### EDITOR'S COMMENTS

When the collection of someone who has compiled antique radio information in many books goes on the auction block, the collecting community sits up and takes notice. So it was with the crowd of avid collectors attending the February Estes auction of the collection of Mark Stein, well-known author of eight radio reference books.

Frigid temperatures and a threatened snow storm were no deterrents because here was an opportunity to see — maybe even buy — sets collectors had seen pictured in the Stein books on their shelves for years. Stein's *Machine Age to Jet Age* 4-volume series on tabletop sets, no longer in print, are staples in many collections. Of the four other Stein books, three are also out of print, but we still have all four remaining in our stock.

We find these and other reference books useful in editing articles and auction reports. Mark Stein's photos are often helpful in identifying a set or providing a model number, but, if you are interested in a particular value, referring to several price guides is always wise.

An example in this very auction is the Majestic "Park Ave." console, which Stein values in his *Pre-War Consoles* at \$7,500, but which sold for \$4,750 in this auction. The same set in another price guide is valued from \$720 to \$960. Guides are just that — guides to recent action in the marketplace, not fixed price lists. It pays to take what they say into account and then show up when important collections are auctioned. You may be lucky.

Sometimes a bit of luck is involved in a purchase that turns out to be something other than expected. Instead of the Zenith Y832 tabletop he thought he had bought, Andrew Hayden opened the chassis and found markings labeling it a Model 6Y61B. Furthermore, it is not AM/ FM, but AM plus shortwave. The reference books don't help on this one, but maybe other collectors can. Andrew's find illustrates one of the pleasures of collecting — unearthing a mystery and pursuing its history.

Alan McChesney is certainly into equipment mysteries. Of course, what appears to be a robot/analog computer with dials like a circular slide rule is not a radio. But, I still couldn't resist doing a little research on the robot — it is a Japanese toy named "Flashy Jim." Perhaps others out there have more to add to Alan's research on this interesting unit.

Obviously a radio historian, Alan also offers in another short piece a comparison of three sets using the same cabinet, but different knobs and escutcheons — a CRC Radio Co. "King" pictured in the January 2008 "Photo Review," his own Steinite, and an Aero 4-tube Midget shown in a 1933 ad. There's always a new angle to be pursued in radio history, and so often we have to conclude that there's no single answer,

It occurred to me that those of us who have been collectors dedicated to the preservation of radio history for decades have personal stories worthy of inclusion in the grand story of radio. Pete Gray, a new subscriber to A.R.C. at age 93, has such a compelling story that his local newspaper in Albany, Oregon, decided to feature his long "Life in Radio." We're happy to reprint that story and only wish that Pete had found us years ago. However, we look forward to connecting him to the wider radio collecting community from now on.

Another longtime radio story has yet to be told. Our fellow staff member Ray Bintliff will get around to that someday, but meantime, we rely on him to report on radio topics of all shapes and sizes. As a serious repairman, Ray encounters many bizarre problems. This time he warns of the danger of a mistake in choosing a replacement for an item as simple as a screw. The result could be a hot time in your old workshop.

# WITH THE COLLECTORS

## Zenith 6Y61B Tabletop Shortwave

Once in a while, you pass on an interesting set and then have a chance to go back and reconsider. Andrew Hayden describes that experience with a Zenith shortwave that has a bit of mystery about it that others may be able to help solve. (Editor)

When people think of Zenith shortwave, they think of the Trans-Oceanic which is known the world over as one of the best shortwave portables ever made. Starting with its introduction just prior to World War II and concluding with a transistorized version in the early 1980s, it remains a favorite with collectors today.

Tabletop shortwave radios were very popular in the 1930s and 1940s, but were not nearly as common in the 1950s since FM was gaining popularity. For those who specifically wanted to listen to distant stations, a portable SW radio or a real communications receiver, such as a Collins or a Hallicrafters, would have been the choice.

