

MEET REPORT

Radio XLII — a.k.a. Radio 42 Westford, Massachusetts — February 20, 2011

Not to worry — bitter cold does not deter the indefatigable radio collectors from traveling to the annual Greater Boston Antique Radio Collectors (GBARC) meet held at the Westford Regency Hotel on President's Day weekend. Luckily, the persistent snow in New England this year held off for this event, and the hotel offered all its usual amenities to make everyone comfortable. What better way to spend a morning with old and new friends all dedicated to our ultimate goal — the preservation of radio history!

The total attendance was 504, close to last year's count. At the 83 tables, there were 52 exhibitors and their helpers, totaling 87. From old guard attendees, as well as new, the response was overwhelmingly positive, and there was much trepidation about the future of the show. A.R.C. had run it for several years, but the magazine's recent sale to Jon Kummer and relocation to Long Island has made the future uncertain. We're hoping that some New Englander will pick up the job of organizing what has been the

most successful event in the Northeast for years.

The enthusiasm of attendees is something the lovers of this hobby don't want to see slip away. An

example lay in the comment of Elis Guditz, a new attendee who expressed his amazement at what was going on — "It's a trip down memory lane. I didn't

think so much catalog stuff still existed!" And he went on marveling from table to table.

Describing himself as "an old repairman," Elis also found he had come to the right place to find someone to help him sort out the vintage equipment in his workshop. We steered him to Ray Bintliff, who, in turn, found Jim Buliszak who volunteered to help. As always, this meet is the place not only to exchange and marvel at old treasures, but also to make valuable connections.

A FAMILY OF FRIENDS

The really great thing about this show is the feeling of "family" even for those who have

However, her attention was soon drawn to a set of Elvis miniature trucks among Lenny's novelties. Unfortunately, she had to wait for Dad to show up with the money, which Lenny managed to extort from Rain later in the day. Another happy ending to a Radio 42 family story.



Lined up on one of their tables were seven Zenith Trans-Oceanics, four of them already sold. On another, lamps with shades made of old tube boxes caught many an eye. In all, John reported, "It was a good day — we sold 90 percent of what we brought before 10:00 a.m."

Having a good day was evident in the faces of Anita and Bob Genthner from Buskirk, New York, who said they had "hit the jackpot" early in the morning with the sale of two solid-state Zenith Trans-Oceanics. But, for them, the best reason to come to this show is not only new customers, but also new friends."

Similar satisfaction was shown by Bob and Pat Sukosky who are a kind of romantic "success story" for this show. A few years ago they came as an engaged couple, with Pat in the process of being introduced to the world of radio collecting.

Attending a show like Radio 42 allows collectors to connect one-on-one — a plus that can't be matched by the Internet. It also reveals how many different ways there are to pursue this hobby. I found a good example in a conversation with Jahan Acciavatti, who jauntily attended to business wearing his period top hat, while his wife Anne Marie "held the money." When I asked how vintage phonographs had become of primary interest to him, he explained that back in the 1980s, an elderly lady had given him her collection of 78 records, and — what eise? — he had to have something to play them on. Simple as that. Since then, old radios and quack medical devices have crept into the mix of his collection, and so it goes — probably on and on.

Maybe on to Tv's next — like Brian Edwards who has a collection of about 125 TV sets. It was good to see some of them on his table, as they were a sign that more and more people have added this important part of communications history to their collections. Brian was showing two unusual TV sets — a Marconi and a GE with the same chassis but in different cabinets.

Jahan Acciavatti's offerings varied from telephones to a 1902 Victor Monarch phonograph selling for \$1,100, and a Magnavox M1-A horn speaker selling for \$95.

He let it slip that he is a big fan of antique technology that now fills his attic. "It doesn't have to be practical," admitted Brian. "It just has to look interesting."

Just about everything looks interesting to John Stein and his longtime partner Sharon Mayor who brought in three hotel carts of large and small, inexpensive items to sell to people looking for restoration projects and parts. Almost everything had been sold. Sharon has a collection of 400 transistor radios, but together they collaborate on all kinds of projects, including a ride-on, live steam railroad in their backyard. Soon they'll be off on a vintage motorcycle ride to the Ocala National Park in Florida. It would be hard to beat this couple's wide range of interests.

