EDITOR'S COMMENTS

"It was a privilege to be there." So says our intrepid reporter Ray Chase about the Estes auction of April 2007, and it's not hard to see why. First, it totalled over \$300,000, a sum not wholly dependent on Art Deco items. Yes, the Sparton Nocturne, King Skycraper, and mirrored radios were all represented, but so were more traditional high-end sets, two of which sold for \$55,000 each. Second, the broad assortment of Catalins, plastics, AC, and battery sets, led me to conclude that just about everyone there must have had a sense of "privilege."

Perhaps this auction will also be a lasting memory for some attendees, just as the 1982 Orr auction has been for several people I have spoken with since my article appeared in the July 2007 issue. Jim Sargent and Robert Lozier both have written about their vivid memories of that auction, and Bob has added an article about a home brew purchased there. One is

tempted to quip, "Old auctions never die."

Luckily for us, Richard Arnold never says die when tracking down a radio or a company. In this case, he has come up with something new about Pooley, the name we associate with fine radio cabinets. Through a descendant of the Pooley family, Richard was able to borrow a brochure that touts Pooley radios, not just cabinets — another link in the chain of radio history.

The latest Slusser Collector's Guide to Antique Radios, Seventh Edition, contributes mightily to that history by keeping us apprised of the ever-changing market. Jim Moneghan's review is definitely positive, and no doubt most of us will join him in "using it until the cover comes off."

A bit of childhood history by Walter Lindenbach about acquiring a Heathkit Type OM-1 oscilloscope is a memory to which many of us can happily relate. Walter conveys his frustration when he built a coveted oscilloscope from a kit and found it didn't work. But then came the triumph of fixing the problem! And so, an inquisitive boy became an equally inquisitive engineer.

But, William Gourd's unhappy story of being scammed via the Internet is one that he hopes will never happen to anyone else. Hats off to William for being willing to share his "confession" in order to save others from a similar fate. Though we often print a scam warning on our "Editor's Page," William's very personal story may have a more meaningful effect.

Similar scams are so prevalent that a television commercial points to a website, fakechecks.org, which issues warnings about fraud involving checks.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Pooley Furniture Company and the Pooley Radio

BY RICHARD ARNOLD

We associate cabinet styles with the name Pooley; however, the fact that Pooley also produced a radio is not common knowledge. Once again Richard Amold delves into the history of an interesting company closely linked with radio. (Editor)

"Pooley radio cabinets and cabinet speakers are made by an organization which has devoted 43 years to the design and manufacture of the very highest grade furniture. Thousands of the finest homes, hotels and clubs in this country bear witness to the superlative art and craftsmanship of Pooley."

So says a 1926 Pooley sales pamphlet, restating the policy of a company that was to specialize in a line of work for which it had no peers.

James Barnum Pooley, who was born in Albany, Indiana, in 1855, founded the Pooley Furniture Company in 1892. He was joined in the business by two other family members, Edward Foster Pooley and Frank B. Pooley. Records from 1900 show that the company was located at 16th Street and Indiana Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. However, Pooley also made furniture in New York, and was famous for the Pooley furniture in the Oak Room of the Plaza Hotel in New York City.

While making beautiful furniture, the company was also busy making cabinets for various talking machine companies, including the Edison Amberola. They also made cabinets to a major extent for Victor and Keen-O-Phone.

ATWATER KENT AND POOLEY CABINETS

Pooley started making radio cabinets in 1924. These were the first exclusively designed cabinets of the radio Industry, according to the company.

Of course, we all know that in the 1920s and early 1930s Pooley and Atwater Kent teamed up to make some very interesting radio cabinet designs. Figures 1 shows an Atwater Kent Model 10 in a Pooley cabinet from John Terrey's collection. Figure 2 shows the decal on the drop-front of the cabinet, which is similar to the Model 1120-R-2, shown in Figure 3.

I have a 1926 Pooley advertising pamphlet that has the following glowing endorsement by Mr. A. Atwater Kent: "The Pooley Radio Cabinet is approved for Atwater Kent Radio because of the design and quality of Pooley cabinet work and because of the tone qualities of the built-in Pooley floating horn. Both meet the standards we set and maintain for Atwater Kent Receivers and Speakers."

