Wireless Communication in the United States By Thorn L. Mayes

WIRELESS COMMUNICATION

IN THE IDNITED STATES

If your interests lie in wireless communication before the broadcast era. then this book is for you. The main theme is the study of early wireless apparatus

and its associated operating companies. In the first chapter. transmitters. receiving tuners. detectors are skillfully described as to their operation and construction. The second chapter scans the growth of commercial and government wireless stations in the Unites States prior to 1920

The third chapter. consisting of 175+ pages is broken down into twelve subchapters. These sections exemplify the development of early wireless companies,

some obscure and others more notable such as DeForest and Marconi. The chapter also narrates extensive biographical information about company pioneers, including some crooked dealings of stock promoters.

The fourth chapter is devoted to a biography o Harry Shoemaker, a prolific wireless inventor with well over 100 patents. The finals chapter consists of various letters from wireless pioneers such as Elmer Bucher, George Clark, Paul Godley, Lee DeForest, etc. These chapters provide insights into these pioneers' past achievements and include never-before published facts of a somewhat personal nature.

The book was initially introduced through lectures given over a 25-year period by Thorn Mayes. He gave seminars at AWA (Antique Wireless Association) conferences, some which were later published in the Old Timer's Bulletin or in separate monographs. Some chapters also

appeared in other club journals. Thorn Mayes' original material has been rewritten. to include additional facts, and has been prepared for publication by Art Goodnow

Robert and Nancy Merriam.

Once we began reading this book, we couldn't put it down. This book contains information unavailable elsewhere on many early wireless companies. Thorn Mayes' precise writing style should be a guide for us all. His thirst for a complete and accurate account of wireless history is exhibited in a "Bibliography/Reference" list at the end of each chapter. Radio historians have been waiting for this book which many will be able to use for research on early

wireless companies. The book contains many fascinating biographies about wireless inventors, promoters and entrepreneurs who played an important part in the technological and social development of wireless telegraphy. High quality photographs are abundantly placed throughout the text, many of which we have never seen before, a result of Thorn Maves' and Bob Merriam's archives.

On a scale of one to ten, Wireless Communication in the United States certainly rates a ten. The book fills a void on every radio historian's bookshelf. The only disparaging remark about the book is the fact that it is only available in softcover. My copy is already shopworn after two weeks of use! We would like to see a hardcover edition which could hold up to continuous use in early wireless reference work.



EDITOR'S COMMENTS

The preservation of old radios and radio history — few orgainzations have served this cause as long and as well as AWA. In looking over the report on AWA's 47th conference contributed primarily by Ray Chase and Larry Babcock, I was struck by how comprehensive and broad-based this annual event continues to be. These are the qualities that make me say once again that, "if you can go to only one meet, make it to this one."

Of course, we report on other meets that have become larger overall. Our own annual one-day meet in Westford, Massachusetts, has had a larger attendance than that of AWA, and other meets have larger crowds and flea markets. But different clubs place emphasis on different activities, and so it is difficult to compare "apples to

apples."

However, AWA always gives attendees the big picture of vintage radio, radio collecting, and radio history. You can count on an exceptional old equipment contest, a good number of international attendees, well-presented and attended seminars, and an excellent auction. In addition, the inclusion of a "Book Fair" filled by dealers in old books and ephemera may be unique to this meet. And don't forget the proximity to the AWA Museum, which is growing into a new 15,000 sq. ft. facility. We have much to look forward to there.

The old equipment contest had many outstanding, well-documented entries. Bob Feczko's Motorola portable display on our cover is an example. Another is David Bart's 150th anniversary of the Atlantic Cable display, which stretched over three tables, and took a first in the open category.

The auction too offered a wide range of items totalling \$28,000. Items of particular interest spanned the 1920s to the 1960s; for example, a 1920s blue Neutrowound battery set sold for \$1,100 while a 1960s vintage tube-type McIntosh amplifier sold for \$1,000. Foreign sets were also highlights: a British Mark II sold for \$1,000; an early German lab demonstration coherer set for \$2,300; and an Austrian 1890 brass key, sounder and register for \$2,000. For me, a "sleeper" was the unusual Standardyne multivalve set selling at \$275, although the "three-tubes-in-one" tube was not operative.

What we always try to do in these meet and auction reports is to present highlights and photos of the unusual in order to give those of you who could not attend a feeling for what went on. AWA deserves credit for its efforts in recent years to improve all aspects of this annual conference to conform more with present-day demands. I saw a lot of happy faces in the flea market and

elsewhere this year, so I recommend that you include AWA in your 2009 summer plans.

