Finding the Hallicrafters SX-111 receiver and HT-37 transmitter at what appeared to be a minor house auction was one thing, but coming across the cabinets by chance in the house basement was another. Claude reminds us of the pleasure in finding such equipment and bringing it back to life.

Every Estes Auction, as reported by Ray Chase, offers similar opportunities. Whether you find a treasure fully restored or one begging for your attention, the rewards can be great. This particular auction was not full of high-end sets, but it did contain a selection of early hi-fi and broadcast equipment, some interesting parts, military equipment, and microphones.

In fact, this was not a typical radio-only auction, but offered a little of everything. Ray's report does what auction reports do best — it gives an idea of how collecting and pricing are related. We are all aware of the history of the rise in prices for high-end radios, such as those manufactured by E.H. Scott. Now we begin to see hi-fi equipment, by such companies as McIntosh, following the same trend as radio. There are many angles to the story of collecting radios.

As for stories, Jerry Berg could be called the official storyteller of the history of shortwave radio. Bart Lee has reviewed in glowing terms Jerry's two new books: LISTENING on the Short Waves 1945 to Today and BROADCASTING on the Short Waves 1945 to Today. These books are companions to Jerry's earlier book covering 1923 to 1945, so now we have the complete story of this extraordinary development in communications history. These new books will inspire you to try out the shortwave bands on the radios in your collection — you can just settle back and reenter the radio world of earlier decades.

Tom Stevens also brings our attention to an earlier decade with a 1920s W.S.A. Type Triode E 2step amplifier. He hopes readers can come up with more information on this set. Tom's request for help is a reminder of one of A.R.C.'s chief services making connections with fellow collectors.

Hope you make even more connections at Radio XLI on Valentine's Day or at any other radio event you may be able to attend.

RESTORATION TOPICS

Templetone Model BP2-A5 "Morale Radio" A Restoration

BY DANIEL SCHOOL

This is Daniel Schoo's third article based on his work restoring the Templeton set. The first dealt with paper capacitor rebuilding (A.R.C., October '09); the second with dial cover making (A.R.C. December '10). Now Dan gives us the full story of this restoration. (Editor)


Figure 1. The Templeton BP2-A5 as found and described as "junk" by one viewer and "cute" by another. The raised cover shows a station log card.

One day my wife Donna came home to find another orphan left on the doorstep. She e-mailed me at work and told me that there was an "old junk radio" in the driveway. When I got home I found a cute little military radio in fairly good condition considering its past. The set as found is shown in Figure 1. The name-plate, as shown in Figure 2, says "Templetone" and Type "BP2-A5." It was a little beat up, but all the parts were there and the chassis was in good condition. The tuning covered the AM broadcast band and shortwave from 6 to 18 MHz.

Templetone was a name I'd heard, but I didn't know anything about it. After some research, I found that Templetone was a fairly large company before World War II located in New London, Connecticut. A 1944 advertisement is shown in Figure 3. The story goes that they did fairly well until they manufactured their first television set. The set used a power transformer that was underrated and prone to burning up. Apparently, their problems were severe enough to bankrupt the company, and in 1949 they went out of business.

THE "AS-WAS" CONDITION

The BP2-A5 was housed in a simple plywood box painted the typical military olive drab color.

The case was battered and dinged up but essentially sound and unbroken. See Figures 4 and 5. Looking over the set, I found that work had been

done on it. The original carrying handle had been replaced with a leather strap handle. A loop antenna was attached inside the case, as shown in




Figure 6, and wired to the longwire antenna input. Also seen in the figure is the graying (actually green) on the chassis which, like many military items, had been coated with M.F.P. (Moisture Fungus Protection) varnish. The original battery plug was replaced with a different type. Also a small microswitch that switched off the filament battery when the front cover was closed had been added, as shown in Figure 7.

There were several station log cards still inside the front cover. One side of the card had a typical station log entry form, and on the other side was a schematic diagram of the radio. The sche(Continued on following page)




Figure 8. The silk-screened schematic on the inside back cover.

matic was also silk screen printed on the inside of the radio back cover, as seen in Figure 8. The schematic showed a representation of the battery plug, and it did not match the plug in the radio, so I knew that it had been replaced, probably to accommodate a different type of battery that was less expensive or easier to get.

When I found that the filaments in every tube were blown, I deduced that someone had probably miswired the battery, connecting the 90-volt B battery to the 1.5-volt filaments and burning them up. Still, the connector was wired correctly as found. The battery was housed in a separate compartment inside the cabinet and below the chassis. It must have been a real job to replace the battery. Ten screws must be removed to take the back of the radio off and access the battery. The ten screw holes can be seen in Figure 5.