In fact, A. Atwater Kent gave Pooley a free hand in the design of his cabinets. No member of the Atwater Kent organization was allowed to recom-

mend or even suggest any standards of design.

Those early cabinets gave an extra impetus to Atwater Kent Radio sales, and, in fact, to the entire radio industry. Radio suddenly blossomed into beautiful pieces of home furnishings. The company could claim that "The design, coloring and finish of Pooley radio cabinets and Pooley cabinet speakers are such that they can be set amidst the handsomest

booklet is a "Special Notice." It says that the Pooley company had recently received reports from a few owners of Pooley radio cabinets that they were at times troubled with a howling noise when using their sets. Pooley investigated and found that this was happening to all makes of radio cabinets and that it was due to the modern radio tube's greater sensitivity. A long explanation of how to correct the problem followed.

POOLEY'S GROWTH

By 1928, the Pooley Company was located at 1600-1672 Indiana Avenue in Philadelphia. It was doing so much business that it had expanded to cover a whole city block, as shown in Figure 4.

On April 29, 1929, Pooley issued the Dealer Bulletin No. 6 stating that more than 600,000 Poolev radio cabinets had been made. It also states that "New 1929/30 Atwater Kent Radio cabinets by Poolev are about to be announced. The Pooley Company, with 47 years of experience in design and manufacture of fine furniture, again justifies your confidence by continuing the policies which have helped to build your business in the past."

THE AMERICAN BOSCH MODEL 28

Atwater Kent was apparently not the only company that used the Pooley cabinets to house its radios. My 1928 American Bosch Model 28, shown in Figures 5 and 6, is installed in a 1928 Pooley Cabinet Model 7400 radio desk. See my article on this set in the October 1994 A.R.C. Figure 7 shows the Pooley Model 7400 cabinet from an advertising broadside.

Pooley's description of this cabinet says that it is similar to the Model 7300, but it features a "stretcher" underneath the cabinet that provides accommodation for any Atwater Kent speaker. (I've always wondered what that thing was called.) When I found my (Continued on following page)

and costliest furniture and not suffer by comparison, and yet, they may be placed in rooms of the most simple furnishing and not be unduly noticeable."

Pooley also had trained radio engineers who worked for them and were responsible for the design and manufacture of the electrical equipment which was built into their cabinets. These professionals were also responsible for testing the Atwater Kent radios when they were received at the Pooley factory and then again prior to leaving the factory as a finished product.

The fourth edition of the Pooley Instruction Booklet describes removing the Atwater Kent equipment from its carton and then removing the Pooley cabinet from its casing. Detailed assembly information is provided, including hookups for the batteries, antenna and ground.

One interesting item in the

radio, it did not have a speaker behind the stretcher, so I have installed an RCA 100A speaker, and it works fine.

The Pooley description of this cabinet continues: "Compartments for stationery, books, etc., make this model a complete and useful desk as well as an unusually handsome radio cabinet. Equipment includes inkwell and a large desk blotter."

The cabinet is made of carefully matched American walnut veneers, with satinwood and ebony inlays and Pooley's Standard American walnut duotone finish. All Pooley cabinets were finished in a rich, matte, lasting finish. Scratches would disappear when polished with a soft cloth.

The Pooley Model 7400 cabinet has its original finish. When new in 1928, the cabinet sold for \$60 without the receiving set and speaker. As you can see, I am using it as the company intended it to be used, as a radio desk. The radio works well and so does the desk.

POOLEY RADIOS

For the past few months, while gathering information for this article, I was very fortunate to come into contact with Mr. Thomas M. Pooley of Ringoes, New Jersey. Mr. Pooley may be a descendent of the Pooley side of the family that came to America from Cornwall, England, in the mid-1800s.

He has in his possession some very interesting Pooley Furniture Company and Pooley Radio information that he graciously shared with me. It is from this information and our e-mail exchanges that I have in great part been able to put together this article.

