EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Two decades make a difference in any life, including that of a magazine. In October 1986, I was a few years younger (well, okay, 20), recognizable by my full beard, ready to become a publisher and take on what Gary Schneider had started only two years before — Antique Radio Classified. As we all know, the world to the schanged dramatically in just the last five years, but in this issue, I take a moment to celebrate what started at Radiofest in 1986 — my 20 years as editor of A.R.C.

As I look back over those 20 years, I realize how much about the hobby has changed, while the mission of the magazine has remained the same — "to stimulate the growth of the hobby... and to provide a monthly forum for the interchange of ideas and information." We continue to pursue those goals, but at the same time the scope of the hobby has broadened with each decade. Details of that history are described in the anniversary issues of June 1994 and 2004.

Reflecting on decades of change, I chose the same cover for this issue as used on my first A.R.C. issue in October 1986. The 1929 RASCO Radio Parts catalog cover seemed appropriate then because collectors of the time were fixed on radios of the 1920s and 1930s. In fact, nothing in the editorial section of the 1986 issue suggests collecting interests beyond the 1930s

In 1986, for example, I myself was still using an AR speaker, the subject of our lead article, in my hi-fi system. An item only twenty years old was not considered "antique enough" to be of interest to vintage collectors of the 1980s. Andrew Hayden's excellent article on the AR loudspeaker, as well as his earlier KLH articles, would not have been published here in 1986. They were simply not yet collectible items.

And who 20 years ago would think of car radios as "vintage"? Yet. Walter Hall makes a strong case in 2006 for a radio from a 1950 Ford. The history of 56 years of entertainment in your car can't be dismissed as insignificant in the grand scheme of radio history.

Of course, two subjects in this issue would fit nicely into the 1986 issue — Phil Bliss's 1923-24 SECO Crystal set and Don Watson's attractive Montgomery Ward Airline table model. Don's article gives some interesting insights into the marketing techniques of the pre-World War II days.

On the other hand, Neil Robar's handsome 1933 Majestic 344 lowboy might have been out of favor in the 1980s. But, even then we felt the need to prepare for changing tastes, and so we did just that. In July 1989, Dave Crocker's cover and article entitled "Here Come the Consoles" forecasts a resurgence of interest in the sets "we all thought took up too much room."

And, indeed, consoles have been in and out of favor over the decades. Today higher end consoles are definitely back in vogue, as indicated by the Estes Auctions price of \$2,100 for a Scott Philharmonic, reported in this issue by Ray Chase.

In fact, Ray's Estes Auctions reports and photos are always indicators of what's in and what's out. He also

reminds us of what has had staying power over the decades, and Art Deco items are an example. Mirrored radios continue to bring high prices, and in this auction, a Sparton Nocturne brought a top dollar of \$55,000.

In general, we can never discount the appeal of early items. Though in this particular auction, rare wireless and battery sets did not make a significant showing, they regularly sell in the \$1.000-and-up category.

Still, many things do change. As I look over this issue, I'm struck by the 41 club listings today compared to five in October 1986. Of course, we were just beginning then to list events, and may not have had full coverage. But, the proliferation of regional and local events since the 1980s is indisputable. We always reported on most large events, and now include additional events, such as the two in this issue.

Thanks to reporters like Jim Moneghan and John Hagman, who have traveled far from home, we can report on events like the Carolinas Chapter/AWA Conference in North Carolina and the DVHRC Meet in Pennsylvania. What Jim and John tell us is that the quality of these events doesn't lie in the attendance numbers or sales as much as in the camaraderic.

So, what hasn't changed about the essence of this hobby is the importance of people-to-people contact. That's certa nly the first moral of my 20-year story. The second is that what was not vintage in 1986 has become vintage in 2006. As the meaning of "vintage" has changed, A.R.C has changed with it. We continue to grow with the times and serve the needs of the radio collecting community.

ON THE COVER

If you were a subscriber ir 1986, this cover may be familiar to you because it also appeared on the October 1986 issue of A.R.C. The 1929 catalog was a publication of the Radio Specialty Co. of Park Place, New York City, only a few blocks from the heart of Radio Row. RASCO claimed to have published the first radio catalog in the U. S., to offer a "100% square deal," and to produce "only perfect apparatus." So sure were they of their quality merchandise that they didn't even have a Complaint Department. And speaking of change over the decades, they also had a minimum order requirement — 50 cents.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Acoustic Research and the Acoustic Suspension Loudspeaker

High-fidelity is a primary interest for Andrew Hayden who has written articles about Henry Kloss and KLH in previous issues of A.R.C. (June 2005 and March 2006). In this article, he describes the development of air-suspension speaker systems that resulted in smaller cabinets and improved reproduction. (Editor)

In the years following World War II, many advances were made in the sound quality of audio components, and, by the early 1950s, consumers were fast becoming interested in hi-fi setups. Full stereo sound was about to become the standard for listening to music, and the loudspeaker was a large part of the investment in a system.

