EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Many of us vintage radio collectors take pride in the wide diversity of our collections; others are dedicated to one or two manufacturers, periods, or styles. Whatever works for you — whether high or low-end models or everything in between — is what counts. And A.R.C. tries to cover all your interests at one time or another in these pages.

And so, when Phil MacArthur sent us a follow-up to his 2002 article on his Flavoradio collection, he again caught our attention. Here was a collector who, with not a little tongue-in-cheek, takes his pursuit of these inexpensive but very colorful sets to heart. Of course, Phil sent photos, and here begins the saga of a good cover photo achieved by a very cooperative contributor.

Like the digital photos sent by some contributors today, Phil's shots were marginal—perhaps good enough for family albums, but not for magazine reproduction. He tried again — and again. We realized that he had only a 0.03 megapixel camera, whereas we require a 4 or more megapixel image for a cover. We suggested that perhaps a friend with a better camera could help.

But, Phil asked first for instructions to improve the shots. We furnished these, telling him to pay attention particularly to the composition — to stand back and get all the tops and bottoms. His response: "Oh, that's why all my photos have the family heads chopped off!" Then he set to work, followed our suggestions, and even went out and bought a new 8 megapixel camera!

All this is not to say that you have to have a camera with all the latest bells and whistles to submit photos, but it is important to try for the possible. And it was a pleasure to work with Phil who responded so positively to instructions that we were able to achieve a good color photo for our cover.

Color is an important aspect of the diversity of the relatively inexpensive GE electric models of the 1940s, the subject of an article by Steve Auyer and Loren Ashworth. This is a follow-up to Steve's article on glow-in-the-dark radios which also provided a cover photo for the April 2007 issue. Here again we're reminded that you don't have to write about only the rarest sets for A.R.C. Often new angles to a previously covered topic are of equal interest to A.R.C. readers.

PRINTED WITHOUT COMMENT

We continue to receive reports from advertisers of e-mail responses to their classified ads proposing to pay them with a check, sometimes via a third party, in excess of the purchase price. The seller is asked to refund the difference by wire. In more than one case reported to A.R.C., the check received was "bad."

To minimize problems, we suggest that you always know whom you are dealing with drask for references.

In fact, this issue could be called the "follow-up issue." Bryan Hodgson's follow-up to two earlier wire recorder articles is another case in point. Bryan writes about two uncommon, relatively inexpensive pieces of wire recording equipment that take us back to the early days of music and voice recording. He strikes a familiar note among collectors — sometimes you think you're the only one with an oddity on your shelf, and through these pages, you find a kindred collector or two.

Walter Hughes had a somewhat similar problem in that he had found a simple box with such intriguing contents that he sent us photos hoping someone could identify it. Well, he came to the right place because I happen to have had a similar device in my collection. However, it is not directly radio-related, but a beautiful piece of quack medical apparatus. These "cure-alls" are relatively inexpensive items that appeal to many collectors of finely made equipment — a category that certainly includes vintage radio collectors.

Those same collectors are avid followers of informative auction reports. We welcome the Eric's 18th Annual Antique Radio Auction report by Ron Ramirez, well known author of *Philco Radio*, 1928-1942. There were no highflyers in this auction, but it offered an opportunity to pick up bargains. This is often the case with smaller auctions, and seeking them out and attending with an empty truck could be a wise choice.

Our faithful auction contributor Ray Chase reports on an Estes Auction also with modest proceeds. However, it offers many interesting items which we select and feature in photos. Among them are a number of unusual speakers and four small table sets. Again the possibility of bargains was evident.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Flavoradios Become More Flavorful

Flavoradios have a delicious sound enhanced, of course, by their many colors. Phil MacArthur can be relied on to bring us up to date on what new colors are surfacing in the marketplace. (Editor)




Figure 1. Artwork from promotional material supplied to distributors who, in turn, gave it to the stores. Shown are Model 507, left, and Model 540, right.