The happy result of Don Watson's hard labor is shown in his article on giving a Zenith Royal 750 a new cabinet and a new life. After doing an electrical restoration, Don faced the problem of what to do about the cowhide case, which was beyond repair. Since the grille was uncommon and worth preserving, he decided to build a totally new wood cabinet. You readers might be inspired to use his gluing and clamping techniques to do a restoration job yourselves. Hats off to Don.

And hats off to Loren Ashworth too for his crusade to salvage the wonderful old scopes of the 1960s. Those of you who might have been working in the labs of those days remember marveling at the expertise and superb craftsmanship in the instruments produced by Tektronix, General Radio, Hewlett Packard, and others. Loren himself brought a Tektronix Type 545A back to life. It seems these instruments are under appreciated today, and they are available cheap. Most of us are nostalgic about the radios we once saw in the kitchens and living rooms of our earlier years, but why not add scopes to that list?

MEET AND AUCTION REPORT

Antique Wireless Association Conference and Auction Report Rochester, New York — August 20-23, 2008

The 47th AWA conference was held August 20-23, 2008. at the RIT Conference Center. Rochester, New York. Registration began on Wednesday from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m., and though vendors could park in the flea market area, selling was not permitted until the grand opening on Thursday morning. In contrast to the rainy preceding year, the weather was good, and there was a generally relaxed atmosphere as old friends met to trade radio stories and enhance their collections. They also had the opportunity to encourage new interest in radio collecting, as the event was advertised to nonmembers and at least 20 responded to the offer. Registrants totaled 402, down from 496 last year.

Of course the decline in attendance is an ongoing con-

cern. Looking back to the year 2000 when attendance was 981, we realize that many factors have been at work here—the Internet, the recent economy, and the aging radio collecting population. Nevertheless, it is obvious that all of us interested in preserving radio history need to do more outreach to new and younger collectors.

Hats off to AWA for beginning that process by opening the meet to nonmembers this year in the interest of staying viable and finding new blood to keep the hobby alive. For many years, other organizations have welcomed the general public for a single admission fee and found it to be a profitable way to go. Wider advertising of this policy in future years should


allow AWA to reap similar rewards.

Another step in the right direction was moving the meet closer to the weekend by starting on Thursday rather than Wednesday. The next good move in the interest of flea market business and generally larger participation would be a Friday to Sunday schedule.

Your editor's personal count of dealers in the flea market as of midday Thursday was 66; but later, Greg Farmer gave me his count of 88. Again looking back over the years, this number is down. I do not have the dealer number for 2006, but Greg reported 120 for 2007. For 2005,

I have 115, and for 2004, 123. The peak was 225 in 1997. Obviously, the Internet (and lack of new faces) is taking its toll. However, sellers this year seemed generally happy with sales.

One exception might be the booksellers who were relegated to back rooms instead of the open court of past years. Though this was a quieter atmosphere, the negative exposure meant less traffic and low-

er sales. Naturally, they hope for a return to the open court next year.

GENERAL ACTIVITIES

The Wednesday night "Mixer" with cash bar and hors d'oeuvres was followed by a seminar given by Tom Perera and Russ Kleinman on "Wireless in World War I and World War II Submarines and the Enigma." On Thursday Bob Murray presented "Radios Made in Canada in the 1920s," which attracted the many Canadians who attend this event. Bob who is (Continued on following page)

(AWA 2008 Conference, continued) from Vancouver, BC, shared information from his new book, Early Development of Radio in Canada.

In all, eleven seminars were presented, covering a wide range of subjects from radar to amateur radio, telegraph, mechanical television, pre-1912 apparatus, and restoration. Even European radios were covered by Bengt Svensson who came from Sweden for the 23rd time to this annual conference.

Bengt's presentation tied in with the old equipment contest theme which was international radio. The idea was to encourage sharing information about the radios of other countries, and the display categories included South and Central America, Europe, Canada, Asia, Africa, and Australia.

Bob Lozier can always be relied on to supply interesting European sets. This time he brought along no fewer than three Polish sets. Three seemed to be the magic number, as Geoffrey Bourne also displayed three early European sets — an AFRA RE-10 battery set, a Bundept 3-valve set, and a Siemens AC set.

Rich Brewster's 1948 Pye Model M78F battery portable from England was an eyecatcher. This extremely rare set has an interesting history with its Japanese flag design, so un-


popular after the war, that it was recalled and destroyed in a bonfire at the Pye factory.


