

Heathkit Audio Generator Model AG-9A

When I first got started in the radio collecting hobby I realized early on that I would need test equipment. As funds were limited I began go to a local radio swap meet that I heard about held on Sundays. There I met other enthusiasts like me, and I made some ham radio friends. They saw my interest in the hobby and one of them was kind enough to give me a Heathkit AG9-A Audio Generator. It was a spare for him and it wasn't working anyway, so he passed it on to me along with the manual. I took my prize in hand and went home to read the book and tear down the unit to see what I needed to do to get it back to operational.

The Heathkit AG-9A Audio Generator is a simple, yet versatile instrument. It provides ease of operation in a multitude of test setups encountered in audio work. The wide range of repeatable frequencies and the metered low distortion output voltages, covering nearly all values encountered in audio work, contained in the conveniently small cabinet meant this instrument would have a preferred spot on my workbench—once I got it going.


FIXING THE AG-9A

The first repair I made to the AG-9A was in the power supply. It uses the conventional power transformer full-wave rectifier circuit feeding a ripple filter consisting of two capacitors and a choke. I found that I had to replace the 6X4 tube

as well as the dual 40-µf capacitors in the power supply. That brought the voltages back up. I also had to replace the pilot lamp.

The oscillator uses a 6AU6 pentode voltage amplifier and a 6CL6 triode-connected cathode follower. Regenerative feedback from the 6CL6 to the 6AU6 cathode is applied through the tungsten filament candelabra-based lamp. A filament check of the lamp indicated it was still good. I had tested the 6CL6 and 6AU6 tubes on a friend's TV7 tester and found them to be good as well.

Degenerative feedback is applied from the 6CL6 through a "notch" network to the grid of the 6AU6. The resultant oscillation occurs at the "notch" frequency, where degeneration is minimal and phase shift is zero. The notch network is a capacitor-shunted bridged-T type. I found that the C1 and C2 values had gone up in the X1 and X10 settings, so I replaced them. The amplitude of oscillation is maintained at a nearly constant value by the tungsten lamp. The regenerative feedback is applied through a voltage divider consisting of the lamp and the "oscillator" control. An increase in output signal increases the lamp current, the lamp temperature and the lamp resistance. This reduces the amount of feedback applied to the 6AU6 cathode and the resultant output. A balanced condition is thus obtained. The oscillator control is used to set the nominal output level.



The notch network consists basically of two resistors and two capacitors. From the relationship shown it is evident that a decrease in capacities by a factor of 10 will increase the frequency by a factor of 10. As the values of C1 and C2 were chosen with a 10:1 ratio, five capacitors can do the job of four pair or eight in achieving four decade ranges.

The attenuator reduces the output voltage from the 6CL6 cathode-follower through a continuously variable 5000-ohm "output" control, attenuator. The attenuator system is designed for 600-ohm output up

through 1 volt and high-impedance output at the 3- and 10-volt positions. The 600-ohm positions may be terminated by an internal load for high-impedance work, or this load may be disconnected when an external 600-ohm load is used. In the 3- and 10-volt positions, the internal load is automatically disconnected. The attenuator operates in steps of 10 dB.

The metering circuit measures the voltage at the arm of the output control. A portion of this voltage, determined by the "meter" control, is rectified by a half bridge using crystal diodes. Non-linearity of the diodes at low signal level is

compensated by a third diode across the meter. The meter carries three scales: 0-10 volt, 0-3 volt, and -10-+2 dB. When the instrument is operated with the proper termination, the meter and attenuator will indicate the output level at the binding posts.

I found that both crystal diodes had to be replaced. I also tested all the resistor and capacitor values and replaced any out-of-tolerance ones I found. Fortunately at the time I was able to get the needed parts from Heathkit. I don't remember now what I paid for them, but it had to be \$10 or less.

After making these repairs and giving the AG-9A a thorough cleaning it was time to test it out.