One of the pieces of information that Mr. Pooley sent to me is a complete 8-page Pooley Radio bro-chure from around 1930/31. In it, Pooley is advertising its new Pooley precision-built radio as "one of the most modern receiving sets made and rightly called, "The New Magic Voice of Radio."

The brochure also says that "Pooley radio comes to you through one fine dealer in each city. Direct from the factory. No distributor or jobber adds his costs and profits." In other words, Pooley controlled its own cabinet costs and production and claimed that selling only through high-class ex-

clusive dealers assured "perfect service in the purchase of your set."

Pooley radios shown in this booklet ranged in price from \$94.50 to \$189. Representative radios are shown in Figures 8, 9, and 10 on the three pages following this page.

Pooley had contracted with Silver-Marshall, and it was the Silver-Marshall 8-tube, superheterodyne, screen grid radio that was used in the Pooley cabinets shown in this eight-page brochure. The radio was called the "Bearcat."

An article on the Silver-Marshall Company in the Fumiture Manufacturer magazine from May 1929 reports that Silver-Marshall was opening a new, modern to the utmost detail, 100,000 square foot factory at 6435 West 65th St. in Chicago, Illinois. This new facility would be able to take care of the demand for the screen grid tube receivers, along with other chassis that were being made there, as it would have more than four times the manufacturing space than its present location on Jackson Boulevard in Chicago.

In Radio News for December 1929, there is a fivepage advertisement on Silver-Marshall. Included is an ad from the I.A. Lund Corporation of Chicago, a cabinetmaker that was using the Silver-Marshall chassis in its cabinets also.

Some Pooley radios were made by Gilfillan Radio. Since Gilfillan was licensed by RCA, the company could and would on occasion contract with various nonlicensed companies, such as Troy, Ravenscroft, and Breting, to name a few, and maybe even Pooley.

These companies could design their circuits, order parts, put in a team of people at the Gilfillan plant to assemble the parts onto a chassis, test the radio and have an RCA license attached to the chassis. They could then ship the chassis plus speaker back to their plants for installation into a cabinet and ship to their customers.

However, with Pooley, it would seem more practical to simply order a chassis from another company such as Silver-Marshall or Giffillan with an ongoing assembly line, have it tested, and then ship the chassis to the Pooley factory for retesting and installation in one of the Pooley radio cabinets.

Well, that just about does it. I have spent a lot of time doing research on the Pooley Company. I have come into contact with a lot of very interesting people, and I than them for all of their help, advice and most of all the information that they so gladly shared with me.

The bottom line — There is a Pooley radio.

The Collector's Guide to Antique Radios, Seventh Edition — By John Slusser

REVIEWED BY JIM MONEGHAN

The Collector's Guide to Antique Radios series of books is well known throughout the radio community as the definitive reference book on radio manufacturers and their models. Each new edition of this series has added new data, such as companies not previously listed, more model numbers for the companies listed, more photographs, and, of course, updated prices to reflect changes since the last edition.

The seventh edition has done all of that and more. First, this new edition takes all of the previous information and adds fourteen new manufacturers. thus increasing the total listing to around 10,350! There are now over 1,200 color photos.

an increase of 15 percent over the sixth edition. No other price/reference guide on the market has this kind of depth. That is why, in my opinion, you need to pick up a copy of this book, even if it is only for the reference to model numbers for each company.

I have never been a fan of price guides because usually by the time they reach the targeted audience, the radio collector, prices have changed. This is especially true in today's fast-paced, internet market with the explosion of the auction site eBay.

This seventh edition does a pretty good job of using average selling prices from radio shows, online auctions and geographic locations, just to name a few. I noticed that, on many radios, the range of pricing has widened; for instance, a Clapp Eastham RZ Radak in the sixth edition is valued at \$820-\$920; in the seventh edition, it is \$740-\$985.

These changes have made the seventh edition more useful and more accurate for the collector since there are many factors involved in determining price. Condition both cosmetically and electrically is the primary factor. Slusser and his Radio Daze staff have considered every possible aspect of condition, from intact knobs and push buttons to readable dials/scales, escutcheons, bezels, cabinet veneers, and completeness of internal compo-



nents. Of course, on the lower priced radios, the changes are not as dramatic.