There were many outstanding entries in the Standard category. Merrill Bancroft's nice TEC-LA display included two rare items — a 1-tube receiver and a 2-tube amplifier. There were also photos of the Thomas E. Clark Co. TECLA factory in Detroit.

In addition, Merrill showed an unusual tuner and amplifier from the Campbell Company of Lynn, Massachusetts. This company also made quack medical equipment.

A display of Atlantic Cable items relating to the 150th anniversary was a blue-ribbon entry by David and Julia Bart. The Doron Bros. radio products of 1911-1922 entered by Charles Stinger made another blue-ribbon display winner. In all, attendees were treated to an exhibit of outstanding items.

Many attendees always look forward to a visit to the museum, and this year was no exception. An additional attraction was to go out to the location of the new 15,000 square foot multibuilding campus which will ultimately also house the museum. Currently, the new library

is almost completely furnished, and the huge job of cataloging and photographing the museum collection is underway.

On Friday night, the annual Awards Banquet was greatly enjoyed by 104 attendees. The highlight of the evening was an excellent slide presentation and talk by Eric Wenaas about his experiences in writing his highly regarded book Radiola — The Golden Age of RCA, 1919-1929.

THE AUCTION

As usual, Richard Estes ably conducted the auction assisted by his brother John, and Bob Dobush, all from Ohio. The regular crew of AWA members, who do a fine job, also clerked and moved goods throughout the sale. The format started with the tube sale at 9:00 A.M., on to books and paper goods at 10:15, and finally to general equipment at 11:10. The auction concluded at 3:35 P.M., and the sale total was a bit over \$28,000.

According to our auction reporter Ray Chase, this AWA auction was an interesting affair. The separate Ham/communications equipment auc-

tion was combined with the general auction several years ago, and the result is that some interesting communications and military equipment now shows up in the general auction. Also of interest was quite an assortment of foreign radio/telegraph items, probably brought by the European and Canadian participants.

While a few high prices were realized, in general, there were a lot of bargains here. Maybe the low prices were a result of the soft economy or the declining attendance at this convention. At the same time, there was a larger than usual number of "no-sale" items.

A total of 329 lots were offered for sale, and 42 of them could not make reserves set by the consignors or could not draw a bid. This is 13 percent of the total, and many of the reserves were not wildly unreasonable. Ray expressed regret that he didn't have more funds available and/or room to carry the stuff home.

The top-priced item was a German lab demonstration coherer and decoherer set that brought a price of \$2,300. Another rare item was a Hotspot 14-tube battery superhet in great shape that went for a very reasonable \$500.

There were several good box lots of tubes selling for up to \$600, but they are not included in the listing because of the mixture of tube types.

Plans are already underway for the 2009 AWA Conference, August 20-23. Be sure to mark your calendars.

The top photo shows a close-up of the coherer itself, the glass tube, center of photo, and the bell/tapper mechanism. When a radio signal is received, the metal filings inside the glass tube "cohere" or stick together. This action completes a DC circuit, which, via a sensitive relay seen on the left of the lower photo, rings the bell and taps the glass tube. The tapping shakes the metal filings loose, breaking the DC circuit, and the detector is ready for the next radio signal.







RESTORATION TOPICS

A New Cabinet and New Life for an Old Zenith Royal 750

BY DON WATSON

Sometimes we pass up the purchase of a radio because of the poor condition of the cabinet. In this article, Don Watson shows us how such a radio can be salvaged. His cabinet building and restoration techniques are applicable to many a cabinet restoration project. (Editor)

While at a flea market, my wife wandered off and found this Zenith transistor radio, a Royal 750, circa 1959, in need of a home. She wrapped it up and put it under the Christmas tree for my next restoration project. The set had a cowhide case and a classic grille made of diecast anodized aluminum. These grilles have not been made for many, many years and have been replaced by cheap plastic — just another reason to preserve this set.

I no longer have a photo of the set in its original state, but Figure 1, from Sams Photofact Picture Guide, Vol. 6, pg. 294, shows what it should have looked like.

The cowhide case was in very poor condition, but the radio had a lot of potential. It did work, but the volume was quite low. After I had changed the

electrolytic capacitors, the radio sounded like new. I checked the alignment and found it to be spot-on, even after all these years.

Zenith radios were always known for their good sound and quality construction. This 8-transistor set features planetary drive tuning, a tuned RF stage, and a rather large audio output transformer driving a 4" speaker. I replaced the battery case with a 9-volt wall wart, since the set won't be used for portable operation.

