
MEET REPORT

Antique Radio Club of Illinois Radiofest XXXI Willowbrook, Illinois August 2–4, 2012

The Antique Radio Club of Illinois Radiofest was held at the Willowbrook Holiday Inn Conference Center on Kingery Highway in the southwest Chicago suburb of Willowbrook. This is the 31st annual Radiofest and the sixth year at this location. The Holiday Inn facilities and excellent support staff once again combined to enable us to deliver a quality event.

My wife Donna and I could not make it to the Thursday evening auction but my informants told me that there were 144 registered bidders. Of 194 lots, 143 of those sold with total sales of \$25,300. Once again Ron Steinberg's Rent Com supplied a video camera/projection system to assist in the auction showing and for video recording of the event. The auction started about 6:30 p.m and continued until close at 10:30, with the usual free pizza party for club members afterward. The three top selling bids were \$2,100 for a Sparton blue mirrored sled radio, \$1,800 for a McIntosh model 240 stereo power amplifier and \$1,050 for a Wireless Specialty Apparatus Triode-B amplifier.

Fest Day Dawns

Early Friday morning we headed for Willowbrook, which is about an hour's drive from home. We arrived about 6:40 and things were busy. The official opening is 7 a.m., but a lot of sales had already been made. The day was sunny and already getting hot, eventually reaching the low 90s. We started making the rounds, taking pictures, and talking to our usual collector friends. The number of sellers in the Swap Meet area was down from previous years. Some of the old-timers that we always see didn't make it this year. Although the unusual heat and the economy did take its toll, we achieved a 75-percent occupancy rate in the sales area and provided a top-flight experience for those attending.

We saw several interesting pieces in the swap meet. There was another Leutz model C superhet for sale, and we saw a rare matched pair of DuKane Ionovac speakers in fully restored condition with new matched plasma cells. Unfortunately, we didn't see as many catalins this year. Also, I learned that many of the very special items sold early.

The KC9IPB vintage special event ham station began operation at 8 a.m. Jim Novak, W9FIH, Barry Nelson, K9YVT, Chris Farley, KC9IEQ. Dale Svetanoff, WA9ENA, and Harry Blesy, N9CQX took turns at the controls. The station equipment was provided by Jim, W9FIH and Chris, KC9IEQ. An impressive 61 contacts were made this year. The scene was reminiscent of ARRL Field Days, in the 1950s, '60s, and '70s.

Lots to Do

Radiofest Program Coordinator, Greg Hunolt, set up an impressive series of informational presentations in the main ballroom. The first one started at 10 a.m. and covered the theme of vacuum tube audio. John Stone, Pete Nauseda, Terry Shaver, and Karl Johnson discussed tube audio issues and tips. John gave a technical lecture on measuring the output power of a tube audio amplifier using common test equipment and the importance of speaker impedance matching. He discussed why even though a tube tests "good" on a tube tester, or even if it's described as "strong" on an online auction, it may not deliver rated power due to the hours of service it has seen. Pete talked about early FM stereo multiplex decoders and the differences between them. Terry gave a humorous talk about the legendary baseball player Yogi Berra and his memorable quotes

as they apply to tube hi-fi. Karl gave an informative update on his recent write-up on tube amplifier improvements that you can do.

The second talk, at 11 a.m., showcased the Pavek Museum of Broadcastir.g in St. Louis Park, Minnesota. Curator Steve Raymer gave a presentation on the biography of Joseph R. Pavek, his early collecting, and how his collection evolved into the Pavek Museum. The museum houses the collection of Charles Bradley and also Jack Mullin's collection of equipment spanning 125 years of audio recording technology. Hands-on displays include a 1929 RCA Theremin that visitors can play, a 1960's radio broadcasting studio, and a state-of-theart amateur radio station. 

After lunch at 12:30, Bill Ross, W9WR, hosted the "Ham Radio Forum," with guests Jim, W9FIH, and Harry, N9CQX. Bill presented a video about the legendary WLW 500 kW commercial broadcast transmitter. Jim gave a talk about Clegg and some of their products. Their presence, microphone-inhand, was reminiscent of the amateur radio conversations heard on the 75-meter phone band back in the 1950s

At 1:30 Kent King's excellent presentation, "The E. H. Scott Company: History and Products," drew related restorers and collectors. Scott Company radios are renowned for their outstanding performance and stunning appearance, with chrome-plated chassis and classic layout. Detailed product descriptions were augmented with historical and tabular data tracing their radio production. The final presentation of the day, at 2:30 p.m., featured Mike Adams, author of *Lee de Forest-King of Radio, Television and Film*, discussing de Forest's pioneering work in recording sound on motion picture film. Best known for his invention of the triode tube and various failed radio enterprises, de Forest was an active inventor all his life and developed a practical method of making sound movies. A book signing followed the his presentation.

Gear Galore

The Old Equipment contest check-in opened at 10 a.m. and closed at noon for judging. This year the categories were: Radios Pre-1930, Radios Pre-WWII (1945), Radios Post WWII (1946 and up), Art Deco Radios, Catalin and Rare Plastic Radios, Speakers, Transistor and Novelty Radios, Vacuum Tube Audio, Radios Made in the Midwest, Ham/ Military Radio, and Open Category.