BEGINNING THE RESTORATION

The first thing I did was to remove the modifications. Whoever had installed the loop antenna did a really nice job. He did not cut or modify any of the original wiring, so I was able to restore it to original rather easily. He had mounted the antenna using four existing screws that were meant for the original metal carry handle.

To get more information on this radio I contacted a fellow member of the Tube Collectors of America, who is also a member of a military radio collectors' club. He got me in touch with Tom Laszynski, a military radio collector who has a BP2-A5 in his collection. Tom was an enormous help. He took several photographs showing the original handle and the control markers. He also had an original owner's manual, and he was kind enough to make photocopies of it for me. I found out from the manual that the radio was made for the British Ministry of Supply Mission through the U.S. Signal Corps in 1944.

DUPLICATING THE CONTROL MARKERS

The three control markers on the set were very unusual. I had one damaged original on the radio, seen in Figure 7, lower right, and a photo showing what the others looked like. The manufacturer had used thumbtacks with a sort of paper overlay molded around the heads. The markings were printed on them indicating the function of the switch positions and then coated with a bright green clear coating. The tacks were pressed into the plywood front panel next to the control knobs.

There was one labeled "OFF" next to the power switch/volume control. Two more were next to the band switch, one indicating "B" for the standard AM broadcast band and the other indicating "SW" for shortwave.

To duplicate these, I had to start from scratch and make a set of thumbtacks the size of the originals since they were a little bigger than the usual thumbtack size. I started by punching out ½6" diameter slugs of thin mild steel on a Rotex shop punch. After that, I flattened the slugs and then drilled and countersunk the center dimple on each one. I inserted a small nail Into the countersunk side and glued it in with a blob of epoxy. After the epoxy cured, I sanded the head smooth and flat, and then I rounded the edges by sanding them with a Dremel Moto tool. This got me to the point where I had a set of thumbtacks the proper size and shape.

Next, I spray painted the heads flat white to provide a neutral base for the final step. To get the heads the proper color and apply the markings, I used Photoshop Elements on the computer. Using a flatbed scanner, I scanned an image of the original tack into a digital image file. I sampled the color of the tack from that file and used the sample

to paint the background in a new image.

I went through the available fonts and picked out one that was pretty close to the one on the existing tack. I typed the appropriate lettering and then, using the photo editor functions, I tweaked the lettering a bit to make it match in size and style. Now I had the lettering on the correct background color. I printed that image onto very thin tissue paper using a high quality color laser printer. (How I did that is an article in itself!)




Figure 9. The various steps of duplicating the control markers.

I cut out the individual markings and glued them to the tack heads, wrapping the paper around the sides and twisting it tightly around the nail. After the glue was dry, I trimmed the excess paper off at the back edge of the head with a sharp knife. To finish the job, I sprayed the heads with several coats of clear high gloss acrylic to fix and protect the paper covering. The various steps of the process are shown in Figure 9.

OTHER CHALLENGES

The plastic dial cover was split and needed to be replaced as shown in Figure 7. I bought a kit from Dialcover.com and

made a new one. I had never made a dial cover before. That took a little practice and experimentation, but I managed, and it turned out very nicely. (See A.R.C., December '09).

The carry handle was more of a challenge. The original handle was some hardware product that probably hadn't been manufactured for many years. Donna and I searched through flea markets, antique markets, and garage sales for something close, but we didn't find anything. I found one that was really close on a website for furniture hardware, so I ordered it. When I got the handle, it was not the same as shown in the picture on the website, but it would have to do. At least the screw hole footprint matched.

On the chassis as shown in Figure 10, I had the usual things to fix. Many of the paper capacitors were leaky and needed to be replaced. I gutted them out and rebuilt them with new Mylar capacitors inside. Although this is a lot more trouble than just replacing them, I prefer to try to keep the original look under the chassis if possible, while making the radio functional. I found that several carbon composition resistors were out of tolerance.

The volume control had been replaced with a huge one that barely fit under the chassis. The shaft was too short to attach the knob so there was no knob on it. Besides that, the control shaft was frozen. To match the other shafts, the original volume control would have had a plain shaft ½" in diameter with no flats and 1" long. My friend Dan Johnson looked through his junk box to see if

he could find one like that. He found one with exactly the right shaft, with the right resistance, and with a switch attached to the back. (Some of you longtime readers might remember my July 1993 A.R.C. article about Dan Johnson's 1929 Kylectron electrostatic speaker.)

