AUCTION REPORT

Pandur Auction Richlandtown, Pennsylvania, July 30, 2011

he Pandur auction was held last summer at Benner Hall in Richlandtown, a small village near Quakertown, Pennsylvania. It was advertised as a radio and phonograph auction and promoted in area auction papers and on AuctionZip.com with 157 photos of the items to be sold. The event started at 10 a.m. on Saturday, with viewing at 9 a.m., and auctioneer Joe Pandur provided gavel services. The day was sunny and warm and a fairly good crowd showed up for the viewing.

As the promotional photos showed, this was going to be an auction heavy on radio

parts, tubes, test equipment, and acoustic phonograph parts. There were only a few exceptional radios, and many of the remainder were in poor shape. Also up for auction were numerous empty radio and phonograph cabinets, seven tube caddies, and the largest pile of Rider volumes I have ever seen.

During the viewing some prospective bidders left after seeing the quality of the goods. Over the course of the auction the audience gradually dispersed further, dwindling to a few diehards and those who were waiting for the phonograph parts to be offered. The auction it-

self was rather haphazard; there were only two runners who soon were overwhelmed to the extent that members of the audience stepped in to help the auction along. The console radios were located in the rear of the room, and as there were no hand trucks available, they were auctioned in place, interspersed with items from up front. The result was that the action switched back and forth from front to back. I have to say, it was a strange auction and not very well run.

Although (or possibly because) many of the items were not in good shape, it appeared to be a real buyers' market. Of the 247 items I recorded, 37 of them were \$1 sales, and I did not bother to include them in the detail listing. Twenty-three items, including quite a few of the over 24 console radios offered, did not get a bid at all and ended up as "no sales." Of the 247 items that did sell, the average lot price was \$15.16.


Interspersed in the sale were some real bargains for the perceptive bidder. Surprisingly, a large 1940's Chinese motif Stromberg Carlson radio/phonograph/TV (it had a TV made by Dumont) that was in pretty good shape could not get a \$5 opening bid and went unsold. This

is a fairly rare TV console that would go well in any radio/TV collection, so it may have proved the old adage, "if you don't come with the means to transport it, you can't buy it," no matter how good the price is.

All in all, it was not a great sale for radio collectors, and the prices realized indicated as much. I suspect that phonograph collectors and repair people did quite well as there was a plethora of phonograph parts and those prices seemed quite reasonable, although I am

not that knowledgeable about acoustic phonographs. I stopped recording results at 1:05 p.m. after all the radio goods were sold, but there were still batches of phonograph motors, parts, and Victrola cabinet pieces to be auctioned. The pile of 65 or so Rider manuals had not been offered by that time, so I do not know if they sold. I wonder if the auctioneer had to cart them away along with the console radios that did not sell! If so, maybe he'll think twice before having another radio/phonograph sale.


I believe that most of the goods were from one estate. Due to the short viewing time, I was not able to record many radio model numbers, so the accompanying list basically describes the radios as they were presented at time of sale.

The 6-percent Pennsylvania sales tax was collected as was a 10-percent buyer's premium and are not included in the following prices. The sales that I recorded totaled up to only \$3,746.00.

VINTAGE AUDIO

Atwater Kent's First Cathedral Radio

BY DAVE CROCKER

n August of 1930, most radio manufacturers were influenced by the introduction of Philco's revolutionary model 20 "Midget" table radio with a curved top. It was dubbed the "cathedral" and Atwater Kent joined the revolution.

By all reason, the 1931 introduction of Atwater Kent's first cathedrals should have been in numeric order; that is, model 80, 81, 82, 83, and so on. You'd think so, right? Not so. The AK 84 came out first and was followed by the 80 and 82 cathedral-styled receivers (both 1932 sets). These later models used the same chassis, but added an additional 24A tube for AVC, which was quite early for Atwater Kent to be using this feature. The 80 and 82 also had different grille designs and "rope" trim on the front pilasters.

To make matters even more complicated, there were seven different types of the model 84 cathedrals. Let me explain, but keep in mind that I'm not a master of electrical tech-

nology and you won't see words like kilocycles, bicycles, and megacycles. I'm a history-oriented person, and I ask you to bear with me.

