RESTORATION REPORT

The Problem with the 1924 Zenith Super Portable Radio

Zenith introduced the Super Portable (Companion) radio in early 1924. Selling for \$224, it was entirely self-contained in a traveling case. described as "smaller than the average suitcase," and included tubes, batteries, horn speaker, and built-in antenna. The controls were located outside so that the set could be played in a closed or open configuration, making it truly portable.

Zenith marketed the Super Portable radio as allowing the user to take it on camping trips, to the beach or enjoy it in the home, and the company's advertising has always maintained that the 1924 Super Portable radio was the "world's first portable radio." There was, however, a problem with this radio that resulted in fairly low production numbers.

and all went back at least twice. There's even a folklore story that Zenith President Eugene Mc-Donald publicized the destruction of the returned radios by burning them in a huge bonfire, Judging from these reports—and the fact that there are not very many still in existence—the problem with the Super Portable was a very serious one. To my knowledge, there's no information avail-

able that indicates what the problem was. Did it not play well? Did the batteries run down quickly?

There's some confusion as to exactly how many

set were produced, but evidently most were either

were recalled by Zenith. One source states that

1,000 radios were produced, of which 600 were


returned. Another says that 6,000 were produced

Did it just quit playing? What, exactly, was the problem?

I was fortunate enough to obtain a 1924 Zenith Super Portable radio in good condition. Moreover, it was complete-it even had original Zenith UV-99 tubes-so I decided to restore it, to the point of re-producing the A. B, and C batteries. The only serious problem I found during restoration involved the first and second ACME: two RF transformers were open. There was a note inside the first transformer that stated "Repaired both #2 coils 3-28-1940.

I used substitute transformers, but they didn't work very well. I purchased five used Acme transformers, but they were all open. The only option left to me was to rewind them using 30-gauge lacquer coated wire as a substitute for the original 40-gauge clothcovered wire. All other parts in the radio remain original, except for the D battery, which required an adapter since the original had a negative case.

With that problem solved the radio stated working. I

theorized that the batteries might have been the original problem because of a statement in an article I came across about the Super Portable, which said that the batteries "only lasted a few minutes." I decided to perform some tests to see if I could determine if they were indeed the problem, and also to see how long they would last for me now.

TEST METHOD AND RESULTS

My test results are presented in the accompanying Test Activity Log table. The tests were conducted by recording the A voltage, the B voltage and the start time. The radio was then turned on and frequently monitored, and I would occasionally change stations. When I turned off the radio the end time was recorded along with the A voltage and the B voltage again. This was continued until the batteries were exhausted.

I used the 1930 Trav-Ler Model D Portable radio as a baseline for how long the A batteries should last (Trav-Ler suggests that A batteries should last 75 hours).

The Zenith portable actually performed better than the Trav-Ler, playing for over 80 hours on the same set of batteries. The Zenith outlasted the Trav-Ler because the Zenith had 6 - 99 tubes and the Trav-Ler only had 5 - 99 tubes, and because it

was also six years younger. Was the Zenith Super Portable radio ahead of its time?

No adjustments were made for using the D cells, 9 volt, and AAA batteries in the re-produced A, B, and C batteries. The test data confirms that battery consumption of the Zenith Super Portable radio was not a problem.

The performance of the Super Portable radio over the test period was very satisfactory. The volume (horn speaker) was always acceptable and could be heard across the room. The tuning required a little patience as the single knob control is a little misleading because rheostat knobs greatly affect the volume of the station being tuned: If the rheostats are turned too low the station cannot be heard, but if they are turned too high a hissing noise is heard (feedback). With a little tinkering, however, many stations, strong and weak, could be heard.

The antenna is located in the lid of the case and most of the tests were performed with the case in the open position; however, some were performed in the closed position. The radio seemed to perform slightly better in the open position.

The radio was also tested with head phones that resulted in excellent performance, as expected. During the testing there were never any problems or performance issues that would suggest that the

radio should be returned to the manufacturer.

After the restoration, testing, and operation of this particular radio for many hours, I could only identify one catastrophic problem that would have caused this device to be returned to the manufacturer. That problem was the failure of the Acme transformers. I now find myself speculating as to what was wrong with these transformers; was there a problem in design, materials (wire, solder, flux), workmanship?


Since only one radio was tested, it isn't reasonable to attribute all those returns to the Acme transformers. It might prove enlightening if other Zenith Super Portable radio owners checked the Acme transformers, or even performed similar testing.

CONCLUSION


The 1924 Zenith Super Portable radio was one of the first truly portable radios manufactured for the general public. When it was introduced it would have been considered high-tech, incorporating the new low voltage UV-199 tubes and single dial tuning, as well as being fully self-contained. Based on the performance of this radio I believe the Zenith Super Portable radio might have been a real success story for Zenith if engineering had not made the decision to use the Acme transformers, which likely resulted in its failure, early death and obscurity.



AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auction Burbank, Ohio, January 16, 2010

After a long spell of cold weather, the weekend of the Estes Auction was relatively mild, with the temperature at least above freezing. It was foggy and damp, however, and there was quite a bit of snow on the ground—but that's a small price to pay when hunting for great radio deals.

