

#### **EDITOR'S COMMENTS**

One of the enduring pleasures of being a vintage radio collector is that we're part of an era in which a ceaseless effort to improve communication has been a goal for the industry. Each decade of the last century brought new theories, new improvements in order to make a better product — yes, for profit, but also for better communication. For example, when radio challenged newspapers as the primary daily communicator of news in the early 20th century, it was not long before attempts were made to bridge the gap between the two.

In our lead article, Michael Banks takes us to the mid-1930s when William G.H. Finch and others began to put the concept of printed news transmitted by radio into production. Radio FAX seemed a good business bet because almost everyone had a radio, despite the hard times of the Depression.

However, the listener also had to buy a printer and maybe a timer, if he wanted the printer to go on at appropriate times. Money was tight, sales were slow, and the product was short-lived. Furthermore, by 1940, television, the next big communicator, challenged radio for consumer attention.

Today FAX is still with us, though not by radio, and the Internet is challenging nearly every aspect of communication. Still, hard copy newspapers, television, and radio endure, we're happy to report.

Another example of an attempt to both capitalize and improve on the use of radio sets also came in the 1930s. John Eckland's article on the Magnavox Company describes the inclusion of phonographs to enhance Magnavox radios. Advancing technology to improve the fidelity of speakers naturally followed, and so we moved on into an era of producing better sound systems. Better audio means better communication.

During these years of rapid change in the radio industry, no name was any more prominent than Crosley. In this issue, Dave Crocker, our resident Crosley expert, reviews the bestseller book on the Crosley Company and the brothers who built it. An interesting aside is that the book is co-authored by Michael Banks who also wrote our lead article on Radio FAX. It must be an excep-

Open it because it might contain a treasure waiting to be rescued, or, as in this case, a story waiting to be told. You never know.

Many times we never do know what we have found. Let's hope that won't prove true for Tom Stevens who seeks information about his JARS variable condenser. Because of Tom's fine photos, we can see that it looks like a well manufactured radio component. If someone out there has a clue about a company named JARS, we would like to do our usual thing — be a communicator of information.

Ray Chase helps us to do just that all the time with his reports on Estes Auctions, which sometimes unearth rare items and which always tell us something about market prices. This February auction contained no high-end, super rare items, but offered a good broad selection of both early and late sets. Total proceeds were over \$50,000.

One area did stand out — the many unusually well-made home brews, a couple of which brought over \$100. It was also unusual for a piece of test equipment, a Model 39C tube tester, to be the third highest selling item at \$850. In all, this was another Estes good show.

## WITH THE COLLECTORS

## Radio and Newspapers in the 1930s "Just the FAX. Ma'am"

In the 1930s attempts were made to commercialize the transmission of text and photographic material by radio facsimile. In this article, Michael Banks covers the Finch facsimile system and the major players in radio facsimile. (Editor)

The Great Depression, with its bank failures, widespread unemployment, and bread lines was a grim period. Business, industry, and the economy shuddered to a halt, along with most people's hopes for the future.

But not everything was stagnant. The march of science and technology continued unabated. Indeed, technology seemed to be the only thing that held any promise for the future. As the decade progressed, electricity was extended into rural areas. Automobiles became faster, safer, and more luxurious. Aviation records were broken as quickly as they were set. Advances in medicine, entertainment, and labor-saving appliances were announced almost daily, and two world's fairs showcased the marvels of technology to come.

Most of these modern marvels were not available to every citizen, but one aspect of technology touched almost everyone — radio. Even people without electricity or telephone service had radios. Music, news, speeches, and plays had most of North America gathered around their Philco. Emerson, and Crosley sets every evening.

As the growth industry of the 1930s, radio was the focus of many experiments and improvements. More powerful transmitters were built, and more reliable receivers poured from the factories. Radio was broadcast from airplanes. Deco style came to both radio and phonograph cabinets. Radios were even showing up in new cars.

Almost anything seemed possible. Anything, that is, but combining radio with newspapers. Radio was the newspaper's worst enemy. It competed for advertising dollars, and lured people away from reading the news. (Why pay a nickel for a paper, when you could listen to the news for free?) The wire services that supplied newspapers with news and photos refused to allow broadcasters access to their services. The one news service that was formed to supply radio stations with news — the Transradio News Service—was the object of lawsuits by the conventional news services almost before it started business.

