



EDITOR'S COMMENTS

The heightened, sometimes frenzied, activity involved in getting A.R.C. to the printer every month increases twofold for the February issue. Why? Because our monthly routine goes a bit awry with the demands of planning for a worthy cause — Radio XXXVIII, which A.R.C. runs for the Greater Boston Radio Collectors.

Every February on the Sunday of Presidents' Day weekend, our staff mounts what has become (forgive the boast) the biggest antique radio show on the East Coast. No wonder we are breathless as we go to press, but we've done it all before and feel confident of success. I'm hoping that many of you who haven't made it to the show in the past will join us for a great day of radio camaraderie.

Success is certainly a word that leaps out at you when you consider the subject of Andrew Hayden's lead article — RadioShack, a company that has been a household name for decades. I have a personal attachment to the history of RadioShack because as a boy in Texas, I ordered parts for my Ham projects from the company's early catalogs. When I came to the Boston area for college in the late 1950s. I was able to make many trips in person to RadioShack.

Several years later, I was amazed to see branches of the store in rural southern Texas. As Andrew relates, this expansion began after Charles Tandy of Texas had bought the troubled company ir 1963. By 1969, he had opened 500 stores across the country. I doubt that there's any collector among us who hasn't frequented a nearby RadioShack at one time or another. We'll have to see if the company can continue to service the broad interests of the hobbyist, as well as those of the general public, in this new century.

Meanwhile, we continue to take pleasure in the old. Richard Arnold takes us back to the farm sets from around 1940 with his battery-operated farm set, a Truetone D935. Since the voltage requirements for a farm set are different from an early battery set, it must have a different power supply, such as Richard's Powr Shiftr. Instead of a deterent, this difference could make farm sets more interesting to some collectors. Richard himself was late to appreciate the fact that there are ways to run these sets and to enjoy them.

We go even farther back to the 1920s with Ozzie Aasgaard's Crosley Model 5-50. The one-knob control on this late TRF battery set replaced the usual three-knob control in use on sets of those early days. This concept of one-knob control had a brief moment of glory as "high tech" before the emergence of the one-knob superheterodyne still in use. Becoming obsolete in the 1920s was as easy as it is today.

From the Netherlands, Gerald Faassen takes us to the 1950s with a significantly different radio — the very colorful Tesla Talisman 308U manufactured in

Czechoslcvakia. We regret not being able to show the sets in color, but their shape, supposedly inspired by comic book space ships, should pique your interest.

John Hagman's reports on the Delaware Valley Historic Radio Club meets at Kutztown, Pennsylvania, always remind us that the real reward of such an event is getting together with fellow collectors. In spite of bad weather, hours of travel, even modest sales, John regularly attends Kutztown and urges us to join him.

Of course, no one can be everywhere, though our faithful reporter Ray Chase gives it a try. His latest Estes Auctions report describes the sale of Lou Lindauer's collection, an event that I really regret missing. I've known Lou for many years, and I've had items from his collection in the back of my mind, hoping someday to augment my own collection with them. Sure enough, a Lyradion Series B, for example, went for \$2,500. So it goes in a collector's life. However, a broad selection of early battery and wireless sets must have sent many folks home happy.

Reviewer Ray Bintliff gives Bret Menassa's Volume 4 in his series of videos on antique radio restoration a resounding thumbs up. This one on wood cabinet repair and refinishing encourages collectors, regardless of experience, to give it a try. Just follow the careful step-by-step instructions, all useful and easy to carry out. Bret's series does much to advance the cause of radio preservation.

COMPANY PROFILE

Radio Shack A Humble Beginning for an Electronics Giant

Most of us don't think about how a company known as "RadioShack" today — and "Radio Shack" in its earlier days — came to be a giant retailer. Andrew Hayden traces the history of the company, a fixture in many neighborhoods throughout the country for decades — a true American success story. (Editor)

Most things large start out small, and this holds true for the retailers of electronics and related items. However, few companies grew to be the corporate giant which RadioShack is today with its 7,000 retail stores

nationwide, and operations in at least a dozen other counties. In 2003, RadioShack had net sales and operating revenues of \$4.6 billion, making it the world's largest electronics retailer.

I doubt the Deutschmann brothers, Theodore and Milton, envisioned the kind of success that was to follow the opening of their "Radlo Hut," as it was first called in 1921. In this one-store, retail, mail order operation in downtown Boston, they wanted to provide equipment for Amateur Radio

enthusiasts. The store's name became "Radio Shack" early on, a name taken from the small structure or "radio shack" that then housed a ship's radio equipment.