In his "Explanation of Pricing" in the book's introduction. Slusser warns that "Pricing for vintage radios, like many other antiques and collectibles. is extremely variable and dependent on many factors." In selling a radio, he also says "...it is important to be realistic about its true condition." This is what "will primarily dictate its value to a potential buyer."

The thing I like the best about this seventh edition is that Slusser has taken all of the radios with photographs and put them in the listings as well. Previous editions did not have the radios with photos in the list which created

some confusion when trying to find a specific model. Not only are the photographed radios listed, but they are listed in red ink to let you know that there is a photograph that goes with it. Nice change!

Nitpicking is also a reviewer's job. The photo of the Crosley 517 "Fiver" is upside down, and the Crosley 50 pictured has the wrong tuning knob. Also, prices of a few sets are off. For example, I have found that a Kennedy XXX sells for only about 50 percent of the value listed the book, and an Atwater Kent 50 is selling for about twice the listed

However, the mistakes are minimal, and I don't believe that they should stop you from buying a copy of this book. I can see that a lot of time and effort went into this seventh edition, and I believe it is well worth having. I will probably use mine until the cover comes off!

The Collector's Guide to Antique Radios, Seventh Edition is available in an 81/2" x 11" format with 320 pages for \$24.95 from the publisher, Collector Books, www.collectorbooks.com, or from A.R.C. and other booksellers. Be sure to check sellers for shipping information.

Robert Orr Auction More Memories from 1982

CONTRIBUTIONS BY JIM SARGENT AND ROBERT LOZIER

My memory of the 1982 Orr Collection auction sparked the following welcome responses: first, one from Jim Sargent, and then another from Bob Lozier. The photos are ones I took at the auction 25 years ago. (Editor)

From Jim Sargent:

I had to smile as I read John Terrey's article in the July 2007 ARC reminiscing about his attendance at the J. Herbert Orr auction in 1982. How quickly those 25 years have passed!

Like John, I had seen the ads for this mega-auction probably in Don Patterson's *Radio Age* publication. I had been collecting old radios since the mid-1970s and had attended several radio events, including Rockford, Illinois, (predecessor to Elgin) and the Dallas VRPS (originally known as the

Southwest Vintage Radio and Phonograph Society) conventions.

There were only about a half dozen active radio collectors in Arkansas in 1982. However, three of us lived in the Little Rock area: Ken Holeman, who recently passed away; Tom Burgess, still an active collector and restorer; and I. We decided to make the trek to Alabama. Ken rented a 12-foot enclosed U-Haul, we went in Tom's GMC van, and I drove.

We went to buy. Wanting to spend our money at the auction, we chose not to stay at the finest motels along the way. Somewhere I still have the nice sales catalog that I used to record most of the sale prices. I recall the weather was cold and wet, and the majority of the sale took place under a big top tent with sides flapping in the wind. What a thrill it was to be there! This was the Muchow auction of the 1980s.

I remember seeing other well known collectors in the crowd, including Jim and Felicia Kreuzer and Don Patterson. As I recall, either Jim or Don won the bidding on the rare Radiola VIIB and the Western Electric CW-938 that John mentioned in his article.

I also met Paul Klipsch, a fellow Arkansan, sound audio legend, and developer of the Klipsch Horn. Paul had flown in on a private plane seeking phonograph items. He took several home. A few years later, I was fortunate to team up with Mr. Klipsch to do a comparison show of antique and modern tech-

nology at a high-end audio store in Little Rock. He was a real gentleman and impressed me in many ways, but that is another story.

I met Jim Fred there. At the time, Jim was publishing Antique Radio Topics, a monthly newsletter for collectors, as well as antique radio articles for Elementary Electronics. We had corresponded several times before our chance meeting in Alabama. Our hobby has a large crop of fine individuals and Mr. Fred is one of them. I would catch up with him several times over the years while attending the ARCA meet at Eloin.