The choice when buying a high quality speaker that covered the entire audio frequency range was limited to stove-sized cabinets with large drivers. Many of these could put out concert-level volumes, but a major deficiency was that the lower frequencies had noticeable distortion, and their size made them difficult to incorporate into the family living room. Thanks to a New York University professor and a dedicated student, a revolution was about to take place in the world of speakers.

VILLCHUR AND KLOSS

An electronics-oriented man by the name of Edgar Villchur had a radio shop in New York's Greenwich Village after World War II. He built audio systems for customers, as well as did repairs. After moving to Woodstock, New York, in 1952, he focused on technical writing and took courses in mathematics and engineering. In addition, he taught a course at New York University called "Reproduction of Sound." In his class, he discussed a speaker system he had developed in which the speaker had a very compliant suspension and relied on a cushion of air in a sealed cabinet instead of the standard mechanical spring suspension used in a nonsealed cabinet.

Villchur's woofer had a cone travel of up to 1.4 inches, achieving phenomenally low frequency response. He had attempted to sell this technology to several speaker manufacturers, including

the highly regarded Bozak Company. No one was interested; most said, it simply wouldn't work.

One of his NYU students, Henry Kloss, became very interested. Kloss, at this time, in addition to taking Villchur's class, was also attending MIT and manufacturing the Baruch-Lang loudspeaker at his loft in Cambridge, Mass., selling them by mail order. The meeting of these two audio pioneers was the catalyst that led to a major change in sound reproduction — the acoustic suspension loudspeaker.

AR SPEAKERS

In early 1954, Villchur drove Kloss to his Woodstock home to show him his system, and in effect,

Applied physics, using air as a spring. The air in an enclosed space makes an almost perfect spring... In AR speaker systems, the suspension of the cone from the frame is made extremely loose; then the loudspeaker is mounted in a small, tightly sealed cabinet. The air in the cabinet, resting like a spring against the cone, makes a precise and nearly distortionless suspension. This design was originated by Acoustic Research in 1954 and named "acoustic suspension."

the two agreed that night to produce this new speaker. They became partners in a company called Acoustic Research based

in Cambridge, Mass.

The Model AR-1 was unveiled at the September, 1954, New York Audio Fair. It consisted of a 12-inch woofer designed and built by AR. High frequencies were handled by the 755A, an 8-inch full range driver of Western Electric design, produced by Altec. Both units were in a sealed 3/4-inch thick plywood cabinet filled with fiberglass. The size was Just under two cubic feet with dimensions of 25" x 14" x 11", noticeably smaller than other high performance loudspeakers. It weighed in at about 50 lbs.

A Model AR-1W (a woofer only speaker), shown in Figure

1, was also produced and was intended to be used with a separate high frequency unit such as the Janszen Model 130 electrostatic tweeter. Most impressive was the fact that the Models AR-1 and AR-1W could reproduce frequencies down to 32 cycles per second with very low distortion, something the large mechanical suspension speakers could not do.

Among the features of AR woofers built through the late 1960s were a cast aluminum speaker frame, an Ainico magnet, and a treated cloth cone surround for a free suspension. Kloss was put in charge of the AR factory and is credited with 75 percent of the Model AR-1's production design. Julian Hirsch, who at the time published the Audio League Report, wrote, "The AR-1 & AR-1W have established a new industry standard for low distortion bass."

U.S. Patent number 2,775,309 was issued in 1956 for AR's acoustic suspension design, not to be confused with the Patent Number 3,033,045, issued in 1962, which is seen on the back of many AR cabinets. That number deals with the voice coil and diaphragm support for the soft-dome, hemispherical tweeter, another industry first. This tweeter first appeared on the Model 3 in 1958.




Figure 2. A Model AR-2ax in a mahogany cabinet, ca. 1965.

