

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

If the welcome spring weather isn't enough to get you out on the radio trail, a report on a superlative auction might just do the trick. Auctions are a source not only of a great find, but also of great sightseeing. Ray Chase describes both at an Estes auction of what was primarily the Kenneth Zander collection. This was a truly significant auction of more than 525 lots, 33 of which sold for over \$1,000 each. Proceeds totalled over \$173,000.

Hard to miss was the amazing number of consoles, including the star of the show — a stunning Zenith 1000Z Stratosphere selling at \$39,000. A photo on page 8 compares the sheer size of this set to other consoles of normal size.

Perhaps the real story of this auction is the number of unusual items offered, including the two radio lamps that I had never seen before. Other examples were the advertising pieces like a moving Majestic clock and a Stewart-Warner cottage radio displaying an ad for a product called "Pure." These sold for impressive prices — \$1,300 and \$1,700 respectively. They are a reminder that a collection display can be augmented greatly by unusual radios and related items.

Such items would have caught the eye of our colleague Dick Desjarlais, who often brought us stories in his articles of the odd pieces that he found along his way as a collector. In a special article by Managing Editor Dorothy Schecter, we remember Dick, a member of the A.R.C. staff for many years, who passed away on February 16, 2010.

Dick's passion for our hobby is often reflected in articles from those of you who have concentrated on a particular manufacturer. Ralph Jackson offers his second article on Halson radios, a relatively uncommon focus of a collection, as indicated by Slusser's 7th edition price guide which shows only seven Halsons in a listing of over 10,000 entries. But, Ralph has come up with a model with a mystery attached, and he hopes readers have some suggestions or theories to add to his

Jerry Wieland too is looking for more clues about his Coast Guard receiver, which is also a bit of a mystery. As Jerry points out, even the ubiquitous Internet doesn't always come up with the answers. These days we tend to go to the Internet first and sometimes hesitate to ask fellow collectors for information. Ironically, Jerry went full circle in his quest — from a club

member to the Internet and back to another club member.

The moral of the story — keep on asking questions of all sources, not just in your search for information, but also for radios in stores or yard sales. Because Jerry revealed his interest in radios in a seemingly unlikely store, the owner pulled the Coast Guard radio out from under the counter. So don't hesitate to ask wherever you go, and don't let fear of the price being jacked up deter you.

"Photo Review" always opens up more questions, as in the case of a 1930s Reporter radio with no markings, except a serial number. And there is also a number of photos submitted by Clark Trissell and included for their variety. Clark has been a contributor of excellent photos to "Photo Review" for so many years we've lost count. Needless to say, we're grateful for his steady support.

Sometimes a "Photo Review" submission is interesting or unusual enough to warrant a special notice. A case in point is Ray Chase's Crosley WWII "Morale Radio," which has spare socketed tubes for each active tube in the set.

In all, that's what A.R.C. is all about — presenting the unusual, asking the questions, helping you to find answers in order to further enhance your collections and preserve radio history. Here's to a fruitful spring and summer to do just that.

Estes Auctions — The Zander Collection Burbank, Ohio — May 23, 2009

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

It is difficult to find superlatives to describe the Estes auction of May 2009, especially since the prior Estes auction that I had attended in March was mainly a bargain basement affair. What a difference this auction was in that there was an excess of magnificent radios on display and available for those wishing to acquire them.

This was primarily the Kenneth Zander collection of San Jose, California. Never had I seen so many great Zenith radios together in one place. There were at least 40 high quality Zenith sets, including over 10 excellent shutter-dial models, and culminating, of course, in a truly magnificent Zenith 1000Z Stratosphere console. Not to be outdone were four outstanding Majestic consoles, another four highly collectible Scott radios, a collection of seldom (or never before seen) Australian console radios, along with representative

high-end radios from Midwest, Sparton, Stromberg-Carlson, McMurdo Silver, and finally a La France console that could challenge the best of Scott, Zenith and others.