The first Radio Shack catalog came out in the early 1940s. The company entered the growing high-fidelity market in 1947, opening the nation's first audio showroom where people could compare amps, speakers, and turntables.

It was 1954 when the recently formed Harman Kardon Company (HK) approached Radio Shack to see if it was interested in private label audio equipment. HK suggested the name "Realist" which Radio Shack accepted, and they began selling components with this name. The Realist Camera Company wasn't fond of Radlo Shack's use of its

name, and a lawsuit quickly followed. Radlo Shack subsequently changed the "Realist" brand name to "Realistic." This famous name was to be used for the next 45 years until it was discontinued in 2000.

An interesting aside is that, in May of 2006, I sent an e-mall to RadioShack's Corporate Communications to let them know that they had some misinformation on their history page. The page said that the company had started selling the




Figure 2. Another view of the LJ-2 that shows its simplicity and clean design. The LJ-2 was manufactured by Grommes.

private brand "Realistic" in 1954, when, In fact, the name being used then was "Realist," which led to the lawsuit by the Realist Camera Company. RadioShack's online service manager thanked me and made the change. However, the photo of the Realist tuner which ignited the lawsuit is still being used!

REALIST AMPLIFIER AND FM TUNER

Pictured in Figures 1-4 are a Realist monophonic amplifier and an FM tuner from 1954 when Radio Shack still had a single location. Each of these cute vintage hi-fi units is approximately 10" x 4" x 7". The amp, a "Little Jewel" LJ-2, was made by Grommes. Grommes was founded in 1946 and made some very nice amplifiers. Still in business today, the company is called Grommes-Precision, and it is one of the last American manufacturers of custom and consumer audio equipment.

The tuner was made by Harman Kardon (HK), and sold for \$39.95. HK was known for its innovation and quality. The front panels on both units are labeled "Realist – Radio Shack – Boston." The tube lineup is as follows: amplifier — 5Y3, 6V6GT (2), 6SL7, 6SC7; tuner — 6U8, 6AU6 (3), 6AL5, 12AT7. Both have a phono-tuner switch on their front panels.

High Fidelity's review of this tuner says, "With only six tubes, the designers are able to get sensitivity surprisingly close to that of tuners which sell for three or four times its cost." I have this pair hooked up to a 1963 KLH Model 14B loudspeaker, which has two 4-inch drivers, and I must say I'm impressed by the sound quality. This setup exemplifies the meaning of the phrase "less is more" — a small hi-fi setup with great sound.

FROM 1955 TO THE PRESENT

Starting in 1955, Radio Shack began to have its private label products produced in Japan. Their literature claimed this was because Japan had numerous electronics factories located close to the source of component parts. However, as the rest of the U.S. audio industry found out in the coming years, it simply cost much less to produce in Japan.

By 1961, Radio Shack had expanded to four stores and the Realistic brand of products was proving to be successful. The company also carried many audio components by quality makers such as Dynaco, MacIntosh, and Jensen. The diversity and quantity of Items offered in the 180-page catalog of 1961 is quite impressive. (See




Figure 3. A front panel view of the Radio Shack FM tuner. Again we see a unit that stresses simplicity and clean lines. Harman Kardon manufactured the FM tuner for Radio Shack and displays the "Realist" brand name




Figure 5. The cover of Radio Shack's 1961 catalog shows its four store locations, as well as a transistor pocket radio.

the catalog cover in Figure 5.) Nevertheless, Radio Shack was having serious financial troubles and was essentially broke.

in 1963, Charles Tandy bought the company for \$300,000 and what followed was to be one of the greatest success stories of American retailing. Tandy had been running the Tandy Leather Company based in Fort Worth, Texas, with his father. They had 67 stores in 36 states.

After the purchase of Radio Shack, they eliminated everything, except electronics. Tandy was considered a driven marketing genius, and rapid growth followed. By 1969 there were 500 Radio Shack stores. Most of us have owned at least one piece of Realistic audio equipment from the 1970s. By this time, the company had firmly established a reputation for affordable, quality-made products. One of them was among the first personal computers offered to the public, the TRS-80, Introduced in 1977. This limited function computer with its small black and white screen is in stark contrast to today's offerings.

Today the company is involved in every aspect of telecommunications and Is the leading wireless retailer in the U.S. Since 2000, the name (Continued on following page)

officially has been "AadioShack" (one word). The global environment for electronics is very competitive and seems to change frequently. Switching to an online catalog, RadioShack issued its last print catalog in 2002, marking the end of an era.

