

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Radio and clocks have become such a team (like the horse and carriage of a familiar song) that it's hard to remember when the union became an integral part of our lives. This thought came to mind as we changed our clocks to daylight savings a month earlier than usual.

Somehow, this schedule change made us more aware of how complex the once simple task of resetting clocks has become. Now we find that when setting the clocks on computers, as well as the clocks on appliances, including clock radios, the process is different for each one. Even resetting a watch can be a challenge.

That's why it's a pleasure sometimes to be able just to move the hands on a grandfather clock or turn the knobs on a simple alarm clock. But, clocks, like radio, have evolved, from decorative to utilitarian, from relatively simple to more complex operations, so the union of the two was a natural course of events.

It was inevitable that radio would become an almost universally used "alarm clock," and Steve Auyer describes one of the examples — a 1950 GE Model 64. This is a nice, simple clock radio, but Steve uses it to illustrate a feature that we can't imagine living without — glow-in-the dark dials. However, few of us may know that, in these early sets, the source of the illumination was radiumcontaining paint.

The link between clocks and radio is also illustrated by Richard Arnold's article tracing the history of the Sonora Company. This company evolved from a manufacturer of clocks in the early 1900s, to a manufacturer of windup phonographs, and, eventually, of radios and vacuum tubes.

A Model WAU-243 table set first piqued Richard's interest, but he then followed the company's history through changing products, international connections, two bankruptcies, and its demise in 1958. It's interesting that the company motto "Clear as a Bell" prevailed no matter what the product, clock or radio.

Restoring a set to its original condition, just as it came from the store, is another way of pursuing radio history. Don Watson achieved this goal in restoring the cabinet, as well as the chassis, of his Sears Silvertone 8052. However, he has had a little more trouble with the history of his set — the year of manufacture is in question. As always, we hope Steve gets some input from readers.

Ray Chase continues to give us more valuable input on what's going on out there in the auction world. This time he covers three smaller auctions, which together totaled less than \$40,000. Though there were no highly collectible items, over four dozen microphones selling from \$3 to \$350, highlighted the Dale Putt auction of the Robert Wilson collection.

In the Parzow auction of the Lee Kemp collection, radios were a small percentage of a general auction and were disposed of in about 20 minutes. Four items — two Atwater Kent breadboards, and two Federals, a 61 and a 110 — accounted for \$2,800 of the total of about \$5,000.

The September Estes auction is described as an old-fashioned, clean-out kind of sale. Only one item, an Atwater Kent breadboard, sold for over \$1,000, and only 47 items, for over \$100. Ray emphasizes that these were not "soft" prices, but that they simply reflect the fact that many of the items were left over and had not been included in previous auctions due to space or time.

This auction also illustrated the doggedness of collectors when on the auction circuit. Tc an outsider, Ray's description of the auction weather conditions would have made giving the whole thing up an easy choice. Not so for the radio collectors — they hung in there despite the rain and cold.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Glow-in-the-Dark Radios

BY STEVE AUYER

In this article, Steve Auyer wonders about how many of us have thought about the literal meaning of "radioactive" when we joke about our hobby. He points to some interesting facts that give us food-forthought as we look at our clock radios. (Editor)

l always get a kick out of seeing a radio collector wearing one of those "I'm Radio-Active" badges. Depending upon what they collect, there may be more truth in their badges than they know. Why? Well up until the mid-1970s a number of clocks, including those used in clock radios, used luminescent paint that contained radium!

Backing up a bit, we need to remember that there are a number of materials that can "store" energy, and then later release it as light. Depending upon the material, the source of the energy may be heat, mechanical deformation, an electric field, visible light, ultraviolet light, etc.

A commonly used material is zinc sulfide, which, after exposure to sunlight, will give of a green glow for several hours. The only problem with using this on clocks is that when you wake up at 3 A.M. and try to read the time, the zinc sulfide has used up its stored energy and is no longer glowing.

However, early in the 20th century, experimenters found that by mixing small quantitles of a radioactive material, such as radium in with the zinc sulfide and some sort of binder, they would end up with a paint that would continue to glow "forever." Basically, the radiation released by the radium

was continuously recharging the zinc sulfide.