After replacing all the tubes, I powered the radio up on my bench power supplies, and it worked. I cleaned the band switches, went through alignment, and the electrical work was done. Now I had to deal with the cabinet.

THE CABINET

Naturally, the cabinet was showing the years, and it needed some work. I removed the press fit, rusted steel feet from the bottom of the cabinet, (Continued on following page)




Figure 11. A rusted steel foot on the bottom of the cabinet ready to be removed and bead-blasted.




Figure 13. The holes and dings were filled with Elmer's Wood Filler.




Figure 14. The holes and dings are ready for sanding and paint.

(See Figure 11) and I bead-blasted them to remove the heavy coating of rust. The cabinet had extra holes drilled in it where the replacement handle (see Figure 12) and door switch were mounted. I filled the extra holes and dings with Elmer's Wood Filler, shown in Figure 13 and 14. When it dried, I sanded it out smooth. With the holes and case damage filled, the cabinet was ready to paint.

To get the proper color, I took the front panel to a local paint store and had them scan it with their computerized color scanner. They mixed a quart of custom paint the same color as the original. I gave the cabinet two coats of paint using a small trim roller for the flat surfaces and a small artist's brush to get into the crevices. I asked a friend who has an airbrush to paint the new carrying handle for me.

After the paint was dry, I reassembled the cabinet and attached the various accessories, namely, the dial cover, carry handle, control markers, knobs and nameplate. Many of the original screws were missing, damaged, or badly rusted, so I replaced them.

FINAL STEPS

Probably the most amount of work was invested in reprinting a copy of the owner's manual. This project could be another article on its own, but I'll describe the highlights. Tom Laszynski sent me a photocopy of the manual. He offered to scan it and send it to me in digital form, but I preferred a photocopy because they are very high resolution due to the analog nature of Xerography. The downside is that copied photographs tend to get a little muddy. I scanned the copies at very high resolution and imported them into my old workhorse Photoshop Elements.

Tom described some of the lettering in the manual as red and the cover as a grey lightweight card stock. I digitally restored each page and formatted the pages into booklet form saving the whole thing as an Adobe Acrobat

multipage file. I printed the pages double-sided on a high quality laser printer, using grey cardstock for the cover. I stapled the prints together and folded them into booklet form.

FINAL THOUGHTS

Overall, I probably spent more time and money on this project than it is worth, but in the process,




Figure 17. An interior view of the finished product with the back cover off showing the schematic on the inside.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

A Hallicrafters Junker at Auction SX-111 Receiver, R-48 Speaker and HT-37 Transmitter

Never pass an "Auction Today" sign by is the moral of Claude Chafin's story. And never hesitate to look even further than the auction itself, if the opportunity presents itself. (Editor)

Imagine yourself one spring day driving home when you see a sign posting "Auction Today." Curious, you investigate, hoping to find something of interest.

In the spring of 2009, that was what happened to me here in Kansas City in a local suburb. Upon entering the house where the auction was being held, I found what appeared to be some old Amateur radio equipment. Only the chassis were present, no cabinets. Turns out the equipment was a Hallicrafters SX-111 receiver and matching R-48 speaker plus the companion HT-37 transmitter.

They didn't look very handsome without the cabinets, but I bought them anyway for very little money. Before leaving, I snooped around the empty house There in the basement were the manuals for both radios. Then I noticed these large vented metal cabinets. Could I be so lucky? Sure enough, they were the cabinets for the radios. The auctioneer was all too happy to give them to me free of charge. "Everything left in the house," he said, "is going to be cleaned out." Figures 1 and 2 show the SX-111, R-48 and HT-37 after restoration.

RESTORATION

Once I got them home, I could begin playing with my new "old" toys. Both power cords were in sad shape. To be safe one needs to install new cords of the 3-prong variety.

I started with the receiver — cleaning the chassis, testing and cleaning all the tubes, cleaning air capacitors and the dial lens, installing the new

power cord, and replacing the electrolytics. Some of the mounting screws were missing, but a trip to the hardware store resolved that problem. In the end, I had a great receiver and matching speaker.

Then came the transmitter. It had a relay with a jumble of wires connected to it when I bought it. I thought maybe it was some sort of interconnecting relay for the receiver. Turns out I was right. The contacts were dirty and needed cleaning.




Figure 3. Hams will skip a heart beat when they see a chassis this clean. The two 6146 output tubes can be seen in the upper center of the photo.

The HT-37 transmitter uses two 6146 tubes in it its final stage. The original tubes tested OK. Figure 3 shows the 6146s and the clean chassis.