Over the next ten years, the model lineup was expanded to Include Models AR-2, AR-2a, AR-2x, AR-2ax, AR-3a, AR-3a, AR-4, and AR-4x. A view of the Model AR-2ax is shown in Figure 2. The letter suffix indicated changes in the tweeter and mid-range drivers used.

Speaker components appear in Figures 3, 4, and 5. On the back of each speaker cabinet are level controls to make adjustments on the midrange speaker and tweeter, as shown in Figure 6.

If a home had a lot of fabric, such as wall-towall carpeting or drapes which absorb higher frequencies, an adjustment could be made to increase the higher frequency output. These con-(Continued on following page)




Figure 5. A view of the dome-shaped 3/4" tweeter used in the AR-2ax

trols allow the owner to fine tune the sound to the environment in which the speakers are placed, since every room has different acoustics.

Cabinet choices included birch, unfinished pine, mahogany, walnut, cherry and teak wood veneers, making these speakers look as good as they sounded! They were priced individually, but most often sold in pairs.

MORE AR HISTORY

Two other key players in the company's history were Tony Hofmann, a solid-state physiclst, and Malcolm Low. Kloss, Low and Hofmann left AR in 1957 and formed KLH. They had great success with their line of speakers and audio components. The audio press raved about the performance of all AR speakers, which led the company to an astonishing 32 percent of the speaker market by 1966, followed by KLH in second place at 12 percent.

No other speaker manufacturer before or since, has acquired this large a market share. Acoustle Research had developed a reputation for having speakers which sounded better then anything else offered by other makers, at any price! An impressive list of spokespeople endorsed AR products — conductor Herbert von Karajan, Louis Armstrong and Judy Collins, to name a few. The company also held "live vs. recorded" demonstrations, defying listeners to tell the difference!

Edgar Villchur sold AR to Teledyne in 1967, and this company continued producing most of the early models though 1974 when a major redesign of all speakers took place. Villchur went on to establish the Foundation for Hearing Aid Research, as well as to become a visiting scientist at MIT. As of this writing, he is still living and working in Woodstock, New York.

After leaving AR, Henry Kloss spent the next 45 years developing many groundbreaking audio products through his various companies. He passed away in 2002.




Figure 6. A rear view of a Model AR-2ax shows the speaker connections and the mid- and highlevel controls used to adjust the speaker's frequency response to compensate for room acoustics and the listener's preference.

COLLECTOR INTEREST

As indicated by my earlier A.R.C. articles, my primary interest is In Kloss's KLH products, but clearly AR was the foundation of a major change in the type of speaker systems that interested the public. By the 1970s, millions of hl-fi speakers made by dozens of companies were in homes across America.

Today, it's the AR-1 that collectors search high and low for, often spending up to \$1,000 when one is located. Many are bought up by collectors in China and Japan who love early hi-fi from the U.S. The AR-3 and AR-3a were the flagship models and can be found for \$200-\$500 a pair. A Model AR-3 is on display at the Smithsonian Information Age Exhibit in Washington DC. The AR-4 and AR-4x were the economy models, having an 8-inch woofer and selling for about \$75 a palr.

I think AR-2ax is the collector's bargain — a 10-inch woofer, a midrange, and a dome tweeter, which today go for \$75 to \$150 a pair. These are internet prices, and as we all know, if one goes to a yard sale or church falr, you can strike speaker gold and find something for \$10. This is how I spend my Saturday mornings!

SECO Crystal Set

Phil Bliss augments the coverage of SECO in "Crystal Clear," the extensive two-volume reference by Maurice I. Sievers for American crystal sets. (Editor)

The crystal set shown in Figure 1 is a recent purchase. It was manufactured in the 1923-1924 time frame and was probably the only design by Spielman Electric Company marketed under the SECO name.

I wanted to share this information with A.R.C because some of your readers might be interested in photos and details that are not included on pages 193 and 194 in the resource guide *Crystal Clear, Volume 1*.




Figure 3. A close view of the crystal set panel showing the crystal, the tuning knob and the binding posts for antenna, ground, and telephone (or phones).




Figure 4. The diagram for connecting the set. Note that a switch was available to connect the antenna to ground when the crystal set was not being used.

The box shown in Figure 2 measures 4%" long x 4%" wide x 5%" high. Shown in Figure 3 is the Bakelite panel with the crystal and catwhisker mounted parallel to the panel. The diagram for connecting the crystal set to the antenna, ground and telephones (referred to today as headphones) is shown in Figure 4.




Figure 6. The large tuning coil inside the set.