It's been a long wait since June 2002 when the first Flavoradio article graced these pages. Since then three more "flavors" have surfaced bringing the total to eleven, probably setting a record for the largest color variety of any radio ever made. The photo of all eleven sets in Figure 1, and on this month's cover, shows what I believe is the world's only complete set of Flavoradios. I think this claim may be true, since I have made it on "my eBay" and at radio shows for several years, and no one has come forth to dispute it. (On the other hand, maybe no one really cares.)

Several of the colors never ap-

peared in domestic Radioshack catalogs and some may have been for export only. I've been monitoring Flavoradio appearances on eBay now for about 10 years (I need to get a life), and no other colors have appeared.

In the original article, I wrote that plum (grape) and chocolate appeared to be quite scarce, but since then, a half dozen of those have sold for around \$20 each. However, all white models or those with white backs are actually very scarce, and I own the only examples of those that have ever shown their faces.

Black or gray models of this case design (which would have completed the RETMA color code) have never appeared. Maybe we'll just have to haul out a roller and a can of KemTone and finish the job. The eleven colors are: vanilla, strawberries & cream, peaches & cream, hot fudge sundae, chocolate, strawberry, orange, lemon, avocado, blueberry, and plum.

It would be tempting to mix and match fronts and backs but we're trying to keep our hobby historically accurate (bring on the polygraph machine). If anyone reading this article has Canadian or European copies of Radioshack catalogs showing the two-tones or whites, please e-mail me.

All colors of Flavoradios carried the same model number, 12-166, from 1972 through 1985, although it became 12-166A when the sixth transistor was added in the 1980s.

The Model 12-166, also holds the record for the longest radio production run at 15 years (1972 –

1987). The examples shown in the picture are all the earliest production runs made in Korea, but those made later in Hong Kong and the Philippines look identical.

I have noticed that running "Flavoradio" through Google gets several hundred hits. It also seems to have become a metaphor for low fidelity, as in, "After the dog ate my woofers, the stereo sounded like my sister's Flavoradio." (No respect.) And, I wonder if the case design with its window dial and vertical grille bars was inspired by the Westinghouse Little Gem, the "refrigerator" radio.

I still see one or two Flavoradios each week on eBay, but almost never at flea markets, garage sales or in stores. It could be that these were so cheap (\$4.99 - \$6.99) and unremarkable that when the battery ran down or when one just quit, it was tossed in the waste can.

Even so, they usually sell on eBay for \$5 to \$15, so it's not too late to start your very own collection. Then you can anxiously await the next *Antique Radio Classified* Flavoradio update, along with all the other dedicated Flavoradio collectors (both of us).

WITH THE COLLECTORS

General Electric Model Diversity

BY STEVE AUYER AND LOREN ASHWORTH

The following article demonstrates the kind of interconnection A.R.C. fosters among collectors. It's really a follow-up to a follow-up. Steve Auyer's article on glow-in-the-dark radios in the April 2007 issue prompted a response from Loren Ashworth in the July issue. And with a little more prompting from A.R.C., they got together on a broader subject about diversity in GE models of the 1940s. (Editor)

About his Model T, Henry Ford is reputed to have said, "You can buy it in any color you want — as long as it is black." And for many years, radio manufacturers had the same philosophy. Other than the brightly colored Catalin radios of the 1930s and few other distinctively styled radios, radios came in wood finished cabinets. Initial production of Bakelite cabinets was generally in wood-toned brown, but by

tric appliances — all automatically!" And "In any room – Turns on a favorite radio program automatically. Beautiful tone. G-E electric clock tells time even in dark." [But only if you bought the model with the radium dial.]

In the late 1940s, General Electric would take a standard radio chassis and offer it packaged in several different cabinet styles and colors. Typical was the 1949 clock radio line that was offered as Models 64, 65, 500, 501, 505, 506, 507, 508, 509 and 530, depending upon cabinet style and color.

CABINET STYLES AND COLORS

Figure 1 shows the two basic cabinet styles, and it is interesting to note that the same basic radio,

the early 1940s, General Electric was offering its table radios either in the traditional brown cabinet or in an ivory-colored version.

