF as an amplifier, and a 1U5 detector-AVC & AF amplifier. A 3V4 is used as a power output tube. Now, here is the kicker — the radio also includes one Type VG18 Geiger-Muller tube.

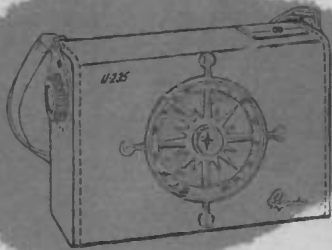
Figure 2 shows an interior view of the radio. Note the inverted chassis and the Geiger-Muller

tube at the left, just below the IF can.

The radio operates on 105-125 volts AC-DC or batteries and tunes in the broadcast band from 540 to 1650 Kc.

The Geiger counter part to this radio is pretty simple. There is a push button which, when pressed, activates a simple buzzer-transformer. The transformer generates a high voltage, which is stored in a capacitor. This high voltage

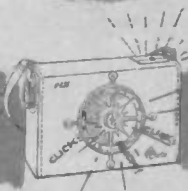

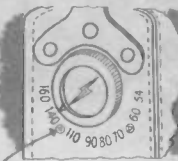
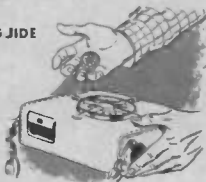

is what operates the Geiger-Muller tube.

Each time a Uranium particle penetrates the Geiger-Muller tube it discharges (fires). Each time the Geiger tube fires, it passes a small pulse of current, which is coupled into the audio amplifier in the radio and makes a "click" in the speaker. The sudden pulse of plate current in the audio

output tube causes a neon light to flash at the time that the click is heard. The push button and neon lamp are shown in Figure 3.

WHY A GEIGER COUNTER?

When I first saw the pictures of this radio I thought back to the 1950s when I was a kid and we were all somewhat afraid of a nuclear

attack from Russia. A lot of families back then built bomb shelters and had them stocked with all the necessities to maintain life should an attack have occurred. One of the most important items was a battery radio. I think that this Geiger counter radio could have been used not only to keep up with the news, but also to test the outside air to see if it was safe to venture out.

Well, of course, that was not really the radio's purpose. Back in the 1950s many people were out prospecting for uranium. There was a lot of money to be made up in them thar hills. I found out that this radio was used in prospecting for uranium. So, while someone was running up and down the mountains looking for uranium to make his fortune, he could also be enjoying his favorite AM radio program. Cool!

The radio also incorporates in its construction a built-in compass that is smack in the center of the front of the cabinet, as shown in

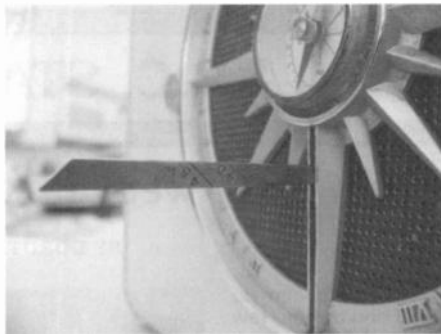


Figure 5. A close-up of the sundial and its pulled-out vane. Note the use of Roman numerals on the sundial's face.

So, this little radio seems to have it all — an AC radio, a Geiger counter, a sundial, and a compass. For the weekend uranium hunter how could he lose?

I have been watching for one to show up on eBay, but so far none has. I have learned from others that they do appear from time to time and usually go for around \$200 or so.

I want to thank Mr. Bill Jeffrey of Scottsdale, Arizona, a senior member of the Antique Radio Forum, for supplying me with the pictures shown in this article. Because of his contribution, we all now have a little more knowledge of what was an obscure little radio. Thanks too to Randy Bassham, also a member of the Antique Radio Forum, for the wonderful color brochure.

My friend Fielding Grigsby of Ardmore, Oklahoma, deserves full credit and thanks for initiating this whole project.