Lucky Seven

The Atwater Kent model 84 receivers (see **Photos A** and **B**) came out in early 1931 and used type 24A tetrode tubes, whereas the model 80 cathedral, which was introduced just after the 84 was announced, operated with type 35 tubes. Another important distinction is that the 84 had Atwater Kent's drawing number of 17500; the 80 had drawing number 20900 and the 82 had drawing number 21000. All this indicates that the 84 was Kent's first cathedral.




Figure 1. Schematic of the "early' model 84 receiver

As there are so many different tube complements in 80 series of sets, I'm only mentioning those in the 84. Of the seven types of model 84s, the first was the "early" model 84, which was a six-tube superhetrodyne receiver advertised as the "Golden Voiced" compact. Its tube complement was as follows: three type 24s; one type 27; one type 47; and one 80 rectifier (see the chassis pictured in **Photo** C and schematic provided as **Figure 1**). It had a pointed-top cathedral-style cabinet with somewhat plain front pilasters. Its arch mea-

sured 19 inches tall and its three control knobs formed a triangular pattern. The top knob was used for the main tuning control, the bottom left knob was for volume only, and the bottom right knob was the on/off switch. Located above these was the familiar "f-owning face" bezel with a moving pointer on a dial from 55 to 160. Its price in 1931 was \$69.50.

Shortly after that version came out, the model 84 "Deluxe" (or "late" model) was released. It featured the same style cabinet, but it was adorned with added curved woodwork from the plain pilasters up to the pointed top.

At Water's Edge

Well, I think I've thrown enough numbers at you, so now a little local color...

If you're ever in Kennebunkport, Maine, be sure to go down through the center of town to Ocean Avenue past the yacht club and the big white Colony hotel on the water. At the next curve you'll see a stone church, St. Anne's Episcopal. The rectory of the church (pictured at right), which was built in 1891 for the Nesmith family of Lowell, Massachusetts, was purchased in 1910 by A. Atwater Kent who named it Water's Edge. I don't know exactly how long he resided there, but I do know he was still there in the

1920s. Since that time the carriage house was moved and now serves as an addition to one of the houses just before the site. Take a look inside the gate—you are welcome.



On this type, the bottom left knob controlled the on/off and volume, and the bottom right knob was for tone only. The tubes used in this set were as follows: two type 35s; one type 24; one type 47; one type 27; and one 80 rectifier.

The Complete 84 Series Sets

The 84 series radios included the models 84, 84-Deluxe, 84-F (a 25-cycle set), model 84-Q (a seven-tube, battery-operated set with a price tag that went up to \$94.50), the 84-D (not "Deluxe" but a 110-volt DC receiver for inner-city use), the 84-Z (a 32-volt farm set that probably ran off a wind charger), and the

84-L (I am personally unfamiliar with this last one, but it is on Atwater Kent's product list).

The Complete 80 Series Sets

The models 80 (see Photo D), 82, 84, 84-D 82, 82-F, 82-Q, and the mysterious 84-Z were all "compact" cathedral-style receivers. The models 83, 85, 85-Q, 86 (a Canadian set?), 87-D, and 89 were either lowboy or highboy consoles. The models 80, 82, and 84 were used inside Atwater Kent's grandfather clock radio, in which the entire cathedral cabinet actually slid into the rear of the tall grandfather cabinet, although some of these tall cabinets used the chassis only inside. Rumor has it that the grandfather clock sets with the slide-in chassis were actually made by manufacturers other than Atwater Kent. The model 81 was an auto radio. The 84-L could have been an export set.

Get Ready for the First International Restoration Contest

ere at Antique Radio Classified we're always on the lookout for ideas that help promote the hobby of antique and vintage radio collecting. And we just found a great one!

For the past nine years, the Quebec Antique Radio Collectors Society (SQCRA), a group of collectors mostly from the Canadian province of Quebec, has been holding a radio restoration contest for its members. For the 10th competition, they're taking the challenge to an international level, inviting all interested clubs to participate in a first International Restoration Contest.

Maybe you already have a restoration contest in your club. It would be interesting if all clubs join this international event, perhaps following your own local competition. This may be the perfect way to spur new friendships, stimulate exchanges between clubs, and promote conservation of antique radios through their restoration.

The rules are simple: interested participants have one year to restore a basket case radio. Photographs must be taken before the restoration starts and at all steps of the process. One year later, the participants must present their work to a panel of judges in a local club event. Photographs taken during the process will help judges better understand the challenges participants faced in order to finish their projects. The

individual clubs may give a prize (perhaps a free one-year membership) to the local winner.

