



Our latest Web innovation is a searchable auction price data base, which includes nearly 20,000 prices for almost 100 auctions over the past ten years. Check

New technology aside, we also enjoy participating in the old events that bring us together. Auctions are another way to bring us together. Ray Chase reminds us that even small ones like Alderfer can be valuable. Many box lots that can replenish your workshop make such auctions worth noting.

Also worth noting might be a later model console, even though your primary interest is in early items. Daniel Schoo tells a great personal story about restoring a 1964 GE RC-1671A radio/phonograph to fill his father's wish to play his old recordings. The restored GE was good news for both Dan's dad and for us in the resulting article and photos of the restoration process.

Another great personal story is recounted by Jerry Katz in his article about how his radio collecting hobby helped build his hardware business. Jerry attributed his success to his collaboration with the late Tom

Romano, a master at restoration.

A different kind of collaboration resulted in our cover and a short accompanying article by John McCarty, a collector and restorer, and his artist son Matt. Matt had grown up with the Zenith console in their living room, as well as with his dad's radio activities. The result — an illustration from what could be the family album.

# Radio XLI — a.k.a. Radio 41 Westford, Massachusetts — February 14, 2010



It's always a gamble. Will the winter snows of New England hold off for the weekend? Will the radio crowd leave their warm workshops for the Greater Boston Antique Radio Collectors (GBARC) meet held annually at the Westford Regency Hotel in Westford Mass., and hosted by A.R.C? Well, it did — and they didf

Total attendance was 546 from ten states, up from last year, in spite of the uncertain economy. Vendors numbered 53 from eight states, and the upbeat feeling that goes with a long weekend that includes Valentine's Day pervaded the crowd.

#### A FAMILY AND FRIENDS AFFAIR

More people also took advantage of the hotel amenities — pool, health club, restaurants, and ample parking. The 40 advance hotel room reservations topped last year's 32. Among


to all the shows," she said, "but this is the best." With Cookie chiming in, an endorsement by "radio wives" of an ideal radio weekend was clear.

The Milanos' tables offered some very nice 1930s table radios, such as the colorful Federal set priced at \$225. Needless to say, the rare Radolek (Model 16721 or 16724 according to Stein's Machine Age to Jet Age, III) offered at \$425 generated a great deal of interest. In general, the Milano display was typical of the work of a collector who does everything possible to restore sets to original condition. That goal was evident in many displays at this meet.

Mark Meehl and his North Reading, Mass., neighbor John Nowosacki were first-time exhib-

itors and set up tables side by side. They enlisted the help of Mark's son Joe and daughter Leah for heavy lifting — definitely a family/neighbor affair. Like so many in the hobby, both Mark and John are general collectors and enjoy doing repairs.

John had an interesting potential customer for his Kolster radio receiver, which needed serious repair. In fact, Greg Charvat couldn't seem to tear himself away, and I learned later from John that, after returning a second time, Greg had succumbed to temptation and bought the set.

I also learned from Greg himself why he couldn't resist the challenge of this set. It seems that Greg, an M.I.T. Lincoln Lab engineer, combines two seemingly unrelated hobbies — vintage repair and dance. To the delight of participants at dance parties in Waltham and Cambridge, Mass., he plays vintage music through his vintage equipment. All of which proves that you never know what draws people to a radio meet.

Another first time exhibitor was Bob Genthner along with his wife Anita from Upstate New York. Bob has been mainly a solid-state Zenith collector, but is always open to exceptions. He was in the process of trying to evaluate the current market, and in that pursuit, they have attended several meets. There he hopes to talk directly with serious collectors. He was also hoping such a collector would come along to show an interest in his Zenith 8G005 Trans-Oceanic.

#### "CATCHING THE NEXT COLLECTOR WAVE"

Longtime buyer turned first-time exhibitor Allan Ropper was also interested in the state of the market and was looking to "catching the next collector wave." First an engineer and now an M.D., Allan offered on his table a touch of what might also be offered to patients in his waiting room — a bowl of Hershey candies. What a way to sweeten a deal and help to celebrate a Valentine's Day meet!

As for catching the wave, longtime exhibitors Dave and Karen Sutherland seem to have that trick mastered. Diversification is their motto as evidenced by the wide variety of radio-related items on their tables, and no doubt, also in their large country store in Keene, N. H. Among the ephemera was Dave's impressive collection of doll house radios. One example was a Majestic highboy, which functions as a bank and was actually used to advertise a bank — a reminder that in its heyday, radio was advertising bait for many a business.

a serious business, and he had Grundig and Telefunken sets, among others, on display. Two Grundigs with the same model number and in poor condition offered a great opportunity for a 2 for 1 bargain. Someone looking for a project could make one good set out of the two.