Figure 4. New electrolytic capacitors, upper right, shown installed in the transmitter chassis.

It also uses two 20MF/600V electrolytics capacitors. I didn't even bother testing these. Knowing that 50-year-old electrolytic capacitors are not dependable, I changed them out for brand new ones; see Figure 4. Why risk a short, open circuit, or who knows what? The power cord was again easy to replace.

The transmitter calls for a high impedance microphone. I already had an old Astatic 10-D I found at a recent Hamfest, perfect for this set up.

The receiver cabinet was in good shape, but the transmitter cabinet had to be repainted. It has an odd shade of gray and today's modern paints don't come anywhere close. Luckily, I found that you can buy an industrial brand that comes pretty close to a match.

JUNK NO MORE

Both radios are now functional. as shown in Figure 5. For me, that's part of the fun of finding, restoring, and operating an old piece of equipment that someone had discarded as "Auction Junk."

The 1960 ARRL Ham Radio Manual shows these radios in a new release advertisement in the back of the book. The picture in the ad has the transmitter, receiver, matching speaker and even the Astatic 10-D microphone that I already have matched up with it.

My plan is to have these radios on 20 and 40 meters for Field Day 2010 as a 50th Year Anniversary Special Event Station, NOFMO. A handsome QSL card will be available, if you QSL directly.


Estes Auctions Burbank, Ohio — February 21, 2009

What's the worst thing that could happen to a professional auctioneer? Well, I guess that it would be coming down with a strep throat the day before a big auction, and that is what happened to Richard Estes at the February auction. Fortunately, his brother John is also a professional auctioneer, and he stepped in to conduct the entire radio auction and did a bang-up job of it.

Original ads for this auction did not indicate much that was unusual, but quite a number of unique items showed up. This auction was originally supposed to contain much of the late Jim Fred's estate, but poor weather and a difficult location prevented the pick up of Jim's stuff, so that material will be sold at a later date. Several other estates and a few items from the Marconi Museum in New Hampshire were included.

The weather for this sale was cold and clear, but a snowstorm was predicted to move through later on Saturday. Saturday morning the temperature was 11 degrees above, and the auction hall heat was supplemented by an industrial space heater that was kept running most of the




The old and the older — the vintage Majestic Model 766 sold for \$175, and the Watkins Engineering WE-1 speakers sold for \$900.

day and added to the noise level. The room was reasonably comfortable, if you had several layers of clothing on. The snowstorm held off until after the auction was over and the outside temperature rose to the 40s in the afternoon, but some buyers

who had to travel westward left early to beat the oncoming storm.

This was a large auction of more than 650 lots, not counting the early morning low-value goods auction and the two side auctions of transistor/novelty radios and bulk tube lots. None of these were recorded. The 8:30 A.M. low-value auction was packed with items, and more were coming in on Saturday morning. This auction was handled by Mark Delauder in quick fashion, but still just managed to finish at 10 A.M. I have listed a few select items from this sale; suffice it to say that quite a few cars and vans were loaded even before the main auction started. The main auction contained a

mix of goods, including quite a lot of audio and studio equipment, some of which had Braille markings added to the various controls. There were more than the usual Browning Drake battery sets and a lot of home-brew battery sets. In general, prices were on the low side.

As the crowd thinned out around 3:50 P.M., requests were taken for items to be brought up, and many lots sold for only \$5. The auction ended about 4:30 P.M. with a fair amount of leftovers that will be held for the next sale. The total sale value was over \$30,000, not including the 5 percent buyer's premium. Richard is fortunate in having a large crew

that includes several auctioneers and particularly a brother auctioneer who could step in and handle the complete sale in a forthright manner.







In response to the inquiry about the World Radio Corp. in the November 2009 issue, I found the following information: "The Battery Set Compendium" lists this company as operating at 349 Washington St. in Boston. It offered three TRF radio models in 1926 and one in 1927. World Radio apparently appears in the "Radio Retailing Receiving Sets 1926-27" listing. The company is reported as having advertised in *Radio News* for October 1927. And sure enough, that issue contains a one-sixth-page display ad offering a rather simply styled, 5-tube 3-dialer for \$24.50.

The "Compendium" assembled by Greg Hunoldt, is an 11-meg Excel data base covering 1920s radios. The 2009 version lists 5,921 radios from 1,768 (!) companies. It's available as a free download from the Wisconsin Antique Radio Club website, www.warci.org. (See the link on the lower left corner of the home page under "Resources.") The "Compendium" has proven to be a great resource for researching obscure companies.