What a privilege to see, touch, and photograph these fine radios before they went to other appre-

ciative owners. Then there were the radio lamps—never-before-seen examples of radios combined with table and floor lamps, some with no visible manufacturers labels.

First to the 25-tube Zenith Stratosphere. This was a fine example, complete and in good shape.

It was Serial Number 60, and it sold here for \$39,000. The companion white cat statuette was sold separately for \$500. There was some discussion as to whether the correct cat should be white or black, but I will leave that up to the expert Zenith historians.

As for the LaFrance Model SF console, this was a favorite of mine as I once owned a smaller one like it. I eventually found out that these consoles were made by Webster Chicago probably for Montgomery Ward or Sears. The Model 6F presented here had two chromed chassis and multiple speakers, a model

that could give most Scotts a run for their money. It sold for \$1,900.

One could go on and on describing the wonders in this collection, but suffice it to add some statistics. Of the 525 lots that I recorded, 33 of them sold for over \$1,000 each, while another 21 sold for between \$500 and \$1,000. The average sale price per lot was \$329, an outstanding figure. The sales total that I recorded came to \$172,600, not including the 5 percent premium that is charged here and not including the early sale or any of the side auctions.

This auction also contained items from a Michigan collection, as well as a special consignment from Frank and Eleanor Quinn containing memorabilia related to filmmaker Mike Todd. This single lot consisted of a Regency TR1 radio, an

"Around the World in 80 Days" music box, an original sound track album from "Around the World in 80 Days," and other personalized memorabilia from Mike Todd. Frank Quinn was past president of the New York Film Critics Circle and also hosted a radio show and a television talk/game show. Eleanor Quinn was a public relations writer for various studios. This unique lot sold for \$8,500.

Several other items merit comment. First, there was a very nice Perryman tube display that brought

a price of \$275. Next, a very early Edison openframe motor with brass blade fan sold for \$2,800, in spite of having an open winding. Then another consignment consisted of most if not all the internal components for another Zenith Stratosphere radio, both chassis and all the speakers, etc. It looked to be in reasonably good condition, but did not sell when bidding stopped at \$5,000, and that did not meet the seller's reserve.

The weather for this sale was ideal and the

Friday viewing was quite crowded. Obviously, the pre-sale publicity attracted many potential buyers. A lot of additional consignments were coming in on Friday evening and even some early on Saturday morning. Again many were probably trying to take advantage of a large turnout for this sale. However, bringing in consignments on Saturday morning can be a gamble since there is no pre-sale publicity for them, and viewing time on Saturday morning is limited due to the early low-value sale that starts at 8:30 A.M. The early sale started on time, and there was, indeed, a lot of stuff to move. It actually ran until 10:10 A.M. in order to process all the goods.

When the main sale started, there were over 110 bidders registered, and some were still coming in. This sale had fewer radios than normal and fewer battery sets, military, or Ham gear. For a change, there were not many items "under the tables" where box lots and parts lots are usually presented. Still there were some bulk lots of tubes, (Continued on following page)

test equipment, and parts on the tables, as well as a good assortment of paper items.

About mid-afternoon the crowd thinned out quite a bit after all the "juicy" items had been sold. At 3:30 P.M., side auctions for the tubes, test equipment, and paper were started, and so many people left their seats for the side auctions that the main auction was suspended for a while. Then a little after 4:00 P.M. the side auctions concluded, and the main auction resumed. During this running back and forth, I missed quite a few items and did not record any of the side auctions. I stopped my limited recording at 4:45 and left at 5:00 P.м. while some tube lots were still being sold off.

One final note: The pictures of many of the high-end radios show most of the knobs missing. This is a precaution that Estes takes to avoid the knobs being "mysteriously lost," especial-

ly for the wooden and rare knobs. The buyer of the radio can then claim the knob set at the cashier when paying for his or her purchase.