PUTTING IT THROUGH ITS PACES


I brought the AG-9A over to my friend's place and we used his Oscilloscope to check it out. I used the AG-9A for years but retired it some two decades ago for better equipment. I recently brought it back out of mothballs, however, and found that it's still about as accurate today as I remember it was back then. Over the years I've repaired one or two other AG-9As for friends who, for various reasons, didn't want to take on the repair themselves. Some of the parts are harder to come by, but with a little searching and ingenuity you, too, can still repair one.

RESTORATION REPORT

1934 Majestic Radio Model 55 "Duette"

One of the most iconic art deco radios ever manufactured in the United States is the 1934 Majestic "Duette" model 55. It's one of 33 different Majestic radio models offered as part of the company's "Smart Set" series of radios and it features the then modern deco look and a highly polished aluminum lyre grille.

Introduced to dealers in the summer of 1933, the Duette is a five-tube, two-band set covering the AM broadcast band (535–1550 kc) and the old "police band" (1480–4400 kc.). When I got it, the very nice example of the Majestic 55 pictured here was finished decoupage green with eagle decals and had been electronically repaired some 20-plus years ago.

When I stripped the green paint to restore the radio, the top gloss finish looked like it might have been dark brown originally, or possibly black as paint stripper darkens dark lacquer somewhat. I believed it most likely a dark brown so that's the way I refinished it. According to original factory information, the set had a high gloss "piano finish" and I refinished it accordingly.

BRINGING THE DUETTE BACK TO LIFE

The Hawaiian Lacewood veneer – which some mistake for Birdseye Maple or other types of wood – is in very good condition, except for a dent above the volume knob. The uniquely designed wood knobs were missing when I got the radio, and I still need to get the correct ones. The cloth-covered line cord and plug I replaced look original to the radio now. The grille cloth is an exact reproduction of the original and is held in place with four wood splines made out of precut balsa from the hobby store. The one-piece chassis with enclosed speaker was in excellent condition and very clean. The speaker was also like new and worked perfectly; there were no finger holes and no need for repairs.

The top knob is the On/Off/Volume control; the bottom knob is for tuning. The band switch is located at the back of the chassis and has a small "rosette" knob over it. The polished aluminum lyre grille is in very good condition considering that most others I've seen over the years are somewhat bent, over-polished or just plain worn. The



reception and sound quality is very good, probably the best of Smart Set series of radios, mainly because of the two IF stages and separated audio and AVC detection circuits. A 10-inch-long external antenna works very well, and I was able to pick up more than 15 stations on the AM band and every signal was clean, crisp and very clear. There was no hum, static or buzzing.

A SOUND DESIGN

In 1933 the Grigsby-Grunow Majestic model 55 radio was "a radical departure from the conventional design," incorporating "Majestic

Duo-Valve" tubes. The good preselection is obtained through a low-loss antenna coil. The tuned antenna circuit feeds a Duo-Valve (pentagrid converter) 6A7-S that serves as the local oscillator and mixer ("modulator"). The 456-kHz IF output feeds a double tuned IF transformer into the pentode section of the 6F7-S. The plate feeds the second IF transformer. The secondary is tuned and feeds the pentode section of a Duo-Valve 6B7-S into the third primary tuned IF transformer. The untuned IF secondary feeds the second detector diode plate for audio, and the second plate is capacitorcoupled for AVC voltage applied to the three IF amplifier stages. providing very good AVC action.


The detected audio feeds the triode section of the 6F7-S and onto the 42-pentode power output stage. The radio is transformer-powered and uses an 80 rectifier; B+ is 250 VDC.

Although during the 1930s most superheterodyne radios used tuned RF stages and one IF amplifier stage, this model 55 radio's 500 series chassis has significantly better selectivity, sensitivity and noise rejection capability as a result of the two IF amplifier stages. Also the second detector for audio recovery is not biased negative by the AVC voltage; instead the company separated the AC audio from the rectified AVC voltage, thereby reducing audio distortion. During this period most radio manufacturers – including GG Majestic, as in

images a 456-kHz IF frequency was needed.
Dimensions of this very nice looking radio are 9 x 12 1/2 x 7 1/2 inches (HWD).

the 460 chassis - were still using a 175-kHz IF fre-

quency; however, to minimize shortwave reception



The 1925 Sears Silvertone Neutrodyne Radio: "The World's Greatest Radio Receiver" Can Be Very Confusing!