The criteria for evaluation are submitted beforehand to all the clubs interested and are subject general consensus. Once every club has finished its local contest and determined the winner, a pool of all the first prizewinners would be created and submitted to an international panel of judges. This panel would comprise one member elected locally from each participating club. Pictures from each contestant would be submitted through the Internet to each judge and results compiled to determine a winner and two runners up. The clubs that don't have a contest could nominate someone to represent their club at this contest.

The goal, of course, is to promote the conservation of the technological/historical heritage, to motivate our common interest, increase the general knowledge of antique radio technology, increase club exchanges, and see what is done in other clubs.

If you are interested in participating, contact the SQCRA—they would be happy to include your club in this new international event. As a first step they will create a list of all participating clubs. Afterwards, they will invite all organizations to provide the name and email address of the selected judge who will become the contact for the club in order to create the international panel.

RESTORATION REPORT

"Must-Haves" from the Majestic Radio and Television Corporation

In June of 1936, all Majestic intellectual property and trademark rights exchanged hands again, purchased this time by the Triangle Electric Company of 600 Adams Street, Chicago. Triangle Electric, owned by Davega Stares Corp, a division of Atlas Stores Corp., had been a wholesaler of radio sets and electrical apparatus in the mid-West since 1920. Their past clients, numbering some 2,000, had included Kolster and Zenith, and they now planned to manufacture and nationally distribute "a complete line of Majestic radio sets, refrigerators, and household utilities." for which they planned an expansion and conversion of their warehouse facilities on Adams Street.

However, in October, Davega sold the rights to the Majestic Radio and Television Corporation, which it had been instrumental in forming and newly incorporating in September. The management team for this new company was, as it had been at Triangle, under Davega Stores. Davega was principal stockholder and had a cash investment exceeding \$300,000 in the new venture.

The reformed Majestic would stay in the manufacturing business through 1955. However their journey through the years was a turbulent one, with several Chapter 11 reorganizations and changes of ownership. Their products are today well known among radio collectors and include such gems as the Charlie McCarthy and Melody Cruiser models, to name just two, That is, however, another story.

lthough I had always liked the appearance of the Majestic Charley Mc-Carthy and Melody Cruiser novelty radios I never thought their manufacturer had any connection to Grigsby, Grunow, or Heinz. Apparently, 1 was wrong. Majestic Radio and Television was formed by B.J. Grigsby who ran it through 1955, which was more than Grunow had been able to accomplish. Although Roger Majestic was producing some very fine radios during the period from 1930-1942, there was no connection between the two companies; Roger Majestic radios were made and sold in Canada with Grigsby-Grunow Majestic made in the United States and sold mostly in the U.S. and Europe.

The manufacture of the Melody Cruiser started up again in 1946 after the war. A few

radios sold in 1946 were the same as the 1942 versions; later a third chassis was designed and a longer ship with a wider cabin was sold. This design used the same sails and three masts, but it had a larger dial opening to the right of the tuning knob. The pre-war Majestic Charley McCarthy and Melody Cruiser novelty radios still are collector "must-have" radios and command a good resale price if in good original condition. With the radio collecting market currently way down, the prices are low and it's a good time to buy. A few years ago a mint Charley McCarthy could command \$1,200 to \$1,500, but sellers are having trouble getting \$500 today. The Melody Cruisers are running about the same; I bought

my Melody Cruiser for \$173, plus shipping, but had to put into it another \$180, including parts, tubes, lacquer, and my time.


The cabinet of the Charley McCarthy features an unusual design of "modern plasticivory or walnut," and the chassis holds a powerful six-tube AC-DC superheterodyne, as the 1939 Majestic Catalog boasted, stating:

America's millions. Absolutely a "must have" item for every radio department. The demand has been created and the aggressive dealer will promote and capitalize on Majestic Charlie McCarthy.

The cabinet is an unusual design in ivory plastic. The chassis, a powerful 6 tube AC-DC superheterodyne.

CHARLIE McCARTHY: You've heard him on the air, you've seen him in the movies—NOW, put him in every home.




tector, AVC detector and 1st audio, 25L6GT audio power output, and 25Z6GT half-wave rectifier, both plates and cathodes tied together. The L49-B ballast drops 49 VAC and dissipation is 12.3 watts.