#### **RADIO FACSIMILE TRANSMISSION**

There were people who hoped to bridge the

gap between radio and newspapers, however. One was an engineer named William G.H. Finch. His company, Finch Telecommunications Laboratories, had developed a simple, low-cost system for transmitting and receiving facsimile (now known as FAX) by radio. He applied for his first

patent in 1935.

Surprisingly, radio facsimile was nothing new. The first radio facsimile system was patented in 1905, and its earliest application was transmitting weather maps and other data to ships at sea (a practice that continues today). By the early 1920s, news services were transmitting photos by radio facsimile (the first wire photos).

In theory, radio facsimile transmission was nothing more than substituting radio broadcast for telephone wires. But the reality was not that simple. Transmitters and receivers were complicated and temperamental, and usually required highly trained operators. Until Finch's system, radio facsimile equipment was just too complex

and costly for most commercial

applications.

Finch had three rivals: RCA. General Electric, and Western Electric, each a corporate giant that might have crushed him. But, as a 1937 article in Business Week put it, the Finch system was "... the first to come out of the laboratory and into family parlors."

By the end of 1937, Finch had sold three U.S. radio stations on testing his "radio printer" system: WGH in Newport News, Virginia; WHO in Des Moines, Iowa; and KSTP of St. Paul, Minnesota. The broadcasters received FCC permission to transmit radio facsimile signals in September, 1937, and the first transmissions of radioprinted news were made the week of October 15, 1937, in the Minneapolis/St. Paul area. By November, the Iowa and Virginia stations were also broadcasting newspapers.

#### A TYPICAL FAX UNIT

The typical radio facsimile unit resembled a large radio or phonograph cabinet, with the radio receiver and printer housed as one unit within. One example of the receiver/printer equipment was Crosley's high fidelity 2-band radio, Reado printer, and timer, shown in Figures 1, 2, and 3.




Figure 4. This printout is an example of information transmitted by radio facsimile.

The system printed the news on a 5-inch wide strip of heat-sensitive paper similar to that used by 1970s printing calculators and FAX machines. The chemical treatment that made the paper heatsensitive gave the paper a gray or green tint. Text and images were printed in black or dark gray in two columns. Photos and half-tone artwork didn't come through as well as in regular newspapers. but line art reproduced nicely. A typical printout is shown in Figure 4.

#### STATION PARTICIPATION

Participating broadcasters underwrote the entire effort as an experiment. Each radio station placed 50 receiving sets in its broadcast area at a cost of \$125 apiece, an investment of more than \$6,000 — nearly \$200,000 today. And that didn't include scanning equipment and transmitter hookups. But broadcasters were optimistic, figuring revenue from advertising and subscriptions would justify the cost.

There were a few technical problems, the main one being static. As it turned out, facsimile broadcasts were not as "tolerant" of static as voice broadcasts. A burst of static lasting no more than a fraction of a second could wipe out several pages of a broadcast. However, engineers were confident the problem could be solved.

The opportunity of sending and receiving Q.S.L. cards, photos, wiring diagrams and printed messages by radio opens a new field of interest to the amateur from which he will not only receive new thrills but will find himself contributing many new ideas and developments to improve this new art, just as he did in the earlier days of voice transmission.

By March of 1938, the Mutual Network stations (WOR in New York, WLW in Cincinnati, and WGN in Chicago) were conducting experiments with Finch equipment. Before long their owners signed on to the program. WHK in Cleveland, Nashville's WSM, and Califomia radio stations KMJ and KFBK of Fresno and Sacramento, soon followed.

The FCC permitted stations to broadcast printed news between midnight and 6:00 A.M. At the time, radio stations routinely ended their broadcasts and signed off the air at 11:00 P.M. or midnight, so the time slot was ideal for delivering printed news before most people awoke.

Once the receiving sets were in place, the cost to consumers was nominal. Rolls of heat-sensitive paper cost a dollar each, and the estimated cost of the paper used in a week would be tencents. (Paper consumption was projected to be about five feet per hour of transmission.) The cost of electrical usage in the average home would be increased by only 20 cents per week.