The antenna and tuning coils, shown In Figures 5 and 6, are wound on cardboard (Continued on following page)

forms with a smaller antenna coil inside the tuning coil. The slide on the tuning coil is operated by a knob on the face of the panel. This clrcuit arrangement allows for very good selectivity.

Majestic Model 344 Lowboy

The following article describes a real labor of radio love. It also is a reminder of how a radio treasure can be thought of as part of an inheritance to our children. (Editor)




Figure 1. A front view of the radio from a 1950 Ford showing the concentric tuning and volume controls, and the five push buttons.

My pride and joy is a Majestic Model 344 lowboy, which was manufactured in 1933 and which now graces the dining room of my home. Figure 1 shows a front view of the radio. When I found it in St. Augustine, Florida, the radio was complete, except for a missing side knob. An interesting feature of

the set is the log drawer with a small pull handle just below the radio, as shown in Figure 2.

Though in working condition when I purchased it, the set was in only fair condition cosmetically. The criss-cross pattern of the speaker grille was broken in several places. The color of the cabinet was dull, almost black in appearance. You could not see any of the Inlaid wood patterns or tell the colors of the veneer.

Repair began with stripping the walnut cab-

inet down to the base wood and attending to any broken or damaged parts. I then rubbed the cabinet down with three coats of boiled linseed oil cut with mineral spirits. This process brought back the true colors of the various veneers and put life back into the old wood

The fluted legs and panels made the refinishing work very tedious and time-consuming. The triple grille area proved to be a task, as I had to make hard cardboard frames over which to stretch the grille cloth, and then tack them into place inside the hard-to-reach area.

However, the extra time and effort paid off, as the radio now looks, I am sure, very close to how it looked when manufactured 73 years ago. The stripping and refinishing show off the magnificent woodworking of this cabinet.

The rear view of the radio, shown in Figure 3, shows its twin speakers and chassls. The set now plays like new, and the 6-legged walnut cabinet is a thing of beauty. This is one radio I plan to keep and pass on to family members in the future.

RESTORATION TOPICS

Vintage Automobile Radios

BY WALTER H. HALL

In the article, Walter Hall provides some background information on car radios, and tells how he found a new application for an old set from a 1950 Ford. (Editor)

A number of years ago an acquaintance of mine brought to me a vintage automobile radio, which he had salvaged from a 1950 Ford. The car had suffered serious damage due to an unfortunate misunderstanding at an intersection. Since I had no Immediate use for the radio, It sat on a shelf in my workshop for several more years.

One day out of curiosity, I decided to take a closer look at the radio, which fortunately showed no signs of deterioration due to the passage of time. I found the radio, shown in Figures 1 and 2, to be complete and undamaged. Typical of its time, it had an "airplane" type dial and five mechanical push buttons for selecting stations without having to look at the dial.

The set operated from the vehicle's 6-volt battery and had a vibrator type power supply to provide the plate voltage. The vacuum tubes were the conventional type used widely in other types of radio equipment of that period.

NEW USE FOR THE MODIFIED RADIO

Since I had no urgent need for the unit as configured, I decided as an experiment to replace the vibrator and related transformer so it could be operated on plug-in power. Fortunately, I had a suitable 60-cycle transformer on hand and it fitted precisely in the space vacated by the vibrator and transformer. The modified radio is shown in Figure 3.

When powered-up, the modified radio performed in all respects as its designer had expected. No other major repairs other than routine maIntenance, such as cleaning, lubricating, etc., were required. Since it functioned so well, I decided to give it a permanent home by installing it in the paneled wall of an adjacent family room. The wall-mounted radio is shown in Figure 4.

Once installed and equipped with a short 5-foot wire antenna tacked to the wall, it performed very well, and it continues to serve as a working reminder of mobile radio 50 years ago.

EARLY AUTO RADIO HISTORY

Due to the demanding conditions under which they are designed to operate, automobile radios are usually superior performers in nonmobile use. These radios became popular as add-ons during the mid-1930s long before automobiles were designed to accommodate these devices. Initially, radios for cars were sold as a nice-to-have item.

As some may recall, the early units usually had the control head mounted on the car's steering

column. Remote controls for tuning and volume operated with flexible shafts. High voltage was provided by using a dynamotor consisting of a 6-volt DC motor and a 200-volt generator on the same shaft. The dynamotor worked remarkably well but was expensive to manufacture.

