A.R.C. OVER THE YEARS

As those of you who read these pages monthly must be aware, for some time this publication has attempted to adapt to the changes brought about by the new media environment — primarily, the Internet. The means of delivering information has changed drastically in the last ten years and all print media are struggling to find their niche and to continue with their print publications.

I took over the publishing of A.R.C. in 1986, and, within ten years, grew the subscriber base from 1,800 to over 8,000. Our biggest problem back then was how to get the classified ads to everyone at the same time. We tried every reasonable solution, but problems with the U.S. Postal Service persist to this day.

However, the solution to instant delivery of information was finally invented — the Internet. Now all who subscribe to A.R.C. can get the information at the same time by reading A.R.C. on our website.

Nevertheless, this seemingly miraculous delivery system has proved to be both a blessing and a curse to print publications trying to preserve the quality of their editorial offerings and to find a way to pay the bills. In our case, in addition to the offerings on the website, we have a history of quality articles and of spreading the word about radio preservation and the pleasure and camaraderie inherent in this hobby.

For example, we have had requests for over 92,000 free samples over the years, often from individuals who have just one radio that might have been destined for the town dump. Instead, our free sample copy may have resulted in an owner's connection with an interested buyer who restores the radio. In addition, we have offered a free listing on our pages for clubs and museums to help them promote their events and add to their membership.

How many radio enthusiasts have we reached out there? Well, over the years we have had over 28,000 subscribers. Add to these the 92,000 free samples and we have been in touch with over 120,000 collectors or individuals interested in old radios. And today, we have over 1,000 visitors to (Continued on following page)

our website each day. Unfortunately, those impressive numbers have not translated into the enlarged subscription base so essential to any publication. To those who remain loyal subscribers, we cannot thank you enough for your support, but it is unfortunate that so many more fail to realize the value of Antique Radio Classified!

When I took over the publication of A.R.C., I believed that by making it a "real business," as opposed to a "sideline," and a "real magazine" as opposed to a "newsletter," there would be both continuity and quality. Quality we achieved. but continuity is now elusive. In our better years, there were four full-time plus additional part-time employees answering the phones, typing the ads, taking orders, shipping the books, editing the articles, doing "paste-up." (Paste-up in those days meant using an X-Acto knife and wax; page layout software such as Pagemaker or InDesign did not exist!) A.R.C. was, and still is, one of those small businesses that furnishes an excellent product - plus provides jobs, purchases goods and services, and pays taxes. Unfortunately, surviving as a small magazine business today is proving not only difficult but also extremely challenging. I am hoping that in the near future, someone with a new vision will take up that challenge.

THE CURRENT ISSUE

Now back to what makes this job a pleasure every month — the content of the current issue. I'm always struck by how dedicated the contributors of articles are to preserving antique radios and radio history. Howard Stone excels in that category as is evident in Part 2 of his article on his outstanding collection of early wireless equipment now also shown on his website.

This time Howard concentrates on his Marconi items. The three Fleming valves pictured, all manufactured by Marconi, are examples from his large tube collection. Before and after photos of his Marconi Type 16 crystal set illustrate the quality of his restoration techniques. Those barnacles or whatever they were covering the set brought up from the ocean bottom must have known the game was up when Howard took on the restoration. The products of such a dogged pursuit of perfection and accuracy are what make this hobby so endlessly interesting.

Phil MacArthur too is engaged in another kind of dogged pursuit. He searches for "benchmark radios" and urges fellow collectors to join him in documenting coming across a first model or the first of a particular class of radio such as the transistorized Trans-Oceanic Royal 1000 or the Zenith 500 series. That kind of collaboration in record keeping would be another giant step in keeping track of everything worth knowing about the world of antique radio.

That world is endlessly surprising as proved by Gary Milner's *Photo Review* submission an RCA Model 301 Duo, which might be called a "stealth radio/phono." Unless you lifted the cover, you'd never know that a phonograph lurked beneath.

As always, thanks to Ray Chase for a fine report on the Estes auction of the Steven Ralston Collection. This auction had to be a happy event for many participants who saw some high quality, uncommon items cross the block. The colorful GE and RCA wooden advertising dolls by Maxwell Parrish drew a lot of attention and solid bids of \$700 and \$750, while the top bid of \$4,250 went to a superb McMurdo Silver Masterpiece V in a Clifton cabinet. As Ray often reminds us, at auctions you have the pleasure of seeing fine old radios, even though you may not be able to take one home.