Ross was also interested in talking about the state of the radio market, which he says has declined, though A.R.C. ads have often worked well for him. However, he also runs a clock repair business, which is booming. So again, diversification is a key to survival these days.

Bob and Judy Fuerderer know all about diversifying within the field, having owned a TV and radio dealership for 50 years in Long Island, New York. When their sons took that business over, they moved to Surrey, N. H., where for several years they've been doing what else — collecting and radio/TV repair! Obviously, radio is not something you leave behind when you retire.


Actually, I doubt that anyone at the meet ever leaves radio behind, no matter what his or her profession or stage of life. Like Norm Hertz who made the five hour trip from Staten Island, New York, on a Sunday morning, almost everyone was there because of a commitment to radio preservation. Norm's special interest is crystal sets and early receivers, and he sells parts for restoration while also writing a book on crystal sets.

Norm must have been the right person for buyer Henry Thomas, a Motorola technician from Halifax, Mass., to consult. Before I knew it, they were in deep conversation about technical matters that left me way behind. I realized I was witnessing another primary reason for people to attend a meet — to exchange and to get information.


In fact, that was the primary reason for Randolph Peet, a non-collector, to travel all the way from the Albany, N. Y., area. His ultimate goal was to find out the best way to ensure that the equipment from his late uncle John Marona's used radio and TV business could be passed on "to those who would enjoy it." The radio collecting community

always welcomes a preservationist like Randolph who doesn't want "to just throw it away."

Perhaps he got some answers from the longtime radio business team Bruce and Charlotte Mager of Waves in New York City who set up in their usual corner in the side room. Others also in the side room like Rain Buttignol, Walter Bernd, and Lenny Provost, all long in the trade, are more than willing to give advice and to share the latest radio talk. They even try to sell to each other, as in the case of the first automatic phone with bells in it that Bruce thought Rain should have.

The Magers always display exceptional items, such as the huge Hammond clock in a neon frame advertising "RCA Radiolas — \$95-\$495" or the two Kennedy battery sets. The beautiful original painting of a Grebe Synchrophase makes you wonder whatever happened to such art work — why don't we see more of it?

Lenny Provost, who calls himself "a non-techie," also displays the unusual. The star of his show was the RCA record player with microphone and Dick Clark 45 rpm records. Lenny too was musing on the state of the hobby. He says that nowadays you have to do a little more planning and thinking about what you bring to a show. He thought that the selection of goods this year was a little different — "not as much old stuff, but still not too modern." His idea that "you have to work harder for a little less" probably applies to every field in this struggling economy.

#### **BEYOND BUYING AND SELLING**

The really great thing about a meet like this is the camaraderie that goes far beyond the business of buying and selling. To enjoy that fellowship, people came from all over the Northeast, and as far away as Illinois. We were pleased that Marc Ellis, editor of the AWA Journal, who had come East from Chicago on a family visit, took the time to drop in on the meet. As he sat in the lobby waiting for Editor John Terrey to take him on a visit to his museum, he said, "I'm seeing

many happy faces coming out of that hall."

Our colleague and staff member Ray Bintliff agreed. Though there were hectic moments, Ray commented that people seemed more relaxed, pleased with the event, and eager to stop by for a leisurely chat.

In the same vein, a totally unsolicited e-mail to me from Bob Genthner almost a month after the event said it all. It read: "If you were the woman who was taking an informal survey during the event, this is for you. I had no major criticism of any aspect. As for attracting a varied clientele, I sold things to just about every type you could imagine, so apparently there is broad appeal. I did well, and hopefully I will attend next year. Thank you

# RADIO XLI AND THE JOHN TERREY MUSEUM

Radio XLI

This year I happened to be in the Boston area on February 14th, which gave me an opportunity to visit an event I've been aware of for some time and have always wanted to attend. The half-day indoor flea market is generally held over the President's Day weekend, and it looks like this was its forty-first year.

The meet is sponsored by The Greater Boston Antique Radio Collectors, with Antique Radio Classified magazine donating time for planning.

coordination, and the handling of advance vendor registrations. The Publisher/ Editor of ARC is John Terrey, who is also an AWA Director.

The event is heavily advertised via direct mailings and press releases within about a 300-mile radius as well as in some national publications. Participation in Radio XLI included 546 attendees from ten states and 53 vendors from eight states.