Most stations worked with local newspapers to provide the "radio printed" news. (The exceptions were WHO and WGN, which used Transradio News Service as their news source.) Advertising sales would of course generate profits for all.

#### RCA AND CROSLEY JOIN THE CROWD

As enthusiasm grew, two radio manufacturers moved in for a share. RCA had experimented with radio facsimile messaging several years earlier, and lost little time getting into the manufacture of radio facsimile receivers. Crosley Radio Corporation, which was heavily committed on the broadcast end through its ownership of WLW, went a step farther. Its owner, Powel Crosley, Jr. licensed the Finch patents and started building a

low-cost version of the Finch receiver.

This move by Crosley, whose inexpensive radio sets were in large part responsible for the immense popularity and growth of radio from 1921 on, was a huge vote of confidence for radio printed news. In industry circles, it was taken for granted that, if Powel Crosley, Jr., the man the press had dubbed "the Henry Ford of Radio," was involved in an endeavor, it had to be a sure thing. Even Macy's in New York carried Reado sets. Crosley was always pursuing new commercial applications. Figure 5 shows a Crosley advertisement that offers radio facsimile equipment to Amateur radio operators.

#### A DOOMED SERVICE

But, fate conspired against Crosley, Finch, RCA, and all the broadcasters who had invested so much in the radio facsimile system. Money was still tight in the late 1930s, and consumer response was less than overwhelming. This made advertisers leery of the new medium. Without strong advertiser support and subscriptions, the service was doomed. By 1940, radio facsimile newspaper delivery had ended.

The system might have been resurrected after World War II. By then, however, television was making its way into the nation's living rooms. Text and pictures by radio just couldn't compete with television's moving pictures and sound.

William Finch hadn't lost his confidence in FAX as a mass communications medium, however. Right after World War II, he devised a new approach to transmitting newspapers. He intended to FAX them over telephone lines into the homes of millions of paying Americans.

Interestingly, his business plan included local and regional versions of the facsimile newspapers, plus one "super-newspaper" for national consumption (Shades of USA Today)

That didn't go over, either. Television and radio were more convenient, and people apparently preferred their newspapers on newsprint. Finch's company went bankrupt in 1952. Fortunately, he was able to license some of this technology to RCA over the next few years.

There's little left of radio facsimile-printed newspapers today, save for the odd receiver/printer in a radio collection or antique shop. That's probably just as well. Even if radio delivery of newspapers hadn't been killed by television, it would never have survived the Internet

#### **JARS Variable Condenser**




Figure 1. The JARS variable condenser and its repair tag.

I recently obtained this old variable condenser, shown in Figures 1 and 2, and thought that other early radio collectors may be interested to see it. I know very little about the condenser other than what is on the unit itself and the repair tag.




Figure 3. A close-up shows the details of the record player, including the needle cups, speed control and audio controls.

The panel is engraved, as shown in Figure 3, and a tag is attached which says, "On His Majesty's Service, 18 June 1926, EES Dept., W/T Repair Section," possibly a British military depot tag.

The size and construction led me to believe that this condenser was already an old unit when it was repaired in 1926. The condenser face plate is 7" across, and 6" tall, and it is yery heavy.

I have never heard of the manufacturer "JARS" and a search of the internet did not turn up any information. Any information on this item, when it was made, what type of equipment it was in, etc., would be greatly appreciated.

#### WITH THE COLLECTORS

#### The Magnavox Company

BY JOHN ECKLAND

The following article follows the Magnavox Company largely from the 1930s through the 1950s. As he did in his earlier article on the Remler 88 (see A.R.C., May 2007) John Eckland draws our attention to early efforts to improve the fidelity of speakers, and in the case of Magnavox, to combine radios and phonographs in both table and console models. (Editor)

Magnavox, a company founded by Peter Jensen and Edwin S. Pridham in 1917, was the sole manufacturer of "moving coil" horn loudspeakers, which the two had invented. Located originally in Napa, and later in Oakland, California, the company made public address systems under the Magnavox "Telemegafone" name. These were manufactured from the late teens through the mid-1920s. Also manufactured in the Oakland plant in the 1920s were European-styled telephones, as well as portable electric heaters.