In the late 1930s, vibrator power supplies replaced the dynamotors and became the standard way of converting 6 volts DC to 200 volts DC. The vibrator acted as a "chopper" to permit step-up transformers to produce high voltage to a rectifier unit and thereby produce high voltage DC. Vibrators were reasonably functional, but generally had a short operational life due to wear and pitting of its contact points.

FACTORY-INSTALLED RADIOS

Automobile radios finally hit their stride when the design of instrument panels included space for factory-installed radios. However, a radio was usually installed by the dealers since it was a price add-on option not always exercised by the buyer. If the buyer declined the option, the space for the radio was filled with a plate symbolic of the car logo — a quiet reminder of the missed opportunity. This loss sometimes led to post-sale radio installations.

In addition to radio sales by car dealers, there was a rapidly growing market for radios not designed for a specific car. Examples were those made by Philco, Motorola, Zenith, Wells-Gardner, and others that were designed to fit any car.

Many of these models were superior to the car makers' products and were sold nationwide. After World War II, the car makers' products were of fered almost universally as a part of the price of the car. The advent of solid-state devices and related high technology eliminated earlier power supply problems and marked the beginning of a new era from which future generations could create their own standards of what constitutes antiquity.

COLLECTIBLE VINTAGE AUTO RADIOS

Collectible vintage automobile radios are becoming a rare commodity. When they became an inte-

gral part of an automobile, they suffered the same fate as the vehicle — when it was scrapped, the radio usually disappeared.

For demonstration purposes. vintage automobile radios can be powered more practically by readily available line voltagepowered, bench-type, power supplies than by modification to replace the vibrator and power transformer. For solid-state radios of any vintage, bench tests indicate that plug-in power supplies of the type used for office machines, etc., work very well if the marked voltage and current ratings are consistent with the demands of the connected load Older automobile radios using vacuum tubes and dynamotor or vibrator power supplies require bench-type power supplies be-

cause of the high current demand.

While they may not be commonly seen as collectible, vintage automobile radios reflect the historically important efforts made to provide entertainment during those early days when many electronic mysteries remained to be solved.

cult. I tend to unload and then move the van a bit out from the hustle and bustle anyway

The noon start mentioned on the Renninger's site is a misprint — dealers arrive starting at 9:00 A.M. or earlier. Before unpacking, I wandered around saying "hello" and looking over the merchandise. I found nothing too promising at first, but later bought a really well made home-brew set (modeled on the National SW-3, it appeared). At \$25 it was a great buy, as it turned out later to be a 3-tube Doerle design with an added 2A5 output tube

After an hour of shopping, I unpacked, and as usual, sold a couple of things instantly. By early evening, an all original, nice, little GE cathedral I had seen earlier appeared to be a good choice, since I couldn't find a tempting 1930s, big, wood fixer-upper that is my specialty. So for \$190, I picked up the GE and consider it another good buy, as these sets are generally higher in price on eBay.

I followed the lead of Bruce Mager at the Waves table across from me, covered up my table around 7 P.M., and went out to get a sandwich. Later though, I saw dealers still open well after dark. That evening, the DVHRC put on a great talk on crystal set design, and I learned a lot about using sound-powered phone parts and other techniques for squeezing out the best performance.

For the night, I parked the van out in the lot by a pole with outlets where we had power and some privacy. Then I let the dogs run around. Just as at the fall meet, there was a big yellow moon, and I sat out sipping some cheap beer offered by a fellow camper. I managed to get to sleep by 11:00 P.M., anticipating the usual early rush.

Indeed, the first announcement came over the PA system at 5:30 A.M. about someone blocking access to a dealer's parking spot. I uncovered everything about 7 A.M. after being satisfied that I would find nothing else I wanted to buy. I enjoyed talking to club members, as well as to a cadre of collector friends mostly from the Boston area meets. It's 800 miles round-trip to Kutztown for me, and I consider it time and gas well spent.

Later that day, I bought a beautiful early 1930s Airline tombstone. The model number tag was gone, but this set is used as an icon on the Antique Radio Forum online and in my own ads. 
WITH THE COLLECTORS

Montgomery Ward Airline Model 04WG-731 Tube-Count Marketing

Tube counts can be misleading, as Don Watson points out in this story about a vintage Airline set. (Editor)

The Montgomery Ward Airline Model 04WG-731, shown in Figure 1, is a pre-World War II vintage radio with some interesting design features. It is an AC/DC 7-tube set that covers standard broadcast and 9 to 12.2 megacycles. Among its more appealing features are the attractive walnut veneer cabinet, an easy-to-read slide rule diathat is backlit, and a 6-inch PM speaker coupled with a tone control that does sound good.