My first impression of the meet was the double take I did on my first look at the Westford (MA) Regency Inn where the event was held. The sprawling Colonial-style building, located well back from the road in a semi-rural setting, looked like one of those resorts for the very rich. I arrived about halfway through the four-hour meet, and as I snaked my way through the almost-full parking lot, I began to see people with smiling faces carrying all manner of goodies out to their cars.

Inside, the mood was upbeat and lively. The 83 vendor tables virtually filled a large meeting or banquet room, and I'm guessing that all spaces were sold out or virtually so. A touch of class that I'm not used to seeing at most meets I at-

tend was the crimson tablecloth that neatly covered each vendor table.

This is not a meet where you might find parts from disemboweled three-dialers and other odd items under the tables. It looked like most people had brought their best and most presentable merchandise. And, probably because the meet was running for such a limited time, the atmosphere seemed intense (but very friendly) with vendors quite responsive to potential customers.

Admission was \$11.00 per person and

vendors paid \$33.00 more for each table. Vendors were permitted to bring in merchandise a half-hour before the 8 a.m. opening, but were then required to leave the room and wait in the foyer until 8 a.m. One person from the vendor's party was permitted to wait at the table for security—but no unpacking or setup was allowed before the admission of the general public. This, of course, was to prevent vendors from trading the best goodies among themselves before the general public had a crack at them.

I had a most excellent time and enjoyed the opportunity to chat with John Terrey and to meet for the first time ARC's Managing Editor Dorothy Schecter—with whom I've had many phone and e-mail exchanges in the past. As an unexpected bonus, John invited me to a viewing of his private museum in Carlisle, MA just a few minutes' drive from the hotel.

#### The Terrey Museum

If I did a double take on my first look at the Westford Regency Inn, I did a bigger one on viewing the specially-built barn museum. The 36' × 60' two-story-plus-basement structure dwarfs John's home, which is on the same property. John's extensive collection of wireless and early broadcast sets and accessories had formerly been located in the home. Building this barn (completed in 2007) to house the collection was the culmination of a 10-year dream.

The handsome structure, built by a company specializing in barn work, utilizes traditional pegged post-and-beam construction. The loft-type design and the natural wood finish used throughout gives the interior an open airy feeling.

The first floor houses the basic collection of

over 600 radios, amplifiers, horns, crystal sets, etc., from the early broadcast set and wireless days. John's extensive technical library and a studio for his wife, Sarah are on the second floor. The editorial offices of Antique Radio Classified occupy a basement suite.

I'm not a specialist in early wireless and radio, so I'll rely on John's list of some of the of the highlights of the collection, which include... "over 37 different Grebe items, including all sets from the CR-1 through the CR-10; Adams Morgan RA-6 tuner and 2-5-U Trans-

mitter; Chicago Radio Labs PAR tuner and 2-, 3and 4-tube detector/amp units; RCA Radiola Models VI, VII, VII-B and IX, plus the TF transmitter; the gold-plated Federal Models 159 & 161, plus the early Federal 8, 9, 55, 56 and 60 sets; Marconi CM-294A and Magnetic detector; and an RCA Theremin.

"In addition, there are broad representations of Air-Way, Amrad, Atwater Kent, Chelsea, Clapp Eastham, Crosley, Cutting and Washington, de Forest, Federal, Firth, Kennedy, Kodel, Mignon, Neutrowound, SE-AR-DE, Sleeper, Tuska, Western Coil and Western Electric sets. (Unfortunately, the Crosley part of the collection is not yet on display, as well as about another 200 sets.)"

However, John continues, "This brief description is only a beginning; many surprises are awaiting those who look carefully!"

I especially enjoyed the opportunity to peek at the ARC editorial offices. Though empty just at the moment, there were still signs of the continuous activity required to put out a monthly magazine. I have to admit, the ARC offices are significantly neater than my headquarters for editing the Journal and—as a quarterly—I don't have much excuse for not pulling things together between issues!

Visitors who would like to examine and/or photograph the sets are welcome, but should should call ahead to check on John's availability because the museum is open by prearrangement only. ## General Electric Model RC-1671A Radio/Phonograph Restoration

Sometimes restoring a set becomes a long-range project. However, the pleasure of combining the project with presenting it as a gift makes it all worthwhile, as illustrated in the following article. (Editor)

In 1995, a friend and I were going through an old vacated office and tech shop where I work. The former occupants had moved to a new location and left a bunch of things behind. One of the things was a General Electric Model RC-1671A stereo AM/FM radio/record player made in 1964. The tableton unit was not in too bad shape and just reeked of that wonderful 1960s styling that I grew up with. It had a veneered, dark walnut finish, wood cabinet, and the speaker grille cloth was that cane type material popular back then. Besides all that, it had tubes!

had tubes!