THE GE MODEL 64 CLOCK RADIO

A good example of a clock radio that uses




Figure 2. The clock face of the GE Model 64 in daylight.

such paint is the General Electric Model 64, which sold in 1950, and is shown in Figure 1. Actually the same basic chassis was used in a whole series of radios: the 64, 65, 500, 501, 505, 506, 507, 509 and 530, with differ-

ent model numbers indicating different cabinet colors, whether a switched AC outlet was included, and whether a model had a glow-in-the-dark clock.




Figure 3. A time exposure of the face of the GE Model 64 in the dark.

The clock face of the Model 64 in daylight, shown in Figure 2, is the same clock face in the dark, shown in Figure 3. Figure 3 is a time exposure — the actual glow isn't quite this bright.

Just because your clock face doesn't appear to glow, doesn't mean that it's not painted with a radium-containing paint. What happens over time is that the glow becomes fainter and fainter. This is not due to the radium decaving, as it has a half life of 1.600 years, but appears to be due to the fact that extended exposure to the radiation damages the zinc sulfide crystals. The result is that they lose their ability to absorb energy and release it as light.

A tip-off is to take a close look at the hands and markings on the clock, shown in Figure 4. If they appear to be painted with a light greenish/ yellowish paint, especially if the coating is a little "lumpy" or discolored in spots, as in Figure 4, you've probably got radium-containing paint.

So, if you have one of these sets, do you need to be worried? The answer is probably not – just as long as you are not physically close to the set for many hours every day. It would not be a good idea to have one of these sets on the nightstand by your bed with the clock face a foot from your head!

Use of this radium-containing paint was not limited to clocks. During World War II many controls and instruments used liberal amounts of this paint to provide a strong glow in a darkened cockpit. There have been accounts,

possibly anecdotal, of some collectors setting off radiation detectors when they shipped a large quantity of these items at one time.

So to the casual collector, the risk is low – but still something to be aware of.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Sonora — From Chimes to Radio "Clear as a Bell"

The focus of this article was first going to be the Sonora Model WAU-243. However, one bit of information led to another, and before he knew it, Richard Arnold was deep into the story of a company with an interesting history in radio. (Editor)

The image of a bell and a slogan "Clear as a Bell" proved to be appropriate no matter what product the Sonora Company was touting throughout its history — from clocks to phonographs to

radios. Beginning in 1908 as the Sonora Chime Company at 5 Cedar St., New York City, the company patented its system of chiming bells to be put into its clocks. These Sonora chime bells, actually shaped like bells, were so very melodious and had



such an accurate pitch that they were patented on their manufacture and quality.

Sonora Chime Company started making twomovement chime clocks around 1900. The company made only a few of its own clocks before Seth Thomas acquired the patent rights in 1908.

Seth Thomas's first Sonora chlme models appeared in the company's 1909-1910 catalog. These clocks, using the Sonora "nest of bells"




Figure 1. The face of this Seth Thomas windup clock is marked "Seth Thomas, Sonora chime."

chiming mechanism, are highly sought after today. Sonora also made a chime rod mechanism. An example of a Seth Thomas clock with a Sonora chime mechanism is shown in Figure 1.

THE SONORA PHONOGRAPH COMPANY

Back around 1910, many companies were trylng to get into the manufacturing and selling of one of the hottest items on the market, the phonograph. One of these companies was Sonora,

which used "Clear as a Bell" as its slogan, touting the fidelity of its machine's sound reproduction.

The Sonora Chlme Company was reincorporated In February of 1913 as the Sonora Phonograph Company by its founder George Brightson. It was located at

78 Reade St., New York City.

An earlier attempt by the Sonora Phonograph Company in 1909 to sell horns and hornless machines made by a Swiss company named Paillard had run into legal problems and went nowhere. Paillard at that time was also a major manufacturer of music boxes.

A company named Presto Products produced the Sonora phonographs. Sonora also bought

thousands of its phonograph motors from a Swiss Company named Bawdy.

Sonora was one of the companies that were allowed to exist by the big three (Victor, Edison and Columbia) to avoid threats of a trust sult. Because Sonora had paid a lot of money in royalties on patents held by the big three on a per unit basis, it could only compete with them on their high-end machines.