REMEMBRANCES

Remembering Dick Desjarlais Radioman and A.R.C. Staff Member

"A welcoming smile, wisdom, kindness, and generosity" — these were only a few of the words used to describe Dick Desjarlais at a memorial service on February 20, 2010, in Littleton, Mass., a town he served in many capacities for over forty years. We at A.R.C. remember Dick in much the same way. We also knew him as a collector devoted to antique radio preservation, and as a friend and colleague.

For many years, Dick worked on our staff as a consultant and writer of articles on a wide range of topics, from book reviews and a Web TV series to his favorite heirloom, an Atwater Kent Model 40 in a Pooley 7500 cabinet. Sometimes he wrote in collaboration with fellow staff member Ray Bintliff and Editor John Terrey, and always he did it with care, humor, and enthusiasm for the topic.

In fact, by all accounts, Dick did everything with enthusiasm, from his career in public education to his involvement in community affairs, to his retirement business, Dick's Radio Days. His service in the U.S. Navy in World War II as a Radio Technician may have triggered his lifelong interest in radio. But first came a doctoral degree in education which led ultimately to his role as Littleton Superintendent of Schools for two decades.

His service to the community Involved active membership in the Rotary Club, the Lions Club, the Congregational Church, and the town library, which once mounted an exhibit of his prize radios. Add his passion for music, birding, even Scrabble, and a busy social/ radio life, and you have a "Renaissance Man."

But for us at A.R.C., of course, Dick will always be remembered as a "Radioman." Dick was a gentle person who enjoyed people and vice versa. As a collector, he established many enduring relationships and had a network that produced a number of "finds."

More than once, our editor John Terrey bought one of those finds to add to his collection. One example is the rare Mignon Type RLC-6 that is described in Dick's article "Yard Sales — Radio's Best Friend" in the February 2001 issue of A.R.C.

It is the story of that "find" that prompted Ray Bintliff to write about "Dick's honesty and high standards." The story is that Dick made a deal at a very low price on a pile of musty radio stuff in an old shed. He had paid little attention to the items as he loaded them into his van.

But, as Ray continues, "Back at his barn, Dick reviewed his purchases and discovered the Mignon, a very collectible, high-end piece of wireless gear. Since the seller was anything but prosperous, Dick wanted to share his good fortune with him. So back he went to give him an additional payment. Dick explained, 'It was the right thing to do.' That was Dick."

Other A.R.C. articles also illustrated what we once called "Dick's ferreting instincts." He had a way of finding oddball radios or radio-related items that made for an amusing read. Some of you may remember the articles about the tiny Pastime radio resembling an armoire, or the Radi-O-Larm gadget that became an air raid alarm when attached to a radio. There's no question that Dick was a very serious "Radioman," but we doubt that anyone had more fun pursuing the hobby.

Ray speaks for the A.R.C. staff when he says, "Dick Desjarlais was a gentleman and good friend who will long be remembered."

MOTOROLA MODEL 5A5 – This AC/DC portable was manufactured in 1946 by the Galvin Mfg. Company of Chicago. The flip-top is the on/off switch. It operates on one each of the following tube types: 1R5, 155, 1T4, 3S4, and 117Z3. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NE)



CROSLEY MUSICONE "D" – Crosley Radio Co. of Cincinnati, Ohio, manufactured this speaker in 1929. The metal frame is painted gold, and the paper cone inside came in either orange or gold/blue. It stands 13 inches high. These speakers are found with the usual 2-lead wire for magnetic drivers or the 4-lead wire for Electro-Dynamic reproducers. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NE)



GENERAL ELECTRIC MODEL 431 – This 6-tube table radio was manufactured in 1955 by GE and sold for \$45. A similar radio was issued as Model 621. Both radios were broadcast sets with Civil Defense markings. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NE)



FREED-EISEMANN MODEL 30 – This 6-tube receiver was manufactured by the Freed-Eisemann Radio Corp. of Brooklyn, New York. It sold for \$75 in 1926. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NE)





REPORTER RADIO, SERIAL NO. 43499 AE – This cathedral-style radio has no other markings but those mentioned in the caption above. It looks like an early 1930s model, but I would appreciate any additional information collectors might supply. (Christal L. Knight – Palatka, FL)

WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Halson Model 45 "Recipe Radio"

BY RALPH JACKSON

In the August 2009 A.R.C., Ralph Jackson described the development of his interest in Halson brand radios. Here he tells of another addition to his Halson collection, one with a mystery attached. (Editor)




Figure 1. The Halson Model 45 cabinet showing the volume control on the left and the tuning control on the right.