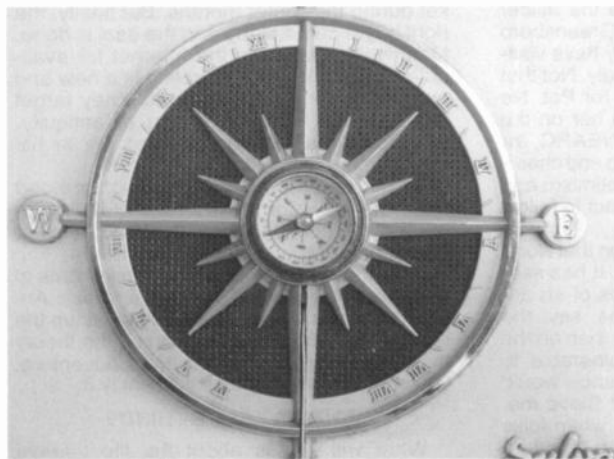


Figure 4. A compass is mounted on the front of the radio and is surrounded by a compass rosette.

Pseudo Pup

When you can't find the radio of your secret desires, build it. Phil Bliss didn't wait for Fate to hand him a Crosley Pup. Read about his step-by-step acquisition. (Editor)

For quite some time I have wanted to own a Crosley Pup. Since the availability is somewhat limited, I decided to build a "Pseudo Pup." Thanks to Dave Crocker and Leonard Aquino, I was able to obtain the Crosley book type condenser, regeneration control, schematic, and rheostat necessary to construct the radio. Although the Crosley Pup is housed in a metal cabinet, I chose to build my reproduction using wood stock. I used $\frac{1}{16}$ " stock made by laminating two sheets of $\frac{1}{32}$ " thick walnut veneer.

The first step was to get all of the materials and parts together. (See parts and materials lists below). Before I cut the sides, top, and bottom pieces for the cabinet, I assembled the circuit on a breadboard with the

sides containing the book condenser and regeneration control spaced $\frac{5}{16}$ ". I discovered

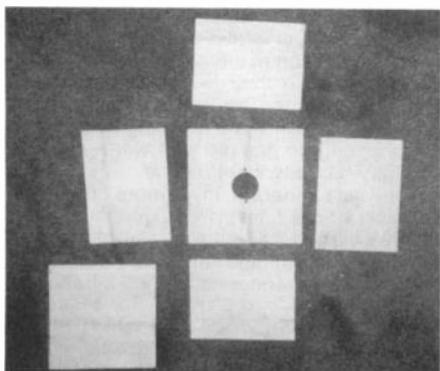


Figure 1. The panels cut to size and ready for assembly.

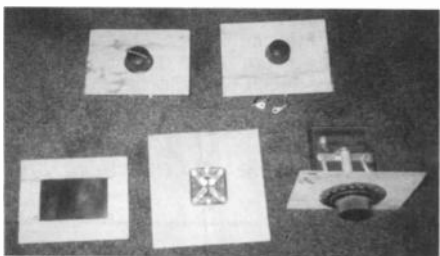


Figure 2. The wood cabinet panels with all components mounted and the rear panel cut to accept the Bakelite panel.

ered that to keep within the approximate dimensions of the original Pup and still allow the radio to tune properly, had to cut $\frac{3}{8}$ " off of the regeneration control shaft and add $\frac{1}{16}$ " to the overall length and width of the cabinet.

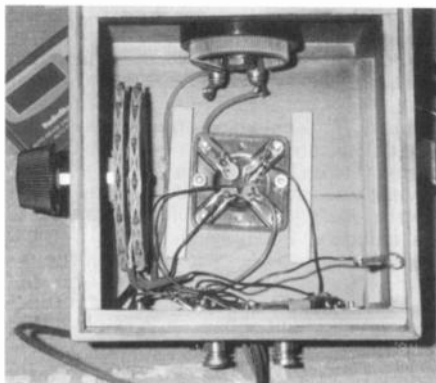


Figure 4. An underside view of the radio before installation of the tuning capacitor.

After these calculations, I cut the sides, top, and bottom to size, as shown in Figure 1. I added $\frac{1}{8}$ " to length of two of the sides and $\frac{1}{8}$ " to the length and width of the top to allow for an overlap at the corners during the assembly process. After cutting the shaft, I drilled and tapped the cut end of the control shaft to enable me to reattach the spiderweb coil with a small screw.

After these calculations I cut the sides, top, and bottom to size. I added $\frac{1}{8}$ " to length of two of the sides and $\frac{1}{8}$ " to the length and widths of the top to allow for an overlap at the corners during the assembly process.