You should have many more such opportunities in the remaining summer/fall months. Enjoy!

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Wireless at Stone Vintage Radio — Part 2

As promised in Part 1, Howard Stone presents an overview of his prized Marconi sets that can also be viewed on his website. (Editor)

In last month's issue of A.R.C., I discussed several wireless receivers from 1914 to 1919 that may be seen in my virtual museum Stone Vintage Radio.com. This month I will again look at wireless sets, but this time all of the sets are made by Marconi. Some were made by the Marconi Company in the U. K. and others by American Marconi.

The story of Marconi, thought by many to be the father of radio, is well known to all serious radio historians and collectors. Bom in 1874, he began experimenting with wireless in Italy at an early age. He became fascinated with

the work of Heinrich Hertz, and it occurred to him that he could use Hertzian waves to communicate from point to point without wires.

Most researchers in the late 18th century were interested in Hertzian waves purely as a scientific exploration. Marconi found that he had to go to England to get a good hearing for his ideas of wireless communication. Soon he started wireless companies in the U. K. and also in many countries around the world. At first he would not sell his equipment but offered it only for lease. Included here are a few selected pieces of Marconi equipment from the collection at StoneVintageRadio.com. (I urge readers not familiar with Marconi and his wireless sets to read J. & F. Kreuzer's "Marconi-The Man and his Apparatus," in Vol. 9 of the AWA Review.)

FLEMING VALVES, AMERICAN MARCONI




Figure 1. Three different American Marconi Fleming Valves.

Shown in Figure 1 are three Fleming valves made by the American Marconi company. The Fleming Valve was the first commercial application of the Edison Effect (the flow of electrons through space by a heated element) used as a vacuum tube rectifier/detector. J.A. Fleming developed the tube in 1904. The Fleming Valve is by most accounts the grandfather of the modern vacuum tube.

It is hard to estimate how many of these Fleming valves are still in existence. One knowledgeable authority suggested that there were about 60 in the U. S., about 30 in the U. K. and about 20 or so elsewhere. Shown are three different Fleming

Valves. You see two different shapes of glass enclosures. The valve on the left has one plate and the other two have two plates. I assume that the single plate is an earlier version of the valve. The valve on the right has an intact carbon filament.

103 RECEIVER, AMERICAN MARCONI




Figure 2. American Marconi 103 receiver.

The Marconi 103 seen in Figure 2 is an early radio made by American Marconi. It is a crystal set and was made for the most part with English parts. It came out in 1913 and primarily was used on board ships. The frequency it tunes is 200 to 600 meters. Just two years after the 103 was introduced, most were recalled to the factory for a significant change of its circuitry. The result was the more commonly seen Model 107 or 107A. You can tell the difference between a 103 and a 107 because the 107 has a 6-point switch mounted on top of the panel in the center. By changing the tuning circuit of the 103 to the 107, it could now tune 250 to 4,000 meters, according to the J. & F. Kreuzer article mentioned earlier.

TYPE 16 CRYSTAL RECEIVER

Around 1918, a ship went down. Although I know nothing about the ship, it must have been a modern ship of its time because it was outfitted with a Marconi wireless station. The receiver was a Marconi Model 16 crystal set first introduced in 1914. It is a 2-crystal detector set; the two detectors can be used for balanced or independent working. The (Continued on following page) (Stone Vintage Radio Part 2, continued) Marconi 16 covers 250 to 3,500 meters.

In 1999, the Model 16 crystal set I have in my collection was brought up from the bottom of the ocean — along, presumably, with other treasures from the sunken ship. Another collector did some preservation work on the set for three years before turning over the reins to me. He commented, "If I knew what I was getting into, I might not have done it." Many radio historians have echoed those words after they started a preservation project.




Figure 4. The restored Type 16 crystal receiver.

Figure 3 shows the set as I received it. If someone had told me I could restore a radio that had been under the ocean for some eighty years, I would have thought he was crazy! But my wife agreed that I needed a big project that would keep me occupied for a long time. As it turned out, preserving the Marconi 16 has been my most satisfying project in over 35 years of restoring radios. The restored receiver is seen in Figure 4.

I do enjoy preserving radios even basket cases; in fact, it is the aspect of radio collecting that I value most. I am neither fond of nor very good at finding sets. When I take a mouse-infested, ratty old shambles of a radio and make it look good again, that is satisfaction. I probably developed this bent to my hobby because, as a teacher married to a teacher, many times I could not afford good clean examples of the sets I wanted. I had Dom Perignon taste on a Tecate budget.