In fact, Šonora ads say, "The Highest Class Talking Machlne In the World." The prices ranged from \$60 to \$2,500. The hardware varied from unit to unit indicating that they were most likely made by various manufactures. The fancy cabinets were Sonora's best selling point, along with its "award-winning magnificent, pure, clear, rich mellow tone." In

1915, the Sonora Phonograph Company won the award for tone at the Panama Pacific Exposition.

Sometime in the middle of 1919, the Sonora Phonograph Company opened an assembly factory in Saginaw, Michigan, and the company headquarters was moved there in the summer of 1927. At that time, Michigan was the center of cabinet production, especially in the Grand Rapids area. Sonora at this time also had a branch in Oakland, California, that later became Magnavox.

SONORA RADIO AND TELEVISION CORP.

During the late 1920s and the Depression years, Sonora had many rough times, including going into receiverships and bankruptcy. The company emerged from bankruptcy on March 10, 1938, under the Articles of Incorporation as the Sonora Radio and Television Corporation.

The new company's corporate offices were located in Room 14108 of the very large Merchandise Mart building in Chicago, Illinois. It was estimated that the gross amount of business that would be transacted during the following year (1939) would be \$40,000.

Sonora sales in the year 1940 were \$200,000. On a list of 18 companies it was Number 14. It

was doing better than Detrola, Farnsworth and Sparks Withington and tied with Wells-Gardner. Then the company moved again in September of 1943 to 325 N. Hoyne Ave., Chicago, Illinois.

I came across a 78 rpm record put out by the Velvetones in 1946-1947 that was released on the Sonora label, shown in Figure 2. The label reads, "The Sonora Radio and Television Corporation." The songs are, "It Just ain't Right" and "Reverse the Charges."

Another point of interest here is that if you have a Sears Silvertone radio with the first three numbers of the chassis as #135, that means your radio was made by Sonora.

THE FRENCH CONNECTION

In 1923, Sonora phonographs were being sold in two stores in France. The stores, both in Paris, were called "The Innovation" and "Champ."

I found a picture of a Sonora radio factory located at 5 Rue de la Mairie, Paris, France. Actually it was located in a prosperous suburb of Paris called Puteaux. There is a sign in front of

> the plant that says "L'Amerique Guarantie avec un Sonora Radio" — you are guaranteed to hear American stations on a Sonora radio. See Figure 3.

> In 1932, the American Sonora Company exported cathedral-style radios to France. A typical radio is shown in Figure 4. Figure 5 shows a French advertisement for Sonora.

> In the same year, after about a year or so of gearing up for production, the French (Continued on following page)

Sonora Company, (Sonora SA France), started making a Model F1, the "Puissant," for the French market. This set Is shown in Flgure 6. Sonora became an important and popular brand in France, and the French company never exported any of its radios to the United States.

There is a new French Sonora website that has all kinds of information, including a lot of color photos of French Sonora radios — www.radiosonora.com/index.php. The owner of the site is Mr. Philippe Delmotte.who has been very helpful and has given me permission to use whatever information from his site that I need.

THE CANADIAN CONNECTION

Sonora also did business in Canada. The company called the Sonora Corporation of Canada Ltd. had two addresses: in 1924, the address was in Bridgeburg, Ontario; in 1931, it was 79-181 King Street West, Toronto, Ontario. The company made only 15 models, and In 1932, due to the Depression, moved back to the U. S.

I have talked to Lloyd Swackhammer, author of the book *Radios of Canada*, who has been very helpful in my Sonora research. Looking for the Canadian Sonora models listed in the schematic books of the Radio College of Canada, Mr. Swackhammer found the following Information on Sonora radios made for the years 1929-1933.

1929-30	A 40, A 44, 31, 33
1930-31	36, 36A & C38
1931-32	D50, D70
1932-33	S7, S10, S12,
	8AW, D90

The D90 was also identified as a chassis, and used in the Frasser and Cartier models of Sonora Radios. The 1930-31 Sonora Models C34 and C35 were made for Sonora by the Stewart-Warner Speedometer Corporation of Belleville Ontario, which changed its name in 1931 to the Stewart-Warner Alemite Corp. Ltd., and continued in business for many years.