The next step was to mount all of the components in their proper location, as shown in Figure 2, and cut the opening for the Bakelite panel on the rear of the cabinet. For ease of assembly, I removed all of the parts from the sides and top and put the cabinet together using the $\frac{1}{4}$ " square wood stock for bracing on all of the inside corners and edges. Since I planned to recess the bottom panel, I raised the bottom mounting strips $\frac{1}{16}$ " to allow for the thickness of the panel.

Using model maker's Super Glue made

the construction process fast and easy. During the mock-up process, I found that if I had used square stock any larger than $\frac{1}{4}$ ", the spider web coil on the regeneration control would not fit properly. Using $\frac{1}{4}$ " stock limited the arc of the rounded outside edges of the cabinet.

To make the flange around the bottom edge I cut a $\frac{1}{8}$ " by $\frac{3}{8}$ " strip of wood from an old ruler, rounded the top edge and attached the pieces to the lower edge. Using a sanding block, I then rounded the top and side edges. Figure 3 shows the finished cabinet in its unpainted state. Since this completed the wood working, I primed and sprayed the cabinet with wrinkle finish.

The next step was to cut and drill mounting holes in the Bakelite panel. The slots for the grid leak resistor supports were cut and the four binding posts were mounted. Then the grid leak assembly was bolted into place.

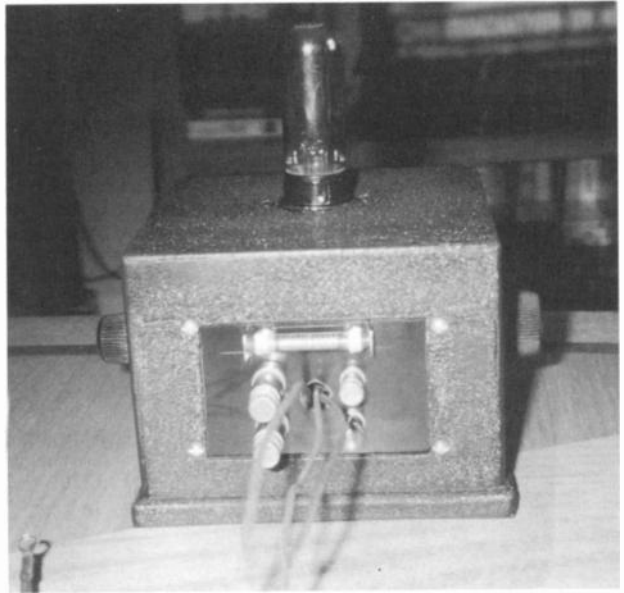


Figure 6. A rear view of the completed radio showing the Bakelite panel and its components.

After the wrinkle finish had dried, the radio was ready to assemble. I left the book condenser out until all other wiring was finished. Figures 4 and 5 show the interior of the Pseudo Pup, while exterior views are provided in Figures 6 and 7.

Wiring the radio was made quite easy by leaving the book condenser out until all other parts were in place and wired. Since I have never seen a Pup in real life, I could only guess how large to make the rear Bakelite panel. The finished dimensions of the radio are $5\frac{7}{16}$ " x $5\frac{1}{16}$ " x 4".

Upon completing the set, I attached it to my Antique Electronic Supply Model K-101A power supply for the final test. After hooking

it up to my antenna and ground, I attached my Baldwin "C" earphones and turned it on.

Wow! It worked even better than I had expected. Even though the adjustment of the tuning condenser regeneration control and the filament voltage were very critical, the selectivity was better than I had expected.

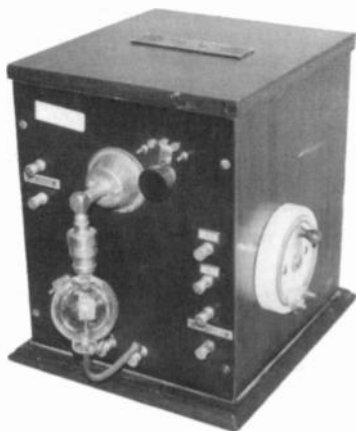

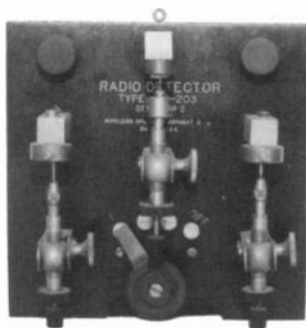
PHILCO MODEL 38-12 – This 5-tube table radio was manufactured by the Philco Corporation in Philadelphia. The tubes used in this set are one each of the following: 6A7, 78, 75, 84, and 41. The first two numbers in the model number indicate that it was sold in 1938. (*Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NE*)