Following World War II, the company began introducing color as a marketing tool in its lines of consumer products. By the mid-1950s, kitchen appliances were offered in pastel shades of pink, blue, and yellow, in addition to the traditional white. And, of course, we remember the more brightly colored avocado, yellow and harvest brown colors of the 1960s.

THE CLOCK RADIO LINE

A popular product of the time was the clock radio. General Electric promoted their use: "In the bedroom — Lulls you to sleep, then turns itself off. Wakes you on time to sweet music — automatically!"; "In the kitchen — Electronic Servant starts breakfast — turns on coffee-maker, dozens of elec-

when packaged in a more smoothly styled cabinet, had a list price \$5 higher than the traditionally styled cabinet. Cabinets were offered in "Rich Rosewood, Lovely Ivory, Beautiful Burgundy, White, and Modern Bleached Mahogany." This range of colors might have been a bit of overkill as the following year the list was pared to "Congo Brown, Alabaster Ivory, Persian Red, and Porcelain White."

THE CHASSIS

Figure 2 (courtesy of Howard Sams Photofact) shows the basic chassis. There are several interesting features, the first being the size of the chassis cutouts for the tube sockets. In the late 1940s, demand for vacuum tubes outstripped production, and the designers wanted the freedom to use whichever tube model was available — either a 35W4 or 35Z5 rectifier, for example. Thus the chassis cut-

outs were sized for octal-based tubes and filled with special sockets if 7-pin miniature tubes were available.

On the back of the chassis, you will note a small sub-chassis that contains an electrical outlet that is controlled by the clock timer, and also a slide switch that can be used to override the clock timer. Again, General Electric offered several options here: Models 64 and 65 did not have the sub-chassis; Models 505, 506, 507 and 508 had only an outlet on the sub-chassis; and Models 509 and 530 had the timer override switch in addition to the outlet.

If you look at a section of the Sams parts list in Figure 3 you'll note that depending upon the specific model that you were working on, you had to select one of four different loop antennas, one of two

different power switches, and one of four different dial scales. But, if this annoyed the serviceman, think of the headaches it gave the poor production control guy on the manufacturing line who had to make sure the kits contained the right mix of parts for the model being produced.

THE TELECHRON MECHANISM

This radio, like most other clock radios, wall and desk clocks, and appliances of the era used a Telechron mechanism in the clock. The Telethon mechanism, shown in Figure 4, consisted of an AC coil and a sealed rotor and gear assembly with a single output shaft. A series of external gears would drive the hour and minute hands from the output shaft. Occasionally, an AC coil would fail and the




Figure 2. This basic radio chassis was used in two ???? of GE models. Note that the metal chassis was stamped with tube socket holes for octal-based tubes and filler plates were used to accommodate the smaller miniature tube sockets. (Howard Sams photo)

repairman could obtain a replacement for this part.

The sealed rotor and gear assembly had a tendency to get "noisy" after long use. This would often take the form of a faint grinding noise that was most annoying when it was coming from a clock radio and the owner was trying to get to sleep. The unit would still keep accurate time but the noise would eventually become louder and louder. Finally, the crunching/grinding could be heard across a room, and it was time to do something.

Replacement rotor and gear assemblies were available, but they were fairly expensive. As a result, many radio repairmen made a "quick fix" by drilling a small hole in the rotor housing, squirting in a few drops of WD-40, and then sealing the hole with tape. Ah, the ingenuity of the radio servicemen of those

Seymour's Battery


Walter Huges did what every intrepid radio collector does when he sees a simple looking wooden box — he looks inside. What he found was internesting enough for him to send in several photos of his find, labeled "Seymour's Battery," and ask if someone could identify it. Before taking photos, however, he cleaned it up with camauba wax and QRB refinisher.

A perusal through your editor's files yielded a photo of essentially the same device; however, it was labeled, "The Paine Drug Company."