The Montgomery Ward Airline Model 04WG-731 is a 7-tube radio that functions like a 5- or 6-tube set.

TUBE-COUNT MARKETING

What perhaps makes this set most interesting concerns the marketing philosophy of the day. It was thought that a higher tube count meant a better radio. In some cases I am sure that was true, but not in this one. However, advertising a higher tube count was good for sales.

Inside this set is where the theory that more tubes equal a better radio falls apart. Seven tubes illuminated in a series string is not quite the norm. The tube complement is as follows: a 12SA7 converter, two 12SK7 IF amplifiers, a 6L5 second detector, a 12SQ7 first audio, a 3575 rectifier.

The two 12SK7s are resistance coupled; thus, the radio uses only two IF transformers. This design does not do a lot for the dynamic range of the AVC or for the overall receiver gain. Too much gain is lumped together, and so the set is more prone to overload. The overload becomes apparent when living near two 50 KW AM stations.

TUBE INFLATION

The Airline 04WG-731 is basically an "All American Five " with some additional twists. One extra tube is the 6L5 second detector. I had never heard of such a tube, and it was very difficult to find in any tube manual. However, I did find it. It is a triode like a 6J5, except the filament current is that of the series string. Therefore, it is used as a diode for the detector. The diode is formed between the cathode and grid with the plate left open. The diode plates in the 12SQ7 that could

be used as the detector are left unused — clearly a case of tube-count inflation.

This radio was made before I was, so I have no idea how sales were. I do see them from time to time on eBay, but they really don't command a high dollar figure.

Having worked for Montgomery Ward many years ago, I am partial to Airline radios. This model was manufactured by Wells-Gardner in Chicago. Like many other radio manufacturers, his company became a defense contractor and produced some of the BC-348 aircraft receivers for the war effort. In the late 1950s and mid-1960s, Wells-Gardner also produced some TVs for Montgomery Ward. These were definitely not high-end sets. I don't know whether or not Wells-Gardner is still in business. If it is, perhaps commercial electronics is its field.


Can you imagine — Richard Estes had already sold two Sparton Nocturnes at a prior auction, and here was a third one in the February 25th auction? These were also from the collection of Mr. Sage of Albuquerque, New Mexico, along with other blue and peach mirror Spartons, There were also radios from a collector in Missouri, as well as others.

February can be a challenge if the weather does not cooperate, but that Saturday turned out to be clear and blustery. The buyers were late in arriving, but by auction time, about 100 had shown up. This auction had a large selection of very nice early phonographs, cylinder records and parts. Ham gear and box lots were limited, but there were quite a few Catalins, a lot of crystal sets, the usual large selection of tubes, and, of course, the mirror radios.

If ever there was proof of the old statistical rule of the "vital few and the trivial many," this auction proved it. While I recorded 582 lots for a total sale price of \$123,627, six items alone accounted for 55 percent of that value. Of course, these were mostly glass mirror radios that

mostly glass mirror radios that do not show up that often, and one item, the Sparton Nocturne, sold for \$55,000. Remember, all dollar values

Some items came in late on Saturday morning, and one in particular caught my interest. It was a Norden-Hauck Admiralty, a large table model superheterodyne with AC power supply built-in. It was very dirty and in need of some restoration, but I had never seen one before. Its features include 12 tubes on three chassis, a 3-tube preamp, a 3-tube IF amp, and a main chassis with 6 tubes; the front panel had two meters. The output audio stage had two Type 50 globe tubes with good filaments.

I lusted for this radio and secretly hoped that since it came in late, it might go unnoticed. However, that was not to be as it sold for \$1,100, unfortunately not to me. Anyway, one of the benefits of these Estes auctions is that you can

examine, touch and photograph these wonderful radios even if you do not end up owning them.

There was a fair sampling of paper goods, books, magazines and ephemera, but they were sold "choice" and I could not record them. Side auctions in the afternoon were held to process box lots, test equipment, and low value tube lots. I ran back and forth for some items I wanted, so I missed some items in both auctions.

There was a large batch of transistor novelty radios that were also sold on the side, and I prevailed on my wife Edith to record some information on these. That list is included after the main auction listing. The dollar total here was only \$234.

I stopped recording at 4:40 P.M. with about 75 items left to go.
