

#### Analysis of Station Ownership

A N analysis of the active stations on the air today shows how impractical it is to fear anything like a monopoly of the ether: practically all the 694 or more stations are individual, and independent, not more than ten are owned by any single or combined interests. The ten are, of course, the group the uninitiated believe is the nucleus of a broadcasting monopoly. It includes the Westinghouse group of four, WBZ, WBZA, KDKA and WRC, and the single National broadcasting station WEAF. To be sure, about fifty stations cooperate with the National Broadcasting Company in its chain hook-ups, but they are still independent, being actually subscribers, associated solely for program service, like the newspaper subscribers to a press service.

According to the official broadcast lists, but without any attempt to ascertain ownership other than the names listed, it appears that most of the stations are independent—about 90 per cent of them, the rest are affiliated in a few chains and groups for mutual benefit to provide high-class entertainment.

Strange as it may seem, colleges, schools and other educational institutions own and operate more stations than any other group, ninety-four being so listed.

Next come the electrical and radio interests, owning ninety-three stations. Seventy-nine are listed as being operated by or for independent broadcast companies; fifty by

churches and religious organizations; fortynine are run by manufacturers and general business interests; forty by newspapers and publications; twenty-two by states and municipalities; nineteen by hospitals, hotels and theatres; twelve each by clubs and financial institutions; eleven by automobile dealers; ten by professional men, such as doctors and lawyers, and nine by public utilities. These aggregate 510 out of about 694 stations on the air, the balance being filed under the names of individuals or companies unidentified with any particular industry.

Any monopoly by these various divergent interests is hard to anticipate; the colleges certainly would never merge their activities and independence; churches are far from consolidation; the electrical and radio industry may combine but it does not seem probable, and many of the individual broadcasters might do so, but if they do it will only mean more chain competition and better programs. The newspapers are unlikely to form a monopoly, except in so far as news channels go, and so on down the list; there are too many angles and interests involved to believe that anything like a monopoly in broadcasting is probable in the future. The Federal Trade Commission is ready to investigate if such a thing becomes detrimental to public welfare, just as it is watching the alleged radio manufacturing industry today.

#### Seattle Radio Exposition

Seattle will hold its First Annual Radio Exposition in the Masonic Temple, Pine & Harvard Sts., September 8th to 11th, inclusive

There has been an unusually fine spirit of cooperation evinced between Portland and Seattle industrial interests, in securing entertainers for the "big show." Artists have been borrowed both from Portland and from Coast Vaudeville Theatres, to make the afternoons and evenings at the exposition diverting. Altho at this writing exact schedules are not compiled. It is known that KFOA, KJR and KOMO will broadcast from a crystal studio erected in the exposition hall

The management of the exposition will furnish some of the talent used, altho the station whose turn it is to broadcast will also provide its own staff artists.

In addition to the radio wedding of Paul Gruber and Maybelle Smith, there will be featured:

A moving picture of some of radio's notables—Maurice Gunsky. Eduardo Abdo, the Neapolitan Quartet, and others;

Novak's Californians, a girls orchestra, formerly in vaudeville;

The Telephone Male Quartet, some KGW Hoot Owl Entertainers, and

Personal appearances of Mayor Bertha K. Landes and Governor Roland H. Hartley on the opening evening.

An advertising feature of the exposition will be the "Phantom Car," a machine running thru the downtown streets under its own power, stopping at traffic signals, blowing its horn and shifting gears, without a driver or passenger. This car, controlled entirely by radio, will be piloted by a driver in a second car running a few yards in the rear.

A bait to skeptics is offered in the form of a \$1000 reward by the management of the Exposition, to anyone who can find a driver concealed in the machine.

However successful and colorful this year's show may be, it is regarded by all forward-looking citizens, as a stepping stone to the larger and more elaborate one to be staged in September of 1928, in Seattle's then newly completed Civic Center.

Portland's Third Annual Exposition will be held on September 14th to 18th inclusive, at the Public Auditorium, Third and Clay Sts. Stations KGW, KOIN, and KFJR will broadcast from the exposition there.

#### Broadcast Station KWKH to Be Prosecuted

The Federal Radio Commission has begun the prosecution of erring radio broadcast stations. Those operating without the full sanction of the Commission on the channels and with the power assigned them may expect trouble. The Commission is determined to clear up the ether lanes and stop interference.