Obviously, the conversations at Radio 42 could veer off into almost anything, but radio and radio-related was the topic that had brought these folks together. And because everyone had found this show both good for sales over the years and good for picking up new information while renewing old ties, the idea that it might come to an end was not a happy thought. MEET REPORT

Kutztown Radio Show XXIII A View From the Trenches

The spring Kutztown Radio Show XXIII, hosted by the Delaware Valley Historic Radio Club (DVHRC) was held on May 7 and 8, 2010, at Renningers Antiques and Farmer's Market in Kutztown, Pennsylvania. The two-day show was, as usual, a great success. When all was said and done, there was nothing left but a stack of Lawrence Welk albums, a lot of wind, a busted speaker, and some broken glass from Lewie Newhard's grandfather clock radio.

In the beginning, some 257 tables were in use. I'm not certain whether this was an event record,

since I don't know if anybody ever bothered to count before. But the meat of the matter was that Renninger's two pavilions were brimming with a literal museum of everything antique radio. But unlike a museum, everything in this museum was "For Sale." You name it — it was there.

When I arrived early on Thursday to set up, it was clearly evident that this function, believe it or not, was continuing to grow in scope. The word earlier in the week had been that the demand for tables was so great that Renninger's crew had to build more of them to accommodate the throngs of last minute dealers. Knowing full well that the primary pavilion was reserved in advance, my first trip next door to Pavilion 2 revealed that radio folk could assume half of the area there commonly occupied by regular Saturday flea marketers.

By late Thursday afternoon, there were about 20 radio sellers who had come early to enjoy the













low-key opportunity to display their wares before the madness of Friday morning. Since the indoor market was closed, most of them had packed provisions for the evening, or headed into town for nourishment.

In their absence, Doug and the gang from Just Grillin' arrived to get the kitchen arranged. A cool evening, it was no surprise that they didn't wait for the customary Friday night "Radio Burn" to get a campfire going. These wonderful folks work hard keeping everyone fed during the course of the meet, and have become part of the customary friendly fabric of Kutztown, just like the vendors who attend regularly.

FRIDAY BEEHIVE ACTIVITY

The beehive of seller activity at dawn on Friday was as expected. And buyers showed up en masse as well. The advance team from the DVHRC had the club area ready to go the night before, and it didn't take long for a never ending stream of shoppers to show up to purchase tubes, capacitors, and DVHRC "bling," and to admire our exquisite Jackson Bell raffle radio.

Elsewhere, it would appear that many collectors were thinning their herd of large furniture-type pieces. Consoles ruled at Kutztown XXIII, ranging from fully restored to "project" pieces. There was also a marked increase in transistor radio inventory. And for the first time in memory, TV shoppers had their choice of five different Philco Predictas!

One would imagine that for a first time attendee, it was an overwhelming experience. So many cool radios! But, which one to choose? Perhaps, paired with a weak economy, none of these newbies parted with their money quickly.

My guess is they wanted to see everything before committing to a purchase. While foot traffic the first day appeared up from past meets, most sellers expressed "soft" initial sales.

But K-Town veterans know that the number of potential buyers goes hot and cold as the day progresses, and they are always willing to be flexible in their pricing. Day One peaked at about 3 P.M. A quick run-through revealed that over 90 percent of the tables were active, and even more late-comers had secured a sales area in the overflow pavilion. Traffic was up, but sales were down.

The traditional Friday night steak dinner was devoured and enjoyed by one and all. Many remained in the food court area to socialize and enjoy some adult refreshments while the pile for the Radio Burn started to take shape.

And what a glorious blaze it was. Supplementing the scrap harvested from

the tree line at the back of the property, thirteen sacrificial lambs were donated to the fuel stack.

While most of the radio cabinets were in various stages of disrepair and delamination, a couple were spared from the inferno and taken home to live again by some of our resident radio recyclers. A crowd of about sixty watched the silliness billow into the night, as others, the audiophiles in particular, remained at their tables to show off their rigs and listen to music. Overall, it made for a diverse and entertaining evening.