DICTOGRAPH SILENT RADIO – Found in a local estate auction, this set has six tubes, and judging by its tube lineup, I would guess that it was made in the 1930s. Made of a bright maple with Deco style lines across the front, it has a unique sliding door that closes from right to left. The controls on the front are for tuning, volume, and tone. I figured there should be something for dictation, but there is no evidence of that at all. (*Claude Chafin – Independence, MO*)



DEFORREST RJ5 REPRODUCTION – I fabricated this hand-built detector unit based on the DeForest RJ5 Audion detector. DeForest sold the original unit for \$25 in 1914. My set uses original parts, such as the ceramic rheostat and the spherical, double filament DeForest tube. The cabinet stands 10½" tall and 8¾" wide. (*Wally Worth – Wollaston, MA*)



WIRELESS SPECIALTY IP-203 DETECTOR – This unit has three selectable crystal detectors. Two appear to be galena crystals, while the third is a green sparkling color. Any ideas about the material in this third crystal? (*Don Watson, Elk Grove Village, IL*)

STEWART-WARNER MODEL 415 SPEAKER –

This dynamic radio speaker was introduced by the Speedmeter Corporation in 1926, and it sold then for \$30. Called the "Radioamplifier" by the company, it was referred to as the "Dancing Girl Speaker" by everyone else. The thin brass grille over a light gold cloth depicts two (mythical?) girls dancing gleefully. The center base is brass. (Robert Enemark – Duxbury, MA)



WARE TYPE T – This 3-tube Neutrodyne receiver was offered in 1924 by the Ware Radio Corporation of New York City. It operated on three Type 199 tubes, which were exposed. The small lift-top opened for access to the batteries. (Wally Worth – Wollaston, MA)



KENNEDY MODEL III – Manufactured by the Colin B. Kennedy Company of St. Louis, Missouri, this 3-tube portable is covered with black leatherette. It has a cover with a handle that snaps over the top. Inside the cover is a small strap to hold the headphones, also made by Kennedy. It sold for \$101 in 1934. (Wally Worth – Wollaston, MA)



ZENITH CUBE, MODEL UNKNOWN – This 5-tube, 3-band set, ca 1936, was found in rough condition with no model identification. The chassis appears to be essentially the same as a Model 5S29, except that it has a large power transformer that will operate on 110 or 220 volts AC. It features a small black dial with color bands. I believe that this very unusual radio was made for the international market, as Zenith did not market a cube model in the U. S. in 1936. The cabinet has been refinished, the under chassis has all new capacitors and filters, the original speaker has been replaced with another vintage Zenith speaker, and it has four factory wood "Z" knobs. It works great on all bands and sounds great too. (Ed Ripley – South St. Paul, MN)

MEET REPORT

Radio XXXVII

Westford, Massachusetts — February 19, 2006

If you're a collector and you have relatives in Boston, why not arrange a visit around a major radio event in the area? And if you're from Minnesota, a few degrees below zero on the morning of a meet in Massachusetts is no deterrent. So went the thinking of Alan Yelsey from Minneapolis, who was duly impressed with the happenings at Radio XXXVII, the annual Greater Boston Antique Radio Collectors (GBARC) meet on Sunday, February 19. In the first hour, Alan sold most of the 1930s and 1940s radios he had brought along, and so he was able to enjoy the crowd, the size of which was unlike anything he had seen at events back home.

This year the Westford Regency Hotel ballroom and an adjunct room in Westford, Massachusetts, were filled with 98 tables, up from last year's 90. More than 600 eager buyers and sellers crowded the room. Alan deserved a prize for coming the greatest distance, but all of the New England states were represented, as well as New York, New Jersey, Ohio, and others.

WHY AM I HERE?