The usual pre-sale of low-value goods started at 8:30 a.m. and was smaller than usual but did contain some better items such as six or more AK "coffin" sets and several nice seven-tube Zenith chassis. This auction ended at 9:40 a.m. allowing for a short break before the main auction at 10:00. I did not record any items here.

Almost 100 bidders showed up for the main auction, which featured a large collection of jukeboxes. In addition to the usual battery and 1930s wood table sets, there was a collection of near-mint World War II military electronic items, about 20 very nice console radios, an exceptional Echophone cathedral mounted in a small highboy console cabinet, a Cob Organ, a pair of Leslie X77 speakers. and quite a few phonograph items. All this was in addition to the usual tubes and parts offerings. There was also some nice service literature and a side auction of transistor radios that I did not record.

The prices paid for the jukeboxes covered quite a range, possibly because some were listed as not working or partially restored. Most of them looked in good condition, and for lucky buyers who could handle and transport them, they would certainly look nice in a den or rec room. The star of the group was the Chicago Band Box Automaton. This unit did not play records or make music—it just mimicked an orchestra. It was in good working condition and sold for \$3,600.

I stopped recording the auction's results at 3:45 p.m., with maybe 15 or 20 minutes' worth of items left to sell and few bidders remaining. It being the







middle of winter, many people no doubt wanted to hit the road before it got too late. The dollar total of what I recorded came to \$43,076, not including the 5-percents buyer's premium.

CLUB REPORT

Reinvigorating a Vintage Radio Organization

How do you grow and reinvigorate an antique radio organization that has been in existence for over 35 years? This has been an ongoing question faced by the California Historical Radio Society (CHRS) and its Northern California membership. As many similar groups have found, growth in the hobby has proven a challenge. Most are experiencing declines in membership. Many reasons are given, including the Internet and maturity of the hobbyists. Certainly it does not help that membership is growing increasingly gray and that today's youth are often not attracted to the hobby. When I showed my

prized radio collection to my 25-year old nephew and told him that they all used vacuum tubes, he looked up from his iPhone and said, with near zero interest. "Yeah? What's that?"

If there were a catchphrase to describe how the CHRS board has tackled the "growth problem," I

would pick "actively opportunistic." For the first 30-plus years of its existence, CHRS held quarterly swap meets, published a newsletter, and provided public radio displays. The first opportunity for real expansion came in 2003, when CHRS approached the owners of Inner Cities Broadcasting with a proposal to occupy the empty studios and offices of radio station KVTO, formerly KRE, in Berkeley (still an active, remotely controlled transmitter site). The owners liked the idea of dedicating the unused space to radio history and agreed to give CHRS a 10-year, rent-free lease. The 1937 building gave CHRS just what it wanted: room for meetings, workshops, and a collection of historically significant radios, along with a parking lot for swap meets (for more details about the KRE deal, see the ARC article "Bay Area Organization Takes over KRE" in the August 2004 issue).

After nearly seven years of restoration work by a dedicated band of CHRS volunteers, the once graffiti-ridden KRE building now houses an excellent collection of muse-

um-quality radios, televisions, and test equipment, as well as a large radio repair shop and an active amateur radio station (W6CF). It also features an audio digitization service, a working 1950s control room, and an extensive library of radio manuals, technical books, magazines, and journals from the James Maxwell collection. CHRS is probably the only

antique radio organization in the country to occupy a historically significant radio station building complete with an active transmitting tower.

Undoubtedly the highlight of the year is CHRS's radio day by the bay, which they've dubbed LIVE! at KRE. This all-day fundraising event, held under Berkeley's beautiful blue skies in mid-July, features a giant auction of vintage radios, test equipment, amateur gear, and radio ephemera. LIVE! at KRE also features an extensive flea market, hot food, live music, tours of the KRE building radio displays, interviews with radio personalities, and a live radio play put on by the Broadcast Legends. This annual event draws crowds of hundreds for a full day of radio fun. Don't miss this year's event held on Saturday, July 16. See the CHRS website at www.CaliforniaHistoricalRadio.com for details and a map.

Throughout the year, CHRS involves its members by hosting a series of volunteer days almost every weekend at KRE. On these weekends, the KRE building opens to offer members a choice of activities. Some choose to volunteer their time to help restore the building, or maintain the grounds. Others help organize the Maxwell Library of donated books. magazines, and technical journals. Others work on restoring artifacts in the CHRS collection, or volunteer time archiving historic media in CHRS' audio transfer facility. They also host several vintage radio swap meets and Radio Activity Days at KRE where members can bring a troublesome radio and participate in the popular Radio Repair Clinics, Members can attend one of the many educational lectures or video presentations offered throughout the year about some aspect of vintage radio or broadcasting. There's something for everyone, and it's hard not to feel that vacuum tube glow-in-the-dark camaraderie.