In the mid-1920s, Magnavox made radios, some of which contained the "workings" in a drawer. Circuits for these radios may be referenced in Rider's Volume I. Horns for radio made after 1920 were followed by paper cone loudspeakers. In fact, from the mid-1920s onward,

Magnavox made cone-type loudspeakers exclusively, with the main speaker manufacturing plant located in Chicago by 1930.

Somewhere around 1930 the company moved from Oakland, California, to Fort Wayne, Indiana. About the same time, it purchased the Mershon Condenser Co., a well-known manufacturer of quality electrolytic condensers.

In addition, Magnavox purchased the Electro-Acoustic Products Company, which became a subsidiary in the mid-1930s. This company made sales presentation phono/filmstrip projector units called "Illustravox." This product put Magnavox back into the consumer electronics business with the introduction of radios and phonographs for the 1936 year.

#### THE "CONCERTO"

Magnavox made a tabletop high fidelity phonograph called the "Concerto," shown in Figures 1 and 2. This set features a single-ended 2A3 amplifier, an Astatic B-2 crystal pickup in a straight tonearm assembly, plus a special 8-inch electrodynamic speaker with an aluminum voice coil. The 78 rpm turntable is a governor-controlled, adjustable speed General Industries Green-Flyer. Figure 3 shows a close-up of the turntable, tone arm, and controls.

At the time, there was nothing else on the market that could compare to the performance of this phonograph. Later on, two competitors pro-

duced a phonograph of similar performance — the RCA R-98 and the Ansley Dynaphone. Both manufacturers used amplifiers employing a pair of push-pull Type 2A3 tubes.

#### THE "SYMPHONY"

Also for the 1936 year, Magnavox made a floor-standing console phonograph called the "Symphony," as shown in Figure 4. It uses the same turntable and arm as the "Concerto"; however, it was available also with a record-changer as an option.

The amplifier uses a 25-watt, beam power, a push-pull Type 6L6 amp, and an interstage transformer with a Type 6C5 driver tube.

The speaker system is unusual in that it uses a pair of 12-inch, vertically arranged (one above the other), electro-dynamic speakers, voice-coils hooked in parallel. The upper treble speaker uses a hard grey paper cone, while the lower speaker uses a softer black paper cone more suitable for lower frequencies. The speaker compartment is, as is usual with Magnavox sets, open-backed.

Both the Concerto and Symphony cabinets are streamlined, Art Deco "radio" types of furniture. Capehart was a high-end radio-phonograph manufacturer in Fort Wayne also, and its conservative cabinet designs may possibly have rubbed off on Magnavox's later cabinet designs. Teamed up with Drexel, Magnavox took on the styles of traditional furniture design, such as Duncan Phyfe and others.

The various record changers used over the years include mechanisms made by General Industries, Garrard, Webster Corporation and Collaro of England. The Magnavox/Collaro relationship lasted many years.

The quality of the radio and amp ifier chassis is very good. Parts are well spreac out over the foundation. Large high-"Q" coils are used and component quality is very good. The mechanical design of the tuner is simple and durable — no

belts to break, and dial cord, if used, is laid out simply for expedient restringing. Usually, direct drive is employed with a planetary drive, coupled with a large, ergonomically correct tuning knob

From 1936 to 1959 Magnavox continued to use the twin 12-inch loudspeaker complement as on the original Symphony model. The most commonly used output tubes in Maganvox sets were Types 6V6 and 6L6. They were often used n push-pull parallel.

The first FM tuner introduced in 1941 by Magnavox was the CR-158. It tuned from approximately 42 to 50 megacycles.

#### THE WINDSOR IMPERIAL

The top-of-the-line Magnavox was the Windsor Imperial. It was manufactured from the late 1930s to the early 1950s. This model featured Drexel cabinetry, and in later iterations, a fully divided high fidelity speaker system. Stephens Tru-Sonic of Culver City, California, provided the 8-cell horn tweeter. Magnavox provided a 15-inch woofer, and the crossover frequency is 800 cycles. The Stephens tweeter was supplied with either a field coil or an Alnico magnet in later production Windsors.