MAGNETIC DETECTOR

Most seasoned radio collectors spend many hours helping antique dealers and others learn about radios. It is in our own interest to have more eyes out there looking for radio gear. When I was teaching at Texas Christian University, every seventh year I was granted research leave - the first three times in Cambridge, England. As a result, my wife and I have many British friends, among them an antiques dealer who finds items of early technology from time to time. On one research leave (1992-93), he and I were poring over an early book on electrical and wireless technology while we waited for tea.

I would point at a picture and say, "If you ever see this, please buy it for me." Tea came, and we put the book aside.

Nine months later, back in Fort Worth, Texas, I received a phone call from England. My friend had found a magnetic detector. Did I want it? My answer, obviously, was yes. When the magnetic detector arrived, it was a little scruffy, but all original. Figure 5 shows the magnetic detector today.

A little history: In 1895, Ernest Rutherford, a scientist in England. was able to detect signals transmitted a mile away, using a magnetometer, a device used for measuring the strength of magnetic fields. Rutherford's research was based on the prior work of Lord Rayleigh and other scientists studying oscillatory currents. Rutherford attached an antenna to the magnetometer, the received signal deflected the needle of the magnetometer, and, thus, an early "magnetic detector" had been discovered. Marconi further developed the work of Rutherford, and in 1902, he produced his own magnetic detector.

The first "Maggie" (the nickname widely used for the magnetic detector) was installed in the Italian Navy's warship the *Carlo Alberto* in 1903. Magnetic detectors were very reliable for shipboard communication and were the primary detectors installed on European vessels from 1903 to 1912, replacing coherer type detectors. In fact, because of their reliability, magnetic detectors were

used as back-up detectors on many ships into World War I to supplement crystal and later valve detectors. For more information on Marconi magnetic detectors, see the article I wrote for A.R.C. in the June 1999 issue.

AMERICAN MARCONI MAGNETIC DETECTOR

Most of the Marconi magnetic detectors, like the one discussed above, were manufactured in England. The few built in the United States were produced in Aldene, New Jersey. The Aldene plant did not begin full operations until 1912 when magnetic detectors were already on their way out as valves and crystal detectors came in. The result was that not many were produced, and today, no more than a dozen American versions are known still to exist. My American Marconi magnetic detector is shown in Figure 6.

Printed on the bottom of the drawer of this American Marconi magnetic detector is the date it was made, September 26, 1912. There are several obvious differences in the American Maggie: the hinged lid, the beveled glass top, the shape and number of magnets (two vs. four in the English version), and

the inclusion of a drawer. It still functions like the English version.

MULTIPLE TUNER




Figure 7. Multiple tuner.




Figure 8. An inside view of the multiple tuner.

The magnetic detector needed something to tune in the desired frequency and a Mr. C. S. Franklin of the Marconi Company developed the multiple tuner to do just that. It was patented in 1907. My multiple tuner is shown in Figures 7 and 8.

The multiple tuner was produced for ship or shore installations. The magnetic detector was connected to the terminals marked "detector" on the multiple tuner. With the switch on the multiple tuner set at "tune," the magnetic detector was in series with a condenser that was coupled inductively with another circuit called the "intermediate circuit." This intermediate circuit was coupled with the antenna circuit. Each of these circuits was adjusted to the desired wavelength.

Most Marconi installations from 1907 to 1914 used the multiple tuner and are seen with the magnetic detector in many pictures of early shipboard radio rooms. The three round objects on the top of *(Continued on following page)* (Stone Vintage Radio Part 2, continued) the tuner are high quality variable condensers. The parallel horizontal bars on the front are for tuning and the large knob on the front left is for varying inductance. By selecting the appropriate taps of the antenna inductance, variocouplers, and variable condensers, the set can cover 80 to 2,600 meters. The multiple tuner worked very well for the time.

WAVEMETER NUMBER ONE

Wavemeters are used to measure the length of transmitted waves; from the wavelength, the frequency of a transmission can be calculated. They were one of the first pieces of test equipment developed at the beginning of radio. In 1906, Marconi introduced the Marconi Wavemeter Number One in England. The first commercial wavemeter that Marconi made, it was used mainly at ship-to-ship and ship-to-shore stations. It typically covered the frequencies of 100 to 800 meters (this particular wavemeter, when introduced, was calibrated to measure from 200 to 1.040 meters).