In recent years, I have developed an interest in the 8-tube

AM/FM Zeniths of the 1950s and early 1960s because of their superb sound quality. As a result, I am very familiar with the 1955 top-of-the-line Zenith "Super-Symphonaire," the Model Y832 AM/ FM high fidelity radio. It is a real pleasure to listen to thanks to its 8-inch main speaker and a pair of electrostatic tweeters housed in a very solidly constructed wooden cabinet. Many consider this radio and its descendants to be among the best sounding AM/FM radios produced in the late tube era.

#### **ACQUIRING THE MODEL 6Y61B**

Recently, I spotted what I thought was a Model Y832 with both a telescopic and a loop antenna mounted on its back panel sitting on the floor of an indoor antique market. See Figure 1. Having that 1950s cold war look, the set with its blond cabinet finish and large circular dial did stand out against its surroundings. Since I had a Y832 at home and the asking price was a bit high on this one, I passed.

Over the course of the next eight months I would glance down at it every time I checked for new inventory at this market. Maybe I should have

noticed another oddity in its appearance — a white enamel dial pointer. All the other large Zeniths from the 1950s had a gold electroplate finished pointer.

No one seemed to have any interest whatsoever in this radio, and the dust covering it was getting thick, so I decided to take a closer look. What's this — it's not AM/FM — it's AM plus shortwave and has six tubes not eight! Now I'm interested.

Since there was no model number to be found, I searched the internet with no results. I then corresponded with a few Zenith collectors. My first contact had seen one on a kitchen table when he was a child; another had also seen only one example in all his years of collecting Zeniths and thought it was a scarce model. Well that did it. I went down, took a chance and made an offer for half of the asking price and became the new owner for \$30.




Figure 2. The markings across the top of the large dial are for the broadcast band. Along the bottom are the two shortwave bands. The right small knob is for volume; the left knob has two concentric knobs the outer is for tuning, the inner is the band switch.

I was surprised that another radio collector hadn't grabbed this interesting Zenith. Besides the standard broadcast, it has two SW bands with its dial indicating 2.3 to 7 MHz; the second band is 7 to 22 MHz. See Figure 2. A label on the bottom of the cabinet listed four different chassis number possibilities: 6Y60T, 6Y61T — 115 volts only; or 6Y60BT and 6Y61BT — either 115 volts or 230 volts.

#### CHASSIS REVELATIONS

When I removed the back cover, as shown in Fig-3. IIFe. the chassis was marked 6Y61B (not BT). It operates on 115 volts and has a large transformer marked "115V-225V"

with a switch for the desired voltage. This radio is not an AC/DC set like the other Zeniths of the era, and it has a tube line-up of the following types: one each 6BE6, 6X4, and 6AT6; two 6BA6s; and one 6K6GT output tube. Also to my surprise was the presence of two 3-inch cone tweeters flanking the large 8-inch center speaker instead of the electrostatic tweeters seen in the Model Y832.

This radio has "big" sound with both low and high frequencies being noticeably stronger than other radios from the 1950s, and it gives the expensive German sets a run for their money in terms of performance. It also has the unique tone adjustment knob in the center of the dial pointer, which was an interesting feature of the high end Zeniths. The combined speaker-dial arrangement itself had been patented by Zenith in 1942 and is seen on many models made through the late 1950s. Cabinet dimensions are a relatively modest 151/2" x 10" x 8" deep.

The consensus so far is that it's an export model, but I wonder if it was also offered in the U.S. considering that there was a 115volt only version (chassis 6Y61T), and that an example had been seen in a home, as I mentioned earlier. I can see why this set would not have sold well with buyers, since the impressive Trans-Oceanic lay close by on the dealer's sales floor.

On the topic of exports, there's a very interesting bit of information in Zenith's Annual Report for 1955. It reads, "A number of important foreign markets remain closed to Zenith merchandise through operation of a world cartel controlling patents and foreign trade in radio and television receivers." The report goes on to say that overall export sales dein 1956, sold poorty, and then discontinued. I would like to find out more about this seldom seen Zenith shortwave radio, so if any readers recognize it, or have further details, please let me know.