Years ago, I remember my uncle had one of these sets, and to my 13-year-old eyes, it was just about the most beautiful thing I had ever seen. I asked the supervisor if we could have it, and he agreed. I let my friend take it home, as I did not have room for it. He put it in his garage, and it sat there for 14 years.

My restoration of this set started as the result of my father's wish to have a record player to play his old records. Although you can still buy a record player today, the selection is not very plentiful, the mechanisms are cheaply made, and many contemporary players are not designed to play both the old 78 rpm disks and 33 rpm albums.

For months, I looked around at Hamfests, radio swap meets and garage sales for something appropriate. I found a few record players, but they were either junk or priced too high or both. I wanted something classy that would sound nice but not have to be as big as a floor console.




Figure 2. End view showing water damage.

After an unsuccessful search for a record player for my dad, I remembered the old GE, and I asked my friend if I could have it. He was only too glad to get it out of his garage. Figure 1 shows the set after retrieval. While it was in storage, water had dripped on it staining the wood and rusting two of the hinges that the left speaker hangs on. Figures 2 and 3 show the water-damaged cabinet. Figure 4 shows hinge and knob damage. And so, the project began in early August of 2009.

#### THE GE MODEL RC-1671A

This system could be called a mini-console at 32 inches wide and 20 inches tall. The two speakers are on hinges and swing out from the front, allowing the user to fold them closed when not in use. The hinges are used to electrically connect the speakers to the stereo. You can also lift the speakers off the hinges and connect them remotely with standard RCA-type audio cables.




Figure 5. A pre-restoration rear view of the system with the rear cover removed. The location for the missing MDS unit is on the lower left.

There is a fold-down record changer on the left side and a tilt-open storage compartment on the right for records. The console can be set on a shelf or table, or you could mount it on the wall using an included template to locate the mounting screws in the proper locations. Figure 5 shows a rear view of the system.

#### MUSIC DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM (MDS)




Figure 6. Both speaker versions, the large and the small, for the Music Distribution System.

One of the unique features of this product is that it has an option called a Music Distribution System (MDS), or more commonly known in advertising as "GE Porta-Fi." The MDS is a form of wireless remote speaker system. There is a separate speaker that you could take to any room in your home, plug it into an AC outlet, and it would play whatever audio was on the main stereo. Figure 6 shows two versions of the remote speaker.

The way it works is that an optional MDS adapter was installed in a special location inside the main stereo cabinet. The stereo was prewired for it, and the MDS adapter simply plugged into the existing wiring. The MDS adapter consisted of a low power FM monaural radio transmitter operating at a frequency of 250 kHz. The radio frequency output signal was coupled through a high pass filter into the AC power line. The AC power line wiring carried the signal throughout the house. The space reserved for the MDS unit can be seen on the lower left of Figure 5.

The remote speaker has an FM receiver in it that receives the 250 kHz signal from the power line through a high pass filter. This is known as a "carrier current" system and is still used for things like wireless intercoms, baby monitors and low power, local program broadcasting. An alternate B frequency of 300 kHz could be used (Continued on following page)


(General Electric RC-1671A, continued) to prevent interference from a similar neighboring system.




Figure 7. Interior views of the remote speaker cabinets, the large, above, and the small, below, showing the speakers and FM receivers.

This set did not have the MDS option installed when we found it. A couple of years later, I found a GE MDS transmitter and remote speaker at a garage sale. I knew exactly what it was, so I bought it. I gave it to my friend and he put it in his garage along with the stereo. A short time later, I found another bigger and better GE MDS remote speaker on the pile in the donation auction at the Antique Radio Club of Illinois Radiofest, so I picked that up and gave it to him. I have not seen another one since. Rear views of both versions of the remote speakers are seen in Figure 7.

#### **ELECTRICAL RESTORATION**

For the electrical restoration work, I replaced a couple of selenium rectifiers in the radio and in the MDS component chassis. I don't bother testing selenium rectifiers assume that they are all bad or will be, and that way, I never get surprised by an unexpected failure.




Figure 8. The amplifier chassis shown before restoration, above, and after restoration, below. Note the general clean up of the chassis and components, and the rebuilt cardboard electrolytic capacitor, seen above the vacuum tubes and transformer.