"Old Guard" attendees were heard to ask the question with tongue-in-cheek, knowing full well the easy answers — the fun of the chase after the long-sought-for set, the competition, the wheeling and dealing, the camaraderie — and, of course, the addiction to old radios and anything to do with the heyday of the radio era. That's why they're apt to hang around long after the show has officially ended to swap radio tales.

No one admits more readily to the addiction than John DeLoria, who, along with his wife Judy, whom he describes as the "heavy lifter," lives a radio life. They belong to ten different clubs and travel all over the country to all the big shows.

The addiction is confirmed when John describes the purchase of a collection of 350 radios in order to get the one or two he really wanted. Transporting the collection meant several trips to Canada. And

how could he pass up the brand new 3-piece, 1931 living room set with a radio built into the couch, all still packed in plastic? Small wonder he has nine public storage spaces.

The DeLoria tables showed the variety in his collection. The Wings Cigarette radio from the early 1930s was one of many different brands that RCA had no problem advertising in times when smoking was the fashion. A porcelain ladybug crystal set sat on a round living room table containing a 1930s RCA radio. A 1950s Emerson advertising piece perched next to a large photo of another handsome set for sale, but too heavy to bring to the meet — a Philco bar radio complete with all the glassware.

Yes, John is addicted to old radios, but he and Judy appreciate the other major attraction to the

hobby — the wonderful people and sense of community.

That's what seems to bring folks back year after year and even after a hiatus. George Kazowska had a two-year break, but he was back with his friend and helper May Yanocsko. In his 25 years of collecting, George's interests have taken many turns, from the 1930s to transistor sets to foreign sets and back to the 1930s. A Cord blue mirrored radio from the 1930s graced his table, along with a 1940s Champion Venus 975A.

A meet like this one fits into his philosophy of sharing information with fellow collectors. On his website is a page for Zenith research, containing raw data from Zenith service manuals and other references.

For a first-time seller like Johanna Mendelin, this philosophy would fit well with her impression that at this meet she was being introduced to things she wouldn't have otherwise known. That was what her late brother Bob Defenderfer, a Ham and professional audio man, had done when he shared with her his love of radio and electronics. Johanna was there with her husband and 23-month old twins to try to put Bob's collection into the right hands, rather than throw it out as some relations had suggested. Bob did well to pass on the need to preserve radio history.

A GENERATIONAL THING

The Mendelin family was a good example of the increasing number of families with two or three generations in attendance. Surely a good sign for this hobby. Like the

Mendelins, Bill and Darcey Dunn came from Vermont with their very young children to display their wares and enjoy the crowd. Bill has been collecting since his father gave him his grandmother's old radio about 35 years ago. That may be a longer time than many much older attendees who began collecting in their retirement years. And who knows, the children may carry on the interest.

Signs of that hope were everywhere. Jeff Gardner of Gloversville, New York, was back for the second year as a vendor. He was able to tour the room while his son Ben once again manned the table. Bruce Phillips did not have his usual helper, *(Continued on following page)*

son Ross, but daughter Jonica filled in nicely at the "Radio Orphanage." Multiple progeny is certainly an asset in the radio meet business.

Of course, the "First Family" was there — "first that is, when your father runs the meet. John Terrey's grandchildren came with son Jeff and his wife Susan. Nine-month old Katie latched on to a "Hello Kitty" novelty radio, indicating that she and her brother Joe are being brought up right.

Two generations are impressive, but three in attendance are even more so. Phil and Giselle Guinan from Litchfield, New Hampshire, had help from their grandson, 16-year-old Jayme, and his dad, son-in-law Bob LaRochelle. What an opportunity for Phil to indoctrinate the young. He has plenty of history to use as ammunition — a radio shop back in the 1930s, a career in industrial electronics, and

now lots of repair work on sets of the 1930s-1950s. Let's hope Jayme follows in his footsteps.

LOOKING AHEAD

The future of the hobby seemed to be on the minds of many participants. John Hartman commented that, as he looked around, he saw many young people. He expressed amazement at the growth of interest in the hobby and confidence in the possibility of finding the right home for most old sets. He himself has filled a big barn at his apple farm in Eaton, New Hampshire, in less than three years.