The first record changer used was a Webster 78 rpm model, followed by a 2-speed model, and finally, a 3-speed changer in the last of the Windsors. As an option, some of the Websters are fitted with plug-in headshells to accommodate standard groove and microgroove records. Also available were GE reluctance-type magnetic cartridges to fit into these headshells.

FM tuners were usually in operation in earlier Windsors; however, they became integrated with AM and shortwave tuner in last production runs of the set in the late 1940s.

The cabinet of the Windsor is nice in that it will accommodate a large number of record albums. In 1948, an upper unit was available that would provide further storage room. It also had room to (Continued on following page)

(Magnavox, continued) accommodate the new Magnavox 10-inch television sets.

#### **MOUNTING TUNERS AND AMPLIFIERS**

The mounting of Magnavox tuners and amplifiers was facilitated in some cases through the use of a novel "shock-mounted" sled arrangement. Unplugging the cables and removing just two screws allows the tuner to be extracted in short order for service. Another nice feature is that the tuner faceplate and knobs are integral to same, allowing for expedient removal.

The brilliant mechanical engineers responsible for this good design must have left the company, for, after 1950, the tuner was a nuisance to remove from the cabinet. Many screws holding the back have to be removed just to gain entry to the rear of the set. Underwriters Laboratory may have had something to do with this change of design. Also, due to the fixed faceplate, the knobs have to be removed before the tuner can be extracted.

Magnavox used a push-button sweep dial of novel mechanical design throughout the 1940s. This was an excellent and reliable design, given its moderate degree of complexity.

#### THE CONCERT GRAND

Finally, the last top-of-the-line combo from Magnavox would have to be the Concert Grand, popular from the early to late 1950s in various iterations, finally ending up as a stereo model in 1959. Originally selling for \$800, it uses the Brit-

ish Collaro record changer or optional Collaro manual turntable, both with plug-in headshells to accommodate standard and microgroove records.

The Concert Grand also features bi-amplification with push-pull, parallel 6V6 tubes — six for the 30-watt bass channel and two for the treble channel (10 watts). The silver Hammerite painted amplifier with eight Type 6V6 tubes looks impressive.

The speaker complement features a 15-inch woofer, a 12-inch mid-range speaker and two Jensen horn tweeters. Except for the perforated masonite back, the speaker cabinet is essentially "open-backed."

## BOOK REVIEW

#### Crosley – Two Brothers and a Business Empire that Transformed the Nation By Rusty McClure with David Stern and Michael A. Banks

When A.R.C. asked me to review this book, I was at first a little reluctant, because I've been a Crosley collector for over 30 years, and thought I knew everything about Powel and the company. Was I wrong! I started reading and quickly turning the page, but after a while, I couldn't put the book down. Now I can say I really know the Crosley story.


The book tells in detail the story of Powel Crosley and his brother Lewis, from birth to death. You can't appreciate the closeness these two had and what they accomplished together until you read this book. "Powel dreamt it; Lewis made it happen" — this is the theme the book keeps repeating.

They truly were a team, a team that would endure for over 50 years. And what things they accomplished! Crosley radios (of course), "Shelvador" refrigerators, "icyBall" coolers, hair restorers, facsimile machines, safety tires, soft drink coolers, air conditioners, phonographs, radio broadcasting, cameras, flashlights, night baseball, baby strollers, TVs, airplanes, ironers, washing machines, exercisers, generators — the list goes on and on. If it was marketable, Crosley sold it.

This book is more than just products, for if you really want to get the feeling of how it was back then, when the invention of radio hit the market, this book will make you feel as if you were there. Step-bystep, you witness radios introduction, its total acceptance by the public, and its good days and bad.

Not that it's all silver lining, for you become aware of the awful tragedies, bad luck and misfortunes of the Crosley family. There was a succession of premature family deaths, along with unhappy marriages and divorces. I personally knew the other Lewis Crosley, Powel's grandson, and got firsthand some of the family setbacks. It seems that with all the riches that success brought, the Crosley family had to deal with much unhappiness and disappointment.

Many of the new products that Crosley marketed became dismal flops. In this book, you'll see how World War I was a setback for Powel, even though he was involved in wartime production. The scarcity of manpower and material for manufacture was a



constant problem. Even radio production was halted, and that was Crosley's main product.