This article is about another Halson which I have identified as a Model 45, ca 1934. The radio's cabinet and chassis are shown in Figures 1 and 2.

The mystery associated with this radio is the meaning of the name "Recipe Radio" that appears on the nameplate shown in Figure 3. I have no idea what this name is supposed to mean. One of my sons, who is knowledgeable about antique items, thinks it may have been a promotional radio for some other product. Or maybe it looks like an old fashioned recipe holder given its shape and the metal case. I have done searches on the Internet and found nothing. Maybe an interested reader will unwrap the mystery of the "Recipe Radio."

THE HALSON MODEL 45




Figure 4. The Model 45 cabinet with the back cover removed.

Figure 4 shows the radio's cabinet and back cover. Figure 5 shows its cardboard bottom with "Operating Instructions" on the left, "Patent Data" in the middle, and "Service Policy" on the right. The Operating Instructions include the 4-tube lineup of Types 6D6, 6C6, 43, and 12Z3. The Service Policy guarantees the tubes for 90 days and one year for the other components. Note that this is an AC-DC radio. The cardboard bottom also says "Halson Radio Mfg. Corporation, 120 East 16th Street, New York, N.Y."

The volume control is located on the left; the tuning control on the right. The tuner plate is marked 0 to 100 (low to high frequency) in a CCW direction. I wonder why the CCW rather than the CW direction was chosen. Since wavelength is inversely proportional to frequency, maybe the idea is CW for increasing wavelength.

Figure 6 shows a rear view of the chassis. Note the large horizontally mounted 220-ohm, filament, voltage dropping resistor mounted on the bottom rear of the chassis. It is just a fraction of an inch from the edge of the cardboard bottom and stretches nearly side-to-side on the chassis. Maybe this cardboard bottom is non-flammable, I don't know. They lived dangerously in those days! I marked the tube locations, as shown on the rear face of the chassis.

There are no customary tube shields in this design; however, there is a metal shield between the 6D6 (RF amplifier) and the 6C6 (AM detector). This radio will oscillate under certain conditions. The operating instructions say to start with low settings on the volume control while initially tuning for a station. This

will lessen the chances of positive feedback and subsequent howling.

The schematic for this radio appears in Riders Vol. VI. The tuning capacitor is ganged with one section in the antenna coil tank circuit feeding the 6D6 grid and the other in the tuned grid circuit of the 6C6. Both tank circuits are tuned over the AM broadcast frequency range. The volume control is a 25k-ohm potentiometer in the 6D6 input circuit.

The 6C6 is configured for AM detection with a 29k-ohm cathode resistor with a 5 uF bypass capacitor. The plate couples to the grid of the 43 power amplifier.

The speaker is fed through the 43-plate output transformer and is an electromagnetic design with a 3500-ohm field coil. The schematic says that the 3500 ohms is a hot measurement. The field coil is connected between the rectifier cathode and ground.

The 12Z3 rectifier also feeds into a pi LC filter with 16 uF on the cathode and 8 uF on the choke output. The filter choke has a DC resistance of 400 ohms.

RESTORATION PROJECTS

The only electrical restoration I have done is replacing the filter and cathode bypass capacitors, which put the radio in playing condition. I may decide to repaint the cabinet, which is not too bad, though a little rust has started and would have to be addressed before repainting.

I would also have to install some grille cloth. From the old glue marks on the inside of the cabinet there was a frame (probably cardboard) on which the grille cloth was stretched. There is also evidence that this frame was bolted to the speaker's metal frame.