Some feel that the company has lost its way by seemingly focusing on cell phones and gadgets and moving away from the great audio products that were its bread and butter for so many years. In February 2006, RadioShack announced plans to close about 500 company-operated stores. Despite this, no matter what town you're in, it seems as though you are still able to find a RadioShack outlet within 20 mlnutes. This is something I'm sure the Deutschmann brothers could not have Imagined when they opened their store in Boston 85 years ago. The company's impact on the electronics market in the 20th century was substantial, and only time will tell what the 21st century holds.

Tesla Talisman 308U

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Truetone Model D935 Farm Radio

If you have been passing up battery-operated "farm radios," Richard Arnold's experience may cause you to view them in a new light. (Editor)

Here is a radio type that perhaps has been somewhat overlooked or neglected over the years by a lot of collectors. I know from my own experience that up until just recently I have had little or no desire to collect "farm" or battery sets from the 1930s to 1940s. Why, I'm not really sure. Maybe it was because I looked down on them as not being very interesting, lacking in style and not having much, if any, value. I think maybe that it was simply ignorance on my part.

In June of 2005, I was asked by a relative to restore two battery sets. His father had purchased them both back in the late 1930s to early 1940s. Well, I took on the projects and over a period of a few months I managed to get both of the sets working. I had to send one of the cabinets out for restoration by a professional as it was beyond anything that I could handle. Antique Radio Forum member Jerry Huelsbec completely replaced the veneer and refinished the cabinet for me. He did a beautiful job.

THE TRUETONE MODEL D935

After working on my bother-in-law's two farm radios, I started looking for one of my own. I ended up with two — a Stewart-Warner Model 9005A (See A.R.C., September 2006) and the radio shown in Figure 1, found on eBay. The seller said that it was a Truetone, but he did not know the model number or if it worked, as it was a battery set. The cabinet was a little rough but the chassis looked great. It even had one of those 4-pin A & B combined battery power plugs. This would make hook-up for me very easy using the Silvertone Powr Shiftr that I have. My article on the Sears Silvertone Powr Shiftr in the November 2005 Antique Radio Classified describes this battery eliminator.

Í bid on the set and got it for only \$11.75, plus \$16.00 in shipping. So, now I have another farm set. When the radio arrived, I was not surprised. After a good dusting, the chassis proved to be in excellent condition, almost brand new looking. It had all of its original parts and still worked great. I did have to replace the grille cloth and refinish the cabinet, but when I was finished, I was quite pleased with my \$27.75 purchase.

I contacted a guy named Larry who has a web site called "Truetone Radio Land," and he looked the radio up for me in one of his Truetone catalogs. He sent me all of the information that I

needed on the radio and even added a copy of the radio schematic. He said the radio was a 1940 Truetone Model D935 mantel set called the "Master." Coronado Radio Company made the radio in its Factory 4A.

The radio uses the following four 1.5v filament tube types: a 1A7G converter/oscillator, a 1N5G IF, a 1H6G 2nd detector, AVC and AF, and a 1C5G output. The IF for this radio is 456 Kc. This set uses a 5-inch permanent magnet speaker, which produces great sound.

I have noticed also that the chassis in this set seems to have been rather popular, as it is the same one used in my brother-in-law's radio and in my Stewart-Warner 9005A. So, if you were buying a Truetone, a Stewart-Warner or a generic no-name set, you wculd actually be buying the same radio with just a different looking cabinet and a different name stuck on it. I don't suppose it matters all that much, especially now, since all of my radios with that chassis in them work great and have their original equipment.

Well, thanks to my brother-in-law, I have developed a new, but still somewhat limited interest in the farm radios. I now have two of them in my collection and play one of them almost every day.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Crosley Model 5-50 One-Knob Tuning

BY LAUREL "OZZIE" AASGAARD

High tech today is a far cry from high tech in the 1920s. The ease of the Crosley 5-50's one-knob tuning must have been a great sales pitch compared to the three individual controls of the more common sets of the day. (Editor)

With today's Digital Displays and Programmable Memory Tuning it is difficult to imagine that the development of one-knob station selection was high tech. One of Crosley's entries into this technology was the Model 5-50 shown in Figure 1.

I've had in my possession a Model 5-50 that my father-inlaw bought in 1926. Scratched in the finish under the oval nameplate on the font panel are the words "No good, 1926, G. Lund," I remember Mr. Lund from my youth as a rather eccentric old-timer who repaired radios. He wore a World War I uniform complete with wraparound leggings and rode a bicycle to the local creamery for a pail of buttermilk everyday. But that's beside the point of this story.