BUILDING A NEW WOOD CASE

I decided to build a new wooden cabinet for this deserving radio, but I didn't want it to look as if I had put it in a cigar box. I had been successful building cathedral-style speaker cabinets in the past and decided to apply this technique to a new case, but with some degree of style. Figure 2 shows the result — the Zenith Royal 750 in its new wooden cabinet.

I like to use a 1/6" birch plywood that is meant for this application. The plywood can be obtained at woodworking or hardwood stores, but is not found at home centers. It was first necessary to build the frame for wrapping the wood around. I cut the plywood blank oversized and left it to soak in water for about four hours, weighted down and not allowed to float. The next step required extra hands to perform the bending process.

I clamped the plywood at one end, and then used a heat gun set on high as the steam generator. At this

point, the wood cannot be allowed to dry out, so that is where the extra hands come in. While I applied heat and some pressure, my wife was spraying both sides of the plywood to keep it wet. This is done very slowly, and you can feel the wood yield to the pressure as heat is applied. No glue was used to make sure there was no damage to the plywood.




Figure 3. A second right view showing the sub-chassis open. It's all tubes, except for the many silicon diodes in the B+ power supply visible above and left of the massive power supply transformer.

Then I applied carpenter's yellow glue to the frame and wrapped the plywood around it. This takes about every clamp you can find. Be sure to use scrap wood blocks between the clamp and the wood to avoid dimples in the wood. (Figure 3 shows Don hard at work in the gluing and clamping process.)

I used only glue and no metal fasteners, and the plywood was allowed to dry overnight with the help of a fan. Figure 4 shows the plywood wrapped around the frame and clamped for overnight drying. Figure 5 shows another clamping setup.

The birch plywood takes stain very well, but you can also use a hardwood veneer like oak, walnut, or mahogany applied with contact cement. These veneers can be applied to other restoration projects for that like-new appearance.

For the finish, I like to use MinWax satin polyurethane in a spray can. Don't get discouraged after the first finish coat, since it doesn't always look great. Sand the first coat using a 400-grit sandpapercalled "Between Coats." Wipe off the dust using a tack cloth and repeat the process three or four more times to build a professional looking finish. I prefer the satin or semigloss to a highgloss finish. You can look at other pieces of furniture to get an idea of what look is best for your application.

These grand old radios will never be produced again and deserve your restoration efforts. Nothing seems to sound like that new/old wood radio.

VINTAGE TEST EQUIPMENT

The Tektronix Type 545A Scope Save Our Scopes!

BY LOREN P. ASHWORTH

Many of us remember using these wonderful old instruments in our early collecting days. As described here, putting them back into working order is a worthwhile endeavor. (Editor)

The classic Tektronix Type 545A with camera bezel, ca 1958-1960, shown in Figure 1, was recently rescued. Figure 2 shows the scope with the Type CA dual-trace, plugin slid out to show its tubes. The unit provides both standard and time delay sweep. A very early example of a time delay scope, it was complete when given to me, save four or five 6DJ8 tubes that had been removed by some previous owner.

The slightly modified instrument sports an incredible tube count of 88 tubes. Around 500 watts of power are required to operate the scope. Figure 3 provides another right-hand view of the scope with the subchassis in open position. Figure 4 shows even more of the tubes and a view inside the plug-in module.

Unlike my newer Type 543B scope, the 545A has a tube lineup of pretty standard types. Any radio hobbyist would recognize the types from radio, TV and audio numbers. In contrast, the 1962-1964 Type 543 has several industrial tubes, as well as a transistor circuit, in addition to the many standard types.

MAKING IT WORK

Upon receiving the scope, I had to find out if it worked. First, I replaced the missing

6DJ8 tubes with cheaper used Type 6BQ7s. The B+buzzed noisily and would not latch on (the relay comes on after the tubes light up). With a screwdriver, I forced the armature down hard for a few seconds and — voila, it held!

Some experience with my working Type 543B scope, a little newer unit, (see A.R.C., May 2004, "Photo Review") helped me to fiddle this set to get a trace. The unit contains a square wave generator/calibrator, which is rather touchy, but it works. Many sockets and controls were dirty, but the trace came up finally.

SAVE THESE UNITS

These units cost thousands of dollars when new in 1958-1960 — probably the

price of a new auto. This one is reasonably clean inside, and except for the bad relay, it still functions.

I hope this article encourages anyone who can to salvage these scopes. They are boat anchors for sure, but they don't take up much room. I hate to see them just discarded with their superb workmanship and engineering.