I found this Marconi wavemeter while living in Cambridge, England. It was a basket case. The glue was no longer holding and the cabinet was falling apart at all of the joints. The leather was dried and curled up. The leather strap had to be soaked to soften it and then reglued to the box on the left end that holds the earphone.

Because the wavemeter was in such poor shape. I was not sure how the finish should look. It did not look like other early Marconi apparatus I had seen. I tried to find one in someone's collection in the United Kingdom with no luck. The Science Museum in London had several later Marconi wavemeters. but not the Number One. I contacted the Marconi archives in England; they replied that they had an example of this wavemeter in their collection but would not let me see it because the archives, at that time, were not open to the public. That was bad news for anyone studying or restoring early wireless.

Finally, I mailed some stain chips

and a list of specific questions to the archives and got some answers. I found out what I already suspected: the wood of the case was teak — not mahogany, oak or walnut as one might expect in radios or wireless equipment, but it certainly makes sense for equipment used on shipboard. Fortunately, about half of the original finish was still there so the rest of the

finish could be blended in.

The detector used in the wavemeter is a chunk of crystal wedged in between two 2-inch long pieces of spring brass to the back left of the condenser. The small turned round wood box in the back of the earphone box is for spare crystals. The card in the lid is for calculating the wavelength. Surrounding the card wrapped in black tape is the coil.

UNITED WIRELESS TYPE E TUNER




Figure 10. The United Wireless Type E Tuner.

The Type E tuner shown in Figure 10, was manufactured by United Wireless in 1911. In 1912, when Marconi took over United Wireless, the Type E tuner was put out as a Marconi set. Therefore, although this particular set was made by United Wireless before Marconi took the company over, both Marconi and United Wireless Type E tuners exist.

The Type E tuner was the first United Wireless set that had a loose coupler on top of the hard rubber panel. The Type E tuner served as the basic design of the oversized Marconi Type 101 receiver, which incorporated a loose coupler mounted behind the panel and tuned from 100-4.000 meters: it was first supplied to the U.S. Navy in 1914. The loose coupler is of very high quality workmanship. The detector could be detached by loosening the two knurled nuts that hold it in place.

MARCONI 4 VA VALVE AMPLIFIER

I've never seen a description or data on the Marconi 4 VA, a four-step valve amplifier, but it would be safe to describe it as a 4-tube cascade amplifier using Marconi VT vacuum tubes, Jim Kreuzer suggested that "It would have been among the last products produced by American Marconi, about the same time as the Type 120-121-122 receivers. These are dated 1918 and received the final approval on 10-1-1919, only three weeks before the merger into RCA." (Personal communication, December 29,

2009) Only a few of these sets exist today.

IN CONCLUSION

I have covered several Marconi wireless pieces in my collection that can be found on the virtual museum at StoneVintageRadio.com. The website features additional Marconi pieces, as well as early tubes, hom speakers, radio advertising, and of course, radios up to the 1950s.

Marconi's genius lay in transforming scientific observations into commercially viable products. I sometimes wonder how fully he understood the science behind his wireless transmitters and receiver, but undeniably he had the vision and energy needed to revolutionize communication. Thanks to Marconi, the world was in touch without wires.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

"Benchmark" Radios

In pursuit of "benchmark" Zenith Trans-Oceanic radios, Phil MacArthur hopes his fellow collectors will join him in the search for "benchmarks" in other sets and brands as well. Every addition to early radio history is welcome. As Phil has said, "We're doing all this buying and selling without much record keeping." Editor)

I recently sold a Zenith B600 Trans-Oceanic to a collector in California. I had claimed in an ad that it may have been the very last unit to come off the last assembly line making tube portables in the U.S.A. This claim was based on a very late cabinet date of April 27, 1962, and chassis parts codes from May 1962. Whether this claim is true is still in question, although I've been checking every B600 I have come across in the last 20 years and have not encountered any later dates.

In any event, I hope this article will encourage collectors to be more aware of similar benchmark radios as they peruse Antique Radio Classified and eBay listings, or walk through a flea market. For instance, if you already have a couple of 600 series Trans-Oceanics, you probably just walk on past any other 600s that you see. However, as conservators, shouldn't we be looking out for the first of that series — the L600 with early date codes, say from January 1954, but introduced in May 1954, as well as the last? The same is true for the other models — the 7G605, the 8G005, and so on.

I've written ad nauseam about the Realistic Flavoradio mainly because it was the last production AM radio made. Otherwise, that little unremarkable blip on the screen would have passed into history unheralded.