Times were changing, and Crosley had to keep up. While Powel was eager to sink money into something new, Lewis, the guy who was responsible for producing it, was an unhappy partner. Lewis's dream had always been to be a gentleman farmer, a dream that was kept at bay because of the demands of his responsibilities for factory production.

Let us not forget that Powel's first love was the automobile. While Powel had early ventures into auto marketing and production, all of which failed, he always kept the dream alive. Someday he would make that dream come

true, and, in fact, he eventually came out with a tiny Crosley car. The book gives every detail about why the car was so successful at first and why it died

Read this book, and you too, will understand what really happened to Crosley in the many chapters of its history. Read this book and you'll have trouble putting it down.

I like pictures. My only wish is that the authors had included more pictures of the Crosley products, as there were so many unique ones. Some products are mentioned by name only, and I think more pictures would have helped. Otherwise, the book is a "Must Have" in your library.

#### The Knight Capacitor Checker Affaire

You never know what you are bringing home when you go hunting for vintage radios. Inside the hulks of old radios I have discovered hornets' nests, all manner of insects and tiny crawling creatures. A few years back I bought a home-brew, two-tube battery set at an auction, full of shredded paper that mice had dragged in through the battery cable. When I returned home and had time to remove the nest. I discovered that the mouse was still in it - alive! My wife Karen wasn't too pleased. She wondered, "What if there were two mice in there, and one is now loose in the house?"

Some of you know that I am primarily interested in preserving pre-1920 wireless and early 1920s battery sets. But I'm also an audiophile of sorts.

While restoring an amplifier a few weeks ago, I needed to test some capacitors. I have an old Knight capacitor checker, shown in Figure 1, that I purchased several years earlier from the estate of another radio collector. It had always worked fine, but this time it went on the fritz.




Figure 2. The Knight capacitor checker reveals its surprising contents.

I opened it up to see what had gone wrong. After removing the 10 screws that hold the Knight-case together, I discovered a brittle, yellowed envelope inside, shown in Figure 2. What in the world was this? My first hope was that the envelope might hold money, or maybe war bonds, hidden long ago. War bonds should be worth a lot now, I thought, and mentally began spending my newfound wealth as I ripped open the envelope.

newfound wealth as I ripped open the envelope. No money. Instead I found a dozen love letters. An excerpt of one letter appears in the box above.

Since we weren't going to be wealthy, I set the letters aside thinking that Karen and I would read

Well, my dearest, you probably won't get a letter in Rio either, but I shall make an effort. I was sure I wouldn't have time to reach you on your first stop and sure I'd have plenty of time for the second stop, but the time flew. We got all involved with carnival parades and parties... It has turned warm and spring-like and flowers are popping out everywhere...

I had a visit with Jane one day and on the way home drove around looking at "rooms for rent" signs and wondering if I could possibly do what we planned ... I don't think I can actually do such a thing because it also is such an "arrangement." It seems a heavy, cumbersome - gives me the feeling of wading in soft - sort of unclean and dangerous. Are we to be always given only "moments"? As I recall them, they are like shining butterflies, "bright spangles on the meadows," little bits of life given to us instead of laboriously planned de-ceptions. Am I wrong? Would I be smarter to do the other thing we talked about? Since your letter came I think you agree with the way I feel about it, and yet, I do not want people to be looking askance at your car parked here at odd times either. Well, if I can only look at you and maybe touch you now and then, maybe help you do some sort of work at your house, just be near you sometimes, always with the hope, of course, that some little merging moment may come to us, will this be a better way? them after supper. We'd try to figure out what led someone to go to the trouble of squirreling them away inside a capacitor checker.

#### THE CONTENTS

That evening, we sat on the sofa with the letters between us and Karen began to read aloud. Before she finished the first two paragraphs, a picture began to emerge. Clearly the writer was a woman, educated and articulate, who was having an affair with a married man. All of the letters are beautifully written: some of them are very intimate.

We assume it was the woman's married lover who hid her letters in the capacitor checker. After his death, the Knight would have been sold with his estate, perhaps passing through

many hands before coming into our possession.