Because the Charley McCarthy is so compact and the case very small, the radio runs quite hot. The original Bakelite case had a small sheet of 1/8-inch asbestos at the top on the flat part of the cabinet. I can imagine if this little radio were left turned on in a book shelf surrounded with books it could set the owner's house on fire. Filaments alone are 30 watts, add the B+ load is a very hot 45 watts.

The radio has amazingly good performance and plays loud and very clear. Majestic claimed 15 μ V sensitivity, and I can verify that number.


Melody Cruiser

I recently acquired a Majestic 1S49 Melody Cruiser clipper ship radio and restored and refinished it. The sails polished up nicely and didn't require re-chroming. It also still had the original back with original seals over the back screws and shock preveners. As you can see from the accompanying photo, its chrome sails are shining brightly on its three masts and it sports a bow plate that reads, "Majestic Melody Cruiser." This set is circa 1941 and uses a similar chassis and dial to the Majestic "Charlie McCarthy" radios.



Here's my Majestic 1849 Melody Cruiser clipper ship radio electronically restored. The sails polished up nicely, with no re-chroming necessary, and I refinished the attractive wood ship.

Taking the length of the extended sails into account, the Majestic's Melody Cruiser is a little over 19-1/2 inches long, 16-5/8 inches tall, and about 6 inches across. Fortunately, my ship radio required very little refurbishing to bring it up to full speecs electronically. Al-



Rear view of my Majestic Melody Cruiser. It had the original back with its anti-shock seals still located over the back hardware, which screw into the electrically hot chassis.


though it had all its original tubes and played fine after warming up for 15 minutes, I recapped it and changed every tube.

The previous owner had stripped and sprayed with lacquer the interesting shipshaped cabinet, but luckily it only required cleaning, masking and a re-stain of the dark brown lower portion, as originally done. After removing the masking, I put on seven coats of lacquer. It took a bit of elbow grease on the polishing wheel to shine up all the sails and mast pieces, which were chrome-plated brass that had been painted silver. I don't know if that was factory original, but I left the masts and hardware polished chrome over brass. I replaced all the decorative rigging wire with beading cable from Hobby Lobby. The cable is 0.019-inch diameter and made up of seven strands of stainless steel wire covered with nylon; it looks authentic and is very flexible.


The AM receiver is of extremely compact design. Its 4-inch original speaker produces

a nice full-bodied sound with a crisp highs. The radio chassis appeared to be 100-percent original, right down to its fragile celluloid frequency scale indicator and gold fabric grill cloth. All the tubes were original, with 1941 date code, and only the two separate filter electrolytics had been changed. Majestic used metalized film capacitors encapsulated in Bakelite cases that looked like large flat mica capacitors. When I found a 0.02uF 400V capacitor across the AC line, which had exploded in the Bakelite case, I decided to change all the capacitors except three real mica capacitors.

This ship radio model incorporates a fivetube AC-DC powered standard-broadcast superheterodyne receiver. The tube line-up consists of a 12SA7GT pentagrid converter, 12K7GT IF amplifier, 12Q7GT 2nd detector, AVC detector and 1st audio, 35L6GT audio power output, and 35Z5GT half-wave rectifier. This is almost, but not quite, the standard

octal AA5 tube set (12SA7GT, 12SK7GT, 12SQ7GT, 50L6GT and 35Z5GT); as the 50L6 was just becoming available about the time this radio was being manufactured, Majestic added a 68-ohm 5-watt resistor in the 0.150A filament string. The lower filament current reduced the power dissipation to 31 watts from the 45 watts of the earlier Charley McCarthy radio.

The 1S49 chassis uses open IF transformers, one above the chassis and the output below, which makes the radio very difficult to align because coupling causes the radio to oscillate. With some shielding and careful location of the wires and test equipment cables, however, I was able to obtain good alignment. To prevent the radio from setting its wood case on fire, the manufacturer installed in the cabinet a 1/8-inch sheet of long-fiber asbestos, as well as a thin copper sheet on the right side, bottom and top, for shielding of the IF transformers. As with the

Charley McCarthy radio the sensitivity is a good 15uV.

As I said before, this is a "must have" pair of radios for the serious radio collector. The good news is that because the market is down, this is a great time to get one, or both, for your collection. Good luck.