I anxiously await reader 220-onm, man feedback on what the name "Recipe Radio" is all about. Having said that, I have more mysteries in my Halson collection of 37 radios, all different. Stay tuned.

RESTORATION TOPICS

A U.S. Coast Guard Mystery Receiver

Jerry Wieland is looking for more answers regarding his U.S. Coast Guard receiver. As he says, even knowlegeable friends and the web don't always come up with everything you want to know. (Editor)

On a recent radio hunting expedition, I visited a few resale shops in an old part of Racine, Wisconsin. My brother lives in Racine and introduced me to this area years ago. I found a few radios there in the past, but nothing in recent years. In one store full of all sorts of stuff, I bought a small RCA oscilloscope that actually worked in the store.




Figure 2. An interior view of the Model R-138 chassis where both tubes and adjustments had corresponding ID labels painted on.

After the sale, the owner said he had something else I might be interested in. Under a table I had

passed before, pushed to the rear was a black metal communications receiver with an impressive number of knobs and a large dial, as shown in Figure 1. When I opened the top cover which was missing a latch assembly, I counted eleven tubes. There were also many alignment adjustments. Both the tubes and adjustments had corresponding ID labels painted on the chassis, shown in Figure 2. The dial had six bands covering LW, BC, and SW to 19 MHz.

After some negotiating, we settled on \$25.

RESTORATION

Some of the features of this receiver are the following: crystal filter with phasing adjustment, noise limiter, antenna trimmer, BFO, receiver muting relay, and standby power switch. The weight is 38 pounds.

With no hope of finding a schematic, I checked all

the tubes and replaced two weak ones. I noted that this was an AC/DC design with the chassis isolated from the cabinet by two long insulating blocks. One was broken at one of the two mounting screws and part of it was missing. To maintain the isolation, I cut the remaining piece in half, drilled and tapped two more mounting holes, and securely mounted the two pieces.

After a few more checks, I decided to bring power up slowly. The BC band came alive. I checked the other bands, and all had some activity. Since the alignment adjustments were well labeled, I decided to try optimizing performance. None of the adjustments were very far from the optimum setting. Performance was acceptable on all bands. All that remained was some general cleaning.

IDENTIFICATION




Figure 3. A view of the orderly component layout.

When I first brought the set home and had time to examine it, I could not find a model number or manufacturer's name anywhere. In fact, I could not even see the outline of a paper label or mounting holes for a metal one. I removed the chassis from the cabinet to look for clues underneath. The circuit layout was very orderly, as shown in Figure 3, but there was no ID of any kind.

Since I am a member of the Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI), I asked some of the members if they recognized this receiver. One said it was used by

the Coast Guard. I did a Google search on Coast Guard Receivers and found the site http://www.imradioha.org/CG_RX_R-138.htm

It turned out that Jim Novak, an ARCI member I had not consulted, contributed all the information regarding my receiver to this site. After reviewing the site information, I found the receiver to be an R-138 manufactured by the R.L. Dooley Corporation of New York in 1948. I also found out why I could not identify my unit.

The metal ID plate had been mounted on the front panel where my internal speaker is mounted. The original design did not have an internal speaker. Whoever had modified my receiver never bothered to re-attach the ID plate. This also explains why my internal speaker is attached with pop rivets which

didn't seem correct for this vintage design.

The web site doesn't have all the answers, however. As Jim learned, the Coast Guard Museum has no record of this receiver. He found no information regarding the R.L. Dooley Corporation other than a letter to a professional dancer. And I wonder how my unit made its way to a Racine resale shop.

This Navy WW II "Morale Radio" is a Crosley Model REP. It is a 7-tube set operating on 110 or 200 VAC, with the broadcast band, 540 to 1610 kHz, and two shortwave bands covering 5.8 to 15.8 Mhz. It also has a tuning eye.

A large red warning label cautions not to use it aboard ship due to possible radiation from the local oscillator.





Inside the chassis are spare socketed tubes for each active tube in the set. Unfortunately, the prior owner made off with the spare 6E5 eye tube. It plays very well!