My collection also has what may be the first transistorized Trans-Oceanic built. It has a speaker coded 738 (part code 343738) — the 343 is Zenith; the 738 means the 38th week of 1957. The tuner is coded 731, and the transformer 732. These are all the earliest dates any of us Zenith collectors have seen (those of us who are speaking to each other, that is) so the Trans-Oceanic Royal 1000, serial number 6250523 (perhaps actually number523) may be among the very first produced. See Figure 1. I have this set in my collection, but

I'd certainly like to hear from collectors who have earlier numbers.

THE WORK TO BE DONE

Several of us have been in a friendly competition for the earliest Zenith 500. This was the only radio to be sequentially numbered from 00000 up. Most manufacturers code their serial numbers so as to keep their total production figures secret.

For several years, Bob M. had the earliest number at 00506. Then Gary obtained number 00046 and shortly after that, I found #00016, shown in Figure 2. However, that one had been photographed with nonmatching components, so my holding may be of questionable integrity. But, all of us should be on the lookout for a single digit survivor, as it would certainly come from the first day of regular production.

I wonder if anyone knows what the earliest surviving serial number Regency TR-1 is — or the last.

We should be documenting the early and late models of all the benchmark radios. Certain radios from many different manufacturers come to mind: Admiral 909, Hallicrafters S-93 and the TW series, the big Philco T-9, the RCA StratoWorld series, and the Magnavox AW-100, the first transistorized all-wave radio. And where are the first and last of the Privat-Ear sets from 1951, the first pocketable radio? Can we hear from the Sony and Hitachi collectors? Where are the benchmark units from the European

manufacturers?

There is a lot of work to be done here and the most important part is the documentation, certainly here in *Antique Radio Classified*, but also in your own blog or web page. Share what you know. I only started doing

this a couple of years ago when I found that Verizon would give me a web page for free.

I hope to start a firestorm of activity here, but I especially want to find that Zenith 500 with senal number 0000x.

Not to mention another white Flavoradio, as shown in Figure 3.


RCA Model 301 Duo – Radio/Phonograph

Estes Auctions — The Steven R. Ralston Collection Burbank. Ohio — October 10, 2009

The October Estes auction dealt with a fine collection amassed by Steven R. Ralston of Lyons, Colorado. Included were a Grebe CR-18 with coils and a RORK amp, a McMurdo Silver Masterpiece V in Clifton cabinet, a magnificent Philco 37-690, two of the RCA & GE wood advertising dolls designed by Maxfield Parrish, many military sets. Ham sets, and a large selection of tube testers, along with the usual great selection of tubes.

This was a large sale. I recorded over 500 items in the main sale and missed guite a few items due to several side auctions that I wanted to attend. There were side auctions


of phonograph items, transistor radios, paper items, and the usual bulk tube lots later in the day, none of which I recorded. There was also the usual 8:30 A.M. auction of low value items that

lasted until 10:07 A.M. and was not recorded. These early morning auctions are an interesting free-for-all, and it's amazing how much "stuff" moves out in a short period of time. Bargains are




to be had and sometimes a few

really good items turn up.

The total sale proceeds that I recorded came to over \$47,000, not including the 5 percent buyer's premium. With that number and the auction items I missed. the total sale value must have been closer to \$60,000.

There was rain on Friday when we arrived and Saturday morning was cold and wet, although not raining. However, by midmorning, the sun was out, and it was warm enough to open the auction hall doors for ventilation. The parking lot was full and over 100 bidders registered for the sale. Competition was firm, and it seemed as if prices were firming up a bit after being in the doldrums for most of the year.

However, as always at auctions, there are bargains to be had, especially as the day wears on, and bidders run out of funds or stamina. The two seldom seen wood-articulated GE & RCA advertising dolls by Maxwell Par-

rish sold for \$700 and \$750. A very nice Grebe CR-18 with coils and RORK amp sold for \$2,300. The excellent McMurdo Silver Masterpiece sold for \$4,250 while the very nice Philco 37-690 console went for \$800. Other prices were more or less in line with current valuations, but I was shocked when a really nice Philco 39-116 console complete with its Mystery remote control was sold for only \$35. I quess if you do not have room for it it matters little how low the price does.

I stopped recording at 4:45 P.M. while there was still a lot to sell and bidding was still active. All in all, a nice sale on a good day. It was wonderful to see and touch those fine radios even if you could not manage to take many home with you.