The circuit design is such that I could replace the selenium rectifiers with silicon rectifier diodes and not have to make any modifications. I rebuilt a big multisection cardboard electrolytic on the audio chassis and replaced several small electrolytics in the MDS chassis. Figure 8 shows both before and after views of the amplifier chassis, including the rebuilt paper electrolytic capacitor. There are several upright aluminum can electrolytics in the radio and the MDS chassis, and they tested good.

To check these old can-type electrolytics I measure the Equivalent Series Resistance (ESR) with a digital ESR tester. The ESR is a measurement of the internal resistance of a capacitor. It's like having a resistor in series with the capacitor inside the can. If the electrolyte dries out, its resistance goes up and that becomes an impediment to the function of the capacitor. The ESR should be in the low ohms to sub-ohm range depending on the capacity and voltage rating.

I have seen electrolytic capacitors measure perfectly good for capacity but not work because of high ESR. If the ESR is not too high, I do a leakage test. I apply a DC voltage to the capacitor slowly ramping it up while watching the leakage current. If I can get to full rated voltage or better with low leakage, that's good enough. Again, leakage current depends on the capacity and voltage rating of the capacitor.

The radio was in pretty good shape. Besides the selenium rectifier, I replaced a couple of tubes.

The audio output uses a pair of Type 7189 pentodes in single-ended Class A configuration, one tube for each channel. The audio chassis uses a Type 5Y3 rectifier and a single Type 12AX7 twin triode as a preamp/driver for both channels. The 7189 sockets were baked, and the solder joints didn't look good.

Any old, printed, circuit-based equipment like this should have all of the tube sockets resoldered. Repeated heating and cooling from rectifiers, power resistors, and power tubes crack the solder around the pins in the PC board, and they go intermittent or open. Even a close inspection with a magnifying glass will not show any problems, but they are there. I resoldered every joint on the printed circuit board in the audio amplifier chassis and several in the radio.




Figure 9. A rear view of the restored unit with the rear cover removed. The added MDS unit is on the lower left.

The rear view of the fully restored system, including the added MDS unit, is shown in Figure 9.

#### THE RECORD CHANGER RESTORATION

The record changer is a lower end model made by Garrard but sturdily built. It has a GE ceramic cartridge installed. The changer was filthy but in good condition. Even the idler wheel was still lively and pliable. All that it needed was a good cleaning and re-lubrication.

The changer was actually working when I got it, but there was one minor problem: It would not shut off after the last record was played. I scouted around the mechanism, and I determined that there must be a

spring missing that pulled on a lever. I was able to make the changer work by lightly pushing the lever with my finger. Sure enough, I found a loose spring, and when I connected it up where I thought it should go, the changer worked. I found a new stylus for the cartridge at West-Tech services in Ohio.

#### THE CABINET RESTORATION

The cabinet was more of a challenge. The control panel and cabinet were filthy and needed a good cleaning. The knobs had dirt and grime imbedded in (Continued on following page)




Figure 10. The restored General Electric Model RC-1671A stereo, AM/FM radio/record player, shown complete with swing-out speakers.

the grooves. Inside, it was pretty dusty, so I took it out on the driveway and blew it out with a leaf blower.

I sanded the sides and top of the cabinet to deal with the serious water stains. I had to be careful because the veneer is paper thin. After that, I applied oxalic acid repeatedly to the bad side to bleach out the black iron stains. That took most of a day and it cleared up almost all of the stains.

After the wood dried though, some of the stain came back. I completed the job by applying a light coat of walnut stain. That really perked things up. I removed the rusty hinges and bead-blasted them. That took off all the rust, but they were badly pitted in places. They were heavily plated with copper because they are used as the electrical connection for the speakers, and the plating prevented them from total ruin.

#### A HAPPY ENDING

After the restoration work, I installed the MDS unit and it works fairly well. Figures 10 and 11 show the final result. However, electrical noise from sources such as domestic solid-state light dimmers (which were not around in 1964) affect it.

My wife Donna and I took the set over to my dad on his birthday, and he was like a child with a new puppy, see Figure 12. His eyes lit up and he got all excited. He played records the rest of the time we

were there, and I think he's been playing them every day since.