Unlike the Crosley Model 5-50, many early AM radios had three individually tuned controls for the RF stages. These controls had dials marked with divisions from 0 to 100 and were called logging scales, denot-

ing neither frequency nor wavelength. Some dealers provided logging charts for noting the dial settings for desired stations. A sample of an old chart is shown in Figure 2.

Notice there are three boxes under the heading "Dial Settings," one for each dial of the early radios. Actually, the settlngs would be very close to the same number, except in the case of some distant stations when some tweaking might be necessary. Also notice the column on either side of the boxes: K.C. (kllocycles, now kilohertz) and W.L. (wavelength in meters). Some early radio dials were cali-

brated in wavelength.

A CAPACITOR COUPLING PROBLEM




Figure 3. The Model 5-50 chassis. The three ganged variable capacitors can be clearly seen.

As Figure 3 shows, Crosley used the in-line, mechanically coupled configuration for the tuning capacitors (the manufacture of ganged tuning capacitors was developed later). However, the trouble I found with the Model 5-50 was broken flexible coupled disks between the capacitor sections. The original material seemed to be pressed paper.

My first thought was to replace the couplings with some Malden universal joint shaft couplers

that I had in my N.O.S. inventory. But they were made of metal, and further inspection, verified by the schematic diagram, showed that both the rotor and stator sections of each capacitor were insulated from each other. I could have changed to nonmetallic shafts, but I solved the problem by resorting to another item that brought back fond memories — I cut discs from the cover of a plastic 5-quart ice cream bucket

The radio was made for battery operation, but I play it on a universal AC-powered supply that I use for old radios. It plays as well as can be expected from a 1926 radio with a Musicone speaker. The dial markings are not visible in the picture, but they

are 0 to 100 in division of tens on a replaceable paper band that attaches to the single thumb-wheel tuning drum.

MEET REPORT

Delaware Valley Historic Radio Club Meet Kutztown, Penn. — September 22-23, 2006

The thing that most characterizes my hobby is irony. I realized this fact as I headed through the endless mountains of Pennsylvania on the way to the Delaware Valley Historic Radio Club fall meet in Kutztown, Pennsylvania. It is the Internet that brought me the knowledge and skills to indulge in such an arcane craft - the restoration of vacuum tube radios and phonographs. Even the word "phonograph" is starting to feel strange and old in my mouth, headed the way of words like "vaudeville" and "livery." The word "radio" may not be far behind.

But the giant silicon chip has become synonymous with the baby steps of the people who first put sound into the air. My

own heros are Reginald Fessenden, who broadcast voice for the first time ever on Christmas Eve, 1906, and the late Jean Shephard, whose show on WOR in the 1960s and 1970s was the beginning of my own special radlo history. These were my thoughts as I neared my destination in search of antique radios.

I stayed in Binghamton, New York, the night before the meet at the Super 8 and found it comfortable. I wanted to get to Kutztown before noon and barely made it after picking up

tarps I needed. I recommend that those seeking bargains come early to mid-morning and next year plan to stay in Scranton or closer. But this meet has a unique "soft start" feature where dealers can drift in and set up between 8 A.M. and 6 P.M., so it was chill, as they say.

Immediately upon arriving, I put Lani, the plastic, purple Tiki God with Simulated Flame Illusion, on my table to promote good luck. I circled about a few times looking for promising, high-end, wooden bargains, but finding nothing pressing, I set up pretty quickly.

The moment I finished setting up I noticed

that my neighbor had a 15tube Philco 37-116 in decent shape for \$90. I talked him up to a hundred after realizing it was the kind of thing you just don't pass up. It is in better shape and more complete than the one I got at Westford many years ago for the same price.

Bruce from Waves in New York City was on the other side, and it was fun talking with him as usual. There are so many people here 400 miles from home that I call friends. They gather together twice a year for this odd blend of flea market, camping trip, and fraternity party. I met Keith Park, and also our hosts the Delaware Valley Historic Radio Club crew, as well as many other dealers and collectors I know a little or a lot.

The food at the flea was improved this year and kudos to those who arranged it. By late afternoon as things wound

down, I was starving and appreciated having them right there. Later the steak dinner was good, and I had a fun time talking to the Oppats in from Michigan.