Of course, Mr. Orr was there. He was an interest-

ing man in his own right. I have forgotten the details with time, but among his many business ventures was Orrtronic, a maker of the first magnetic tape player for automobiles. It was actually the forerunner of the 4- and 8-track players. Anyone remember these antiques? I remember his telling me that the magnetic tape had its origin in Germany. He brought the idea to the states after the war. Mr. Orr passed away about two years after the auction.

I remember the auctioneer selling a rare Crosley Model 50A without cabinet. After the spirited bidding had ended (it sold for \$150), the surprised auctioneer called for someone on his team to run back in the building, where the items were waiting their tum on the auction block, and get him another one of "those things."

Weather notwithstanding, it was a great weekend. Tom, Ken and I tested the capacity of Tom's van and the rented U-Haul to get our goodies back to Arkansas. Both Tom and I still have several of the items we bought that weekend. Each can be identified by a

metal tag that Mr. Orr had carefully placed on the item in an inconspicuous place.

John closed his article saying he would never forget the auction in Opelika. I would have to agree. While the cold and dampness in the air that November weekend have faded with the years, the excitement and friendships formed that weekend are still with me.

From Bob Lozier:

Back when the Bill Orr collection went to auction, I had been recently laid off and was just starting to get into a new job. Money was definitely tight, but I was determined to go to what was, for me, the first estate radio auction I could attend. As I recall it was about a nine-hour drive, and when I got to the preview, it knocked my socks off! I also realized that my chance of being high bidder on anything of interest to me was going to be slim.

As far as I can remember, I came away with only one radio. It was a nondescript sort of home

brew that just looked strange inside. It had just two tubes and some honeycomb coils. After a little research, I figured out just what it was — a home-brew broadcast band super-regenerative receiver of about 1923 vintage. I relegated the set to a high shelf.

Fast forward about 20 years to a February when I had to go work at MET Laboratories in Baltimore for three weeks. The day before leaving, I installed a new dehumidifier in one of my display rooms. Ten days later, I flew home for the weekend to find the house stinking like crazy of mildew. The drain line fitting of the new unit had cracked, causing all the water from the dehumidifier to spill out onto the tile floor for probably most of the ten days.

I had to remove everything in the room, bleach the floor and walls, repaint the walls and do a detail cleaning of every item in the room (some 200 radios plus a few hundred other small items). It required just about all of my spare time over a period of five months to clean things up to my satisfaction. Fortunately, there was apparently little lasting damage.

When it came time to clean the super-regen broadcast set, I realized that I had accumulated some info on Armstrong's introduction of the circuit and that now was the time to note the extreme rarity of this set. I decided to clean up the set and show it at Charlotte and Rochester in 2006. [Robert's article on the set begins on the following page.]

Armstrong Super-Regenerative Broadcast Receiver - Circa 1922-1923 A Rare Bird

BY ROBERT LOZIER

Along with his recollections of the Robert Orr auction, Robert sent us this article on the set which he bought there, and which, at the time, he thought was just a nondescript home brew. (Editor)

Why write about a dull home brew like this?

Millions of radio enthusiasts around the world built or purchased broadcast receivers using the regenerative circuit in one form or the other. However, virtually no one actually built broadcast receivers using Howard Armstrong's super-regenerative receiver circuit that was disclosed to the public June 31, 1922.

While it was indeed true that amplification of radio signals approaching one million could be obtained with only two tubes, the output signal contained artifacts from the blocking (quench) oscillator that precluded really good audio quality when operated at medium wave broadcast frequencies. (Artifacts that

would manifest in the form of a rushing sound in the background.) Add to that, the fact that the super-regen was generally considered very difficult to set up and operate successfully, and that you had a circuit by a world famous inventor that did not excite the public interest for a long time.

The real value of the super-regenerative circuit was not demonstrated until almost ten years later when there was a rapid increase in practical communications operation at VHF frequencies (above 50 MHz.).

Think the super-regenerative circuit should be dead by now? Not so. It has found a niche in the designs for GigaHertz ultra, ultra low power receivers for battery-powered data collection systems like gas and water meters.