SATURDAY – THE SHOW GOES ON

After a good night's rest, Saturday morning found a fast moving cold front blow through the meet,

causing a rather hard, albeit brief shower. Insignificant, really, when you consider the many oldtimers who wear their survival of past hurricane conditions like a badge of honor. Foul weather aside, more vendors only able to attend for one day set up quickly, followed by a horde of new shoppers.

And shop, they did. A canvass of some sellers suggested that their Saturday take far exceeded Friday's. The seemingly unsellable items donated to the club's "Buy It Now" area were liquidated as quickly as the morning rain.

As far as I could see, there were only five unoccupied spaces — a far cry from previous shows where more reserved spaces remained unoccupied.

When the swap meet began winding down around noontime, many trekked indoors for the auction in the White Room. Keeping the electronic refuse outside has made a big difference for the club. There were probably fewer bidders, and fewer lots, but the quality of the items was far better than it was two or three years ago. And even with the later start time of 1 P.M., it took



considerably less time to set up, execute, and check out than in the past.

By 2 P.M. it was time to pack up and head for home, tired, but confident that the spring 2010 Kutztown was time well spent and a joy for all who made the journey from across the area, from out of state, and from faraway lands like Canada and France.

AUCTION REPORT

Diefenderfer Auction, Leesport, Pennsylvania September 27, 2010

This early autumn weekday auction was held to dispose of the collection of Carl Ratner of Reinholds, Pennsylvania. The collection consisted of clocks (mostly electric), radios, telephones (mostly dial phones), test equipment, tubes, parts, records and miscellaneous phonograph collectibles. As such it was an interesting afternoon and gave me a chance to get an insight on some other aspects of collecting.

The auction was held indoors at a Farmer's Market complex. The market was not active this Monday and there was ample room with good lighting to view the

The event started at 1:30 p.m. with a "walk-around" auction of five or six tables of records, mostly 78s. I did not make any attempt to list the prices, which seemed high to me, but there was good activity nonetheless. At 1:55 p.m., while records were still being sold in the back, the main auctioneer started selling the clocks. Again, I made no attempt to record these sales. Finally, at 3:15 p.m. the sale of radio goods started with flats of parts.


The auctioneer had attempted to sort out many parts by grouping similar-looking things together; therefore, there was not much rhyme or reason to the assortment. As a result, 21 flats of parts sold for a total of \$43, a good deal for restocking one's workbench. Most of the radios were average or below-average electric table sets, quite a few were missing knobs, and I think there was only one homebrew battery radio, but there were also a couple of high flyers.

In the latter category, first up was an original

Sparton Bluebird in fair to good condition that sold for \$1,300. Surprisingly there were two spare mirror fronts for it, one with blue trim and one with black trim. They were sold separately for \$110 and \$10, respectively. Next auctioned were two Globe World radios, one white and one black. The white one, in good condition, sold for \$1,000; the black one, which had damage, sold for \$300. Next there was a

very interesting wood case, trapezoid-shaped white table set with a blue mirror glass front with an aquarium motif. I could not identify a make or model. but it was a factory set and sold for \$950 in fair to good condition. There were a couple of catalins, but most had damage or parts missing. A very nice black laquered small RCA 6K10 console brought only \$105, which was a very good buy in my opinion.

At 4:30 p.m. the auction shifted to the telephones, and I was surprised at the interest in dial phones. Many were purchased by one buyer for what I thought were high prices. So the lesson is hang onto those old rotary phones, they are going up in value. (By the way, how many


people under a "certain age" really know how to "dial" a telephone number?)

After the phones were disposed of, the radio and phonograph sales resumed. Of particular note was the extensive collection of over 50 old Victrola needle tins. These were sold "choice" and brought a total of nearly \$600. The test equipment and hi-fi items finished up the auction, and there seemed to be some good bargains here, as well.

All in all, it was an interesting event and one that presented an opportunity to gather some new acquisitions for the collector or repair shop. The auction ended at 5:50 p.m., and the total realized for only the radio items was about \$7,300. There was a buyer's premium of 10% (13% if paying by credit card) that is not included in the following listed prices. There was no sales tax at this sale.

RESTORATION REPORT

Examining a Rare Hallicrafters S-2

BY JERRY WIELAND

Jerry Wieland examines and tests a Hallicrafters S-2 communications receiver which is a version of Hallicrafters' first communications receiver, the S-1. Only a few examples of the S-2 are known to exist.