### **Alderfer Auction** Hatfield, Pennsylvania — June 25, 2009


This was a relatively small radio auction, one of half a dozen or so that Alderfer runs simultaneously every Thursday. It was not a high quality collection but included many "fixer uppers" and lots of parts and tubes, so if your workshop needed some replenishment this would be a good sale. Many of the items showed signs of poor storage, perhaps because another radio collector had passed away, and his collection languished under less than ideal conditions. The former owner may have been an RCA serviceman, as the sale started with a showcase of men's jewelry, such as cuff links and tie tacs all with an RCA motif.

The actual sale started at 10:00 A.M. and there was no catalog, but viewing was allowed from 7:30 A.M. on and I arrived early enough to gather fairly detailed information on the radios. The sale progressed quickly, ending in an hour and a quarter at 11:15 A.M.

Alderfers is a general auction house so the presentation of the radios and descriptions was limited, but the buyers in the audience were knowledgeable and many bargains were to be had. The sale price total was about \$4,600 not including the 10 percent buyer's premium charged by this auction house. All in all, a pleasant way to spend a Thursday morning.

Only about one-third of the lots are included

# The Hobby That Built a Business Aborn True Value Hardware

Here is a success story that's a pleasure to tell. Jerry Katz brought his hobby of radio collecting into his business and found that customers maybe looking for a can of paint walked off with a radio as well. Jerry credits his repairman, the late Tom Romano. (Editor)

In 1995, the company I worked for reorganized. With a wife and two girls to support, I decided to go out on my own and purchased Aborn True Value in Brookline, Massachusetts. There were seven other hardware stores within a mile and a half and Aborn was long past its prime. Out of desperation, I decided to try to give the store a unique niche. After placing about a dozen antique radios in the window, we quickly became known as the "cool hardware store with the neat radios for sale." By 2008, we had increased our overall business about 450 percent from 1995.

Over the years, we sold hundreds of radios. Many of them were purchased or repaired by Tom Romano who passed away suddenly in March, 2009. This article is dedicated to Tom.

#### **RAPID APPEAL OF RADIOS**

Soon after we brought our first radios into the store, many people came in to check out these strange looking boxes. The appeal went across all age groups and spawned more than one fanatical collector. One gentleman, a dentist, purchased so many sets, he had to constantly sneak new ones into the house. Sound like a familiar story?

The most popular sets we sold were Trans-Oceanics. Dozens of purchasers were amazed to hear shortwave broadcasts. Other popular sets were cathedrals, followed by pushbutton sets, tombstones, and more mundane plastic sets from the 1930s and 1940s. The few Catalin radios sold almost immediately. Sets from the 1950s and 1960s were dogs. The only real disappointment expressed by most buyers was that the sets did not have FM.

### OTHER RELATED

A natural progression from radios was windup phonographs. We sold everything from upright Victors to Edisons and many other styles in between. Most popular were suitcase models, all of which sold at around \$150. The usual questions about these units concerned the changing of needles at every other play of a record and why they would not play 33 rpm records.

Jukeboxes were also a popular item for a few years. We sold Wurlitzers, Seeburgs and AMIs. All of these had visible mechanisms where you could see the record play. We also sold the Wurlitzer One-More-Time digital CD boxes.

#### THE RADIO WIZARD

While tastes of our buvers changed over the years, the one most important constant in the purchase was the repair of the sets by Tom Romano. This radio wizard always had a good supply of radios for sale at very fair prices. I lost count years ago of how many sets I purchased from him. The key to making some money on the sets was to make purchases of nonworking sets from various sources and to get them repaired at a reasonable cost. Many were the days I spent hauling sets out to Millbury where Tom lived, about an hour from the store. I spent many hours at Tom's workbench while he patiently explained his repair techniques. He would show the old parts he had replaced and point out step-by-step the repair process.

Sometimes Tom and his wife Mary would meet me halfway to make a radio exchange. His copious notes on the repairs and the return of old parts were his trademark.

Near the end of 2009, I sold the business to my longtime store manager, Jose Monroy and his wife Irene. As part of the sale, radios would remain in the store. However, I felt that with Tom's passing, I myself would be unable to keep my inventory up.

Collecting radios may not have been the whole success of Aborn True Value, but it sure played a major role in it. Our unique hobby helped my store to compete and win over customers from the "big boxes."

When his grandmother's Westinghouse refrigerator radio sprang to life with its glowing "W", Jerry Katz's fascination with radio began. As a teenager, he lived across the street from a Heathkit retail store, and he convinced his dad to let him build a color TV. Sleepless days later, he finished the set and plugged it in. It did not work. One week later Heathkit called to say a faulty pre-assembled board was to blame and there was no charge. His current collection includes jukeboxes, windup phonographs, vogue picture records. and lots of radios.