Figure 3. A rear inside view of the Zenith set. Note the two "tweeters" on each side of the larger main speaker. The text "Chassis 6Y61B" can be seen on the right/top of the chassis.

clined in 1955 with sales to the Armed Forces declinina sharply, while all other segments of the company saw marked growth. The full line of Zenith radios is discussed in the report, but there is no mention of a tabletop shortwave.

Another possibility regarding the history of the set is that it was brought to market early

## More on CRC Radio Co. King Set A Steinite and Aero Too

The January 2008 A.R.C. "Photo Review" pictures Tom Ackerman's CRC Radio Co. "King." It reminded me of a similar set in my collection, which has a decal on the rear that says, "C.R.C. Chicago, III." The escutcheon on the front is labeled "Steinite." It is a TRF set and has the same tube lineup as the "King" — two Type 24As, one Type 47, and one Type 80.

An ad in the May 1933 issue of *Radio News* shows an "AERO 4-tube Midget" that uses the same cabinet as the "King" and the "Steinite." I'm sure I have seen an ad for another radio using the same cabinet (may have been Steinite), but after looking through about 50 magazines, I have been unable to find it.

The only visible differences among these three radios are the knobs and escutcheons.



## ELTROCOL MARK I

In February, 2007, A.R.C. received these strange photos from Alan McChesney. Although the item is not a radio, it certainly is radio related. He hoped that A.R.C. readers might be able to help him in finding more information on his ELTROCOL Mark I. A.R.C. did a little Web research and found the information on the toy robot which is included at the end of this article. Does anyone out there know any more on Alan's robot/computer item? (Editor)

I am enclosing some photos of something I bought about 20 years ago at an antique center in Clifton Park, New York. I have never been able to find any information about it and am hoping other A.R.C. readers may be able help.


As you can see in the photos. above the dial is written "ELTRO-COL Mark I" and on the left side. protected by a plastic lens, is "Computer Type T-I, Component of ELTBOCOL Mark I." The R7 robot fastened to the top was once a child's toy (of the late 1950s I think) that had wires run to a battery/switch box. The four wires from the robot are now connected to the computer circuit. The front panel has two toggle switches, three momentary push-button switches and a three-position rotary switch with a concentric knob to rotate the large dial (with three scales) that is attached to a pot.

The chassis is very well built and contains seven tube types one 12AT7, one 0A-2, three 5823s, a Mullard EM34 eye tube, and a Sylvania 6802 indicator tube. Also on the chassis are one relay and two pots with taper lock nuts labeled HF & LF. The unit connects to another component via an octal plug on the rear.

Any information about this unit would be greatly appreciated.




Alan McChesney's ELTROCOL Mark I.




The tag on the left side of Alan McChesney's EITroCol Mark I.






A close-up of the robot on the ELTROCOL Mark I.

## Flashy Jim on the Web

A bit of Web research tracked down the toy robot on Alan McChesney's EL: **TROCOL** Mark I as "Flashy Jim." Flashy Jim was made in the mid-1950s by a little known name in robot manufacture Japanese Sankei/SNK. Flashy Jim has a plain silver finish, a small antenna emerging from his head, a suggestion of a meter on his upper chest and an "R7" in a red circle on his chest. Flashy Jim is battery-powered, and a simple remote control commands his forward walking motion and illuminated eyes. He shuffles forward as his eyes light up.

## **COLLECTOR PROFILE**

## Pete Gray's Life in Radio A New A.R.C. Subscriber at Age 93

The following article first appeared in the "Albany Democrat-Herald," an Albany, Oregon, publication, on April 9, 2008. Pete Gray, at age 93, had just become a new subscriber to A.R.C., and he sent us the article. We, in turn, contacted the paper for the rights to reprint this perfect "Collector Profile." We are pleased to have collectors of all ages as new subscribers to A.R.C. (Editor)

Long before the far corners of the world were connected by cellular phones and the Internet, there were radios. Big, bulky radios in handsome wooden cabinets that operated not from microchips but from the miracle of glowing vacuum tubes. And there were radio repairmen like Preston "Pete" Grav.