SONORA MODEL WAU-243

The Sonora set that piqued my interest in the company is my Model WAU-243, shown In Flgure 7 and 8. My sales catalog has very good descriptions of Sonora sets. Here is what it says about the Model WAU-243:

"Sonora's special knack for quality and heads-up creative styling is dramatized in this peer-(Continued on page 12)

less plastic model. You will take a keenest pride of possession in the rare beauty of this original Sonora design. You'll get a listening-lift and everlasting pleasure from that famous "Clear as a Bell" tone. And you'll marvel at the tuning ease of this sensitive performer, whether you bring in your favorite stations by automatic push button, or by fingertip touch of the smooth glant rotor dial. Finally, you'll be pleased as punch with the sensible price of this refreshingly different Sonora."

The Model WAU-243 is an AC-DC superhet ivory plastic table model that sold for \$29,75. It tunes the complete standard broadcast band from 535 to 1720 KC, plus police calls. It has push-

button tuning for four favorite stations; a built-in "Sonorascope" loop antenna, so that no aerial or ground is needed; a 5-inch dynamic speaker; and an automatic volume control. It is Underwriters approved.

The streamlined, ivory plastic, molded cabinet has a giant maroon rotor dial and a graceful louvered grille. The dimensions are 11.4" x 6.75" x 6.4". The tube complement is one each of the following: 12SA7, 12SK7, 12SQ7, 35L6, and 35Z5. The shipping weight is nine pounds.

SONORA TUBES

Sonora was also putting its name on radio tubes. I found an address for the Sonora Tube Company located at 220 South State Street, Chicago, Illinois. I have come across pictures of blue Arcturus tubes with the Sonora name engraved into the base. According to George H. Fathauer at tubes@qwest.net, Sonora, along with other tube types, had a series of 15V filament tubes that were unique to Sonora radios. They came in boxes printed "Sonora A-C Tubes made especially for Sonora Radio sets." Developed by Arcturus, the tube used a carbon rod for the heater. It had a long thermal time constant allowing operation on AC. Some of the tube numbers were RA-1 and RE-1.

When Sonora Radio and Television Corp went bankrupt in 1929/1930, they owed the Arcturus Tube Company \$18,458.

Looking over all of this history, it seems that Sonora Corporation had a rough existence moving In and out of receivership a number of times, fighting receiverships, having to sell off assets to make others happy, bankruptcies, big shots stealing money. Finally, on January 1, 1957, the State of Illinois decreed the Sonora Radio & Phonograph Corporation bankrupt again and for the last time. Then on December 23, 1958 a decree - Number 164184 - was issued by the State of Illinois dissolving the corporation

RESTORATION TOPICS

Sears Silvertone 8052

BY DON WATSON

Another flea market find for Don Watson offers the opportunity for a satisfactory restoration project. But as always, questions arise which some reader may be able to answer. (Editor)

Part of the enjoyment of the radio collecting hobby is pursuing the next restoration project or parts required for it. My wife and I like to attend as many flea markets as possible during the summer months, and many times we come home with nothing more than tired feet. We are always looking to give new life to an old radio, and we found this one at the flea market in Elkhorn, Wisconsin.

Half the fun is negotiating a price, something you can't do

online. After the trip home from the flea market with a set, the next phase is disassembling it to see just what you have purchased. This is where it gets very interesting. For example, on a previous occasion, I brought home a small Bakelite radio and upon removing the chassis, I found that it had been home to thousands of bugs. Where had this radio spent its working life?

THE SILVERTONE 8052

The Silvertone, shown in Figure 1, was a pleasant surprise, considering that I had no idea of what I had purchased. Still, I could see that it had a lot of potential.

The radio is a 6-tube AC/DC set using loctal tubes typical of the era. The cabinet has a walnut veneer on top and sides and what appears to be burled walnut on the front. The secondary wood appears to be poplar. The cabinet was refinished in satin polyurethane, and these hardwoods are elegant. My restoration goal was to bring it back to the same working order and appearance that it had the day it was brought home from the Sears Roebuck store.