That optimism was reflected in the presence of buyers like John and Jean Jesensky who were looking for radios of the 1960s and stereo of the 1970s — "All the stuff you wanted to buy when you were a kid, but couldn't afford to.

Another husband and wife team, Francis and Barbara Pond, were also serious buyers. They were looking for promising items to stock their space in a group antique shop in Amherst, New Hampshire. Collectors for 30 years, they enjoy the activity as a hobby, not expecting it to be a big money-maker. It must also be a pleasure to share the same interest — a repeated theme in "radio families."

Friends are often like families. Tom Cooper and

Pat Franzis from New Milford, Connecticut, came together and did well as first-time sellers. Both began collecting as eight-year olds and both are lucky enough to have sympathetic wives. Pat figures he has a "radio gene" directly from his grandfather who built sets. He also has a 1920s house that is perfect for antique radio decor. These two would seem to have it all.

LOOKING BACK

The same might be said of Ed White and his longtime companion/helper Trudy Adams. The only difference might be that, at age 90, Ed has had a much longer time to enjoy his life in radio. In a memoir given to A.R.C. Ed has traced his interest in radio back to grade school and a next-door

neighbor with a radio shop in his cellar.

Other memories include acquiring a chunk of galena ore for use as a detector, making a cat whisker from a fine guitar string, sending a box top and fifty cents for a Quaker Oats crystal set kit, and building a one-tube amplifier, to name a few. We can only conclude that radio-collecting contributes to keeping the memory sharp.

Memories were certainly a part of the conversation at John Nowacki's table. Here was a case of West meets East, as John from Kennebunk, Maine, talked with Werzhen Xu, a Massachusetts computer software engineer originally from China. Xu spoke of his growing interest in radio during his high school years in China. His father had an RCA radio and an RCA turntable in a crank phonograph, but with Chinese labels. He remembered that before 1940, all radios came from the U.S., but the family's first black and white TV in 1958 came from Russia.

Such one-on-one encounters make the radio meet experience an international affair. We realize that radio touched the lives of people throughout the world long before "global economy" became a household phrase.

HERE AND NOW

A chat with John Hagman, down from Vermont and a sometime reporter for A.R.C., often gives a sense of immediacy. A down-to-business guy, John finds it advantageous to stay at the hotel and get a close parking space from which to move his specialty — large table sets. Though he uses the Internet as an educational tool and to get fast information, he finds that a meet allows him to buy, sell, and socialize. Furthermore, it enables him to hand a sale over without shipping and labor costs.

On the other hand, after the meet John expressed disappoint-

ment with his sales and the lack of interest in his consoles and restored table sets. However, many others were pleased with sales; in fact some sold everything they brought. A certain amount of luck is built into any meet.

Despite his disappointment, John also found himself in a typical dilemma for many vendors — how to resist buying and to avoid turning his house into a series of aisles. The A.R.C. staff recognizes the problem, since we work for John Terrey in the midst of his hundreds of radios! Still, how difficult resistance must be when a collector like John Hagman says, "I've already seen more exotic sets for sale here than at any other meet." As John DeLoria might add, "What's an addict to do?" Maybe it all has to do with the name "John."

Hope to see you all at Radio XXXVIII on February 18, 2007. It's always worth the trip from wherever you are.

As with the November 2004 VRPS convention report, which we ran in April 2006. "Better late than never!" We thank George for completing this report in between his FEMA duties. (Editor)

The Vintage Radio and Phonograph Society (VRPS) Spring Auction was held on March 19, 2005, at the Grapevine Convention Center, Grapevine, Texas, just north of DFW International airport.

The doors opened at 7 A.M., bidding started at 10 A.M., and by 4 P.M., the VRPS team had finished up the auction. Jim Sargent did the honors as auctioneer, with Bill Werzner, HVRA president from Houston, helping out.

This year we had an excellent mix of 436 items to sell, with only 43 passes. One of the unusual items that passed was an Atwater Kent breadboard with display brass/tipped tubes that started at \$875. There was also a box with manuals and 3 headsets, which sold for 60 bucks. Why? It contained a Kennedy headset that many didn't see! There was also a very nice Atwater Kent 84 cathedral that sold at \$530.

Total attendance was 148 of which 114 were registered bidders. Total sales were: \$20,666.