There were 30 entries this year. That's not as many as I have seen in past years, but there were several outstanding displays. The Muchow -Best of Show winner was a Leutz model C battery-operated superhet, powered up and playing on vintage battery eliminators, which was entered by Michael Feldt. The People's Choice and Best Historical Display awards both went to the Walt Buffinton custom-built E. H. Scott miniature radio museum, entered by Bruce Sorensen. The display included the years 1925 to 1940. By my count it showcased 34 consoles, chassis, and tabletop radios, each meticulously reproduced in miniature. The Chairman's Award went to Bill Ross for an exceptional display of antique tube boxes.

The special theme display this year was a Marconi/*Titanic* commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic. David Bart coordinated an incredible collection of equipment, memorabilia, and paper about Marconi, shipboard radio, and the *Titanic*. I was impressed at the number of high-quality rare items that were brought in by our members.

The Saturday morning donation auction had the best gross ever, with \$1,391 taken in. There were a few especially interesting pieces that I noted. For instance, there was a repwood /papier-mâché 1920's horn speaker with wood base and a near perfect 1950's Airline radio/ phono console with owner's manual. I also saw a pair of working 1970's Altec transistorized PA mixer/amps and a couple of 1970's Sony U-Matic video recorders with several boxes of tapes. There was an additional donation of school electronics lab equipment similar to the equipment that was donated to the club last December. Several 40-MHz solid-state oscilloscopes, old meters, and other equipment went for sale. The donation auction is a double benefit for the club members. They get to pick up some great treasures at reasonable prices, and the club uses the proceeds to offset the cost of Radiofest, which helps to hold registration fees down. The donation lot sells the donations flea-market-style on Friday and auctions the rest on Saturday morning.

Another Year, Another Good Day

We couldn't stay for the banquet at 6 p.m. on Friday because of other commitments, but as always it was a memorable day for us. Although all events like this seem to be suffering because of the weak economy and high gas prices, the Radiofest team still continues to deliver an excellent experience. Most sellers I talked to told me that they had a good day, and I met and spoke with a lot of happy buyers, too.

AT HOME WITH THE COLLECTOR

A Visit with Bill in New York State's Catskill Region

hen A.R.C. was invited to the monthly meeting of the Hudson Valley Antique Radio and Phonograph Society, I was delighted to attend. About a dozen member gathered for this event, held in a room of a local church. The members discussed what has been going on over the last month, participated in a "show and tell," and auctioned off some items.

At the meeting I had a chance to meet up with A.R.C. author Bill Liers ("Murphy's Station Master," December 2011) and chat about his extensive radio collection. Bill told me that the radios he looks for must be amazing and have great design. He started his radio collecting at the age of five when he first became interested in radios and how they worked. At age 16 he inherited his grandmother's Philco 41-380 console, which he considers the set he "cut his teeth on" – and, yes, he still has it.

Like many of us, Bill has wandered in and out of the hobby over the years. In 2005, due to a heart condition, he spent a number of months confined to his home, which gave him lots of time to conduct Web research into radios. At that time he owned only a few radios, but his searches soon led him to a local collector named Art Kingsley. After Art invited him to the local club meeting, Bill was hooked!

What's in Bill's Collection?

Bill, who works as a satellite communications engineer, likes unusual radios, and you'll find some of the finest E.H. Scott consoles, Zenith shutter dial models, and foreign sets taking pride of place. He told me, "I consider the mid-1930s to be the Golden Age of radio design. They were amazing sets, with shortwave bands, tuning eyes, decorative cabinets, and the beginning of high-fidelity, all rolled into one."

"Scott was the Rolls Royce of radio design," he continued. "They may not be the fastest, but they are the finest in quality."

Bill's collection boasts the Scott Philharmonic in the Gothic Grande cabinet with the Philharmonic FM (1940) as well as the Philharmonic AM in the Revinia cabinet (1937). Other consoles include the McMurdo Masterpiece Six (1938) and a 1939 Philco Radiobar with the glassware. He also has battery sets such as a Federal 61 with original antenna and a rare Silvertone Neutrodyne with speaker top option. Bill's foreign radios include a Radiomarelli model 9A26 from Italy and numerous German radios.

On Bill's Repair Bench


Bill says that for him the most satisfying finds are the basket cases. He does all his own repair work, including chassis replating and veneer replacement, as well as the usual parts replacement.

One of his favorite stories concerns a Croydon cathedral. It all started with the tomato crop he enjoys raising. One day he picked a basket for his neighbor. The grateful tomato recipient said, "I have something for you in the garage. It's a radio that belonged to my father. Naturally, Bill expected a 1950s clock radio or something similar, not really a collectable. Bill even told the neighbor not to be insulted if he couldn't really use it. But the generous soul gave Bill a box with that contained the remains of the Croydon. The cabinet was in pieces with no finish and a very rusty chassis, but it did have the knobs and grille cloth. Bill refinished the Croydon and sandblasted and replated the chassis. Today it's one of his favorites.