These devices are called "Faradic Batteries" and use an induction coil to produce a pulsed voltage which is applied by probes to various parts of the

body. The frequency of the pulses is controlled by a vibrating arm which has a weight that can be moved to affect the frequency. Other controls switch the polarity and intensity of the current applied to the body. One reference claims that the treatment is "useful for the following conditions: neurasthenia, hysteria, general debility, nervous dyspepsia, anaemia, rickets, etc." It goes on to say that "the good results experienced are a feeling of exhiliaration and well being, increased appetite, relief of dyspeptic symptoms, and a steadying of the pulse."

Faradic batteries are similar to the electrical stimulation devices used by physical therapists today.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Arthur Atwater Kent Story — A Postscript

The name Arthur Atwater Kent always triggers curiosity among radio collectors. In this article, Richard Begbie describes how even just a chance reference set him off on the trail of the great man's final years. [Editor]

Sometime in the 1970s I enjoyed reading the amusing, if light-weight memoir of movie actor David Niven. His two volumes were crammed with inside stories on Hollywood's glitterati, mostly funny, and occasionally poignant in the extreme.

Recently sorting through some old shelves, I came across one of those books again — Bring on the Empty Horses. As chance would have it, the book fell open at a passage which would have meant little in preradio collecting days. This time it lit up like a neon sign. Here it is in full:

An eccentric and lonely little old millionaire named Atwater Kent gave sumptuous parties at his statue-encrusted estate above Beverly Hills — Capo di Monte. No expense was spared, and a good time was had by all, but many people never set eyes on their host because he usually took refuge in a leather wing chair in a remote library and stayed there all night.

A majority of the guests never discovered why they had been invited, but they swallowed their curiosity and the Moet Chandon, and attacked the Beluga with reckless abandon.

If occasionally the better mannered would go to the remote library to seek out Atwater Kent and thank him, he was almost pathetically touched, smiled a wispy little smile and marked them down in his heart as "friends." When he departed this earth, he left bequests to seventy-three "friends" and enjoined them to use the money "for happiness," something, perhaps, he had always been short of.

Could this pathetic figure be the same fiercely independent entrepreneur who had dominated the radio-manufacturing scene for so long, before departing on his own unique terms in 1936?

Curiosity piqued, I explored further to discover

that, indeed, this was he. Most Atwater Kent buffs are aware that some time after closing down the factory, the great man left Philadelphia (and his family) for the sun and glamour of Hollywood. But, there is more to this story, as a trawl of the internet turned up.

First, the bare facts of the Niven account turn out to be true. Atwater Kent did buy the huge Italianate mansion Capo di Monte, and he did give himself over to entertaining a broad spectrum of the celebrities gravitating to Hollywood in the 1940s.

However, it turns out that Niven's picture of the old recluse with the "wispy little smile" tells us much more about David Niven than A. A. Kent. More precisely, it captures nicely the almost casual hubris which cinema superstars wore then, and,

for all I know, wear still today.

Because, far from inviting the glamorous and wealthy to his mansion, and then shrinking in shy confusion to his remote library, it seems that at almost all the extravagant dinners, solrees, and parties he hosted, Atwater Kent himself led the revelry with gusto and style.

THE REAL A. ATWATER KENT

Like most of our species, Kent was a complex character. The ingenuity, the market sense, and the drive for perfection are clear to every latter-day Atwater Kent enthusiast. What emerges from other sources are more human traits. In a Michigan Antique Radio Club (MARC) newsletter piece from 1991, we discover that his staff were amused by his attempts at what he thought "cultured"

speech, as in using the soft English "a" in words like "brass" — when he remembered to do so!

Such harmless vanities, reflecting the cultured poverty of his childhood home, found magnified expression in California. With him he imported his collection of bow ties, a great deal of money, and a clutch of English servants. He planned to enjoy what he had once called "the simple life" on a grand scale.