The writer of the letters was very circumspect and avoided any identifying information. There are no salutations or good-byes; a horizontal line substitutes for the names of her beloved and most others. Only a few out-of-towners are mentioned by their given names.

Even so, it appears that our writer's paramour worked on a merchant ship (or ships) that traveled widely in the western hemisphere — possibly he was a captain or at least someone of high rank, as she makes reference to their station in life. A mention of air raids and descriptions of automobiles suggest that the letters were written during or soon after World War II.

Reading between the lines, we guess that the two lead characters were in their forties and that the writer lived somewhere in or around New Orleans. There are no dates on the letters, so it took some time to arrange them in (approximate)

order. Karen and I always love a good mystery, and this proved to be good fun.

What appears to be the final letter is filled with sadness. As in many a good drama, the couple has been discovered. The woman has a lump in her breast and is dreading surgery, wondering if she will survive the operation, apprehensive about that ominous lump. The signs do not sound good, and since her other letters revealed no alarmist tendencies, we surmise she did not survive. Certainly she wrote no further letters that were saved in the same fashion as the others.

#### **END OF STORY**

We imagine the recipient opening the capacitor checker from time to time to return to his memories. Decades later, the letters found their way to us. If the capacitor checker hadn't broken down, we would know nothing of their existence.

The Knight is working again,

the amplifier is repaired, but the story that emerged from the letters still haunts us.

The quest for vintage radios has taken me to places all over the world where I never would have gone. It has enriched my life with wonderful friendships. It has led to interesting, humorous, poignant, and just p ain weird experiences.

I love the stories that accompany many of my radios; they give them character, history, and meaning. The discovery of these letters from a secret love affair, painstakingly hidden inside a capacitor checker for so many years, adds yet another rich dimension to the old radios that we preserve.

#### AUCTION REPORT

#### Estes Auctions Burbank, Ohio — February 10, 2007

The week of February 10. 2007, turned out to be in the midst of a spell of bitter cold weather. The nights were down to zero or 10° above and the temperature during the day did not get above freezing. When we got up on Saturday morning, the outside temperature was 4° above zero, and those concrete floors at the Expo Auction Center in Burbank were darn cold. But radio people are a hardy lot, and a fair crowd showed up for this month's auction. Fortunately, Estes has ceased using his barn for radio auctions and will hold all future auctions at the Expo Center where there are a few more creature comforts.

This auction featured consignments from "Mr. Gustafson" of

Franklin, Pennsylvania, Robert Stone and Irene Fair, plus a "collection from Michigan."

There was a very good selection of Ham gear, lots of 3-dialers, many phonograph items and a very large supply of tubes. An IP-500 was included, but it turned out to be missing a few details and had been worked on internally. Still, it commanded a price of \$1,000 even though the market seems to be getting soft for some of these early wireless items, especially the ones that

show up more regularly.

Among some very good tube testers, a Hickok 539C drew a price of \$850, while a very nice Hickok Cardmatic 123K went for only \$175. Otherwise, the usual rows of tables displayed nice wood AC radios, two rows of consoles, some nice crystal sets. (mostly home brew), a table of transistor novelties and several racks of paper goods. The paper, novelties, and bulk tube lots, as well as miscellaneous parts, test equipment and box lots, were handled in side auctions that I could not cover.


A side auction of low value items had started at 9 A.M. and concluded by 9:40 A.M. This side auction will now take the place

of the preauctions that Richard Estes used to conduct outside the barn in Seville. These are a lot of fun and produce many project sets or "strip-'emfor-parts" sets.

The main auction ran from 10 A.M. to about 4:30 P.M., although I quit recording at about 4:00 P.M. Without the space heater running, it was getting quite chilly inside and my fingers were becoming numb. I recorded 560 lots for a sale total of slightly over \$45,000, but probably over

\$50,000 would be more accurate if the side auctions, plus lots I missed, were added. The recorded prices do not include the 5 percent buyer's premium at this site.

Richard Estes noted that he has quite a few estate cleanouts scheduled, so the auction schedule will be full for the rest of the year.




This rear view shows the unusual 3-tube, home-brew, battery set that is housed in a glass case. It brought \$125 in the auction.