Station KWKH at Shreveport, La., was the first to suffer, having criminal proceedings instigated by the Department of Justice. Incidentally, it lost half its time on the 760 Kc., broadcast channel.

According to the testimony of its owner, W. K. Henderson, before the Radio Com-

mission, this station has been using 3000 watts since June 15, 1927, instead of the alloted power of 1000 watts. This, the Radio Commission holds, is an infraction of its license and the regulations of the Commission under Section 32 of the Radio Act, being punishable by a fine of \$500 for each and every offense.

The Department of Justice has been asked by the Commission to take up the matter of prosecuting Mr. Henderson through the proper Federal authorities in Louisiana. It is charged that KWKH did not act in the public interest by using higher than its authorized power, despite recent testimony showing its great popularity,

Nine broadcast stations have been relicensed for only thirty days instead of sixty as is the custom, pending a decision by the Commissioners as to whether they can maintain their frequency assignments. Eight of these stations in the New York district are: WWRL, WGL, WRNY, WNJ, WMSG, WKBQ, WKBO, WPAP and WCBM, Baltimore. During this thirty-day period the field force of the Department of Commerce Radio Division will check the erring stations to see if they still vary as to frequency. In the event they are found to be wobbling still, their licenses are believed in jeopardy of renewal.

#### Care and Installation of Receivers

NOTE—This is the first of eight articles on the "Care, Installation and Operation of Receivers" that will appear in consecutive issues of Broadcast Weekly. The next article will be on Antennas.

#### **GROUNDS**

NIEXT to a good antenna, the ground N connection is the most important part of the installation of a radio receiver, and its installation should be given careful The customary thought and attention. ground connection is the water-pipe, and in a large percentage of installations, this is adequate. The cold water supply pipe should be used; never a hot water, drain or gas pipe, as they may have insulating joints which will increase the ground resistance enormously. If the receiver is located on the first floor of the home, the ground connection should be made in the cellar, near the point where the pipe enters the earth. A ground clamp should be fastened around the pipe, which should first be scraped clean with a knife, or sandpaper, and the ground lead fastened to the binding post or screw terminal of the clamp. If the ground lead first goes to the lightning arrester on the outside of the building, which is the best procedure, then the ground lead can be continued through the window to the set, and thereby avoid unsightly wires in the house. If the installation is in an apartment house, or upper floor of the dwelling, it may be impractical to run the wires outside the house, and a ground clamp will have to be placed on the piping in the bathroom or kitchen, wherever a conveniently exposed portion of water pipe is had.

If the water pipe does not provide good ground, a buried ground, or a counterpoise are the alternate arrangements. Amateurs who have transmitting sets often bury several old hot water boilers, or other large masses of metal, several feet in the earth, in well moistened soil and find that such a combination makes an excellent ground. For a simple receiving installation, there are several patented grounds which can be buried and which provide good contact with the earth if properly installed. A few feet of copper window screen, or chicken wire fencing, buried under the earth's surface

will also make a good ground, and one which can easily be abandoned if there is no further use for it.

A counterpoise consists of a network of wires, somewhat like an antenna, but suspended only a few feet above the earth. For a receiving installation, a counterpoise of four or five wires, spaced two feet apart, so as to form a rectangle at least forty feet long, and as near under the antenna as is possible, will make a very satisfactory ground. The wires should be high enough to clear the heads of persons walking under it, and if the antenna is very high, the counterpoise may be as high as 25 or 30 feet above the ground, with good results. The counterpoise should be insulated thoroughly, the same as the antenna. Often, where bad interference from power lines is had, when a ground is used, the installation of a counterpoise has greatly reduced the interference, especially where the power line ground, and the radio set ground are close together.

Underground antennas are also popular, and many claims for them have been set forth in recent years. There is no doubt but that an underground antenna will reduce the static to a certain extent, but it is a question but what the signals from the station are also reduced in about the same proportion. Underground antennas usually consist of a piece of heavily insulated wire, buried in a conduit of non-metallic material, six inches or more below the surface, and at least 75 feet long. They may now be purchased completely equipped with a flexible conduit, so that a narrow trench may be dug in the backyard or alongside the house, and the wire easily buried the proper distance. Where an underground antenna is used, a ground must also be employed, preferably located away from the buried antenna. A water-pipe connection is generally employed, as it has been found satisfactory in such installations.

THE Chamber of Commerce of Algiers and Constantine have filed resolution concerning radio-telephonic liaison between Algeria and France by the creation of two radio stations; Algiers-Marseille in the first instance, and then Algiers-Paris, the transmission, in the interior being by telephone, the American Consul at Algiers states in a report.