It all started about 10-years ago when I purchased a 1925 Sears Silvertone Neutrodyne battery set. The radio was not unusual for its time. There were five 01A tubes – a typical 1920s battery set.

Then about two years ago I saw another one at a meet. The only difference was the addition of some fancy wood trim around the edges of the Bakelite front panel. Of course I had to purchase it and take it home to compare.


The difference was the cabinet of the first one had some decorative grooves along the front facing edge of the right and left sides and the second one didn't, the base of the first one had a plainer edge then the second one, the front panel on the first one was flush with the front facing edges and on the second one the front panel was recessed slightly to accommodate the fancy wood trim, and finally the cover of the first one did not completely cover the radio - there was about a inch wide strip of wood over the front panel while the cover of the second one covered the entire top of the radio and had

Top: Inside view of Version I - Plain cabinet with 01A tubes Middle: Fancy cabinet Bottom: Version II - 01A tubes


a decorative front edge. I thought that Silvertone had simply changed cabinet sources.


The labels on both units indicate they were manufactured by King-Hinners Radio Company

in Buffalo, NY. The serial number of the first radio was 10766 and the second was 7549.

End of story. Well, not yet.
Last year I saw another one of these radios







with the same cabinet as the fancy example but not decorative trim. Close inspection showed the outline of the trim had once been there but removed. I believe the trim covered the screws fastening the front panel to the cabinet. Again I opened the lid and there was a different chassis using five UV199 tubes! The 4-volt "C" battery was still present held in by a metal bracket. You know what happened – I had to buy it. It also had a King-Hinners label with a serial number of 6582.


Another surprise in the UV199 radio was a letter dated January 12, 1925 from Sears to the owner

apologizing for not including the instructions with the radio. Included in the envelope were the letter, a wiring diagram, and three pages of operating instructions for both chassis.

Furthermore, I was able to obtain a 1925 Sears catalog (courtesy of John Terrey) that shows this radio and discusses it could be purchased for either dry cell (UV199 tubes) or storage battery (01A tubes) operation. The cost for either radio was \$97.00. The cost for the dry cell tubes and batteries was \$42.50 and \$52.50 for storage cell batteries and tubes. In addition, the catalog

offered both radios in a "Plain Cabinet" version for \$89.00. The only difference being the radios housed in a plain cabinet.

Normally you don't see a radio offered in both

versions. I tried to find, with no success, a 1924 catalog to see if the UV199 version had been offered in the previous year.

In the Alan Douglas book, Radio Manufactur-

ers of the 1920's, Volume 2, there is a photo of this radio in the King Quality Products section on page 103. It is identified as the Silvertone Neutrodyne September 1924. The book also discusses how King made 15,000 sets for Sears during the 1925-1926 season. In 1926 King divided into two companies: King-Hinners to make neutrodynes and King-Buffalo to make TRF models.

If anyone has further information on why Sears offered this radio in two versions, let us know.

This month we visit the collection of Mike who lives in Long Island, NY.

Mike has been collecting since 1983 when he lived in an apartment in New York City. Since space is limited in most Manhattan apartments, Mike made the best use of space as shown in photo 1.

Now-a-days Mike and his family live in a house in the New York suburbs. It is a good example of how a radio collector can integrate his collection in spaces where normally radios aren't allowed – the living room and dining room. Photo 2 shows how radios can be arranged in a cabinet of family photos and memories, and in photo 3 there is a single radio in the dining room area.

The remainder of his collection is in the other two levels of the "split level" home. Photo 4 shows radios as part of his home entertainment center. The other photos are from various places in the basement section.

At this point, Mike has decided to collect only table top radios (mostly

The only repairs he performs are cosmetic and out-sources any electronic repairs.