What about the little knife-switch on the front panel? I can only speculate on this. When Armstrong demonstrated this circuit, it

was done with a loop antenna to show that the outfit would easily pick up the New York stations from inside a lecture hall. When this set was built, there was a three-circuit coil mount that permitted the signal to be applied via a long wire. Maybe the intention was to be able to use a loop antenna at a later date with the option of a switch select. Another theory could be that since the panel has three peepholes, it could be that the experimenter salvaged the panel from an earlier project.

PRESERVATION OF THE SET

I obtained this set back in the early 1980s when the Bill Orr collection was sold at auction. It was in good shape, except for the front of the hard rubber front panel. The surface was somewhat rough and it looked as if someone had tried to protect the white filler

in the knobs by giving them an over-coat of shellac which spilled over onto the panel in places. The general color was a very dull grayish brown due to natural oxidation aggravated by relatively high humidity, even though the back side of the panel is pretty much a semigloss jet black.

I noted that it would be a simple task to remove all the components from the panel. Doing that, I proceeded to remove the shelac with alcohol. That went very quickly. The next step was to smear on a coat of Goop waterless hand cleaner and rub down with a clean terry cloth. (Remember! Never use cleaners like 409, Super Clean, Purple Stuff, etc., when cleaning hard rubber or Bakelite. These caustic materials will dissolve/etch the surface in a heartbeat!)

Then I applied another generous coat of Goop. This time, I substituted the terry cloth with 0000-grade steel wool and used very light pressure and circular motion all over the panel for 10 to 20 minutes. Every few min-

utes during the process, I would wipe as much of the Goop off as possible and inspect the panel under strong light. I was looking to make sure that the coloration across the entire panel stayed as even as possible.

If I had continued this process long enough, I'd have gotten back to a black panel rather than a somewhat grayish brown tinted black. I decided that it was better to keep some of the oxidation evident for educational purposes.

If you know of another 1920s vintage super-regen, I'd sure like to exchange photos.

Scammed on the Internet

Here at A.R.C., we have received a number of reports of Internet fraud attempts, some actually successful. We thank William Gould for his "confession" hoping it may save others from a similar fate. (Editor)

For a couple of months, I had a classified ad in A.R.C., seeking to sell some electronic equipment that I no longer use (amplifier, tuner, turntable, etc.). A few days ago, I concluded an e-mail correspondence with an apparent buyer in another country. The conclusion was that I was ripped off to the tune of \$2,500, and I bloody well ought to have known better. I'm telling the story in order to warn others.

On May 10, I received an e-mail from """@yahoo.com, (""" = specific info deleted) who said that she wanted to buy the turntable. The language, spelling, and sentence structure sounded foreign. We then exchanged several e-mails; she eventually told me that payment had been sent to me: a check in the amount of \$2,500, which I was to cash, deduct the \$150 price of the turntable, and send the rest to her "shipper" in London, England.

Red flags should immediately have come up, but they didn't, and I proceeded. She put me in touch via e-mail with the "shipper," "*shippingagent@yahoo.co.uk. He told me how to send the money to him via Western Union. I was vaguely uncomfortable with all of this, but not enough to come to my senses and cancel the deal. So I cashed the \$2,500 cashier's check, drawn on Pinnacle Bank in Newcastle, Wyoming. The check bore a state-

ment something like "If you can't read the tiny print in this area, the check is counterfeit." I couldn't read the tiny print. I dismissed it by telling myself that it's just my poor vision. I was about to be monumentally suckered.

On May 31, growing impatient with keeping someone else's money, I sent \$2,350 (minus a sending fee) to "shipper" in London via Western Union. I even told him the Money Transfer Control Number! Had I waited only TWO MORE DAYS, I would have been rescued by the telephone call from my bank telling me that the check was counterfeit and that the bank had withdrawn \$2,500 from my account to cover its loss. I had allowed myself to be led down the proverbial primrose path, and lost \$2,350 as a result.