VOCAL MUSIC PASSION

He also brought other passions. Probably first among these was his love of good vocal music. The Atwater Kent Auditions, a life long project, had provided opportunities for aspiring young opera singers for decades. They were given a national platform in the long-running "Atwater Kent Hour," where a generation of talent was introduced to the nation, often via Atwater Kent rad os. He transported the project to Los Angeles, and in the Bel Air mansion, was able to promote this love in other, most congenial ways. For starters, he took singing lessons himself, with great enjoyment.

And then performers, conductors, composers and new young talent alike were bidden to parties on the hill. Unlike the typical Hollywood bash of the day, they introduced a style and dignity new to the brash, young movie community. Kent loved entertaining talented and famous musicians, and photographs of the time show him in animated engagement with some great names. There was an elegance and purpose to these events new to the tinsel capital.

He contributed freely to the promotion of good music, as well as to unnumbered worthwhile causes, local and national. Thus, in these later years, he was able not only to promote good music and sane welfare, but to do it in his own flamboyant and generous way.

FILM COMMUNITY CONNECTION

Nor did he ignore the film community surrounding him, and movie stars certainly came to many of

the parties. However, it seems reasonable to surmise that Mr. Kent was less interested in their company than that of most other guests.

Niven's picture of a lonely little man brokenly grateful for the attentions of the great stars of the day simply does not hold up. Far more likely is that the genteel Kent was not especially interested in the crasser behaviors of self-indulgent young movie stars. In addition, it seems that he was not a latenighter himself, and the reclusive tag may well have had more to do with his 9 p.m. bedtime habit than anything else.

In one sad particular, the Niven account does hold up. Mr Kent bequeathed varying sums to many of the people who had surrounded him during the twilight years, up to and including his singing teacher. But not one of these beneficiaries turned up to his modest funeral. The sole mourners were his children, staff, and servants. It is a sad end, suggestive of a child-like faith in the brittle stuff of the performing ego, a faith always destined for disillusionment.

VINTAGE RECORDING

Even More on Wire Recorders

BY BRYAN A. HODGSON

Once again, an article has far-reaching effects. In the October 2007 issue of A.R.C., Loren Ashworth responded to Nick Gent's article on his wire recorder project in the November 2006 issue. Bryan Hodgson, in turn, responded in a letter with photos directly to Loren. Loren, in yet another turn, sent that exchange to us for publication with Bryan's permission. And so it goes here at A.R.C. — a continuous round of shared information.

Bryan describes two pieces of equipment. The first is a complete wire recorder; the second is only part of a wire recorder, basically, the wire transport mechanism. (Editor)

I read Loren Ashworth's article in the October 2007 edition of A.R.C., as well as Nick Gent's article in the November 2006 edition, with some interest, as I was beginning to think that I was the only person to own a wire recorder. But, as Loren says in his article "There are some out there," and since so few have crossed his path, I thought I would tell of two that I acquired — don't ask me where!

WIRE RECORDER MODEL 50

It has always been my collecting policy to acquire anything with tubes in it, from quack medical devices all the way down. So, when I saw a black box with tubes in it some years ago, I bought it, not thinking




Figure 2. This rear view of the wire recorder shows its high-quality components typical of military equipment.

that I had no idea what it was or what it did. So the black box turned out to be a wire recorder, and I still haven't had the courage to put any power on it.

Figure 1 shows a front view of the recorder, while Figure 2 is a rear view (there are no drive belts installed at this time). In the lid, which is not shown, is a compartment open for storage of cleaning materials/ spares. The plate in the middle of the front panel reads, "Wire Recorder Model 50" and "Special Devices Division — USN Bureau of Aeronautics." The recorder was made by Utah Radio Products of Chicago, Illinois, and operates from 115v.

MAGNETIC RECORDER MAGAZINE




Figure 4. A view of the wire transport mechanism cover.

The second item, which is really only part of a recorder, is a "Magazine of KS-12009 Magnetic Recorder." Contained in a grey box, it is just the wire transport mechanism; there are no tubes in it. Figure 3 shows the printing on the magazine lid. Figure 4 shows the unit with its cover removed, and it consists of a base, the wire spools, the transport mechanism, and the glass-sided box.