The controls are volume, power, tone, and tuning, with four push buttons. The chassis uses a 3-gang tuning capacitor for a true tuned RF stage, and it has provisions for an external antenna. The speaker is a 5-inch PM mounted on a baffle board. The output transformer is tapped and is used as a hum-bucking coil. I replaced all the paper capacitors; however, the electrolytic

is an FP type can that is still good.

There was one problem: After playing for a few minutes the radio would go silent. The only capacitor I didn't change was a mica that was leaky and loaded down the first audio stage. After I replaced the leaky mica, everything worked fine. The push-button assembly is very well engineered and has a backlash adjustment.

Here is where the history trail starts to run cold. This radio was manufactured in 1949 and the chassis is Number 101.808. The same chassis with few changes was used in the Model 7054, which Rider dates to pre-March of 1942. *Radio Daze* dates the Model 7054 to 1947

Rider makes reference to the Models 8052 and 7054 in Volume XVIII. Perhaps some A.R.C. readers can unravel the mystery. Could this chassis have been produced prior to World War II and reintroduced after the war in a different cabinet? This radio has the quality that faded away in succeeding years.

AUCTION REPORT

Dale Putt Auction — Robert Winter Collection Blue Ball, Pennsylvania — July 1, 2006

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

This was a rather unusual radio auction, not the massive Estes style affair and not having a great many high-end radios. What it did have was a large collection of microphones, a lot of phonograph records, many post-World War II radios, and a lot of paper goods. This was the collection of Robert Winter of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, who was a World War II net radio operator and a professional musician.

Blue Ball, Pennsylvania, Is located in the heart of Pennsylvania Dutch country and this was a typical country auction held in the local firehouse. There was neither a buyers' premium nor a state sales tax at this sale since It was a single owner's sale. The sale was also an opportunity for new collectors or flea market dealers to obtain goods at very reasonable prices.

Approximately 334 lots were sold for a total sale price of about \$9,500. Although the average price per lot was \$28.50, nearly half the lots sold for \$10 or less and fully one-third sold for \$5 or less. While many of the radlos were not in the highly collectlble category, they were generally in decent shape and would make a good starting point for a fledging collector.

On the other hand, the microphone collectors made their presence known, and many of the microphones were sold in the \$100 or more range, as were some of the more collectible or older radios. One could also witness the decline of the collectibility of phonograph records by the minimum prices realized. Certainly the continuing technical advances in music storage have made the need to collect phonograph records a declining hobby. The auction started at 9:10 A.M. and was completed at 12:45 P.M.

Although many items are included without model numbers to give a sense of the event, many other low cost items and items in poor condition or nonspecific descriptions are omlited. Also not included in the listing are several parts lots of knobs, cords, capacitors, etc., which sold for \$1 to \$22 per lot, and over a dozen tube lots of all types, of up to 100 tubes per lot, which sold for \$3 to \$55 per lot.







Parzow Auction — Kemp Collection Frederick, Maryland — December 16, 2006

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

This was a very large general auction just before Christmas that also happened to contain a collection of radios from Lee Kemp of Frederick, Maryland. Toy motors, steam engine parts, and telegraph equipment were also included. The venue was the Frederick, Maryland, Fairgrounds Building. It is fairly common to have large-scale auctions just before Christmas when people are supposedly in a "buying mood." Fortunately, the radios, etc., here were sold first thing, so one did not have to wait all day for them to come up.

The auction started at 9:00 A.M. and probably continued well into the evening, as there was that much to sell. The radio, telegraph, and toy motors were dealt with in the first 20 minutes or so.

There were quite a few desirable collector items in this auc-

tion, and some of them were sold to "left bids" bids that are left with the auctioneer when the bidder cannot attend in person. While most auctions are advertised as "with no reserves," the left bid is sometimes a disguised reserve that the consignor decides is the minimum that he will sell the item for. In that case, the item returns to the seller.

I have no idea if that was the case here, but, since there was no viewing or inspection prior to the morning of the auction, one can only specu-


late. However, most of the desirable radios were type-listed in the preauction advertising, so perhaps someone left bids without examining the merchandise.

The magazines were not grouped with like titles or age and were rather haphazardly presented. Many were not in good condition, although there were some desirable selections among them. Some of the telegraph items were grouped and sold "by the piece, take them all," so you had to take four sounders even if you only wanted to bid on one.