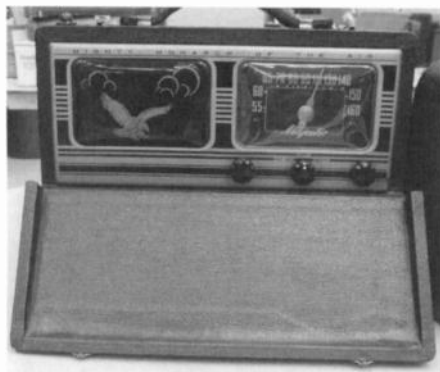

BOOK REVIEW

Antique Trader Radio & Television Price Guide Edited by Kyle Husfloen

REVIEWED BY JIM MONEGHAN & DAVE CROCKER

This new price guide has input by contributing editors Steve McVoy, Bob Ready and Harry Poster. The book covers radios from the 1920s to the 1950s, and television sets from the late 1920s to the 1970s. There are 272 pages with 750 nice big color photos.

The well known TV collector, Harry Poster, writes the introduction and provides a basic overview of radio/TV collecting that is easy to understand and appeals to the novice collector. However, the description of a crystal set is a little confusing, and the terms Bakelite and Catalin should be more clearly defined.

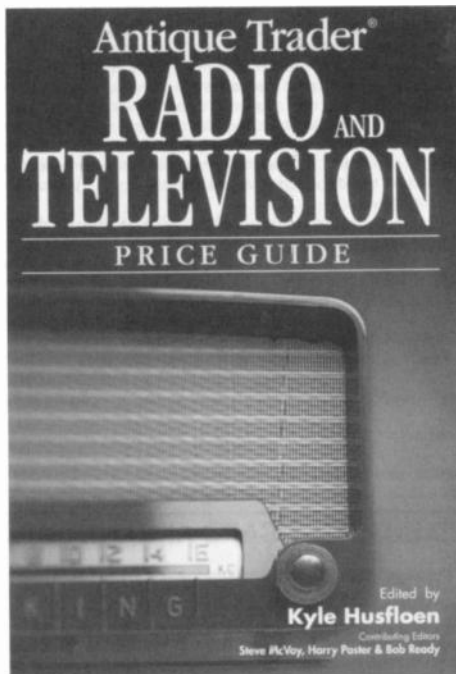
The Radio Section.

The radio section, (not including transistor sets), consists of 58 pages of listings and prices. Quite a few manufacturers are listed, but, unfortunately, there is a very small representation of radio models for each one. There are only eight listings for Atwater Kent, 18 listings for Philco, 16 listings for RCA and a mere 14 for Zenith. Some of the high-end companies are not listed at all (Federal and Kennedy to name a few).

There are some mistakes in model numbers and descriptions in the radio section. The Amrad Neutrodyne is not a crystal set. The metal Atwater Kent 441 shown is really a Model 44. The console shown on page 17 is not an Atwater Kent but an Eveready. The Arvin 850T is priced at \$435, instead of \$35-45. In the introduction, the Stewart-Warner A6-1Q is priced correctly later, on page 61. The Crosley 51 is definitely not a "crystal set."

There are other items that could be mentioned, but let's get on to the TV section.

The TV Section. Where this book excels is in the television section that has 120 pages with lots of vivid color photographs. The comprehensive



listing of manufacturers and models covers practically all of the collectible TVs you are likely to encounter in attics and at shows. The TV collectors will also appreciate the extensive listings and color photos for the rare prewar televisions. The prices in this section are very good and correspond with current values.

We found ourselves looking through this section over and over again. A lot of work went into this chapter and the results are excellent. This book is an outstanding resource for any TV collector from beginner to advanced.

There is a small section of original advertisements (25 pages), mostly from the 1940s to the 1950s, that are really fun to look over. Too bad they weren't dated as to year of publication. The special feature section (32 pages), contains an unusual group of radios with color photos and prices in reverse alphabetical order (Z to A).

If you are strictly a radio collector who isn't interested in TVs, there are other price guides on the market that will give you a more comprehensive listing of manufacturers and their radios. If you take an interest in antique radios *and* TVs, it wouldn't hurt to include this new publication in your library. But, if you are a real TV enthusiast, this book is a must! There hasn't been a TV price guide update since 1992. Enjoy!