After I read Ed Curran's article, "A 'Once in a Lifetime Find" (January 2011), I thought about all the radios I had worked on through the years. None would be considered rare. However, within a month I had the opportunity to examine and operate one of the earliest and rarest Hallicrafters receivers.

Bill Ross, W9WR, a fellow member of the Antique Radio Club of Illinois, asked if I would check out his Hallicrafters Sky-Rider [seems to appear most often this way] Model S-2 that had been restored in 1994. He displayed it at various meets over the years, but has never turned it on. While Bill knew of about eight Sky-Rider Model S-1s, this model is so rare that, when he acquired it, he knew of no other original and complete Model S-2. Since then, another has surfaced.

I couldn't pass up this once-in-alifetime opportunity of my own. When

Bill delivered the radio, he also brought Chuck Dachis' book, Radios by Hallicrafters, 1 from which I learned that the S-2 is a modified version of the S-1, Hallicrafters first communications receiver. Both models were introduced in 1934, but the S-2 (also referred to as a Sky-Rrider S-1 "Special) had the added features of bandspread and a Send/Receive switch. It sold for \$49.95. The radio we examine here is the same S-2 pictured in Chuck's book.

THE CABINET AND CONTROLS

Figure 1 is a front panel view The toggle switch on the left side next to the dial is the Send/Receive switch. The horizontal thumb wheel below the dial operates the coarse tuning. The clear celluloid tuning indicator has a series of holes for inserting a pencil point to mark station locations on the paper dial. The dial is divided into four bands: 1.5–3.0, 3.0–5.7, 5.7–11.5, and 11.5–22.0 MC. The top half of the dial is calibrated in megacycles (MC) and the bottom half in meters.

The four-position band switch is to the right of the tuning thumb wheel. The long pointed knob in the center of the panel is the bandspread control with dial markings from 0 to 100. The main dial is



closest to being calibrated when the bandspread control is fully clockwise. Because of a gear reduction mechanism on the bandspread control, the knob rotates significantly beyond the dial end points. The knob directly above the bandspread is an antenna trimmer. The knob under and to the left of the speaker is the volume control and power switch. To the right of the volume control is another horizontal thumb wheel, which is the regeneration control. A headphone jack is to the upper right of the speaker.

None of the controls is labeled, although the band switch is numbered 1 through 4. Personally, I find it odd that the lowest frequency band is labeled 4 and the highest 1. Another oddity is the absence of grooves on the thumb wheel knobs, which are smooth and therefore more difficult to operate. The front panel is silver and the remainder of the cabinet is black, the original color scheme according to a 1934 receiver review article. Figure 2 is a view of the back and top of the cabinet, which is all metal. As you can see, the back is well ventilated. Three wires snake through one of the holes on the upper right side of Figure 2. One is ground and two are for a doublet antenna. Originally they were attached

to a free-floating, three-terminal Ant-Gnd strip (not shown), which was temporarily unsoldered to separate the cabinet from the chassis.

Figure 3 shows an area on the cabinet top for tube access. This panel is secured by four screws. The only way to remove the chassis is through the cabinet front. The front panel is mounted to the chassis and secured to the cabinet by eight screws.

THE CIRCUIT




Figure 4. The speaker reproducer shown attached to the paper speaker back, probably affixed with Hydrolene glue.




Figure 5. The 2-C-1 schematic that appeared in the February issue of The Crosley Broadcaster.

The S-2 is a five-tube TRF receiver with regeneration to increase sensitivity. Figure 4 is a top view of the chassis and front panel removed from the cabinet; Figure 5 is a bottom view of the chassis. The tubes and their functions are as follows:

6D6 Tuned RF amp

6D6 Detector with regen

6C6 Audio pre-amp

42 Audio driver

80 Rectifier

The first three tubes are shielded. The output tube drives either a five-inch speaker or headphones. There is no dial light and there are no internal adjust-







ments for alignment. Besides using the speaker field coil for supply filtering, an additional choke is also used, which is visible in Figure 5 directly under the power transformer at the top left. This choke appears to have been replaced (as were all the paper capacitors) with Mylar types. Both electrolytic power supply filter capacitors were also replaced with modern types. However, the old cans were left on the chassis, although disconnected. All these changes were probably done during the 1994 restoration. I found a paper label on the rear chassis wall indicating that Chuck had performed the 1994 cosmetic and electrical restoration in Austin, Texas. He probably took the photo for his book at this time.