A resolution has also been put forward to the effect that the wireless station at Ain-el-Turck, Dept. of Oran, shall be ceded to the Post, Telegraph and Telephone Service. in order that it may be used by vessels in the Mediterranean as in the case of the Fort de l'Eau station, Dept. of Algiers. The Ain-el-Turck station has hitherto come under the administration of the French Navy Dept. and has not been available for trade communications.

As in the case of Rossini's "Barber of Seville," Mozart's "Marriage of Figaro" is based on one of three comedies by Beaumarchais, dealing with the same characters, though at a later period of their lives

Beaumarchais was the George Bernard Shaw of his day. He lived in the eighteenth century and his comedies dealt with the foibles of the great in his own day. "The Marriage of Figaro" was forbidden public perference in Paris and a gorgant of its someformance in Paris, not on account of its somewhat scandalous plot, but because "Figaro" is a mere servant in the household of the aristocratic Count Almaviva and his success in countries his paster was not a success in aristocratic Count Almaviva and his success in outwitting his master was regarded as politically dangerous at a period when the profligacy of the nobility was leading fast toward the French Revolution

To overcome the difficulty, a series of private performances were given, Marie Antoinette, herself, attending them. The combinater of the professional professional professional programmer.

nette, herself, attending them. The combina-tion of "forbidden fruit" and royal patronage was too much for the authorities and in consequence the private performances of Beaumarchais" comedy were a tremendous success.

The plot is simple enough, and of a kind familiar enough in the eighteenth century. But for Mozart's genius it is possible that "The Marriage of Figaro" would have been

Figaro, the former Barber of Seville, having he'ped Count Almaviva to marry Rosina by outwitting her guardian. Dr. Hariolo, was installed as "major domo" in the count's houseinstalled as "major domo" in the count's household. All went well for a time, but presently the count wearied of tepid domesticity and his attention was attracted by Susanna. Rosina's maid. Figuro himself planned to marry Susanna and his suspicions were aroused by the count's ready acquiescence in the marriage. It becomes plain to him that his master wishes to use him as a "smoke-screen" for his own peccadilloes. To complicate matters, Cherubino, a saucy page, is annoying the count by paying attention to the countess Meantime. Susanna and the countess take a Meantime. Susanna and the countess take a hand unknown to either the count or Figaro. nand unknown to either the count of Figaro. In the final garden scene, the count attempts at night to embrace Susanna, only to find he is courting Cherubino dressed up in her clothes. The countess is wearing Susanna's attire and Figaro believing her to be his sweetheart attempts to kiss her. She reveals herself, but not before the count himself has seen Figuro apparently kissing his wife. When the storm clears, however, the count with his wife looking on is compelled to permit Figaro to wed Susanna with no further fear of molestation



# Kilocycles vs Meters

By Carl H. Butman

Although the United States is apparently ready to use kilocycles of frequency rather than wave lengths in meters for broadcasting, technical men state it will be difficult to establish these terms in international commercial work.

Other countries, such as Great Britain, France, Italy, Russia and Switzerland, still use the term wave length and give the channels in meters. This practice is being followed in the recommendations made to the International Radio-Telegraph convention by some countries, which will require a dual presentation of channel designations if the U. S. section presents its suggestions in kilocycles only.

Sea-going radio operators, it is pointed out by W. D. Terrell, the United States supervisor of radio, are of the old school and use meters. Since the radio apparatus on all ships is calibrated in meters and not kilocycles, orders issued them, re-adjusting their sets on channels designated in kilocycles, could not be carried out accurately. This also applies to practically all commercial land station transmitters, calibrated in old style meters.

While kilocycle designation for broadcast channels is favored and found very desirable, with the ten Kc. separation, no decimals or fractions being required, on the longer commercial channels and especially the trans-oceanic wave lengths, the frequencies would have to be given with decimals, while the corresponding wave lengths would fall on even meters.

Some suggestions, received by the International Radio-Telegraph convention from abroad, favor the use of meters and waves, recommending, regarding measuring instruments for example, "wave-meters" instead of "frequency meters"; replacing "frequency" by "wave length," and "meters" rather than "kilocycles."

European radio companies use meters, as well as the International Broadcast Union, listing station channels in that manner. All of which indicates Europe is not yet ready for the change to kilocycles in place of meters