Up to this point I hadn't bought anything more. Some dealers as usual were still open later as I wandered around and availed myself of some fine single malt Scotch that magically appears each year about midway down the fairway. It appeared to be quite a good crowd as much of the pavilion had been full since late in the day. I was getting quite tired, having hauled down and unloaded an enormous Zenith 75 radio/phono and several other giant things to display.

I was set up for the night in the van about 100 feet from the pavilion, and I turned in about 10:00 P.M. But first the dogs and I walked far out to the edge of the field as usual — the Renningers site provides so much space that it's great fun.

Next morning, it was raining a bit but it didn't last long. I set up at 7:00 A.M., and the flea was pretty packed by 8:00 despite the weather. I think we saw fewer casual radio shoppers from the regular flea next door though. I sold my Zenith 7S260 and Philco 41-300 by noon and had traded my rough Edison C-150 Diamond Disk for a Silvertone 36 cathedral and some cash. Since I needed that space in the van to sleep in, it was welcome to finally have my booths cleared out a bit.

Prices in general varied wildly and there appear to be fewer and fewer fixer uppers each meet. But this meet still had lots of bargains, and many of the restored sets were pretty well done and not too expensive. I saw a restored

Case tombstone with a simply stunning multicolored airplane dial, as well as a really nice RCA giant projection TV that went for a bit over \$300. Many of the tempted folks were relieved that someone else bought this set finally.

I decided to stay late this year but paid attention to the auction only in fits and starts while I was packing up. Still I was pleased and surprised to get a decent Philco 90 cathedral for \$125 about mid-afternoon. No one else bid against me. You could fill a moving van at the auction for that much money, and many people might have a third that amount as their whole auction budget. But the guy needed the space, and I'm into quality over bulk now, so yet another Philco I can't refuse followed me home.

The Zenith 75 I had painstakingly prepared didn't sell and neither did the Philco 116 tombstone, but almost everything else went, and I donated a few things to the club. Since those are the two radios I don't mind keeping, it was a win-win. I was pleased and tired as I headed off to camping nearby that night. Thanks to all the wonderful folks of DVHRC and Renningers for making this all possible. I have my space already for Kutztown, May 2007 (\$20 per table with free camping). AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions — Lou Lindauer Collection Burbank, Ohio — May 27, 2006

After the spectacular auction of the Dexter Deely collection in April, one might have expected a lull in radio auction activity, but such was not the case, as the Richard Estes May auction again offered more wonderful and rare radio artifacts. The April auction had brought in well over \$200,000, and this May auction was no slouch at over \$150,000.

The bottom line is not everything though, and there was something for everyone at this sale held on Memorial Day weekend. Friday was rainy (they do seem to get a lot of rain in this part of Ohio), but Saturday was fine. Many buyers turned up as the parking lot was completely filled, and I noted about 100 bid-

ding cards issued. This was also unusual since there were two good competing auctions on this day, one in Virginia and one in Maryland. As always, there was Friday evening viewing and also Saturday morning inspection from 8 A.M. until the start of auction at 10 A.M.

With a few additions, this auction centered on the Lou Lindauer collection from Delaware, and it should be noted that, with a few exceptions, most items were in remarkably good condition. Included were many old movie projectors and related

photographic items, as well as some early patent models. I recorded the photographic items but opted out on the patent models.

There was a fair amount of paper, as well as books, but they were sold "choice" so I could not tabulate them. A number of phonograph items were sprinkled in.

For the radio collectors it was a field day with over 40 crystal sets, another great batch of Grebes and Kennedys, three Atwater Kent breadboards. a few DeForests, a really nice selection of cathe-


drals, many nice battery sets, a sea of horn speakers, and then those IP and SE early wireless items, and much more. Tubes were also plentiful with 93 lots of tubes being sold, not counting bulk lots sold later in the auction. If one needed to stock up on early battery and/or collector tubes, this was the place to come.

A few special items of note: first, an especially nice 6-tube, 3-dialer home brew In a glass case. This was one of the finest I have seen with a large wood base that may have been made to hold batteries. The coils in the set were by Clearfield, but otherwise, the radio was pure home-brew. It sold for \$2,050. Next was a Lyradion Series B, 175 to 620 meters battery radio. The

claim was that only two were known to exist. Whether this is true or not, the set was in fine condition and sold for \$2,500. Finally, there was a shortwave tuner made by Johnson & Phillips, Ltd., of London. While it was dated 1929, it looked much earlier with lots of nice brass on the panel. An interesting and uncommon set with accompanion.

nying paper, it sold for \$1,000.