Auctioneers have some conventions that may or may not be applicable to specialty items. The lesson here is to deal with an auctioneer who has knowledge of the merchandise that you are planning to sell and is familiar with the type of buyers who are apt to be interested in those items.

Not included in the listing below were several vacuum tube lots which sold for \$5 to \$65 per flat. I have included the listing of toy motors etc., in case they may be of interest. A 10 percent buyers' premium was charged at this auction.



Estes Auctions Seville, Ohio – September 30, 2006

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

This auction at the end of September was held in the Estes auction barn in Seville, Ohio, and was sort of a clean out auction to deal with an accumulation of moderate quality radios. It really was an old-fashioned barn sale, as the facilities at Seville are quite primitive. It is an old barn with a dirt floor and old church pews arranged in a tiered fashion. RIchard Estes planned a similar sale a few weeks later, but I could not attend that one.

On first viewing, it looked like all the world's "3dialers" were assembled here, but there were some better items mixed in as well. There was a large selection of vintage TVs, some good, some not so good, along with many magazines, miscellaneous paper and tubes.

As usual at this site there was an outside sale of box lots and lesser quality items on Saturday morning at 8:00 A.M., prior to the main sale.

The weather on Friday evening was cold and damp with spotting rain. The outside area was loaded with about 15 tables where stuff was piled on and under the tables and then covered with the ubiquitous blue tarps. In between rain showers, one could peek under the tarps to see what goodies were hidden there. The weather was not promising for Saturday so a dreary weekend was in the offing.

True enough, Saturday was cold with intermittent light showers. A "salamander" portable space heater was used in the barn to raise the inside temperature. It was helpful, but then had to turned off during the auction due to the noise it generated. During the latter part of the day, the barn

became quite cool.

Outside, at 8:00 A.M. the rain was fairly strong but eased off by 8:30, so the outside crew gathered, and the auction commenced at about 8:45. The modus operandi was to uncover one table at a time and sell off the goods as fast as possible while the rain was light or intermittent. In addition to the auctioneer (one of Richard's staff of licensed auctioneers), the clerk, and several handlers, one worker was detailed to hold an umbrella above the clerk so her tally sheets would stay dry. The rest of the crew and all the prospective buyers had to tough it out with whatever protection they came with.

This was a typical "walk-around" auction where you have to be nimble to stay positioned in the crowd in order to see what is going on. You also must be ready to move quickly out of the way any goods that you buy while trying to keep pace with the next lots coming up. You end up staking out a spot of real estate where you can assemble your pile of purchases pending later removal to your vehicle. Not for the faint-of-heart, especially in bad weather.

There was a horde of goods, many sold in large batches and many sales logged at \$1 or \$2. An occasional goodie would get up into the two or even three figures. It was a lot of fun in a macabre way, and many trucks and car trunks were stuffed with flea market goods. It took until 10:10 A.M. to finish off the outside sale, and after a short break, we retired to the warmed up barn to participate in the main auction.

In the beginning there was a good crowd of buyers in the barn, as there were some better items in this sale. But, by 3:00 P.M., the crowd had thinned considerably, and by 4:30 only the hardiest remained. The weather stayed grim all day with some rain continuing and the barn was getting quite chilly. At one point many of the tube box lots, which I did not record, were gathered at the side and auctioned off separately.

After 3:00 P.M., I did not record many lots, as most were selling for \$5 or less; therefore, the total of the 483 lots that I did record is probably short by 100 to 200 lots. At 4:30, the audience was invited to choose what of the remaining items they wanted put up for auction. Anything left unsold would be carried over to the next barn sale.

I left at about 4:45 P.M., at which time the auction was essentially over. Unfortunately, as happens at many of these auctions, I occasionally miss the sale of an item, and this time I could not find in my notes the record of a nice RCA TV on a stand that I had photographed. Overall, the 483 lots I did record totaled up to a bit over \$25,000.

As indicated earlier, this was not a high-end sale as only one item sold for over \$1,000 — an Atwater Kent breadboard for \$1,700. There were only 47 sales that drew bids of \$100 or more. Yet there were some good items here and if you were willing to brave the weather and the chilly temperature, there were many bargains to be had. As usual, there were many tubes organized and han-