In his tidy apartment at Alterra Villas of Albany, three large bookcases are filled with relics of that bygone era, dozens of antique radios and testing equipment accumulated over a lifetime of work in and around the radio business.

"I was born in California, but was almost born in Canada," Gray said. His father was a telegraph operator for the railroad, and the family moved around a bit.

Gray, who'll turn 93 this month, became interested in radios while he was in high school. Using information gleaned from books and magazines, he taught himself how to use radios for communication and to repair them.

"I graduated early from Marshfield High School in southern Oregon in 1932, when I also was licensed as a Ham operator," Gray said. "In the Depression my parents didn't have money to send me to college, but there was a trade school in Oakland, California, near where my grandmother lived. It was a state school and it was free. The program was six months long."

He returned to the Coos Bay area after graduation and offered to donate his time to a local radio repair shop, just to hone his skills.

"Radios were still pretty new at that time," Gray said. "I had fun and learned a lot. I was pretty good at it by then anyway."

He also learned both telegraph and radio Morse Code. He said there is a difference in the way the dots and dashes are played out.

"With radio Morse Code, you have to learn how to use spaces correctly," he said. He also learned to use a special key set that would allow him to send up to 35 words per minute compared to about 15 words per

minute with a regular telegrapher's key.

Gray attended Oregon State University off and on for parts of six years, interspersed with periods of work to pay for tuition. He studied both engineering and physics.

"I never got a degree, but I did teach night classes there," Gray said. "I kept running out of money and worked at a lumber company pulling green lumber for 50 cents per hour."

His life swayed away from radios for a brief period in 1939, when he became a traveling salesman based in Seattle, Washington. He married Jean Reynolds, a Corvallis girl, and they lived in Seattle while he traveled.

"I fell in love with her at our first dance on our first date," Gray said. They were married 63 years until her death in 2002.

After he gave up the sales job, Gray and his bride moved to Coos Bay, where he opened a radio repair shop and soon found himself adding a line of Hot Point appliances. But, in the World War II era, it became harder to get orders for appliances since factories were gearing up to support the war effort.

A local radio station owner had been begging Gray to become his engineer, even though he didn't have a license. Gray realized he might need to diversify, and he took and passed all three of the required licensing exams in one day.

For several years, he acted as the radio station's engineer and kept his own business operating at the same time. He also learned to be a disk jockey.

As his business grew, Gray began adding more shops, and within a few years owned stores in Coos Bay, Myrtle Point, Central Point and Eugene. But, in the 1950s, with a downtum in the economy and customers defaulting on their loans, Gray said he went "flat broke."

He took a job repairing TVs in Corvallis, but the urge to have his own business remained strong. He rented an empty building in Corvallis and started a radio and TV repair business. Again, he soon added furniture to his inventory and began to open more stores.

"TV was coming in big and I gave big trade-ins on TVs as a promotion for other fumiture sales," Gray said. "I'd fix up the old sets and sell them or rent them out for \$25 per month, with \$12 going toward the purchase price."

He eventually had stores in Corvallis, Philomath and Lebanon, as well as two stores in Albany. His son, Richard, continues to operate the store in downtown Albany. In addition to his son, he has three daughters and four grandchildren.

Gray worked until he was 87 years old, although he tried retirement for a short time in the 1980s.

"It just wasn't for me," he said. He still enjoys tinkering with old radios people drop off.

"I've had a wonderful life," Gray said. "I love it in Albany and I love living here. The people who work here and the people who live here are so friendly."