Figure 7. This bottom view of the transport mechanism shows the spool controls and a 10-pin connector.

Figures 5 and 6 show closeups of the front and back of the wire transport system. Figure 7 shows the bottom of the transport system with a 10-pin connector. I wonder what the whole recorder looked like, and I wonder what, if anything, is recorded on the wire. It came with ten reels of wire.

Who knows — maybe someone out there has the electronics mechanism to make this model complete.

AUCTION REPORT

Eric's 18th Annual Antique Radio Auction Olney, Illinois — October 28, 2007

It is somewhat hard to believe that so many years have passed since Eric Bruner held his very first auction of antique radios and accessories. But although 18 years have passed. this annual tradition continues to hold its own in the face of strong online competition in the form of eBay.


The auction was held at Eric's Auction Barn, located at 1000 Southwest, just one mile north of U.S. Rte. 50, in Olney, Illinois.

The quality of the items offered has varied over the years. There were no Catalin radios or Atwater Kent breadboards at this year's sale. That being said however, the overall quality of the items was up from the past two years. There were more cathedral and tombstone models. a lot more wooden table models, and a lot fewer 1950s and 1960s plastic model radios.

Collectors attend this annual sale mostly from Central and Southern Illinois, although vehicles in the parking lot were spotted with license plates from Indiana, Kentucky, Missouri, and as far away as Tennessee. Ohio, and Wisconsin, The Ohio plate probably belonged to noted tube collector and seller Bob Dobush, who was one of the ringmen at this year's sale.

Highlights of the sale included an E.H. Scott Allwave 15 with a rusty chassis, housed in a wooden cabinet which had been damaged and had delaminating veneer. Nevertheless, it was still the top moneymaker at \$270. Other highlights included a loose coupler mounted on a

wide board, with cat's whisker detector and Chelsea variable condenser at \$210; an RCA Radiola AC 2-stage amplifier, also at \$210; a Westinghouse RC (RA-DA) at \$180; and a Jackson-Bell 62 which, despite its stripped cabinet and mismatched knobs, also brought \$180.



AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions Burbank, Ohio — May 26, 2007

This was a large sale consisting of the Willis Rudolph collection from Cordova, Tennessee, and a portion of the Larry Porter estate from Crestline, Ohio, as well as others. While there were few early radio items, over 35 nice consoles were offered, about 40 good 1930s wood radios, a batch of tube testers, some nice speakers and horns, some phonograph items, a very large batch of tubes, and some interesting and rare 3dialer battery sets. There were only a few military and Ham items and not much in the line of paper and books.


Some goods were coming in on Friday evening as well as on Saturday morning. Few people showed up for the Friday evening viewing, but, on Saturday, 173 bidders had signed on.

As has become an Estes custom, there was a pre-auction at 9 A.M. Saturday to sell off a large quantity of low value items. This sale was especially loaded and included an early Kennedy in rather

poor shape. It also included probably the worst Atwater Kent 12 breadboard that has been found. It was terribly rusted and corroded but still had tubes, probably permanently stuck in its sockets. Nonetheless, it sold for

\$130. It would be interesting to find out if the purchaser attempted a restoration — that would be a story in itself.

I normally do not record the results of this earlier sale but did note four items worthy of



This overview of the auction display shows the wide range of items offered.


mention. In addition to the Atwater Kent breadboard, a slant-front Kennedy sold for \$170, a Western Electric tall horn in fair condition sold for \$85, and a rack-mounted RCA audio amplifier from a drive-in theatre sold for \$375. These prices were unusual since items in this sale mostly sell for a couple of dollars, seldom more than \$25. This sale ran over to 10:15 A.M. and delayed the start of the main auction until 10:30 A.M.

Richard Estes ran at a more brisk pace this day in order to get through the large number of items, and this did not make my job any easier. I recorded about 625 lots and stopped at about 4:00 p.m. The sale ended at about 5:00 p.m., so I missed maybe a hundred or so lots. The total value that I recorded was about \$50,000, not counting the 5 percent premium that is not included in the following detailed listing.