THE TEST

A visual inspection did not uncover any issues. The tubes and power transformer tested OK. After lubing the moving parts and inserting the tubes, I connected a short wire antenna to one end of the doublet and connected the other doublet wire to chassis. I did not ground the chassis.

I decided to start with Band 4, which includes the

top of the standard broadcast band. While slowly bringing up power and monitoring B+, I heard normal channel noise from the speaker. I found a few broadcast stations between 1.5 and 1.7 MHz. Peaking the antenna trimmer and adjusting the volume and regen controls resulted in good quality audio with decent volume.

As I ventured higher in frequency, the regen and antenna trimmer interacted more. At night, I pulled in many international stations and hams with my meager antenna. I also found I could unscramble single sideband transmissions by adjusting the regen control past the oscillation point while using the bandspread to tune to either side of the signal. Sometimes I would also have to adjust the antenna trimmer. Tuning conventional double sideband signals was much easier when I adjusted the antenna trimmer first and then adjusting the regen control to a point just before oscillation.

Chuck's restoration withstood the test of time. And now I have a once-in-a-lifetime radio memory.

RESTORATION REPORT

The Crosley Model 2-C-1 – Minor Mysteries Surround A True Depression-Era Radio

A casual phone conversation about radios often can become so engrossing that it provides enough material for a full-blown radio article. Such was the case when A.R.C. writer Bob Sands called another frequent contributor, Dave Crocker, about a unique Crosley radio he has. With editorial assistance from Dave, and photos and notes from Bob, this is the result. (Editor)

About the time Powel Crosley was awaiting delivery of the famous 500-kW WLW transmitter in Cincinnati, Ohio, his engineers were busy designing a simple cost-effective radio to meet the demands of a market hindered by the Great Depression. It was envisioned to be the "Volkswagen" of receivers of the time.

ENTER THE CROSLEY MODEL 2-C-1 OF 1935

Electrically, the circuit is ingenious because it uses two dual-purpose tubes and therefore achieves four-tube performance combined with its tuned radio frequency circuit. Savings are realized in terms of space, metal chassis layout, and sockets. With the front panel of the set being the actual speaker diaphragm (or cone), the usual front panel was saved as well as a speaker frame or basket .No bezel or separate dial is needed since a pointer knob is used with the dial settings printed on the front panel.

ALL IN A VERY "VALUE-ENGINEERED" DESIGN (A CROSLEY TRADITION)

Two versions of the 2-C-1's front panel were

available at the time: the "Ship's Design" and the "Artist's Design" (see Figures 1 and 2). As far as I know, examples of the Artist's Design may be the only ones to have survived as my research has located no others. (If any of our readers out there have any input on this, please write to A.R.C.

I personally believe the artists depicted on the front panel were likely those featured on radio station WLW programming. For example, the blackface entertainers in the top left might be Amos 'n' Andy, or Hink & Dink (E. Hinkle and G. Ross), who performed "Song & Patter" on WLW and were so popular they toured theaters around Cincinnati in the late 1920s and 30s. In the upper right, we appear to have the DeVore sisters, Ruth, Billie, and Marge, who were performers in the early 1930s, in the center, that fellow with the violin could be guitarist Chet Atkins, who started on WLW as a fiddle player. The couple in the lower left corner might be Nelson Eddy and Jeanette MacDonald.

THE SAMPLER

The most common version (though still very hard to find! was known as "The Sampler." But one wonders, who would have named it that? Crosley's service notes state that the front is a Ship's Design (note the cross-stitch pattern), but by the time the information was published in Rider, the 2-C-1 was referred to as the Sampler. Were there legalities involving the use of these pictures? Why not choose a name with a nautical theme? Interesting questions like these puzzle collectors.

Six collectors that I know of (Greg Farmer, Jim Watson, Geoff Shearer, John Miller, Bob White, and myself) possess the Sampler model, but I'm sure there are a few more 2-C-1's hiding in collections, closets, and cellars. Geoff found his set as a cabinet and chassis only, with a completely destroyed front panel, no back or identifying labels or numbers. (See The Crosley 2C1 and A.R.C. is Helping Hand in the September 2004 A.R.C. issue.)