### Honey, Why Are The Smoke Detectors Beeping?

Previous issues of A.R.C. have carried stories of fires and explosions in radios. In this article, Ray describes another such occurrence. (Editor)

The multisection electrolytic capacitor shown on the right was removed from under the chassis of a radio given to me for repair. The owner said he got it for a good price because it didn't play. The reason for the set's not playing was obvious. During some previous repair, a chassis mounting screw that was much too long was used, and it pierced the electrolytic capacitor.


When the radio was turned on, the fireworks must have been impressive.

This self-inflicted disaster serves as a reminder that care should be taken when servicing radios. When replacing components make certain that there is sufficient clearance for the chassis-mounting screws. Likewise, make sure that the chassis-mounting screws are of the proper length. This point is especially true if the mounting hardware is not original.

Work safely and enjoy the hobby.

## Estes Auctions — The Mark Stein Collection Burbank, Ohio — February 23, 2008

The February Estes auction promised to be a notable event because of the sale of the famed Mark Stein collection. However, attendance at an Estes auction during the winter months requires planning and a close watch on the weather. The forecast called for a winter storm to be passing east through Ohio and Pennsylvania between Thursday and Friday preceding the auction.

After consulting the weather gods (radar maps are great nowadays), we decided to leave New Jersey Thursday afternoon and hopefully let the storm pass us while we were snug in a motel somewhere, maybe half way through Pennsylvania. That worked out perfectly, as we hit our motel just as the snow start**REPORTED BY RAY CHASE**

ed falling. We were able to complete our trek to Ohio, catching only the tail of the storm on Friday morning.

There are few if any radio collectors who do not know Mark Stein, at least through the many books and price guides that he has authored. He is also a regular at many radio conventions and swap meets. His collection was primarily 1930s and 1940s, AC-powered radios of famous designers, so the display of his collection was widely anticipated as an event not to be missed.

This was a large auction with probably 700 lots to be sold. The display on Friday was awesome, and yet because of space limitations, many display tables were three deep in radios. Here one could see dozens of truly rare and uncommon radios that probably would never again be seen together in one place. The viewing crowd on Friday afternoon/evening was particularly large with many new faces. This in spite of quite cold weather outside and the fact that the Expo Auction Center is not noted for having a very efficient heating system.

Since this was a highly personalized collection, there was not much in battery sets, Ham gear, military equipment, or books and paper. A great percentage of Mark's radios were wood table or consoles, yet there were still over 125 plastic radios of all types present. However, some consignors brought in battery sets on Saturday morning, probably intent on taking advantage of the hype about this collection.

Still battery sets seemed not to draw as well as they might have during this auction.

Clearly most buyers were here for the "pretty" stuff. And pretty it was — truly "eye candy" for those who were looking for radios that represented the best of many design genres. It appeared that more attention had been placed on the appearance of the radios than on their ability to function. This was only my opinion after peering into the in-




Every auction seems to include a breadboard. This Atwater Kent Model 10 with tubes and tags brought \$700.


nards of quite a few of the radios, although I could be mistaken since the working condition of the sets was not listed. Richard Estes had gone to great lengths to provide many pictures on the Estes website and to include a catalog of many of the sets in advertisements.

On Saturday, as is the usual format, a low value auction preceded the main auction at 9:00 A.M. There was little of note in this sale, and I recorded only one or two items. The number of bidders on Saturday was well over 100, and during the sale, quite a few "left bids" (bids left by absentee bidders) were exercised, as well as a few phone bids. I stopped recording at 4:30 P.M. as the crowd dwindled. There were still quite a few large tube lots to be processed at that time. It should be noted that there are large quantities of collector and repair tubes at these auctions. Over 60 lots were sold on this date, not counting the unrecorded bulk box lots.

The final sale realized over \$132,000 not counting the five percent buyers premium charged. The detailed price list (Continued on following page)


also does not include this premium or taxes as applicable. All in all, a very exciting day, one that many radio collectors will not forget for quite a while.