An interesting note about this last item was that Richard opened the bidding at \$1,000, and it immediately sold on that one bid. While I assume that the buyer is happy and probably felt that he got a good buy, this is often not the best buying strategy at an auction. Usually, if Richard did not get a response to the opening bid, he would progressively reduce the asking bid price until someone, usually several bidders at once, made an opening bid. Then competitive bidding would

begin. With this plan, the final sale price might have gone above \$1,000, but it also might have ended up much lower. It certainly is unusual to have such an item self on only one bid.


As for the wireless items, an SE-143 receiver brought \$3,500, and its accompanying SE 143 2-step amp netted \$1,300. An IP-501 sold for \$3,750, but an IP-501A ended up at \$12,000. I should also not forget to mention the thirteen great Western Electric pleces offered. If you needed to fill a gap in your Westem Electric collection, you probably could have done so here.

Ánother interesting note is that the bidding crowd seemed to hang in longer than usual, well into the middle of the afternoon. As a rule the crowd starts thinning out early in the afternoon. Obviously, there was extended interest in this sale. I recorded 513 lots but missed most of the

paper items and stopped recording at 3:45 p.m. when there were still about 200 lots to go. Most were low value or bulk items, and there was nothing of interest to me so I took the opportunity to leave early. Nonetheless, my listing totaled \$149,837, which certainty must have been quite a bit higher considering the lots that I missed. As usual all prices do not include the 5 percent buyer's premium charged at this site.

This was a pleasant day as usual. I picked up a few pieces for myself (none of the high flyers) and was able to gaze upon, twiddle with the knobs, open the lids and poke into some of the preclous treasures of radio collecting even if I could not own them myself. I will always have my photos to remember them.





DVD REVIEW

Antique Radio Restoration – Volume 4 Wood Cabinet Repair & Refinishing By Bret Menassa

REVIEWED BY RAY BINTLIFF, W1RY

Bret continues his radio restoration series with Volume 4. This time he covers the repair and restoration of wooden cabinets. (Editor)

In this DVD, Bret Menassa shows how to repair and restore wood cabinets much like he did with plastic cabinets in Volume 3 (reviewed in the March 2006 A.R.C.). By using cabinets that are in very poor condition, he is able to demonstrate a wide range of repair and restoration techniques. His methods are practical and easy to duplicate. If you have hesitated to refinish a cabinet, this video should provide the encouragement needed to give it a try.


As with plastic cabinets, Bret suggests that you practice on junkers before moving on to other radios in your col-

lection. All of the materials and tools needed to accomplish these repairs are readily available. Enclosed with the DVD is a suggested list of supplies. Some of the supplies, such as solvents, are potentially hazardous, and Bret provides precautionary advice.

Many cabinets in need of repair suffer from missing or lifted veneer. Replacing veneer can be a problem because new veneer may not match the grain, color and thickness of the old veneer in your radio. The DVD will show you how to remove the veneer from a donor cabinet and use it to patch the cabinet under repair. Bret also demonstrates how to repair delaminated veneer and plywood. The video is a very effective medium for conveying these techniques.

You will also learn about dry stripping (sanding) and masking prior to stripping with chemicals. Bret shows that in some cases it is not necessary to strip the entire cabinet and that some of the original finish can be saved. The video provides detailed instructions for using lacquer-based toners for the finish coats and stresses the importance of applying light and even coats.

Other topics include sanding techniques, the use of wood sealers and fillers, the types of glue to use and when, how to select and match veneer, replac-



ing missing wood and covering mistakes. In this regard, Bret's presentation is candid. When he makes a mistake, he shows how to recover and charges ahead.

Like his other DVDs, the time consuming tasks are done off camera so that the presentation moves along ricely. The DVD includes the usual FBI warning about unlawful reproduction, but Bret has inserted a plea of his own. Be sure to pause your DVD player and read it. I think you will enjoy it.

Bret also makes some interesting observations. Usually radios that need cabinet work, and particularly veneer work, can be bought inexpensively. By performing your own cabinet restoration, you end up with a nice radio at low cost. He believes that how

a radio is refinished is a matter of taste. Shiny, dull or whatever — it's your choice. But he does suggest not tampering with the patina or finish on brass escutcheons. In this case, shiny does look right.

Although Bret recommends Pledge polish, a number of refinishers do not because it contains silicone. Bret concurs that silicone could be a problem, but only when refinishing.

The DVD's run time is 108 minutes and the audio/video quality is top notch. As presented, the restoration methods are practical and should be easy for most collectors to carry out. Regardless of your present skill level, you'll find the many good ideas in this DVD useful.