The chassis is extraordinarily simple (see Figure 3). It uses just two tubes, a type 12A7 and a type 6F7, situated on either side of the electrolytic condenser located at the rear of the chassis. The permanent magnetic speaker driver is shown at the top right of the Figure. Its vibrating needle (not shown) goes forward to the paper speaker. Figure 4 shows this needle attached to the back of the speaker diaphragm. The Hydrolene glue likely used to affix the front speaker panel to the square metal cabinet is a water-soluble substance patented by Sunoco in 1921. It can be mixed in many viscosities from liquid to solid and is still used in the medical industry.

MORE QUESTIONS REMAIN

To the best of my knowledge, no form of advertising or dealer information has been located. The Crosley Broadcasters, the dealer monthly bulletin, shows nothing about this set except the circuit diagram that appeared in the February 1, 1935, issue (see Figure 5) and This same circuit diagram also appeared in the December 1934 volume of Rider, page 6-1. We've checked all the issues from 1933 to 1935 - and no introduction. Since there was never a model or chassis number affixed to the 2-C-1, might it have been a promotional item only? Was it an extremely limited production run? Or - my personal suspicion - was production ceased because of how difficult it is to remove the chassis (it must be unsoldered from the speaker diaphragm the motor. I'm guessing that many owners and service repairmen didn't want to perform that task, even if they tried the speaker was likely ruined when the chassis was pulled.

GE MODEL BX – Housed in a grey-brown case, this compact table set is an AC/DC, 4-tube receiver. It was manufactured by the General Electric Co. of Bridgeport, Conn. in 1932. (Dave Crocker – Mashpee, MA)

PHILCO MODEL 50-524 – This 5-tube receiver of 1950 was manufactured by the Philco Corp. of Philadelphia. It is one of the many "Transitone" radios which Philco offered in the 1950s. It uses one each of the following tubes types: 7A8, 12BA6, 14B6, 50L6, and 35Z5. It tuned the broadcast band only. (Clark Thissell – Lincoln, NE)



MATADOR CRYSTAL SET KIT NO. 152 – This crystal set, which I constructed with old 1924 plans and original wooden parts, was designed by Johann Korbuly of Vienna, the founder of Matador. He was famous for his wooden radio kits for children. (Erwin Macho – Vienna, Austria)

RADIODYNE MODEL WC10 - This 5-tube receiver was manufactured by the Western Coil and Electrical Co. of Racine, Wisconsin. In 1923, it sold for \$150, less tubes, batteries, and speaker. (Wally Worth - Wollaston, MA)



COLOMBIA MODEL 20 – PHILCO MODEL 60B – Manufactured by the Philco Corp. of Philadelphia in 1934, this 5-tube cathedral tuned both the broadcast and the shortwave bands. It was one of the many cathedral-styled receivers of the 1930s. (Clark Thissell – Lincoln, NE)





FREED-EISEMANN NR-102 – This 5-tube Neutrodyne was manufactured by the Freed-Eisemann Radio Corp. of Brooklyn, New York. It is a rarely seen 1925 radio, as it is one of only 70 produced. All five tubes stick out of the front panel in a vertical configuration. There is a wooden cover on the top that lifts and covers the binding posts which are factory-labeled on a card. HORNYPHON "HORNYETTA" MODEL W147U - This 1957 Austrian radio was very popular because of its plastic cabinet and the fact that it worked with AC/DC and received MW. (Erwin Macho - Vienna, Austria)



CLARION MODEL 321 – This 5-tube tombstone radio was manufactured in 1933 by the Warwick Manufacturing Corp. of Chicago. It tunes the broadcast band only. (Clark Trissell – Lincoln, NE)

EMERSON MODEL 400 – Manufactured by the Emerson Radio & Phonograph Company of New York, this 1940 table radio is of yellow Catalin with red grille bars and black knobs. Called the "Aristocrat," it has a 5-tube, AC/DC chassis The color is now reddish brown due to its exposure to UV light, but it will polish down to a bright yellow. (Robert Kitchel – Danville, VT)