One more brief note, and I'll quit: While all of the above was occurring, another "buyer" said that "his client" was sending me a check. Days went by; no check. Finally, I asked him what was up. He said that he wasn't sure, but he guessed that now he'd just have to use my credit card. At least I had brains enough to smell this one, and simply said "No" and "Goodbye." That "buyer's" address was ""300@yahoo.com. And now I've received another e-mail message, from ""2000@yahoo.com, inquiring, in the same sort of stilted language, about the items that I have for sale. He will get no response!

It's interesting—all of these clowns are @yahoo.com. It must be a club. Be very careful out there.

AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions Burbank, Ohio — April 28, 2007

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

It will be difficult to find enough of the right superlatives to report this auction. From both a financial and statistical aspect, it was close to a record setter. The over 600 items attained a total bid price of over \$310,000 (\$325,000 with the five percent buyers premium added in). Fourteen items contributed over two-thirds of the value to the bottom line with five items reaching the five-figure mark.

But, putting aside the cold numbers, it was a tourde-force — a rare grouping of exceptional radios, never to be seen again in one spot. Essentially it was a magnificent museum that was assembled in a few days and only stayed together for literally a few

hours. It was a privilege to be there.

Of course the star of the show had to be the Crosley Super Power receiver, perhaps one of only two or three still thought to exist. Impressive as it was, it was somewhat jaded since it was incomplete having lost a couple of speakers and several of its chassis along the way. As a final indignity, it did not have the correct knobs. Yet, it was still an imposing sight, and if Richard Estes had charged for picture-taking, he probably could have made a tidy sum. Everyone had to take multiple pictures of it, and many posed beside it, so, if they had no hope of ever owning one, they could at least go home with a picture.

Frank Rasada, who had owned it at one time, came from California to witness its changing of hands again. Frank said that when he sold it many years ago, he bought a house with the proceeds. This time the selling bid price was \$55,000 — not bad considering the work needed to locate or construct the

missing pieces. Fortunately, the main receiver chassis was present. Allegedly, some hi-fi enthusiast had commandeered the amplifier chassis and maybe a speaker or two sometime in its past life.

But the Crosley was just one of the stars of this show. There was a Zenith 1000Z Stratosphere that was in the best shape of any that had previously

passed under Richard's gavel. It also sold for \$55,000. Then came the Sparton Noctume, again a better example than any of the previous three or four that passed through this house last year. It might be called a bargain at \$37,500 when prior examples sold for over \$50,000, but then how many Noctumes does one need?

If you were a high-end hi-fi fan, especially for McIntosh items, then your mouth would be watering for the incredible selection of McIntosh items offered. The McIntosh MC2000 New Millennium Edition stereo amp with eight push-pull parallel KT-88 tubes was a sight to behold. Even the tubes were marked McIntosh. One of only 50 that were made and originally sold new for \$15,000, it sold here for \$8,000. Then there were the Catalins, mirror and other decorator radios, dozens of them. Many sold in the several thousand range, and a couple hit the five-figure mark. It was all somewhat overwhelming!

But, there was still nearly something for everyone. No low value auction preceded the main auction, and there was little Ham gear and not many paper items. Still, there was a good selection of AC and battery wood radios and consoles, and some of the prices tended to be on the low side. I guess if you wanted Catalins or five-figure radios you were not going to pick up a lot of hundred dollar radios.


There were some nice parts and test equipment lots that were sold in a side auction in the afternoon. I did not record them and missed quite a few items in the main auction; I was running back and forth trying to capture a couple of items for myself from the side auction.

The weather was cloudy and damp, and the Friday evening viewing was as crowded as I have ever seen it. On Saturday, there were cars from all over the country in the parking lot, and yet many console radios and other items were being brought in by consign-

ors in the morning. Maybe they were hoping that the bidding frenzy would help move their items. By the 10 A.M. start, there were over 100 bidders registered.

I stopped recording at 4:45 P.M., and the auction ended at about 5:15 P.M. In spite of the "big bucks" emphasis at this auction, there were still plenty of bargains and many lots sold for less than \$50 or even \$25.