In 2010, CHRS saw another opportunity to expand and broaden its membership by merging with David Jackson's Bay Area Radio Museum. This merger provided CHRS with a vast online archive of radio broadcasts, historical documents, photographs, personality biographies, and music surveys. This collection traces the history of radio in the San Francisco Bay Area from its origins in the early 20th Century through its development into a network powerhouse

in the 1930s and 1940s to today. Access to this vast online collection is available on the CHRS website (via the BARM tab). As part of the BARM acquisition, CHRS acquired the Bay Area Radio Hall of Fame (started in on-line only form in 2006). Last year, volunteers created a physical Bay Area Radio Hall of Fame in the KRE building. The walls of Studio A now proudly display 85 members from stations that made Bay Area radio great.

None of these growth efforts would have been undertaken without the incredible dedication of CHRS' president, Steve Kushman, and a persistent group of volunteers who have restored the KRE site. Thanks to this group's dedication, the organization's future looks brighter than ever. Swap meets are well attended. Membership is once again growing. That's right, growing! They had 281 members in 2008

and 376 in February 2011. And CHRS' Sacramento and Central Valley Chapters remain active with local meetings and regional swap meets.

Certainly many challenges remain ahead. The KRE building is only leased, and CHRS would like to purchase it and renovate the studios to their 1950s glory. The board is still trying to sort out how to make the vision of housing a permanent museum-quality collection a reality. More volunteers are needed as well as generous benefactors with an interest in preserving radio history (hint: large donations greatly appreciated!).

Rarely does an old radio set have a chance to tell its own story. In this unique article, JoAnn Hughes Grossoehme does just that through the persuasion and assistance of Bob Sands of CARS (Cincinnati). JoAnn, who just turned 80, felt that the Atwater Kent radio she once owned should tell its own story, so she composed this little "autobiography" for it, which now sits, framed, on top of the radio's table. Read and enjoy as JoAnn imagines the family's radio life. But, first, Bob Sands tells how this all came about.

It's fortunate to have good neighbors for 37 years who share the same interests and hobbies, and it's terrific to have them offer to you an antique radio. Such is the case with my neighbors, Floyd and JoAnn Grossoehme, who live four houses away. Floyd has a degree in physics and JoAnn a degree in education. Floyd and I have common interests in motorcycling, target shooting, ham radio, and general electronics. Our families have shared dinners and many social evenings happily engaged in interesting discussions. The radio turned out to be an Atwater Kent Model 60 housed in the original Kiel table. The top of the table was marred, as are most older wooden tables, but the real damage was found inside. Through many moves the chassis and speaker had not been fastened down with blocks and screws, and consequently the cabinet's inside and inner lid were severely damaged. The AK chassis and speaker appeared to have survived OK. We put the radio in my basement where it resided for a few years before restoration.

The Kiel cabinet had seen loving care for its 80 years of existence, so the table needed only some touch-up, a bit of glue, and a treatment of Howard's Restore-A-Finish. The top, however, needed professional help. I had it completely patched and refinished and had a glass top cut to match the Kiel's lid design.

The Atwater Kent 60 chassis was totally checked out, tubes replaced, correct resistors replaced with modern banded color-coded types, and of course, new capacitors installed. The unit now performs well, and I have DXed stations in Texas, Canada, Iowa, Chicago, Boston, New York, and elsewhere.


When everything was finished, my wife Sue gave her blessing to set the unit in a corner of the dining room. I phoned Floyd and JoAnn and invited them over to hear the results. JoAnn was especially pleased as this set had been in her family since its original

FROM THE DIARY OF AN ATWATER KENT RADIO

I was born in 1929 and have led a long and interesting life. I was first purchased by John Eicher and placed in a spacious entry hall in the lovely home that he built at 6242 Savannah Avenue in College Hill, Cincinnati, Ohio. I was given a place of honor in the corner of the room, near the long staircase.

My earliest memory is that of my new owner sitting before me, smoking his pipe, and listening to H.V. Kaltenborn Jr. and the "Evening News." All during the 1930s he sat before me each evening, following the news of the gathering storm clouds over Europe.

I also remember the family sitting around me to listen to King Edward VIII of England abdicate the throne in 1936. This is especially vivid in my memory because the five-year-old granddaughter of our family was visiting and she was very interested in what the King said and asked many questions about it.

In the 1940s when the entry hall was redecorated, I was moved to a corner of the large family kitchen. Mr. Eicher sat in his rocking chair in front of me and listened to every Cincinnati Reds baseball game, narrated by Waite Hoyt.

Sometimes in the afternoons Mrs. Eicher would turn me on to listen to soap operas. On Sunday evenings, if I remember correctly, any of the family who were there listened to "One Man's Family." And, of course, on December 7th, 1941, everyone huddled around to hear me tell of the terrible attack on Pearl Harbor.

When the Eichers bought a new and more modern radio, I was given to their son-in-law, Walter Hughes, to use in his office at the Herschede Hall Clock Company. By this time I was getting older and didn't work very well, so I was taken to the Hughes home in College Hill and placed in their rathskeller. Here I served mostly as a table only, although occasionally I could manage to produce some listening entertainment for them. When Mr. And Mrs. Hughes moved to Mississippi, I was given to their daughter (the Eicher's granddaughter, JoAnn), who used me as an occasional table.

Finally, the family had no use for me, but fortunately I was given to a lover of old radios who saw my potential and restored me to my days of glory.