Note: Many of the photos show radios with knobs missing, especially Zeniths, Catalins and other spe-

Crosley "WLW" Receiver BY RAY CHASE

The Crosley "WLW" Super Power receiver dwarfed other console radios in the late 1930s, standing 58 inches tall. It is estimated that no more than five or ten were made, and the radio was priced at \$1,500, almost double the price of a Zenith Stratosphere. The new owner of this radio also received a binder of historical information and photos related to this radio.


Included was a copy of "Treatise on the WLW Receiver" from the Agricultural & Mechanical Library of the Oklahoma Agricultural & Mechanical College. It was dated 23 Sept. 1939. This treatise was authored by Auryle P. Richards and submitted to the Department of Electrical Engineering for a Ph.D. in 1939. Mr. Richards had received a BS in Electrical Engineering from this school in 1927.

I tried to google this document to determine if it was available online, but was not successful. I did look over the article in the binder prior to the sale and found it very comprehensive and worthy of obtaining. One of the radio magazines of the day also did an article on this receiver.









The Scope That Went to Heaven, or The Heathkit Scope Adventure

He had been bitten hard by the Electronics Bug, and had much more to learn than he does now (which is more than enough; every question answered leads to two more.) But at least he had learned that alternating electric currents have wiggles in them. Meters are fine to find out how much wiggle there is, but to see the wiggles, you have to have an oscilloscope.

At times, the lust for a scope actually supplanted more fundamental urges with the result that, after a summer of hard labor picking raspberries to raise the astronomical sum of \$39.95, the Heath Type OM-1 scope kit was ordered.


It was the summer of 1956, and everything was slow. It took one and one-half etemities for that precious box to arrive from Benton Harbor.

Mercifully, it was summer and school didn't interfere with progress. The only remaining impediment was his Mom, who insisted on such irritating interruptions as meals and going to bed. It could have been much worse: if they had known the voltages in this device, his parents would have leapt up and down and howled in harmony and horror, "Leave that thing alone!"

Still, despite such handicaps, the scope kit was assembled in two and a half days. Now, it was time to plug it in. Maybe the connections should be checked once more. Maybe it should be plugged in to a Variac first and started at a low voltage. He had no such thing — probably didn't even know of such a thing. Nope, it was full line voltage or nothing.

Okay, deep breath, power plug into socket, more deep breath, power switch ON. What a noise that switch made! Clunk not click. Deafening! And there was nothing. Oh yes—oh wow—there's a red glow in that tube. It's getting too bright! No, no: its okay. What's that? Oh, the CRT heater. And, glory hallelujah! There is a spot on the screen! Oh what a heavenly green spot! There never was such a shade of green before!

"Now what? It's rising to the top of the screen. Turn the vertical centering control. That's better. No, it's still rising. Turn the centering some more.



That's as far as it goes, and the trace is still rising Off the top of the screen it went. Gone! Where? Why?

Well, what next? Send it back to Benton Harbor for repair? NO! Check the parts again, All okay.

"Where oh where has my little trace gone? It must be halfway to the moon by now!" He felt tears in his throat. No, no, no, stop being stupid; think! There is a tube voltage-chart in the manual. Good: check the voltages on all the tube pins. All okay too.

No, not all okay: one of the grids of the two tube sections, whose plates connect to the vertical deflection plates of the CRT has +80 volts on it! It's supposed to be at volts. Now what? The tube? Pull it out. Ouch! Hot! No matter. Now

the voltage on the grid is higher! Put the tube back in.

What's connected to the grid pin? A 100KΩ resistor and a capacitor. Take them off. The +80 volts is still there! The thing is bewitched! Wherever is it coming from?

He stared at the circuit board with the voltmeter test probe in his hand, and suddenly there was a little red line flickering in a black smudge of solderrosin flux between two circuit board lines. He scratched it off with the test probe, and there was a flicker in the corner of his eye. What? The trace? Could it be? He turned the vertical centering control back toward the center of its range, and there —oh, wonders never cease! — was his beautiful green trace, back from the moon or heaven or wherever.
